NO. 11/13 SOFTBALL SET TO COMPETE IN 2024 MARY NUTTER COLLEGIATE CLASSIC

The No. 11/13 University of Missouri softball program (10-0) treks to Cathedral City, California, for the 2024 Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic Thursday through Saturday at the Big League Dreams Complex.

Mizzou will face San Diego State (7 p.m., CT | 5 p.m., PT) and Wisconsin (9:30 p.m., CT | 7:30 p.m., PT) Thursday before taking on Central Florida (7:30 p.m., CT | 5:30 p.m., PT) and California State Fullerton (10 p.m., CT | 8 p.m., PT) Friday. The Tigers will wrap the Classic Saturday with a top-25 meeting against No. 22 Baylor set for 10 p.m., CT | 8 p.m., PT.

Thursday's games will be played on Yankee Stadium, while Friday's games will be contested on Fenway Park. Saturday's finale will be on Wrigley Field.

All five games at the 2024 Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic will be streamed on FloSoftball.

Mizzou was also ranked in all four polls heading into the weekend after first appearing last week. The Tigers enter the third week of the season #11 in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll, and #13 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll. Mizzou also was #8 and #11 in the Softball America and D1Softball polls, respectively.

The 10-0 start to the 2024 season is the best start for Missouri since the Tigers opened the 2009 campaign 12-0 en route to a 50-12 finish.

Mizzou ranks first in the SEC this season with a .985 fielding percentage.

SERIES HISTORY

• Missouri leads the all-time series with San Diego State, 5-2. Head coach Larissa Anderson is 1-0 in her career against the Aztecs. The Tigers and SDSU last faced in 2022 with Mizzou prevailing, 7-6, in eight innings on Feb. 26.

Missouri holds a 4-2 advantage against Wisconsin. Anderson is 1-2 as a head coach against the Badgers. The two teams last faced off Feb. 12, 2022, with Mizzou edging Wisconsin, 8-1.

The Tigers lead UCF, 2-1, in the all-time series after Mizzou overcame the Knights, 11-8, in Orlando, Florida, Feb. 15, 2023. Anderson is 2-1 against UCF.

Cal State Fullerton leads Mizzou, 6-3, in the all-time series with Anderson having one win (1-0) against the Titans.

The two teams last met March 17, 2019, with Missouri winning, 7-4.

Mizzou leads Baylor in the all-time series, 31-19, while Anderson is 1-0 against the Bears. The Tigers run-ruled Baylor, 9-1, in five innings in the most recent meeting on Feb. 8, 2020.

LAST TIME AT MARY NUTTER

• Missouri went 3-2 at the 2023 edition of the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic Feb. 23-25.

• The Tigers opened the Classic with back-to-back run-rule wins over Cal Poly (9-1) and BYU (11-3).

• Missouri then lost tight contests to Oregon State (3-2) and No. 22/24 Oregon (6-4) before run-ruling Long Beach State (9-0, six innings) to cap the tournament.

2024 TRACY BEARD COLLEGE CLASSIC RECAP

• Missouri continued its perfect opening to the 2024 season, reeling off five wins at the 2024 Tracy Beard College Classic to improve to 10-0.

• Cierra Harrison picked up her first career no-hitter in the opener with Texas A&M-Commerce (1-0).

• Missouri then edged South Dakota State, 4-3, in the first of two meetings over the Classic. Laurin Krings improved to 5-0 in 2024 with the win.

• Lilly Whitten posted her first career win in her first career start as a Tiger, leading Mizzou to a 7-1 win over South Dakota State.

• Missouri also posted double-digit wins over North Texas including an 11-2 run-rule win to conclude the tournament.

• Stefania Abruscato made her first career starts (4) over the tournament, batting .333 with five walks.

• Through two weeks, Alex Honnold is batting .355 (.581 slugging percentage, four multi-hit games) with eight RBI (two multi-RBI games). She notched a pair of doubles in Texas. .

HARRISON IN THE CIRCLE

• Cierra Harrison led Mizzou in the circle at the Tracy Beard College Classic, registering a pair of wins including her first career no-hitter. She pitched 13.1 innings over North Texas' tournament, allowing no runs and two hits with 12 strikeouts.

• Harrison opened the Classic with a 1-0 no-hitter over Texas A&M-Commerce. She posted her first career seven-inning shutout and matched a career-high eight strikeouts for the no-hitter.

• On the heels of her first career no-hitter, Harrison then allowed only

two hits while striking out four over six innings in a 10-0 win over North Texas.

• Harrison then utilized one pitch to retire the lone North Texas batter she faced Sunday in the finale, securing the win for Mizzou.

• Harrison boasts a 4-0 mark with 13 strikeouts in 2024. She is limiting opposing batters to a .061 batting average.

• The Lee's Summit, Missouri, sophomore paces the NCAA with a 0.00 ERA over 21.1 innings and five appearances. She also leads the country with a hits allowed per seven innings rate of 1.31.

GALLY

• Maddie Gallagher notched a career-best 4-for-4 day at the plate in the first game with North Texas on Saturday. She also chipped in a run and an RBI in the game.

• With four hits against UNT, Gallagher notched her 100th career collegiate hit.

• Gallagher finished the Tracy Beard College Classic, hitting .500 and paces the Tigers at the plate (.429) through two weeks.

OUR LEADOFF HITTER

• Jenna Laird chipped in a .455 weekend over the Tracy Beard College Classic, scoring eight times to go with four RBI and three steals.

• The senior from East Meadow, New York, extended her reached base streak to 10 games (four-game hitting streak).

• The Tigers leadoff hitter has scored in all 10 games this season, having totaled 15 runs thus far.

• She ranks 15th Nationally with 1.50 runs per game in 2024.

MADISON WALKER

• Freshman first baseman Madison Walker chipped in a .308 weekend in Denton, Texas, this past week.

• She notched her first career double, while adding two runs and an RBI at the Tracy Beard College Classic

• Walker concluded the tournament, with a career-best 2-for-3 in the finale with North Texas.

FIRST GRAND SALAMI

• Sophomore Katie Chester knocked her first career grand slam Sunday in Mizzou's 11-2 run-rule win over North Texas.

• It marked the first Tigers grand slam since Kara Daly notched one on Feb. 23, 2023, against Cal Poly.

• The home run was Katie Chester's second of the season (fifth in her career). She finished Sunday with a career-best four RBI, going 1-for-3 with a run.

• Chester, a Liberty, Missouri, native, is batting .318 in 2024 with eight RBI and a .636 slugging percentage.

WHITTEN MAKES MIZZOU DEBUTS

• Lilly Whitten recorded her first collegiate win in her first collegiate start and appearance in a 7-1 victory over South Dakota State on Feb. 17.

• After redshirting in 2023, the Tunas, Missouri, native, finished her collegiate debut with a line of 6.0 innings pitched, allowing one run on six hits, and eight strikeouts for the win.

• Jayci Kruse made her first appearance of the 2024 season, and the fourth of her Mizzou career, collecting one strikeout over the final inning to secure the win.

ON THE DALY

• Junior third baseman Kara Daly is three hits away from 100 in her career as a Tiger. She'd be the second Mizzou player to reach the career threshold after Maddie Gallagher reached the milestone in Denton, Texas.

• Daly is currently hitting .300 in 2024 with a .600 slugging percentage, seven RBI, seven runs and two homers.

RUN-RULE WINS

• Mizzou picked up its third run-rule win of the season in the Tracy Beard College Classic finale with an 11-2 decision over host, North Texas.

• Missouri secured the win with a seven-run fourth that featured a grand slam from Katie Chester.

<u>2023 RECAP</u>

• Mizzou enters the 2024 season on the heels of its 16th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance.

• The Tigers finished the 2023 season with a 35-26 mark, including a 7-17 in SEC play. With its 2023 record, Missouri has registered 35 wins in four of the last five seasons (2020 COVID-19 shortened season was the only time the Tigers didn't meet the threshold in that span).

• During the 2023 campaign, Missouri totaled 51 home runs, while logging 75 doubles to go with 310 runs as a team.

• On the dirt, Mizzou tallied a .978 fielding percentage. The clip ranks second in program history, after the Tigers' surpassed their previous .976 fielding percentage from 2022.

LOOKING AHEAD

A new era in Mizzou Softball began in the Summer of 2018, as Larissa Anderson was named the 10th head coach to lead the tradition-rich Tiger program on Saturday, May 26, 2018.

As Anderson enters year six in Mid-Missouri that new era has already gotten off to a successful start, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why. Anderson has led Mizzou to a 169-97 record over her five seasons and owns a career record of 299-170-1 as a head coach.

In her short time at the helm of the Tigers, Anderson has steered Missouri to 169 victories, one NCAA Super Regional and two regional final appearances. In 2021, Mizzou hosted a regional and super regional for the first time since 2013 and again hosted a regional in 2022.

Anderson finished her first season in the Black & Gold with a 35-25 record, the most wins for the Tigers in a single season since 2016, when they won 42 games. Anderson's squad was also stellar in her first season as part of the always elite Southeastern Conference, as the Tigers' 12 wins during SEC play, which resulted in a tie for fourth place, were the most conference victories for Mizzou since 2016. The season ended with the Tigers' 13th straight regional appearance, as Anderson's Tigers earned a spot in the Los Angeles Regional, where they went 3-2, pushing host No. 2 UCLA to a winner-take-all game seven.

Her biggest test would come during the 2020 season. With Mizzou Softball's postseason ban being upheld three months prior to the season, Anderson's steady leadership guided the Tigers through what would be a turbulent year. Despite the postseason ban, Mizzou lost zero players to transfer, and entered the season with its roster intact.

Mizzou's postseason ban would prove to be only a minor blip in a season that was ultimately canceled after 26 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Tigers made the most of those 26 games, finishing with a 19-7 record, and being one of only two teams to be undefeated in SEC play. Mizzou ended the season ranked 25th in the NFCA Coaches' Poll – its first time finishing the season ranked since 2016 – while Cayla Kessinger was named to Softball America's All-America team.

Anderson returned Mizzou Softball to the national stage in 2021. With an experienced roster but a young pitching staff, she led the Tigers to a 42-17 record and a Super Regional appearance. Mizzou hosted an NCAA Regional and Super Regional for the first time since 2013. The 2021 team finished among the program's best statistically in fielding percentage (1st), home runs (1st), RBI (2nd), doubles (T-6th), and runs scored (3rd).

In the postseason, Mizzou pitching led the nation in ERA at 1.37 over six games. Two Tiger pitchers, Jordan Weber and Laurin Krings combined to allow only two hits and no runs over three games at the Columbia Regional. Freshman shortstop Jenna Laird earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors while senior outfielder Brooke Wilmes was recognized as an NFCA Third Team All-American. Anderson led the Tigers to a No. 13 final ranking in the NFCA Coaches' Poll and a No. 14 ranking in the USA Softball poll, the program's highest final rankings since 2015. Mizzou's memorable 2022 season saw them host an NCAA Regional for the second-consecutive year and made the Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship game for the second time in program history. The Tigers notched a 38-22 mark and went 12-11 during SEC play. Mizzou's pitching staff posted a 2.81 ERA including a 1.00 ERA in the postseason.

In the inaugural year of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, presented by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, Jenna Laird and Casidy Chaumont earned the award at shortstop and left field, respectively.

Laird, a 2022 Softball All-SEC Second Team player, finished the year with a .975 fielding percentage, while turning 10 double plays and did not make an error during SEC play.

Chaumont, an All-SEC Defensive Team Selection, has appeared on SportsCenter's Top Ten Plays four times over her career at Mizzou. After beginning her career as an infielder at Louisiana, she converted to the outfield at the start of the 2021 season and finished with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Chaumont has thrown out five runners on the basepaths from left field over her two seasons in the Black and Gold.

Kimberly Wert and Brooke Wilmes were each named First Team All-SEC performers in 2022. Jordan Weber, Jenna Laird, Wert and Wilmes were each tabbed to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Southeast All-Region team. Weber led the Tigers to the SEC Tournament final with a pair of shutouts against No. 17/20 Auburn and No. 13/10 Tennessee. She became the first Mizzou pitcher to record three wins in a single SEC series when she earned the victory in all three games against Kentucky.

Mizzou is coming off a 2023 season that saw the Tigers reach a 16th straight NCAA Regional, finishing the season with a 35-26 record and going 7-17 against SEC foes. The pitching staff proved efficient yet again, registering a cumulative ERA of 3.33, including a strikeout/walk ratio of 2.66.

Alex Honnold became the 26th All-American in program history (31 total All-American honors) after earning Second-Team honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

A Top 25 Finalist for 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, Honnold led Mizzou and ranked top six in the SEC for on-base percentage (.539), slugging percentage (.779), runs (52), batting average (.396), and triples (three). Her slugging percentage in 2023 ranked fourth all-time in program history. Honnold also earned NFCA Southeast All-Region honors and was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

Jenna Laird joined Honnold in representing the Tigers on the All-SEC Team, her sixth postseason honor at Mizzou and third-straight appearance on the All-SEC Team. The leadoff hitter paced the Tigers in SEC play with a .291 batting average to go with 14 runs, three doubles, five RBI, .371 on-base percentage, and a .329 slugging percentage.

Anderson joined Mizzou after a 17-year run at Hofstra, the final four as the head coach.

In four seasons at Hofstra, Anderson fashioned a 130-73-1 (.640) record with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, two Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles and four winning seasons. She picked up her 100th career win with the Pride's 7-2 win over Boston University, March 17, 2018, and posted seven career wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including three in 2018—a 1-0 victory over then-No. 13 Florida State on March 2 and a pair at No. 22 James Madison to claim the CAA Tournament crown.

The 2018 campaign was a historic one for Hofstra Softball, as Anderson led the 24th-ranked Pride to a 41-14 record, the CAA Tournament title and the NCAA Columbia Regional. Hofstra earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by defeating CAA regular-season champion and 22nd-ranked James Madison, 7-4, to claim its 12th CAA title in the sport since joining the league in 2002 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015.

Anderson's 2018 squad reached the 40-win mark for the 11th time in program history (and first since a school-record 46 wins in 2013), while setting school records for runs scored (334), home runs (70) and RBI (315). Hofstra owned an RPI of 19 against the nation's 29th-toughest schedule in 2018. Hofstra also garnered a league-high eight CAA postseason honors headlined by Sarah Cornell's selection as the CAA Pitcher of the Year—the Pride's 10th such honor all-time and first since 2013, all of which were tutored by Anderson.

In 2017, Hofstra returned to the CAA championship game, as the program registered its 28th-straight winning season (27-23) and earned the No. 2 seed in the CAA Tournament. Anderson picked up her first win over a Top 10 opponent as head coach with a 5-2 victory over No. 10 James Madison. Under Anderson's direction, Cornell was named first-team NFCA All-Northeast Region as a rookie, while also earning a spot on the All-CAA second team and All-Rookie team.

The Pride posted another winning record in her second season (24-22) and had six student-athletes earn CAA postseason honors and two garner NFCA All-Northeast Region recognition.

In her first season as the storied program's head coach in 2015, Anderson led Hofstra to the CAA championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, guiding Hofstra to a 38-14-1 record and a spot in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Anderson and her assistants were named the NFCA Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year after Hofstra posted a collective 2.05 ERA, smashed 56 home runs and out-scored opponents, 277-129.

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head coach. In 17 seasons at Hofstra, she helped the Pride to a 610-267-2 (.695) record). Before taking over as head coach from Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, Anderson spent 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach, helping the program to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 CAA titles. As associate head coach, she helped Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Under Anderson's guidance, Hofstra hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09. Galati was twice named an All-America by the NFCA and was the program's first-ever firstteam pick in 2012 after leading Division I with a 0.95 ERA and a 34-7 record. Anderson helped guide Galati to a NCAA-best 40 wins and 22 shutouts in 2013. A hallmark of the Hofstra Softball program during Anderson's tenure was the Pride's stellar defense. From 2008-13, Hofstra consistently ranked among the nation's elite in fielding percentage as the Pride was among the Top 20 nationally in five of those seasons. Hofstra ranked first in Division I in fielding percentage during the 2011 season and was fourth in 2008 and 2010, and 16th in 2012 and 2013. Her 2018 team currently ranks sixth nationally with an .979 mark.

An active NFCA member, she chaired its Ethics Committee from 2009-13, and currently serves as its Fourth Vice President on the NFCA executive board and as a member of the NFCA Recruiting Committee and the NFCA Hall of Fame Committee. Anderson is currently the Vice President of the Awards Committee. She was elected NFCA President on Oct. 25, 2022, and was one of eight members who were voted to the NFCA's Board of Directors for 2023. Anderson will officially begin her three-year term on January 1, 2023.

Prior to joining the Hofstra staff, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school-record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and was in charge of coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th-best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a C.W. Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson spent one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

She is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages the St. Louis Cardinals' Class A affiliate in Peoria, Illinois.
