SERIES HISTORY OVERALL 28-20 HOME 19-12 AWAY 8-7 NEUTRAL 1-1

NOTABLE Florida has won 21 of its last 24 regular-season, non-conference contests.

MIDWEEK PREVIEW: No. 4 Florida hosts Central Florida this week to begin a nine-game home stand at Condon Family Ballpark. The Gators have not played UCF since Feb. 27, 2019 (L, 12-9), but hold a significant advantage in the series at 28-20. Florida is 11-7 against the Knights including 8-3 at home under **HC Kevin O'Sullivan**. Despite having lost two-straight vs. UCF at home, the Gators have won six of the last eight contests in Gainesville and eight of 13 overall.

LAST TIME OUT: The Gators are coming off yet another successful trip to Coral Gables (W 7-3, L 10-6, W 8-4), having secured their ninth series win in the last 10 against the Canes. Under O'Sullivan, Florida is 42-18 vs. the Canes featuring an 18-9 road mark. Florida was led offensively by **1B Jac Caglianone** (7-for-14, 2 HR), **OF Ty Evans** (4-for-12, HR, 3 R), **OF Tyler Shelnut** (3-for-10, 1 HR, 2 2B, 4 R, 3 RBI) and **SS Colby Shelton** (3-for-13, 2 HR, 5 RBI).

NON-CON DOMINANCE: After the series win over Miami, Florida has now won 21 of its last 24 regular season non-conference games. Dating back to 2023, the Gators are 30-6 in regular-season, non-con action.

MIDWEEK MAGIC: Dating back to last season, Florida has won 12 of its last 13 midweek games.

IN THE RANKINGS: Florida remained at No. 4 in the D1Baseball Top 25 this week. The Gators are a consensus top-six team nationally, coming in at No. 6 per Baseball America and Perfect Game.

NATIONAL DEFENSE: The Gators lead the SEC and rank second nationally with a .992 fielding percentage behind Creighton (.992), having committed just three errors across 285 chances this season. Only two miscues have been made by UF position players all year. From the second inning of the season opener until the eighth inning on Feb. 28 vs. B-CU, Florida went 67 1/3 innings without committing an error.

BLUE SHELS: Ranking second and third on the team in hitting, respectively, **OF/INF Tyler Shelnut** and **INF Colby Shelton** are off to hot starts. Shelton's five homers and 15 runs pace the team, as the first-year Gator is slashing .325/.473/.750 while starting all 11 games at shortstop. Shelnut's four home runs are tied for second on the roster while his 15 RBI lead the squad. He holds a .333/.447/.744 batting line on four doubles, 11 runs and two steals.

MOUND MILESTONES: Florida has struck out double-digit batters in 10 of 11 games and ranks fourth nationally in strikeouts per nine (12.8).

THE CAGLIANONE FILE: 2023 Golden Spikes Award Finalist and ABCA National Position Player of the Year **Jac Caglianone** is fresh off SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week and Perfect Game Co-National Player of the Week honors. He threw six shutout innings to earn the decisive game-three victory vs. Miami, striking out a career-high 11 batters while allowing just three hits and two walks. At the plate, he went 3-for-5 with a solo home run, after also blasting a homer in game one of the series. He hit .417/.440/.792 last week to move his season line to .478/.564/.761, leading UF in every triple slash category as well as hits (22) and OPS (1.325).

CAGS AND EVANS STREAKING: Caglianone carries a season-opening, 11-game hitting streak into Tuesday's contest, featuring multiple knocks in seven games. Although he missed the opener due to injury, **OF Ty Evans** has hit safely in all 10 games he has played. **SS Colby Shelton** has also reached base in 11-consecutive games to begin the year while **INF Dale Thomas** has reached safely in 10 in a row.

THIS PHILLY AIN'T CHICKEN: True freshman **RHP Alex Philpott** has opened his career with 9 2/3 scoreless innings and a .152 batting average against. He has made four appearances, leading the team with two wins and wielding an 11.2 K/9.

MCNEILLIE'S MIDWEEK: Milton, Ga. native **RHP Luke McNeillie** will make his second-career start on Tuesday vs. FAU. Despite struggling in his first start at Stetson, McNeillie picked up the win with 2 2/3 scoreless relief innings on three hits and one strikeout in his career debut on Feb. 24 vs. Columbia. As a senior at Milton HS, McNeillie was named All-Region 6-7A First Team and the Milton High School Pitcher of the Year.

TRUE FRESHMAN FIREPOWER: Florida true freshman hurlers are off to an unprecedented start this season. The quartet of **RHP Alex Philpott**, **LHP Robert Satin**, **RHP Grayson Smith** and **RHP Reilly Witmer** has combined to go 4-0 with 21 1/3 scoreless innings. They wield twice as many strikeouts (24) as walks (12) and have allowed just 10 hits.

SLATER-AID: Star reliever **RHP Ryan Slater** paces qualified UF pitchers with a 2.40 ERA, .140 batting average against, six appearances and 15 innings pitched. The right-hander has struck out 17 batters against five walks and has not allowed a home run yet this season.

TYME BOMBS: Sitting fourth on the team in batting (.324) and slugging (.649), **OF Ty Evans** has picked up where he left off last season after setting the College World Series record with five home runs. Evans already has three home runs, one triple, one double, 11 RBI and nine runs this season across his first 37 at bats.

YEAR TO REMEMBER: The 2023 Gators finished the season as the NCAA Runner-Up while winning a program-record 54 games and capturing the team's 16th SEC Regular-Season Championship. In making the program's 13th MCWS appearance including the eighth under Head Coach Kevin O'Sullivan, the Gators claimed their 15th NCAA Regional Title and posted 50 victories for the seventh time ever. In the process, the Gators set single-season program records in home runs (145), pitching strikeouts (725), strikeouts per nine innings (10.6) and offensive hit-by-pitches (90).

SULLY SUPERLATIVES: Since O'Sullivan's 2008 arrival, no college program has more CWS trips (8), Super Regionals hosted (nine), top-eight national seeds (10) and NCAA Tournament bids (15) than the Florida Gators. Overall, Florida's 15-straight NCAA bids represent the second-longest active streak in the sport. The Gators have also hosted 12 NCAA Regionals out of a possible 15 during O'Sullivan's tenure (no NCAA Tournament in 2020), which ranks first in the nation. Looking at the SEC specifically, Florida's .617 winning percentage (277-172) since 2008 is the top mark in the conference.

PRESEASON HYPE: Various publications have tabbed **1B/LHP Jac Caglianone** (first team), **INF Colby Shelton** (second team) and **RHP Brandon Neely** (second team) as Preseason All-Americans. The Gators also secured a league-high four First Team Preseason All-SEC selections, twice more than the next-closest school (Caglianone, Kurland, Shelton, Neely). Collectively, UF is a consensus top-five team via DIB (2), BA (4) and PG (4) and the SEC Coaches' preseason pick to win the SEC East.

2023 STANDOUTS: Seven Gators collected All-American honors in 2023 including two Unanimous First Team selections in OF Wyatt Langford and **1B/LHP Jac Caglianone**. That is on top of UF's league-high seven All-SEC selections. Of those seven All-Americans, four are back in Orange & Blue including Caglianone, **RHP Brandon Neely** (Second Team), **INF Cade Kurland** (Freshman Team) and **LHP Cade Fisher** (Freshman Team). Florida also saw O'Sullivan honored as the ABCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year and Caglianone as the ABCA National Position Player of the Year.

SECOND TO CAGLIA-NONE: Two-way star **Jac Caglianone** set single-season program records with 33 home runs and 90 RBI while slashing .323/.389/.738 last season. As the lone Gator to start all 71 games, Caglianone's 33 homers led the nation and established a new BBCOR era record in college baseball. On the mound, the 2023 ABCA Player of the Year went 7-4 with a 4.34 ERA, 190 BAA and 87 strikeouts across 18 weekend starts. He enters 2024 as the SEC Preseason Player of the Year and a Golden Spikes Award frontrunner.

BIG WHIFFS MISCONSTRUED: Of Florida's 12 position players that competed in Division I baseball last season, **1B Jac Caglianone** has the second-lowest strikeout rate on the team behind Jaylen Guy (12.6%) at 18.2% - less than once per game. In fact, Caglianone and Guy are the only players on UF's roster with a strikeout rate below 20% in 2023.

MEDIA SERVICES

The 2024 Florida Baseball Media Supplement and Game Notes were compiled and written for the benefit of all readers interested in learning detailed information regarding the University, coaches, staff and student-athletes of the Gators Baseball program. CREDENTIALS AND PRESS GATE

All media attending Florida baseball home games must present a media pass for admission to Condon Family Ballpark. Credentials for home games are issued for working media only and should be requested as early as possible, at least 48 hours in advance, to Sullivan Bortner. The Media Entrance is located next to Gate 4 of the ballpark, which is along the first base side of the stadium's exterior. Credentials not mailed or picked up will be left at this entrance and may be picked up by showing proper identification. Florida reserves the right to refuse any credential request deemed not to be in the best interest of the University.

INTERVIEW POLICY

Player interviews are arranged through the Communications Department. We will do our best to coordinate an interview time that is convenient to both the student-athlete and the media member. The best time to interview an athlete or head coach Kevin O'Sullivan is during the afternoon before practice. Following each game, O'Sullivan will do a brief interview with the Gators IMG Sports Network (official radio partner) and then meet with the media. Following games, players will be available upon request. All interview requests should be provided to Sullivan Bortner in the press box prior to the conclusion of the game. The UF clubhouse and dugout are closed to the media.

Due to new NCAA policy, no player media interviews may be granted on official days off. During the season, the team is typically off on Mondays.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

All photographers are required to shoot from designated areas. There are to be no cameras allowed behind the center field fence other than the originating TV network. Photographers are also not permitted in or between the dugouts. Please stay within these parameters.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Updated cumulative statistics, game notes and scorecards will be available in the press box at each home game. A final NCAA box score will be furnished to the media at the completion of each game. An official scorer is assigned to all home games, and Sullivan Bortner will keep the media informed of all scoring decisions, notable facts and records. Condon Family Ballpark's press box will be available for writers to work from after each game.

O'Sullivan passed Dave Fuller for the most wins in program history on March 9, 2021 with a 5-1 win vs. Georgia State. Fuller finished his illustrious Gators head coaching career with 556 wins from 1948-75. O'Sullivan picked up his 435th career win against Kentucky (5/19/17) to pass Joe Arnold for the second-most wins in UF history. He also became the quickest UF baseball coach to reach the 400-win mark against Miami (2/24/17), taking just 590 games to accomplish the feat. The national championship coach broke the record in a 5-1 victory against Georgia State on March 9.

On February 8, 2019, the University Athletic Association broke ground on Conrdon Family Ballpark. Construction on the (estimated) \$65 million ballpark, located on the southwest part of the University of Florida campus adjacent to Disney Stadium, was completed in June 2020.

Conrdon Family Ballpark features a 360-degree open concourse, shade structure for fans, multiple seating and game experience options, high-definition video and sound, enhanced concession space and food options, and multiple prominent entry gates.



State Attendance Records

From June 9-10, 2023 vs. South Carolina, Florida set the record for the two largest on-campus baseball crowds in state history with official attendance marks of 8,439 and 8,851 in games one and two of Super Regionals.

REMEMBERING ALFRED A. MCKETHAN STADIUM at PERRY FIELD



2020 marked the final season at Alfred A. McKethan Stadium at Perry Field. The friendly confines of McKethan Stadium were an important ingredient to the success of Gators Baseball for more than two decades. From its opening in 1988 until its final season in 2020, Florida was one of the toughest teams in the nation to defeat at home, posting a 911-303 (.750) record at McKethan Stadium.

Head coach **Kevin O'Sullivan** logged a 366-104 (.779) overall record, and an eye-popping 85-16 (.837) mark in regular-season series at McKethan Stadium in the first 13 years of his tenure.

The Gators ran off a school-record 29-game home winning streak from May 2015 through April 8, 2016, won 12 NCAA Regionals, and captured eight NCAA Super Regional titles at McKethan Stadium.

McKethan Stadium (also referred to as "The Mac"), formerly located on Stadium Road, gave the Gators one of the most unique ballparks in college baseball upon its inaugural season in 1988.

The \$2.4-million stadium's initial construction and refurbishment – which featured a 2,500-seat grandstand with 800 chair backs, a new press box, concession stands, and restrooms – in 1987 was made possible through the generosity of Alfred A. McKethan, a major benefactor to the University of Florida in many ways throughout his lifetime.

"Baseball always had been my first love. The facility we have at home (Emerson Field at Hernando High School) looked better than at the university," McKethan told The Tampa Tribune for its Feb. 23, 1988 story which detailed the project's completion. "I challenged fellow (Bull Gator Club) members to match me dollar for dollar and let us bring baseball at Florida to the level with football and basketball facilities."

McKethan, who was chairman of the board of Brooksville's Sun Bank & Trust at the time, presented the University Athletic Association with just over 10,000 shares

of Sun Bank stock, which amounted to a \$500,000 donation. Matching funds from the state and McKethan's fellow Bull Gator Club members covered the remaining costs.

Although the Gators dropped their first home game of the 1988 season (a 3-1 loss to Western Carolina), they won the first game of a double-header against Miami on Feb. 23, when an official stadium dedication was held in McKethan's honor. McKethan threw out the ceremonial first pitch ahead of Florida's 3-2 victory over the Hurricanes.

McKethan Stadium was built around Perry Field, which became Florida's home ballpark in 1949. The field drew its namesake from Carl E. "Tootie" Perry, a two-way offensive and defensive lineman for the Gators football team in 1916 and 1919-21; he earned All-Southern honors in 1920 and 1921, and served as team captain the latter season. A Gainesville product, Perry's family owned the land which became the Gators' home baseball stadium and track and field complex. Perry's family donated the land to the University with the stipulation the field be named for their son. Upon graduation, Perry became the official "Waterboy" for the baseball team and faithfully attended numerous Gators games.

The ballpark was also named Percy Beard Stadium before it was re-named Alfred A. McKethan Stadium at Perry Field in 1988.

Lights were installed at Perry Field in 1977, courtesy of a generous contribution from New York Yankees owner George Steinbrenner. Florida christened Steinbrenner's donation with an exhibition game against the Yankees that season.

A home team dugout was constructed at Perry Field in 1981, thanks to a \$10,000 donation by former Gators catcher and football quarterback Tom Shannon. The construction included a training room and storage area.

"Its roof serves as a photographer's paradise and the whole thing looks like a 7-Eleven," an editor for The Tampa Tribune wrote in a March 10, 1981 story about the project and another Gators-Yankees exhibition game the day prior – which saw Reggie Jackson finish 0-for-2 as a designated hitter against Gators starting pitcher Larry Mikesell.

At that time, Perry Field was infamous for a hill in left field which rose 30 feet to the wall. The Tampa Tribune story described how "a left fielder must chug uphill over an old sewer line in pursuit of a ball" and that "Steinbrenner winced each time outfielder Dave Winfield risked those expensive legs of his in the mountain climb" throughout the March 9, 1981 exhibition game.

A construction project in the summer of 1995 added 1,000 seats to the main grandstand of McKethan Stadium, which replaced seating the facility lost as a result of prior construction and an expansion of the press box.

The following year, a \$350,000 plaza development project created a courtyard atmosphere around the main grandstand, as well as a new main entrance to the ballpark.

In the fall of 1996, the press box was rebuilt with a gift of \$300,000 from Mr. McKethan.

Two significant upgrades were made in the summer of 1997. First, the playing field was leveled and new grass was planted. Second, the stadium's capacity increased to 5,000 after the addition of seats along the left field line and beyond the left field fence.

Those improvements made "The Mac" one of the best stadiums in college baseball. When Baseball America released a list of the Best College Baseball Stadiums in its January 1998 magazine issue, McKethan Stadium was ranked No. 7 nationally and No. 1 in the state of Florida.



REMEMBERING ALFRED A. MCKETHAN STADIUM at PERRY FIELD

A \$13-million expansion to McKethan Stadium and the adjacent Lemerand Athletic Center further enhanced the complex upon its completion in September 2006.

The construction project created additional stadium seating and a baseball-specific building which included a training facility, video room, offices and locker rooms, as well as a new bullpen and batting cage building. The building's roof became the Don and Irene Disney Plaza, a viewing deck which overlooked the field from foul territory in left field. Other major donors for the plaza included Gary and Nancy Condron, Rob Gidel, Tommy Oakley, George Sanders, and W. Kelly Smith.

Those projects brought McKethan Stadium's seating capacity up to 5,500 (5,100 grandstand seats; 400 bleacher seats in left field).

From 1911 through 1948, Florida played its home baseball games at Fleming Field, which stretched from Thomas Hall to Gale Lemerand Drive (east to west), and University Avenue to what is currently the north end zone of Ben Hill Griffin Stadium at Steve Spurrier-Florida Field. Florida fielded its first varsity baseball team in 1912.

Five Major League Baseball teams participated in exhibition games, and at least 23 Hall of Fame inductees – including Babe Ruth and Mel Ott – played at Fleming Field between 1919 and 1929, according to a story published by The Gainesville Sun.

Fleming Field, which also served as the home of Florida football games from 1911 through 1930, was named in honor of Francis Philip Fleming, Florida's 15th governor, in October 1915. Before it was renamed, the site was referred to as the University Athletic Grounds, or the University Athletic Field.

Prior to 1911, the university's home baseball and football games were held at a downtown stadium in the Porters Community. In January 1911, the UAA purchased the ballpark's wooden fence and grandstand and moved them to the site which eventually became Fleming Field.

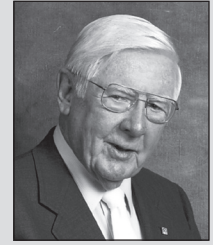

ALFRED A. MCKETHAN (1908-2002)

A native Floridian, Mr. Alfred A. McKethan distinguished himself in his profession and service to the state of Florida. He served as President and Chief Executive Officer of the Sun Bank and Trust Company



(formerly Hernando State Bank) from 1942-94, at which time he retired. At the age of 38, McKethan became the youngest president of the Florida Bankers Association. Along with his brother, John W. McKethan, he established the Brooksville Rock Company, which later became known as the Florida Mining and Materials Corporation.

McKethan was also a citrus grower, serving as the Director and Chairman of the Brooksville Citrus Growers Association for 40 years, and as Director of the Florida Citrus Exchange for 15 years. He was a board member and Chairman for the Florida State Road Department and was the first Chairman of the Southwest Florida Water Management District. In addition, the Sunshine Skyway Bridge across Tampa Bay was due in part from the works of McKethan, as well as the initial planning of the Florida Turnpike.

He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from the University of Florida as an honors graduate in 1931, and maintained close ties as an alumnus. In 1981, it was McKethan who became the first eminent scholar under a new law that provided matching funds from the state to create chairs at Florida universities if the private sector donated \$600,000. He later made his donation to UF's College of Business Administration. Also active on campus, McKethan was a member of the President's Council, a long-time Bull Gator and had been an instrumental and active member of Gator Boosters.

A Distinguished Director of Gator Boosters, he was a major benefactor to the University of Florida in many ways over the years. An avid baseball fan, McKethan attended games whenever possible each Gator season. The original 1988 stadium construction and refurbishment was made possible through his generous \$2.4-million contribution. In 1996, college baseball's fanciest and most luxurious press box was rebuilt with the aid of an additional gift of \$300,000 from McKethan.

"When you talk of Gator spirit and love for the University," said former Florida football coach Steve Spurrier, "Alfred McKethan embodies what that is all about."

McKethan passed away in April of 2002 at the age of 93 and the Gator players and coaching staff honored him by wearing black A.A.M. patches on their hats. His initials were also put above the scoreboard at the stadium bearing his name.

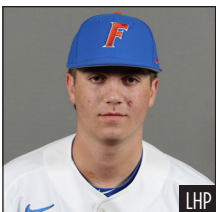
