## QUICK HITS

- The Gamecocks begin the 2025 season in the city where the 2024 season ended with a trip to Orlando. Jax State played in the Cure Bowl at Camping World Stadium on December 20th against Ohio.
- Jax State was bowl-eligible in each of its first two FBS seasons, becoming the first team to reach bowl games in each of its first two seasons at the FBS level since Marshall in 1997 and 1998.
- The Gamecocks hosted and won the Conference USA championship game in their first year eligible to do so. Jax State was the 13th different school to host the Conference USA title game in 20 years.
- For the second year in a row, the season starts on a Thursday night. Jax State is one of six teams that will play four mid-week (Monday-Thursday) games this season which is the most in FBS.
- Last year, Jax State played seven games on a day other than Saturday which was the most in the country.
- Charles Kelly begins his first season as the head coach of the Gamecocks. His first full-time college coaching job was under Coach Bill Burgess at Jax State in 1992.
- Kelly becomes the 31st person to serve as head coach of the Gamecocks.

## CHARLES KELLY HEAD COACH

Jacksonville State Vice President for Athletics Greg Seitz announced the hiring of Charles Kelly as the 31st head football coach in program history on December 21, 2024.

Kelly, a native of Ozark, Alabama, brings 35 years of coaching experience to the Gamecocks with 19 of those coming at the Power Five level and 21 as a defensive coordinator.

His first five seasons as a full-time college coach came at Jax State after being hired by Hall of Fame coach Bill Burgess. In total, his resume includes 208 wins, 15 bowl games, and nine seasons with 10 or more wins.

Kelly has spent time at some of the top programs in college football, including Alabama, Florida State, Auburn, Tennessee, and Georgia Tech. He has been part of teams that have won two national championships and numerous conference titles.

In total, five of the head coaches Kelly has worked under have won national championships (Bill Burgess, Chan Gailey, Paul Johnson, Jimbo Fisher, and Nick Saban).

Most recently, Kelly served as the co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Auburn, his alma mater. Under his guidance, the Tigers' defense ranked among the SEC leaders in several categories, including scoring defense and rushing defense.

Before his time at Auburn, Kelly was the defensive coordinator at Colorado in 2023, where he played a pivotal role in helping turn around the Buffaloes program under head coach Deion Sanders. His players included 2024 Heisman Trophy winner Travis Hunter and All-Pac-12 safety Shiloh Sanders.

Kelly also spent four seasons at Alabama with Nick Saban as the associate defensive coordinator and safeties coach. During his tenure, the Crimson Tide achieved a 47-6 record and won a national championship in 2020. In his four seasons in Tuscaloosa, the Tide made two College Football Playoff appearances and qualified for an additional New Years Six Bowl.

In recognition of his recruiting prowess, Kelly was named the 2023 247Sports National Recruiter of the Year and consistently ranked among the top recruiters in the country.

Kelly was on staff at Florida State during the 2013 season when the Seminoles were national champions and led the NCAA in scoring defense (12.1), pass defense (156.6), and interceptions (26). He was also in charge of the special teams during the championship season when kicker Roberto Aguayo was third nationally in scoring and Kermit Whitfield had two kickoff return touchdowns.

Prior to Florida State, Kelly coached at Georgia Tech for seven seasons which included serving as interim defensive coordinator in 2012 when he helped the team recover from a 2-4 start to the season to make the ACC Championship and then win the Sun Bowl over USC's high-powered offense.

Kelly's coaching journey also includes stints at Tennessee, Georgia Tech, and Nicholls State. Earlier in his career, Kelly held roles at Eufaula High School, Henderson State, and Phenix City High School.

Kelly and his wife, Kristy, have three daughters: Caroline, Kathleen, and Charli Grace.

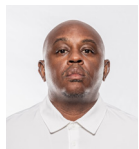

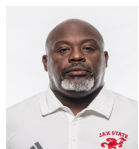
- Comes to Jax State after serving as passing game coordinator and coaching tight ends and inside receivers at Georgia Southern last year.

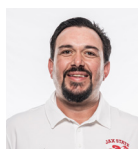
- Comes to Jax State after six seasons on the defensive staff at Maryland.

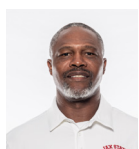

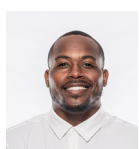

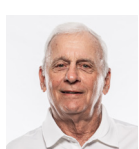
- Spent the 2024 season at Georgia Tech as a defensive assistant working with the line, coaching two all-conference honorees.

## Gamecocks Are Movin' On Up - to Conference USA

On Nov. 5 of 2021, Jacksonville State accepted an invitation to join Conference USA and become an FBS program, ending an impressive run in the FCS that began in 1995. The Gamecocks joined Liberty, New Mexico State and Sam Houston, all entering CUSA in 2023. They joined existing CUSA members Middle Tennessee, Western Kentucky, Florida International, Louisiana Tech and UTEP. Kennesaw State is entering its first season as members of Conference USA in 2024.

## Conference Carousel

When Jax State kicked off the 2023 season against UTEP, it served as the Gamecocks' first Conference USA game and first game as a member of FBS. Conference USA was Jax State's third in four years, after they finished an 18-year stint in the Ohio Valley Conference in 2020 and moved into the ASUN Conference in 2021. Not long after joining the ASUN, the Gamecocks received an invitation to join CUSA and started the process to move to FBS and become a member of their new league home.

## Year Two Success

During the 2024-25 school year, Jax State advanced to five Conference USA Championship games. The football team won the championship game to mark the first FBS conference title in program history and the second Conference USA title in any sport in school history (Bowling-2024). The Gamecocks were Conference USA runner-up in men's basketball, bowling, softball, and baseball last year.

## CUSA BOWL OVERVIEW

Conference USA is in the final year of the league's six-year cycle of the bowl lineup, concluding with the 2025 season. The conference is guaranteed seven bowl appearances in each year of the cycle and will have associations with up to 16 different bowls.

As part of the new bowl cycle, CUSA will annually send teams to the Bahamas Bowl against a Mid-American Conference opponent, and to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, against a Sun Belt Conference school. The league has participated in all 10 Bahamas Bowls and has placed a team in the New Orleans Bowl 20 times in its first 24 years.

The league continues its relationship with the Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl. CUSA is guaranteed to send a team to the Shreveport, Louisiana-based bowl in 2025, while holding a secondary agreement with the bowl in the other years of the cycle.

The conference's remaining guaranteed selections in the cycle (either four or five per season) will include the 68 Ventures Bowl (Mobile, Alabama) or from among 11 games which are owned and operated by ESPN Events. A backup opportunity also exists for the Quick Lane Bowl after ESPN and/or Independence Bowl slots have been filled.

### Title 26 in '24

With a 52-12 win over Western Kentucky on December 6th, Jax State clinched their 26th conference title in program history and their first in Conference USA in their first year eligible to participate in the title game.

Jax State went a perfect 5-0 in ASUN play during the 2022 season, which gave the Gamecocks their 25th conference championship in program history and their first in the ASUN. Jax State won the Ohio Valley Conference title nine times (2020, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2015, 2014, 2011, 2004 and 2003), won the Gulf South Conference title nine times (1992, 1991, 1989, 1988, 1982, 1981, 1978, 1977 and 1974), won the Mid-South Conference Championship once (1970) and won the Alabama Collegiate Conference Championship five times (1966, 1965, 1964, 1963 and 1962).

### Blending New and Old

A total of 47 scholarship players were on the roster when Charles Kelly was officially introduced as the Jax State head football coach. The coaching and recruiting staff added 51 scholarship players with 26 coming from high schools and 25 from the transfer portal. The projected depth chart has 13 new players on offense, 10 on defense, and three on special teams.

### You Look Familiar

Nine players on the Jax State roster have played for a member of the current coaching staff at a previous program. Head coach Charles Kelly had safety Rod Elston in his position group last year at Auburn and Trevor Woods at Colorado. He was the defensive coordinator at Alabama when Khurtiss Perry and Tre'Quon Fegas were there. Offensive Coordinator Clint Trickett had quarterback Cade Cunningham and receiver Caleb Coombs at Marshall. Defensive line coach Xavier Garcia coached Jacob Cruz at Georgia Tech. When Rohan Gaines was coaching at Bainbridge HS, cornerback Jaheim Jenkins was a senior. Franklin Baret Jr. was a redshirt wide receiver at Appalachian State last season where Lawrence Dawsey was his position coach.

### Gamecocks Getting National TV Exposure

Thanks to Conference USA's television agreement with CBS Sports and ESPN, the Gamecock played 10 nationally televised games in 2024 including the Conference USA Championship on CBS Sports Network. In 2023, Jax State had eight games on national TV. The 2025 season features five games already slated for national television with four others that are designated for ESPN Platforms which are subject to the 12-day selection window to be moved to a national broadcast.

### Jax State on The Tube

Jacksonville State is 154-82 (.652) in televised games in its football history. Jax State played just 10 televised games before moving up from Division II after the 1992 National Championship, and is 145-78 in televised games at the Division I level.

### 30+ Points Equals a Win

Since 2000, Jax State is 134-15 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Jax State is 78-4 at Burgess-Snow Field since 2003 when putting up 30-plus points and is 23-1 since 2022 when hitting the 30-point mark.

### Comeback Gamecocks Keep on Winning

Jacksonville State has 61 come-from-behind wins since the start of the 2010 season and rallied for four come-from-behind wins in 2015. In 2016, Jax State had three come-from-behind wins and two in 2017. In 2018, Jax State had four come-from-behind wins and the Gamecocks had four in 2019 and four in 2020. The Gamecocks had three come-from-behind wins in 2021, three in 2022, and five come-from-behind wins in 2023. Nineteen of those wins have occurred in the final 1:16 or less.

### Cardiac Gamecocks

According to ESPN's win probability, Jax State won five games over the last two years in which they had an 83.5 percent chance or worse to lose the game. On November 9th, 2024, with 5:55 to go in the fourth quarter, LA Tech had a 92.6% chance to win the game and went to 98.3% with 51 seconds left when the Bulldogs went to punt from the Jax State 46-yard line. It was 99% before Tyler Huff's 49-yard toss to the end zone to Cam Vaughn to force overtime.

In 2023, the Sam Houston game was the least probable, with ESPN saying the Bearkats had a 99.9 percent chance to win the game with 3:31 left in the third quarter. Jax State overcame an eight-point deficit in the final minute to win that game 35-28 in overtime. Middle Tennessee had a 92.7% win probability with 14:45 left in third quarter in 2023, only to watch the Gamecocks storm back with 38 unanswered points and win 45-30. Western Kentucky had an 83.5% win probability with 11:26 left in fourth quarter, but Jax State won that game 20-17 on a walk-off 40-yard field goal.

Jax State closed out the 2023 season with a 34-31 overtime victory over Louisiana in which the Ragin Cajuns boasted a 94.4 win probability with 4:33 remaining in the contest.

## Did you Know?

Jacksonville State is the **ONLY** school in the history of **NCAA** competition to win NCAA National Championships in baseball, men's basketball and football at the Division II level. The Gamecocks won the Div. II title in football (1992), basketball (1985) and baseball (1990, 1991). Before Florida's 2017 College World Series win, JSU was the lone school at either the Division I or Division II levels to achieve the feat.

## Gamecocks Chasing 5,000 Yards

Last season's team became just the fifth in program history to record over 6,000 yards of total offense. Jax State could have its second run of three consecutive seasons of 5,000 yards if it were to achieve that this season. It was last done in 2013-15.

## Record Crowds Watching Gamecocks

Jax State has continued to draw large crowds, even during the limitations that COVID-19 put on stadium capacities in the 2020-21 season. JSU averaged 7,439 fans in 2020-21, second-most among all FCS schools and the most in an on-campus facility.

Since JSU expanded Burgess-Snow Field to its current 24,000-seat capacity in 2010, each of the last 14 full seasons (except 2020-21 when full capacity wasn't allowed due to COVID-19) has been one of the top 13 in school history, and 2023 ranked second in average attendance and third in total attendance.
