Dr. Janet Astle, Assistant Dean for Student Services, Duquesne University School of Pharmacy

Dr. Astle is a licensed pharmacist in Pennsylvania and her special areas of interest include legislative advocacy and substance abuse disorders. She is responsible for the development of two distinct substance abuse use disorder certificate programs focusing on identification and referral, as well as treatment and alternative approaches to pain management.

Carin Fraioli, Vice President, Recovery Services, Gateway Rehab

Carin is responsible for all clinical programming provided by Gateway Rehab across 8 locations. Carin started her career with Gateway as an adolescent therapist. Now her experience consists of direct care, evaluation services, electronic medical record management, peer-to-peer recovery specialist programming, and care coordination.
