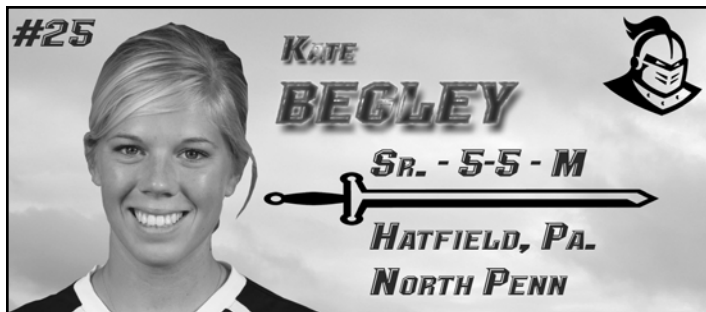


2007 UCF PLAYER BIOS

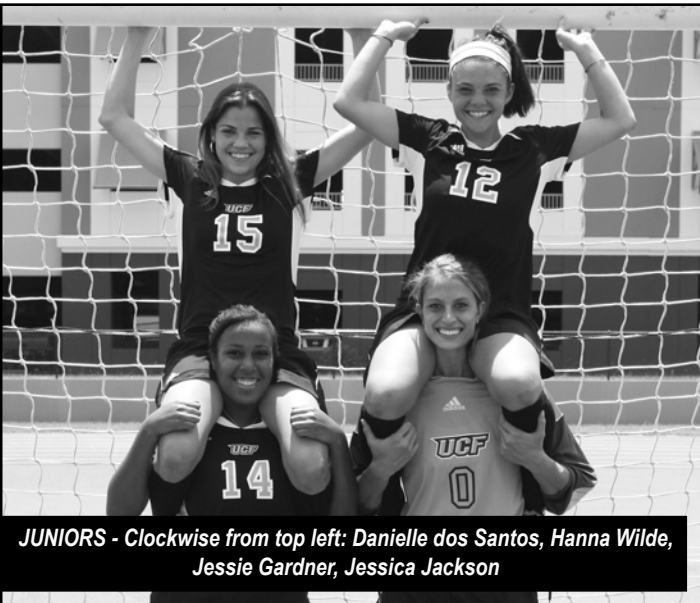
