GAME NOTES

NO. 15 SOFTBALL HEADS TO ORLANDO FOR TUESDAY MIDWEEK AGAINST UCF

- No. 15 ranked University of Missouri softball (4-1) continues its stay in the Sunshine State with a Tuesday evening midweek matchup against Central Florida (5-1) in Orlando.
- First pitch is set for 5 p.m., CT at the UCF Softball Complex. The game will be streamed on ESPN+ with Eric Lopez and Alex Powers on the call.
- Following the midweek against the Knights, Mizzou will compete in the Shriners Children's Clearwater Invitational Presented by EvoShield Thursday through Saturday, marking MU's second-straight Florida tournament to commence the 2025 campaign.
- Mizzou is ranked #15 in both the ESPN.com/USA Softball and the NFCA/GoRout Coaches Polls.

SERIES HISTORY

- Missouri leads the all-time series with UCF, 3-1.
- MU has won the last three meetings dating back to 2021, all three wins with Larissa Anderson leading the Tigers.
- MU beat the Knights, 5-1, at the 2024 Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic in Cathedral City, California, Feb. 23.
- Mizzou last faced UCF in Orlando in 2023, an 11-8 victory over then No. 20 UCF on Feb. 15.
- In 2021, Mizzou edged out UCF 6-5 in Orlando on Feb. 24.
- The only loss for Missouri in the series came in the first-ever meeting between the two teams, when the Knights took a 1-0 victory in 2015.
- The Tigers and Knights last faced off on Feb. 23, 2024, with MU prevailing 5-1.
- Laurin Krings pitched a complete game, allowing just one run on six hits with five strikeouts.
- Kara Daly opened the scoring with a two-run single in the first inning.
- Alex Honnold added an RBI double in the second.
- Missouri tacked on two more runs late, with Mya Dodge and Julia Crenshaw each recording RBI hits.

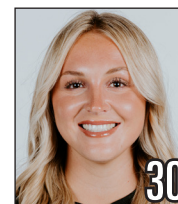

STEFANIA ABRUSCATO

- Sophomore Stefania Abruscato was named to the 2025 NFCA Division I Leadoff Classic All-Tournament Team after she paced Mizzou at the plate, batting .438 with four runs, two doubles, a homer and four RBI.
- She is currently on a five-game hitting streak to start the 2025 campaign.
- Abruscato notched an RBI single in Mizzou's top-25 win over No. 21/20 Northwestern.
- She then led the Tigers at the dish, going a career-best tying 3-for-4 with two runs and two RBI in MU's win over No. 7/8 Duke. She notched a double and a homer in the victory.

2025 NFCA DIVISION I LEADOFF CLASSIC

- Missouri went 4-1 over its season-opening NFCA Division I Leadoff Classic. The Tigers picked up top-25 wins over No. 20/21 Northwestern (3-0 win) and No. 7/8 Duke (10-3 win).
- Sophomore Abby Hay drove in a personal-best matching four runs on a career-best two doubles to propel Mizzou to the a 9-1 run-rule victory over Marshall.
- A solo home run in the bottom of the fifth by senior Julia Crenshaw sealed the run-rule victory. The catcher from O'Fallon, Missouri, finished 2-for-2 with three runs, two walks and an RBI as MU's leadoff hitter.
- Sophomore pitcher Marissa McCann (1-0) was credited with the complete-game win for the Tigers, pitching five innings only giving up one run on five hits with three strikeouts.
- Cierra Harrison tossed a three-hit complete-game shutout of No. 20/21 Northwestern (3-0 win). She threw a career-best 7.0 innings for the fourth time as a Tiger. Harrison notched six strikeouts while allowing just three hits and a walk.

- MU utilized a nine-run sixth inning to power its way past No. 7/8 Duke (10-3 win) for the Tigers' first top-10 win of the season. Madison Walker's two-run shot to left capped the inning as MU scored its highest run total of the campaign.
- Harrison picked up her second win in the circle (2-0 in 2025), going 5.0 innings, allowing three runs on nine

hits with a strikeout vs. Duke.

- Claire Cahalan knocked her second-straight triple in the win over Duke
- Taylor Pannell (1-1) earned her first win of the season, pitching the final two outs of the seventh against Iowa (3-2 win), allowing just a hit with a strikeout.
- Nathalie Touchet made her first appearance of the season against Iowa, pitching a career-high 2.1 innings in relief of McCann. Touchet, a sophomore from Aledo, Texas, notched her first career strikeout at Mizzou while allowing just two hits (one run, zero earned runs) and two walks.
- Hay has reached base safely in all five games this season while Cahalan has reached based in four-straight games.
- Both freshman Sophie Smith and Madison Uptegrove made their first career starts over the opening weekend in Clearwater and also notched their first career hits at Mizzou.

LARISSA ANDERSON

- Head coach Larissa Anderson picked up her 350th career win with a 10-3 victory over Duke on Feb. 8. Anderson was also inducted into the Gannon University (Erie, Pennsylvania) Athletics Hall of Fame that same day.
- She led the Tigers to a top-10 (#7) finish in 2024, an NCAA Super Regional appearance and the team's second Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship appearance in three seasons.
- Anderson is currently in her seventh season at Mizzou, holding a 221-116 record.
- Mizzou's 48 wins in 2024 are the most for Anderson at the helm of Missouri.
- She signed an extension with Mizzou through 2028 over the fall.

- Mizzou heads into the 2025 campaign, coming off an impressive 2024 that saw the Tigers earn a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the 17th consecutive year (27 total regional appearances). MU made its 10th Supers appearance in program history in 2024.
- The Tigers totaled 48 wins (48-14, 13-11 SEC) in 2024, their highest total in the program's SEC era and fourth most in program history. Missouri's 13 SEC wins in the 2024 campaign are the most since 15 in 2021.
- The Tigers return six starters from the 2024 NCAA Super Regional team including SEC All-Defensive right fielder Kayley Lenger, NFCA All-Region first baseman Abby Hay along with catcher Julia Crenshaw and third baseman Kara Daly.
- Mizzou added 10 newcomers including seven freshmen and three transfers for the 2025 season.
- Missouri also returns the 11th best team ERA (2.03) in 2024 led by starters Cierra Harrison and Marissa McCann along with NCAA saves leader Taylor Pannell.
- Missouri ranked fourth in the NCAA in 2024 with an average attendance of 2,784. In the postseason, MU had the highest home attendance of Regionals (10,016) and Super Regionals (11,608, MU record). Mizzou set single-game (4,021, vs. Duke, May 26, 2024) and single-series attendance records over the postseason weekends.

ABBY HAY

- Abby Hay returns for her sophomore campaign after picking up 2024 NFCA Southeast All-Region Second Team and 2024 All-SEC Second Team honors. In the 2025 preseason she was listed as one of the top first baseman in the country by D1Softball (Jan. 16).
- The Columbia, Missouri, native, appeared in 40 games in 2024 including 33 starts at first base.
- She was third on Mizzou, batting .306 with 30 hits, 16 runs, four doubles, and a triple, five homers and 23 RBI. Hay also slugged .520 (.419 on-base percentage) in her debut season.
- She paced the Tigers in SEC play, batting .318 with 14 hits, nine RBI, six

runs and three home runs for her first career All-SEC Team honors. Hay also slugged .591 (.423 on-base percentage).

KAYLEY LENDER

- Kayley Lenger returns for her junior season after earning 2024 SEC All-Defensive Team honors for her standout play in right field
- Lenger appeared in 62 games with 59 starts in right during the 2024 campaign.
- The outfielder posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage in SEC play, recording 45 putouts with zero errors, and compiled an overall fielding percentage of .982.
- At the plate, Lenger hit .258 with 33 hits, 31 runs, five doubles, two home runs and 12 RBI, finishing the season with a .344 slugging percentage.
- She led the SEC with 22 hit-by-pitches (third in the NCAA), while also drawing 18 walks and maintaining a .435 on-base percentage.

TAYLOR PANNELL

- Taylor Pannell returns for her junior season coming off a record-breaking 2024 campaign. The left-hander appeared in 30 games as Mizzou's primary closer, securing 15 saves, which matched the NCAA single-season record alongside FGCU's Taylor Bauman (2018, 36 games) and Canisius' Mallory Aldred (2008, 41 games).
- With her 2024 performance, Pannell became Missouri's all-time saves leader (15), surpassing Kacey Marshall's 1994 record (12), and also set the SEC single-season saves record (14), previously held by Mississippi State's Kellie Wilkerson (2002).
- She leads all active NCAA pitchers in career saves (21), with 15 in 2024 and six in 2023.
- Pannell also compiled a 4-1 record over 34.2 innings pitched, posting a 1.21 ERA while striking out 35 batters and holding opponents to a .185 batting average.

MARISSA MCCANN

• Marissa McCann recorded an 8-4 record with a 1.87 ERA over 82.1 innings as a freshman in 2024. She also notched a trio of saves.
• The Surprise, Arizona, native, compiled 51 strikeouts and limited opposing batters to a .185 batting average over her debut collegiate season.
• McCann was tabbed the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week (3/26), going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA over her two appearances against No. 2/3 LSU (3/22-24). She pitched 6.2 innings, allowing just four hits and no runs.

JULIA CRENSHAW

• After coming to Mizzou as a highly touted infielder, senior Julia Crenshaw has emerged as MU's starting catcher.
• She made 63 starts at catcher in 2024 as a junior after making the position shift in 2023.
• In 2024, the O'Fallon, Missouri, native, notched 37 hits, 30 runs, nine doubles, three home runs and 29 RBI. She also slugged .307 (.291 on-base percentage).

KARA DALY

• Since her arrival in Columbia, senior Kara Daly has started in all but five games at third base for the Tigers.
• Daly compiled 20 runs, 38 hits, eight doubles, seven homers, and a triple with 32 RBI in 2024. She notched a .375 slugging percentage.

CIERRA HARRISON

• Cierra Harrison returns for her third season in the circle donning the Black & Gold.
• The Lee's Summit, Missouri, righthander, was listed as No. 87 in Softball America's Preseason Top 100 player list on Jan. 6, 2025, and one of the top pitchers in the country by D1Softball (Jan. 16).
• Harrison compiled a 14-3 record over 2024 with a 2.05 ERA over 106.0 innings with 87 strikeouts. She posted four complete games and three shut-

outs with a save.

• Harrison tallied her first career no-hitter against Texas A&M-Commerce (Feb. 16), finishing with eight strikeouts. She also threw a complete-game shutout against Auburn (March 9), racking up nine strikeouts.
• In two seasons for Mizzou, Harrison has totaled a 22-5 record with six complete games and four shutouts.

TRANSFERS

• Mizzou added a trio of transfers in 2025 with infielder Taylor Ebbs, outfielder Haidyn Sokoloski and pitcher Courtney Donahue.

TAYLOR EBBS

• No stranger to the SEC, Taylor Ebbs came to Mizzou after spending the past three seasons at Kentucky.
• The Keizer, Oregon, native, hit a career best .311 (.364 on-base percentage, .656 slugging percentage) over 39 games in 2024 with 31 RBI. Ebbs made 27 starts and tallied eight multi-hit games.
• Over her collegiate career with the Wildcats, she appeared in 146 games (119 starts), batting .272 with 90 hits, 54 runs, 19 doubles, 25 home runs and 85 RBI. Ebbs brings a left, power bat to the 2025 lineup.

HAIDYN SOKOLOSKI

• Haidyn Sokoloski transferred to Mizzou after making back-to-back NCAA Women's College World Series appearances with Oklahoma State.
• The Flower Mound, Texas, native slashed a career-best .333/.367/.593 over her sophomore campaign with the Cowgirls. She totaled nine hits, 10 runs, nine RBI, two doubles, one triple and a homer in 2024.
• Sokoloski appeared in 69 games with eight starts over two seasons in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

COURTNEY DONAHUE

- Courtney Donahue was named the 2024 TUCCI/NFCA NJCAA DII Pitcher of the Year.
- The Dane, Wisconsin, native, struck out 386 batters in 2024, 103 more than the next pitcher in NJCAA DII and posted a 26-4 record with a 0.94 ERA in 186.2 innings of work as a sophomore at Des Moines Area Community College.
- She also topped the Division in shutouts (12), strikeouts per seven innings (14.48), complete games (25) and WHIP (0.56), while she ranked third in victories (tie) and ERA and fifth in batting average against (.115).

FRESHMEN

- Missouri signed freshmen Abbie Wilhelm (infielder), Jordyn Thurman (outfielder), Saniya Hill (third base/utility), Kadence Shepherd (infielder), Madison Uptergrove (infielder), Nevaeh Watkins (outfielder) and Sophie Smith (infielder) ahead of the 2025 season.
- Madison Uptergrove and Saniya Hill were both featured on the D100 Freshman Watch List, D1Softball announced Jan. 8. Uptergrove, Hill and Watkins were also named to Softball America's Freshman Watch List (Jan. 14).

1500 PROGRAM WINS

- Mizzou picked up its 1,500-win in program history in game one against Omaha on May 19 to become the 15th program in NCAA history to reach the milestone and second SEC school [Texas A&M, 1894-829-2].
- Missouri is 1502-818 in program history.
- Mizzou's 48 wins in 2024 ranks tied for fourth in program history and are its highest total in the program's SEC era.

2024 NCAA COLUMBIA REGIONAL

- After dropping its 2024 NCAA Columbia Regional opener, Mizzou reeled off four-straight elimination game victories to claim the Championship.
- The Tigers became just the 11th team in NCAA history to advance out of their Regional after dropping their first game, coming back from a 3-1 extra-inning setback to Omaha on May 18.
- Mizzou eliminated Indiana with a 5-1 win to commence Day 2 of the Regional on May 19. The Tigers tallied two runs in the top of the first and never gave their lead back.
- Home runs from Abby Hay in the second and Jenna Laird in the third carried the Tigers in their second victory of the day, 4-1, over No. 13/15 Washington.
- Trailing Omaha, 1-0, in the Regional Finals opener on May 19, Jenna Laird notched an RBI groundout to even the game and start a five-run seventh.
- Alex Honnold added a two-run homer before Julia Crenshaw singled through the left side to complete the comeback, 5-1.
- In the Regional Finals Championship game, Madison Walker broke a scoreless tie in the ninth with an RBI single for the walk-off win to propel Mizzou into the Super Regional.
- Jenna Laird led Mizzou over the Regional, batting .412 with her first homer of the season and first since April 29, 2022. She also had a .647 slugging percentage and two RBI.



- Abby Hay and Alex Honnold (two RBI, .529 slugging percentage) each finished the Regional, batting .353. Hay, a freshman from Columbia, Missouri, knocked a double and a homer for four RBI with a .588 slugging percentage.

2024 NCAA COLUMBIA SUPER REGIONAL

- Mizzou dropped its 2024 NCAA Columbia Super Regional opener to Duke, 6-3, on May 24 before forcing a winner-take-all game three with a 3-1 victory on May 25.
- Taylor Pannell worked out of a bases-loaded jam in the sixth and retired Duke in order in the seventh to tie the NCAA single-season record with her 15th save of the campaign.
- The Tigers broke open an early pitcher's duel with three runs in the top of the fourth inning. Abby Hay knocked a single to right which scored Alex Honnold from second. Maddie Gallagher took third and then scored on a throwing error with Hay ending up on third. Julia Crenshaw's groundout scored Hay and increased the Tigers lead to 3-0.
- Senior Laurin Krings picked up the win, her career-best 17th of the campaign.
- In game three on May 26, the No. 7 Tigers (48-18) extra-inning rally fell short in a 4-3 loss to No. 10 Duke (52-7).
- Trailing Duke 4-0 in the bottom of the ninth inning, Mizzou clawed back behind Abby Hay's three-run opposite-field home run to right.

2024 SEC TOURNAMENT

- Mizzou went 3-1 at the 2024 SEC Tournament, advancing to the Championship Final.
- The Tigers opened their stay at Auburn, Alabama, with a 3-1 win over Ole Miss on May 8. Laurin Krings was efficient in the circle, allowing just one earned run on three hits to go with a walk on 79 pitches.
- Leadoff batter Jenna Laird paced the Tigers at the dish, going 2-for-3 with a run, a walk, and a stolen base against Ole Miss.
- Alex Honnold notched a two-run double to right center before an RBI base hit from Abby Hay. The double marked Honnold's 21st of the season as she continues to improve on the Mizzou single-season record.
- Mizzou secured a spot in the 2024 SEC Tournament Semifinals May 10, edging fourth seeded No. 16/13 Arkansas, 3-1.
- Jenna Laird paced Mizzou at the plate with a 2-for-4 outing with two runs, a double and an RBI.
- Cierra Harrison pitched five innings for the win, allowing just one earned run on four hits with a pair of strikeouts. She improved to 14-3 in 2024.
- Harrison was relieved for Marissa McCann in the bottom of the sixth with two on and no outs. After letting up a single to load the bases, McCann retired the Razorbacks with an infield fly before consecutive strikeouts to deny the threat.

**LARISSA ANDERSON****HEAD COACH****Seventh Season
Gannon, '97**

A new era in Mizzou Softball began in the Summer of 2018, as Larissa Anderson was named the 10th head coach to lead the tradition-rich Tiger program on Saturday, May 26, 2018.

As Anderson enters year seven in Mid-Missouri that new era has already gotten off to a successful start, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why. Anderson has led Mizzou to a 217-115 record over her six seasons and owns a career record of 350-189-1 as a head coach.

In her time at the helm of the Tigers, Anderson has steered Missouri to five NCAA Regional appearances and a pair of Super Regionals. She has led the Tigers to 35 or more wins each season at Mizzou — in all but the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season.

Missouri most recently hosted a Regional and Super Regional in 2024 after home postseason runs in 2021 (Regional and Super Regional) and 2022 (Regional).

Anderson finished her first season in the Black & Gold with a 35-25 record, the most wins for the Tigers in a single season since 2016, when they won 42 games. Anderson's squad was also stellar in her first season as part of the always elite Southeastern Conference, as the Tigers' 12 wins during SEC play, which resulted in a tie for fourth place, were the most conference victories for Mizzou since 2016. The season ended with the Tigers' 13th straight regional appearance, as Anderson's Tigers earned a spot in the Los Angeles Regional, where they went 3-2, pushing host No. 2 UCLA to a winner-take-all game seven.

Her biggest test would come during the 2020 season. With Mizzou Softball's postseason ban being upheld three months prior to the season, Anderson's steady leadership guided the Tigers through what would be a turbulent year. Despite the postseason ban, Mizzou lost zero players to transfer, and entered the season with its roster intact.

Mizzou's postseason ban would prove to be only a minor blip in a season that was ultimately canceled after 26 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Tigers made the most of those 26 games, finishing with a 19-7 record, and being one of only two teams to be undefeated in SEC play. Mizzou ended the season ranked 25th in the NFCA Coaches' Poll — its first time finishing the season ranked since 2016 — while Cayla Kessinger was named to Softball America's All-America team.

Anderson returned Mizzou Softball to the national stage in 2021. With an experienced roster but a young pitching staff, she led the Tigers to a 42-17 record and a Super Regional appearance. Mizzou hosted an NCAA Regional and Super Regional for the first time since 2013. The 2021 team finished among the program's best statistically in fielding percentage (1st), home runs (1st), RBI (2nd), doubles (T-6th), and runs scored (3rd).

In the postseason, Mizzou pitching led the nation in ERA at 1.37 over six games. Two Tiger pitchers, Jordan Weber and Laurin Krings combined to allow only two hits and no runs over three games at the Columbia Regional. Freshman shortstop Jenna Laird earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors while senior outfielder Brooke Wilmes was recognized as an NFCA Third Team All-American. Anderson led the Tigers to a No. 13 final ranking in the NFCA Coaches' Poll and a No. 14

ranking in the USA Softball poll, the program's highest final rankings since 2015.

Mizzou's memorable 2022 season saw them host an NCAA Regional for the second-consecutive year and made the Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship game for the second time in program history. The Tigers notched a 38-22 mark and went 12-11 during SEC play. Mizzou's pitching staff posted a 2.81 ERA including a 1.00 ERA in the postseason.

In the inaugural year of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, presented by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, Jenna Laird and Casidy Chaumont earned the award at shortstop and left field, respectively.

Laird, a 2022 Softball All-SEC Second Team player, finished the year with a .975 fielding percentage, while turning 10 double plays and did not make an error during SEC play.

Chaumont, an All-SEC Defensive Team Selection, has appeared on SportsCenter's Top Ten Plays four times over her career at Mizzou. After beginning her career as an infielder at Louisiana, she converted to the outfield at the start of the 2021 season and finished with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Chaumont has thrown out five runners on the basepaths from left field over her two seasons in the Black and Gold.

Kimberly Wert and Brooke Wilmes were each named First Team All-SEC performers in 2022. Jordan Weber, Jenna Laird, Wert and Wilmes were each tabbed to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Southeast All-Region team. Weber led the Tigers to the SEC Tournament final with a pair of shutouts against No. 17/20 Auburn and No. 13/10 Tennessee. She became the first Mizzou pitcher to record three wins in a single SEC series when she earned the victory in all three games against Kentucky.

Mizzou is coming off a 2023 season that saw the Tigers reach a 16th straight NCAA Regional, finishing the season with a 35-26 record and going 7-17 against SEC foes. The pitching staff proved efficient yet again, registering a cumulative ERA of 3.33, including a strikeout/walk ratio of 2.66.

Alex Honnold became the 26th All-American in program history (31 total All-American honors) after earning Second-Team honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

A Top 25 Finalist for 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, Honnold led Mizzou and ranked top six in the SEC for on-base percentage (.539), slugging percentage (.779), runs (52), batting average (.396), and triples (three). Her slugging percentage in 2023 ranked fourth all-time in program history. Honnold also earned NFCA Southeast All-Region honors and was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

Jenna Laird joined Honnold in representing the Tigers on the All-SEC Team, her sixth postseason honor at Mizzou and third-straight appearance on the All-SEC Team. The leadoff hitter paced the Tigers in SEC play with a .291 batting average to go with 14 runs, three doubles, five RBI, .371 on-base percentage, and a .329 slugging percentage.

In 2024, Anderson led the Tigers to a top-10 finish, an NCAA Super Regional appearance and the team's second Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship appearance in three seasons. The Tigers totaled 48 wins, their highest total in the program's SEC era and fourth-most in program history.

A trio of Tigers earned National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Region while 13 student-athletes secured Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete honors for earning a 3.5 GPA and above.



Freshman Abby Hay was listed on the NFCA Southeast Second Team All-Region, while seniors Laurin Krings and Alex Honnold were tabbed to the Southeast Third Team All-Region.

Jenna Laird, Honnold and Hay were also named to the All-SEC Second Team while Krings (pitcher) and right fielder Kayley Lenger nabbed spots on the SEC All-Defensive Team.

Anderson joined Mizzou after a 17-year run at Hofstra, the final four as the head coach.

In four seasons at Hofstra, Anderson fashioned a 130-73-1 (.640) record with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, two Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles and four winning seasons. She picked up her 100th career win with the Pride's 7-2 win over Boston University, March 17, 2018, and posted seven career wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including three in 2018—a 1-0 victory over then-No. 13 Florida State on March 2 and a pair at No. 22 James Madison to claim the CAA Tournament crown.

The 2018 campaign was a historic one for Hofstra Softball, as Anderson led the 24th-ranked Pride to a 41-14 record, the CAA Tournament title and the NCAA Columbia Regional. Hofstra earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by defeating CAA regular-season champion and 22nd-ranked James Madison, 7-4, to claim its 12th CAA title in the sport since joining the league in 2002 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015.

Anderson's 2018 squad reached the 40-win mark for the 11th time in program history (and first since a school-record 46 wins in 2013), while setting school records for runs scored (334), home runs (70) and RBI (315). Hofstra owned an RPI of 19 against the nation's 29th-toughest schedule in 2018. Hofstra also garnered a league-high eight CAA postseason honors headlined by Sarah Cornell's selection as the CAA Pitcher of the Year—the Pride's 10th such honor all-time and first since 2013, all of which were tutored by Anderson.

In 2017, Hofstra returned to the CAA championship game, as the program registered its 28th-straight winning season (27-23) and earned the No. 2 seed in the CAA Tournament. Anderson picked up her first win over a Top 10 opponent as head coach with a 5-2 victory over No. 10 James Madison. Under Anderson's direction, Cornell was named first-team NFCA All-Northeast Region as a rookie, while also earning a spot on the All-CAA second team and All-Rookie team.

The Pride posted another winning record in her second season (24-22) and had six student-athletes earn CAA postseason honors and two garner NFCA All-Northeast Region recognition.

In her first season as the storied program's head coach in 2015, Anderson led Hofstra to the CAA championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, guiding Hofstra to a 38-14-1 record and a spot in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Anderson and her assistants were named the NFCA Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year after Hofstra posted a collective 2.05 ERA, smashed 56 home runs and outscored opponents, 277-129.

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head coach. In 17 seasons at Hofstra, she helped the Pride to a 610-267-2 (.695) record. Before taking over as head coach from Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, Anderson spent 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach, helping the program to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 CAA titles. As associate head coach, she helped

Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Under Anderson's guidance, Hofstra hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09. Galati was twice named an All-America by the NFCA and was the program's first-ever first-team pick in 2012 after leading Division I with a 0.95 ERA and a 34-7 record. Anderson helped guide Galati to a NCAA-best 40 wins and 22 shutouts in 2013.

A hallmark of the Hofstra Softball program during Anderson's tenure was the Pride's stellar defense. From 2008-13, Hofstra consistently ranked among the nation's elite in fielding percentage as the Pride was among the Top 20 nationally in five of those seasons. Hofstra ranked first in Division I in fielding percentage during the 2011 season and was fourth in 2008 and 2010, and 16th in 2012 and 2013. Her 2018 team currently ranks sixth nationally with an .979 mark.

An active NFCA member, she chaired its Ethics Committee from 2009-13, and previously served as the fourth Vice President on the NFCA executive board and as a member of the NFCA Recruiting Committee and the NFCA Hall of Fame Committee. Anderson is currently the Vice President of the Awards Committee. She was elected NFCA President on Oct. 25, 2022, and was one of eight members who were voted to the NFCA's Board of Directors for 2023. Anderson officially began her three-year term on January 1, 2023.

Prior to joining the Hofstra staff, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school-record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and was in charge of coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th-best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a C.W. Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson spent one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

She is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages the St. Louis Cardinals' Class AA affiliate in Springfield, Missouri. Prior to his elevation in 2025, Patrick Anderson spent three seasons as the head coach in Peoria, Illinois, with the Cardinals' Class A affiliate.

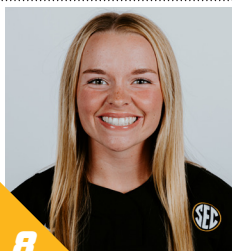

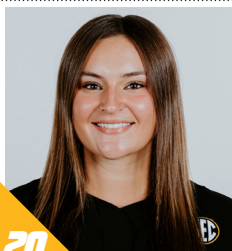

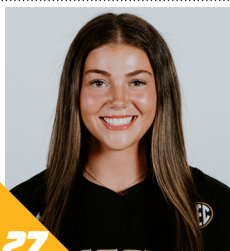
