## THE FIRST PITCH

- Freshman right-handed pitcher Katelynn Oxley has not allowed an earned run in her last 10 innings pitched. She picked up her first career save against the Knights when the teams met on March 12
- Olivia Miller is the only Orlando, Fla., native on the Florida roster. She graduated from Bishop Moore Catholic
- On March 19 at Jacksonville, senior Reagan Walsh tallied her 200th RBI of her Florida career. She is just the fifth Gator to tally 200 or more RBI in their career: Lauren Haegar (260), Francesca Enea (221), Megan Bush (217), Charla Echols (210) and Walsh (200)
- Senior Kendra Falby is just four hits shy of 300 in her Florida career. She'd be just the third player in program history with 300 or more hits: Kelsey Stewart (357) and Amanda Lorenz (301) are currently the only two
- Falby has reached base in every game this season (34). It's the longest on-base streak for a Gator since Hannah Adams (35) in 2021
- Florida has shut out opponents 12 times this season, the fourth-most of any team in the NCAA. The Gators have shutout UCF in back-to-back meetings
- The Gators tallied their 19th run-rule victory of the season against North Florida on March 20
- Florida is 9-0 against in-state opponents this season with seven run-rule victories and six shutouts
- The Gators have recorded multiple home runs in 20 games this season. Jocelyn Erickson and Falby each hit solo home runs against the Knights on March 12
- 12 different Florida players have combined for 62 home runs: Taylor Shumaker (13), Mia Williams (11),

Jocelyn Erickson (9), Reagan Walsh (9), Kenleigh Cahalan (7), Ava Brown (3) Korbe Otis (3), Rylee Holtorf (2), Falby (2), Gabi Comia (1), Cassidy McLellan (1) and Brooke Barnard (1)

- Both Mia Williams and Ava Brown have each hit solo home runs in back-to-back games entering the matchup against UCF
- The Gators are 74-for-77 in stolen bases attempts this season, led by Falby who is 30-for-31, tied for seventh-most stolen bases in a single season in program history

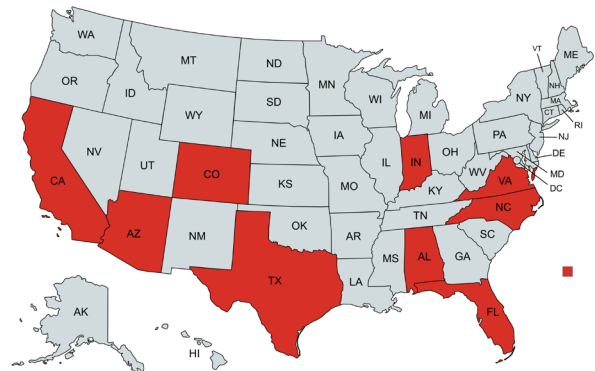

2024 NFCA Hall of Fame inductee Tim Walton enters his 20th year at the helm of the Florida Gators softball program. Going into the 2025 season, Walton has tallied a 980-238 (.805) record in 19 seasons as Florida's head coach and 1,103-302 (.785) in 22 seasons overall.

In 2024, Florida returned to the Women's College World Series for the 12th time and earned its sixth SEC Tournament championship, rolling up 54 wins.

The Gators earned extensive recognition within the Southeastern Conference as Jocelyn Erickson earned SEC Player of the Year honors and Keagan Rothrock added SEC Freshman of the Year accolades. Five Gators earned first-team All-SEC honors in 2024, including Erickson, Kendra Falby, Korbe Otis, Skylar Wallace and Reagan Walsh, while Rothrock added second-team recognition. Erickson and Falby also earned SEC All-Defensive Team honors.

Prior to the start of the 2024 campaign, Walton was announced as a member of the 2024 National Fastpitch Coaches Association Hall of Fame Class.

Walton reached a historic milestone during the Gators 2022 campaign as he became the second fastest head coach to reach 1,000 career NCAA Division I softball victories with 2-1 (9 inning) win at LSU on May 1. In addition, Walton led the Gators to its 11th overall Women's College World Series appearance after the Orange & Blue defeated No. 3-seed Virginia Tech in Blacksburg during the NCAA Super Regional round. In 2021, Walton led the program to a Southeastern Conference leading ninth regular season championship.

During the 2019 season, the Gators became back-to-back SEC Tournament Champions for the second time in program history and Walton navigated the program through a shortened 2020 campaign due to COVID-19 with a 23-4, 3-0 SEC record and a No. 7 national ranking.

With an incredible record of 926-223 (.806) at Florida, the five-time SEC Coach of the Year has led the Orange and Blue to 364 school records and numerous other SEC records, and his squads have earned various firsts for the Gator softball program. By the end of the 2008 season, the Gators had set the NCAA single-season record for wins (70) and the SEC single-season record (27). In 2018, the program set the NCAA record for walks (360) in a season and most recently set the UF program record for stolen bases (132).

In 2018, Florida became only the second SEC program to win four straight SEC Regular Season Championships and now holds a league leading nine titles, eight of which have come under Walton's guidance. In 2017, Walton and his staff earned their fifth NFCA Southeast Coaching Staff of the Year award and the team finished the season leading the nation in ERA (0.81) and fielding percentage (.985) for the second consecutive season.

With back-to-back national titles in 2014 and 2015, Walton's Gators are one of only four teams to have achieved the feat in consecutive seasons.

The five-time SEC Coach of the Year recipient, has led his squads to 18 NCAA Regional appearances, 15 Super Regionals, 12 Women's College World Series berths, eight SEC Regular Season Championships and six SEC Tournament Championships. From 2006 to 2018, the Orange & Blue appeared in a nation's best five WCWS championship series appearances. That success led to a 2015 NFCA Division I National Coaching Staff of the Year award and five NFCA Southeast Region Coaching Staff of the Year selections.

Under Walton's tutelage, Gator softball student-athletes have earned 52 NFCA All-American honors, 79 All-SEC honors, two USA Softball Player of the Year recipients, three Honda Award winners, 13 SEC Player & Pitcher of the Year honorees, two NFCA Players of the Year and one NFCA Freshman of the Year.

The Gators have not only excelled on the field but in the classroom as well under Walton. Since 2006, Florida student-athletes have achieved 23 College Sports Communicators (CoSIDA) Academic All-American honors, 191 appearances on the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 79 SEC Academic Honor Roll First-Year recipients.

Prior to arriving at Florida, he took Wichita State to the NCAA Tournament in 2005 where his team finished with a school single-season record 46 wins (46-18). After three seasons with the Shockers he amassed a record of 123-64.

Walton has been a part of national championship teams as a baseball player, an assistant softball coach and a head softball coach. Before heading to take his first head coaching position at Wichita State, Walton served as an assistant softball coach for the University of Oklahoma, as the hitting coach and outfielders' coach. In his four seasons at OU, the Sooners won three Big 12 titles and made three consecutive WCWS appearances, including winning the 2000 NCAA title.

## Walton Inducted Into NFCA Hall of Fame

Head coach Tim Walton added another accolade to his extensive resume on Dec. 6 as he was inducted into the National Fastpitch Coaches' Association (NFCA) Hall of Fame in Dallas, Texas.

He joined former Texas head coach Connie Clark and Augustana University head coach Gretta Melsted to make up the 2024 NFCA Hall of Fame class.

Walton, who is in his 20th season at the helm of the Gators and season 23rd as a head coach, has established Florida as one of the preeminent softball programs in the country as one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the sport.

Entering the 2025 season, Walton holds a 980-238 (.805) record in 19 seasons in Gainesville. In 22 seasons as a head coach, Walton holds a career record of 1,103-302, which is good for a .785 winning percentage, which ranks third among active NCAA head coaches with a minimum of 10 years of experience as head coach.

His wins have also translated into numerous championships, leading the Gators to back-to-back NCAA National Championships in 2014 and 2015, eight Southeastern Conference Regular Season Championships, six SEC Tournament titles, 12 trips to the Women's College World Series and five WCWS Championship series appearances.

Walton's athletes have earned 53 NFCA All-America honors and 79 All-SEC nods.

He's also coached three Collegiate Women Sports Award winners, two USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year recipients, two NFCA Division I Player of the Year winners, one NFCA Freshman of the Year recipient and 13 SEC Player & Pitcher of the Year honorees.

In addition to their athletic success, Walton's athletes have been leaders in the classroom. 13 student-athletes under Walton's leadership were named College Sports Communicators Academic All-America 23 times and 90 players secured a spot 191 times on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

## Five Gators Earn Preseason All-SEC Team Recognition

The Florida softball team matched a conference-high five All-Southeastern Conference preseason selections, the SEC announced on Jan. 6.

Keagan Rothrock, Korbe Otis, Kendra Falby, Reagan Walsh and Jocelyn Erickson each earned All-SEC Preseason Team recognition by a vote of the conference's head coaches.

Erickson, Falby, Otis and Walsh were All-SEC First Team selections in 2024, while Rothrock was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

Erickson is the reigning SEC Player of the Year and Rothrock is the reigning SEC Freshman of the Year.

As a team, Florida was selected to finish second in the league and received six first-place votes. The 2024 SEC Tournament Champions, the Gators are coming off a 54-win 2024 season that included the program's 12th trip to the Women's College World Series.

Florida finished second in the SEC last season with a 17-7 record in conference play, winning seven of eight conference series.

The No. 3/2 Gators open the 2025 season at home on Feb. 6 vs. North Florida, before traveling to Tampa for the USF-Rawlings Invitational from Feb. 7-9.

Ocasio (Pick 5) was the first Gator off the board by the Blaze, Wallace (Pick 11) was selected by the Bandits and both Amanda Lorenz (Pick 7) and Stewart-Hunter (Pick 36) were drafted by the Volts.

### ***Shumaker Named Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week***

Florida softball freshman Taylor Shumaker was named the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week, the organization announced on Feb. 11.

She is just the second freshman in program history to earn the recognition and first since Kirsti Merritt in 2013.

The last Gator to win was Skylar Wallace in 2023.

Shumaker, who was named the Southeastern Conference Co-Freshman of the Week on Monday, was also recognized as D1 Softball's National Player of the Week and a 'Star of the Week' by Softball America.

The Fullerton, Calif., native opened her college career with a hot bat at the plate.

She hit five home runs in six games, tied for the most in the NCAA, hitting .500 (9-for-18) with a team-high 11 RBI, 11 runs, four walks and three stolen bases.

The outfielder slugged two home runs against both USF and RV/No. 22 Michigan and tied a school single-game record with four runs plated against the Wolverines.

She was the first Florida freshman to hit two home runs in a regular-season game against a ranked opponent since Megan Bush at No. 17 Georgia on April 12, 2008.

Shumaker is the sixth player in program history to be named the NFCA Player of the Week. It's the ninth time overall that a Gator has been selected.

### ***Cahalan Named Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week***

Junior Kenleigh Cahalan was named the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week, the organization announced on Feb. 25.

The Gator third baseman helped lead Florida to a 5-0 week at the Sun Devil Classic in Arizona, slugging three home runs, including her first career grand slam, with a team-best 13 RBI.

The Trussville, Ala., native hit .500 (7-for-14) on the weekend, with five of those hits going for extra bases.

She matched her career-best of four RBI at Grand Canyon on Feb. 22, before setting a new career-best of six RBI vs. Iowa State on Feb. 23.

Cahalan hit a home run in each of the Gators' last three games out west, including a two-run home run vs. New Mexico State, a grand slam at GCU and a solo shot against Iowa State.

She finished the five-game week with seven runs, two doubles and a sacrifice fly.

Cahalan is the second Florida player to earn NFCA Player of the Week honors this season as freshman Taylor Shumaker was selected on Feb. 11.

It's just the second time in program history that Florida has earned two NFCA Player of the Week honors in the same season.

Kelly Barnhill and Kendyl Lindaman were each selected in 2019.

### ***Walton Wins 1000th At Florida; No. 3 Gators Down Samford***

Head coach Tim Walton clinched his 1000th win as Florida's head coach on Feb. 28 in the Gators' 9-1 six-inning victory over Samford.

No. 3 Florida (20-1) earned its 13th run-rule of the season over the Bulldogs (10-6), with five different Gators recording multi-hit performances.

Walton is in his 20th season as the head coach and holds a record of 1000-239 (.807) in Gainesville. Overall, Walton holds a career record of 1,123-303 (.788) in 23 seasons as a head coach.

Walton currently ranks eighth of all active Division I coaches in career wins.

### ***Walsh Named Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week***

Senior Reagan Walsh has been named the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week, the organization announced on March 6.

The Gator first baseman, who was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on Monday, blasting four home runs with 11 RBI in a 5-0 week for No. 3 Florida.

Walsh hit .688 (11-for-16), with seven of her hits going for extra bases.

She slugged 1.625 on the week, hitting a pair of home runs vs. Western Michigan, which included her second grand slam of the season and fifth in her career.

Walsh recorded five multi-hit performances, hitting home runs in back-to-back-to-back games against the Broncos, Troy and Florida A&M, and tallying a pair of doubles vs. Samford on Feb. 28.

It's the first time in program history that Florida players have earned NFCA Player of the Week honors three times in one season and the first time in back-to-back weeks.

Both Taylor Shumaker (Feb. 11) and Kenleigh Cahalan (Feb. 25) have been named the NFCA Player of the Week this season.

### ***Shumaker Garners SEC Co-Freshman Of the Week Honors***

Florida freshman outfielder Taylor Shumaker has been named the Southeastern Conference Co-Freshman of the Week, the league announced on March 11.

Shumaker led the No. 3 Gators (26-2) to a 3-1 record on the week, including an SEC series victory on the road at No. 5/4 Texas A&M.

She batted a team-best .538 (7-for-13) with eight RBI, two home runs, two doubles, three walks and four runs.

In Florida's 11-0 victory at Houston on March 5, Shumaker went 3-for-4 at the plate with six RBI, the first Gator freshman to have six RBI in a game since Reagan Walsh in 2022.

Shumaker averaged .444 at the plate against the Aggies in her first SEC series, including a home run in the series opener on March 7.

She currently leads the nation in RBI (46), runs (42) and total bases (88) and is tied for first in home runs (13).

This is Shumaker's second SEC Freshman of the Week honor and Florida's third weekly conference honor of the season.

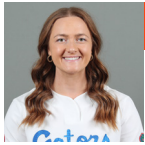

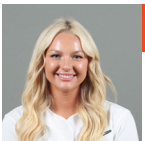
