### **GAME PREVIEW**



### Men's Basketball Opens The Season at Arizona State

CEDAR CITY, UTAH -- The SUU Men's Basketball team is set to open the 2025-26 season at Arizona State University on Tuesday, November 4, at 7:00 p.m.

Head Coach Rob Jeter said

"It has been a long off-season and the guys are ready to get out and compete. We know what we need to do to be successful, and every game is an opportunity to do just that. If we can come out and play with pace and physicality, we can be successful."

### **Matchup History**

 SUU is 0-5 all-time against the Sun Devils. Their last meeting came back in the 2005-06 season, a 62-82 loss in Tempe.

### The Thunderbirds

SUU was picked to finish last in the WAC Preseason Coaches poll, but that hasn't deterred the Thunderbirds at all. With essentially an all-new team, the ceiling of the 2025-26 squad remains to be seen.

True freshman point guard <u>Elijah Duval</u> is a name that the entire league will soon be familiar with. A four-star recruit according to ESPN, Duval is quickly becoming the leader of the Thunderbirds offensively and defensively. Duval commands respect off the dribble and will knock down the three-ball when needed. He is a dual-threat point guard who is willing to make the extra pass that leads to his teammates' success.

6'11 senior center <u>Isaiah Cottrell</u> is another guy who is ready to make an immediate impact. Another former four-star recruit who transferred to Southern Utah from UNLV is ready to leave his mark in SUU's history. Cottrell is the definition of a stretch-big. He is an athlete who can score from the low post and consistently knocks down three-pointers. His length makes him tough to score on defensively, and he can move his feet laterally, despite being nearly seven feet tall. <u>Dylan Jones</u> and <u>Jaiden Feroah</u> are both originally from northern Utah and grew up playing basketball with and against each other. They attended different high schools but played in the same region, and in the offseason, the two players were on the same AAU team, and know how to complement each other well.

Jones transfers in from Fairleigh Dickinson, where he attempted over 200 three-pointers and made them at a 40% clip. And Feroah was at Holy Cross a season ago, where he played in all 32 games and averaged seven points and six rebounds.

Look out for other transfers like <u>Zach Bell</u>, a sophomore guard who played at Jacksonville a season ago, <u>Jalen (Roc) Lee</u>, who came in from Long Island University, and <u>Tanner Hayhurst</u>, who went to BYU out of high school but comes to SUU from the College of Southern Idaho. <u>Cale Barclay</u> isn't a transfer, but a 6'9 true freshman from Herriman, Utah, who plays a physical type of basketball and can score inside and out.

#### **Scouting the Sun Devils**

ASU was picked last in the Big 12 Preseason rankings, and is only returning one player who has scored a point in a Sun Devils uniform.

Maurice Odom is a four-star transfer from Pepperdine, who averaged 13 points, seven assists, and three rebounds per game a season ago.

Marcus Adams Jr is a transfer from CSUN who was at BYU his freshman season. Adams averaged 16.5 points and five rebounds per game for CSUN last year, and he earned All-Big West Second Team accolades. He originally committed to Kansas as a highly-touted recruit, but switched to BYU for his first season.

The Sun Devils are in the same boat as the Thunderbirds, with essentially a brand-new team.



## Head Coach Rob Jeter

Third Season Overall Record (245-255) At SUU (22-40)

Southern Utah University is excited to announce the new men's basketball head coach, Rob Jeter.

Jeter joins the Thunderbird family from Western Illinois University, where he spent the last three years as the head coach. Jeter inherited a team that won just five games the year prior and in his previous two seasons, had the Leathernecks over .500 both years.

Jeter carries over 25 years of coaching experience and seven NCAA Tournament appearances. His previous stops included the University of Minnesota, the University of Nevada-Las Vegas, and a head coaching stint at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

In 11 years with the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, he was awarded Coach of the Year three times and had five, 20+ win seasons. Jeter led the Panthers to two NCAA tournament appearances, including a first-round win over 6-seeded Oklahoma in 2006.

Jeter left Milwaukee (2005-2016) as its all-time winningest coach (Division I era) with an overall record of 185-170. The Panthers claimed the Horizon League's regular-season titles in 2006 and 2011 and tournament titles in 2006 and 2014.

"We are excited to welcome Rob and his family to T-Bird Nation," said SUU President Mindy Benson. "We are confident that Rob's experience and leadership skills will continue to elevate the men's basketball program and look forward to next season."

Jeter's most recent trip to the NCAAs occurred in 2019 as an assistant at Minnesota. The Gophers ended their season in the second round but earned their first tournament win in six years to go alongside another 20-win season (22-14).

Prior to Minnesota, Jeter was on staff at UNLV from 2016-18. The Runnin' Rebels doubled their wins in year two to produce a 20-win season, and Jeter had a hand in recruiting the 12th-best class in the country that included McDonald's High School All-American Brandon McCoy and National Junior College Player of the Year Shakur Juiston.

From 2001 to 05, Jeter was an assistant at the University of Wisconsin under Hall of Fame head coach Bo Ryan. The Badgers had much success during this run, including four-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, including berths in the Sweet 16 in 2003 and the Elite Eight in 2005.

Jeter played college basketball for Ryan at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville and captained his team to the NCAA Division III title in 1991. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1991 and a master's from UWP in 2001.

Jeter was inducted into the UW-Platteville Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006 and was also inducted into the inaugural Hall of Fame class for the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. He became a three-time HOFer in 2013 when Platteville's 1991 national championship team received the school's highest honor.

#### At SUL

In Jeter's first year with the Thunderbirds, they won 10 games on the season, and 5 games in the Western Athletic Conference.

In Coach Jeter's second season with the Thunderbirds, he led the team to it's best start in school history. Jumping out to an 8-2 record to start the year. Many cruicial injuries derailed the season, but the Thundebrirds still finished with a 12-18 record.

### **Assistant Coach - Will Ryan (First Season)**

Will Ryan, the oldest son of well-known College Basketball Hall of Famer and former University of Wisconsin Head Coach Bo Ryan, will join Southern Utah after spending three seasons as the head coach of the Green Bay Phoenix Men's Basketball Team.

Ryan and Coach Jeter have a long history. Jeter was an assistant on the team at Platteville when Ryan played for them, and then again when Ryan transferred to Milwaukee and played under Jeter and his dad, Bo Ryan. They ended up on the same coaching staff at Wisconsin from 2003-05. In 2020, Will was named the eighth Head Coach for the Green Bay Phoenix. helm, he guided a young team to an 8-12 record in Horizon League play and 8-17 overall. Lucas Stieber was named to the League's All-Freshman Team. Despite a 5-25 record in his second season, Cade Meyer and Kamari McGee were named to the All-Freshman team.



### **Assistant Coach - Shaun Gutting (Third Season)**

Coach Gutting comes to SUU from Casper College, where he was the Head Coach for the past 4 years. His career Head Coaching record is 83-35. His team finished first in Region IX North in 2022-23 with a 24-8 record. As a Head Coach, Gutting sent 14 players on to play Division I programs. In 2020, he was selected by TopConnect Leaders as one of the top Junior College coaches in the country. Participating in the 2-day symposium, working with other great young coaches across the country. Before Casper, Gutting was an Assistant Coach at New Mexico Junior College. The program posted a 106-54 record during his time there, sending 27 players to Division I programs over a 5-year span. Gutting was born in Pennsylvania and grew up in Fort Collins, Colorado. He comes from a lineage of coaching with his father, Steve, who coached for over 35 + years between college and high school. He has a Bachelor's in Communication Studies and a Master's in Sports Administration – Secondary Education.



#### **Assistant Coach - Donald Williams (Third Season)**

Coach Williams has over 20 years of coaching experience, including 10 years at the Division I level. Most recently, as the assistant coach at the College of Southern Nevada.

Donald started his coaching career in the Bay Area with the Oakland Soldiers in 1998 while cutting his teeth at San Leandro High School from 1998-2002.

Williams then moved up to the NCAA D1 level at San Jose State for two stints: 2002-2004 and returned to the program as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for George Nessman from 2005-2013.



#### Assistant Coach - Tennessee Owens (Third Season)

Owens comes to SUU by way of Albuquerque Prep School, where he served as Head Coach of its Post-Grad Program, which saw 10 players receive college scholarships. He also served as an Assistant Coach for their national roster, which includes multiple Division 1 players.

Prior to Albuquerque Prep, he was an Assistant for Kazma Basketball Club in Kuwait's First Division League. During his time in Kuwait, he led his team to a second-place finish in the regular season and guided Kazma to the KBA Finals. He handled all player development and aided in opponent scouting and video.

Prior to his coaching career, Owens played basketball at New Mexico State University, where he was part of some of the most dominant teams in program history.

Graduate of New Mexico State University

Father is a long-time basketball coach who has coached in the NBA, G League, NCAA, and FIBA.


