



Measles Cases in the DMV

There have been a few cases of measles reported in the DMV so far in 2026, with the most recent on February 4. For more information, please see the [Virginia Department of Health](#) and the [DC Department of Health](#) for dates/ locations of possible exposure.

Most people in our area have immunity to measles through vaccination, so the risk to the general public is low. *However, anyone who was at the potential exposure sites at the times listed should:*

- Report your exposure to the Fairfax County Health Department by completing this [short survey](#). Public health officials will follow-up with respondents if additional actions are needed.
- Verify whether they are up to date on their measles vaccine. If you are unsure if your child is up to date with their measles vaccine, you can check their vaccination record on portal or message your provider.
- Watch for symptoms of measles for 21 days after the potential exposure. If you notice symptoms of measles, immediately isolate yourself by staying home and contacting your provider via phone or portal.

We are *NOT* in a measles outbreak situation. It is not yet indicated to give the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR, dose 1 or dose 2) early. If you have specific questions, please message your CAP provider.
