FLORIDA FLIGHT FOR THE ANTEATERS THIS WEEK TO TAKE ON #17 KNIGHTS, BULLS

- UC Irvine went unbeaten last week with a draw against Vermont who was receiving national votes, 1-1, and a 3-1 win over Mercyhurst. The 'Eaters enter the United Soccer Coaches Far West regional rankings this week sitting No. 8
- Marcus Lee took home Big West Freshman of the Week honors after scoring his first career goal on Thursday's draw. UCI has won the award seven times in the four years since its inception with current Anteaters Nolan DiCenzo, Agaton Pourshahidi, and Brady Treinen also recipients
- UC Irvine's attack showed up with four goals. Alongside Lee were first career goals and points to third-year Justin Conyers scoring Sunday's game-winning goal, and junior transfer Misael Gonzalez scoring the third and final goal in his first Division I match. Elsewhere, Isaiah Gutierrez and Danny de Lorijn added their first career points on assists during the week.
- Alex Shields was thrust into the starting goalkeeper role for his first career minutes in his third year after an injury to Luke Pruter. Shields sprawled for multiple impressive saves Thursday in a draw against the Catamounts, and hauled in his first career victory on Sunday. In all, he registered six saves in net.
- A number of Anteaters opened their accounts last week in terms of points and minutes. In all, nine Anteaters have made their collegiate debuts with five doing so last week with Gonzalez and Shields along with second-years Braden Ferreira and Isaac Nixon and freshman Darwin Lopez. Isaiah Quarcoo, who spent two years at Tulsa and transferred to UCI in 2023 got his first minutes for the 'Eaters Sunday.
- Nolan DiCenzo will return to the lineup after a red card last Thursday from two cautions. It was the program's first red card since 2021. Thursday also happened to be the junior defender's birthday.

Friday at the Knights

- UC Irvine and UCF meet for the third time with the series even 1-1. UCI took down ranked UCF in the first meeting at Orlando, 1-0, in overtime back in 2018. Most recently, the Knights won on UCI's turf, 3-2, in 2022
- The 2022 match was overshadowed by hurricane conditions in Anteater Stadium. The atmosphere made for plentiful offense as the 'Eaters leveled things twice, once in the 32nd minute and again thanks to Samuel Atiye in the 54th minute, before UCF put home the winner in the 77th. Four Knights from that match return - Emmanuel Bam, Anderson Rosa, Lucca Dourado who scored twice, and keeper Juanvi Munoz. UCI has eight players including five starters back from that match.
- The Knights are spotless so far jumping around the rankings to No. 17 this week and a 1-0-2 record. Five different goalkeepers have converted their five goals, and two keepers in net have made nine stops. Their three matches have seen both sides score in each of them as well.

Monday at the Bulls

- UC Irvine and South Florida finish the weekend on Monday in their second-ever meeting. UCI and USF were each top 12 when they met in 2011, and the Bulls won 2-0 to drop UCI to 7-1 on the season in the match at Tampa; a match in which nine future USF MLS draft picks played including their two goalscorers - Dom Dwyer and Wesley Charpie, and both sides went deep in the NCAA Tournament that season with the 'Eaters reaching the Sweet Sixteen for a second time while South Florida advanced to the Elite Eight.
- The Bulls stumbled to open the year losing 4-1 to No. 23 Seattle U, but are unbeaten since with draws against Mercer and UNCW and a win over Eckerd., and they'll play FGCU Friday. Lovro Kostanjsek has two of their four goals and an assist while leading in shot attempts. Preseason All-AAC notables included Jalen Anderson who scored once and assisted once and top-tier defender Pedro Faife with five shots of his own from defense.

YOSSI RAZ

HEAD COACH
SEVENTH SEASON

Yossi Raz took over guidance of the Anteater men's soccer program on January 19, 2017 as the fourth head coach in UCI men's soccer history after four seasons as head coach at Division II Cal Poly Pomona.

Raz enters his seventh year with the program and sixth season of play in 2023. The program along with the entire Big West Conference did not compete in 2020 due to health and well-being concerns around the COVID-19 virus and pandemic.

Raz and the program were co-Big West regular season champions in 2021 going 6-1-2 reaching the Big West Tournament final. The Anteaters have finished .500 overall in 2021 and 2019. UCI and the Big West Conference did not compete in the 2020 season.

Raz took the program to its sixth trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2018 where the program reached the second round. UC Irvine went 11-6-4 as a program picking up a Big West regular season title. Coach Raz was named Big West Coach of the Year in just his second season. In his first year as UCI's head coach, the Anteaters finished 8-8-3.

He was named California Collegiate Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2014 after leading the Broncos to conference regular-season and tournament championships. His Cal Poly Pomona team followed up in 2015 with a second consecutive 17-win season and the program's second-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament that led to the championship match. The Broncos returned to the NCAA tournament again in 2016, reaching the third round. In four seasons at Cal Poly Pomona, Raz compiled a record of 54-17-12.

Raz is no stranger to the Big West Conference mentality as he was part of the soccer program at CSUN for 13 years, four as a student-athlete and nine more as an assistant coach. Raz was named First Team All-Big West in each of his four seasons competing for the Matadors, earning Big West Freshman of the Year honors and Scholar-Athlete of the Year distinction from CSUN and the Big West.

Raz joined the Matadors' coaching staff in 2005 and made an immediate impact, helping CSUN amass a 15-4-3 record and a Big West championship. The Matadors reached the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament, defeating league rival UC Santa Barbara in the program's lone Division I Tournament victory.

Off the pitch, Raz was President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Council and was selected for the NCAA Leadership Conference. His interest in academics continued on as an assistant coach at CSUN, as he was involved in the academic and social progress of his student-athletes and later at Cal Poly Pomona, consistently recognized by the Division of Student Affairs for his program's 100 percent graduation rate.

Raz's coaching circle includes the youth level, where he has recruited talent for the U.S. Youth National Team as a scout and coach. He has participated globally in coaching clinics in countries such as Guatemala, Brazil, and Spain, as well as being a training participant in Israel where he was born and raised. Raz previously spent time with the Israeli Youth National Team.

CALE RODRIGUEZ

ASSISTANT COACH
SEVENTH SEASON

Cale Rodriguez begins his seventh year at UC Irvine and sixth season with the UC Irvine men's soccer coaching staff as an assistant coach.

Rodriguez came to UC Irvine in 2017 after spending the previous two seasons as head coach at Peninsula College in Port Angeles, Washington. In his first season at the helm, the Pirates went 16-3-3 and finished the year with the Northwest Athletic Conference Championship, culminating in a final season ranking of 13th in the country for Division I Junior Colleges by the NSCAA. In his second year, the Pirates went 16-0-3, winning back to back NWAC North Division Championships, culminating in a final season ranking of 9th in the country for Division I Junior Colleges by the NSCAA, with Rodriguez earning NWAC North Division Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to Peninsula College, Rodriguez spent four years at his alma mater, the University of Redlands in California where he served as assistant coach in 2010, and from 2012-2015 under Ralph Perez, a U.S. soccer coaching icon. As an assistant for the Bulldogs, he assisted in all aspects of running the program while also serving as the recruiting coordinator. Rodriguez was instrumental in putting together one of the most successful recruiting classes in the history of the program. He also spent a year as an assistant coach at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas from 2011-2012.

Other coaching experience for Rodriguez includes one year as a head coach for Nevada Boys ODP (2016), one year as a head coach for Pateadores IER (2014-15) in Redlands, one year as a head coach for Heat FC (2011-12) in Las Vegas, one year as a head coach for San Gabriel Valley Soccer Club (2010-11) in Monrovia and one year as a head coach girls varsity soccer at Gahr High School (2010-11) in Cerritos

In Rodriguez's playing career at Redlands, he was a four-year starter and served as team captain his senior year in 2009. He was named to the NCAA Division III All-West Region Team and was twice named All-Conference. His career totals include fourth all-time in games started and tenth all-time in games played in program history. His Bulldogs were nationally-ranked in 2006-2008, winning conference titles and reaching the NCAA playoffs all three years.

Rodriguez graduated from the University of Redlands in 2010 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics and received his Master's degree in Higher Education from Redlands in July of 2014. Rodriguez also currently works with Pateadores Academy Boys ECNL and ODP Boys West. He currently resides in Irvine, CA with his wife Dana, son Zidane, and dog Bailey.



YONHA ADRABI

ASSISTANT COACH
FIFTH SEASON

Yonha Adrabi joined the UC Irvine men's soccer coaching staff as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2019 season before elevating to assistant and goalkeeper coach for the 2021 season.

Adrabi joined the staff first right as the season neared. In the two years prior, his goalkeeping expertise was used with club Albion SC in San Diego on the professional and youth levels. He spent the previous four seasons as an assistant at Wheaton College, a Division III program in Massachusetts. At Wheaton, he helped the program to 56 wins and one NCAA Tournament appearance as the squad's primary goalkeeper coach. Adrabi returns to the west coast after growing up in Hollywood, Calif. and a El Camino Real High School graduate. He played a pair of seasons at Santa Barbara City College before finishing his career and earning his degree at the University of Hawai'i-Hilo.

Five Things to Know for 2024 Men's Soccer

- **The 2023 Anteaters** returned to glory earning a Big West Championship, the first under head coach Yossi Raz's tenure. It came with a return trip to the NCAA Tournament, first since 2018, and battled with an LMU squad that reached the Quarterfinals
- **The 2024 roster saw departures from multiple key student-athletes** including four from the 2019 class that was ranked No. 1 in the nation in **Eddy Berumen**, **Oscar Cervantes**, **Rafael Espinoza**, and **Ricardo Ibarra**. One 'Eater still remains from that class in **Mario Anaya** returning for a sixth season in the midfield.
- **The Anteaters scored 21 goals a season ago** from 13 different goal scorers, and seven of those scorers return and bring over 50% of the offense. Last season, UCI's nine game-winning goals were spread among nine different scorers with four of the finishers back in the mix.
- **The imposing presence in net is also back in Luke Pruter** even after he was drafted in the final pick of the MLS SuperDraft by the Columbus Crew SC. Pruter is in the top 10 almost every all-time goalkeeping category as he enters his fourth season with the 'Eaters with 16 career wins, 12 shutouts, and 143 saves in 45 matches and nearly 4,000 career minutes
- **Once again, coach Raz has delivered a challenging schedule** starting off with NCAA College Cup participant from last year, Oregon State. The schedule also features tournament teams from last season Vermont and San Diego who will each visit Anteater Stadium, and a daunting trip to Florida in September to face a pair of perennial postseason contenders in UCF and South Florida.

Student-Athlete Notes

- **UC Irvine is represented internationally** with upperclassmen from Norway, Sweden, and Germany as their home countries, and newcomers arriving from Netherlands and Korea Republic. **Samuel Atiye** grew up in Germany but his family is Togolese and he will visit the country often. Senior keeper **Luke Pruter** was born in Kilkenny, Ireland and has dual citizenship with Ireland and the U.S.
- **The squad benefitted from four-year transfers last year** of **Isaiah Quarcoo** (Tulsa) and the departed Christian Gomez (Cal) and Mauricio Gutierrez (UCLA). The 2024 Anteaters bring in more college experience:
 - ⇒ **Abraham Brown grew up nearby** before spending his first two season at the University of Pittsburgh. After playing just two matches so far, he's ready to inject his talent into the Anteater backline
 - ⇒ **Another defensive star joins the 'Eaters in Travis Babineau** who played the part the last two years at Cal State San Bernardino. The 5-8 LA Galaxy Academy product brings more experience an attack to the UCI backline
 - ⇒ **A transfer duo joins the four-year defenders** with a prolific scorer from the junior college level, **Misael Gonzalez** (Fullerton College), as well as NAIA star and Netherlands-native **Danny de Lorijn** (Life University) ready to give a boost to the team's attack
- **Of the 18 'Eaters that have declared, nine different majors are represented** with the most common being nine in Sociology. Other fields UCI men's soccer players are studying toward are two in business economics, and single students taking computer science, English, economics, business administration, earth system science, and a graduate program in project management.

Anteater Numbers

- **Career stat leaders entering the 2024 season** fall between senior **Francesco Montanile** and his 10 assists and 20 points and junior **Agaton Pourshahidi** whose scored six goals. Montanile has five goals across his career, and is tied with Pourshahidi who have each scored two game-winners
- **Luke Pruter holds a majority of the stats for keepers** with 45 career matches under his belt amassing 16 wins, six draws, and 12 clean sheets. He's totaled 143 saves ranking 10th all-time in UCI history, and ranks in the top 10 in matches (7th), wins (7th), and shutouts (6th).
- **Entering the 2019 season, coach Raz's recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the nation** by Top Drawer Soccer. From that class, seven players have played professionally with six currently in action - Roberto Molina at Miami FC, Jorge Hernandez with San Antonio FC, Ricardo Ibarra for Town FC, Oscar Cervantes and Rafael Espinoza with Irvine Zeta FC, and Eddy Berumen at LAFC II and recent callups to LAFC of the MLS- and one still on the roster with **Mario Anaya** back for a sixth collegiate season
- **Head Coach Yossi Raz is in his eighth year with the program** and seventh of competition (2020 season was canceled). Raz is 49-48-22 in his six seasons at the helm. His teams have won two Big West regular-season titles (2018, 2021), a Big West Championship in 2023, and made trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2018 and 2023.
- **UC Irvine men's soccer begins its 40th season.** All-time, UCI is now 22-12-5 in its season opener and will start the season at home for the second time in the coach Raz's six seasons.

'Eaters Playing Professionally

- **LAFC II—Eddy Berumen:** Berumen began his professional career with the LAFC organization playing matches between LAFC II and USL side Las Vegas Lights before getting a brief call-up for the main club, LAFC
- **The Town FC—Ricardo Ibarra:** Ibarra has played 20 of 21 matches suited up for starting 15 times at The Town FC part of MLS Next Pro level
- **Tampa Bay Rowdies—Danny Crisostomo:** Crisostomo joined up with the USL Championship side this Spring after beginning his career at LAFC playing some at each level of MLS, MLS Next Pro, CONCACAF Champions League, and U.S. Open Cup
- **Charlotte Independence—Miguel Ibarra:** the U.S. pro soccer legend is in for his 14th professional season and

WHY THE ANTEATER?

Two former water polo players, Pat Glasgow and Bob Ernst, are regarded as the main instigators to anoint the Anteater as the mascot for UC Irvine. The character is inspired by the character from the "B.C." comic by Johnny Hart. The student-athletes, along with fellow student Schuyler Hadley Bsasset III, organized a campaign to promote their idea ahead of the 195 student election.

Despite other candidates, the students chose the Anteater to represent the university with a commanding 55.9% majority. Peter The Anteater's famous "Zot" war cry is borrowed from the "B.C." comic strip, and still serves its purpose to this day.

The correct way to refer to the Anteaters is UC Irvine or UCI. Please do not refer to the university as "Cal-Irvine" or Cal State Irvine." The university name is written as "UC Irvine," not "U.C. Irvine," "UC-Irvine" or "Cal Irvine." This naming convention also applies to the majority of the UC-system universities (i.e. UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara, UC San Diego). The only exceptions are UCLA and California (UC Berkeley).
