COMMENTS

Welcome to this afternoon's Isthmian Premier League fixture against Dartford. I've had to go to press ahead of Tuesday's trip to Brentwood, but we're all hoping — of course — that we've been able build on last Saturday's solid start down here with a win in that one, and we'll be looking to push on again, here today, against Dartford.

Chatham came to Clarence Park as one of the pre-season favourites, and we expected a tough test. A hybrid full-time/part-time side, and a strong and physical side, they're expected to be pushing at the top and it was important for us to be on our game from the off.

I thought that, overall, we did enough to win it. The first half wasn't a great spectacle. For our part, I thought we were a bit too direct, which didn't fit in with the way we'd set up to play. We'd packed the midfield in response to how we expected them to position themselves, but that did require a bit of discipline on our part and our being prepared to be patient and play it out from the back was part of that. I didn't think we really saw that first half, and the game was a bit messy as a result.

I was happy to get the lads in at 0-0 at half

time, and we talked it through. I thought we were altogether more positive after the break. We stuck to the plan, and we really controlled the game. We had a number of chances and, on another day, Lewis's strike dips in instead of coming back off the bar, but we couldn't quite make the breakthrough. I thought we had a decent shout for a penalty — the referee explained that their lad had got something on the ball, but he came in from behind and I've certainly seen those given.

A word about the lads who came on during the game — all made a positive impact and really helped us to keep the pressure on to the end. It's very much a squad game these days and everyone here will have their part to play. We saw that last Saturday and Paul and I are very aware that how we use our subs can be the difference come the end of a game. And can I just say how great it was to see over 1,100 people at the Park during what is still the holiday season. We need you all behind us. We know that we have our part to play in return, and hopefully we can deliver on that.

In the end, the draw against Chatham wasn't the worst start. We can be really

pleased with the amount of possession we enjoyed and pressure we were able to apply. It's a game of fine margins of course, and if Lewis's shot had been a fraction lower, we'd have gone into Tuesday's game with three points rather than one – but it's very early days and the key thing was that we didn't lose. Magnus didn't really have a lot to do, behind a very well drilled defence, and they should all be pleased with an opening day clean sheet. Yes, it'd have been nice to have got off to a winning start, but the draw gave us plenty to build on and we'll take that and move on.

Dartford started the season as one of the favourites, so this was never going to be an easy fixture. I don't think it would be unfair to say that their 4-0 defeat at Dulwich was one of the more eye-catching results from the first day, but I'd never read too much into one game, especially the opening day game and one where the losing team has played half the game with ten men. They hosted another of the red-hot favourites, Billericay, in mid-week and will no doubt have been fired up for that one. All of which sets today's game up very nicely.

After today we travel to Folkstone (at Margate of course, while Folkstone sort out their 3G pitch) on Saturday 23rd before welcoming Cheshunt here on Bank Holiday Monday. We look forward to welcoming you back here for that one.

ST ALBANS CITY 0-0 CHATHAM TOWN

9/8/25 - Isthmian Premier League - ATT: 1,119

As a new season beckons for The Saints, we embark upon a new challenge in the Isthmian Premier Division. Despite the disappointment of last season, City are optimistic of returning to step 2 of the non-league football pyramid. St Albans' first fixture sees us come up against Chatham Town at Clarence Park, who, after last year's 9th-place finish, will be a tough test for St Albans.



The Saints started as the brighter of the two sides; Perez Duah tried his luck early on but saw his effort go over the bar. Chatham then began to grow into the game, creating a good opening down the left-hand side through Sene-Richardson, who cut it back to Garlinge, but Sweet was back to make the block from his shot. The next chance fell to the Chats and Sene Richardson, who whipped a

free kick just outside the area narrowly over the bar. St Albans then started to find their flow again with Lewis Page whipping a ball into the box, which Chatham flicked behind just past the post for a corner. In the 30th minute, Folarin found himself in the box on the right side and slid in Moynes at the near post, but he got poor contact on his shot and fired wide of the near post for the Chats. In the 40th minute Lewis Page picked up the ball in an advanced position left of the Chatham goal and fired a vicious drive across goal which was saved by Molyneux. Ryley Scott was there for the rebound, but again Molyneux got down smartly to make the double save. In the 45th minute, a beautiful bit of interplay between Banton and Sery down the right flank resulted in Sery firing a ball across the face of goal, but no one was there to convert.

The Saints fashioned the first chance of the second half; Lewis Page delivered a pinpoint free-kick towards the back post, and Alex Wall was there to meet it, but his header was straight at the keeper. In the 70th minute Alex Wall did well to win the ball back in the Chatham half, driving towards goal; before unleashing a strike at the keeper, but it was directed too close to him, as he made a routine save.



Five minutes later, after a long throw-in from Lewis Page was headed away, he pounced on the loose bouncing ball and instinctively fired the ball from outside the area, beating the goalkeeper but striking the bar. In the 85th minute, substitute Jasper Mather did brilliantly to escape his man down the left wing. He got to the byline and cut it back for Banton, but his shot was blocked for a Saints corner. In the 90th minute, Lewis

Page hung a corner up at the back post; Fyfield was there to head it down towards the bottom corner, but again the keeper was there to meet it. Despite the Saints' flurry of chances towards the end, they were unable to find the opening, and the game finished all square.

DARTFORD

Dartford Football Club was formed in early 1888 by members of the Dartford Workingmen's club and for the first few seasons, played only friendly fixtures with the occasional foray into cup football. A run to the final of the Kent Senior cup in 1894 encouraged the club committee to enter Dartford as a Founder-Member of the Kent League for the 1894-95 season. It was in October 1895 that Dartford first played in the FA Cup.

Dartford had many successes in a number of leagues and cup competitions in their long history.

The 2003-04 season saw the first team finish in 16th position in the Eastern Division but the news that everybody had been waiting for came on 10 April 2004 when Dartford Borough Council announced it would provide funding and a site for the building of a stadium in Dartford in time for the 2006-07 season. Construction work began on 14 November 2005. The 2004-05 season saw the restructuring of non-league football. Dartford remained in the Southern League in a division made up of largely teams from the Isthmian League. The season as a whole was disappointing

with the Darts on the edge of the relegation zone for much of the season. Manager Tommy Sampson left the club towards the end of January and director and former player and manager Tony Burman took over on a caretaker basis. An early upsurge in results pulled the Darts away from the relegation zone to retain their Southern League status. Meanwhile, the Reserves under the managership of Bob Pittaway improved on the previous season's poor performances. An influx of players previously under Bob's guidance at Tonbridge Angels and several youth team players from the previous season's Under-18s helped the team achieve a creditable mid-table position. Dartford finished the 2005-06 season in seventh place. Following the second stage of restructuring the non-League football system, the club moved into the Isthmian League Division One South.

Dartford played their first game at new stadium Princes Park on 11 November 2006, less than twelve months after building work began. They beat Horsham YMCA 4-2 in front of an all ticket capacity crowd of 4,097. On 20 July 2007 Dartford hosted Crystal Palace in a friendly match at Princes Park as part of Dave Martin's

transfer to the Eagles. The game ended in Crystal Palace winning 3–0 in front of a sold-out crowd of 4,097, exactly the same attendance as the first game played at Princes Park. After a strong season, including an undefeated run of 21 matches, they finished as champions, securing automatic promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division.

Dartford finished their first season back in the Isthmian Premier (2008–09) in 8th position thanks to a 90th-minute strike by Richard O'Reilly. The following season the "Darts" won the title on 10 April 2010 when they beat Kingstonian, who were at that point the team in second place, 6–2 away. They won the title with six games to spare & began the 2010–11 season in the Conference South. In the 2010–11 season, Dartford finished tenth in the league after a turbulent Christmas which saw them in the relegation zone. They won the Kent Senior Cup for the tenth time against Bromley at Princes Park after a coin-toss decided the venue of the final. It ended 4–1, with Bradbrook, Hayes, Harris and an own goal giving them victory. The 2011–12 season saw Darts hovering around the top 5 up until Christmas, being 14 points behind leaders Woking. Starting with the new year victory over Welling, The Darts amassed 49 points from 21 games (fifteen wins, four draws and two defeats) at one stage closing the gap on Woking to only five points, eventually finishing on 88 points, nine short of the title.

They then played Basingstoke Town over two legs in the play-off semi-final, winning both games, 1–0 and 2–1.[3] On 13 May 2012, Dartford beat Welling United 1–0 at Princes Park in the Conference

South league play-off in front of a sellout crowd of 4,088, and returned to the Conference Premier for 2012–13. The 2012–13 season saw Dartford surprise many of the top full-time clubs, recording wins against eventual champions Mansfield Town, Kidderminster Harriers, Wrexham, Newport County, Grimsby Town, Hereford United, and a memorable double over Luton Town. Despite this, the Darts failed to perform well against the bottom half sides, losing to ten of the sixteen teams that finished below them, therefore finishing 8th in their return to the Conference Premier. Dartford had a poor 2013–14 season and finished 22nd, relegating them to the Conference South after two years. However, Salisbury City were demoted to the Conference South on 13 June 2014 after missing a deadline for paying their debts. With Hereford United having already been expelled from the Football Conference for the same reason, Dartford therefore became the second team (alongside Chester) to be reprieved from relegation.

But after a season drifting in and out of the bottom four, Dartford got relegated to the renamed National League South. In the 2017–18 season, Dartford narrowly missed out on automatic promotion via goal difference to Havant & Waterlooville. They played Braintree Town in the play-off semi-final and lost 1–0. It was announced after the play-off that Tony Burman and his management team would step down from their managerial positions. A few days later ex-players Adam Flanagan and Jamie Coyle were confirmed as the new Dartford joint-managers. The 2019–20 season saw managers Adam Flanagan and Jamie Coyle removed from their position. On 10

October, Steve King was announced as the new manager of the club on a three-year deal. Having taken the job with the team in the bottom four, King went on to guide Dartford to the play-off final, which saw Dartford lose on penalties to Weymouth.

Steve King was let go, with Alan Dowson appointed for the start of the 22–23 season. The 22–23 started well, with the team reaching the top spot in November after beating Welling 5–1. The team remained in second or third spot all season with wins of 4–1 away and 4–0 at home against Ebbsfleet among the highlights. Ebbsfleet went on to win the league title by 20 points, with Darts finishing in second and losing the play-off semi-final to St Albans City on penalties.

The 23–24 saw the team struggle, with Alan Dowson let go in January. Tony Burnham took charge, but results did not improve and Ady Pennock – a former Gillingham FC player and manager – took charge for the final 10 games.

His appointment would prove to be too late, with the team ending the season relegated to the Isthmian Premier League.

For 24–25, Pennock swept in the changes, effectively bringing in a whole new team for the beginning of the season and putting his trust in the successful Academy, with eight players making the step up to first team football.

The side finished third in the league after a brilliant late run, before losing to Dover in the Play-off Final at Princes Park. For 25/26, Ady has brought in a number of new faces as he hopes to go one better.

FUNDRAISER TO FIGHT CANCER

St Albans City FC in support of Phil Coates

St Albans City FC are in full support of the Tour D 4 ride to fight cancer. Following Sir Chris Hoy's diagnosis, Tour D 4 setup a new fundraising initiative. A charity bike ride that aims to shine a spotlight on what a Stage 4 cancer diagnosis can look like and to demonstrate that it is possible to live well and lead a happy life alongside this devastating diagnosis.

Phil's story?

I'm doing it because I'm one of the lucky ones. My prostate cancer was caught early, and I feel so desperately sorry for those like Chris who aren't so lucky.

My story starts in 2015 when ironically having had mainly overnight waterworks

problems I went on one of my usual Sunday morning bike rides with friends and had to stop a number of times. I decided the following day to book an appointment with my doctor.

Having seen my dad struggle with an enlarged prostate I thought I might have the same problem. Fortunately, my doctor suggested a PSA test.

This proved to be very high, and a subsequent test 2 weeks later was even higher.

Fortunately, after considering the options radical prostatectomy surgery was arranged quickly.

Any man going through this situation is glad of valuable help and the Specialist Nurses at Prostate Cancer UK gave that help.

In return I decided that it was my duty to raise both awareness and funds for the charity

I did this in conjunction with St Albans City Football Club staff and supporters (I had become the club's Community Manager at around the time of my diagnosis)

Since that time the club have raised awareness of a disease that affects 1 in 8 men partly by participating 6 times in the charity's Football to Amsterdam cycle rides with Saints riders ranging in numbers from 3 to 54 and also personally taking part in 16 Jeff Stelling March for Men Marathon Marches going between various football league grounds. Having totalled over 1000 miles on these rides and 500 on the marches St Albans City FC have raised just over £185,000 for the charity.

LEAGUE RESPECT STATEMENT

The Isthmian Football League strongly supports the Football Association's statement that there should be a zero-tolerance approach against all forms of discrimination.
