## UCF Women's Soccer History

UCF's tradition of women's soccer dates all the way back to 1981, when the school fielded its first women's soccer team. The Golden Knights posted a remarkable 11-3-0 record and a runner-up finish in the AIAW National Tournament that inaugural season.

Twenty-four years later, UCF has won nine Atlantic Sun championships and has been to the NCAA Tournament 10 times, including trips to the Final Four in 1987 and 1982.

The following is a listing of UCF's year-by-year results along with a short account of the best seasons in school history.

### 1981 AIAW Runner-Up (11-3-0)

UCF women's soccer began its inaugural season as a varsity sport in fine fashion, outscoring its first five opponents 76-0. The Golden Knights mauled Miami (20-0, 13-0), hammered Florida State 15-0 and crushed Florida and Vanderbilt by scores of 14-0 and 13-0 respectively. Duke would become the first opponent to score against UCF, but the Golden Knights still prevailed by a score of 11-1. UCF went on to post an 11-3 overall record, with all three losses coming from North Carolina. The final loss to the Tar Heels was a 1-0 setback in the AIAW National Championship game in Chapel Hill, N.C. Seeded 11th out of 12 teams, UCF faced No. 6 Colorado College in the first round and won the first of three consecutive shutouts in the tournament, 4-0. The Golden Knights later met North Carolina before a vocal crowd of 3,500 in the championship. Diane Beatty's first-half goal lifted UNC to the victory despite UCF goalkeeper Amy Ford's 10 saves on the day. Ford would earn All-Tournament honors along with teammates Linda Gancitano, Pam Baughman and Nancy Lay. Baughman led the team in scoring with 47 points (18 goals, 11 assists).

### 1982 NCAA Runner-Up (10-1-2)

In the first year the NCAA recognized women's soccer as an official sport, UCF served as the host for the post-season tournament and again advanced to the National Championship game against North Carolina. UCF entered the title match unbeaten, but the Tar Heels edged the Golden Knights, 2-0. Despite the loss, UCF's Mary Varas was named Most Valuable Player of the tournament and finished with 10 goals for the season. Laura Dryden led UCF with 29 points (11 goals, 7 assists) on the year, while Amy Ford and Kim Wyant combined to produce eight shutouts and allowed just six goals all season.

### 1984 NCAA 2nd Round (10-4-0)

Only two teams accounted for UCF's four losses in 1984, George Mason and North Carolina. George Mason edged the Golden Knights 3-2 in the finals of the GMU Tournament early in the season, while North Carolina downed UCF three times, including a 4-1 decision that eliminated the Golden Knights in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament. Freshman Michelle Akers led UCF with 32 points (14 goals, 4 assists), while Kim Wyant posted seven shutouts.

### 1987 NCAA Final Four (14-4-0)

UCF broke through the NCAA field to advance to the 1987 Final Four, only to be turned back by host Massachusetts, 2-1. With a wind chill factor of -25 and 35 MPH winds, UCF couldn't hold on despite Michelle Akers giving the team a 1-0 lead early on. Akers led the team in scoring with 36 points (13 goals, 10 assists), while fellow All-American and adidas/ISAA Goalkeeper of the Year Amy Allman posted 12 shutouts and a 0.76 goals against average.

### 1988 NCAA 2nd Round (10-3-2)

The Golden Knights put together another successful season before running into their nemesis from Chapel Hill. Perennial NCAA Champion North Carolina squeaked by UCF, 2-1, in a heartbreaking loss. The Golden Knights fought UNC to a scoreless tie earlier in the year, but couldn't overcome the Tar Heels and *Soccer America* National Player of the Year Shannon Higgins. Junior Michelle Akers led the team in scoring with 26 points (11 goals, 4 assists), while future UCF coach Karen Richter recorded a 0.69 goals against average and posted 10 shutouts.

### 1991 NCAA Tournament (10-5-1)

It was supposed to be a rebuilding year, but the freshmen duo of forward Kelly Kochevar and goalkeeper Heather Brann led UCF to its sixth NCAA Tournament. Kochevar led the team in scoring with 39 points (16 goals, 7 assists), while Brann finished the season with a 1.32 goals against average and six shutouts. Among those who were shutout: Hartford, Villanova, Duke and Notre Dame. The storybook season ended in the first round of the NCAA Tournament as North Carolina State shutout UCF, 4-0.

### 1993 Atlantic Sun Co-Champions (8-7-1)

Under first year head coach Karen Richter, UCF played one of their toughest schedules ever. However, a tough schedule didn't stop UCF from taking a share of the first Atlantic Sun Conference Championship thanks to a 5-1 mark in regular season league play. UCF started slowly, but won five straight matches late in the season, including a 2-0 victory over rival Florida International that all but clinched a share of the conference title. Kelly Kochevar led the way, scoring 36 points (17 goals, 2 assists). Amy Geltz added 26 points (10 goals, 6 assists), while Heather Brann controlled the net with a 1.56 goals against average and seven shutouts.

### 1994 A-Sun Champions (13-5-1)

UCF had one of its best seasons in history knocking off Atlantic Coast power NC State early and winning nine of its last 10 games. The Golden Knights entered *Soccer America's* National Poll at 19th after defeating the Wolfpack. In the inaugural A-Sun tournament, host UCF blitzed Mercer 5-1 in the first round thanks to three goals by senior Amy Geltz. In the championship game, Geltz scored a goal and added an assist as UCF shutout rival Florida International 2-0. Senior Kelly Kochevar led UCF in scoring with 33 points (15 goals, 3 assists), while Geltz added 25 (10 goals, 5 assists). Fellow senior Heather Brann posted a 0.82 goals against average and 9.5 shutouts.

### 1995 A-Sun Champions (10-6-4)

Junior midfielder Amy Jones had a record-setting season on way to becoming the first UCF player to earn All-America honors since Michelle Akers. Jones set school records for goals (20) and total points (46) in a season and was also named A-Sun Player of the Year and first team All-Southeast Region for her efforts. Senior Kelly Stout set the UCF single-season record with 13 assists, while teammate Jennifer O'Connor tied Akers' mark of 12 that was set in 1986. The Golden Knights set a team record with eight overtime games, including four ties. UCF had several team highlights during the season, most notably winning its third straight A-Sun title with a 1-0 victory over Campbell. The Golden Knights also finished tied for fifth in the Southeast Region, narrowly missing a berth in the NCAA Tournament.



## UCF Women's Soccer History

### 1996 A-Sun Champions (13-7-1)

UCF captured an unprecedented fourth straight A-Sun Conference Championship as a result of a thrilling 1-0 win at Florida International in the tournament finale. Amy Jones knocked home the game-winning goal on a penalty kick midway through the second half. Goalkeeper Alyssa O'Brien stopped a penalty kick attempt earlier in the second period to give Jones an opportunity for the game-winner. Jones led the team in scoring with 29 points (10 goals, 9 assists). O'Brien set an A-Sun single season record with 11 shutouts and finished with a 0.89 goals against average.

### 1998 A-Sun Champions/NCAA 1st Round (12-8-0)

The Golden Knights won their fifth A-Sun title in six years and returned to the NCAA Tournament for first time since 1992. UCF ran the field with a flawless 4-0 record in the A-Sun and two more wins in the A-Sun Tournament over Jacksonville and Campbell. Freshman Michelle Anderson scored the only goal of the championship game and tournament MVP Alyssa O'Brien made it stand up with the second of her two shutouts in the tournament. With the win, the Golden Knights earned an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament against Wisconsin. The Badgers would end the Golden Knights run with a 2-0 win in cold and snowy conditions of Madison, Wis. The season wrapped up the careers of one of UCF's best-ever senior classes. O'Brien finished as UCF's all-time leader in saves and was ranked in every goal keeping category. Danya Harris finished her career ranked in the top 10 in five offensive categories, including third in game-winning goals.

### 1999 A-Sun Champions/NCAA 2nd Round (16-6-1)

The loss of a star forward and four-year starting goalkeeper did not phase the Golden Knights, who recorded their best season since 1989. UCF fought their way into the second round of the NCAA Tournament only to lose to their old nemesis North Carolina. The Golden Knights knocked off Southern Conference champion Furman, 1-0. After downing the Paladins, UCF fell to the eventual national champions from North Carolina snapping a seven-game winning streak and 11-game unbeaten streak. The Golden Knights swept the A-Sun, posting an 8-0-1 record against their conference, and added two more in the A-Sun Tournament. The UCF women held all nine A-Sun opponents scoreless throughout the season until the final game of the A-Sun Tournament. Thirteen shutouts ranked UCF tied for sixth in the nation in shutouts per game and earned every starting defender a spot on one of the conference's three All-A-Sun teams. SoccerBuzz.com ranked the UCF women ninth in the Southeast Region while the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) picked UCF 10th in its Southeast Region final poll. Cally Howell earned first-team All-A-Sun, second-team All-NSCAA Southeast Region and third-team SoccerBuzz.com All-Southeast Region honors.

### 2001 A-Sun Champions/NCAA 1st Round (14-6-0)

After a one-year absence, the Golden Knights went dancing again. UCF defeated Florida Atlantic 2-1 in the A-Sun Tournament final to earn an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The victory earned the Golden Knights their seventh A-Sun Championship. UCF lost to Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. UCF finished the regular season with a 12-5 mark, including an impressive 11-1 record in conference play. The Golden Knights won both the regular season and post season tournament crowns. During the season, UCF rattled off a 10-game winning streak against A-Sun foes that included two victories in the conference tournament. Senior Michelle

Anderson ended her career on a high note, as she was named A-Sun Player of the Year, MVP of the A-Sun Tournament, first-team All-Atlantic Sun and third-team All-Southeast Region. There were also 13 Golden Knights named to the A-Sun All-Academic Team. SoccerBuzz.com also named UCF the sixth most improved team in the nation.

### 2002 A-Sun Champions/NCAA 1st Round (18-5-0)

After opening the season with four shutouts, the Golden Knights enjoyed their most successful season in program history earning a school record 18 victories en route to their second consecutive A-Sun Championship and NCAA Tournament berth. Finishing the season on a five-match winning streak, UCF continued the streak in the conference tournament rolling over Jacksonville State, 3-0, in the first round before edging Jacksonville, 3-2, in the title game. The season ended in Tallahassee, where Auburn shutout the Golden Knights, 2-0, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Freshman forward Jennifer Montgomery paced UCF scoring with 17 goals and 12 assists for a conference-leading 46 points. For her efforts, she racked up numerous awards including A-Sun Freshman of the Year and NSCAA Second-Team All-South Region. She also headlined the list of first-team all-conference honorees that also included Jessica Kuhlman, Jackie VanLooven and Nicole Cieslak.

### 2003 A-Sun Champions/NCAA 1st Round (16-5-1)

The Golden Knights made it a three-peat as they took the A-Sun Championship from host Florida Atlantic on penalty kicks, 3-0, after two overtimes. Junior Allison Blagriff took home the title of Tournament MVP for the second consecutive season. Joining Blagriff on the A-Sun Tournament team were Becca Eshelman, Jennifer Montgomery, Summer Savage and Shannon Wing. Their season-ending nine-game winning streak was halted in the first round of the NCAA Tournament as Florida dropped UCF in a 3-2 overtime heartbreaker. Eshelman took home NSCAA and SoccerBuzz.com All-Southeast Region honors.

### 2004 NCAA 2nd Round (17-4-2)

UCF recorded 17 victories, the second most in a season, during the 2004 campaign. The Golden Knights ended the regular season on a five-game winning streak, including a 3-2 victory over No. 12 Florida State in Tallahassee. UCF earned the first-ever A-Sun at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament. During the first round of the tournament, the Golden Knights eliminated host No. 10 Florida to give UCF a perfect 9-0 record against teams from the state of Florida. Junior Courtney Baines was named A-Sun Defensive Player of the Year, while head coach Amanda Cromwell was named coach of the year for the Southeast Region by SoccerBuzz.com and the Central Florida Chapter of National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association.

### 2005 C-USA Regular Season Co-Champions (12-10-0)

UCF won the Conference USA regular season title after going 8-1 in the Golden Knights' inaugural season in the league. Courtney Baines was named C-USA Defensive Player of the Year, while teammates Roberta Pelarigo and Jennifer Montgomery were also chosen for the all-conference teams.

## Women's Soccer in the UCF Hall of Fame

The UCF Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 1998 to honor those individuals who, through their demonstrated athletics achievement or service, have distinguished themselves and the University of Central Florida. Below are the four representatives from the women's soccer are currently in the Hall of Fame: Michelle Akers, Amy Allmann, Karen Richter and Jim Rudy.



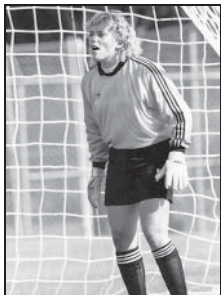
**Michelle Akers**  
**Women's Soccer**  
**1984, 86-88**  
**Class of 1998**

Michelle Akers, regarded by many as the best female soccer player in the world during her career, was a four-time All-America selection at UCF. She was the recipient of the first Hermann Award for women in 1988, soccer's version of the Heisman Trophy. She led UCF to three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a berth in the Final Four in 1987. She went on to play professionally in Sweden after graduation and was a long-time member of the U.S. National Team. In 1991 she led the U.S. to its first Women's World Cup Championship, earning the Golden Boot as the tournament's leading scorer. She was also a vital part of the gold medal-winning U.S. National squad in the Olympics in 1996 and the World Cup team in 1999. In 1999, she was also named the FIFA Women's Player of the Century.



**Jim Rudy**  
**Soccer Coach**  
**1975-87**  
**Class of 2001**

Jim Rudy coached the men's soccer team from 1975-87 and the women's team from 1981-87. He started the women's soccer program and led it to four post-season appearances in seven years and a 73-22-6 overall record. His teams advanced to the Final Four of the NCAA Tournament twice, including an appearance in the first NCAA championship game in 1982. His 1981 squad finished runner up in the AIAW, the forerunner to the NCAA. He coached nine All-Americans, including UCF Athletics Hall of Fame inductees Michelle Akers and Amy Allmann. He finished his career as the winningest coach in history of UCF's men's soccer program with a 129-58-18 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances. He coached three All-Americans on the men's side, including UCF Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Winston DuBose.



**Amy Allmann**  
**Women's Soccer**  
**1984-87**  
**Class of 1999**

Amy Allmann was a starting goalkeeper during her career at UCF, which culminated with her being named NCAA Goalkeeper of the Year in 1987. The same year she helped UCF reach the Final Four. A versatile athlete, Allmann also competed in cross-country and rowing while at UCF. She went on to compete for the U.S. National Team that won the Women's World Cup in 1991.



**Karen Richter**  
**Women's Soccer**  
**1987-90**  
**Class of 2000**

Karen Richter played from 1987-90, earning adidas/ISAA and NCAA Goalkeeper of the Year honors in 1990. In 1989, she was named to the *Soccer America* MVP Team and the adidas scholar-athlete team in 1989 and 1990. She set the school record for lowest career goals-against average (0.59), lowest single-season goals-against average (0.25) and career shutouts (30.5). As a junior she led the team to an 11-1-2 record and allowed only four goals in 14 games.
