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NEED TO KNOW

- Gonzaga takes its first road trip of the season and visits Arizona State in a true road game Friday at 8 p.m. Pacific. It's only the second all-time meetings between the programs, as the Zags won the first matchup last season, 88-80. The game was tied at halftime and the Sun Devils led 69-67 with 7:21 remaining.
- The Bulldogs are coming off an impressive 90-63 win over No. 23 Creighton in Spokane Tuesday. Graham Ike had 20 points and 10 rebounds, while Braden Huff added 14 points, Mario Saint-Supéry scored 13 off the bench. GU forced 17 turnovers and held the Bluejays to 36.7 percent shooting from the field.
- Following the win, Gonzaga jumped to No. 2 in KenPom's ranking and the ESPN BPI rating. In KenPom, the Zags' defense ranks fifth in the country, while their offense is ninth.
- Graham Ike eclipsed the 2,000-point mark in his career in the win over Creighton. He needed nine points to reach the mark and finished with 20. He sits at 2,011. Ike ranks second among active scorers in NCAA Div. 1, Indiana's Tucker DeVries is first at 2,031. Ike's 927 rebounds also ranks second among active players. He is the only active player with 1,500 points and 900 rebounds in a career. Ike was named preseason All-American by CBS Sports and ESPN, and to the NABC and Naismith Player of the Year and Malone Award watch lists.
- Ike is one of five players in the nation with three double-doubles already this season, as he has a double-double in each of the three games to open the schedule.
- While the Bulldogs only return 36 percent of their scoring from last season, along with 34 percent of their rebounding, the current roster features four 1,000-point career scorers and two more at 853 and 754. Seven Zags have played at least 65 games in their careers, with six averaging at least 20 minutes per game. GU's 2025-26 roster features the 2022-23 Mountain West Preseason Player of the Year, the 2022-23 Big Sky Player of the Year, the 2023-24 WAC Player of the Year, and the 2023-24 Patriot League Player of the Year. KenPom metrics ranks the Bulldogs' roster second in the nation in experience.
- The Zags were ranked No. 21 in the preseason Associated Press poll. It marks the 25th straight season GU has been ranked in the AP poll. It's the 16th straight year the Bulldogs have appeared in the preseason poll. GU joins Duke, Kansas, Kentucky, and North Carolina as the only programs that have appeared in each of the last 16 preseason AP Polls.
- Last season, the Bulldogs advanced to their 26th straight NCAA Tournament, the third-longest active streak in the nation, and finished with a 26-9 record. Gonzaga finished No. 23 in the final AP Poll.
- The Zags extended its NCAA Div. 1 record to 18 straight seasons of at least 25 wins. GU's 28-straight 20-win seasons ranks second for the longest active run in the country.

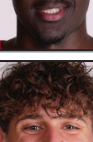

For over 25 years, Mark Few has built one of the greatest dynasties in college basketball. Since taking over at Gonzaga University in 1999, Few has turned a small private school in Spokane, Washington, into a national powerhouse defined by consistency, innovation, and excellence. Entering the 2024–25 season, Few owns the highest active winning percentage in NCAA Division I men’s basketball (.830) with a career record of 741–152. Under his leadership, Gonzaga has: Reached 26 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, Captured 22 WCC regular-season titles and 20 conference tournament crowns, Advanced to two national championship games, five Elite Eights, and thirteen Sweet Sixteens. Few’s program is synonymous with player development, offensive efficiency, and selfless teamwork, underpinned by a culture of humility, discipline, and relentless competitiveness.

Born in 1962, in Creswell, Ore., Few grew up in a small-town environment that shaped his values and drive. A standout multi-sport athlete at Creswell High, he graduated from the University of Oregon (B.S., Physical Education, 1987) and later earned an M.A. in Athletic Administration from Gonzaga (1993). Though he never played college basketball, Few’s sharp basketball mind led him quickly into coaching. After stints at the high school level, he joined Gonzaga as a graduate assistant in 1989 under head coach Dan Fitzgerald. At that time, Gonzaga had never appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Few’s energy and recruiting acumen soon earned him a full-time assistant role, and he helped build the foundation for Gonzaga’s rise. The 1999 Elite Eight run under Dan Monson put the program on the map — and that summer, Gonzaga promoted Few to head coach.

Few’s debut season set the standard: 26–9, both WCC titles, and a Sweet Sixteen appearance. From 2000 to 2004, Gonzaga captured five straight regular-season championships and became a fixture in the national rankings. Under Few’s direction, players such as Dan Dickau, Blake Stepp, and Ronny Turiaf developed into All-Americans and future NBA players. Gonzaga’s hallmark — skill-based, unselfish basketball — stood out in an era dominated by athleticism and isolation play. By the mid-2000s, the Bulldogs were no longer Cinderella. The 2006 team, led by national Player of the Year Adam Morrison, made another Sweet Sixteen, proving Gonzaga belonged among the nation’s elite. Few continued to challenge his teams with ambitious schedules, seeking matchups with programs like Duke, North Carolina, and Arizona. In 2013, Gonzaga achieved its first-ever No. 1 AP ranking and top NCAA Tournament seed. The 2014–15 team finished 35–3 and reached the Elite Eight, cementing Few’s status as one of the sport’s premier coaches.

Gonzaga’s transformation into a national powerhouse peaked in this era. The 2016–17 team (37–2) reached the national championship game for the first time, falling narrowly to North Carolina. Two years later, the 2018–19 squad featuring Rui Hachimura, Brandon Clarke, and Killian Tillie reached another Elite Eight after multiple top-10 wins. The 2020–21 Bulldogs produced one of the most dominant seasons in NCAA history: Opened 31–0, led the nation in offense, Featured stars Jalen Suggs, Corey Kispert, and Drew Timme, Reached the national championship game after Suggs’ iconic half-court buzzer-beater in the Final Four. Though they fell to Baylor, Gonzaga’s undefeated run into the final cemented their place in basketball lore.

Few’s adaptability has kept Gonzaga among the elite. 2021–22: Future NBA lottery pick Chet Holmgren led another Sweet Sixteen run. 2022–23: Gonzaga reached the Elite Eight, highlighted by a dramatic comeback win over UCLA. 2023–24: The Bulldogs extended their NCAA streak to 25 straight appearances, captured another WCC title, and remained nationally ranked. Few continues to innovate, blending transfers, international recruits, and freshmen into balanced, championship-caliber teams.

Few has coached 22 All-Americans and produced a steady pipeline of NBA players, including: Domantas Sabonis, Rui Hachimura, Jalen Suggs, Chet Holmgren, Corey Kispert, Kelly Olynyk, Zach Collins, and Andrew Nembhard. Gonzaga players are recognized for their basketball IQ, skill, and team-first mentality, reflecting Few’s developmental philosophy.

Few’s leadership extends to the international stage: Assistant Coach, Team USA (Gold – 2024 Paris Olympics), Head Coach, 2015 Pan American Games (Bronze), Assistant, 2012 FIBA Americas U18 (Gold), Contributor, 2019 FIBA World Cup staff.

Off the court, Mark and Marcy Few are deeply engaged in philanthropy. Through Coaches vs. Cancer and the Community Cancer Fund, they’ve raised over \$25 million for research, treatment access, and family support across the Inland Northwest.

The Fews live in Spokane, Washington, and have four children — A.J., Joseph, Julia, and Colt. Away from basketball, Mark Few is an avid fly fisherman and outdoorsman, often found exploring the rivers and lakes of the Pacific Northwest — a pursuit that mirrors the balance and perspective he brings to his life and career.

SCOUTING THE SUN DEVILS

- Arizona State beat Utah Tech Sunday, 81-66.
- Massamba Diop led all scorers with 18 points. Santiago Trouet added 13 points and 10 rebounds. Pepperdine transfer Moe Odum had 14 points, six assists, six rebounds and three steals.
- The Sun Devils opened their season with an 81-64 win over Southern Utah in Tempe on Nov. 4.
- In the first all-time matchup last year, Gonzaga beat Arizona State in Spokane 88-80 in a back-and-forth battle. Braden Huff led the way for the Zags with 21 points. Basheer Jihad added 22 points and 10 boards for the Sun Devils.
- Arizona State was picked to finish last out of 16 teams in the Big 12 preseason poll.
- Arizona State has eight incoming transfers, highlighted by Marcus Adams Jr. and Moe Odum.
- Arizona State returns one player from last year's team that went 13-20.

SERIES INFO

- Gonzaga won the first all-time meeting last season in Spokane, 88-80. Braden Huff scored 21 points off the bench to lead the Zags, while Adam Miller had eight points and three assists for Arizona State.
- The Zags have a 60-29 record with all of the current schools in the Big 12 Conference.

UP NEXT

- Gonzaga welcomes Southern Utah to the McCarthy Athletic Center Monday at 6 p.m.
- GU has won two of the three all-time meetings against the Thunderbirds, including the most recent in November 2012 where the Zags prevailed with a 38-point victory margin (103-65)
- The first-ever matchup was a win for Gonzaga in 1995 (77-60), but the Thunderbirds won their next matchup with the Bulldogs in 1996 (47-71)
- The Thunderbirds hold the record for the most blocks scored against Gonzaga by a single player (5) in program history. Jayson Cheesman had five blocks against the Zags in the 2012 matchup.
- Also in the 2012 matchup, Gonzaga tied its program best for the most steals in a game (18).
- SUU was picked to finish last in the WAC Preseason Coaches Poll, but there is room for improvement with their essentially all-new team.
- The Thunderbirds have a reloaded transfer roster – Isaiah Cottrell from UNLV, Dylan Jones from Fairleigh Dickson, Jaiden Feroah from Holy Cross, Zach Bell from Jacksonville, Jalen Lee from Long Island, and Tanner Hayhurst from the College of Southern Idaho (and BYU before that).

EXPERIENCE IS KEY

- While the Bulldogs only return 36 percent of their scoring from last season, along with 34 percent of their rebounding, the current roster features four 1,000-point career scorers and two more at 853 and 754.
- Eight Zags have played at least 65 games in their careers, with seven averaging at least 20 minutes.
- KenPom metrics ranks the Bulldogs' lineup second in the nation in experience. KenPom's "experience" statistic measures average number of full DI seasons played, weighted by minutes played. GU is at 2.78, while Indiana leads at 3.03.
- The average age of Gonzaga's roster, featuring 12

scholarship players and four walk-ons, is 21.2 years old. The Brooklyn Nets, by comparison, are the NBA's youngest team at 23.3 years old.

- GU's roster features the 2022-23 Mountain West Conference Preseason Player of the Year, the 2022-23 Big Sky Conference Player of the Year, the 2023-24 WAC Player of the Year, and the 2023-24 Patriot League Player of the Year.

- Gonzaga's depth and balance may be showcased the most in the wing position, boasting four players heights at 6-foot seven inches.
- Between Steele Venters, Tyon Grant-Foster, and Jalen Warley, the trio combines for 2,908 career points in 272 appearances.

SHOWCASING THE DEPTH

- In the Zags' 83-68 victory over Oklahoma, GU's bench outscored its counterparts, 38-8.
- Tyon Grant-Foster and Jalen Warley came off the bench to combine for 27 points and 15 rebounds.
- Three Bulldogs came off the bench and played over 20 minutes, with Steele Venters adding 12 minutes.

A DEFENSIVE DELIGHT

- The Bulldogs defense held Texas Southern to just 25 percent shooting from the field in the season-opening win, including 3-of-21 (14 percent) from behind-the-arc.
- Gonzaga forced 17 TSU turnovers behind nine steals.
- The Zags outscored the Tigers 52-16 in the second half, while limiting Texas Southern to 5-of-30 shooting from the field, including 0-of-11 from three.
- Jalen Warley had four steals in his Gonzaga debut.

IKE NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Graham Ike was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches and Naismith Trophy preseason watch lists for the Division I Player of the Year.
- Ike is 28 points from 2,000 in his career. He has started in 109 of his 116 career appearances. Last season led the WCC in field goal percentage (59.8), was third in scoring (17.3), and fifth in rebounding (7.3). He is coming off back-to-back First Team All-Conference selections. The Colorado native was named Preseason All-American by multiple outlets after earning the WCC Tournament Most Outstanding Player honor last year.
- The 2026 NABC Division I Player of the Year - selected by a nationwide vote of Division I head coaches - will be announced the week of the 2026 Men's Final Four.

IKE NAMED TO MALONE AWARD WATCH LIST

- Graham Ike was named to the Karl Malone Award Watch List. The Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame announced the 20 watch-list candidates.
- Named after Class of 2010 Hall of Famer and two-time NBA Most Valuable Player Karl Malone, the annual honor in its 11th year recognizes the top power forwards in Division I men's college basketball. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates in November, which has now been narrowed to 10.
- In late January, the watch list of 20 players for the 2026 Karl Malone Award will be narrowed to 10, and then in late February, to just five. In March, the five finalists will be presented to Malone and the Hall of Fame's selection committee, where winners will be se-

lected. The Selection Committee for the Karl Malone Award is composed of top men's college basketball personnel, including media members, head coaches, sports information directors, and Hall of Famers.

- The winner of the 2026 Karl Malone Award will be presented on a to be determined date, along with the other four members of the Men's Starting Five. Additional awards being presented include the Bob Cousy Award (Point Guard), Jerry West Award (Shooting Guard), Julius Erving (Small Forward), and the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award (Center).

ZAGS PICKED WCC PRESEASON FAVORITE

- For the 23rd time in the last 25 seasons, the Gonzaga men's basketball team was selected as favorites in the West Coast Conference preseason coaches' poll.

- With the exception of the 2023-24 and 2017-18 seasons, the Zags have been first place in every WCC preseason poll since 2001.

- GU received nine of the league's 12 first place votes in this year's poll. Coaches are not allowed to vote for their own program.

- Saint Mary's and San Francisco collected the other three first place votes in this year's poll. Santa Clara and Oregon State rounded out the top-half of the league.

- The Bulldogs have won 24 of the last 28 WCC regular season championships, 20 of which have been won outright. GU has 26 WCC regular season titles overall, including 22 of the last 25.

- Gonzaga has appeared in 28 straight WCC Tournament Championship games, which is the longest streak of its kind in the nation. The Zags have won the conference tournament title 11 times in the last 14 years.

HUFF AND IKE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-WCC

- Braden Huff and Graham Ike were both named to the conference's preseason team.

- Ike earned the recognition for the third straight season, while Huff makes his first appearance.

GONZAGA RANKED 20TH IN COACHES POLL

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 20 in the preseason USA TODAY Sports/Coaches poll.

- GU opens in the top-20 of the poll for the 13th straight year. GU appears in the coaches' preseason poll for the 16th straight season.

- Purdue was No. 1 in the preseason poll for the first time in program history, collecting 18 of the 31 first-place votes. Houston received 12 first-place votes and was No. 2. Defending national champion Florida also received a first-place vote and was No. 3. UConn and Duke round out the Top 5.

ZAGS OPEN SEASON RANKED NO. 21 IN AP POLL

- Gonzaga was ranked No. 21 in the preseason Associated Press poll. The Bulldogs received 387 points in the preseason rankings.

- This marks the 25th straight season GU has been ranked in the AP Poll and the 16th consecutive year the Zags have appeared in the preseason poll.

- Gonzaga joins Duke, Kansas, Kentucky, and North Carolina as the only programs to appear in each of the last 16 preseason AP Polls.

STEADY IN THE POLLS

- The Bulldogs have appeared in 161 of the last 175 AP Polls (92 percent) since the start of the 2016 season, ranking only

behind Kansas's 169 appearances.

- Gonzaga has averaged a No. 7.1 ranking in the AP Polls since 2017, second only to Kansas (6.3).

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

- The Zags have now won 22 straight regular season-openers dating back to a 73-66 loss to Saint Joseph's in the 2003 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in New York City.

- GU has won 36 consecutive regular season home-openers since a 73-65 loss to Boise State on Dec. 7, 1988.

- Gonzaga has won all 21 regular season home-openers in the McCarthy Athletic Center and all 27 regular season home-openers under Mark Few.

ZAGS TAME WOLVES IN EXHIBITION WIN

- Gonzaga eased to a 111-53 exhibition victory over Western Oregon in the final tune-up for the regular season.

- The Zags led 22-14 at the 12:30 mark, before going on a 28-0 run over the next eight minutes to pull away. GU led for over 38 minutes, and by as many as 63 points. The Bulldogs led 57-23 at halftime.

- Braden Huff led five Zag double-digit scorers with a game-high 21 points on 8-of-10 shooting from the field. Graham Ike made all seven of his shots from the field and finished with 18 points. Ismaila Diagne had 14 points and 10 rebounds. Davis Fogle went 11-for-11 from the free-throw line and added 13 points. Adam Miller contributed 10 points.

- The Bulldogs made 64.1 percent from the field and 25-of-28 from the free-throw line. Gonzaga also outrebounded WOU, 41-21 and had a 74-10 advantage in points in the paint. The Zags turned 22 Western Oregon turnovers in to a 36-8 advantage in points off turnovers.

BULLDOGS CRUISE IN OPENING EXHIBITION WIN

- Gonzaga started the season with a 111-62 exhibition victory over Northwest (Wash.) Oct. 19.

- Five Zags finished in double-digit scoring, with four others at eight points or more, led by Davis Fogle's 18 points. In his collegiate debut, the freshman made eight of his 12 shots from the field.

- Braeden Smith added 15 points, four assists, and three steals. Braden Huff and Graham Ike both had 13 points, while Mario Saint-Supéry chipped in 12 points.

- Jalen Warley grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds.

- The Bulldogs forced Northwest, also playing in its season-opening exhibition, into 22 turnovers.

- The Eagles were also limited to 34.9 percent shooting from the field. GU was 54.1 percent from the field.

- The Zags finished with 23 assists and 10 steals.

- Gonzaga outrebounded Northwest, 57-30, while pulling down 20 offensive rebounds.

- The Bulldogs outscored the Eagles in the paint, 60-18, and 31-6 in fast break points.

- Gonzaga led 21-16 at the 10:56 mark of the first half, before going on a 15-3 run to open the margin. The Zags led 50-28 at halftime. GU never trailed and its largest lead was 49 points.

THE SLATE

- No. 5 St. John's and No. 3 Houston are potential opponents for Gonzaga on the final day of the Players Era Championship. The Bulldogs open the event against No. 15 Alabama on Nov. 24.

- The Zags host No. 23 Creighton on Nov. 11. No. 9 Kentucky and GU meet in Nashville, Tenn., on Dec. 5, before Gonzaga faces No. 12 UCLA in the Seattle Hoops Showdown

- Gonzaga welcomes Oklahoma to Spokane on Nov. 8; the Sooners received one vote in the poll.

- West Coast Conference foe Saint Mary's (Jan. 31 and Feb. 28) received two votes in the preseason rankings.

- During their non-conference slate, the Zags could face up to eight teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season.

- Seven non-conference opponents won 20 or more games in 2024-25 and finished inside the Top 75 in last year's NET rankings.
