- The Miami Hurricanes will face the UCF Knights for their fifth midweek game of the season. So far this season, Miami holds a 3-1 record in midweek contests.
- · Despite losing their last series to UConn at Mark Light Field, the Hurricanes managed a 15-11 win on Sunday.
- In Sunday's contest against Villanova, Jake Ogden led the charge for Miami, going 3-for-5 with a home run and five RBI tying his single-game career high.
- · Right-handed pitcher Will Smith (1-0) earned the win for Miami despite allowing three runs in two innings of relief.
- · Miami's pitchers have combined for 188 strikeouts, a figure that ranks tenth nationally and third in the ACC.
- This will be Miami's final game before moving on to conference play. The Hurricanes will travel to Winston-Salem, N.C. for a three-game series against Wake Forest March 14-16.
- Miami welcome 28 newcomers to the squad. 14 freshmen, 13 transfers and 1 JUCO transfer will don the orange and green.

THE HURRICANES' SKIPPER

UM Sports Hall of Fame Class of '07 No. 33 retired in '03 Winningest pitcher in program history (43)



J.D. Arteaga became the 10th head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2024 season.

Arteaga previously served as associate head coach in charge of pitching. Overall, 2025 will mark Arteaga's 23rd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff.

For four straight years, the Hurricanes' longtime pitching guru groomed an All-American hurler. Right-hander Andrew Walters cemented himself as one of the most dominant closers in college baseball, after earning a spot as a finalist for the prestigious NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award the season prior. The unanimous All-America honoree headlined a Miami staff which featured four draft picks in the 2022 Major League Baseball First-Year Plaver Draft.

Southpaw Carson Palmquist led the class as a third-round choice by the Colorado Rockies, while righty Alex McFarlane followed shortly as a fourth-round selection by the Philadelphia Phillies.

Arteaga developed another All-American in 2021, as Palmquist was a consensus All-America pick and earned first-team honors by the NCBWA and Perfect Game. The lefty headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team nod while also earning a place on the ACC All-Freshman Team.

Palmquist and right-hander Alejandro Rosario each were named Freshman All-Americans, while righthander Jake Smith was selected in the sixth round of the MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken by the Arizona Diamondbacks with the 33rd overall pick in the 2020 MLB Draft, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft.

McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round of the MLB Draft to the Colorado Rockies. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively, and giving Miami four pitchers joining the

The 2019 season featured the emergence of redshirt junior Brian Van Belle as a standout starter for the Canes. The right-hander earned All-ACC Second Team honors and was named to the All-Starkville Regional team to cap a season in which Van Belle led the Hurricanes in wins (10), innings pitched (95.1) and had the lowest ERA among starting pitchers (3.30). Right-hander Slade Cecconi earned Freshman All-America honors, while Evan McKendry (9th round, Rays) and Gregory Veliz (15th round, Angels) headlined four pitchers selected in the MLB draft.

In 2018, Arteaga guided right-hander Evan McKendry to a breakout season on the mound, where he led the Hurricanes staff in wins (seven) and strikeouts (114), as well as compiled a 3.52 ERA – second-best among weekend starters – while earning Third-Team All-ACC honors. Fellow right-hander Daniel Federman earned Freshman All-America honors, while four Miami pitchers were selected in the MLB Draft.

Jeb Bargfeldt, Miami's ace in 2017, was named to the All-ACC Second Team in his first season working under Arteaga. The left-hander finished the season 7-3 with a 2.28 ERA over 87 innings.

Arteaga, a standout southpaw during his own four years in the Miami rotation, helped guide the Hurricanes to their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under his direction as pitching coach in 2016, closer Bryan Garcia set the all-time saves record at Miami and became the first Hurricane to win NCBWA Stopper of the Year honors as the nation's top relief pitcher.

Garcia (sixth round, Detroit) and left-hander Danny Garcia (14th round, Seattle) were both selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. At least one Hurricane pitcher has been selected in the MLB Draft each year since 2004.

Arteaga recently coached left-hander Chris Diaz to ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year honors in 2014. Under his guidance, all four of Miami's starting pitchers in 2014 – Diaz, Bryan Radziewski, Javi Salas and Andy Suarez – were all drafted in the top 10 rounds of the 2014 MLB Draft.

Suarez, who elected to return to school and served as the staff ace on a 2015 team that qualified for the College World Series, was drafted in the second round (No. 67) overall by San Francisco in the 2015 MLB Draft.

Arteaga helped lead Radziewski to Rawlings All-America honors in 2013 – the first for a UM player since 2010. Two of the team's weekend starters, Radziewski and Diaz, ranked among the top three in ERA for all Atlantic Coast Conference pitchers in 2013.

Arteaga has tutored three recent first-round draft picks in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft – Carlos Gutierrez in 2008, Chris Perez in 2006 and Cesar Carrillo in 2005. Gutierrez was the 27th overall pick in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Twins after earning second team All-ACC honors. Perez, who came to Miami as a starting prospect, was aided by Arteaga in his transition to becoming one of the country's top closers. Carrillo started his career 24-0 as a Hurricane.

In addition to his work in converting Perez from a starter to a closer, he helped Kyle Bellamy in his transition from a traditional over-the-top throwing motion to a sidewinding delivery. The move had great rewards, as Bellamy recorded 16 saves and finished the 2009 season with a 0.97 ERA en route to numerous first team All-America honors.

Arteaga's 2008 staff boasted National Freshman Pitcher of the Year and Roger Clemens Award finalist Chri







Hernandez, who finished 11-0 with a 2.72 ERA while opponents hit just .223 against him. All three starters in 2008, Hernandez, sophomore lefty Eric Erickson and senior righthander Enrique Garcia combined to go 27-4 while the entire pitching staff combined for the fewest walks (187) in school history and eighth-most strikeouts (554).

His 2006 staff, composed almost entirely of first-time starters, recorded five shutouts, the most by a UM staff since the 1998 season. Miami also recorded the team's first postseason shutout on the road since 1976 with a 7-0 win against Ole Miss in the 2006 Oxford Super Regional.

Four pitchers from Arteaga's 2005 pitching staff signed pro contracts following the season, including the school's first pitcher drafted in the first round since the 1991 season, Carrillo. Arteaga also played a major role in Carrillo's career development and run at the NCAA record books. Carrillo, who was the 18th overall pick in the 2005 draft, ended with a career record of 25-3, was an All-American and a finalist for the Dick Howser Trophy and the Roger Clemens Award as college baseball's best pitcher in 2005.

The 2004 Miami pitching staff produced the best team ERA in (3.73) since the 2000 season (3.72).

Head coach Jim Morris named Arteaga the Hurricanes' next pitching coach on March 4, 2003, nine games deep into the season. Arteaga's style and approach to pitching was vital in J.D. Cockroft's development into the ace on Miami's 2003 club. Cockroft, a crafty left-hander, went 11–3 with a 2.72 ERA in a team-high 119 innings, including three complete games and one shutout.

Arteaga played for the Hurricanes from 1994-1997, helping UM reach the College World Series four straight seasons. He left Miami as the program's all-time wins leader with 43 and the all-time starts leader with 72. Arteaga ranks second for innings pitched in a career with 458.1.

He is also fifth on the all-time strikeouts chart with 343 career punchouts

Arteaga threw three complete games at UM and struck out career-high 11 batters on two different occasions (FSU, 4/16/95 and George Washington, 2/16/96). He posted an 11-3 record as a sophomore in 1995 and a 9-1 mark as a freshman.

Miami retired Arteaga's No. 33 on Feb. 5, 2003, prior to the season opener with Florida International. A 26th round draft choice by the New York Mets, Arteaga spent six seasons in the Mets' and Houston Astros' organizations. He had signed on with the Texas Rangers' organization in the spring of 2003, prior to accepting his post with the Hurricanes. He spent his last professional season with the Astros' Triple-A franchise New Orleans Zephyrs, compiling a 9-10 record with a 4.29 ERA in 15 starts and 42 appearances.

The left-hander came to the Hurricanes out of Westminster Christian in Miami. He won a career-best 12 games as a junior in 1996 (12-1) and came back to go 11-4 as a senior in 1997.

After six seasons in professional baseball, Arteaga earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Miami.

He is married to the former Ysha Schettini and the couple has a daughter, Ariana. The Arteagas' son, Ari, passed away in 2018 at the age of 16. The Ari Arteaga Foundation was founded shortly afterward to honor and memorialize Ari. Its mission is to spread Ari's spirit by helping children and families overcome obstacles they may face due to unforeseen hardships. The goal is to shine Ari's light on their path of need.

- The University of Miami baseball team (12-5) won the series finale over UConn Sunday, 15-11, at Mark Light Field.
- Jake Ogden led the charge for Miami, going 3-for-5 with a home run and five RBI — tying his single-game career high.
- Right-handed pitcher Will Smith (1-0) earned the win for Miami despite allowing three runs in two innings of relief.
 Brian Walters started the game, giving up five runs over 4.1 innings. Jackson Cleveland closed out the game, striking out three in 1.2 innings.
- Despite UConn fighting back with five combined runs in the fifth and sixth innings, Miami matched their energy with five runs of their own, including a two-run home run by Jake Ogden that moved the score to 13-7.

- Max Galvin, Bobby Marsh, Jake Ogden, Dorian Gonzalez
 Jr. and Daniel Cuvet have led the Hurricanes to early
 offensive success as the Miami sluggers are responsible
 for 94 RBI and counting this season.
- Bobby Marsh, who ranks at second in the ACC in RBI (24), has six multple RBI games and four where he's tallied four RBI a piece. Ogden is right behind him with five multple RBI games.
- Ogden is the lone leader for the Hurricanes in five major offensive categories — batting average (.424 (15+ AB)), runs (21), hits (28), total bases (41) and SLG% (.621 (15+AB))
- Daniel Cuvet leads the Miami roster with four home runs while Ogden, Galvin and Marsh are right behind him with three dingers a piece.

IF YOU BLINKED, IT'S ALREADY TOO LATE

- Led by RHPs Nick Robert, Griffin Hugus and Brian Walters, the Miami pitchers have shutdown the opposition with ease.
- The Miami pitching attack ranks fourth in the conference and 18th nationally when it comes to opponent batting average (.206) and ranks fourth in the ACC and tenth nationally in strikeouts (188).
- **Griffin Hugus**, who was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week in the first week of the season, is ranked sixth amongst ACC pitchers in total strikeouts (33).
- Newcomers Alex Giroux and Reese Lumpkin both earned new strikeout career highs during their first wins as Hurricanes. Giroux fanned five Princeton Tigers in his last outing while Lumpkin struckout nine last against FGCU, throwing 95 pitches in his most recent appearance.

THE RETURN OF DANNY DINGERS

- After a historic freshman season, Daniel Cuvet returns to Coral Gables for his sophomore campaign.
- Ranked number one on D1Baseball's list of the nation's best third basemen, the Miami slugger led the 2024 Hurricanes squad in home runs (24), RBIs (75) and batting average (.351)
- · Cuvet also shattered a 28-year-old freshman home run record. Previously held by Pat Burrell, Cuvet tallied his 24th home run against Duke in the ACC Tournament semifinal round — also tying him for the second-most home runs in a season in team history with Alex Toral (2019) and **Yonder Alonso** (2008)
- · Not only did Cuvet, who's known around the dugout as "Cuvie", crack Miami records, but he also led all Division I freshman nationally in RBIs (75) — one shy of tying Miami great and big leaguer Ryan Braun's freshman singleseason record.
- · The runs kept piling on for Cuvet in different spurts throughout the 2024 season as #14 slugged two home runs in a single game on four seperate occasions, and tallied five RBIs thrice against NJIT, Lousiville and BYU
- · The Fort Lauderdale, Fla. native found himself on D1Baseball's and Perfect Game's First Team All-American list; as well as being named to Perfect Game's Preseason **AII-ACC Team**
- Cuvet carried his fantastic freshman outing into summer ball, where he traded orange and green for purple and blue — joining the Brewster Whitecaps for the Cape Cod summer league. Cuvet ended the summer league tied for fifth overall in home runs (6), tenth in batting average (.314) and 13th in RBIs (20)

CUVET LANDS ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Infielder Daniel Cuvet was among the 55 players named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list, as announced by USA Baseball.
- Miami has had 17 different players named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list since 2008.
- Chris Hernandez (2009-10), Zack Collins (2015-16) and Adrian Del Castillo (2020-21) each were two-time selections, while Yonder Alonso (2008), Jemile Weeks (2008), Ryan Jackson (2009), Yasmani Grandal (2010), Harold Martinez (2011), Peter O'Brien (2012), Andrew **Suarez** (2015), **Carl Chester** (2017), **Chris McMahon** (2020) and Alex Toral (2021), Carson Palmquist (2022), Yohandy Morales (2023), and Gage Ziehl (2024) preeceded Cuvet as preseason honorees.
- University of Miami Sports Hall of Famer Pat Burrell is the lone Hurricane to ever win the Golden Spikes Award, claiming the prestigious honor in 1998.

- Following its debut last year, Spring Breakout returns in 2025 with 16 matchups on March 13-16. The four-day event showcases the future of baseball with games between the best prospects in each farm system across Grapefruit and Cactus League ballparks.
- C.J. Kayfus (Guardians), Carson Palmquist (Rockies), Anthony Vilar (Padres), Zach Levenson (Cardinals), Yohandy Morales (Nationals), Maxwell Romero Jr. (Nationals), Gage Ziehl (Yankees) and Alex McFarlane (Phillies) will represent their organizations in this seasons MLB/MILB Spring Breakout.
- · Miami's eigth is tied with LSU and Florida State for the third most prospects. Arkansas leads the pack with ten.

NEW CANES ON THE BLOCK

- · With almost a brand new roster, the Miami Hurricanes have the highest turnover rate and number of transfer portal players in the country.
- Jake Ogden from UNC Greensoboro and Max Galvin from Oklahoma State pose as key newcomers for the Hurricanes
- · Ogden, originally from Homestead, Fla., was the only UNC Greensboro Spartan to start in all 54 games, ranking third on the squad with 10 doubles and eigth home runs. Ogden ended his sophomore season with a .313 batting average and a stellar 94% fielding percentage.
- Outfielder Max Galvin, who spent his first two years at Miami-Dade College, posted a .400/.469/.591 slash line for the Sharks in 2023.
- · Galvin's summer in the Northwoods League showed no signs of rust after redshirtng the 2024 season at Oklahoma State. Miami's new outfielder tallied 14 multihit games, ending with a .344 batting average which ranked eighth out of the entire summer league.
- On the bump, Cincinnati transfer Griffin Hugus and freshman Lazaro Collera, who hails from Westminster Christian in Miami, will be looking to turn some heads with their skillset.
- · Hugus has showed impressive poise during the Hurricanes' fall and spring sessions. The right hander, in his freshman year for Cincinnati, was name to the AAC All-Freshman Team as a two-way player.
- Collera, a Miami native, was ranked the second-best right handed pitcher in the state of Florida and 14th nationally by Perfect Game. He also checks in at #51 in Perfect Game's list of the nation's top 100 freshmen.
- Standing at 6-6 230, his fastball velocity topped out at an impressive 98 mph at the 2023 PG High School Showcase.

O CAPTAIN! MY CAPTAIN!

 The University of Miami players and coaches combined to select right-handed pitcher Brian Walters and infielder Dorian Gonzalez Jr. as 2025 team captains. This marks the second consecutive season where Gonzalez Jr. has earned the title.

THE DESTINATION IS THE SAME: OMAHA

- Miami made its second straight trip to the **College World Series in 2016**, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.
- Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the secondmost of any program in the country. The Hurricanes have won 48 games in the College World Series, the fourthmost of any program; Miami's four national championships rank fifth most.
- Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight in eight seasons: 1999** (#1), **2001** (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5), **2016** (#3) and **2022** (#6).

MIAMI IS #MLBU

- **Forty-four** Hurricanes have appeared in the MLB since 2000, the most among all ACC programs.
- No school in the ACC has had **more players drafted than Miami**, which has seen **318** players picked into the professional ranks including five in 2024.
- Since 1991, UM has produced **213 draft picks** 25 more than the next-highest ACC total (187, Clemson).
- With 15 players taken in 1996, Miami has the **most** players selected in a single draft by any ACC school. (#1), 2015 (#5), 2016 (#3) and 2022 (#6).

NEW ONE-AND-DONE ACC TOURNAMENT

On February 2, the Atlantic Coast Conference announced a new design to the baseball conference tournament with the additions of California, SMU, and Stanford.

All 16 teams will compete in a single-elimination tournament, where seedings will be based on regular season standings.

The top four seeds will receive double-byes into the quarterfinal, seeds five through eight will earn a bye into the second round (No. 5 vs. No. 12/13 winner, No. 6 vs. No. 11/14 winner, No. 7 vs. No. 10/15 winner, No. 8 vs. No. 9/16 winner) and seeds nine through 16 will compete in the four first-round games (No. 9 vs. No. 16, No. 10 vs. No. 15, No. 11 vs. No. 14, No. 12 vs. No. 13)

The tournament will run from Tuesday, May 20 to Sunday, May 25. In the previous format, the ACC championship has used pool play or a round-robin style tournament
