LEADING OFF

- The 2024 season will be the 51st season for the Carolina Softball team.
- Carolina received votes in every poll this week. They are ranked No. 22 by NFCA/USA Today and ESPN/USA Softball, No. 23 by D1softball and No. 24 by Softball America.
- Carolina's game Wednesday night against the College of Charleston was called in the top of the sixth inning due to weather, as the Gamecocks won 4-0.
- The Gamecocks will face UCF for the eighth time in the last four seasons. The two teams played a three-game series in 2021, twice at UCF for a tournament in 2022, and twice in the NCAA tournament last season.
- Freshman Reganne Bennett is coming off a tremendous week at the plate and in the circle.
 - She threw her first complete game shutout on Friday night in a win over UMass.
 - She became the first player to earned a complete game shutout and hit a home run in the same game since Cayla Drotar against Bethune-Cookman in the NCAA Tournament on May 18, 2019.
 - At the dish, she hit .313 with a pair of home runs and seven RBIs, while leading the team with a .688 slugging percentage.
- The Gamecocks traveled to Puerto Vallarta for the second time in their history.
 - They opened the tournament defeating then-No 13 Utah 9-1 in a six inning run-rule victory.
 - They also defeated UC Davis 6-4 in extra innings and clobbered UC San Diego 18-1 in five innings.

South Carolina has seen its star rise again in the collegiate softball world, and head coach Beverly Smith has guided that process since arriving as head coach in July of 2010. She oversees all aspects of the program and works most closely on the field with the pitchers. As a head coach, Smith became only the second Gamecock softball coach with over 400 career wins.

Carolina made a postseason run for the ages in 2023, as the Gamecocks became the first double-digit seed to reach the SEC Tournament final. They defeated three teams, two in extra innings, before falling to top-seeded Tennessee. The Gamecocks continued their postseason run, advancing to the Tallahassee Final, forcing an if-necessary game against the No. 3 Seminoles. Carolina finished the season with 40 wins for the second time under Smith. She earned her 400th career win against UNC on March 1, becoming the 29th active head coach in Division I to amass 400 career victories while only coaching at one school.

The Gamecocks finished the 2022 season 26-30, defeating four nationally ranked opponents. Smith guided Carolina to a four-spot improving in its final RPI ranking.

In 2021, the Gamecocks finished the season 26-26, defeating Auburn in the first round of the SEC Tournament.

From 2013-19, Smith guided the Gamecocks to a program record seven-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. Carolina was well on its way to its eighth-consecutive postseason trip in 2020 before the season was ended early due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The Gamecocks have competed in the regional championship four-consecutive completed seasons (also a program record), while the 2018 team reached the program's second-ever Super Regional.

Carolina closed the 2020 season with a 17-6 record after the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. In the shortened season, the Gamecocks recorded wins over Ohio State, Kansas, No. 8 Michigan, Iowa State and No. 13 Georgia, among others.

South Carolina finished the 2019 season with a respectable 38-19 record and reached its fourth-straight regional final under Smith. South Carolina notably had a 15-game winning streak for the second-consecutive season, marking the first time since the 1996 and 1997 seasons the program won 10-straight games (or more) in back-to-back years. Smith earned her 300th career win as head coach at South Carolina in a 5-4 victory over Duke on March 20, 2019. The Gamecocks earned back-to-back series wins over Alabama and Auburn, becoming just the third team in the conference since 2005 to do so (11 chances). It was the first time since 2009 Carolina took the series over Alabama. Another notable streak continued in 2019 as the Gamecocks have had more than 30,000 fans come to Carolina Stadium for the past six-consecutive years. Carolina tied the program record for largest single-game crowd against Alabama with 2,250 which was previously set in 1997.

In 2018, for the second-straight season, Mackenzie Boesel led the Gamecocks in nine different offensive categories (at bats, on-base percentage, hits, batting average, runs, total bases, RBI and slugging percentage) while she paced the Gamecocks in two categories (doubles and walks) for the first time in her career. In the circle Cayla Drotar led the Gamecocks with 21 wins, becoming the first 20-game winner since 2015 and just the second in the past 16 years at Carolina. In league honors the Gamecocks had two players (Maguire and Tiara Duffy) named SEC Player of the Week while Johns became the first freshman in program history to be named SEC Freshman of the Week twice.

Prior to coming to South Carolina, Smith served as the top assistant at North Carolina, working mostly with the pitchers and catchers. The final three years, she was the associate head coach after nine as an assistant. Smith helped the Tar Heels to two Atlantic Coast Conference titles in 2001 and 2008 and eight of their nine NCAA Tournament appearances. She served as the lead recruiter for the Tar Heels during that time, helping to bring in five All-Americans into the UNC program. She also helped North Carolina achieve a top-25 ranking in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll at least once per season from 2006-10.

THIS IS CAROLINA - TRADITION LIVES HERE

- South Carolina has made 23 trips to the NCAA postseason, a number that started in 1982. The Gamecocks have reached two super regionals and three WCWS. In conference play, Carolina owns two SEC Championships.
- Carolina rolls into the 2023 season with a 48-50 record all-time in postseason games and a 17-17 mark under Beverly Smith.
- Fans and opponents have become accustomed to seeing the Gamecocks play on Sundays in the postseason. Carolina reached the regional final four-straight years (2016-19) and again in 2023. The Gamecocks are 3-4 in those past seven Sunday games.
- Since 1982, the Gamecocks are just 3-12 against host schools and 1-8 under Smith. On the flip side, South Carolina is 4-2 at home in the postseason under Smith having advanced to just the program's second super regional in 2018 with two win-or-go-home games against Liberty.

THE GAMECOCKS

- Carolina comes into the 2024 season looking to fight back after advancing to the Tallahassee Regional Final, before falling to eventual national runner-up Florida State in a winner-take-all game.
- Carolina advanced to both the SEC Tournament and NCAA Regional Finals.
- The 2024 squad will look to build on that momentum, as they'll just nine underclassmen (four sophomores and six freshmen).
- The Gamecocks welcome five new freshmen to the program (Reganne Bennett, Sophia Grillo, Sage Mardjetko, Karley Shelton).
- Carolina will have seven left-handed batters available in the lineup. It also had seven in 2023 and 2022, nine in 2021, five in 2020, seven in 2019, eight in 2017 and six in 2016. Of the seven left-handed batters, only two (Carlie Henderson and Kyee Ricks) are listed as slap hitters.
- Seven Georgia natives help make up the Gamecock roster. It's the most from any single state.

COMING THROUGH THE PORTAL

- The Gamecocks hit the transfer portal in the offseason, bringing in five players that played the 2023 season at the Division I level.
- Denver Bryant (Sr./Auburn), joins Carolina for her final season after being named to the All-SEC Second Team in 2023. She led Auburn with a .322 batting average against SEC opponents. Appeared in 56 games, starting a career-high 42 games all at third base. Hit a career-high .319 batting average with four doubles, and five home runs.
- Kiki Estrada (So./Arkansas) played her first collegiate season at Arkansas, appearing in six games. Was ranked 13th in Extra Inning Softball's 2022 Extra Elite 100 after garnering second team High School All-American honors. She is a member of the Mexican National team, most recently finishing fourth at the 2023 Pan American Games.
- Kianna Jones (Gr./North Carolina) played two seasons and UNC and two seasons prior to that with Minnesota. Last year with the Tar Heels she played in 45 games and made 23 starts and three home runs. She is a member of the Canadian National Team, most recently winning a bronze medal at the 2023 Pan American Games.
- Alana Vawter (Gr./Stanford), is pursuing her master's after four star-studded seasons with the Cardinal. Her long list of accomplishments was capped off by being named an NFCA All-America second team selection in 2023. She was a USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top-25 finalist, leading the Cardinal to the Women's College World Series. She was a three-time All-Pac-12 First Team selection and a three-time NFCA All-West Region pick.
- Bre Warren (R-Jr./Texas A&M) played three seasons for the Aggies, missing the 2022 season due to injury. As a freshman she was named to the All-SEC First Team and SEC All-Freshman Team. Last season she played in 42 games, getting 66 at-bats and collecting six doubles.



VAWTER ON THE NATIONAL STAGE

- Alana Vawter joined the Gamecocks after an outstanding four-year career at Stanford. Her awards list is long, but she also ranks among the nation's active career leaders in a myriad of pitching categories:
- She ranks first in not only Division I but among all NCAA players in:
 - Game started: 109
 - Innings pitched: 713 1/3
- Ranks second in DI and fourth overall in wins (81)
- Ranks second in DI and fourth overall in shutouts (27)
- Ranks third in DI and fourth overall in complete games (73)
- Ranks fourth in DI and NCAA in appearances with 137
- Ranks 11th in DI and 40th overall in ERA with a 1.76
- Ranks 15th in DI and 28th overall in strikeouts at 555
- Ranks 44th in DI in strikeouts per 7 innings at 5.45

THAT'S...INTERESTING!

- South Carolina will have at least one student-athlete from the state of California for the 28th-consecutive year dating back to 1994. The Gamecocks signed incoming freshmen and California natives Shae Anderson and Mya Flindt in November, ensuring the tradition continues on into its 30th year.
- Carlie Henderson won't be the first in her family to achieve at a high level in sports. Her grandpa, Billy Shaw, played football at Georgia Tech and went on to play offensive line for nine years with the Buffalo Bills before being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Her father, Chip, played baseball at Shorter University and has been the baseball head coach at Calhoun High School for 26 years. He's won more than 600 games with three state titles (and had eight players drafted into MLB).
- Denver Bryant is a late-bloomer when it comes to playing softball. She made the switch to softball after playing baseball for the majority of her prep career. She was one of the youngest members on the United States Women's National Baseball Team, joining the development program in the summer of 2017.
- Karley Shelton is the fifth member of her immediate family to play softball or baseball in college. She joins her father and mother who both played at Charlotte, her older brother Colby is currently at Florida, and older sister Kiley is playing at Colgate.
- Brooke Blankenship, Giulia Desiderio, and Karley Shelton have actually played for assistant coach Kevin Maguire before. Their travel ball team was coached by Maguire and was based out of Tampa, Fla.

OUCH...THAT HURT!

- Jen Cummings ranks 3rd in DI with 43 career high by pitches.
- She also ranks 5th among all divisions.

IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

- For the fourth straight season, South Carolina is set for over 30 home games.
- Carolina will host 33 home contests, including the Gamecock Invitational, Garnet & Black Invitational, and Carolina Classic.
- They will play just two true non-conference road games and seven neutral site games. The schedule also includes 12 road SEC games.

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- South Carolina is 254-118 (.683) at home during the Beverly Smith era, which includes a 4-1 record at home while hosting a regional at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field.
- Carolina has finished .500 or better at home 10 of Beverly Smith's 13 years.
- Prior to 2021, South Carolina had not lost double digit games at home in seven years and has won 20 or more seven of the past eight seasons (2020 included).

WARREN IS READY TO HAVE FUN AGAIN

Bre Warren wants to prove something to herself. The redshirt junior outfielder is in her first year at South Carolina after transferring from Texas A&M, where her father made a name for himself as an All-Conference defensive lineman and later starred in the NFL for a decade. Her career got off to a great start, earning All-SEC honors as a freshman, but injuries caused her to miss her second year on the diamond, and she still wasn't one hundred percent last year. Sometimes a change is good.

"I was a little nervous at first (about transferring) because I had never been so far from home for so long," said Warren. "Coach Bev (Smith) and the staff here just made it feel like family. It was a very genuine feeling. I saw it when they played last year. They were just having fun. It was fun to watch them play, and I wanted to get to the point where I was having fun playing again.

"It's just about proving it to myself. I can still have fun and be successful. It doesn't have to feel like a job all the time. You can still enjoy it, have success, and celebrate your teammates' success. You can enjoy it again like when you were twelve when you first started playing. That's the biggest thing I want to prove to myself."

Warren burst onto the scene as a freshman, hitting .308 with 28 runs batted in to earn First Team All-SEC and All-Freshman team honors. After missing all of 2022, she started less than half the games in 2023 and batted .182.

"Coming back last year, it was a tough process mentally, and physically," said Warren, who had shoulder surgery to repair her rotator cuff and labrum. "I didn't feel like I was back to where I had been before. It was a tough process, but I learned a lot about being a good teammate when I couldn't physically do it. There were some good lessons that came out of it."

Warren was no stranger to working hard from a physical standpoint, but she also discovered the importance of mental strength.

"I've always been a pretty hard worker, but last year I was working hard with more of a purpose," said Warren, who is studying sports management. "I overlooked the mental side of playing a lot because it came easy for me before I had surgery. Finding out what my cues are mentally and trusting myself again was how I got through it.

Warren grew up playing a lot of sports, including lacrosse basketball, volleyball, softball, and track. Despite her father's celebrity status as a Texas A&M Athletics Hall of Famer, she wasn't pressured by her dad.

COMPETITION IS A FAMILY TRADITION FOR KARLEY SHELTON

South Carolina freshman infielder Karley Shelton is starting her collegiate career a year early after finishing high school in three years, but it shouldn't be a surprise that the 17-year-old excels on the diamond. Shelton's mother, father, sister, and brother all played or are playing collegiate baseball or softball.

"Ever since I was little, we were always going outside, and we all played many sports," said Shelton, who is studying sport and entertainment management. "We swam, played basketball, tennis, softball, and baseball. We're a very competitive family. Anything is a competition. We can be sitting around the house, and something comes up and then we'll all say, 'I'll do it first!'"

"We're always competitive no matter what's going on. There was never any pressure though. We all just know we love the sport."

Her father, Eric, and mother, Bonnie, were baseball and softball pitchers, respectively, at Charlotte, while her brother, Colby, is a sophomore on the baseball team a Florida after playing his freshman year at Alabama, and her sister, Kiley, is a freshman softball student-athlete at Colgate. The competition within the family isn't just between the kids.

"My dad is very competitive," said Shelton. "He'll throw us batting practice, and we'll play a game where it's like a war to see who wins. If I hit a barrel, I win. If he gets me out, he wins. It's the best out of five."

Shelton graduated from nearby Lexington High School in just three years and chose to start her collegiate career a year early.

"I had been training with my brother, who is three years older, since my freshman year (of high school), so I thought I was ready," said Shelton, who is sometimes simply called 'Karl' by her teammates. "Plus, I'm only thirty minutes from home. We thought I was ready because of all the training that I've done. When I was younger and playing travel ball, I always played up because of my sister. When I was 14, I started my first year of playing 18U."

"Even though I'm only 17, the team here welcomed me with open arms. They're the best teammates, ever! They treat me the same way. It was intimidating the first day, but after that I realized that we're all here doing the same thing every day. I'm one of them."

Although she relies on her training, like many ball players, Shelton has a few superstitions.

"Before I hit, I have to spit on my batting gloves and rub them together," said Shelton with a laugh and noted that she has to dress in a certain order as well before each game. "I also have to put my hair in a high ponytail, no matter what!"

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS IS NOTHING NEW FOR SC

- South Carolina is 258-67 (.794) over the past nine years in games outside the SEC. Notable wins include Utah, Texas, Penn State, Houston, Arizona State, North Carolina, Florida State, California, Virginia Tech, USF, Long Beach State, Hofstra, Liberty, and UCF.
- Carolina had won 26-straight non-conference games (regular season) before a loss to Texas Tech in the second weekend of the 2020 season.

CAROLINA HOSTS TOURNAMENTS... AND WINS A LOT

- Carolina is an amazing 43-6 over the past seven seasons in the Gamecock Invitational. The 2021 tournament was canceled due to weather.
- The Gamecock pitching staff has shined in the tournaments. In the games during that span, Carolina pitching staffs have allowed three or more runs 12 times. On the flip side, nine games have ended as shutouts.
- Including the Carolina Classic and Black & Garnet Challenge, the Gamecocks are 77-7 in their past 84 home tournament games.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 163-380-1 (.301) against opponents ranked in the NFCA top 25 since 1995.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 79-130 (.378) at home, 39-176 (.181) on the road and 46-73-1 (.388) in neutral-site outings.
- In 2023, the Gamecocks went 12-16 against ranked opponents. Earning victories over #3 Florida State, #4 Tennessee, #13 Georgia, #11 Florida (twice), #14 LSU, #16 Alabama, #16 Auburn (twice), and #23 Texas A&M (three).

SOUTH CAROLINA HISTORICAL RECORD

- South Carolina has played 2,586 games in its softball history, going 1,666-913-7 (.646) in its 51 years of history.
- The Gamecocks have posted 30 or more wins in eight of the past 10 full seasons under the direction of head coach Beverly Smith.
- Carolina has protected home well, also, with 17 or more victories coming in friendly confines each of the past eight full years.

NEW COACH IN THE DUGOUT

- Smith added a new face to the coaching staff for the season, Jake Epstein, who serves as the hitting coach for the Gamecocks.
- Regarded as one of the top hitting instructors in the country, for the past 20-plus years Epstein has served as a full-time hitting instructor with professional and amateur players, while also spending the previous six seasons working as a hitting consultant for the Milwaukee Brewers.
- As the founder of the Epstein Online Hitting Academy, he has consulted with multiple MLB teams, including the Padres, Giants, and Brewers, as well as several Power 5 baseball and softball programs.
- His college softball athletes have included former SEC players Casidy Chaudmont of Missouri, who is currently playing for the USSSA Pride of the Women's Professional Fastpitch league, along with two-time All-American and 2021 SEC Player of the Year Bailey Hemphill of Alabama.
- He served as hitting coach for Missouri baseball in 2019, helping the Tigers to a 34-22-1 record. Two of his hitters were drafted during the MLB draft, with Kameron Misner in the first round and Chris Cornelius in the 16th.
- Epstein enjoyed a standout playing career at Missouri and Cal State Fullerton. Following his final college season, Epstein signed with the Anaheim Angels organization and hit .336 with 14 doubles, five home runs and 33 RBI in his lone season. He was originally drafted in the 34th round of the 1996 Draft by the San Diego Padres out of high school.



STANDIN' IN THE HALL OF FAME

- Former All-American and SEC Player of the Year Kim Pietro was inducted into the South Carolina athletics Hall of Fame in the fall of 2023.
- Pietro was a four-year letterwinner, a three-time NFCA All-Region First Team selection, and a three-time All-SEC First Team honoree.
- In 1999 she was named the SEC Softball Player of the Year and earned first-team NFCA All-America and CoSIDA Academic All-America honors.
- She led the Gamecocks to three NCAA Regional appearances in four years, including a berth in the 1997 Women's College World Series.
- Pietro still ranks in the school's all-time top-10 list in numerous categories, including batting average (.346), hits (227), runs (135), doubles (55), triples (12) and total bases (348).
- In addition, she was a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection and a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll member.
- She becomes the eighth person from the softball program to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, which includes her former coach Joyce Compton (Class of 2022). She is joined by: Trinity Johnson, Darlene Lowery, Megan Matthews, Tricia Popowski, Karen Sanchelli, and Tiffany Tootle.

THE BEVERLY SMITH ERA: WHAT A TIME IT HAS BEEN

- South Carolina is running strong under the leadership of head coach Beverly Smith after the Gamecocks made the postseason just once the previous six seasons before she arrived.
- The Gamecocks have improved upon their final RPI ranking under Smith eight of the past 10 years.
- South Carolina made seven-straight postseason trips under Smith. The program has missed the postseason just four time under Smith (her first two years and 2021, 2022 seasons).
- The Gamecocks returned to the postseason in 2023, making the SEC Tournament Championship and the NCAA Regional Final.

- Under the direction of head coach Beverly Smith, Carolina owns an 86-12 mark against other Palmetto State schools.
- That mark includes a 31-game winning streak that stretched over five seasons before Coastal snapped the streak in 2017.
- South Carolina went 7-2 last season against in-state foes.

WHAT WILL THEY WEAR TODAY?

- South Carolina has worn more than 30 different uniform combinations during the past several years based solely on jersey, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Talking just jersey, pants and socks/stirrups the Gamecocks have **245** different combinations they could use this season!
- When you add in visors and belts, Carolina has **2,205** different looks at its disposal. With those two accessories thrown into the equation, South Carolina could go more than **40** seasons without wearing the exact same look!!
- Uniform combinations are selected by the senior class.
- South Carolina will have three student-athletes wearing the SEC graduate patch this season: Kianna Jones, Alana Vawter, and Bailey Betenbaugh.

SOME OF THE GREATS THAT HAVE COME THROUGH

- **Trinity Johnson:** 2004 Carolina Hall of Fame inductee, three-time All-American, 1996-97 Honda Award for Softball Player of the Year (the first Honda award winner for any sport at Carolina). She recently became the first Gamecock in program history to have her jersey retired. (Jersey was retired on the Saturday of the Alabama series in 2019).
- **Tiffany Tootle:** Three-time All-American, Led the nation in hits and runs in 1992 and 1993, one of four three-time All-Americans in school history. Was inducted into the UofSC Hall of Fame in 2006 and was the second to receive the honor.
- **Dr. Megan Matthews Buning:** 1999 NFCA All-American, led the nation in saves in 2000, two All-SEC nods and the 2000 SEC Tournament MVP award.
- **Darleen Lowery:** was a 2014 UofSC Hall of Fame inductee after a career in which she was named a two-time All-American. Notably led the nation with 9.49 strikeouts per seven innings in 1987.

WOMEN AT SOUTH CAROLINA: THEY RUN THINGS, Y'ALL

- South Carolina athletics has had plenty of high points to talk about with women's sports since athletics director Ray Tanner took over in 2012. Since that time, women's teams have posted over 160 All-Americans, over 230 All-Conference selections, more than 30 different national honors, 10 national championships, 14 Conference Championships, eight conference tournament championships, finished the season ranked 52 different times and reached the postseason 65 times (11 teams).
- The past six years have been equally impressive with 103 All-Americans, 167 All-Conference selections, 21 national awards, six national championships, 13 conference championships, six conference tournament championships, finished ranked 42 times and reached the postseason 49 times.

THE BRAND

- Since 1892, the colors garnet and black have been associated with the University of South Carolina's athletics teams. Carolina has a pair of primary logos you'll see in use with the softball program (the Block C and SC Logo).
- South Carolina softball represents the brand with garnet, black and white options for jerseys, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Carolina or Gamecocks can be found across the front of each jersey with the SEC patch on the right and Under Armour logo on the left.
- Starting with the 2007 football season, Carolina partnered with Under Armour, Inc., as the official outfitter of the University's athletics department. South Carolina was previously with Russell Athletics.
- South Carolina and Auburn are the only SEC schools wearing Under Armour apparel.

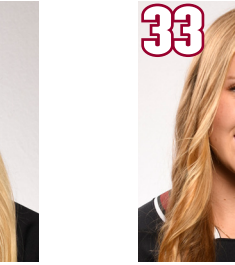
