- Serve just over 60,000 people, of which over 27,000 were children. Each person was treated individually, with the highest possible quality of care.
- Contribute to our community's economic future by employing over 550 people.
- Open 3 additional service sites to see an additional 5,000 patients.
- Create or expand our collaboration with over 185 community partners.

Beth-El School of Nursing in senior-focused care through the Lane Family Senior Health Center within the Lane Center for Academic Sciences. As we confront changes in the healthcare landscape, sustainability remains a primary focus. While the exact outcome of healthcare reform remains unclear, our planning and strategy is flexible to account for the possibility of changes in the way the uninsured access healthcare. Peak Vista IMPACTS

2011 began with a partnership designed to bring care to a completely new population. The Developmental Disabilities Health Center's mission is exemplified by the paintings that hang in the lobby. These paintings were created by J. Bishop who was born with a disability resulting in severe physical challenges and the inability to speak.



Developmental Disabilities Health Center Opening January 2011

The Moreno Health Center also marks a new partnership, by bringing medical care into a behavioral setting. Patients are enabled to see both categories of providers at one location, giving them the opportunity to establish one comprehensive medical home.

Peak Vista received accreditation as a Patient Centered Medical Home. This model emphasizes a healthcare setting that facilitates partnerships between individual patients and their personal providers, and when appropriate, the patient's family. This ensures that patients get the indicated care when and where they need it.



Patient Centered Medical Home Accreditation February 2011

The Outreach Department received a needed tool in its efforts to enroll eligible but not enrolled families in Medicaid/CHP+ and educate them about services at Peak Vista. The van is utilized at a variety of community events, health fairs, schools, and in support of Enrollment Services and the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile.

Senior Leadership from Peak Vista met with national leaders to discuss healthcare reform and its impact on patients in the Pikes Peak Region. While the future of reform remains uncertain, Peak Vista leaders remain engaged and

In 2011, the completion of the comprehensive remodeling of the International Circle campus was celebrated with an Open House, enabling donors and guests to see the completely renovated Dental Health Center, Enrollment Services, Pediatric Health Center, and the brand new Family Health Center at International Circle. This remarkable transformation was made possible by the Community Benefit Initiative.



International Circle Campus Re-Opens May 2011

Continuity of vision, mission, sustainability, and leadership was assured with the announcement that longtime Senior Vice President, Pam McManus, would take the position of President & CEO following BJ Scott who took on the role of Executive Director of the Peak Vista Foundation after ten successful years as CEO.



CEO Transition June 2011

Summer block parties drew over 3,000 people to the International Circle location as Peak Vista provided children with physicals, immunizations, dental care, and backpacks filled with school supplies. These events introduced the community to our new facilities and enrolled many new patients in need of a medical home.



Block Parties July 2011

Peak Vista's commitment to innovation in providing improved patient outcomes while creating more cost effective ways to utilize funding and reimbursement led us to a visionary Medicaid healthcare program. This new approach results in both comprehensive and extra coordination of care for our Medicaid patients in the Accountable Care Organization.




Accountable Care Organization Partnership July 2011

Peak Vista's innovative partnerships with local school districts resulted in the Health Resources and Services Administration's Capital Grant for Peak Vista's School-Based Health Centers. The award is being utilized to construct a new School-Based Health Center in Falcon, expand the Cripple Creek – Victor Mountain Health Center and purchase equipment for Harrison District 2's Entrada Center.

Another productive partnership created an expansion in services that provide for a basic need in primary healthcare. X-Ray services are now available at our International Circle location.

Peak Vista proudly stands as part of a national movement of Community Health Centers that serve over 20 million people at more than 8,000 sites throughout all 50 states. Each year, we participate in a week-long celebration that includes advocacy events, staff awards, and the annual homeless picnic (pictured here), annual staff picnic, and annual funder's appreciation breakfast.



National Community Health Centers Week August 2011

In August, Peak Vista served the largest number of patients in our history: 22,357 patients were treated in one month, breaking the previous record of 21,200 set in March of 2010. Amazingly, in 2011 Peak Vista averaged 1,000 patient visits per day (in 2006, the daily average was 600).



Developmental Disabilities Health Center

Peak Vista's commitment to innovation and a broad spectrum of care resulted in a unique collaboration in 2011 with the opening of the Developmental Disabilities Health Center. A partnership of Peak Vista, The Resource Exchange, HealthSouth Rehabilitation Hospital of Colorado Springs, and AspenPointe,

DDHC focuses on providing exceptional healthcare for adult patients who have a developmental disability. Adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities receive primary healthcare, comprehensive behavioral health services, and referrals to specialty care providers - all with culturally sensitive care coordination.



Moreno Health Center

In 2011 Peak Vista and AspenPointe joined together to create a new center. At the Moreno Health Center we focus on providing exceptional healthcare for adult patients (18 and older) who are currently enrolled with AspenPointe. Integrating Peak Vista's adult medical services into AspenPointe's Adult and Rural Services location (which already provides mental health, substance abuse, care management, housing, justice/rehabilitation,

pharmacy, and lab services) enables patients at that site to be seen by both AspenPointe and Peak Vista providers and to establish a medical home.



Family Health Center at International Circle

Family Health Center at International Circle became Peak Vista's 19th Health Center as part of the massive renovation of the International Circle campus. Begun in 2009, the enterprise resulted in a completely new Enrollment Services facility, Dental and Pediatric Centers, and a brand new Family Health Center. This center now provides primary medical and behavioral

healthcare to persons of all ages through dedicated healthcare providers committed to comprehensive premier health services. The center offers a range of services from preventative routine exams to same-day treatment of illness and injury, on-going primary care, and follow-up for chronic health conditions. Specialty care is referred to qualified community providers.




