



Peak Vista is . . .

- Over 600 dedicated staff, each committed to our mission of providing exceptional medical, dental and behavioral healthcare for those facing access barriers.
- 96 doctors, dentists, and mid-level providers who work tirelessly to care for an average of 1,000 patients every day.
- 21 health centers spread across 15 service locations.
- A committed group of donors, grantors, and partners who generously provide support to ensure that Peak Vista's mission is sustained.
- OB/GYN providers who administer prenatal care for over 1,200 moms and who delivered 14% of the babies born in El Paso County in 2012.
- Dedicated to fiscal accountability and responsibility. In 2012, we were able to leverage every dollar granted by the Federal government into \$10.00 of healthcare.
- A nonprofit healthcare organization that ensures that 83% of revenues support direct services.
- Over 1,260 community, staff, and patients committed to making a difference in our community through commitment to advocacy.
- The healthcare home for 1 in 10 residents of the Pikes Peak region. In 2012, Peak Vista provided care for over 66,000 patients.

- Together, with our partner School District 49, we opened a new School Based Health Center in Falcon Falcon Peak Health Center located at Falcon Elementary School.
- Together, with our partners Cripple Creek–Victor School District RE-1, the Teller County Health Department, the Aspen Mine Center and funders, we opened an expanded School Based Health Center The Mountain Health Center at Cresson Elementary School.
- Together, with our partner UCCS and wonderful benefactors, we completed the Lane Family Senior Health Center fundraising campaign and began construction.
- Together, with our major partners Penrose-St. Francis Health Services and The Colorado Health Foundation, we completed the purchase of the former Penrose Community Hospital that will house our Convenient Care Center, Developmental Disabilities Health Center in partnership with The Resource Exchange and two Family Health Centers.

Together, with you - hundreds of donors, grantors and partners - we strive to make a real and lasting impact in the health needs of our fellow community members in the Pikes Peak region. Once again in 2012, we provided a local solution to the increasing need for primary healthcare services in our community.

Annual Funding Sources

- 54% of revenues generated from patient visits (Medicaid, Medicare, CHP+, patient co-pays, commercial insurance, etc.)
- Other funding included:
 - 24% contributions and donations
 - 12% federal funding
 - 10% state support

- 96 doctors and mid-level providers (physicians, dentists, PAs, NPs, CNMs, and dental hygienists)
- 166 clinical support (RNs, MAs, dental assistants, lab and pharmacy staff, etc.)


$2012 \ {\rm Foundation} \ {\rm Highlights}$

IMPACTS





On October 9th, Peak Vista and Penrose-St. Francis Health Services joined together to mark the occasion of Peak Vista's purchase of the former Penrose Community Hospital. In a ceremony, attended by dozens of community partners and leaders, Penrose-St. Francis CEO Margaret Sabin presented CEO Pam McManus with a ceremonial key, commemorating the change in ownership. Peak Vista will utilize the facility to house a Family Health Center, Lab Services, the Developmental Disabilities Health Center, the Convenient Care Center, an additional Pharmacy, Enrollment Services, and a Well Child Waiting location. Funders and grantors who made this possible include Caring for Colorado Foundation, Centura Health, The Colorado Health Foundation, Inasmuch Foundation, Joseph Henry Edmondson Foundation, Key Bank, Luther T. McCauley Charitable Trust, The Myron Stratton Home, and The Resource Exchange.



Grand Opening Cripple Creek-Victor



Peak Vista and the Cripple Creek-Victor School District celebrated completion of the expansion of the School Based Mountain Health Center with a ribbon cutting ceremony on October 4th. Expansion of this School Based Health Center (SBHC) enables better service to the students and siblings of the district as the center continues to provide the highest quality medical and behavioral care. The newly expanded center is located at Cresson Elementary in Cripple Creek. Funders and grantors for this project included Boettcher Foundation, Caring for Colorado, The Colorado Health Foundation, Colorado Rural Health Care, Cripple Creek and Victor Mining Company, Cripple Creek Elks Lodge # 316, and Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).



Grand Opening Falcon Peak



In August Peak Vista celebrated a new partnership with Falcon School District 49 as they joined together for the grand opening of the Falcon Peak Health Center located at Falcon Elementary School. The Falcon school district is the largest district in the state geographically and is also one of the fastest growing districts. Currently serving over 15,000 students, District 49 is located just east of Colorado Springs. Peak Vista earned a competitive federal grant in 2012, enabling the partnership with the Falcon community, allowing students to access treatment for acute illnesses and chronic conditions. The center accepted its first patient August 7.

Senior Health 2012 Campaign – A Peak Vista/UCCS Collaboration

Thanks to people like you, we met our goal!

Peak Vista is eagerly awaiting the opening of the Lane Family Senior Health Center which will replace the existing Peak Vista Senior North Health Center and greatly expand the capacity to serve seniors in our community. Fundraising for the successful project concluded in 2012 thanks to a lead gift of \$4 million from Margot Lane and the John E. and Margaret L. Lane Foundation to Peak Vista and UCCS, as well as donations from many other foundations and individuals. An enthusiastic crowd of dignitaries and supporters attended the groundbreaking ceremony on June 21, 2012.

Projected to open in early 2014, the Lane Family Senior Health Center will be housed within the Lane Center for Academic Health Sciences on the UCCS campus, and in partnership with the CU Aging Center, will provide integrated care for seniors. It will also promote preventive practices aimed at mitigating existing diseases, and on preventing them and promoting healthy lifestyles.


