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Guide to Soft Contact Lenses

What Are Soft Contact Lenses?

Soft contact lenses are meant to be worn in replacement of glasses for patient's best-corrected vision. These lenses are worn at the surface of the eye over the cornea. Soft contact lenses are made of soft, flexible plastics (i.e., silicone hydrogel) that allow oxygen to pass through to the cornea.

How Do I Acquire Soft Contact Lenses?

To purchase/order soft contact lenses, a patient must have an up-to-date **contact lens prescription**. To obtain a contact lens prescription, a patient must be appropriately fitted through a separate visit called a **contact lens fitting**. This visit will determine the parameters needed for a contact lens prescription – brand, size, and power. A CONTACT LENS PRESCRIPTION IS NOT THE SAME AS A GLASSES PRESCRIPTION.

Types Of Contact Lenses/Contact Lens Wear Schedule

- Monthly: Patient will care for same set of contact lenses with a contact lens case & multipurpose solution for approximately one month (4-5 weeks) before disposing & replacing with new set.
 - **Bi-weekly:** Similar to monthly contacts except contact lenses are changed every 2 weeks.
- <u>Daily Disposables:</u> Patient will dispose of contact lenses at the end of every day & replace with new set the following day.

The Three Golden Rules of Contact Lens Care

- 1. Wash your hands before insertion or removal of contact lenses.
 - 2. **Do NOT sleep** in contact lenses.
 - 3. **Do NOT swim** in contact lenses.

*Not following Golden Rules of Contact Lens Care increases the likelihood of contact lens-related adverse events including acute redness, pain, light sensitivity, and decreased vision that can lead to permanent damage & vision loss. If you are experiencing any of the aforementioned symptoms, discontinue contact lens wear and follow-up with an eyecare provider immediately.

Contact Lens Fitting & Pricing

Pricing will vary depending on if a patient is a new or established contact lens patient with our practice.

A <u>new</u> contact lens fitting requires a separate visit from a patient's annual eye examination. Practice contact lenses (that are non-prescription) may be dispensed to patient prior to a new contact lens fitting. We encourage all new contact lens patients to practice at home under parent supervision while using our "Guide to Soft Contact Lenses" prior to scheduling a contact lens fit. A new contact lens fitting may range anywhere from 20-60 minutes.

An <u>established</u> contact lens fitting can be scheduled at the same day as a patient's annual eye examination. This is only for experienced contact lens wearers that have successfully complete a new contact lens fitting with our practice. We encourage patients to wear or bring their current contact lenses so they can be evaluated by the doctor. Contact lens prescriptions expire annually and require an updated fitting prior to renewal of a contact lens prescription. CONTACT LENS PRESCRIPTIONS ARE NOT INCLUDED WITH YOUR ANNUAL EYE EXAM.

NEW Contact lens fitting = \$100

*\$25 non-refundable down payment is required for scheduling new contact lens fit.

The remaining \$75 will be charged upon arrival on date of fitting.

ESTABLISHED Contact lens fitting = \$50
