# **WHO WE ARE**

Peak Vista Community Health Centers is a leading advocate and health care provider for individuals and families with limited access to quality care in the Pikes Peak and East Central regions of Colorado. Our more than 800 dedicated health care providers, clinical support staff, and administrative professionals are committed to providing quality, patient-centered medical, dental, behavioral health, and care coordination services in the communities we serve. Peak Vista is supported by many volunteers, partner agencies, granters, and donors.



## DEAR FRIENDS OF PEAK VISTA,

Fifty years ago, Peak Vista began as a volunteer-run clinic, open just a few nights a week in the heart of downtown. Through the hard work and persistence of our founders and the many employees who carried the torch beyond them, we are where we stand today: 28 health centers strong and serving 89,000 patients across Colorado's Pikes Peak and Eastern Plains regions. As we celebrated our 50<sup>th</sup> year, we made a promise to continue on the path our founders set for us. We would provide care to all, no matter their ability to pay or insurance status.

#### ANSWERING THE CALL

On January 13, 2021, Peak Vista administered its first COVID-19 vaccine to a member of the Colorado Springs community.

- The COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic, operated out of our Health Center at Jet Wing, vaccinated over 500 people a day during its peak.
- Peak Vista worked with the city and county to set-up equity vaccine clinics to ensure that all residents had access to the vaccine, including community outreach in areas like Strasburg, Calhan, and Divide.
- In 2021, we administered more than 46,000 COVID-19 vaccines to our community.

#### MEETING PATIENTS WHERE THEY ARE

In September, Peak Vista broke ground on its newest health center: the Health Center Downtown. This new location (which opened in April 2022) provides medical, dental, behavioral health, and care coordination services to members of the community, including those experiencing, or at risk of experiencing, homelessness.

#### **LOOKING FORWARD**

In 2022, Peak Vista continues to adapt to meet the needs of our community. Several exciting projects are on the horizon, including an expansion of behavioral health services, and a focus on patient-centered, value-based care.






## **Age Categories**




# Patients experiencing *homelessness*

Peak Vista's Health Center at Rio Grande focused on providing care to those experiencing homelessness. A key feature of this health center was that appointments were not required. Services at Rio Grande moved to our new Health Center Downtown in early 2022.

## A closer look...

The 2021 Point-in-Time report for Colorado Springs and El Paso County listed 629 households (without children) as homeless. Due to restraints from the COVID-19 pandemic, the report was only able to count those that were in emergency, transitional, or safe haven shelters. In all likelihood, the number of families experiencing homelessness is much higher.

#### **Behind the Numbers**

**15%** of Peak Vista patients are uninsured, compared to the **7%** of uninsured people in our general service area.

#### What does this mean?

Peak Vista is providing needed health care services to those who may not have been able to afford it otherwise.

**John** is a patient at Peak Vista's Health Center at Rio Grande, and he, at the time of this interaction, was experiencing homelessness. John suffered a stroke four years ago. In his first interactions with our health care team, John had expressed his distrust in the health care community.

Days before the COVID-19 shutdown in March of 2020, John had his left leg amputated. He was working through his new normal slowly, but surely, with the team at Rio Grande. Staff at the health center would frequently pick him up from the nearby shelter and accompany him to and from his appointments. Over time, they noticed that his wheelchair was falling apart. Staff at the health center rallied to find John a motorized chair to replace his old one, connecting with several local agencies.


After finding a motorized wheelchair, Peak Vista reached out to its community partners, Homeward Pikes Peak and the CSFD CARES program, to locate John after he had to move out of the shelter. Through their street outreach teams, the two organizations were able to find John and bring him to the Health Center at Rio Grande to receive his chair.

## **CLINICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS**

## **Family Medicine Residency**

With eight slots available per year, our residency program is a traditional **three-year Family Medicine Residency** with community support from local hospitals and specialty physicians. As the only primary care residency program in the Pikes Peak region, the program allows residents to work with attending physicians, shadowing surgeries and procedures in both inpatient and outpatient settings. Peak Vista hosts rotations for outpatient pediatrics, family medicine, gynecology, obstetrics, community medicine, patient centered medical home, homeless health care, and geriatrics.

In June 2021, the Family Medicine Residency program graduated its third class and welcomed its sixth class. The sixth class of residents will graduate in 2024, marking the conclusion of the program.

## **APRN Fellowship Program**

The APRN Fellowship is a 13-month, full-time employed/benefited position for transitioning or recently graduated, licensed APRNs who desire to increase their family practice competence and confidence in a progressive, collaborative learning environment. The Fellowship is accredited as a Practice Transition Program by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation. The 13-month-long program combines mentorship, problem-based learning, and hands-on clinical experience. The Fellowship experience is primarily in the Health Center at Union with rotations in Women's Services, Pediatrics, and some specialties.

In August 2021, the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Fellowship graduated its sixth class. The seventh class of Fellows began in September 2021.

## **Other Opportunities**

Peak Vista offers a wide range of both **clinical and non-clinical** continuing education opportunities for those seeking hands-on training and experience in a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) setting. We have many opportunities for a **wide variety of students**.







## **COVID-19 VACCINE**

Peak Vista was honored to be one of the first vaccine providers in its community. During its peak, the vaccine clinic operating out of the Health Center at Jet Wing provided more than 500 vaccines per day. By the end of the year, the organization provided more than **46,000** vaccines to its community.



**Governor Jared Polis** visited the Health Center at Jet Wing to see the vaccine operation in 2021.



**Vaccine equity** was a top priority. Peak Vista partnered with the Salvation Army R.J. Montgomery Center and Springs Rescue Mission to provide the vaccine to those experiencing homelessness. It also hosted multiple vaccine clinics at its Health Center at Rio Grande, a health center dedicated to providing care to those experiencing homelessness.

Peak Vista hosted vaccine equity clinics, in partnership with several organizations, to ensure that minority populations had vaccine access readily available.

The organization also set up vaccine clinics in rural parts of Colorado, such as Divide, Strasburg, and Calhan.

## HEALTH CENTER DOWNTOWN

Peak Vista broke ground on the Health Center Downtown on September 7, 2021. The health center will provide medical, dental, behavioral health, and care coordination services to members of the community, including those at risk of, or currently experiencing, homelessness. (Featured above)



0-3 PROGRAM

Peak Vista, alongside the El Paso County Department of Human Services (DHS), created the Children, Youth, and Family Services 0-3 Program. The program pairs a DHS caseworker and Peak Vista nurse practitioner together on home visits investigating families of suspected abuse or neglect. The nurse practitioner examines the children and helps the parents understand critical care issues, such as safe sleep and nutrition, while the caseworker completes their survey. The program was recognized in 2021 with an Achievement Award from the National Association of Counties (NACo), honoring innovative, effective county government programs that strengthen services for residents.



## ANOTHER MILESTONE

The **Developmental Disabilities Health Center** at Peak Vista celebrated its tenth anniversary in 2021. The DDHC provides care services to adults with developmental disabilities and is one of the few of its kind in the nation.

## **EMPTY STOCKING FUND CAMPAIGN**

The 38<sup>th</sup> Annual Gazette Charities – El Pomar Foundation Empty Stocking Fund Campaign celebrated another successful fundraising year of providing resources for local health and human services in the Pikes Peak region.

Peak Vista was one of 20 entities to receive funding from the Empty Stocking Fund. Overall, the organization received **\$112,143** for its Compassionate Care Fund. Peak Vista also received a \$16,420 match from the El Pomar Foundation and \$5,747 from the Bruni Foundation. The funds provided to the Compassionate Care Fund allow Peak Vista to reduce financial barriers for patients in need, providing access to obtain specialty consultations, procedures, or other medically-indicated therapeutic or diagnostic modalities.






**Samantha,** a single mother of two children, moved to Colorado Springs to pursue a new career. After discovering that she was pregnant with her second child, Samantha was at a loss for where she could receive support. She didn't know many people in town and was still new to the area.

Samantha heard about Peak Vista and its many services, including whole-person primary care, social support services, and connections to local community resources. She became a patient at our Lane Family Health Center and Women's Health Center, and her daughters became patients of the Pediatric Health Center at International Circle.

"From the moment you first call in, to when you actually see your doctor, and when you're leaving, it's just smoothest, easiest process I've ever had. It's the best experience I've ever had with a doctor."





## PEAK VISTA LOCATIONS
