Bye Week Arizona State & #10/10 Iowa State

- BYU, Iowa State and K-State give the Big I2 Conference three bowl-eligible teams after eight weeks with another four teams just one win away
- BYU and lowa State represent two of the remaining IO undefeated FBS teams. The Cougars and Cyclones are tied for the nation's third-longest winning streak at seven games.
- According to ESPN's FPI, BYU (fourth) and Iowa State (sixth) rank in the nation's top IO for strength of record with Kansas State sitting in I2th.
- Big I2 programs are 24-7 this season when ranked in the AP Top 25.
- The Conference's quarterbacks have tallied four games of five touchdown passes, which leads all FBS conferences.
- Big I2 defenses have intercepted II4 passes this season; the most of any conference in FBS.
- Big I2 on-campus venues had capacity crowds in six of the seven games hosted in Week Eight.
- Baylor's 59 points on Saturday were the most by an FBS program in Week Eight and tied for the most in a conference game in a Power Four league this season.
- KU's Jalon Daniels was the nation's leader in pass efficiency rating for the week and was joined in the top IO by Sawyer Robertson (Baylor, No. 9) and Avery Johnson (K-State, No. IO) as the Big I2 was the only league with a trio of top-IO rated QB's in Week Eight.
- The Conference has five teams in the top I2 of Power Four in rushing yards per game; UCF (first), K-State (third), Kansas (fifth), Arizona State (ninth) and West Virginia (IIth).

Conference News & Notes

- UCF's RJ Harvey gave the Big I2 Conference another top rusher for the week after leading the FBS with I96 yards on the ground in Week Eight.
- Colorado became the first Big I2 team to win consecutive conference road games by 27 or more points in a single season since 2015.
- Iowa State's Jontez Williams owns the longest active streak of games with an interception in FBS with four heading into Week Nine.
- The Big I2 Conference has brought back its Big I2 Homecoming for a second year, bringing a Conference-wide celebration of the Big I2 brand to four of its campuses this fall. The three-day events have centered around entertainment, campus engagement and community service for football weekends. After visiting Utah, Colorado and Arizona State, the final stop is this weekend at TCU for the Horned Frogs' game against Texas Tech. The Big I2 teams up with brand partners at homecoming stops, including Allstate, the College Football Playoff Foundation. Sports Illustrated Swimsuit and WWE.
- The Big I2 Conference and Raycom Sports announced the launch of Big I2 Studios in September, a new programming and content venture designed to expand and enhance the league's storytelling efforts. Big I2 Studios will create and deliver original programming and content to fans as a FAST (Free Ad-Supported Television) channel across multiple major platforms, including planned launches on leading platforms early this Fall that will be announced soon, as well as major VOD platforms such as YouTube.
- The 2024 season will be the Big I2 Conference's first as a I6-team league. The Big I2 footprint now spans I0 states, four time zones and 90 million people as it begins its 29th football season.
- The Conference partnered with TuneIn, the world's leader in live audio, to launch Big I2 Radio prior to week one. The new 24/7 Conference-branded audio station, is now streaming to fans across the United States. The station includes Big I2 weekday sports talk, extensive Saturday game-day coverage, Big I2 school content and music programming. Additionally, listeners can access a 'Game of The Week' featuring gameday coverage from their Big I2 school's local play-by-play broadcast team.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on Dec. 3I, 2024, and January I, 2025, while the semifinals will be January 9-I0, 2025. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 20, 2025, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.
