### UCF, NOT CENTRAL FLORIDA

Please refer to the University of Central Florida as UCF, not Central Florida, on all references. Also, UCF is no longer the "Golden Knights" and instead simply known as the "Knights."

### FIRST AND 10

- UCF and Iowa State will meet for the first time in the history of the program's Saturday night at Jack Trice Stadium. Kickoff is set for a 7:30 p.m. on FS1. **Trent Rush** will handle play-by-play, while **Spencer Tillman** will be the analyst.
- The Cyclones are fifth of seven first-time opponents on the Knights' 2024 schedule.
- Saturday's matchup will feature the Big 12 Conference's best offense (UCF) and the best defense (ISU), as the Knights lead the league and rank 13th nationally with 473.8 yards per game and the Cyclones are 15th in the nation and top the conference allowing 285.3 yards per game to opponents.
- The Knights are looking for their fourth top-10 win in program history and the first since 2017 Peach Bowl victory against Auburn. Additionally, the win would mark the first top-10 road win since the 2013 Louisville game.
- The Knights have now rushed for **1,608 yards with 15 touchdowns** on the ground through the first six games of the season. The Knights are fourth in the nation with 268.0 rushing yards per game, which is 20 more than the next-closest Power Four Conference team (Tennessee 246.2).
- UCF is the only team in the nation that has rushed for at least 140 yards in 18 of its last 19 games, dating back to last season. During that span, the Knights have rushed for 200 or more yards 12 times and 250 plus six times.
- UCF leads the nation in explosive running plays, as the Knights have recorded 56 rushing plays of at least 10 yards. Additionally, the Black and Gold pace the league and rank fourth nationally in most offensive plays of 20 or more yards with 41.
- Running back **RJ Harvey** leads the Big 12 and ranks sixth nationally with 23 rushing plays of at least 10 yards. His nine rushing touchdowns are the most in the conference and 10th nationally.
- In contrast, UCF's defense has been strong against the run, allowing just 91.2 rushing yards per game. That mark is second in the Big 12 and the 12th-fewest nationally. The Knights have yielded just 15 rushing plays of 10 yards or more - the fewest in the league and eighth-best among FBS programs.
- Since the start of the 2017 season, UCF has accumulated 68 wins, tied for the 11th-most nationally by an FBS program and the most by a team from the state of Florida. The Knights went 13-0 in 2017, 12-1 in 2018, 10-3 in 2019, 6-4 in the Covid-shortened 2020 season, 9-4 in 2021, 9-5 in 2022 and 6-7 last season. The Knights join Alabama, Georgia, Clemson, Ohio State, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Michigan, Appalachian State, LSU, Oregon and Penn State as the only programs to win at least 68 games since 2017.

## THE OPPONENT

- Iowa State is one of the nation's 11 remaining unbeaten teams in FBS, as the Cyclones are 6-0 and 3-0 in Big 12 play. ISU earned a 28-16 victory against West Virginia in their last game on Saturday.
- Now in his ninth season with the program, head coach Matt Campbell has a 59-48 record at Iowa State and a 94-63 overall record in his 13th season as a head coach. Saturday's contest will be the first meeting between Campbell and Gus Malzahn as head coaches.
- Iowa State is one of the least penalized teams in the nation. The Cyclones rank No. 2 nationally and top the Big 12 in fewest penalty yards per game (27.7).
- They're averaging 30.67 points per game, while opponents have scored 11.0 ppg.
- The Cyclones are bowl eligible for the seventh time in nine seasons under Campbell.

## KNIGHT NOTES

### A WIN WOULD...

- Give UCF its fourth top-10 win in program history and the first since the 2017 Peach Bowl against No. 7 Auburn
- Give the Knights their second Big 12 win of the season and second on the road
- Give the Black and Gold a ranked win for the third consecutive season
- Give UCF its 299th all-time win as a program
- Give UCF head coach Gus Malzahn his first win against Iowa State in his first meeting against the program.

### HISTORY VERSUS TOP-10 TEAMS

UCF is looking for its fourth top-10 win in program history, as the Knights last defeated No. 7/8 Auburn, 34-27, in the 2017 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. UCF also beat a pair of top-10 teams during the 2013 season, taking down No. 8/6 Louisville, 38-35, and No. 6/5 Baylor, 52-42.

The Louisville game was the last time UCF earned a top-10 victory in a true road game, as the Black and Gold rallied from a 28-7 deficit to secure the win. Quarterback Blake Bortles, who was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the third pick in the 2014 NFL Draft, led the comeback for the Knights and running back Storm Johnson was selected in the seventh round by the same organization. Bortles completed 21-of-32 passes for 250 yards with two touchdowns, while Johnson rushed 18 times for 109 yards with a TD and caught four passes for 79 yards with another score.

### YOUNGEST TO DO IT

True freshman quarterback EJ Colson became the youngest quarterback (17Y, 10M) to start at QB for UCF in Saturday's game against Cincinnati. He also is the eighth true freshman in the Knights' FBS era (since 1996) to start under center.

Colson also became the youngest player to start in an FBS game this season.

Colson joins a storied line of UCF true freshman quarterbacks to start for the Knights since 1996: Mikey Keene (2021), Dillon Gabriel (2019), McKenzie Milton (2016), Bo Schneider (2015), Jeff Godfrey (2010), Rob Calabrese (2008), Kyle Isreal (2004) and Steven Moffett (2003).

### MALZAHN VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

Gus Malzahn-coached teams have been at their best against the toughest competition, as Malzahn has recorded 23 wins against ranked opponents in his 13-year tenure as a head coach. Saturday's game marks the first ranked opponent that the Knights will play this season.

At UCF, Malzahn is 3-3 versus ranked opponents as the Knights dominated their last matchup against a ranked foe, taking down then-No. 15 Oklahoma State, 45-3, in the program's annual space game last season.

### EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

UCF leads the Big 12 Conference in explosive running plays, as the Knights have recorded 49 rushing plays of at least 10 yards. Additionally, the Black and Gold pace the league and rank fourth nationally in most offensive plays of 20 or more yards with 41.

Running back RJ Harvey leads the Big 12 and ranks sixth nationally with 23 rushing plays of at least 10 yards. His nine rushing touchdowns are the most in the conference and 10th nationally.

In addition, the Black and Gold own 24 explosive passing plays of at least 20 yards this season. Wide receiver Kobe Hudson's 11 receiving plays of at least 20 yards are the third most among league players.

UCF has run 32 plays that have amassed 20+ yards, tied for the third most in the Big 12 behind Texas Tech (38), Oklahoma State (33) and tied with Baylor (32).

In contrast, UCF's defense has been strong against the run, allowing just 91.2 rushing yards per game. That mark is second in the Big 12 and the 12th-fewest nationally. The Knights have yielded just 15 rushing plays of 10 yards or more - the fewest in the league and eighth-best among FBS programs.

### 29 AND COUNTING

Wide receiver Kobe Hudson has recorded at least one catch in 29 consecutive games, dating back to the SMU game in 2022, which is tied with Ranell Hall for eighth all-time in UCF history for most consecutive games with a reception.

Hudson recorded his third 100+ yard receiving game against the Bearcats on Saturday, hauling in seven catches for 114 yards and one touchdown.

The Pine Mountain, Georgia, native's 477 receiving yards this season lead the Knights and rank among the conference's top 10. Hudson's 20.7 yards per catch average is the best in the league and 18th nationally.

### EXTENDED ACTION FOR BROWN

In his first extended action in a UCF uniform, quarterback Jacurri Brown passed and ran for career highs in both categories. He completed 13-of-20 passes for 207 yards with a touchdown and rushed 16 times for 84 yards.

Brown found Hudson for his first TD pass of the season on a 15-yard reception.

### STRONG START FOR REDDICK

Redshirt freshman kicker Grant Reddick was ready when his number was called against Florida on Oct. 5, as the Orlando native was a perfect 2-for-2 on field goal attempts and converted his only PAT attempt.

He split the uprights from 27 yards out on his first career field goal attempt in the first quarter of the contest and he made a 37-yard field goal in the third quarter.

Reddick connected on two field goals against Cincinnati on Oct. 12 and made an extra point.

### FIRST CAREER INTERCEPTIONS

He had appeared in 44 games during his tenure as a Knight, but in his 45th career game, senior cornerback BJ Adams tallied his first career interception. After numerous pass breakups, the Atlanta native reeled in his first pick in the first quarter of the Cincinnati game.

Similarly to Adams, defensive back Ladarius Tennison secured his first career interception in the 54th game of his career, stepping in front of a pass in the second quarter.

### BARR TABBED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR

For the second consecutive year, UCF linebacker Ethan Barr has been named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy. The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership, and the candidates also comprise the pool of nominees for the 2024 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards Presented by Fidelity Investments.

Barr, who joined the Knights in January after spending his first four seasons at Vanderbilt and earning his undergraduate degree in human and organizational development, is currently pursuing a master's degree in educational leadership with a 3.91 grade-point average and has earned all A's through the first month of this fall's academic coursework.

### MARSHALL NAMED TO JASON WITTEN MAN OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

UCF senior Marcellus Marshall has been tabbed to the eighth annual Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Watch List. The award is presented annually to student-athletes that demonstrate a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.

Marshall has started each game for the Knights this season and has led a stellar offensive line unit that has paved the way for one of the nation's top rushing offenses.

Voted a team captain prior to the season, Marshall is a vocal team leader and has also displayed his leadership in the community. Most recently, he was heavily involved in UCF's Childhood Cancer Awareness Game, interacting with the patients and helping them design the helmet

decals that wore worn against Sam Houston.

### HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

The Knights have scored more points (72) in the third quarters of games this season than any other quarter and have held opponents to just 27 points. The 45-point difference is also the largest delta in any quarter this year.

### RUNNING WILD

After ranking among the nation's top 10 in rushing offense the past two seasons, UCF is in the midst of another strong year on the ground in 2024. UCF has now rushed for 1,608 yards with 15 touchdowns on the ground through the first six games of the season.

The Knights are fourth in the nation with 268.0 rushing yards per game, which is nearly 20 more than the next-closest Power Four Conference team (Tennessee 246.2).

The Black and Gold rushed for 454 yards in the season opener against New Hampshire, the second most in program history. Additionally, UCF's 8.4 rushing yards per carry were the second most in a single game in program history.

The Knights were fourth nationally in rushing offense with 228.2 rushing yards per game last season. UCF rushed for 200 or more yards in nine of its 13 games in 2023 and has picked up where it left off, rushing for at least 200 yards in three of its five games of 2024.

### HARVEY CLIMBING THE PROGRAM RECORD BOOKS

After scoring a rushing touchdown at Florida, UCF running back RJ Harvey has taken over sole possession of fourth (30) on UCF's career rushing touchdowns list. UCF Hall of Famer Latavius Murray is third on the list with 37.

In addition, Harvey has 2,815 career rushing yards to rank fourth all-time behind Willie English with 3,131.

Harvey tied the program record and set a career high with four rushing touchdowns in the Knights' 45-14 victory against Sam Houston on Sept. 7 and has continued to etch his name in the Knights' record books. The Orlando native finished with 126 rushing yards on 19 carries, finding the end zone four times – the first UCF player to do so since Isaiah Bowser in 2021.

### FULL CIRCLE FOR WHITEMORE

UCF wide receiver Trent Whitemore has played numerous games at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium, but none of them have been from the visiting team sideline. After spending his first four years as a member of Florida's football program (2019-22) and earning his degree in sport management, Whitemore transferred into the Knights' program ahead of the 2023 season. His father, Mark, played wide receiver at UCF from 1991-94 and his mother, Missy, played volleyball for UF from 1992-95. Whitemore grew up in Gainesville and attended Buchholz High School.

### HARVEY NATIONAL RB, BIG 12 OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After earning Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors, UCF running back RJ Harvey was selected as the Doak Walker Award National Running Back of the Week on Tuesday, Sept. 16.

Last season, Harvey was a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award, presented annually to the nation's top running back, and was on the 2024 preseason watch list. Harvey's standout performance helped lead UCF to a win in its conference opener on Saturday at TCU, as he rushed for 180 yards on 29 carries with two touchdowns in the Knights' 35-34 win against the Horned Frogs in Fort Worth, Texas. Orlando's Hometown Hero also scored his second career receiving touchdown to end the day with 209 all-purpose yards and three total touchdowns.

He had seven rushes of 10 or more yards in the win, headlined by a 27-yard rushing TD in the fourth quarter, which was the longest rush for either team in the game.

### HISTORIC COMEBACK

Trailing 21-7 at halftime and 28-7 following the first drive of the second half, UCF was unfazed in its win at comeback win at TCU, as the Knight chipped away at the deficit. The Knights outscored TCU 13-10 in the third quarter and 15-3 in the fourth quarter to open Big 12 play with a win.

The comeback win ties the Boise State game from 2021 and the Louisville game from 2013, head coach Gus Malzahn's first game leading the Knights, for the largest come-from-behind win in program history. In just four seasons, Malzahn has guided his teams to two of the largest comeback wins in program history.

### HUGE GAME FOR HUDSON

Wide receiver Kobe Hudson turned in one of his best games of his career in the win at TCU, as the fifth year tallied six catches for 145 yards with a pair of touchdown grabs, including the game-winner with 36 seconds remaining.

The 145 yards were just two shy of his career high 147, achieved in the Villanova win last season. For his performance, Hudson was named to the Pro Football Focus (PFF) Big 12 Team of the Week and was also tabbed the Reese's Senior Bowl Stock Up Player of the Week.

### CLUTCH WHEN IT COUNTS

After helping lead UCF to a 35-34 comeback win at TCU, quarterback KJ Jefferson was selected to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 List and a Manning Award Star of the Week on Tuesday, Sept. 17. Jefferson spearheaded a second-half rally for the Knights, as the Black and Gold overcame a 21-point deficit to defeat the Horned Frogs in the Big 12 Conference opener for both teams.

Hailing from Sardis, Mississippi, Jefferson finished the game 13-of-22 for 230 yards passing with three touchdowns and contributed 46 yards rushing to end the game with 276 total yards. He was at his best in the second half, as he was 9-of-11 for 166 yards with two touchdowns.

Jefferson had a 191.9 quarterback rating for the game, connecting on nine of his last 11 passes, including his first five passes of the second half. On UCF's game-winning drive, he was 4-of-5 for 54 yards and found wide receiver Kobe Hudson across the middle on a post route to knot the score at 34-34 before Colton Boomer's extra point split the uprights to give UCF the one-point victory.

### THAT'S NEW

The Black and Gold's first four opponents of 2024 (New Hampshire, Sam Houston, TCU and Colorado) are all first-time opponents. Additionally, UCF head coach Gus Malzahn is also facing those four opponents for the first time in his 13-year head coaching tenure. In total, the Knights' 2024 slate features seven first-time opponents (Iowa State, Arizona and Utah).

### NEW LOOK SCHEDULE

Despite being in its second year in the Big 12 Conference, UCF only plays two opponents that it played in 2023 – Cincinnati and West Virginia. That mark is tied with BYU (Kansas and Oklahoma State) for the fewest among returning Big 12 teams.

### ALL OF THE NEWCOMERS

UCF is the only team in the Big 12 that will play each of the four newcomers to the league. The Knights host Colorado (Sept. 28), Arizona (Nov. 2) and Utah (Nov. 29), while traveling to Arizona State on Nov. 9.

### VETERAN EXPERIENCE



The football team donned specially designed logos on each side of their helmets.

**OFFENSIVE GURU**

Known as one of the best offensive minds in college football, not only have UCF offenses ranked among the nation's best each season under head coach Gus Malzahn, but also several of the nation's other top offenses have connections to Malzahn.

North Carolina, which ranked seventh nationally in total offense (491.2) last season, is led by offensive coordinator Chip Lindsey, who spent the 2022 season as UCF's offensive coordinator and also worked under Malzahn at Auburn. Texas State head coach GJ Kinne had the Bobcats ranked 15th in total offense last year. Kinne accepted the head coaching job after spending the 2021 season as the Knights' offensive coordinator.

SMU, which was 16th in the nation in total offense in 2023, is coached by Rhett Lashlee, who Malzahn coached at Springdale High School in Arkansas and then later hired at Auburn.

**ELITE TERRITORY**

UCF head coach Gus Malzahn is the only coach to ever win 100 career games as a high school coach and 100 career games at the FBS level as a collegiate head coach. Malzahn was the head coach at Hughes High School from 1992-1995, Shiloh Christian High School from 1996-2000 and Springdale High School from 2001-05 with all three located in the state of Arkansas.

Malzahn's first collegiate head coaching job was at Arkansas State in 2012, before spending the next eight seasons at Auburn and then taking over at UCF.

**UCF CONSISTENTLY AMONG NCAA STAT LEADERS**

UCF finished the 2023 season ranked among the top 10 in two major offensive categories: eighth nationally in total offense (487.0 yards per game) and fourth in rushing offense (228.2).

**HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE**

UCF's all-time record of 84-28 (.757) ranks in the top 15 in the nation for best win percentage in a current home stadium. The Knights earned win No. 80 against Villanova in 2023.

Since 2017, the Knights are 41-8 in home games at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

The Knights finished last season with a 4-2 home record and were undefeated at home in 2021, marking the seventh time in UCF's FBS era, the ninth overall, and the fourth time in five years.

Ted Roof, who won a national championship with Malzahn when the two were coordinators at Auburn in 2010, takes over the defense for the season. Additionally, Trovon Reed was hired as cornerbacks coach in January 2024.

**LEADING THE CHARGE**

Quarterback KJ Jefferson, running back RJ Harvey, offensive lineman Marcellus Marshall and linebacker Ethan Barr have been voted team captains of the 2024 UCF football quad. The selections mark the first time that each captain has been a transfer student-athlete.

**SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST**

A program-record 11 UCF football standouts—defensive back Brandon Adams, defensive tackle Ricky Barber, running back Peny Boone, running back RJ Harvey, wide receiver Kobe Hudson, defensive lineman Lee Hunter, quarterback KJ Jefferson, defensive end Malachi Lawrence, offensive lineman Marcellus Marshall, defensive back Mac McWilliams and linebacker Deshawn Pace — were named to the watch list for the 2025 Reese's Senior Bowl All-Star Game.

Gus Malzahn was named the ninth head coach in UCF football history on Feb. 15, 2021. He has long been known as one of college football's great offensive innovators, and over his 18 seasons as a coordinator and head coach at the collegiate level, he has the resume to prove it.

Malzahn, now 104-57 (.646) in 13 seasons overall as a head coach, has guided his teams to eight conference championship game appearances, including a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012.

He was the first head coach to implement the "Hurry-Up, No Huddle" offense in the SEC at Auburn in 2009, and his offensive philosophy and strategies have since been implemented by most collegiate programs, in addition to several NFL teams.

In nine of Malzahn's 18 seasons as a head coach or coordinator, his teams have been ranked in the Top 20 in total offense and/or rushing offense, including seven seasons in the Top 10. His 2022 and 2023 UCF teams finished the season ninth and fifth, respectively, in rushing offense, including eighth overall in total offense last season. Malzahn has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in his career, including RJ Harvey in 2023, Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Malzahn's Auburn teams still hold SEC Championship game records for points scored (59), total offense (677 yards), rushing yards (545), individual rushing yards (304), individual rushing TDs (4), individual receiving yds (217) and largest margin of victory (39).

Malzahn's first three seasons as UCF head football coach in 2021, 2022 and 2023 have featured three consecutive postseason bowl invitations (now 12 straight for teams coached by Malzahn and eight straight for UCF), overall nine-win marks in 2021 and 2022—plus a 2022 conference title-game qualification—as his Knight teams have injected themselves onto the list of elite collegiate programs.

Malzahn, who spent one year as a head coach in the Sun Belt Conference, eight years in the high-powered Southeastern Conference and two years in the American Athletic Conference, coached his first season in the Big 12 Conference in 2023.

Highlighted by a 45-3 late-season triumph over 15th-ranked Oklahoma State, Malzahn's Knights defeated two teams that played in 2023 conference championship games—the Cowboys (Big 12) and Boise State (Mountain West). UCF's initial year in the Big 12 saw them qualify for a Gasparilla Bowl matchup with Georgia Tech.

His UCF crew in 2023 ranked among the nation's top offensive units—standing fourth in the country in rushing (233.2 yards

per game) and seventh in total offense (492.2). In addition, the Knights allowed the fewest passing yards in the Big 12—with Knight players pacing the league in receiving yards per game (Javon Baker) and tackles for loss (Tre'mon Morris-Brash). UCF also ranked sixth in the country in third-down conversions at 50 percent and 10th in yards per pass completion (14.67).

Baker and Morris-Brash received first-team All-Big 12 recognition in voting by league coaches—while senior linebacker Jason Johnson made the second team after his third straight season with 100-plus tackles and Harvey (1,296 regular-season yards and 16 rushing touchdowns) became a Doak Walker Award semifinalist.

UCF's impressive win against Big 12 runner-up Oklahoma State marked the 100th by Malzahn while coaching FBS programs—making him the first coach in college football history to win 100-plus games at both the high school level as well as while coaching at FBS institutions.

His 2022 squad produced significant regular-season victories over ranked Cincinnati and Tulane squads—followed by an appearance in the AAC Championship Game for the first time since 2018. In 2021 Malzahn's unit finished with six wins in the Knights' final seven games, a 29-17 Gasparilla Bowl triumph over Florida, a perfect 7-0 home record—and an eye-opening response to a parade of injuries to key personnel.

The Knights in 2022 excelled on both sides of the line of scrimmage. UCF finished among the national leaders on offense while also leading the nation in red-zone defense much of the season. Malzahn's team also ranked 11th in first downs, 13th in fumbles recovered to pace the league.

In 2022 UCF ranked second in the AAC in total offense and rushing. The improved Knight attack jumped 50 spots in the NCAA rankings in total offense, 19 in rushing, 34 in passing and six in scoring. The Knights also had 14 All-AAC first- or second-team selections while cornerback Davonte Brown was named the AAC Cornerback of the Year by Pro Football Network.

Malzahn's Knights began the 2021 season by recording the largest comeback victory in UCF history in a 36-31 triumph over Boise State. His first team in Orlando prospered by pulling out three other wins by four-point margins and playing six games overall decided by a touchdown or less—with two UCF defeats coming by a combined 11 points. In recognition of his efforts, Malzahn was named one of three finalists for the Steve Spurrier Award presented by the Football Writers Association of America to the best head coach in his first year at a school.

That season UCF ranked seventh nationally in team pass efficiency defense (after ranking 104th in that NCAA statistical

category the previous year), while also showing dramatic improvement in several other statistical categories:

- An upgrade of 86 slots in passing yards allowed compared to 2020, while permitting 89.1 fewer passing yards in 2021
- An improvement of 70 slots in total defense, while allowing 122.5 fewer yards per game compared to the previous season

In eight years as head football coach at Auburn, Malzahn led the Tigers to an SEC Championship, two SEC West Division titles and six New Year's Day bowl selections to go with those eight postseason appearances.

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach-of-the-Year honors that season after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history. He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and top-ranked Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship Game win over fifth-ranked Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school.

The 34-28 victory over top-rated Alabama in 2013 came on a memorable 100-yard "Kick-6" return of a Tide missed field goal on the final play of the game. Malzahn's Tiger squads also defeated seventh-ranked Texas A&M in 2013, seventh-rated Ole Miss in 2014, second-ranked Georgia and top-rated Alabama in 2017 and fifth-ranked Alabama in 2019.

After his eight seasons at Auburn, Malzahn qualified as the second-longest tenured head coach at one school in the SEC and he remains one of only a handful of active FBS head coaches to take a team to a national championship game. During his time with the Tigers, Auburn was one of only three SEC schools to play in multiple SEC Championships games and play for a national championship.

Malzahn has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 18 seasons as a college coach, including Harvey in 2023 for UCF, Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 (despite missing significant time with injuries) and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 and 2010 (both Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas). Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

During Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, the Tigers had the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 228.6 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) came under Malzahn's leadership. Auburn became just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards (also Texas A&M in 2012).

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing TDs in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense versus Missouri in the 2013 SEC Championship Game.

Mason, the 2013 SEC Player of the Year, ranked

third in the nation with 23 TDs and sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game. He also set Auburn single-season records for rushing yards and all-purpose yards (2,374).

In Malzahn's eight seasons at Auburn 32 players were selected in the National Football League Draft while 14 of his players were named All-Americans.

The Tigers faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, facing 38 ranked opponents, including 21 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1- and No. 2-ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four College Football Playoff semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012 when he led the program to a 9-3 regular-season mark and the Sun Belt Conference title. In that role he worked hand in hand with current UCF vice president and director of athletics Terry Mohajir who was named the Red Wolves' vice chancellor and director of athletics in the middle of that 2012 season and remained in that role until coming to UCF in early 2021.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957. Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records while leading the SEC and finishing in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. Malzahn coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 TDs, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the number-one overall selection in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell awards.

During two seasons (2007-08) as assistant head coach and co-offensive coordinator at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records. The 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally, averaging 47.2 points per games. Malzahn in 2006 spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame. After one year as defensive coordinator in 1991 he spent four years (1992-95) as head coach at Hughes (Arkansas) High School, five years in 1996-2000 as head coach at Shiloh (Arkansas) High School and five years (2001-05) as head coach at Springdale

## PRODUCTIVE OFFENSES

Gus Malzahn was responsible for two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history: Auburn in 2013 (7,018 yards of total offense and Auburn in 2010 (6,989 yards of total offense).

## 50-POINT GAMES

Since the year 2000, in the eight years Malzahn was at Auburn, the Tigers posted 25 50-point games. In the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers recorded three 50-point games in a season four times with Malzahn as head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019)

## MALZAHN AT HOME

Malzahn now holds a record of 62-17 (.785) at home as a collegiate head coach. He was 5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State, at Auburn went 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018, 6-1 in 2019 and 4-1 in 2020, finished 2021 with UCF 7-0, 5-2 in 2022, 4-2 in 2023 and 2-2 this season. He started his tenure at Auburn with 13 consecutive home victories.

## NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Gus Malzahn earned multiple national coach of the year awards in 2013, including the Eddie Robinson Award, the Bobby Bowden Award, and the Bear Bryant Award, as well as national coach of the year honors from Home Depot, the Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, and USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

As a player he helped the Razorbacks to the 1984 Liberty Bowl and the 1985 Holiday Bowl (a win over Arizona State).

Malzahn and his wife Kristi (Otwell) are parents of two daughters, Kylie (Collin) Peek and Kenzie (Charl) Stander.

**ORLANDO** – After ranking among the nation’s top 10 in rushing offense the past two seasons, the UCF football program is poised to have another strong year on the ground in 2024. The Knights rushed for 454 yards, the second most in program history, Thursday night en route to a 57-3 victory against New Hampshire in the season opener at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

Additionally, UCF’s 8.4 rushing yards per carry are the second most in a single game in program history. The Black and Gold had eight different players carry the football in the contest with five Knights rushing for at least 40 yards. UCF had 14 rushes of 10 yards or more, headlined by a 60-yard rush from running back RJ Harvey.

“I’m proud of our team,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “Taking care of business with a convincing win. Looking at the game, I just told the players the thing that stood out to me is only three penalties. We’ve been really focused on not beating ourselves.

“Defensively, we played a big-time game. I think [Deshawn] Pace’s Interception, that was the one that really turned the game into being able to breathe a little bit. [Ladarius] Tennison had the block punt right there. I mean, he was one of the better special teams players in college football last year, and it showed. Xavier Townsend was big time in the return game.”

In addition to the offense, the Knights’ defense was stellar throughout the contest limiting the Wildcats to just nine first downs. UCF’s aggressive defense forced two interceptions, as linebacker Deshawn Pace swung the momentum in the Knights’ favor early in the second quarter when he jumped in front of Seth Morgan’s pass for his sixth career pick.

Following a pair of Colton Boomer field goals in the first half, Pace nearly recorded a pick six as he was knocked out of bounds at the three-yard line after a 37-yard return. One play later, quarterback KJ Jefferson found the end zone for the Knights’ first touchdown of the season to give UCF a 13-0 lead.

Tabbed as one of the top special teams players in the country by College Football Network last season, Ladarius Tennison raced through the middle of the UNH punt unit to block the attempt and it was recovered by the Wildcats in the endzone for a safety.

From there, the Black and Gold scored 23 points in the second quarter to own a 29-3 lead at halftime behind a pair of rushing TDs from Harvey. The 2024 Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List selection surpassed 100 yards rushing for the third consecutive game dating back to last season and the ninth time in his career. The Orlando native finished with 11 carries for 142 yards, averaging 12.9 yards per rush – second most by an individual in program history.

Following the intermission, UCF forced four consecutive punts to pull away from the Wildcats with 28 points in the third quarter. Making his debut in the Black and Gold, Myles Montgomery notched his first career receiving touchdown on a 49-yard catch from KJ Jefferson. His backfield mate, Peny Boone found the endzone a few minutes with a 59-yard scamper to push the Knights’ advantage to 43-3.

Boone had seven rushes for 81 yards and Montgomery logged 77 yards on eight rushes. Johnny Richardson pitched in with 40 rushing yards and a 22-yard touchdown reception.

Sophomore Antione Jackson came up with the Knights’ second interception of the day and Montgomery quickly turned it into six points for UCF, scoring from 25 yards out. It marked the first time he’s scored a touchdown on the ground and receiving in the same game in his career. Pace led the defense with five tackles, including three solo, while Braeden Marshall had a great game with four tackles, including two tackles for loss and a pass breakup. Mac McWilliams notched four tackles with a TFL.

ORLANDO – Saturday’s game was delayed 30 minutes due to lightning in the area, but that didn’t have any impact on a hot start for UCF, as the Knights scored on six of their first seven drives to earn a 45-14 victory against Sam Houston at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

For the second consecutive game, the Black and Gold compiled more than 550 yards of total offense, including 384 rushing yards. Defensively, UCF forced two turnovers and held Sam Houston to just 67 rushing yards.

“I’m real proud of our team, we earned a convincing win against a quality opponent,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “They’ve got good players and that’s a Hall of Fame Coach. He’s won two national championships. It was a good measuring stick for our guys.”

UCF has now opened the season with a 2-0 record in three of Malzahn’s four seasons in Orlando. Saturday’s game also marked the 200th FBS win for the Knights as a program since making the transition from FCS in 1996.

Knights running back RJ Harvey tied the program record and set a career high with four rushing touchdowns, while surpassing 100 yards rushing for the 10th time in his career. The Orlando native finished with 126 rushing yards on 19 carries, finding the end zone four times – the first player to do so since Isaiah Bowser in 2021.

The preseason Doak Walker Award Watch List honoree recorded the first two touchdowns of the game, scoring from 19 yards out and on a two-yard rush to cap 80-yard and 76-yard drives, respectively.

“It feels great to score four times,” said Harvey. “All praise goes to the offensive line. Without them, that wouldn’t have been possible. So, I’m just super blessed for them to have done their job tonight to allow me to have success.”

For the third time in his career, UCF kicker Colton Boomer booted a 50-yard field goal as he split the uprights to extend the Knights’ early advantage to 17-0 in the second quarter. The Lake Mary native had a pair of 50-yarders in the Boise State game last season, including the game-winner.

KJ Jefferson led the offense from his quarterback position, going 12-for-15 passing for 169 yards. He also rushed for 50 yards on nine attempts. Wide receiver Kobe Hudson reeled in 104 of those, eclipsing the 100-yard receiving mark for the sixth time in his career.

Defensively, the Black and Gold were dominant throughout the game, limiting the Bearkats to 118 yards and just 16 rushing at halftime. In comparison, UCF had already rushed for 243 yards and Harvey accounted for 115 yards on 16 carries with three rushing touchdowns in the first 30 minutes.

The Knights tallied two interceptions for the second straight game, as Mac McWilliams and Sheldon Arnold each came down with their first interceptions in a UCF uniform.

Quadric Bullard, Nyjalik Kelly and Xe’ree Alexander led the defensive effort each with six tackles. Kelly notched the Knights’ first sack of the season, forced a fumble and had a pass breakup.

UCF returns to action next weekend when the Knights travel to TCU to open Big 12 Conference play. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. ET on FOX from Amon G. Carter Stadium.

**FORT WORTH, Texas** – Winning is an attitude.

That's the motto for UCF's athletics teams this season coined by vice president and director of athletics Terry Mohajir and the football team epitomized that mindset Saturday evening, rallying from a 21-point deficit to earn a 35-34 win against TCU in its Big 12 Conference opener at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

Trailing 21-7 at halftime and 28-7 following the first drive of the second half, the Knights regrouped and were the better team for the remainder of the contest. UCF (3-0, 1-0 Big 12) outscored TCU (2-1, 0-1) 13-10 in the third quarter and 15-3 in the fourth quarter to open Big 12 play with a win.

With 3:14 seconds left on the clock, the Black and Gold put together a 10-play, 72-yard drive to score the game-winner with 36 seconds remaining in the contest. On a first and 10 play from the 20-yard line, quarterback KJ Jefferson found wide receiver Kobe Hudson across the middle on a post route to knot the score at 34-34 and Colton Boomer's extra point split the uprights to give UCF the one-point victory.

The 21-point comeback win ties the Boise State game from 2021, head coach Gus Malzahn's first game leading the Knights, for the largest come-from-behind win in program history. It marked the largest blown lead in a loss for TCU at Amon G. Carter Stadium since joining the Big 12.

"I'm extremely proud of our team," said Malzahn. "They're a really good team and very well-coached. We simplified things on offense in the second half, making a commitment to running it downhill and it opened up the pass.

"Our guys found a way to win the game, we overcame. There are a lot of areas that we need to improve on, but I think we have the makings of a good team, finding a way to win on the road."

It was a tale of two halves for the Knights, scoring 28 points in the second half as opposed to seven in the first half. Four of UCF's five drives following the intermission ended in a touchdown.

Jefferson was 9-of-11 for 166 yards with two touchdowns in the second half and the Black and Gold ran for another 144 yards to compile 310 yards in the last two quarters. The Sardis, Mississippi, native finished the game 13-of-22 for 230 yards with three touchdowns and he rushed nine times for 46 yards.

Hudson accounted for 145 of Jefferson's passing yards, as the fifth-year senior reeled in six passes and found the end zone twice, including the game-winning score late in the fourth quarter. It marked the second consecutive game and seventh in his career surpassing 100 yards receiving.

One of the nation's most talented running backs, RJ Harvey continued his scorching hot start to the season rushing for 180 yards on 29 carries with two touchdowns on the ground. The Hometown Hero also scored his second career receiving touchdown to end the day with 209 all-purpose yards and three total touchdowns. Harvey has now rushed for more than 100 yards in his last five games dating back to 2023, scoring 11 TDs during that span.

Defensively, linebacker Deshawn Pace was all over the field to lead the Knights with 11 tackles, including eight solo, to finish one shy of matching his career high. He had two big stops on TCU's second to last drive, which resulted in a punt to give UCF the ball back with 3:14 remaining.

The Knights' defense limited the Horned Frogs to just 58 yards rushing, but they threw for 402 yards. UCF's approach was balanced with 289 yards rushing and 230 passing yards.

## UCF Falls to Colorado in Big 12 Home Opener, 48-21



**ORLANDO** – Despite outgaining its opponent for the fourth time in as many games, the UCF football team was handed its first loss of the 2024 season Saturday evening, as the Colorado Buffaloes earned a 48-21 win against the Knights at FBC Mortgage Stadium. In the first meeting between the teams, CU jumped out to an early lead and never relinquished it en route to the victory.

“Congratulations to Colorado. They outplayed us, they outcoached us. They’re a good team,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “I’m real disappointed for our fans. They brought it today with everything and we talked about seizing the moment, we didn’t get it done.”

“I just told our team that in the game of football and in life, you learn the most about yourself in major adversity and we didn’t get it done.”

Looking to put a bow on a great day for the program after hosting Big Noon Kickoff with one of the largest crowds in the history of the show, the Knights fell short in their pursuit.

Entering the game as one of the nation’s top offenses, UCF (3-1, 1-1 Big 12) tallied 461 yards of total offense but had four turnovers, which proved to be the difference. Colorado (4-1, 2-0) compiled 418 yards with 290 through the air and 128 on the ground, but the Buffs were 4-for-4 on red zone attempts and only had one turnover.

Part of the Knights’ Achilles heel was that three of their turnovers came in the red zone, as the Black and Gold were 2-for-5 when driving inside the 20-yard line. UCF was just 6-of-18 on third down, unable to extend drives to trim the deficit against Colorado.

UCF forced a turnover on the opening drive of the game, as linebacker Deshawn Pace picked off a Shedeur Sanders pass to give the Knights great field position on his eighth career interception and second of the season. After moving the ball down to the five-yard line, CU’s Preston Hodge intercepted a pass in the back of the end zone to regain possession for the Buffaloes.

Following the turnover, Colorado scored on its next three drives to jump out to a 21-7 lead midway through the second quarter. KJ Jefferson scored on a quarterback keeper to trim the margin to seven at 21-14 before two field goals from the Buffaloes within the final three minutes of the half to take a 27-14 advantage into halftime.

Receiving the ball after the intermission, UCF saw its nine-play, 38-yard drive end after Colton Boomer’s 55-yard field goal attempt missed wide left. Colorado converted on the ensuing drive, following a couple big passing plays from Sanders and Micah Welsh finished off the drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown to push the Buffs’ lead to 34-14 and they never looked back.

Jefferson finished the game 20-for-35 with 284 yards passing and a pair of touchdowns, while matching his career high with 20 rushing attempts for 76 yards and a score. Running back RJ Harvey was held to fewer than 100 yards rushing for the first time this season but tallied 169 all-purpose yards thanks to 92 receiving yards and 77 rushing. He logged his second receiving touchdown of the season on a career-long 75-yard grab.

Xavier Townsend found the end zone for the first time this season, reeling in a 15-yard touchdown reception late in the third quarter as UCF looked to mount a comeback. Trent Whittemore snagged a career-long 54-yard reception and Kobe Hudson had two catches for 39 yards.

Defensively, linebacker Ethan Barr tallied eight tackles and Ladarius Tension notched seven. Malachi Lawrence secured his first sack of the season and Nyjalik Kelly added his second sack of the season in the contest.

**GAINESVILLE, Fla.** – A palpable buzz swarmed throughout The Swamp as the Knights poured out of the tunnel behind enemy lines Saturday evening. Cheers initially greeted UCF as fans donning the Black and Gold trekked north and made up parts of the 90,369 in attendance, only to be met with the boos and jeers of the Florida faithful.

The electricity in the venue was apparent, as the two in-state schools were set to clash for just the fourth time, and the first time since the Knights's 29-17 Gasparilla Bowl victory in 2021. The outcome wasn't the same this time around, as the Gators jumped out to an early lead, seizing early key moments, propelling them to a 24-13 victory.

"They outplayed us tonight," said head coach Gus Malzahn. "It was loud and their atmosphere was really good. We dug ourselves a hole in the first quarter and had trouble tackling. They made some explosive plays and offensively, we were 1-of-7 on third down in the first half and you're not going to be effective like that."

The Knights entered the contest with a 13-game winning streak against in-state foes, a trend that started early in the 2017 season, a year that would later prove magical for UCF.

The Gators put together a slow yet methodical drive to open the contest, chewing up the first 7:58 while converting all four of their third-down chances. Florida was the first to strike, opening the scoring with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Graham Mertz to Elijah Badger.

UCF's offense ripped off a chunk of yardage on its first play of the evening, a 30-yard screen play to tight end Randy Pittman Jr. Eight consecutive run plays moved the Black and Gold to the 13-yard line, but the drive didn't go much further, ending with Grant Reddick's first attempted and made field goal, a demure 27-yarder to get the Knights on the board.

UCF ran just seven plays on the next two drives, leading to the Gators adding another seven points late in the second, a three-yard rushing touchdown with 1:50 left in the first half to put Florida up 21-3.

The one-for-seven clip on third down told most of the first half's story, resulting in UCF posting a season low 119 yards in the first half.

The Knights' defense allowed just one third down conversion after Florida's four on the opening drive, a sign of things to come in the second half for UCF. The Black and Gold locked down the Gators offense out of the break, holding them to 108 yards and one-for-six on third downs.

The Knights got the ball to start the second half, putting three points on the board thanks to a drive that was started by eight consecutive run plays, seven of which went for four yards or more. UCF continued its grind down the gridiron with a 17-yard jet sweep to Johnny Richardson, followed by a Penry Boone rush for 11 yards on the next play, getting the Knights 10 yards away from the goal line. The Florida defense again stood tall in the redzone, stopping first and second down rushes and sacking Jefferson on third. A 37-yard field goal capped off the nearly eight-and-a-half-minute drive, making the score 24-6 Florida.

UCF's defense stood tall on Florida's first drive of the second half, halting the Gators at the 35-yard line and forcing a 53-yard field goal attempt which was pushed wide left.

The Knights got the ball back with 11:25 to go and drove the ball 82 yards, using just 3:35 of clock to register the team's first touchdown of the game. RJ Harvey was a big part of the journey down the field, hauling in a 35-yard catch down the left sideline and eventually was the one to hit paydirt, scampering for a 13-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to 11 at 24-13 with 7:50 left to play. Harvey's score was his ninth rushing touchdown on the campaign and 30th of his career.

UCF got the ball back with 4:21 left in the game after holding Florida to a five-play drive, but was unable to mount a second straight scoring drive, as a downfield interception slammed the door on the Knights' comeback effort.

**ORLANDO** – It came down to the last possession, but at the final whistle UCF came up a few plays short as the Knights fell to Cincinnati, 19-13, Saturday evening at FBC Mortgage Stadium. After the UCF defense forced a punt with 58 seconds remaining, the Black and Gold drove the ball down to the 25-yard line before a sack ended the game and gave the Bearcats the road win.

“I just told our team I was proud of our fight, they fought hard,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “The 10 penalties stand out, 75 yards. The two fumbles, especially early in the first drive, when we’re driving, and then obviously on the 10-yard line, we fumble again early on. That wasn’t good.”

“I thought our defense did a lot of good things. That’s a really good offense. Third downs, we didn’t do great, but everything else, I think they fought their guts out.”

After winning the previous two meetings, Cincinnati (4-2, 2-1 Big 12) knotted the all-time series at 5-5 as the teams have now met in each of the past 10 seasons. Entering Saturday’s game as the second-best offense in the Big 12 Conference, UCF’s (3-3, 1-2) defense held the Bearcats to the fewest points and fewest yards of the season, but costly penalties and turnovers were too much for the Knights to overcome.

In a matchup that pitted two of the nation’s top offenses, both teams were held to season lows in points and held well below their season averages in a stout defensive effort.

The Knights compiled 397 total yards with 201 passing and 196 rushing yards, while the Bearcats recorded 338 yards with 241 through the air and 97 on the ground. Defensively, UCF forced a pair of turnovers, as senior BJ Adams and Ladarius Tennison each recorded their first career interceptions.

Cincinnati struck first in the contest following a UCF turnover in its own territory, but the defense stood tall and forced a field goal after the Bearcats took over on the Knights four-yard line. UC ran three plays and only gained a yard before settling for the field goal to take a 3-0 lead. Following another miscue, Cincinnati extended its lead to 10-0 after a rushing touchdown from quarterback Brendan Sorsby. UCF countered with a strong drive, amassing 93 yards on 13 plays but the Knights were forced to kick the field goal.

Kobe Hudson knotted the score at 10-10 in the third quarter, after he reeled in a 15-yard pass from quarterback Jacurri Brown, his first TD pass as a Knight. Hudson finished the game with seven catches for 114 yards and a touchdown, as he tallied his 29th consecutive game with a reception to tie for the eighth-longest streak in program history.

Cincinnati tallied the next two scores to pull ahead 19-10 after a 51-yard field goal from Nathan Hawks and a four-yard touchdown reception by Tony Johnson with 6:32 left in the game. UCF answered with a nine-play, 65-yard scoring drive capped by a field goal from Grant Reddick to cut the deficit to six.

The Knights’ defense forced the Bearcats to punt after logging 12 yards on five plays. Following the punt, Brown found running back RJ Harvey and Hudson on back-to-back plays for 21 and 22 yards, respectively, to get the Black and Gold into plus territory.

Brown drove the Knights to the 25-yard line with three seconds left, but unfortunately, he was sacked on the final play of the game as Cincinnati held on for the win.

Harvey led the rushing attack with 17 carries for 94 yards, while Brown tallied 16 attempts for 84 yards. Brown finished the game 13-for-20 with 207 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, Sheldon Arnold, Xe’ree Alexander and Nyjalik Kelly each recorded seven tackles to tie for the game high. Jamaal Johnson recorded his first career sack and Isaiah Nixon notched his first solo sack.
