## KNIGHT NOTES

### THE KNIGHTS CONTROL THEIR DESTINY

- The No. 1 UCF men's soccer team enters its regular-season finale against James Madison Tuesday evening in control of its own destiny, as the squad can clinch its first Sun Belt regular-season championship and No. 1 seed in the 2023 Sun Belt Conference Tournament with a win. The Knights' most recent victory, a 3-2 effort at Georgia State Oct. 27, coupled with No. 2 West Virginia's 1-0 defeat at Kentucky Oct. 27, clinched a top-two seed for UCF, which enters Tuesday's action with a narrow one-point advantage over second-place No. 6 Marshall in the Sun Belt table, 19 points to 18. Should the Knights draw or lose their regular-season finale, UCF would require a loss by Marshall to South Carolina Tuesday.
- UCF's top-two seed guarantees the Knights the right to host the first two rounds of the conference tournament Nov. 5 and Nov. 8, and a Tuesday win would award UCF hosting honors for the Nov. 12 Sun Belt Tournament Championship Game as well, should the Knights advance that far. With a top-two seed already clinched, the Knights will host their first conference tournament since the 2020-21 campaign pushed to the spring of 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

### CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

- The Knights on Tuesday will look to win the fourth regular-season conference championship in program history, and their first since the 2020-21 campaign when UCF produced a 7-3 record within American Athletic Conference play and toppled Tulsa in the AAC Tournament, 1-0, to clinch the regular-season title and the tournament championship in the same season.
- The Knights claimed two other regular-season conference championships as members of The American, going unbeaten in conference play in 2019 (6-0-1) en route to a 15-3-2 record and a third-round NCAA Tournament berth, and producing a 5-1-1 mark in AAC play in 2018 and advancing as far as the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a 13-3-3 final record.
- UCF also claimed three consecutive conference tournament championships as a member of the ASUN from 2002-04, defeating Jacksonville (2-1, 0T) and Florida Atlantic (1-0) in 2002, Mercer (2-0) and Georgia State (2-1, 20T) and Mercer (1-0) in 2004.

### THANK YOU, SENIORS

- The Knights will honor six seniors in honor of Tuesday evening's Senior Knight. Defenders **Zane Bubb** and **Raphael Crivello**, and midfielders **Beto Ydrach**, **Robbie Soronellas**, and **AJ Seals**, in addition to student manager **Matthew Lerner**, will all be recognized in a pregame ceremony.
- Bubb most recently scored the first game-winning goal of his six-year playing career at Georgia State Oct. 27, and has scored his first two goals in a Knights uniform in his second season in Orlando this fall. He was also tabbed as the Sun Belt's Week 2 Defensive Player of the Week Sept. 5.
- Seals most recently scored his first collegiate goal in the Knights' win at Georgia State Oct. 27, breaking the ice for the Knights in the 23rd minute.
- Crivello netted his first Knights goal in UCF's 5-0 win over Coastal Carolina Oct. 18, and added his first assist of the season at Georgia State Oct. 27.
- Ydrach scored his second Knights goal during UCF's 2-2 draw with then-No. 11 FIU Sept. 5, marking his first score since Sept. 18, 2021 at Memphis.
- Soronellas also earned Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 7, and has scored 1 goal and added 1 assist 13 matches this fall.

### OWNING OCTOBER

- October is a month that has historically been kind to the UCF men's soccer team, as the squad has compiled a 25-7-3 all-time record in the month of October since head coach **Scott Calabrese** took the reins prior to the 2017 campaign, with all seven losses coming in the last two seasons. Prior to the fall 2021 slate, the Knights were unbeaten in the month of October under Calabrese, recording a 15-0-3 record in that span, and the team remains perfect in 5 matches in October 2023.
- With a win Tuesday, UCF would conclude a perfect month of October with a 6-0-0 record. The last time the Knights authored a spotless calendar month came in the spring of 2021, when the Knights went 4-0-0 in March, including a win over then-No. 9 SMU, en route to third-round NCAA Tournament berth. The last time the Knights authored a win streak of 6 matches or more within a calendar month came in the 1998 season under head coach **Bob Winch**, when UCF went 7-0-0 from Oct. 7-30 after falling 2-0 against UNC-Charlotte Oct. 2, the lone blemish in October 1998.
- A win would also extend the Knights' active win streak to seven straight matches, marking the team's first win streak of at least 7 games since the fall of 2019, when UCF went 7-0-0 from Oct. 12-Nov. 13 en route to earning a third-round NCAA Tournament berth and a 15-3-2 final record.





**KNIGHT NOTES - CONTINUED**

**DEFENDING THE KINGDOM**

• Since head coach **Scott Calabrese** took over at the beginning of the 2017 season, the Knights have posted a record of 38-12-8 at home. UCF has lost just 10 regular-season home matches during Calabrese's tenure. Prior to the 2020-21 season, UCF only had one regular season home loss through the first three campaigns.

**ROAD WARRIORS**

• After putting the finishing touches on a perfect road trip through South Carolina and Georgia State, the UCF men's soccer team completed its regular season with a road record of 5-1-0, with its lone blemish a 1-0 loss at No. 1 Marshall Sept. 23. The Knights won each of their last four matches away from the UCF Soccer Complex, and outscored its opposition by an aggregate 11 goals to 7 in its six road matches this season.  
 • The last time the Knights managed a 5-1-0 record or better in six road matches came in the fall 2018 campaign, when UCF topped Penn State (Aug. 24, 2-1 in OT), FIU (Sept. 11, 3-1), Stetson (Sept. 15, 4-2), Tulsa (Oct. 6, 4-3) and Memphis (Oct. 27, 2-1) away from its home soccer complex.

**NO. 1 KNIGHTS**

• After beginning the fall 2023 season unranked in the United Soccer Coaches' national top 25 poll, the UCF men's soccer team has climbed all the way to the top, earning the No. 1 national ranking in the week 9 release of the poll following the team's 9-1-2 (5-1-1 SBC) record through its 12 matches on the strength of seven of eight first-place votes. The Knights' 9-1-2 record marks the best start to a season by the program through 12 matches since 2019, when UCF began the year with an identical 9-1-2 mark, including a 2-1 win on the road at the then-No. 6 North Carolina Tar Heels Sept. 1 and a 3-3 double-overtime draw with then-No. 4 SMU Oct. 6. The 2019 Knights would advance as far as the third round of the NCAA Tournament but would fall in overtime by a 2-1 final score against then-No. 5 SMU Nov. 30, concluding the season with a 15-3-2 final record.  
 • The Knights' No. 1 national ranking represents the first No. 1 national spot achieved by any team in a regular-season poll in UCF Athletics history, and represents the latest in a meteoric rise through the polls for the team throughout the fall 2023 slate, as after the squad began the season unranked, the Knights earned the No. 14 spot in the poll's week one rankings, followed by No. 6 in week two, and then a share of No. 5 with Louisville in week three prior to UCF's No. 3 ranking in weeks four and five, and No. 2 in weeks six, seven and eight.  
 • UCF also overtook first place in the Sun Belt table with a conference-best 16 points entering Friday's action, and could clinch the No. 1 seed in the tournament and the Sun Belt regular-season title with a win at Georgia State coupled with losses by No. 2 West Virginia and No. 6 Marshall.

**TOP THREE IN NCAA RPI**

• The Knights also remained within the top three in the nation in the official NCAA RPI rankings for the sixth consecutive week at No. 3 Oct. 30, after debuting at No. 2 in the country in the first and second rankings Sept. 25 and Oct. 2 and pulling in at No. 3 in the Oct. 9 rankings (Oct. 9).  
 • Entering UCF's Tuesday matchup, the Knights had completed all four of their quadrant 1 contests, going 1-1-2 against then-No. 4/9 Clemson (Top Drawer/United Soccer Coaches), then-No. 4 West Virginia (United Soccer Coaches), No. 1 Marshall and then-No. 11 Florida International. Through the team's first 13 matches, their opponent strength of schedule ranks 29th in the nation. UCF has also earned at least one point in six of its seven matches against RPI top 100 teams, going 4-1-2 against the aforementioned Herd (No. 2), Mountaineers (No. 8), FIU Panthers (No. 9), Tigers (No. 25), Kentucky Wildcats (No. 52), Georgia State Panthers (No. 69) and NC State Wolfpack (No. 78).

**AWOKEN OFFENSE**

• After managing to score three or more goals in just one of its first 10 matches this fall, the UCF men's soccer team has exploded for 11 goals in its last 3 contests, a 5-0 win over Coastal Carolina at home Oct. 18 and back-to-back 3-2 wins at South Carolina Oct. 22 and Georgia State Oct. 27.  
 • Nine different Knights have recorded at least one goal in that span, led by **Emmanuel Bam** and **Yanis Belatrache**'s two each. **Clarence Awouodor**, **Raphael Crivello**, **Saku Heiskanen**, **Anderson Rosa**, **Lucca Dourado**, **AJ Seals** and **Zane Bubb** have all added one goal in UCF's last three matches.  
 • The offensive explosion has boosted the Knights to within the top three in the Sun Belt in scoring offense with 2.23 goals per game, a mark that also ranks 15th nationally. UCF on Tuesday will meet the team ahead of it, as the James Madison Dukes average 2.27 goals per game, which slots in at second in the Sun Belt and 13th nationally. The Knights also boast 6.15 points per game, good for third in the Sun Belt and 24th in the country.  
 • Dourado represents the team's leading scorer entering Tuesday's action with nine goals and two assists for a team-best 20 total points.

**DOURADO ON RECORD WATCH**

• Entering Tuesday night's contest against the Dukes, forward **Lucca Dourado** has scored at least one goal in three of his last five matches dating back to UCF's 2-0 win over Georgia Southern Oct. 7, recording five goals in that span and adding his first 2 assists of the season.  
 • With his fourth straight match with at least 1 point Oct. 22, he claimed sole possession of 7th place on the UCF all-time career points list with his 79th career point, surging past **Nik Robson**'s 77 (2009-11). The forward needs just 3 points to tie **Matias Pyysalo**'s sixth-place total of 82 (2014-17).  
 • With one year remaining of eligibility following the 2023 campaign, Dourado had already clinched a share of 10th place on UCF's all-time points list (61) with his penalty kick goal during the Knights' 2-1 win over Stetson Aug. 27. With his second goal of the season against No. 11 FIU Sept. 9, Dourado became the seventh Knight in program history to eclipse the 30-goal mark, joining **Heikki Ritvanen** (88), **Randy DeShield** (56), **Ari Nurmi** (47), **Cal Jennings** (46), **Rony Francois** (39) and **Matias Pyysalo** (32). He now needs just two to tie Francois' fifth-place total of 39.  
 • Dourado scored in seven consecutive matches during the 2022 season, which was the second longest in the nation behind LIU's **Emil Jaaskelainen**, who had his streak end at eight in a row.  
 • Jennings (2016-19) was the last Knight to hit the 30-goal mark and finished his career fourth all-time at UCF with 46. Pyysalo and Jennings are the only two Knights to hit the 30 goal mark under **Scott Calabrese**. Both went on to play professional soccer.  
 • Dourado finished the 2022 season fifth among active NCAA players in goals per game with a mark of 0.65 goals per game and was tied for 31st in total points with 59.

**A MUÑOZ MASTERCLASS**

• UCF netminder **Juanvi Muñoz** made a pair of saves in the Knights' 2-0 victory over Brown Sept. 9, clinching his first clean sheet of the season and the third of his two-year collegiate career. The sophomore also notched shutout wins against UC Riverside and Temple last year.  
 • The clean sheet came on the heels of a career performance for the Valencia, Spain, native Sept. 5 against then-No. 11 FIU Sept. 5, when he made a single-match career-high 9 saves on 11 total shots on goal and 16 total shots faced in the Knights' 2-2 draw. The evening surpassed his previous career high of 7 saves in the Knights' 2-1 win over North Florida Aug. 29, 2022.  
 • Not only did his 9 saves mark a Sun Belt single-match season high, but the total also represented the most in a single match by a Knights goalie since **Yannik Oettl**'s 9 saves in the Knights' triple overtime 1-1 tie (UCF 4-3 win on penalty kicks) April 15, 2021 during the American Athletic Conference Championship Semifinals (season moved from the fall of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

**DECLAWING THE CATS**

• The Knights made a statement in their season-opener, downing the then-No. 4/9 Clemson Tigers (Top Drawer Soccer/United Soccer Coaches) by a 2-1 final score at Historic Riggs Field Aug. 24. The contest marked the Knights' first win against a ranked opponent since downing then-No. 13 Charlotte, also by a 2-1 decision, Oct. 21, 2022, and their first against a nationally-ranked top-10 foe since UCF topped then-No. 6 Tulsa Oct. 10, 2021.  
 • Going with Top Drawer Soccer's rankings, UCF also earned its first victory against an opponent nationally-ranked in the top five since Oct. 2, 2010, when the Knights edged then-No. 5 SMU by a 2-1 margin.  
 • The victory also marked the first win in program history against the Tigers in the third all-time meeting between the two schools. UCF and Clemson hadn't met since Sept. 6, 1995, a 3-0 defeat. The Tigers topped the Knights in the first meeting as well, by a 9-2 decision Sept. 11, 1977.  
 • The victory also assured the Knights at least one ranked win for the fifth consecutive season, after UCF topped No. 13 Charlotte 2-1 Oct. 21, 2022, No. 6 Tulsa 3-2 Oct. 10, 2021, No. 17 James Madison May 2, 2021 (season moved from 2020 to spring as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic), No. 12 Missouri State 2-1 in overtime November 24, 2019, and No. 6 North Carolina 2-1 Sept. 1, 2019.

## UCF DIVISION I CONFERENCE AFFILIATION HISTORY

**Atlantic Sun  
Conference**  
1993-2004 (12 seasons)

After making the D-1 jump in 1984, the Black and Gold didn't join their first Division I conference until 1993. Despite going 4-10-1 in their first year in a conference, the Knights made the A-Sun Semifinals in just their second year as part of the A-Sun. The Knights found success quickly and carried that momentum with them throughout their time in the A-Sun, tallying eight appearances in the conference tournament in 12 total seasons.

The Knights finished their time in the A-Sun on a high note, winning the tournament championship in three consecutive seasons from 2002-04. The championship runs led to UCF's first three NCAA Tournament appearances. The Black and Gold were turned away from their first NCAA Tournament victory in their first two tries by FIU, but were able to beat the Panthers in 2004 for the program's first tournament win.

Three Knights earned four major honors during the program's tenure in the A-Sun. Heikki Ritvanen scored 88 career goals from 1996-99, UCF's most in program history, and was honored as the A-Sun's Player of the Year in 1999. Alejandro Gessen was named Freshman of the Year while Ryan McIntosh was a two-time Defensive Player of the Year. In all, 54 nods were received to the A-Sun First, Second, Third and Freshmen Teams in UCF's 12 years in the league.

**Conference USA**  
2005-2012 (8 seasons)

UCF had a new conference and a new head coach for the 2005 season. Brent Erwin and the Knights went 13-17-3 over their first two seasons as members of Conference USA. Fast forward to UCF's sixth season in the league, fourth year head coach Bryan Cunningham led UCF to its first NCAA Tournament appearance as members of C-USA, winning 12 matches with a 12-5-3 record. The team followed suit the next year, winning a dozen games again and making the NCAA Tournament second round for the second straight year.

The Knights won 32 matches in their final three seasons as part of C-USA, more than first five seasons in the league combined. The Black and Gold won no major honors as C-USA members, but saw nine nods to the All-Conference First Team and a total of 30 nods across the First, Second, Third and Freshman Teams.

**American Athletic  
Conference**  
2013-2022 (10 seasons)

The Knights enjoyed massive success as part of The American, reaching the conference final in five of their final six seasons in the league. The Black and Gold earned three regular seasons titles and one tournament championship as members of The American. In total, UCF qualified for the conference's postseason tournament in nine straight seasons, only missing the 2022 postseason by two points.

Three of UCF's NCAA Tournament appearances came while in The American, qualifying in 2018, 2019 and 2020. The Knights punched their first ticket into the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 in 2019, and then did the same for the 2020 tournament, which was held in the spring of 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Plenty of Knights stood out in UCF's time in The American. A member of the Black and Gold was named Offensive Player of the Year six times out of the team's 10 years in the league. Matias Pysyalo and Cal Jennings won the honor twice while Romario Williams and Hadji Barry were honored once each. UCF collected three Midfielder of the Year honors and three Goalkeeper of the Year awards; Oetti collected all three goalkeeping honors while Yoni Sorokin took two of the three midfielder awards along with Louis Perez who won the other. Gino Vivi was honored as UCF's lone Freshman of the Year award, earning the nod in 2019.

The Black and Gold had 11 First Team All-Conference honorees, including nine that were named on the top squad multiple times. In total, UCF earned 36 nods to the All-Conference First or Second Teams while 16 rookies graced the All-Freshman Team while in The American.

**Sun Belt Conference**  
2023-present

UCF men's soccer's move to the Sun Belt Conference was made in tandem with the rest of UCF's sports moving to the Big 12 Conference in 2023-24, a league which does not sponsor men's soccer. The Sun Belt recently re-emerged as a conference, resuming play in 2022 after previously sponsoring men's soccer from 1976-1995 and 2014-20. The Knights will join Kentucky, South Carolina and West Virginia as men's soccer members only. Those four teams will join James Madison, Marshall, Old Dominion, Coastal Carolina, Georgia Southern and Georgia State.

"I'm very excited to be partnering with Commissioner Keith Gil and Deputy Commissioner Kathy Keene. They are great people and I'm excited to work with them again," said UCF Vice President and athletics director Terry Mohajir. "We believe the move to the Sun Belt positions our men's soccer program for great success in the coming years. Coach Calabrese has shown his teams can compete with the best of the best in The American, and we can't wait to see the program continue to grow and compete in the very strong Sun Belt Conference."

"We are very excited to accept the invitation to join what will clearly be an incredible conference for men's soccer," said head coach Scott Calabrese. "I love that the Sun Belt will be the home of both the Big 12 and the SEC for men's soccer along with 2020 National Champions Marshall and so many top soccer programs as well. It's an exciting new challenge for our program and we can't wait to be a part of it in 2023."

**KNIGHT NOTES - CONTINUED****TWO FIRSTS IN THE OPENER**

- The Knights' historic 2-1 victory over No. 4/9 Clemson (Top Drawer/United Soccer Coaches) Aug. 24 came on the strength of the first goals in the respective careers of both sophomore forward **Emmanuel Bam** and freshman midfielder **Saku Heiskanen**. The occasion marked the first contest that saw two Knights score their first career goals since the fall 2021 season, when fifth-year midfielder **Rainer De Jesus** and senior defender **Yanis Leerman** both notched their first career scores in the American Athletic Conference Tournament Semifinals against Tulsa Nov. 10, a match UCF won 6-0.
- Sophomore forward/midfielder **Lucas Mauro** and redshirt-sophomore midfielder **Josiah Ramirez** both recorded their first career goals in the same match earlier that season as well, during the Knights' 5-0 victory over North Florida Aug. 29.
- Bam's goal also made the sophomore the first Knight since sophomore forward **Kevin Andrews** to have his first career goal also represent a game-winner, as Andrews' tally in the 45th minute proved the difference in the Knights' 3-1 victory over Florida International Oct. 9, 2022.
- Heiskanen also became the first Knight since the 2019 campaign to score a goal in the first match of his collegiate career, when redshirt-freshman midfielder **Gianluca Arcangeli** scored UCF's lone goal in a 2-1 defeat at No. 4 Wake Forest in his collegiate debut Aug. 30.

**FUN IN THE SUN**

- UCF men's soccer makes the jump to the Sun Belt Conference for the 2023 season, as the athletics department transitions from the American Athletic Conference to the Big 12 Conference, a conference that doesn't sponsor men's soccer.
- The Sun Belt is the fourth conference the UCF men's soccer program has been a part of in their Division I history, playing in the Atlantic Sun from 1993-2004, Conference USA from 2005-2012 and The American from 2013 through the 2022 season (more in depth info on page 3).
- The Sun Belt recently re-emerged as a conference, resuming play in 2022 after previously sponsoring men's soccer from 1976-1995 and 2014-20. The Knights will join Kentucky, South Carolina and West Virginia as men's soccer members only. Those four teams will James Madison, Marshall, Old Dominion, Coastal Carolina, Georgia Southern and Georgia State.
- The members of the revamped Sun Belt have enjoyed great success lately. Marshall won the national championship during the 2020 season, played in the spring of 2021. Kentucky was the top overall seed in the 2022 NCAA Tournament and reached the Sweet 16 along with conference-mate Marshall. Coastal Carolina is one of the winningest programs in the NCAA and has made 10 NCAA Tournament appearances since 2010.
- Overall, six of UCF's nine new conference mates finished in the top 60 of the 2022 NCAA RPI with three finishing in the top 50.

**KNIGHTS PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH IN FIRST SUN BELT SEASON, DOURADO AND ROSA NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM**

- UCF was voted to finish fourth in this year's Sun Belt preseason poll with 68 points and one first place vote.
- Kentucky led the way with 93 points and six first place votes, followed closely by Marshall with 91 points and two first place votes. West Virginia sits third with 77 points and a first place vote. Behind UCF were South Carolina (49 points), Georgia State and Coastal Carolina (45), James Madison (40), Old Dominion (26) and Georgia Southern (16).
- Lucca Dourado** and **Anderson Rosa** were named to the Sun Belt Preseason All-Conference Team ahead of the squad's inaugural run in their new league. Dourado earned two All-Conference First Team nods (2021, 2022) and an All-Rookie Team honor (2020-21) in the team's time in the American Athletic Conference. Rosa earned All-Conference First Team and All-Rookie Team honors in his first season of collegiate soccer (2020-21) before being named to the Second Team in 2021 ahead of his return to the First Team in 2022.
- UCF has two members on the Preseason All-Conference Team, tied for second with Marshall and Georgia State, and behind Kentucky who has four.

**MR. WORLDWIDE**

- Scott Calabrese** and staff's roster for the 2023 season has at least one student-athlete from each of the six habitable continents with 13 different countries represented.
- Eleven Knights hail from North America, with nine from three different states in the United States and two from Costa Rica. Eight members of the Black and Gold hail from Europe while four are from Africa, three are from South America, two from Asia and one is from Australia.
- The UCF roster is traditionally diverse, but the 2023 season will be the first time that there is at least one player from each habitable continent in Calabrese's seven year tenure.
