PROJECTED STARTERS

TUES - Grant Siegel, RHP (2-1, 3.15 ERA) vs. TBA (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

Redshirt junior RHP Grant Siegel will make his third straight midweek start and his sixth overall on the season on Tuesday for UCF. Siegel will enter with a 2-1 record and a 3.15 ERA. He holds his wins on the year over Siena as well as last week against Stetson in which he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings to lead the Knights to a 3-0 shutout victory over the Hatters. JU's starter will be annouced at a later time.

ABOUT UCF

- The Knights will enter the ballgame with a 17-6 overall record and a 3-3 Big 12 Conference clip. The Black and Gold are currently receiving votes for this week's NCBWA Top 25 Poll after going 2-2 last week with a win over Stetsson in DeLand before dropping two of three to conference foe Houston at home over the weekend. Despite going 2-2 a week ago, UCF has won 11 of its last 14 contests.
- In Friday's opener against Houston, the Knights held a 5-0 lead early in the game but UH responded with seven unanswered runs to take the series opener, 7-5. UCF looked to overcome the deficit in the bottom of the ninth by loading the bases with one away, but Houston reliever Antoine Jean finished off a five-inning save by striking out back-to-back batters to end the ballgame.
- The Black and Gold then responded by taking game two by a score of 7-1 to force a rubber match on Sunday. In Saturday's contest, four UCF pitchers combined to lime the Cougars to just one run and the Knights put the game away with five runs in the eighth inning.
- Holding to a 2-1 advantage for the majority of the game, Dylan King gave the Black and Gold a little breathing room by driving in a run in the last of the eighth via an RBI groundout. DeAmez Ross followed with a two-run single with two outs and Edian Espinal capped the scoring with a two-run double. UH then looked to make things interesting by loading the bases with two away in the ninth, but Kevin Schoneboom came on and struck out the first batter he faced on three pitches to seal the victory.
- Espinal led the Knights in Saturday's win by going 2-for-5 with a double and two runs batted in while Lex Boedicker went 2-for-3 with two runs scored. Ross and Antonio Jimenez also had big performances by driving in two runs apiece. Wiley Hartley, Russell Sandefer, Alex Galvan and Schoneboom limited the Cougars to just one run in the ballgame.
- In Sunday's rubber match, UCF tied it in the third at 2-2 and again in the sixth at 4-4, but UH managed to score three runs in the seventh to pull out the finale by a score of 7-4.
- Andrew Williamson led the Knights at the plate by going 2-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a run scored. Ross and Kendrey Maduro also drove in runs in the contest. Carter Stanford led the way from the mound by tossing 2.1 innings of scoreless relief over the last couple of innings.
- Jimenez led the Black and Gold at the plate in the Houston series by hitting .400 with a triple, three RBIs and two runs scored. Espinal was next by hitting .357 with two doubles, two runs scored, two runs batted in and two stolen bases. Hartley led the way on the mound by going 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA and five strikeouts over 5.0 innings, while Angelo Smith, Galvan, Stanford, Schoneboom and Sandefer led the way from the bullpen with scoreless relief work.
- For the season, Espinal fronts the Knights with a .479 batting average, a .726 slugging percentage, .587 on-base clip, 28 runs scored and five stolen bases. Williamson is next with a .388 average and team-leading tallies of five home runs, 11 doubles and 28 RBIs and Ross follows by batting .367 with a team-best 36 hits. Hartley leads the way from the mound with a 4-0 record and 2.70 ERA, while Galvan holds a perfect 0.00 ERA over 13.2 innings of work and Dominic Castellano paces the team in strikeouts with 28 over 17.2 innings.

ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP HITTERS

- Junior second baseman Edian Espinal is currently ranked fourth nationally in onbase percentage with a .587 clip and fifth in hitting with a .479 batting average. Over 73 at-bats on the year, Espinal has 35 hits with four homers, six doubles and 11 walks. He has red-hot since his pinch-hit walk-off hit in game one against Bryant and currently leads the team in multi-hit games with 13. He'll also enter Tuesday on a 14-game hitting streak and a 21-game reached base safely streak.

HITTING ON ALL CYLINDERS

- As a team, the Knights currently hold the third-best team batting average in the nation with a .338 average. UCF currently has eight players with 10 or more at-bats hitting above .300 and three batting over .375 in Espinal (.479), Williamson (.388) and Aris Rivera (.385). Richmond of the Atlantic 10 is the current national leader in batting average with a .340 average.

- Tuesday's contest will mark the 94th alltime meeting between the Knights and Dolphins. UCF will enter holding to a 51-42 series advantage and a 24-22 advantage with games played in Jacksonville. UCF has won four of the last six meetings including a 6-0 win at JU last year.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

The Knights scored an impressive total of 103 runs during their recent eight-game winning streak. UCF also outscored it opponents by a whopping 103-22 during the eight games for a plus-81 run differential. The Black and Gold also scored double in six of the eight games and eight or more in all eight. During the stretch, UCF topped rival South Florida twice (12-1 and 12-2), No. 6 Florida (13-3), Miami (14-4), Monmouth three times (17-1, 18-3, 8-0) and BYU (9-8). UCF also outhit the opposition 122-54 during the eight-game streak.

STORYLINES - KNIGHT NOTES

ABOUT JACKSONVILLE

- The Dolphins currently hold an overall record of 12-11 and a 3-3 Atlantic Sun Conference clip. The team is coming off a series loss to Stetson in which they fell in the final two games, including a 11-1 loss in the final game on Sunday. Jacksonville finished its 2024 campaign with a 27-31 record and a 19-12 conference record, which was good enough to finish fifth in the ASUN standings. JU's season came to an end in the conference tournament, in which they went 2-2. The Dolphins were picked to finish fifth in the Atlantic Sun this season.
- Jacksonville is led by Jonah Shields offensively, as he holds a .383 average, a team-best 31 hits and 17 RBIs. Jaden Bastian is also a key contributor, as so far this season he has put up a .337 average, 20 RBIs, a team-leading tallies of 13 stolen bases and four home runs. Blake DeLamielleure leads the team in RBIs with 22. Richard Long is the team's top starting pitcher with a 4-2 record and 2.06 ERA, while reviler Nick Anello fronts the squad with a 0.75 ERA and in saves with six. JU is coached by Chris Hayes who is in his ninth year at the helm of the Dolphins.
- Tuesday's contest will mark the 94th all-time meeting between the Knights and Dolphins. UCF will enter holding to a 51-42 series advantage and a 24-22 advantage with games played in Jacksonville. UCF has won four of the last six meetings including a 6-0 win at JU last year. In last year's meeting, former Knight Cade Boxrucker finished one out shy of a no-hitter. The Dolphins managed to break it up with two outs in the ninth, but Spencer Bauer came on and promptly retired the first man he faced to record a one-hit combined shutout.

BEWARE OF THE BULLPEN

The Knights' bullpen has been red hot to start the season. So far, the group of 15 pitchers have pitched a combined 105.0 innings, in which they have put together an ERA of 2.74, an 8-4 record and allowed only 81 hits and 32 earned runs while striking out 130 batters. Four pitchers—Kris Sosnowski, Alex Galvan, Mateo Gray and Matt Sauser—currently have an ERA of zero. Dominic Castellano leads the way in wins (5-1) and strikeouts (28) while Galvan, Russell Sandefer and Angelo Smith are tied atop the team in saves as they each have one.

BIG WIN IN FRONT OF A BIG CROWD

UCF's March 4 game against Florida had a lot of highlights. But one of the biggest was the size of the crowd. Knight Nation packed John Euliano Park that night to see the Knights defeat the No. 6 team in the country by the score of 13-3. The final attendance was totaled at 4,204, the second largest home crowd in program history. This only ranked below the Knights' March 3, 2015, contest against Florida, in which the Black and Gold Defeated the then-ranked No. 2 Gators 4-3 in front of 4,319 fans.

CASTELLANO & STAGLIANO TABBED PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

- Both of Orlando's favorite Doms, senior pitchers Dominic Castellano and Dom Stagliano, were named to the 2025 Preseason All-Big 12 Baseball Team. Last season Castellano was the Knights' top relief pitcher. He put together a 7-0 record with a 2.83 ERA, three saves in 60.1 innings and an opposing batting average of .164. Stagliano was the Knights' top starting pitcher in 2024, as he went 3-4 with a 4.10 ERA and struck out 66 batters in 74.2 innings. He also finished with one of the best WHIP and strikeouts per nine innings in the nation, as he ranked 19th nationally in WHIP (1.02) and 28th in hits per nine innings (6.51). for their performances, Castellano was named ABCA/Rawlings Southeast All-Region Second Team and Big 12 Conference honorable mention accolades, while Stagliano received All-Big 12 Second Team recognition.

TRIPS TO THE TOURNAMENT WITH WALLY

- Last season, Rich Wallace led the Knights to an NCAA Regional in his first season as head coach. But that wasn't the first time Wallace has helped UCF reach the postseason. As a player, Wallace helped the team make the NCAA tournament three times (2000, '01, '02) and he also helped the Knights makes the 2004 tournament as an assistant coach. Wallace is the first person in program history to make the NCAA Tournament as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

Rich Wallace is no stranger to UCF after playing for the Knights from 2000-03, and coaching with the squad from 2004-08. He's the first UCF alum to lead the Black and Gold in an NCAA-sponsored men's sport since 1988. Wallace grew up in Orlando and attended Bishop Moore High School here in the City Beautiful.

- During his playing career, Wallace led the Knights in batting average (.380) and on base percentage (.529) during the 2000 season. The OBP represents the sixth highest single season mark in the Knights' history. He was also tabbed an honorable mention Freshman All-American that season. In his four seasons with the Knights, UCF won a combined 166 games (51-14 in 2001, 43-19 in 2000, 41-22 in 2002), including a combined 67-17 mark in ASUN play in 2000-02.
- In all, Coach Wallace has advanced to the NCAA tournament eight times. He now has one appearance as a head coach (2024), four as an assistant coach and three as a player. He also helped Notre Dame to a College World Series run while in South Bend in 2022.

CITRONAUT MIDWEEK

WHAT IS CITRONAUT MIDWEEK?

- On select midweek home games this season, the UCF baseball team will take on the persona of the Citronaut. Made whole with canaveral blue and black colors, Citronaut logos, special-edition uniforms and space-themed in-stadium marketing and promotions, the baseball team fully embraces the name of the 'Nauts on select midweek games.
- In 2014, UCF baseball debuted as the 'Nauts with their first-ever specialedition "Citronaut" jerseys. The white and black kits featured the Citronaut script logo and the throwback Citronaut logo on the hats and the sleeve.
- The 'Nauts started Citronaut midweeks in 2024, donning canaveral blue jerseys with black and white piping, complete with white numbers and the polaris star.

WHO ARE THE 'NAUTS?

- We are so glad you asked. The Citronaut was the first mascot of Florida Technological University (FTU), which later became



the University of Central Florida (UCF). The mascot appeared on the first student handbook in 1968-1969. After one year, the students petitioned the student government to establish a new mascot. In 1970, students approved "Knights of the Pegasus" as the second official university mascot, which remains to this day. The space themed uniforms and constellation named streets around campus remember the times when FTU was founded to provide personnel to support NASA at the Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Air Force Station.

KNIGHT NOTES – UCF BASEBALL

SUNSHINE STATE SUCCESS

- UCF defeated 2024 NCAA Tallahassee Regional foe Stetson 3-0 for its fifth win on the year over Sunshine State foes. The win continued the trend of the Knights having success against in-state opponents in the Wallace era. The win moved Wallace
- to 19-6 in games against teams from the state of Florida. Wallace's 2024 squad went 14-4, which included beating the then-fourth ranked Florida in Gainesville, a series win over USF, and a win over Stetson in the Tallahassee Regional.
- This season, UCF is 5-2 against Florida teams. Those wins include two victories to earn the series win over USF and 10-run victories over both Florida and Miami

CASTELLANO & SOSNOWSKI NAMED TO NCBWA PRESEASON STOPPER OF THE WATCH YEAR LIST

- A pair of UCF relievers were named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason Watch List in Dominic Castellano and Kris Sosnowski. The senior southpaw Castellano went a perfect 7-0 in 2024 with a 2.83 ERA, three saves and 68 strikeouts in 60.1 innings, whlie the redshirt junior RHP Sosnowski posted a 1-0 record with a 3.38 ERA, six saves and 40 punchouts in 37.1 innings.

TRIO OF KNIGHTS NAMED TO DIBASEBALL'S PRESEASON PLAYER LIST

- A trio of Knights were named to D1Baseball Preseason Player Lists prior to the season in relief pitcher Kris Sosnowski, starting pitcher Dom Stagliano and third baseman Kendrey Maduro. The redshirt junior and 2024 UCF closer Sosnowski led the group by checking in at No. 16 on D1Baseball's Top 100 Relievers, while the senior Stagliano was ranked No. 85 on the Top 150 Starting Pitchers and junior college transfer Kendrey Maduro is tabbed No. 43 on the Top 50 Third Basemen preseason ranking.

CAPTAIN. MY CAPTAIN

- As voted on by the players, UCF named six captains prior to the 2025 season in pitchers Dominic Castellano (Sr., LHP), Wiley Hartley (RSr., RHP) and Kris Sosnowski (RJr., RHP), as well as infielders Lex Boedicker (Sr., 1B) and Braden Calise (RJr, 2B) and catcher Dylan King (RJr.). The six captains bring a combined total of 19 prior seasons of collegiate experience to the mix, as Boedicker, Castellano, Calise, King and Sosnowski have played three years apiece and Hartley four. All six captains have postseason experience from playing on last season's team that made it to the Tallahassee Regional.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- The Knights have a total of 24 newcomers on the squad this season, which includes 18 transfers and six freshmen. Of the 18 transfers, five of them have Power 4 experience, with two playing at Florida State, one at Duke, one at Miami and one at Penn State. The player from Duke, sophomore outfielder Chase Krewson, helped lead the blue Devils to a 2024 ACC Tournament title and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, while both junior outfielder DeAmez Ross and sophomore RHP Matt Sauser helped FSU make it all the way to the 2024 College World Series in Omaha.

JUMPING OVER FROM JUCO

- Of the Knights 18 transfers, eight are coming from junior colleges. Seven of them come from schools in Florida while the eighth player, junior right-handed pitcher Kevin Schoneboom, comes from Texas (Northeast Texas). The seven from Florida JUCOs are Erick Almonte (Jr., INF, State College of Florida), Edian Espinal (Jr., INF, Chipola), Kendrey Maduro (Jr., INF, Northwest Florida State), Aris Rivera (Jr., C, Polk State), Angelo Smith (Jr., RHP, Indian River State), Carter Stanford (Jr., RHP, Tallahassee State) and Payton Waters (Jr., RHP, St. Johns River State). Big things are expected from the group, as Maduro has started six of the team's seven games at third base and a number of the pitchers are anticipated to be key contributors.

BAUER IS BACK

- Senior RHP Spencer Bauer was granted an extra year of eligibility prior to the spring semester and is back for his sixth season. Bauer was a key reliever for the Knights last year in which he went 2-1 with a 4.32 ERA and struck out 37 batters over 24 appearances

#BUILTBYUCF

- Knights that move on to play in the professional ranks are said to be #BuiltByUCF. In the 2024 season, three Knights, Dylan Moore (UTL, Mariners), Ben Lively (RHP, Guardians) and Thaddeus Ward (RHP, Nationals, 40-man) were on MLB rosters to start the 2024 MLB campaign. UCF had two players drafted a season ago in RHP relief pitchers Najer Victor (14th Round, Angels) and Chase Centala (20th Round, Marlins). Fellow RHP reliever Ben Vespi also inked a free agent deal with the Orioles in 2024.

13 NCAA REGIONAL APPEARANCES - 126 MLB DRAFT PICKS

- The 2025 season marks the 52nd year for the UCF baseball program. UCF's first year of competition on the baseball diamond came in 1973 as an NCAA Division II institution. After 12 years at the Div. II level, the Knights then moved to the NCAA Division I ranks in 1985 under head coach Jay Bergman.
- In its history, the Knights have won 12 conference titles with six regular season conference championships (SSC in 1979; ASUN in '00, '01, '02, '04; and AAC in '17) and six conference tournament championships (ASUN in 1993, '95, '96, '97, 01, '02).
- UCF has advanced to an NCAA Regional 13 times in the program's history at the NCAA Div. I level (1989, '93, '95, '96, '97, '00, '01, '02, '04, '11, '12, '17, '24). The Knights hold an 18-26 all-time record in NCAA Tournament play and will be looking to return to a Regional for the second straight year as well as advance to the program's first NCAA Super Regional under head coach Rich Wallace in 2025
- All-time the Knights have had a total of 126 players selected in the MLB Draft. Over the years, UCF has had four first round selections with outfielder Chad Mottola marking the highest selection by being picked fifth overall in the 1992 draft, one spot ahead of Hall of Famer Derek Jeter. Of the 126 draftees, 14 have played in the big leagues in Chad Mottola (OF, drafted in 1992), Mike Maroth (LHP, drafted in 1998), Esix Snead (OF, drafted in 1998), Matt Fox (RHP, drafted in 2004), Clay Timpner (OF, drafted in 2004), Drew Butera (C, drafted in 2005), Chasen Bradford (RHP, drafted in 2011), Beau Taylor (C, drafted in 2011), Danny Winkler (RHP, drafted in 2011), Darnell Sweeney (INF, drafted in 2012), Ben Lively (RHP, drafted in 2013), Eric Skoglund (LHP, drafted in 2014), Dylan Moore (INF/OF, drafted in 2015), Thad Ward (RHP, drafted in 2018). In 1998, UCF had its most draft selections with 10 that season. Mike Marroth (LHP) and Kevin Gordon (RHP) were both selected in the third round, while Matt Lubozynski (LHP) rounded out UCF's selections that year (42nd round).



OUICK FACTS

THE ULTIMATE HOMECOMING

Wallace began his coaching career at UCF as assistant coach in 2004 following his four-year playing career as a Knight (2000-2003).

In June 2023, Wallace became the first-ever UCF graduate to be named head coach of the Knights baseball team. The Orlando native returned to UCF for the 2024 season in his first head coaching role.

FIRST ONE TO DO IT

By recording an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2024, Wallace became the first person in program history to have appeared in NCAA postseason play as a player (2000, 2001, 2002), an assistant coach (2004), and a head coach (2024).

NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

Including his playing days, Wallace has made a total of eight NCAA Tournament appearances during his playing and coaching career. He first made a trio of apperances as a player, followed by NCAA Regional berths in 2004 (UCF), 2018 (Jacksonville), 2021 and 2022 (Notre Dame) as an assistant and 2024 as a head coach.

HOMETOWN HERO

Wallace's outlook on recruiting means starting with Orlando and bringing hometown kids home to UCF.

"THIS IS HOME. To start my career here and to, hopefully, finish my career here has been my goal for 20-plus years in this. Everything I did was to get back here somehow, some way and lead this baseball program. I'm just grateful to have a chance."

39 RICH WALLACE

Rich Wallace, an Orlando native and former UCF baseball player and Knight assistant coach, brings two decades of experience as a Division I baseball coach with him in his return to Orlando as UCF's seventh head baseball coach. The 2024 season marked Wallace's first season as UCF's head coach as well as the program's inaugural year of competition in the Big 12 Conference.

During his first season at the helm of his alma mater in 2024, Wallace led his Knights to a 37-21 record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017—with a trip to the 2024 NCAA Tallahassee Regional. He also led the Black and Gold to six conference series victories in the program's inaugural season of competition in the Big 12 Conference to finish eighth in the league with a 14-15 conference record.

With a possible postseason bid on the line, Wallace then led the Knights to a deep run at the 2024 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship by going 2-1 and reaching the semifinal round. UCF then received an at-large selection as a No 3 seed at the NCAA Tallahassee Regional and the Black and Gold went on to record wins over Alabama and Stetson to reach the finals of the regional before falling to the host and No. 8 Florida State Seminoles.

Wallace helped his 2024 squad enter the Top 25 national rankings for the first time since February of 2021, as the team spent two weeks in early April in the national rankings. The Knights were ranked as high as 16th by the NCBWA and 17th by D1Baseball. Wallace also guided the Knights to a 19-3 non-conference record during the regular season, which included an impressive 11-1 record in midweek action. The 2024 Knights also finished the season with a 14-4 record against in-state opponents as well as posted the nation's 31st-best RPI.

The UCF alum had six players earn All-Big 12 recognition following the season, as junior pitcher Dom Stagliano received All-Big 12 Second Team honors, and Dominic Castellano (Jr., LHP), Chase Centala (Sr., RHP), Kyle Kramer (Sr., RHP), Danny Neri (Sr., C), and Matt Prevesk (Jr., OF) all earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades. The left-hander Castellano also became UCF's first pitcher to earn All-Region honors since 2017, as he was named to the ABCA/Rawlings NCAA Div. I Southeast All-Region Second Team. Wallace also had a pair of Knights drafted following his first season and another signed as a free agent, as right-handed pitchers Najer Victor and Chase Centala were respectively selected by the Angels and Marlins in the 2024 MLB Draft and fellow RHP Ben Vespi signed a free-agent deal with the Baltimore Orioles.

Wallace spent the 2023 season as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida State. He previously coached at Notre Dame (2020-22), Jacksonville (2018-19), Creighton (2015-17), High Point (2009-14) and UCF (2004-08). Wallace helped teams at UCF in 2004, Jacksonville in 2018 and Notre Dame in 2021 and 2022 to NCAA Championship appearances.

A 2004 UCF graduate, Wallace becomes the first alumnus to be named head coach of an NCAA-sponsored men's sport at UCF since 1988. He played four seasons of baseball for the Knights from 2000-03, helping those teams reach the NCAA Championship in 2000, 2001 and 2002. As a freshman, he led UCF with a .380 batting average and .529 on-base percentage. He played a key role as UCF won the ASUN regular season in 2000-02 and the ASUN conference tournament in 2001 and 2002. Wallace helped the 2001 UCF squad win a school-record 51 games.

His combined NCAA Championship experience includes three times as a UCF player and four times as an assistant coach (two Super Regional appearances and one College World Series berth), along with one more as a head coach.

Wallace spent four seasons working with head coach Link Jarrett at Notre Dame (2020-22) and Florida State (2023). In South Bend, he served as recruiting coordinator and third-base coach while also working with Irish hitters and catchers. He oversaw defensive alignments, managed opposing pitcher video scouting reports, helped coordinate baserunning instruction and assisted with game management during his tenure in South Bend. His role in Tallahassee also featured the recruiting coordinator assignment.

In Wallace's three years at Notre Dame the Irish were 86-32 (.729), second-best winning percentage in the country over that span. Notre Dame's 44-21 (.677) three-year ACC record was the best in the league, and the Irish won the conference's regular-season title (their first ACC crown) by 4.5 games in 2021. Notre Dame finished 41-17 in 2022 (most wins for the Irish since 2006) and set a single-season home run record with 79.

Wallace helped guide the Irish to back-to-back NCAA Super Regionals (first time at Notre Dame) and the 2022 College World Series in the third trip to Omaha in program history. In 2021, first baseman Niko Kavadas became a first-team All-American - Notre Dame's first since 2002 - and set the school record with 22 home runs (second in the ACC and third in the nation).

At Notre Dame, Wallace coached two All-Americans, three All-ACC selections and 14 players were named to the All-ACC Academic Team. Throughout his career Wallace's teams have produced 55 Major League Baseball draft selections and coached more than 60 all-conference performers.

He spent the 2018-19 seasons back in his home state as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Jacksonville under head coach Chris Hayes. In 2018 Wallace and the Dolphins finished 40-21 and reached the NCAA Championship as a two seed, highest in program history. That season, the Dolphins led the ASUN in batting average, on-base percentage, runs scored and fielding percentage.

Wallace was the recruiting coordinator at Creighton (2015-17 under head coach Ed Servais) and High Point (2009-14 under head coach Craig Cozart). He was named the Big East Recruiter of the Year by D1Baseball in 2016 at Creighton. At High Point he helped bring in consecutive nationally ranked recruiting classes for the first time in school history.

Wallace began his coaching career at UCF (2004-08 under head coach Jay Bergman), coaching the catchers and outfielders while coordinating the camps. UCF won the ASUN regular-season title in 2004 and reached the NCAA Championship.

He remains in UCF's top 10 in single-season on-base percentage (.529 in 2000) and career hit by pitch (46). Wallace in 2000 was an honorable mention Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American and a third-team All-ASUN selection as a designated hitter. In his four seasons with the Knights, UCF won a combined 166 games (51-14 in 2001, 43-19 in 2000, 41-22 in 2002), including a combined 67-17 mark in ASUN play in 2000-02.

After his playing career as a 6-1, 220-pound infielder with the Knights concluded, Wallace earned his degree in 2004 from UCF's College of Undergraduate Studies with a major in interdisciplinary studies and a minor in criminal justice. He graduated from Bishop Moore High School in Orlando.

NORBERTO **LOPEZ**

ASSISTANT COACH / RECRUITING COORDINATOR

SECOND YEAR (3B COACH)

In Norberto Lopez's first season of coaching at UCF (2024), he helped lead the Knights to a 37-21 overall record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017 with a trip to the 2024 NCAA Tallahassee Regional. Lopez also helped UCF win six Big 12 Conference series in the program's first year in the league to finish eighth with a 14-15 conference mark, as well as to a deep run at the 2024 Big 12 Championship by going 2-1 and reaching the semifinal round.



Lopez also helped six Knights earn All-Big 12 Conference postseason honors, which included catcher Danny Neri, as well as Dominic Castellano receive ABCA/Rawlings NCAA Dix. I Southeast All-Region Second Team accolades. He helped four more Knights earn CSC Academic All-District accolades.

Prior to UCF, Lopez began working with the Miami baseball program prior to the 2016 season, working with the Canes' hitters and catchers, and adding responsibilities as recruiting coordinator after the 2018 campaign. Miami made NCAA Championship appearances in five of his seasons in Coral Gables, including each of the last three years after an ACC regular-season crown and CWS appearance in 2016. The Canes played host to NCAA regionals in both 2022 and 2023.

The 2019 season marked the first with Lopez as Miami's hitting coach and the Canes responded with an ACC-best 85 home runs. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs that ranked third in the nation.

From Hialeah, Florida, Lopez played collegiately at Broward College (Davie Florida) and Nova Southeastern (Fort Lauderdale, Florida). Drafted by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim in 1999, he spent three years in the organization. He served on the Texas-Pan American coaching staff from 2009-15 and was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2015 season. Lopez was an assistant coach for Florida Atlantic where he helped the Owls compile a .341 batting average with 93 home runs in 2007 - and a .321 batting average with 99 home runs in 2008.

Lopez spent two years at Broward Community College from 2004-06 when he led the team to a third-place finish at the 2006 NJCAA World Series.

Lopez graduated from Nova Southeastern University with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1999. In 2006, he earned a master's in exceptional student education from Nova Southeastern.

DREW THOMAS

PITCHING COACH

SECOND YEAR

In Drew Thomas' first season of coaching at UCF (2024), he helped lead the Knights to a 37-21 overall record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017 with a trip to the 2024 NCAA Tallahassee Regional. Thomas also helped UCF win six Big 12 Conference series in the program's first year in the league to finish eighth with a 14-15 conference mark, as well as to a deep run at the 2024 Big 12 Championship by going 2-1 and reaching the semifinal round.

Thomas also helped six Knights earn All-Big 12 Conference postseason honors, which included four pitchers, as well as junior left-hander Dominic Castellano receive ABCA/Rawlings NCAA Div. I Southeast All-Region Second Team accolades—UCF's first pitcher to be named All-Region since 2017. Thomas helped four more Knights earn CSC Academic All-District accolades.

As the team's pitching coach, Thomas helped the Knight pitching staff improve its team ERA by well over a point during his first season—from a 5.80 team ERA in 2023 to a 4.43 team ERA in 2024. The 4.43 ERA also marked the second-best ERA in the Big 12 Conference and the 20th-best ERA in the nation. He also helped the team's WHIP improve from 1.55 a season ago to 1.28 this season—which marked the second-best WHIP in the Big 12 and also ranked 10th nationally.

Thomas spent 16 years with Coastal Carolina--including a 2016 College World Series title--then worked as pitching coach for Brewers affiliate Wisconsin Timber Rattlers of the Midwest League in 2023 after a season in the same role with the franchise's Carolina Mudcats team in the Carolina League in 2022.

In addition to the 2016 CWS crown, Thomas' Coastal Carolina coaching resume includes 11 NCAA Championship regional appearances, three super regionals, nine conference regular-season championships and nine conference championship tournament titles.

His pitching staffs finished among the NCAA top 40 in ERA eight times, including three top-10 finishes (10th in 2009, eighth in 2010, third in 2012). Coastal ranked among the NCAA top 15 in fewest hits allowed per nine innings four times. His teams led the conference in ERA six times, strikeouts seven times and saves five

His work at Coastal helped produce 13 Major League Baseball draft picks. Thomas came to Coastal Carolina from IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida, where he had worked since 2003.

Thomas pitched in the San Diego Padres organization in 1998-99 and played for the Canton Crocodiles of the Frontier League in 1999-2000. He was the 2000 Frontier League Relief Pitcher of the Year, a Frontier League All-Star and a second-team Baseball America All-Independent team member.

Thomas graduated from Illinois State University, where he earned a degree in history.

9 TED TOM

ASSISTANT COACH EIGHTH YEAR (1B COACH)

Ted Tom begins his eighth year in the program as an assistant coach. Currently, he works with the outfielders and baserunners while assisting with recruiting and hitting.

In 2024, Tom helped lead the Knights to a 37-21 overall record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017. Tom also helped UCF win six Big 12 Conference series in the program's first year in the league to finish eighth with a 14-15 conference mark, as well as to a deep run at the 2024 Big 12 Championship by going 2-1 and reaching the semifinal round.



Tom also helped six Knights earn All-Big 12 Conference postseason honors, which included outfielder Matt Prevesk, as well as Dominic Castellano receive ABCA/Rawlings NCAA Div. I Southeast All-Region Second Team accolades. He helped four more Knights earn CSC Academic All-District accolades.

In 2023, Tom led an offense that set multiple UCF program records, including belting 109 home runs to shatter the American Athletic Conference record from 2019, finishing the season nationally ranked No. 11 in home runs and No. 14 in home runs per game (1.85). For the second consecutive year, three Knights hit above 319, tying the most in a single season over the last ten years. Tom saw Ben McCabe through his highest offensive production in his five seasons as a Knight, getting tabbed an All-American by Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA. Two hitters were named to the AAC All-Conference First Team in McCabe and Andrew Sundean, and Drew Faurot was a unanimous selection to the all-conference freshman team.

The 2022 season saw the Knights offense led the AAC in hitting during the conference season. Freshman Andrew Sundean was named a Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American and Second Team All-AAC after hitting .348 for the season. Senior Gephry Pena finished his career with a Second Team All-AAC nod after hitting .329 and stealing 24 bases. Sophomore Alex Freeland was drafted in the third round by the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Prior to arriving in Orlando, Tom spent three seasons at fellow conference member Cincinnati. He joined the Bearcats as the director of baseball operations in 2015, covering the day-to-day operations, video, and scouting for one season. In 2016, Tom was promoted to assistant coach and remained in that role for his final two years at Cincinnati.

Tom joined UC after seven seasons as the head coach at his alma mater Shawnee State University, where he compiled a record of 203-193. Tom was named 2010 Conference Coach of the Year and helped develop two Conference Player of the Year selections in catcher Philip Butler (2011) and outfielder Danny Gesick (2010).

Tom graduated from Shawnee State with a degree in Sport Management with minors in business and sport coaching in 2004 and having been a member of the 2000 team that finished fifth in the NAIA World Series.




