#### ABOUT UCF

- The 2024 campaign will mark the Black and Gold's inaugural season of competition in the Big 12 Conference as well as former UCF slugger and assistant coach Rich Wallace's first year as the head man for the Knights.

- A season ago, the Black and Gold finished with a 33-26 overall record and a 12-12 conference clip to finish fourth in its final season of competition in the American Athletic Conference. The Knights also set the program and AAC single-season home run record with 109 round trippers in 2023.

- UCF welcomes back five of its 10 position player starters from last year's squad. Two-time all-conference performer Andrew Sundean is the team's top returner as he hit .340 in 2023 with 16 home runs, 10 doubles and a team-best 54 RBIs. The junior catcher was recently named No. 25 on DIBaseball's Preseason Top 50 Catchers list. Fellow junior Lex Boedicker also returns after too tallying 16 homers, along with 10 doubles, 46 RBIs and a .266 average. After starting all of UCF's 59 games a season ago, fifth-year senior infielder Andrew Brait will look to have another strong campaign. The 2024 captain batted .286 with 14 doubles, 20 total extra-base knocks and 38 RBIs.

- The Knights will also welcome in 23 newcomers to the fold in 2024 with 17 transfers and six freshmen. Sixth-year transfer from Notre Dame Jack Zyska (outfielder) looks to be one of the top newcomers for the Black and Gold, as he brings a wealth of postseason experience to the squad which includes a College World Series run in 2022. Zyska too was named a captain prior to the season. His former Notre Dame teammate Danny Neri, a senior catcher, too made the move from South Bend to Orlando. Neri threw out nine would-be base stealers and hit .208 with nine extra-base hits and 18 RBIs in 44 games a season ago.

- Senior infielder Mikey Kluska looks to be another key addition for the Knights as he played his first two years in the Big 12 at West Virginia and last season at Richmond. Kluska was named to the Big 12 Conference All-Freshman Team as a freshman in 2021 and batted .325 with 19 extra-base hits and 35 RBIs while starting all 54 games last year. Junior transfer Andrew Estrella (Stetson) too looks to be a nice addition in the infield, as he hit .247 with eight homers, 11 doubles, a triple and 34 RBIs in 43 games played a season ago. Besides Zyska in the outfield, junior transfer Matt Prevesk (Florida), sophomore transfer AJ Nessler (Pitt), senior transfer Anthony Calabro (West Georgia) and freshman Andrew Williamson (St. Petersburg, Fla.) have all looked strong in practice and will vie for playing time.

- On the mound, senior relievers Kyle Kramer and Najer Victor are both primed for strong seasons as they round out UCF's 2024 team captains. Just this week, both Kramer and Victor were just named to the 2024 NCBWA Preseason Stopper of the Year Watch List. Victor, who was also tabbed No. 19 on D1Baseball's Preseason Top 50 Relief Pitchers list led the squad with a 2.88 ERA in 2023 and struck out 50 batters over 34.1 innings, while Kramer was tops on the team in saves with eight and tied for the team lead in wins with six. Of the starters, senior Ben Vespi and junior Dom Stagliano both return for the Knights in 2024. Vespi was a 2022 all-conference honoree and went 2-2 while splitting time as a starter and a reliever last season while Stagliano went 4-5 with 70 strikeouts over 64.2 innings.

- The Black and Gold also welcome in a number of key additions on the mound this season. Junior transfer Tyler Nesbitt (from Florida) and senior transfer Cade Boxrucker (from Campbell) will both look to see time in a starting role, while fellow transfers Spencer Bauer (Elon), Alex Galvan (Louisville) and Wiley Hartley (Campbell) will also look to play big roles for the Knights. In the pen, the Knights also welcome back senior Chase Centala, junior Nick Vieira, junior Dominic Castellano and senior Cameron Crain to help bolster UCF's pitching staff.

### numbers to know

The Knights blasted out a program record 109 home runs in 2023, which set both UCF and American Athletic Conference records for homers in a single season. A total of 12 Knights hit a home run last year, 11 of which smacked out multiple HRs, and seven tallied double-digits with 10 or more. With 2023 home run leader Ben McCabe (19 HRs) now playing in the Rockies orginization, the Knights return junior catcher Andrew Sundean and junior infielder Lex Boedicker, who tied for second in round trippers with 16 apiece for UCF a season ago.

### STORYLINES - KNIGHT NOTES

#### ABOUT BRYANT

- The Bulldogs are led by former UCF assistant coach Ryan Klosterman, who was an assistant for the Knights from 2012-2019. Klosterman, who is entering his fifth season as the head coach at Bryant, holds an 87-76 career record. The Bulldogs went 26-24 last year and 12-12 in the America East to tie for third in the league standings. Bryant was picked to finish fifth in the America East this season and has won nine conference championships over the past 12 seasons. The Bulldogs last played in an NCAA Regional in 2016.

- Friday's starting pitcher Wainer was recently named to Perfect Game's Preseason All-America East Team as he holds a 5-5 career record and three saves in 92.0 innings. He went 3-4 in 2023 with a 4.73 ERA while striking out 50 in 45.2 innings. Bryant also welcomes back Ken Turner on the mound this season who went 2-3 a year ago with a 5.98 ERA and 46 strikeouts over 52.2 innings. Of the position players, senior infielder Lewis Barnum holds the top returning average, as he hit .281 with 16 extra-base hits, six stolen bases and 35 RBIs. Fellow senior infielder Carmine Petosa is next, as he batted .249 with eight home runs, seven doubles and 37 runs batted in.

- Friday's opener will mark the first all-time meeting between the Knights and Bulldogs on the baseball diamond.

#### **IT'S ALWAYS SUNNY**

- Andrew Sundean was named to D1 Baseball's Preseason top 50 catchers list at the number 25 spot prior to the 2024 season.

- The junior catcher Andrew Sundean led the team in RBIs (54) last season, while tying for second in home runs (16), and also finishing second on the team in batting average (.340), slugging percentage (.626) and on-base (.428).

- Sundean earned first team all-conference honors in 2023 as well as second team all-conference accolades in 2022 as a freshman. He was also tabbed a Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball following his freshman campaign.

- Sundean notably hit a home run in three-straight games during the Wichita State series a season ago (May 18-20). If Sundean belts out at least eight home runs this season, he will be in the top ten for career home runs in only his third season as he enters the year with 21 round trippers for his career.

#### **KRAMER & VICTOR TABBED NCBWA PRESEASON STOPPERS**

- Senior captains Najer Victor and Kyle Kramer will look to shut the door on opposing offenses once again in 2024, as both were named to the 2024 NCBWA Preseason Stopper of the Year Watch List. Victor, who topped the team in ERA a season ago with a 2.88 clip, was also named to D1 Baseball's Preseason top 50 relief pitchers list as he checked in at the number 19 spot prior to the 2024 season.

- A season ago, the senior right-hander Victor had an impressive stretch where tossed 14 no-hit innings over seven appearances. He also threw 12 scoreless outings on the year and struck out 50 batters while walking just 13 over 34.1 innings. Victor is the lone Knight not from the continental United States, as he hails from the U.S. Virgin Islands.

- Kramer, who has led UCF in saves in both 2022 (six) and 2023 (eight), will enter the year tied for sixth in the all-time UCF record books with 14 for his career. A season ago, Kramer was named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Midseason Watch List and also tied for team lead in wins with six (6-2) and posted the second-best ERA with a 3.96 clip.

#### WALLY'S WORLD

- Rich Wallace returns to UCF after playing for the Knights from 2000-03, and coaching with the squad from 2004-08. He's the first UCF alum to lead the Black and Gold in an NCAA-sponsored men's sport since 1988. Wallace grew up in Orlando and attend Bishop Moore High School here in the City Beautiful.

- During his playing career, Wallace led the Knights in batting average (.380) and on base percentage (.529) during the 2000 season. The OBP represents the sixth highest single season mark in the Knights' history. He was also tabbed an honorable mention Freshman All-American that season. In his four seasons with the Knights, UCF won a combined 166 games (51-14 in 2001, 43-19 in 2000, 41-22 in 2002), including a combined 67-17 mark in ASUN play in 2000-02.

- Coach Wallace has advanced to an NCAA Regional eight times, with three coming as a collegiate player and five as an assistant coach. With UCF, he helped the Knights make three consecutive regionals (from 2000-2002) and another as an assistant in 2004. Since 2018, he's also advanced to four more regionals as an assistant since 2018, which includes a super regional while at Notre Dame in 2021 and the College World Series while in South Bend in 2022. He was also tabbed the recruiter of the year by D1Baseball in 2016.

### CITRONAUT SATURDAY

#### WHAT IS CITRONAUT SATURDAY?

- On select Saturdays this season, the UCF baseball team will take on the persona of the Citronaut. Made whole with canaveral blue and black colors, Citronaut logos, special-edition uniforms and space-themed in-stadium marketing and promotions, the baseball team fully embraces the name of the 'Nauts on select Saturdays.

- In 2022, UCF baseball debuted as the 'Nauts with their first-ever specialedition "Citronaut" jerseys. The blackon-black kits featured the Citronaut script logo and jersey numbers detailed with constellations.

- The 'Nauts returned for Citronaut Saturday in 2023, donning monochrome canaveral blue jerseys with black and white piping, complete with black numbers and the polaris star.

#### WHO ARE THE 'NAUTS?

- We are so glad you asked. The Citronaut was the first mascot of Florida Technological University (FTU), which later became



the University of Central Florida (UCF). The mascot appeared on the first student handbook in 1968-1969. After one year, the students petitioned the student government to establish a new mascot. In 1970, students approved "Knights of the Pegasus" as the second official university mascot, which remains to this day. The space themed uniforms and constellation named streets around campus remember the times when FTU was founded to provide personnel to support NASA at the Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Air Force Station.

### KNIGHT NOTES - UCF BASEBALL HISTORY

#### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- The Knights have a total of 23 newcomers on the squad this season, which includes 17 transfers and six freshmen. Of the 17 transfers, 12 of them have prior Power 5 experience, which includes two that played under Coach Wallace during his time at Notre Dame in sixth-year senior outfielder Jack Zyska and senior catcher Danny Neri. Of the P5 transfers, three are from Florida, two from Notre Dame, two from Louisville, two having played at West Virginia, one from North Carolina, one from South Carolina and one from Pitt.

#### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- As voted on by the players, UCF named four captains prior to the 2024 season in senior pitchers Kyle Kramer and Najer Victor, as well as senior infielder Andrew Brait and senior outfielder Jack Zyska.

- The four senior captains will bring a combined total of 17 prior seasons of collegiate experience to the mix, as both Kramer and Zyska have previously played five seasons apiece, Brait four years, and Victor three. Zyska, who played his former five seasons at Notre Dame, also holds numerous seasons of NCAA postseason experience under his belt, which includes making it to Omaha in 2022.

#### **ORLANDO'S BASH BROS**

- After helping UCF set the program's single-season home run record with 109 round trippers a season ago, both Andrew Sundean and Lex Boedicker are back for the Knights in 2024. Sundean and Boedicker tied for second on the team last year with 16 home runs apiece. The 16 dingers were good enough to tie both Sundean and Boedicker for sixth place on the UCF single-season home run leaderboard. Both juniors at UCF, Sundean will enter the year with 21 career homers, while Boedicker has 18.

#### HOW MANY ANDREW'S?

- The Knights have not one, not two, not three, but four players named Andrew on the 2024 roster. Senior infielder Andrew Brait, junior infielder Andrew Estrella, junior catcher Andrew Sundean, and freshman outfielder Andrew Williamson all share the same first name. Two of the four are returners in Brait and Sundean, while Estrella (junior transfer from Stetson) and Williamson are newcomers (freshman from St. Pete, Fla.)

- Andrew is a masculine Greek name meaning "strong" or "manly." This popular name denotes bravery and is a variant of the Greek name Andreas, derived from the aner, which translates to "man."

#### **KLOSTERMAN RETURNS**

- Bryant head coach Ryan Klosterman has history with UCF. Klosterman spent time as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at UCF from 2012-2019. As a recruiter, his 2018 recruiting class was ranked 16th by Collegiate Baseball and 23rd by Baseball America. He also had 26 Knights drafted under his tutelage.

- Klosterman attended South Lake High School in Groveland, Florida, which is about 40 miles west of UCF. He is in his fifth season as the head coach at Bryant.

#### **#BUILTBYUCF**

- Knights that move on to play in the professional ranks are said to be #BuiltByUCF. In the 2023 season, three Knights, Dylan Moore (UTL, Mariners), Ben Lively (RHP, Reds) and Thaddeus Ward (RHP, Nationals) were active on MLB rosters. UCF had one drafted a season ago in All-American catcher Ben McCabe, as he was taken in the ninth round by the Colorado Rockies. Right-handed pitcher Zack Austin also inked a free agent deal with the Atlanta Braves last summer.

#### 12 NCAA REGIONAL APPEARANCES - 130 MLB DRAFT PICKS

- The 2024 season marks the 51st year for the UCF baseball program. UCF's first year of competition on the baseball diamond came in 1973 as an NCAA Division II institution. After 12 years at the Div. II level, the Knights then moved to the NCAA Division I ranks in 1985 under head coach Jay Bergman.

- In its history, the Knights have won 12 conference titles with six regular season conference championships (SSC in 1979; ASUN in '00, '01, '02, '04; and AAC in '17) and six conference tournament championships (ASUN in 1993, '95, '96, '97, 01, '02).

- UCF has advanced to an NCAA Regional 12 times in the program's history at the NCAA Div. I level (1989, '93, '95, '96, '97, '00, '01, '02, '04, '11, '12, '17). The Knights hold a 16-24 all-time record in NCAA Tournament play and will be looking to advance to the program's first NCAA Super Regional under head coach Rich Wallace in 2024 and first NCAA postseason appearance since 2017.

- All-time the Knights have had a total of 130 players selected in the MLB Draft. Over the years, UCF has had four first round selections with outfielder Chad Mottola marking the highest selection by being picked fifth overall in the 1992 draft, one spot ahead of Hall of Famer Derek Jeter.

- Of the 130 draftees, 14 of them have played in the big leagues in Chad Mottola (OF, drafted in 1992), Mike Maroth (LHP, drafted in 1998), Esix Snead (OF, drafted in 1998), Matt Fox (RHP, drafted in 2004), Clay Timpner (OF, drafted in 2004), Drew Butera (C, drafted in 2005), Chasen Bradford (RHP, drafted in 2011), Beau Taylor (C, drafted in 2011), Danny Winkler (RHP, drafted in 2011), Dannell Sweeney (INF, drafted in 2012), Ben Lively (RHP, drafted in 2013), Eric Skoglund (LHP, drafted in 2014), Dylan Moore (INF/ OF, drafted in 2015), Thad Ward (RHP, drafted in 2018).

- In 1998, UCF had its most draft selections with 10 that season. Mike Marroth (LHP) and Kevin Gordon (RHP) were both selected in the third round, while Matt Lubozynski (LHP) rounded out UCF's selections that year by being selected in the 42nd round.

### QUICK FACTS

#### THE ULTIMATE HOMECOMING

Wallace began his coaching career at UCF as assistant coach in 2004 following his four-year playing career as a Knight (2000-2003).

In June 2023, Wallace became the first-ever UCF graduate to be named head coach of the Knights baseball team. The Orlando native makes his return to UCF for the 2024 season in his first head coaching role.

#### HOMETOWN HERO

Wallace's outlook on recruiting means starting with Orlando and bringing hometown kids home to UCF.

### 39 RICH WALLACE

"THIS IS HOME. To start my career here and to, hopefully, finish my career here has been my goal for 20-plus years in this. Everything I did was to get back here somehow, some way and lead this baseball program. I'm just grateful to have a chance."

Rich Wallace, an Orlando native and former UCF baseball player and Knight assistant coach, brings two decades of experience as a Division I baseball coach with him in his return to Orlando as UCF's seventh head baseball coach. His first season as UCF head coach will be in 2024 as the Knights for the first time compete in the Big 12 Conference.

Wallace spent the 2023 season as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida State. He previously coached at Notre Dame (2020-22), Jacksonville (2018-19), Creighton (2015-17), High Point (2009-14) and UCF (2004-08). Wallace helped teams at UCF in 2004, Jacksonville in 2018 and Notre Dame in 2021 and 2022 to NCAA Championship appearances.

A 2004 UCF graduate, Wallace becomes the first alumnus to be named head coach of an NCAA-sponsored men's sport at UCF since 1988. He played four seasons of baseball for the Knights from 2000-03, helping those teams reach the NCAA Championship in 2000, 2001 and 2002. As a freshman, he led UCF with a .380 batting average and .529 on-base percentage. He played a key role as UCF won the ASUN regular season in 2000-02 and the ASUN conference tournament in 2001 and 2002. Wallace helped the 2001 UCF squad win a school-record 51 games.

His combined NCAA Championship experience includes three times as a UCF player and four times as an assistant coach (two Super Regional appearances and one College World Series berth).

Wallace spent four seasons working with head coach Link Jarrett at Notre Dame (2020-22) and Florida State (2023). In South Bend, he served as recruiting coordinator and third-base coach while also working with Irish hitters and catchers. He oversaw defensive alignments, managed opposing pitcher video scouting reports, helped coordinate baserunning instruction and assisted with game management during his tenure in South Bend. His role in Tallahassee also featured the recruiting coordinator assignment.

Under Wallace's guidance, Notre Dame led the Atlantic Coast Conference and ranked in the top 15 nationally in fielding percentage in both 2021 and 2022. Notre Dame threw out more than 35 percent of attempted base stealers, while Irish runners finished in the top four in the league in stolen bases each season.

In Wallace's three years at Notre Dame the Irish were 86-32 (.729), second-best winning percentage in the country over that span. Notre Dame's 44-21 (.677) three-year ACC record was the best in the league, and the Irish won the conference's regular-season title (their first ACC crown) by 4.5 games in 2021. Notre Dame finished 41-17 in 2022 (most wins for the Irish since 2006) and set a single-season home run record with 79.

Wallace helped guide the Irish to back-to-back NCAA Super Regionals (first time at Notre Dame) and the 2022 College World Series in the third trip to Omaha in program history. In 2021, first baseman Niko Kavadas became a first-team All-American - Notre Dame's first since 2002 - and set the school record with 22 home runs (second in the ACC and third in the nation).

At Notre Dame, Wallace coached two All-Americans, three All-ACC selections and 14 players were named to the All-ACC Academic Team. Throughout his career Wallace's teams have produced 53 Major League Baseball draft selections and coached more than 60 all-conference performers.

He spent the 2018-19 seasons back in his home state as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Jacksonville under head coach Chris Hayes. In 2018 Wallace and the Dolphins finished 40-21 and reached the NCAA Championship as a two seed, highest in program history. That season, the Dolphins led the ASUN in batting average, on-base percentage, runs scored and fielding percentage.

Wallace was the recruiting coordinator at Creighton (2015-17 under head coach Ed Servais) and High Point (2009-14 under head coach Craig Cozart). He was named the Big East Recruiter of the Year by D1Baseball in 2016 at Creighton. At High Point he helped bring in consecutive nationally ranked recruiting classes for the first time in school history.

Wallace began his coaching career at UCF (2004-08 under head coach Jay Bergman), coaching the catchers and outfielders while coordinating the camps. UCF won the ASUN regular-season title in 2004 and reached the NCAA Championship.

He remains in UCF's top 10 in single-season on-base percentage (.529 in 2000) and career hit by pitch (46). Wallace in 2000 was an honorable mention Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American and a third-team All-ASUN selection as a designated hitter. In his four seasons with the Knights, UCF won a combined 166 games (51-14 in 2001, 43-19 in 2000, 41-22 in 2002), including a combined 67-17 mark in ASUN play in 2000-02.

After his playing career as a 6-1, 220-pound infielder with the Knights concluded, Wallace earned his degree in 2004 from UCF's College of Undergraduate Studies with a major in interdisciplinary studies and a minor in criminal justice. He graduated from Bishop Moore High School in Orlando.

## Knights COACHING STAFF

### 0 NORBERTO LOPEZ

### ASSISTANT COACH / RECRUITING COORDINATOR FIRST YEAR

Norberto Lopez joined UCF baseball in June 2023 as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator.

Prior to UCF, Lopez began working with the Miami baseball program prior to the 2016 season, working with the Canes' hitters and catchers, and adding responsibilities as recruiting coordinator after the 2018 campaign. Miami made NCAA Championship

appearances in five of his seasons in Coral Gables, including each of the last three years after an ACC regular-season crown and CWS appearance in 2016. The Canes played host to NCAA regionals in both 2022 and 2023.

The 2019 season marked the first with Lopez as Miami's hitting coach and the Canes responded with an ACC-best 85 home runs. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs that ranked third in the nation.

Among his star pupils is catcher Adrian Del Castillo, selected in the second round of the 2021 MLB Draft by the Arizona Diamondbacks. In 2016, junior catcher Zack Collins became the first Hurricane in program history to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher and was selected No. 10 overall by the Chicago White Sox in the 2016 MLB draft.

From Hialeah, Florida, Lopez played collegiately at Broward College (Davie Florida) and Nova Southeastern (Fort Lauderdale, Florida). Drafted by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim in 1999, he spent three years in the organization. He served on the Texas-Pan American coaching staff from 2009-15 and was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2015 season. Lopez was an assistant coach for Florida Atlantic where he helped the Owls compile a .341 batting average with 93 home runs in 2007 - and a .321 batting average with 99 home runs in 2008.

Lopez spent two years at Broward Community College from 2004-06 when he led the team to a third-place finish at the 2006 NJCAA World Series.

Lopez graduated from Nova Southeastern University with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1999. In 2006, he earned a master's in exceptional student education from Nova Southeastern.

### TED TOM ASSISTANT COACH SEVENTH YEAR

Ted Tom begins his seventh year in the program as an Assistant Coach. Currently, he works with the outfielders and baserunners while assisting with recruiting and hitting.

In 2023, Tom led an offense that set multiple UCF program records, including belting 109 home runs to shatter the American Athletic Conference record from 2019, finishing the season nationally ranked No. 11 in home runs and No. 14 in home runs per game (1.85). For

the second consecutive year, three Knights hit above .319, tying the most in a single season over the last ten years. Tom saw Ben McCabe through his highest offensive production in his five seasons as a Knight, getting tabbed an All-American by Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA. Two hitters were named to the AAC All-Conference First Team in McCabe and Andrew Sundean, and Drew Faurot was a unanimous selection to the all-conference freshman team.

The 2022 season saw the Knights offense led the AAC in hitting during the conference season. Freshman Andrew Sundean was named a Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American and Second Team All-AAC after hitting .348 for the season. Senior Gephry Pena finished his career with a Second Team All-AAC nod after hitting .329 and stealing 24 bases. Sophomore Alex Freeland was drafted in the third round by the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Prior to arriving in Orlando, Tom spent three seasons at fellow American Athletic Conference member Cincinnati. He joined the Bearcats as the director of baseball operations in 2015, covering the day-to-day operations, video, and scouting for one season. In 2016, Tom was promoted to assistant coach and remained in that role for his final two years at Cincinnati.

Tom joined UC after seven seasons as the head coach at his alma mater Shawnee State University, where he compiled a record of 203-193. Tom was named 2010 Conference Coach of the Year and helped develop two Conference Player of the Year selections in catcher Philip Butler (2011) and outfielder Danny Gesick (2010) while pitcher Derek Moore was named an NAIA All-American as a Freshman in 2014. Butler is also the only 2-time NAIA All-American in SSU history.

Tom graduated from Shawnee State with a degree in Sport Management with minors in business and sport coaching in 2004 and having been a redshirt member of the 2000 team that finished fifth in the NAIA World Series.

### 20 DREW THOMAS PITCHING COACH

FIRST YEAR Drew Thomas joined the UCF baseball staff in June 2023 as the pitching coach.

Thomas spent 16 years with Coastal Carolina--including a 2016 College World Series title--then worked as pitching coach for Brewers affiliate Wisconsin Timber Rattlers of the Midwest League in 2023 after a season in the same role with the franchise's Carolina Mudcats team in the Carolina League in 2022.



In addition to the 2016 CWS crown, Thomas' Coastal Carolina coaching resume includes 11 NCAA Championship regional appearances, three super regionals, nine conference regular-season championships and nine conference championship tournament titles.

His pitching staffs finished among the NCAA top 40 in ERA eight times, including three top-10 finishes (10th in 2009, eighth in 2010, third in 2012). Coastal ranked among the NCAA top 15 in fewest hits allowed per nine innings four times (12th in 2009 and 2011, seventh in 2010, eighth in 2012). His teams led the conference in ERA six times (2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2016), strikeouts seven times (2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2016, 2018, 2019) and saves five times (2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2016).

His work helped produce 13 Major League Baseball draft picks, including current Major Leaguer Keith Hessler, fifth-rounder Pete Andrelczyk, fifth-rounder Cody Wheeler, second-rounder Anthony Meo, fourth-rounder Josh Conway, 10th rounder Anthony Veneziano and third-rounder Zach McCambley.

Thomas came to Coastal Carolina from IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida, where he had worked since 2003.

Thomas pitched in the San Diego Padres organization in 1998-99 and played for the Canton Crocodiles of the Frontier League in 1999-2000. He was the 2000 Frontier League Relief Pitcher of the Year, a Frontier League All-Star and a second-team Baseball America All-Independent team member.

Thomas graduated from Illinois State University, where he earned a degree in history.

### MORGAN DEPEW DIRECTOR OF BASEBALL OPERATIONS FIRST YEAR

DePew enters his first year as Director of Baseball Operations at UCF. He comes to Orlando after making stops as an assitant coach at Jacksonville, St. Johns River State, Saint Leo, and Lee University.



The past three seasons, DePew was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator

at St. Johns River State College in Palatka, Florida (2021-2023). During his time in Palatka, he helped the Vikings compile a combined a 103-69 record, which included a 46-19 clip in 2023, and a trip to the 2023 NJCAA DII Baseball World Series.

DePew previously spent two years as a volunteer assistant at Jacksonville University (2019 and 2020) where he helped the Dolphins to a 32-27 record in 2019 and a 9-9 mark during the Covid-shortened 2020 campaign. Prior to his time at Jacksonville, he served as the outfield coach at Saint Leo University for the 2018 season in Saint Leo, Florida, where he also assisted with hitting and base running.

Before his time in Sunshine State, DePew spent the summer of 2017 as an assistant coach with the La Crosse Loggers of the Northwoods League and the 2016 summer as an assistant for the Dubois Country Bombers in 2016.
