CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- Of the Big 12's 99 wins this season, 71% have been against Power Four teams. This is the highest mark of all FBS Conferences.
- 82% of Big 12 games have been against Power Four opponents, which is tied for most with Big Ten nationally.
- Nine Big 12 teams are now bowl-eligible with two more just one win away.
- Five Big 12 programs rank in the top 30 in Strength of Record in ESPN's FPI ratings with BYU (13), Arizona State (15) and Iowa State (17) all in the top 20.
- Both the Big 12's 27 fourth-quarter lead changes and its nine go-ahead scores in the final minute of games during conference play are the most in FBS.
- According to ESPN's FPI, eight Big 12 teams are in the nation's top 40 for overall efficiency, which ranks tied for second nationally

CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- The Sun Devils have increased their win total by six from last season, which is the largest single-season turnaround in program history.
- Shedeur Sanders is the only quarterback in FBS to rank in the top 10 nationally in completion percentage, passing yards and touchdowns entering Week 14.
- ISU wide out Jaylin Noel has caught a pass in 43 consecutive games, which is the second-longest streak in program history and the fourth-longest active streak in the nation.
- Texas Tech leads the nation with seven games featuring both a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver. No other program has more than four games of both instances.
- BYU's defense is among the nation's best at disrupting opposing quarterbacks with a Team Passing Defense Efficiency of 102.9, which is the fifth-best mark in FBS.
- Arizona State leads the FBS as the winningest team in one-score games in Power Four football with a perfect 5-0 record.
- Earlier this year, Colorado's Travis Hunter became the first player in Conference history to win an offensive and defensive weekly award. He has played nearly every snap on offense and defense with over 500 snaps on each side of the ball this season.
- The Big 12 Conference and Raycom Sports announced the launch of Big 12 Studios in September, a new programming and content venture designed to expand and enhance the league's storytelling efforts. Big 12 Studios will create and deliver original programming and content to fans as a FAST (Free Ad-Supported Television) channel across multiple major platforms, including planned launches on leading platforms early this Fall that will be announced soon, as well as major VOD platforms such as YouTube.
- The Conference partnered with TuneIn, the world's leader in live audio, to launch Big 12 Radio prior to week one. The new 24/7 Conference-branded audio station, is now streaming to fans across the United States. The station includes Big 12 weekday sports talk, extensive Saturday game-day coverage, Big 12 school content and music programming. Additionally, listeners can access a 'Game of The Week' featuring gameday coverage from their Big 12 school's local play-by-play broadcast team.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the 12 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through 12 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on Dec. 31, 2024, and January 1, 2025, while the semifinals will be January 9-10, 2025. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 20, 2025, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.
