Peak Vista Partners with WIC and CPCD to Provide Wrap-Around Services to COS Families

Colorado Springs, Colo. – Peak Vista Community Health Centers (Peak Vista) partners with El Paso County Public Health Women, Infants and Children (WIC) and Community Partnership for Child Development (CPCD) to provide easy access to wrap-around services for families in Colorado Springs. The two organizations are onsite at Peak Vista's Pediatric Health Center at International Circle (2828 International Circle, Ste 140, Colorado Springs, CO 80910) on certain days of the week through the end of the year for families to ask questions, enroll in programs and get the support they need. Walk-ins for these services are accepted, and those interested do not need to be Peak Vista patients to visit these groups.

"Offering these complementary services in one location is so helpful for caregivers and their hectic schedules," said Mayra Apresa, practice manager of community-based practices & programs at Peak Vista. "We know caring for children is hard. Creating this hub of services not just for our patients, but for the whole community was important to us. If we've made caregivers' lives even a fraction easier, that's a win."

Peak Vista's Pediatric Health Center at International Circle sees more than 1,500 patients between zero to 18 years of age annually. In addition to providing medical, dental and behavioral health care, this health center hosts several other internal wrap-around services, including:

- The First Visitor Program, which provides free education, resources and support to caregivers of children ages zero to five.
- A Well-Child Waiting Area, in which staff members watch over patients' kids during appointments for free to allow them to focus on their health or their sick children's health.
- The Care Coordination department, which connects patient families to local resources and helps them reach their health goals.

WIC

WIC provides supplemental food benefits; breastfeeding support; information about healthy eating; connections to free, healthy food; and referrals to care beyond WIC. A WIC representative is onsite at the Pediatric Health Center at International Circle on the third
