I KNIGHT NOTES THIRD-RANKED KNIGHTS

Lucca Dourado; 4 G, 0 A, 8 PTS.

 After beginning the 2023 fall season unranked in the United Soccer Coaches' national top 25 poll, the UCF men's soccer team has risen to earn the No. 3 ranking in the country in the week four release of the poll following the team's 4-0-2 record through its six matches. The Knights' 4-0-2 record marks the best start to a season by the program since the 2011 season, when UCF began the year with five straight wins and a 6-0-1 mark. The 2011 Knights would advance as far as the second round of the NCAA Tournament but would fall in overtime by a 2-1 final score at then-No. 12 South Florida, wrapping up the season with a 12-6-3 final record.

• The No. 3 ranking also matches the highest in the history of any UCF athletics program, also achieved by the Knights' track & field team on March 27, 2023 when the squad was ranked No. 3 in the first NCAA Division I Women's Track and Field National Rating Index of the spring season. UCF's latest ranking marks the highest in program history, surpassing its previous No. 5 mark achieved in last week's poll, as well as on Nov. 12, 2019 when the Knights were slotted in as the No. 5 team in the nation in the midst of what would become a 16-match unbeaten streak from Sept.

1–Nov. 13 that season (14-0-2 during the streak, 15-3-2 final 2019 record). • The Knights were also included in the week four editions of Top Drawer Soccer and College Soccer News' week three polls at No. 4 in both.

 UCF's latest national ranking represents the latest in a meteoric rise through the polls for the team throughout the fall 2023 slate, as after the squad began the season unranked, the Knights earned the No. 14 spot in the poll's week one rankings, followed by No. 6 in week two, and then a share of No. 5 with Louisville in week three

TOP THREE CLASH WITH THE HERD

• The Knights' contest against No. 1 Marshall Saturday evening represents the first top three matchup in program history, just eight days after UCF played the first top five matchup in program history against then-No. 4 West Virginia Sept. 15. While the Knights have produced a 1-0-2 record against ranked opponents in 2023, the Thundering Herd is fresh off a 3-1 victory against No. 9 James Madison Saturday night, representing the team's seventh consecutive victory to begin the 2023 fall slate and a win that aided in the team climbing to the No. 1 spot in the nation in the United Soccer Coaches' week four poll.

• The Knights' Saturday contest also represents just the seventh time in program history that UCF has matched up against an opponent ranked within the top five in the nation, as UCF owns a 3-0-3 record in its previous six contests against top five foes. (T, 2-2 vs. No. 4 West Virginia, 9/15/23, T, 2-2 vs. No. 2 UConn, 11/15/13; W, 2-1 vs. No. 5 SMU, 10/2/10; T, 2-2 vs. No. 1 SMU, 10/14/06; W, 3-2 vs. No. 3 FIU, 10/11/97; W, 2-1 vs. No. 2 FIU. 9/14/97)

 UCF will also look to etch another positive chapter in its history against the Thundering Herd, as the Knights own a 7-3-1 record in 11 all-time meetings between the two schools, including a five-match win streak. During the teams' last meeting, UCF claimed a 1-0 victory on the road Nov. 3, 2012 on the strength of a goal in the 90th minute by Eduardo Jimenez in support of a Sebastian Evers clean sheet in goal (4 saves).

CALABRESE APPROACHING A MILESTONE

· Head coach Scott Calabrese enters the Knights' Saturday matchup just one win shy of a career milestone, as the Knights' seventh-year head coach needs one more victory to eclipse 150 wins in his career as a head coach. Currently owning a career 149-98-30 (.592) record, Calabrese compiled a 57-44-16 (.556) record in his first six seasons as a head coach at East Tennessee State University before going 28-23-4 in three seasons with the Florida International Panthers. In his seven seasons with the Knights, Calabrese owns a 64-31-10 record.

DEFENDING THE KINGDOM

 Since head coach Scott Calabrese took over at the beginning of the 2017 season, the Knights have posted a record of 36-12-8 at home. UCF has lost just 10 regular-season home matches during Calabrese's tenure. Prior to the 2020-21 season, UCF only had one regular season home loss through the first three campaigns.

A MUÑOZ MASTERCLASS

Knights sophomore goalkeeper Juanvi Muñoz made a pair of saves in the Knights' 2-0 victory over Brown Sept. 9, clinching his first clean sheet of the season and the third of his two-year collegiate career. The sophomore also notched shutout wins against UC Riverside and Temple last year. • The clean sheet came on the heels of a career performance for the Valencia, Spain, native Sept. 5 against then-No. 11 FIU Sept. 5, when he made a single-match career-high 9 saves on 11 total shots on goal and 16 total shots faced in the Knights' 2-2 draw. The evening surpassed his previous career high of 7 saves in the Knights' 2-1 win over North Florida Aug. 29, 2022.

Called in give a value anight 2-4 win over North North Aug. 29, 2022.
Not only did his 9 saves mark a Sum Belt single-match season high, but the total also represented the most in a single match by a Knights goalie since **Yannik Oetti**'s 9 saves in the Knights' triple overtime 1-1 tie (UCF 4-3 win on penalty kicks) April 15, 2021 during the American Athletic Conference Championship Semifinals (season moved from the fall of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

 Entering the Knights' Saturday matchup at Marshall, Muñoz's 21 total saves rank seventh-most in the Sun Belt and 80th in the nation. His 3.50 saves per game also rank sixth-most in the conference, as well as 82nd in the country.

DOURADO BECOMES THE SEVENTH WITH 30

• With two years remaining of eligibility, forward Lucca Dourado had already clinched a share of 10th place on UCF's all-time points list (61) with his penalty kick goal during the Knights' 2-1 win over Stetson Aug. 27. With his second goal of the season against No. 11 FIU Sept. 9, Dourado became the seventh Knight in program history to eclipse the 30-goal mark, joining Heikki Ritvanen (88), Randy DeShield (56), Ari Nurmi (47), Cal Jennings (46), Rony Francois (39) and Matias Pyysalo (32). He also claimed sole possession of 10th place on the Knights' all-time career points list with the 62nd and 63rd points of his now-four-year UCF career. Entering the Knights' Saturday matchup at Marshall, Dourado needs one goal to reach 33 in his collegiate career and break a tie with Pyysalo for sixth place on the UCF all-time career goals scored list.

Dourado scored in seven consecutive matches during the 2022 season, which was the second longest in the nation behind LIU's **Emil** Jaaskelainen, who had his streak end at eight in a row.

 Jennings (2016-19) was the last Knight to hit the 30-goal mark and finished his career fourth all-time at UCF with 46. Pyysalo and Jennings are the only two Knights to hit the 30 goal mark under Scott Calabrese. Both went on to play professional soccer.

 Dourado finished the 2022 season fifth among active NCAA players in goals per game with a mark of 0.65 goals per game and was tied for 31st in total points with 59.

ZANE BUBB WINS SUN BELT DPOTW

 In their second week as members of the Sun Belt, the Knights saw their first winner of a weekly honor following their 3-1 victory over NC State Friday, as fifth-year defender Zane Bubb was named Defensive Player of the Week. Bubb served as a key piece of the Knights' defensive scheme throughout the evening, playing 82 of the 90 total minutes against the Wolfpack and completing 67 of 74 total passes (91 percent). • With Bubb's help, the Knights recorded their third consecutive match with only one goal allowed to begin the season, yielding nine or fewer shot attempts and four or fewer shots on goal in each.

• Bubb represents the first Knight to win a weekly conference honor since Gino Vivi garnered American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week Oct. 24, 2022 after he recorded a goal and an assist in the Knights' 2-1 win over then-No. 13 Charlotte Oct. 21.

 Bubb also became the Knights' first Defensive Player of the Week since the 2021 season, when UCF swept The American's weekly honors following their 4-1 victory over the Memphis Tigers Sept. 18. Following the Black and Gold's performance, Anderson Rosa was tabbed with Defensive Player of the Week, joined by Lucca Dourado on the offensive side and Tyler Lavigne between the goalposts.

FACING ACC FOES

UCF's opener against then-No. 4/9 Clemson was the fourth time in the Scott Calabrese era that the Knights have begun the season against an ACC opponent, representing their first such win in the four tries (also at Duke 8/25/17; at No. 4 Wake Forest 8/30/19; at No. 15 Wake Forest 8/25/22) The 2023 slate is the fifth time in Calabrese's seven seasons that at least one ACC program is on the schedule and the third time two ACC foes have been on the slate. The Knights' Sept. 1 contest against NC State represented the second ACC program on UCF's 2023 schedule.

BAI ANCED OFFENSE

 UCF has seen eight different Knights combine to score its first 13 goals through its first 6 matches this season. After sophomore forward Emmanuel Bam and freshman midfielder Saku Heiskanen both found the back of the net against the Clemson Tigers in the team's season-opener, senior forward Lucca Dourado and sophomore transfer forward Clarence Awoudor tallied the Knights' two scores against Stetson Sunday night. Robbie Soronellas ignited UCF's second-half comeback win over NC State Sept. 1 with his first goal of the season before Bam and Heiskanen recorded their respective second goals of the season, and in the Knights' 2-2 draw against No. 11 FIU Tuesday night, Dourado notched his second goal before Beto Ydrach scored his first goal of the season and the second of his career. Defender Anderson Rosa found the scoresheet for the first time this season Sept. 9, when he converted the Knights' second penalty kick attempt to give the team its second goal against Brown. Finally, defender Zane Bubb scored the first goal of his Knights career during UCF's 2-2 draw against then-No. 4 West Virginia Sept. 15, a header directly off a Saku Heiskanen corner kick that tied the match at two goals apiece in the 34th minute.

• For Awoudor, the goal represented his first in a Knights uniform in just his second match with UCF after recording three goals in his freshman season with Oregon State. The goal also marked his second career game-winner of his first four career scores after his tally in the 83rd minute proved decisive in the Beavers' 2-1 win over Stanford Oct. 27, 2022.

• UCF produced its first three-goal display of the season during its latest win over NC State Friday evening, with Soronellas scoring his first goal of the season to spark the Knights' first second-half comeback of the season. Bam and Heiskanen would later tally their respective second goals of the season, with Bam's serving as his second career game-winning goal in his first three matches this year.

DECLAWING THE CATS

• The Knights made a statement in their season-opener, downing the then-No. 4/9 Clemson Tigers (Top Drawer Soccer/United Soccer Coaches) by a 2-1 final score at Historic Riggs Field Aug. 24. The contest marked the Knights' first win against a ranked opponent since downing then-No. 13 Charlotte, also by a 2-1 decision, Oct. 21, 2022, and their first against a nationally-ranked top-10 foe since UCF topped then-No. 6 Tulsa Oct. 10, 2021. Going with Top Drawer Soccer's rankings, UCF also earned its first victory against an opponent nationally-ranked in the top five since Oct. 2, 2010. when the Knights edged then-No. 5 SMU by a 2-1 margin.

• The victory also marked the first win in program history against the Tigers in the third all-time meeting between the two schools. UCF and Clemson hadn't met since Sept. 6. 1995, a 3-0 defeat. The Tigers topped the Knights in the first meeting as well, by a 9-2 decision Sept. 11, 1977. The victory also assured the Knights at least one ranked win for the fifth consecutive season, after UCF toppled No. 13 Charlotte 2-1 Oct. 21, 2022. No. 6 Tulsa 7-2 Oct. 10, 2021, No. 17 James Madison May 2, 2021 (season moved from 2020 to spring as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic), No. 12 Missouri State 2-1 in overtime November 24, 2019, and No. 6 North Carolina 2-1 Sept. 1, 2019.

TWO FIRSTS IN THE OPENER

• The Knights' historic 2-1 victory over No. 4/9 Clemson Thursday evening came on the strength of the first goals in the respective careers of both sophomore forward **Emmanuel Bam** and freshman midfielder Saku Heiskanen. The occasion marked the first contest that saw two Knights score their first career goals since the fall 2021 season, when fifth-year midfielder Rainer De Jesus and senior defender Yanis Leerman both notched their first career scores in the American Athletic Conference Tournament Semifinals against Tulsa Nov. 10, a match UCF won 6-0. Sophomore forward/midfielder Lucas Mauro and redshirt-sophomore midfielder Josiah Ramirez both recorded their first career goals in the same match earlier that season as well, during the Knights' 5-0 victory over North Florida Aug. 29.

 Bam's goal also made the sophomore the first Knight since sophomore forward Kevin Andrews to have his first career goal also represent a game-winner, as Andrews' tally in the 45th minute proved the difference in the Knights' 3-1 victory over Florida International Oct. 9, 2022. • Heiskanen also became the first Knight since the 2019 campaign to score a goal in the first match of his collegiate career, when redshirtfreshman midfielder Gianluca Arcangeli scored UCF's lone goal in a 2-1 defeat at No. 4 Wake Forest in his collegiate debut Aug. 30.

UCF DIVISION I CONFERENCE AFFILIATION HISTORY





Atlantic Sun Conference 1993-2004 (12 seasons)

After making the D-1 jump in 1984, the Black and Gold didn't join their first Division I conference until 1993. Despite going 4-10-1 in their first year in a conference, the Knights made the A-Sun Semifinals in just their second year as part of the A-Sun. The Knights found success quickly and carried that momentum with them throughout their time in the A-Sun, tallying eight appearances in the conference tournament in 12 total seasons.

The Knights finished their time in the A-Sun on a high note, winning the tournament championship in three consecutive seasons from 2002-04. The championship runs led to UCF's first three NCAA Tournament appearances. The Black and Gold were turned away from their first NCAA Tournament victory in their first two tries by FIU, but were able to beat the Panthers in 2004 for the program's first tournament win.

Three Knights earned four major honors during the program's tenure in the A-Sun. Heikki Ritvanen scored 88 career goals from 1996-99, UCF's most in program history, and was honored as the A-Sun's Player of the Year in 1999. Alejandro Gessen was named Freshman of the Year while Ryan McIntosh was a two-time Defensive Player of the Year. In all, 54 nods were recieved to the A-Sun First, Second, Third and Freshmen Teams in UCF's 12 years in the league.



Conference USA 2005-2012 (8 seasons)

UCF had a new conference and a new head coach for the 2005 season. Brent Erwin and the Knights went 13-17-3 over their first two seasons as members of Conference USA. Fast forward to UCF's sixth season in the league, fourth year head coach Bryan Cunningham led UCF to its first NCAA Tournament apperance as members of C-USA, winning 12 matches with a 12-5-3 record. The team followed suit the next year, winning a dozen games again and making the NCAA Tournament second round for the second straight year.

The Knights won 32 matches in their final three seasons as part of C-USA, more than first five seasons in the league combined. The Black and Gold won no major honors as C-USA members, but saw nine nods to the All-Conference First Team and a total of 30 nods across the First, Second, Third and Freshman Teams.



American Athletic Conference 2013-2022 (10 seasons)

The Knights enjoyed massive success as part of The American, reaching the conference final in five of their final six seasons in the league. The Black and Gold earned three regular seasons titles and one tournamennt championship as members of The American. In total, UCF qualified for the conference's postseason tournament in nine straight seasons, only missing the 2022 postseason by two points.

Three of UCF's NCAA Tournament appearances came while in The American, qualifying in 2018, 2019 and 2020. The Knights punched their first ticket into the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 in 2019, and then did the same for the 2020 tournament, which was held in the spring of 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Plenty of Knights stood out in UCF's time in The American. A member of the Black and Gold was named Offesnive Player of the Year six times out of the team's 10 years in the league. Matias Pyysalo and Cal Jennings won the honor twice while Romario Williams and Hadji Barry were honored once each. UCF collected three Midfielder of the Year honors and three Goalkeeper of the Year awards; Oettl collected all three goalkeeping honors while Yoni Sorokin took two of the three midfielder awards along with Louis Perez who won the other. Gino Vivi was honored as UCF's lone Freshman of the Year award, earning the nod in 2019.

The Black and Gold had 11 First Team All-Conference honorees, including nine that were named on the top squad multiple times. In total, UCF earned 36 nods to the All-Conference First or Second Teams while 16 rookies graced the All-Freshman Team while in The American.



Sun Belt Conference 2023-present

UCF men's soccer's move to the Sun Belt Conference was made in tandem with the rest of UCF's sports moving to the Big 12 Conference in 2023-24, a league which does not sponsor men's soccer. The Sun Belt recently re-emerged as a conference, resuming play in 2022 after previously sponsoring men's soccer from 1976-1995 and 2014-20. The Knights will join Kentucky, South Carolina and West Virginia as men's soccer members only. Those four teams will join James Madison, Marshall, Old Dominion, Coastal Carolina, Georgia Southern and Georgia State.

"I'm very excited to be partnering with Commissioner Keith Gil and Deputy Commissioner Kathy Keene. They are great people and I'm excited to work with them again," said UCF Vice President and athletics director Terry Mohajir. "We believe the move to the Sun Belt positions our men's soccer program for great success in the coming years. Coach Calabrese has shown his teams can compete with the best of the best in The American, and we can't wait to see the program continue to grow and compete in the very strong Sun Belt Conference."

"We are very excited to accept the invitation to join what will clearly be an incredible conference for men's soccer," said head coach Scott Calabrese. "I love that the Sun Belt will be the home of both the Big 12 and the SEC for men's soccer along with 2020 National Champions Marshall and so many top soccer programs as well. It's an exciting new challenge for our program and we can't wait to be a part of it in 2023."

FUN IN THE SUN

• UCF men's soccer makes the jump to the Sun Belt Conference for the 2023 season, as the athletics department transitions from the American Athletic Conference to the Big 12 Conference, a conference that doesn't sponsor men's soccer.

• The Sun Belt is the fourth conference the UCF men's soccer program has been a part of in their Division I history, playing in the Atlantic Sun from 1993-2004, Conference USA from 2005-2012 and The American from 2013 through the 2022 season (more in depth info on page 3).

• The Sun Belt recently re-emerged as a conference, resuming play in 2022 after previously sponsoring men's soccer from 1976-1995 and 2014-20. The Knights will join Kentucky, South Carolina and West Virginia as men's soccer members only. Those four teams will James Madison, Marshall, Old Dominion, Coastal Carolina, Georgia Southern and Georgia State.

• The members of the revamped Sun Belt have enjoyed great success lately. Marshall won the national championship during the 2020 season, played in the spring of 2021. Kentucky was the top overall seed in the 2022 NCAA Tournament and reached the Sweet 16 along with conference-mate Marshall. Coastal Carolina is one of the winningest programs in the NCAA and has made 10 NCAA Tournament appearances since 2010. • Overall, six of UCF's nine new conference mates finished in the top 60 of the 2022 NCAA RPI with three finishing in the top 50.

KNIGHTS PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH IN FIRST SUN BELT SEASON, DOURADO AND ROSA NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

• UCF was voted to finish fourth in this year's Sun Belt preseason poll with 68 points and one first place vote.

• Kentucky led the way with 93 points and six first place votes. Behind UCF were South Carolina (49 points), Georgia State and Coastal Carolina (45), James Madison (40), Old Dominion (26) and Georgia Southern (16).

• Lucca Dourado and Anderson Rosa were named to the Sun Belt Preseason All-Conference Team ahead of the squad's inaugural run in their new league. Dourado earned two All-Conference First Team nods (2021, 2022) and an All-Rookie Team honor (2020-21) in the team's time in the American Athletic Conference. Rosa earned All-Conference First Team and All-Rookie Team honors in his first season of collegiate soccer (2020-21) before being named to the Second Team in 2021 ahead of his return to the First Team in 2022.

• UCF has two members on the Preseason All-Conference Team, tied for second with Marshall and Georgia State, and behind Kentucky who has four.

RANKED MATCHUPS AWAIT

The Knights had four of their 2023 opponents ranked in the preseason edition of the United Soccer Coaches Poll, and an additional two more that were receiving votes.

• UCF will visit No. 3 Kentucky, open the season at No. 9 Clemson, visit No. 11 Marshall, host No. 21 FIU, and face West Virginia and South Carolina who begin the year receiving votes.

- The Black and Gold picked up a ranked win last season over No. 13 Charlotte.
- The Knights have earned at least one ranked win in each of their last four seasons.

MR. WORLDWIDE

• Scott Calabrese and staff's roster for the 2023 season has at least one student-athlete from each of the six habitable continents with 13 different countries represented.

• Eleven Knights hail from North America, with nine from three different states in the United States and two from Costa Rica. Eight members of the Black and Gold hail from Europe while four are from Africa, three are from South America, two from Asia and one is from Australia.

The UCF roster is traditionally diverse, but the 2023 season will be the first time that there is at least one player from each habitable continent in Calabrese's seven year tenure.




