GAME NOTES



Colin Carmichael Head Coach, 19th Season

Colin Carmichael has been at OSU since the inception of the women's soccer program in the fall of 1996, and he continues to help lead Cowgirl soccer to new heights and a spot among the nation's elite

OSU is in the midst of the most successful stretch of seasons in its history as the program is in its 28th year, 19 of those with Carmichael as head coach.

Carmichael, who served as OSU's co-head coach with Karen Hancock during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, entered the 2023 season with a 239-97-50 career record in 18 seasons as the Cowgirls' head coach, compiling a winning percentage of .684. He has led OSU to 12 appearances in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship, including six straight from 2006-11, and after advancing to the second round of the NCAA tourney four-straight years, the Cowgirls made back-to-back trips to the Elite Eight in 2010 and 2011.

The Cowgirls have been a force in the Big 12 Conference under Carmichael, capturing six league titles. OSU claimed four consecutive conference championships from 2008-11 and added crowns in 2017 and 2019; the Cowgirls won regular season titles in 2008, '11, '17 and '19 and Big 12 Soccer Championship titles in 2009 and 2010.

Carmichael has guided OSU to a 14-9-3 record and four finals appearances at the Big 12 Championship and an 11-8-6 record in NCAA tourney play.

ABOUT OKLAHOMA STATE

- Winners of four in a row, Oklahoma State is 10-2-0 and in a three-way tie atop the Big 12 standings at 3-0-0 in conference play. The Cowgirls host 19th-ranked UCF Thursday night before traveling to Fort Worth, Texas, for a Sunday showdown with TCU.
- OSU is coming off an 11-4-4 season in 2022 in which the Cowgirls finished fifth in the Big 12 standings with a 4-2-3 mark.
- The Cowgirls return 11 letterwinners from last season, including five starters in Xcaret Pineda, Mollie Breiner, Megan Haines, Alex Morris and Gracie Bindbeutel (out for 2023 with injury).
- The 2023 season is the 28th in program history; over the first 27, OSU posted a 322-177-63 (.629) record. Head coach Colin Carmichael entered his 19th season at the helm in 2023 with a 239-97-50 mark.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

- UCF is 7-2-0 and tied with OSU and Texas Tech at 3-0-0 in conference play. The 19th-ranked Knights have outscored their opponents 14-7 on the season.
- OSU is 0-2-0 all time against UCF, losing a 2-1 contest in Orlando in 2015 and dropping a 3-2 overtime game in Stillwater in 2016.
- TCU is 6-3-2 overall and 2-0-1 in Big 12 play and hosts Kansas State on Thursday. The Horned Frogs have outscored their opponents 17-11 on the year.
- OSU is 6-7-3 in the all-time series with TCU. The Horned Frogs have won the last four meetings and are unbeaten in the last six (5-0-1); the Cowgirls' last win came in 2017 in Fort Worth.

WELCOME BACK

The 2023 Cowgirls are short on experience but do have several returning veterans. Senior Mollie Breiner started 34 games at defender over the last 2021 and 2022 seasons, while fifth-year Cowgirl Megan Haines has seen her role increase over her career and was a starter 34 times from 2020-22. Another senior, Alex Morris, started 15 games last season and posted a career-high three assists.

NEW FACES

The Cowgirls' 29-player 2023 roster counts 13 newcomers, including 10 freshmen and three transfers. OSU's recruiting class was ranked 23rd nationally by *TopDrawerSoccer.com*; only Texas (14th) had a higher-ranking class than the Cowgirls' among Big 12 programs.

- Three of OSU's freshmen are on the list of *TopDrawerSoccer.com*'s IMG Academy Top 200 players for the '23 recruiting class midfielders Laudan Wilson (No. 74) and Lexi Lee (No. 78) and defender Addison Roberts (No. 168).
- Wilson and Roberts were early enrollees in January 2023 and participated in the Cowgirls' spring exhibition season.
- From the transfer portal, OSU added goalie Grace Gordon from Seton Hall and midfielder/forward Nicole Ray from Utah Valley, both of whom were three-year starters at their previous schools. The Cowgirls' roster also got a boost from Oklahoma transfer Ellie Geoffroy, who played in 19 games for OSU's Bedlam rival as a freshman last season.

BALANCE

Twelve different Cowgirls have scored goals this season, with eight of those finding the back of the net multiple times

Nine OSU players have recorded assists, led by Alex Morris' six and Laudan Wilson's five. In 2022, no Cowgirl had more than three assists on the 19-game season; this season, four Cowgirls have already surpassed the three assist mark.

HAT TRICK HANNAH

With three goals against Little Rock, Hannah Chance became the 13th different Cowgirl in program history and first since 2019 to record a hat trick. It marked the 18th time in the 28-year history of OSU soccer that a Cowgirl has scored three or more goals in a game.

Chance's hat trick came on the heels of a two-goal effort against Florida Atlantic as she netted five goals on eight shots during that stretch; for her efforts, she was named the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week for Week Two.

A junior, Chance has seven goals on the season to rank 29th nationally; three of her goals were game winners, which ranks 15th in the NCAA this season.

SHARING IS CARING

Through 12 games in 2023, senior Alex Morris has already racked up a career-high six assists, which doubles her previous high of three from last season.

The Texan recorded three assists in wins over Florida Atlantic and Little Rock and also spearheaded a pair of shutout wins to earn Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors for Week Two.

FIRST TIMERS

Of OSU's 34 goals this season, 23 have been scored by players who entered the season without a collegiate goal, with seniors Shyann McClary and Alex Morris, junior Hannah Chance, sophomore Logan Heausler and freshmen Adelhia Ghonda, Lexi Lee and Laudan Wilson all finding the back of the net.

D-FENSE

OSU has allowed just six goals through 12 games while recording a Big 12-best eight shutouts. The Cowgirls rank second in the conference behind only Texas Tech in goals allowed and goals against average (0.50).

All four Cowgirl goalkeepers have seen time between the posts, led by Grace Gordon.

OSU ranks fourth nationally with 34 goals and has outscored its opponents 34-6 on the season. The Cowgirls netted 11 goals vs. Florida Atlantic and Little Rock, which marked OSU's highest-scoring output in consecutive games since they also had 11 against Drake (3) and Oral Roberts (8) in back-to-back games in 2015.

The Cowgirls average nearly 21 shots per game, which ranks fourth in the NCAA, and just under nine of those shots are on goal, good for 20th in the nation.

OSU is 13th in the country in scoring offense at 2.83 goals per game.

KICKING IT ON THE CORNER

OSU leads the Big 12 and is second nationally with 95 corner kicks, and their 7.92 corner kicks per game ranks sixth.

The Cowgirls' season high in corner kicks came against Abilene Christian when they took 15, a total that tied for the fifth most in a game in program history.

SAVING GRACE

Grace Gordon has established herself as OSU's top goalkeeper, starting 11 games and posting five shutouts in 914 minutes of action.

A transfer who spent the last three seasons at Seton Hall, Gordon ranks second in the Big 12 with a 0.50 goals against average, while her five clean sheets is third. She has also played a part in two combined shutouts.

During OSU's current four-game winning streak, Gordon has allowed only one goal and has recorded a shutout in the last three games. She posted a season-high eight saves in her Big 12 debut to help OSU to a win at lowa State.

SCORING SURGE

Logan Heausler has scored a goal in four consecutive games and is tied for the team lead with seven goals on the season.

The forward from Houston leads the Cowgirls with 18 points, which ranks fifth in the Big 12, as she also has four assists

Heausler entered the season without a goal and just one assist in 17 career games.

FAB FROSH

Laudan Wilson had a record-setting day in her first-ever Big 12 game.

The Cowgirls' freshman midfielder recorded assists on three of OSU's four goals in a win at Iowa State. The three assists tied a program record as she became the eighth OSU player to achieve the feat and first since 2011.

Wilson followed that performance with a goal against Abilene Christian, and she is second on the team lead with five assists while also contributing three goals on the year.

RANKINGS

For the second consecutive week, OSU is No. 49 in the official NCAA RPI. The Cowgirls are also ranked No. 5 in the Midwest Region by the United Soccer Coaches, up two spots from last week.

COWGIRL COUNTRY

Oklahoma State's 2023 roster includes players from nine states as well as Canada and Northern Ireland.

HOME SWEET HOME

OSU has won 79 percent of its games in four seasons at Neal Patterson Stadium, which opened in 2019. The Cowgirls are 41-9-5 on their current home turf, including a 7-0-0 mark this season. OSU has gone undefeated at home in seven seasons in its history, the last time coming in 2019.

COACH COLIN

Colin Carmichael recorded his 200th career win with OSU's 2-0 victory at Texas on Oct. 11, 2019. Carmichael has spent all 18 of his seasons as a head coach in Stillwater.

Carmichael entered the 2023 season with 239 career wins, ranking fourth among active Big 12 coaches in wins at their current school behind only BYU's Jennifer Rockwood (425 wins in 28 seasons), West Virginia's Nikki Izzo-Brown (383 wins in 27 seasons) and Kansas' Mark Francis (258 wins in 24 seasons).

WINNING IS A HABIT

Now in its 28th season, Oklahoma State soccer has built itself into an established winner.

- OSU has earned a berth in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship 12 of the last 17 years (beginning in 2006) and six of the last 10.
- From 2006-11, the Cowgirls earned six-straight NCAA tourney bids and advanced to at least the second round each time, including back-to-back Elite Eight appearances in 2010 and 2011.
- From 2008-11, OSU celebrated four consecutive Big 12 championships two regular season (2008, '11) and two tournament ('09, '10). The Cowgirls also won regular season titles in 2017 and 2019.

NEAL PATTERSON STADIUM

Neal Patterson Stadium was officially dedicated on Aug. 19, 2018, prior to the Oklahoma State-Oklahoma match. The Cowgirls were 2-1 victors in that contest as an OSU women's soccer record crowd of 4,122 fans were in attendance. Kim Rodriguez scored the first-ever goal in the stadium when she converted a penalty kick in the 15th minute.

A \$20 million project, Neal Patterson Stadium is a showcase for Cowgirl Soccer and one of the top soccer facilities in the collegiate ranks. It is named for its major benefactor and Oklahoma State alumnus, the late Neal Patterson.

Patterson, who passed away during the summer of 2017, grew up near his family's farm in Manchester, Okla. He earned a bachelor's degree in finance and a master's degree in business from Oklahoma State. He was one of five entrepreneurs who founded Sporting Club, which in 2006 purchased the Sporting KC Major League Soccer franchise. He was also chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Cerner Corporation, a company he co-founded with two colleagues in 1979. Today, Cerner is the world's largest publicly traded health information technology company with \$4.8 billion in revenues in 2016 and approximately 24,000 associates worldwide. FORTUNE recently named Cerner one of the world's most admired companies.

"When you provide an education to someone with intelligence, work ethic, determination and big dreams, you occasionally create a force that changes the world," said Mike Holder, OSU's Director of Athletics. "Neal Patterson did that in the health care industry, and our goal is to use his investment in OSU soccer to attract bright, determined, big dreamers from around the world to our soccer team.

"We have been blessed to have an abundance of successful and generous people that have helped transform our athletic department," he added. "Our hope is that Neal's gift will motivate someone else to make a difference on our campus. His name on the stadium is our way of saying thank you and inspiring that next great donor."

The new facility includes club seats, plaza and upper bowl gathering areas and a north end zone terrace area and seating designed specifi-

cally for OSU students. Team facilities include locker rooms, meeting areas, kitchen facilities, sports medicine areas and equipment rooms. The stadium can accommodate 2,500 fans in permanent seats.

The west side of the stadium includes 346 reserved chairback seats and 810 reserved bleacher-back seats. There are 552 general admission seats

The north end zone includes bleacher seating for more than 500 and includes a patio, a building and a concourse area that can host more than 125 for gatherings.

Atop the west side of the stadium are two club levels with a capacity of 80 and two suites with a capacity of 20 guests each. A new press box sits atop the stadium. The west side is anchored by a club area at field level that can host more than 100 and serve as a player lounge and nutrition area on non-game days.

Other unique aspects of Patterson Stadium include:

- A large roof that covers much of the seating areas, providing shade and a soccer-specific feel like that in many international venues;
- Home and visitor bench areas with chairback seating built into the stadium;
- \bullet A 26 feet by 40 feet high-definition video scoreboard in the southeast corner of the facility.

"A facility of this magnitude is a game changer for our program," said OSU head soccer coach Colin Carmichael. "It helps the current student-athletes to be in one of the nicest facilities in the country. Our fans are going to have a much better game day experience. We want it to be a real family atmosphere.

"We have always had a good student following," he added. "But we want to enhance their experience, which will make for a better atmosphere. And of course this will affect recruiting.

"Every recruit wants to know that how serious a school is about their sport. This is a huge statement from our administration."
