**JOI WILLIAMS****HEAD COACH • FIRST YEAR AT UCF
(USF, 1988)**

A Florida native, Joi Williams returned to the Sunshine State on March 29, 2007, when she was named the 11th head coach in UCF women's basketball history. One of the top recruiters in the nation, Williams came to Orlando after four seasons as the head coach at Murray State.

In her final campaign with the Lady Racers, Williams led Murray State to a 21-10 mark in 2006-07 and a trip to the Women's National Invitation Tournament. The 20-victory season was the first for the program in 18 years. The WNIT berth marked only the second postseason appearance in Murray State history.

In her final year at Murray State, Williams guided her squad to a 15-5 Ohio Valley Conference record, which was good for second in the league standings, as the Lady Racers advanced to the OVC Championship title game. Following the regular season, Joi Scott was named the OVC Player of the Year and Amber Guffey earned a spot on the All-OVC Second Team.

Murray State finished the campaign among the national leaders in several statistical categories, including free-throw percentage, field-goal percentage and scoring offense. Scott was also recognized as a Kodak/Women's Basketball Coaches Association Honorable Mention All-America.

Williams was hired as Murray State's head coach in March 2002 and quickly made an impact. The Lady Racers were selected to finish ninth out of 11 teams in the OVC preseason poll, but Murray State concluded the regular season with four-straight victories to finish fifth.

In 2005-06, Murray State paced the OVC in scoring and was ranked 14th nationally in free-throw percentage.

Williams' players also excelled off of the court as Lady Racers were recognized as OVC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll recipients on 12 occasions during her tenure. In the spring of 2007, Guffey was named to the CoSIDA District Four Academic All-America Third Team.

Williams is no stranger to the Sunshine State. Born and raised in Jacksonville, she played on the collegiate level at USF from 1984-88. Williams spent 12 seasons on the staff at Florida, serving as an assistant coach and recruiting

coordinator under Carol Ross from 1990-02. During Williams' tenure, the Gators participated in the NCAA Tournament nine times.

While at Florida, Williams was recognized as one of the top recruiters in the country. During her time in Gainesville, the Lady Gators went 247-121 (.671). Williams was responsible for the arrival of every student-athlete into the program.

She helped attract five All-America selections to Florida, and nine standouts who were recruited by and played under Williams were selected in the Women's National Basketball Association Draft, including DeLisha Milton-Jones of the 2002 WNBA champion Los Angeles Sparks. Milton-Jones was the 1997 Southeastern Conference Player of the Year and the first UF player ever selected to the Kodak All-America First Team. Milton-Jones was also a member of the gold medal winning 2000 United States Olympic women's basketball team, and the 1998 and 2002 USA World Championship women's basketball teams.

Prior to moving to Murray State, Williams spent the 2002-03 campaign as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Clemson.

During the summer of 2005, USA Basketball selected Williams to be a court coach for the USA Under-19 World Championship Team Trials at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., assisting with the implementation of practice drills and training during the trials process.

Williams played prep basketball at Bishop Kenny High School in Jacksonville before moving to USF. She was a four-year starter at point guard and currently ranks 11th on the Bulls' career assists list.

Williams graduated from USF in 1988 with a bachelor of science degree in marketing. She is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and the Black Coaches Association.

After one year working with Joi Williams at Murray State, Brandy Manning became a member of her UCF staff as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2007.

In addition to scouting and recruiting, Manning's responsibilities with the Lady Racers included on-court development of the post players. Under his guidance, center Joi Scott was named a Kodak/WBCA All-America Honorable Mention and the Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year after averaging 21.7 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. Murray State finished the 2006-07 season with a 21-10 record and earned a bid to the Women's National Invitation Tournament.

The previous year, Manning worked at Miller Grove High School in Lithonia, Ga., where he was an assistant coach for the boys' varsity basketball team and head coach of the boy's junior varsity squad.

After graduating from Clark Atlanta in 2002, Manning served as a graduate assistant coach with the Louisville women's basketball team for two seasons. During that time, the Cardinals posted a record of 42-19 and advanced to the 2005 Conference USA championship game.

Manning, a native of Stockton, Calif., holds a bachelor's of arts degree in psychology from Clark Atlanta and a master's degree in education from Louisville. He is married to the former Nakaya Primus.

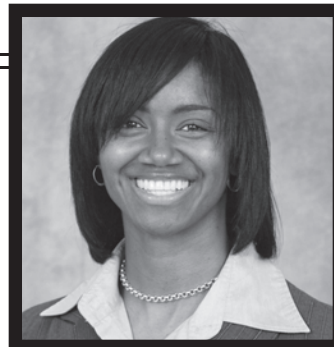

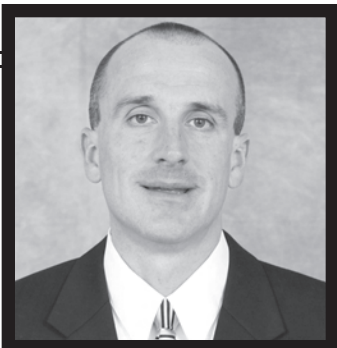

Greg Brown joined the UCF women's basketball staff as an assistant coach in April 2007 and boasts extensive coaching experience on both the collegiate and high school levels. His primary responsibilities include coaching the post players, scouting and coordinating game preparation. In addition, Brown handles all game scheduling for the Knights.

Brown comes to UCF from Nashville, Tenn., where he most recently served as head girls' basketball coach at Goodpasture Christian School.

Brown also found success as the head girls' basketball coach at Friendship Christian School in Lebanon, Tenn., as he guided the Lady Commanders to three district championships, a regional championship and a sub-state title. In 2002, Friendship went 31-3 and advanced to the state quarterfinals. He earned the second of his two District 8A Coach of the Year awards that season.

At the collegiate level, Brown learned from two of the best, beginning as a student assistant coach under Don Meyer at Lipscomb University before working with Pat Summitt at Tennessee for two years. He first served as a graduate assistant in 2002-03 before being elevated to assistant coach in 2003-04. During that time, the Lady Vols had a combined record of 64-9, earned two Southeastern Conference Championships and were twice runner-ups at the NCAA Championship.

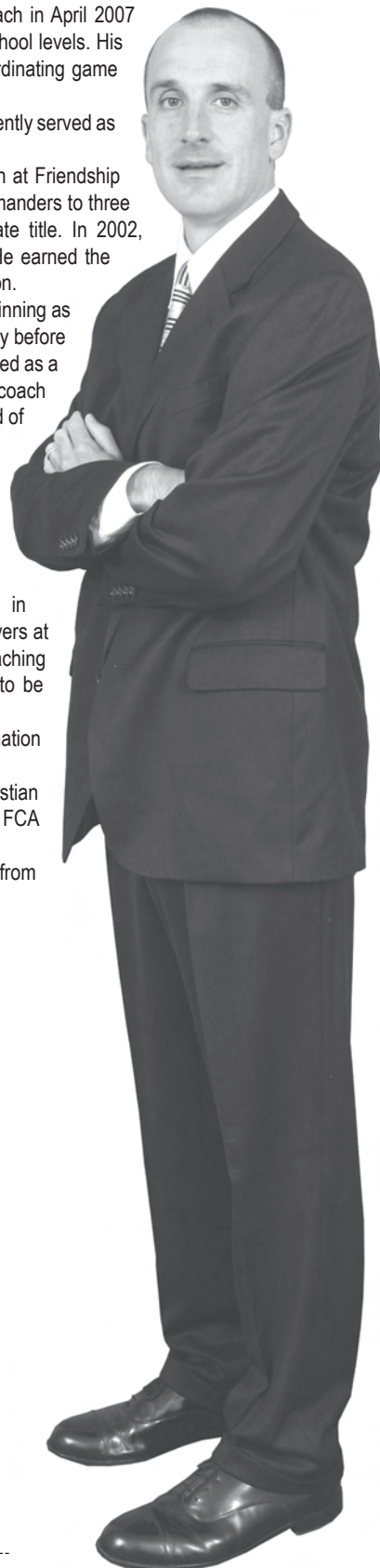
His primary responsibility at Tennessee was player development with emphasis on coaching post players. He worked with several current WNBA players, including 2004 Kodak All-America Shyra Ely.

A student of the game, Brown also published an article in *American Basketball Quarterly* on developing low post players at Tennessee. He is currently working on a series of basketball coaching books called *The Best Things I've Seen in Coaching* to be published later this year.

Brown also directed two of the largest basketball camps in the nation for Don Meyer and at Tennessee.

In addition, Brown has been active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes for many years, serving as guest speaker at numerous FCA functions and community events.

Brown holds a bachelor's of arts degree in political science from Lipscomb. He and his wife, Teresa, have a son, Cole (4).
