# **1ST AND 10**

# FIRST FROST 2 = WIN NUMBER 1

- After posting the best two-year turnaround in the recent history of college football back in 2016 and 2017, the second first game of Scott Frost's UCF career resulted in a victory, beating Jacksonville State 17-10.
- → The Knights' Tayven Jackson tossed a 33-yard strike to DJ Black near the endzone on 3rd and 9 with 1:03 left to play for the game-winning touchdown
- ◆ A two-hour, seven-minute weather delay paused the game with 10:45 left in the second quarter. UCF's starting quarterback Cam Fancher was injured just before the weather delay in a 0-0 game.
- → The game remained scoreless into the half, just the sixth time in Big 12 history and first since Ohio and Iowa State in 2023.
- ◆ In three season openers under Frost, UCF has shut out its opponent in seven of 12 possible quarters. Frost improved to 3-0 in openers as a Knight

# RETURNING TO THE AIR

- → The two quarterbacks to play in UCF's opener totaled 314 passing yards. UCF didn't pass for over 300 yards at any point last season; the last time before 2025's opener was the third game of the 2023 season, tallying 349 vs. Villanova
- ◆ Tayven Jackson accounted for 282 passing yards vs. Jacksonville State, the second highest total of his career behind his career-best 299.
- ◆ As of Sunday, Jackson graded out as the fourth best QB performance in the Big 12

# WIN NUMBER 300

- ◆ UCF earned its 300th victory in program history in the season opener.
- → It took the Knights 542 games to reach the mark, making them the second-fastest of the Power 4 teams in Florida (Florida State, 479: UCF, 542: Miami, 552: Florida, 560)
- ◆ Additionally, it makes UCF the seventh-fastest to reach that mark out of members in the Big 12 Conference (Arizona, 463: Utah, 466: Colorado, 483: Arizona State, 494; West Virginia, 501; TCU, 526; UCF, 542; Kansas and Texas Tech, 547; Baylor, 560; Houston, 574; BYU, 598; Cincinnati, 604; Iowa State, 661; Oklahoma State, 673; Kansas State, 815)

# 4 FROST'S WINNING STREAK

- + With the opening night victory, Coach Frost has won 14 straight games as UCF's head coach after going 13-0 in 2017, putting him among some of the nation's elite coaches in terms of consecutive victories leading a school.
- → The victory over Jacksonville State tied him with Florida State's Mike Norvell and Oregon's Dan Lanning. Norvell strung together 14 across the 2022 and 2023 seasons while Lanning did it through 2023 and 2024.
- ◆ A UCF win against North Carolina A&T would tie Frost with Jim Harbaugh and the 15 victories Michigan compiled in its 2023 championship season. Frost and the Knights would have to put together another magical season to catch Kirby Smart who ripped off 29 straight wins from 2021-23 at Georgia.

# DJ BLACK: D-II TO P4 TD

- ◆ DJ Black, who was on the receiving end of the game-winning touchdown to lift UCF to a 17-10 victory, earned the start in his first game in the Power 4
- ◆ Last season, Black was a member of Limestone, a Division II program that closed the football program down last season. Black plastered his name all over the statsheet, scoring 11 touchdowns and recording 939 receiving yards.
- ◆ Offensive lineman Owen Spell was also at Limestone with Black in 2024

# 6 63 NEWCOMERS

- ◆ In what is technically his third year at the helm of the Knights and the first in his second stint, over half of Frost's roster is new to UCF. Officially, 63 of the 112 players on the squad will be making their debut on the roster.
- ◆ Of the 63 newcomers, 36 are transfers from other D-I institutions. Another six transfers are from football programs throughout other levels while two are former Division I basketball players and one is a former MiLB pitcher.
- ◆ A class of 18 true freshmen make up the remaining newcomers

- ◆ The return of Scott Frost as UCF's head coach reignites some trends from his first tenure, showcasing where the program was at 2017's end
- ◆ UCF outscored their opponents 627-329 in 2017, scoring 30 points or more in all 13 victories. The Knights' offense ranked No. 1 in the nation, averaging 48.2 points per game. UCF's high-powered offense continued even after Frost had departed, as the Black and Gold tacked on 18 more consecutive games scoring 30 points or more.
- ◆ UCF compiled 500+ yards of offense in eight of their 13 wins in 2017

# **SEASON OPENING STREAK**

- ◆ The opening night victory against Jacksonville State was the 10th consecutive win for the Knights in their first game of the season, a trend Frost started as UCF's head coach in 2016 with a 38-0 win over South Carolina State
- ◆ Beyond that, UCF has now started 1-0 in 19 of the last 21 seasons and has won 21 of 31 openers since becoming an FBS program to begin the 1996 season
- ◆ The Knights have won 16 of 19 home openers at Acrisure Bounce House. including five in a row and nine of the last 10

# 9 NEW VS. NEW

- + The Knights are one of 30 FBS programs that have a new head coach; 28 of which are completely new while the other two were elevated from interim.
- → UCF will face three of those 30 as well as an additional opponent, North Carolina A&T of the FCS. The Knights will host the four: Charles Kelly with Jacksonville State (Aug. 28), Shawn Gibbs with N.C. A&T (Sep. 6), Bill Belichick with North Carolina (Sep. 20) and Rich Rodriguez with West Virginia (Oct. 18).
- Of the new crop this year, Frost and Rodriguez are the only pair of FBS head coaches that have coached at a school, left and then returned to the same place later. Including Frost, there are 16 sitting head coaches across all levels to have coached at a place, left and then returned. (Full list can be found in Knight Notes, along with more in depth information). There are well over 200 head coaches historically across all levels who have a similar path.

# **OUT WITH THE OLD, IN WITH THE NI**

- ◆ In addition to its head coach, there is plenty of new in UCF football in 2025
- → The Knights will suit up in fresh uniforms, featuring the "Knighted Eras" number font. The font consists of four different eras of UCF football tied into one bigger and bolder look for the numbers (more in Knight Notes).
- ◆ New grass was planted in the offseason, replacing the original field that was installed in 2007. The new grass is TifTuf® Bermudagrass.
- Roth Tower looks a little different this season as it is undergoing construction to be completed in time for the 2026 season

# BY THE NUMBERS

The Knights have compiled 70 victories since the start of the 2017 season, the most of any program in the Big 12 Conference. The win total is tied for 14th most in the nation since that time.


UCF has scored 3,839 points since the start of 2017, the fifthmost in the nation behind Alabama, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Clemson and Memphis. The Knights have tallied the most in the Big 12; the closest to them is Oklahoma State at 3,438.

A win against North Carolina A&T would make it 3.185 consecutive days without a UCF loss under the direction of head coach Scott Frost. The last Knights loss with Frost at the helm was in the Cure Bowl to Arkansas State on Dec. 17, 2016. UCF returns four players who started six or more games last season. Paul Rubelt is the lone returner who started all 12

games in 2024. Malachi Lawrence and Nyjalik Kelly each had 11 while Braeden Marshall had six. UCF is one of 30 FBS programs with a new head coach this season. The Knights will face three FBS programs (Jacksonville

State, UNC, West Viriginia) who also have a new head coach.

The Knights welcome 63 new players to the roster this season, with the total roster size being 112. Of the 63 newcomers. 36 are transfers from DI schools while 18 are from high school.

- ◆ Help the Big 12 improve a 63-0 record against FCS programs since 2019, the only FBS conference to be unbeaten during that time


# **STAT FOCUS - BLOCK PARTY**



MIAMI (Sep. 6, 2013) - It was a methodical, efficient effort for UCF Friday night at FIU's Alfonso Field. The Knights slowly, surely picked apart the Panthers en route to a 38-0 victory that moved UCF to 2-0 on the young season.

It was the first shutout for UCF since defeating Memphis 41-0 on October 29, 2011. It was also the first time the Knights had held an opponent under 200 yards of total offense since the 2011 season. UCF out-gained the Panthers 390-173, averaging 6.6 yards per play, compared to just 3.0 for FIU.

Storm Johnson rushed for 89 yards on 18 carries to go with his three scores. William Stanback added 55 yards on the ground. Terrance Plummer led the Knights' defense with seven solo stops. Jordan Ozerities tallied six tackles, including two for loss of yardage.



- → The Knights have compiled the most wins since 2017 than anyone in the Big 12 Conference, posting 70 victories from 2017-present. Oklahoma State (66), Cincinnati (65), BYU (64) and Utah (64) join the top 25 in wins since 2017.
- \* The Black and Gold are tied for 14th nationally in wins since the start of the 2017 season, level with Texas and lowawho also have 70. UCF got the streak going by posting 13 wins in 2017, 12 victories in 2018 and 10 in 2019.
- ◆ The Knight's slot in among the nation's elite, as Georgia leads the way with 98, followed by Alabama (96), Ohio State (93), Clemson (91), Notre Dame (87), Oklahoma (79), Michigan and Oregon (78), Penn State (77), Boise State and LSU (75), Applaachian State and Memphis (73) while sitting tied with lowa and Texas. UCF is ahead of Army and Louisiana (68), SMU and Washington (67), Oklahoma State (66), Cincinnati and Fresno State (65), and BYU, Marshall, Troy, Utah and Wisconsin (64).

# **POINTS SINCE 2017**

- + The Knights sit seventh in the FBS in most points scored since 2017, putting 3,839 points on the scoreboard.
- + UCF's points are the most by a current Big 12 program over that time, the next closest is Oklahoma State who sit 15th with 3,438. Other opponents on UCF's schedule this season in the top 25 in points since 2017 include North Carolina, sitting 19th with 3,334 points and Texas Tech at No. 24 with 3,235.
- → The Black and Gold sit behind Alabama (4,494), Ohio State (4,290), Oklahoma (4,161), Georgia (4,013), Clemson (3,992), and Memphis (3,896).
- ◆ UCF is fifth in points from touchdowns, registering 503

- ◆ The three starters on defense who started six or more games last season account for 11.7% of tackles in 2024 (90 of 772), 22.2% of tackles for loss (18.5) of 83), 47.7% of sacks (10.5 of 22) and one of nine interceptions
- → In total, 14 defensive returners from the 2024 roster tallied 148 tackles (19.2%), 22.5 tackles for loss (27.1%) 12 sacks (54.5%) and two of nine picks
- ◆ Offensive returners tallied 694 rushing yards (23.3%) and 88 receiving yards (3.7%)

- Running backs Myles Montgomery and Jaden Nixon are poised to be a one-two punch on the gridiron, and have already proved the same in podcasting
- ◆ So far, the duo has hosted eight episodes in the preseason, welcoming guests such as legendary UCF running back Latavius Murray, as well as current teammates such as Paul Rubelt, Dalton Riggs, Keli Lawson and more

- ◆ UCF extended its Thursday winning streak to 11 with the win over Jacksonville State, the third-longest active streak in college football
- ◆ Two conference mates, Oklahoma State and Utah, lead the active list with 13 and 12 straight Thursday wins each, respectively, after week 1 of 2025
- ◆ Other active Thursday win streaks include Memphis with nine and Toledo and Clemson with eight each. The longest Thursday winning streak in college football history belongs to Miami (FL) at 15 which went from 1998-2008.

◆ Scott Frost's return to UCF makes him one of 16 active head coaches who coached at a school, left and returned. Frost, along with Rich Rodriguez (West Virginia) and Matt Viator (McNeese) are set to start their second term as head coach when the 2025 season kicks off. The full list of the 16 active head coaches making returns to a previous stop are: Scott Frost (UCF), Rich Rodriguez (West Virginia), Matt Viator (McNeese), Kelley Lee (Eastern New Mexico), Mike Furrey (Limestone), Mike Locksley (Maryland), Bo Atterberry (Southeastern Oklahoma State), Joe Dupaix (Southern Virginia), Ted Karras Jr. (Marian [Ind.]), Lance Hinson (Saint Mary), Mike Cardner (Tabor), Bobby Hauck (Montana), Greg Schiano (Rutgers), Shannon Currier (Concordia-St. Paul), Todd Whitten (Tarleton State), Tom Kelley (Framingham State).

- ◆ Last season, UCF was tied for the second-fewest touchdowns allowed in the fourth quarter in all of FBS, allowing just five offensive TDs in the fourth
- ◆ While Northern Illinois led the nation with just four fourth quarter offensive scores allowed, UCF led the Big 12 with the fewest in the category and was tied at five with Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, James Madison, Ole Miss and Wyoming
- ◆ A handful of other Big 12 programs were close to the Knights, as Houston and Iowa State each allowed six fourth quarter offensive scores while Cincinnati allowed seven

- ◆ A handful of Knights have been named to preseason watchlists throughout the fall, with Jaden Nixon leading the way with four nods
- + Running back Jaden Nixon was named to four preseason watchlists: Maxwell Award (college player of the year), Paul Hornung (most versatile player in college football), Doak Walker (best running back), Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award (offensive player who exhibit the enduring characteristics that define Earl Campbell; also must either be born in Texas, attended high school in Texas or attend a college/university in Texas).
- \* Running back Myles Montgomery joined Nixon on the Doak Walker Award watchlist, an honor former Knight RJ Harvey and was a two-time semifinalist for
- ◆ Paul Rubelt was tabbed to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy watchlist, college football's premiere award for community service
- → Cam Fancher and John Walker were named to the Comeback Player of the Year watchlist; Walker missed all last season while Fancher missed time late

- ◆ UCF had a trio of Knights named to Phil Steele's 2025 Preseason Big 12 Teams
- ◆ A pair of Knights made their way onto the Second Team; defensive end Nyjalik Kelly earned the nod after 5.5 sacks for the Black and Gold last year while running back Jaden Nixon compiled 921 yards for Western Michigan
- → Fifth-year senior and Knight offensive lineman Paul Rubelt earned a spot on the Third Team after grading out at a 78.7% clip in pass blocking and helping the Knights finish fifth nationally in rushing offense per game

- ◆ UCF newcomer and defensive back Phillip Dunnam graded as the fifth highest safety in the Big 12 Conference, according to PFF College,
- ◆ He earned a 76.6 grade. Proceeding him was TCU's Bud Clark (89.8), Houston's CJ Douglas (85.7), Utah's Tao Johnson (82.5) and Cincinnati's Antwan Peek Jr. (80.9). Dunnam checks in ahead of West Virginia's Jordan Walker (75.1), rounding out the top half-dozen safties in the Big 12.
- → Last season, Dunnam suited up for Florida Atlantic, eight starts in 11 games played; he tallied 56 tackles, 2.5 of which were for a loss, and three picks


- ◆ UCF debuted new uniforms for the 2025 season and the return of head coach Scott Frost. The uniforms are a fresh blend of classic and modern elements that pay homage to multiple iconic eras in UCF football history. The numbers in particular have four different eras represented:
  - \* The drop shadow on the numbers are a nod to 1998, the year UCF QB Daunte Culpepper finish top 10 in Heisman voting
  - → The notches in the numbers were introduced in 2013, the year UCF QB Blake Bortles led the Knights to a Fiesta Bowl victory, they also replicate the block "Knights" wordmark in the endzones of the Bounce House.
    + Select tones and edges were selected from UCF's "Knighted" font which was featured in the program's rise to the Big 12.

  - The numbers on the new uniforms are bigger and bolder than the most recent version, a nod to large numbers worn from 2016-21.
- ◆ In addition to the new number font, shoulder numbers return to UCF's uniforms from the 2016-21 versions. The shoulders keep a nod to the pegasus, the university's academic logo, by featuring an oversized pegasus wing which was first featured on UCF's 2023 Mission VII Space uniforms. The pants on the new uniforms feature three larger polaris stars, representing UCF's past, present and future. The polaris star also makes an appearance inside the numbers as the shape of the perforation in the numbers. The polaris star is also a part of the university's academic logo.

- ◆ Tayven Jackson's brother Trayce Jackson-Davis is a member of the Golden State Warriors, averaging 7.1 points per game over his career heading into the 2025-26 campaign; Tayven's father, Ray, played cornerback at Washington State and was a member of the Cougars' 1998 Pac-10 championship and went on to play in the NFL for four seasons, NFL Europe for two and Arena Football League for one.
- ◆ Phillip Dunnam's uncle is Miami Heat legend Udonis Haslem, while his cousins E.J. Biggers (cornerback) and Louis Delamas (safety) played in the NFL Jaden Nixon's second cousin is NFL legend Adrian Peterson. Nixon's father, Jeroid Johnson played football and ran track at Oklahoma State while his cousin LaKyron
- Mays ran for the track team there as well. Two more of Jaden's cousins, Larry and Issiah, just wrapped up their college careers on the defensive side of the ball.
- ◆ Davi Belfort's father is retired UFC and Brazilian pro boxer Vitor Belfort
- → Jayden Bellamy's father, Jay, played in the NFL for 14 seasons with the Saints and Seahawks. Jayden's sister, Brellyn (Bre), played five seasons of college basketball
- + Kam Moore's father, Ron, played in the NFL for six seasons, scoring 14 touchdowns and rushing for 2,210 yards
- Agyeman Addae's father, Jahmile Addae, currently coaches cornerbacks for the Buffalo Bills
   Jabari Brooks' father, Willie Kelly, played fullback at Auburn from 1988-92, wining SEC titles in 1988 and 1989. His borthers Karekin (RB at Penn), Kelly (EDGE at Mercer) and Djimon (DL at Georgia Tech) all recently wrapped up their college careers
- ◆ Zack Palmer's father, Mike, also played football at UCF, suiting up as a linebacker from 1995-98
- + Brothers Carson and Chase Hinshaw are both rostered as wide receivers on this years roster; nephew of former UCF OC Darin Hinshaw
- ◆ Two members of Tyreek'e Robinson's family, Sam Shields and Demarcus Christmas, were drafted into the NFL

# **CUSA TIES**

- + Since it's inception in 1995, Conference USA has seen 33 FBS porgrams have played in or are currently a part of the league, equalling 24.3% of the FBS teams. UCF was one of those teams, joining the league in 2005 before playing its final season in the league in 2012.
- → The Black and Gold won two conference championships while members of CUSA, doing so in 2007 and 2010. The Knights finished first or tied for first in the East Division four times while members (2005, 2007, 2010, 2012).
- → Jacksonville State is the most recent champion of Conference USA, winning the 2024 title after joining the league in 2023.
- ◆ Other teams that have come from Conference USA that are on UCF's 2025 schedule include Cincinnati and Houston

- ◆ Fourteen members of this year's UCF squad are making the jump to the FBS level this season
- → The Knights have eight players who are new to a Division I roster and an additional six that make the jump to FBS from FCS
- ◆ The eight Knights that are making the jump to Division I this season are: DJ Black (Limestone DII / South Carolina), Dominick Campbell (Howard and Notre Dame men's basketball), Anthony Coaxum (W.V. Wesleyan/Kentucky Christian/Carson-Newman) Dallan "Deebo" Coleman (UCF and Georgia Tech men's basketball), Mason Denaburg (MiLB, Washington Nationals organization), Laparka Langston (NW Mississippi - NJCAA), Justin Royes (Virginia Union - DII), Owen Spell (Limestone - DII / Madonna)
- ◆ Additionally, six Knights make their jump from FCS to FBS in the 2025 season: Jabari Brooks (Samford), Chris Domercant (Chattanooga / Stonehill), Cole Kozlowski (Colgate), Jeffson Lafontant (Bethune-Cookman), Connor Meadows (Tennessee State / Tennessee), Isaiah Reed (Brown)

# **MULTI-SPORT ATHLETES**

- ◆ Plenty of Knights on this year's roster were multi-sport athletes in high school, but a few have gone on to play multiple sports at some high levels
- → Punter Mason Denaburg recently traded in a baseball for a football after pitching in the Washington Nationals minor league organization after being a first round selection in the 2018 MLB draft. He appeared in 88 games across rookie ball to High-A, punching out 139 batters in the process.
- + Tight end Dallan "Deebo" Coleman dons the Black and Gold for a second straight season, just on a diferent playing surface. After playing basketball at Georgia Tech for the first three seasons of his college career, Coleman transferred to UCF, helping the Knights reach the College Basketball Crown championship game. He averaged 6.7 points per game over his career, shooting 33.6% from the three-point line.
- + Offensive lineman Dominick Campbell also transitions from the hardwood to the gridiron, playing basketball at Notre Dame his freshman year before spending the last two seasons with Howard. He averaged 5.8 points and 3.7 rebounds per game while shooting 49.7% from the floor.

- + The Knights have a chance to add two new nations to the all-time letterwinners list this season, welcoming Aymeric Koumba of France and Davi Belfort of Brazil
- → Both players transferred in this season, as Koumba joins UCF from Michigan and Belfort from Virginia Tech
- Overall, UCF has six different nations represented on this year's roster: United States, France, Brazil, Italy, Canada and Germany

- ◆ For the fifth consecutive season and the sixth time since 2019, UCF has sold out of its football season tickets allotment
- → The lone season that separated the streak was due to a COVID-19 affected 2020 season
- ◆ With the sell out of season tickets, UCF is excited to reintroduce the Bounce Pass. The Bounce Pass is the most unique way to experience UCF Football allowing you to bounce around the stadium to take in gameday from different areas of Acrisure Bounce House

# **UNDERRATED BY THE AP**

- According to Brett McMurphy of On3, UCF was listed as the No. 12 most underrated team by the AP poll since 2014, comparing the Associated Press' preseason Top 25 rankings with the AP's final rankings each season.
- ← Eight Big 12 Conference teams made the list of underrated teams, with BYU at No. 1, TCU at No. 4, Cincinnati at No. 6, Arizona State at No. 9, UCF at No. 12, Houston at No. 16, Oklahoma State at No. 17 and Arizona at No. 19
- ◆ On the flip side, UCF will face a non-conference opponent this seaosn on the top 25 most overrated teams list as North Carolina checks in at No. 12. Also on the most overrated list is Utah at No. 18, Iowa State at No. 23 and Kansas State at No. 24.

- + 2025 marks the 30th season of Big 12 Football, which held its inaugural season in 1996
- ★ As of Sunday night, the Big 12 leads all FBS conferences in passing yards (4,255), passing touchdowns (42) and touchdown-to-interception ratio (14.0).
   ★ The Big 12 is a combined 63-0 against FCS programs since the start of 2019. It is the only FBS conference to be undefeated against FCS schools during that time.
- + Big 12 QB Club: The Big 12 has nine teams that return guarterbacks who threw for 2,400 yards or more last season, nearly twice the total of any other Power 4 conference. The Conference also bolstered its QB class with talented newcomers.
- + The Big 12 will create excitement again this season after the Conference led the nation in 2024 in fourth-quarter lead changes and go-ahead scores in the final minute of conference games.
- ◆ The Big 12 Conference will publicly provide player availability reports for all Conference games this season



# **KNIGHT NOTES**

- ◆ While UCF has faced the No. 1 team in the nation head-to-head just once, the Knights have a streak of playing historic programs that at some point in the program's history have reached a No. 1 ranking. Including 2025, the Knights have five consecutive regular seasons of playing one of those teams. If bowl games are included, the streak extends all the way back to Scott Frost's first year with the Knights, 2016.
- ◆ Since 2006, the only season that didn't include a previous No. 1 in the regular season or bowl game was 2015.
- → The Knights' 2025 schedule sees BYU and North Carolina on that list, with BYU earning four weeks at No. 1, most recently in 1984 while North Carolina earned one number one ranking in 1948. 



# **ACRISURE BOUNCE HOUSE**



The crown jewel in UCF's impressive Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village, Acrisure Bounce House, opened in 2007. The campus facility gives the Knights one of the top venues in the southeast. After spending their previous 28 seasons at the Florida Citrus Bowl (now known as Camping World Stadium) in downtown Orlando, the Knights made their debut in the new on-campus facility on Sept. 15, 2007 against the Texas Longhorns. A capacity crowd was on hand for the game, which was televised live nationally on ESPN2.

In its inaugural campaign at the stadium, UCF completed the season with six-straight wins at home, including a 44-25 victory over Tulsa in the Conference USA Championship game. When UCF hosted Miami on Oct. 17, 2009, a facility-record 48,453 fans were on hand for the contest.

Located on the modern north side of campus, the stadium features luxury boxes, a large club lounge and a natural grass playing surface.

In the summer of 2015, the stadium enjoyed its first major renovation with the addition of the Carl Black and Gold Cabana. This is premium area inside Acrisure Bounce House became one of the signatures of the UCF game-day experience. The Cabana is a 10,000-square-foot, Florida-themed social area and lounge located between the 30-yard lines. The section was expanded prior to the 2017 campaign with 2,921 chair-back seats and features open-air sun deck to enjoy the game.

Two more premium areas were added for 2017. Eight field-level cabanas were added at the south end zone with access to the enclosed air conditioned J and J Rosengren Lounge. The concourse between sections 108-113 was converted into the Stadium Club. This premium area on the popular west side of the stadium, provides access to dedicated food and drink options, as well as plenty of other amenities.

Just in time for the 2016 season, the video board was upgraded to a 114 by 36 feet LED display. It features a Daktronics 15MM HD pixel layout for excellent image clarity. The display also has variable content zoning, allowing it to show one large image or be divided into multiple windows to show any variety of live video, instant replays, statistics, scoring, graphics, animations and sponsorship messages.

The addition of a ribbon display to the south end zone was unveiled in 2017. This display measures more than seven feet high by 199 feet wide.

Acrisure Bounce House has new grass for the first time since it opened back in 2007. This summer, Carolina Green Corp. installed TifTuf ® Bermudagrass, replacing the stadium's original field. The grass came from a sod farm in Vero Beach.

Acrisure Bounce House is enduring its largest renovation in years as Roth Tower is set to be expanded with a completion date of Fall 2026. Currently home to suites, the press box and more, the new Roth Tower will enhance the gameday experience and serve as a premier event space in east Orange County.

The existing tower and club spaces will remain operational for the 2025 season. The north and south expansion structure and roof will take shape around existing tower while the west expansion foundations and columns will be in place. At the conclusion of the 2025 season the existing tower will cease operations to complete remaining structure and interior buildout

The tower will increase premium capacity, expand suite offerings, and provide unique event opportunities year-round, attracting more fans, visitors and events to the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village beyond game days.

The Tower is Go for Launch in Fall of 2026. The new Roth Tower will see a 256% increase in square footage of useable club space for gameday and non-gameday events (4,400 SF to 15,650 SF). It will also include loge seating, 42% more club seats, 28 luxury suites that are 38% larger in size than current suites and 34 new outdoor sky suites. The new tower will include four levels and will provide substanially more shade across the stadium bowl.

# Scott FROST

Head Coach / First Season, Third Season Overall at UCF

After an unforgettable two-year run that saw the UCF football program rise to national prominence, Scott Frost is coming back home.

Known for sparking the "Charge On" spirit and guiding UCF to its first perfect season, Frost was re-introduced as the program's next head coach by UCF Vice President and Director of Athletics Terry Mohajir on Dec. 8. 2024.

Frost originally served as UCF's head coach from 2016 to 2017, culminating in a historic 13-0 season, an AAC championship and a national championship that captured the nation's attention. In his final game, Frost guided UCF to a victory over No. 7 Auburn in the 2018 Peach Bowl, securing the program's first undefeated season in school history.

Frost posted the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history at UCF, inheriting a 0-12 team in 2015 and taking the Knights to a perfect season in his second and final year, when he was named the national coach of the year.

"I'm deeply honored to return to UCF, a school that has always held a special place in my heart," Frost said. "The foundation we built here has only grown stronger, and I am thrilled to continue shaping this program's legacy. As we prepare for year three in the Big 12 Conference, I look forward to working alongside our dedicated student-athletes, talented staff, and passionate fans to reach new heights together."

Frost went a combined 19-7 in two seasons at UCF, helping turn an 0-12 team into a 13-0 squad in just two years. In Frost's first season, he took the Knights to a bowl game and finished with a 6-7 record. The turnaround was historic, as Frost became the only first-year coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season. UCF led the nation with a six-win improvement in 2016 and exceeded that mark in 2017 as the nation's only undefeated team. The Knights put together the first undefeated regular season in UCF and AAC history in 2017, posted the longest winning streak in school history at the time of his departure (13 games), achieved the highest in-season ranking in program history (10th), highest final ranking (6th) and set an AAC record with 16 all-conference selections.

UCF was led by its high-powered offense and improved defense under Frost. The Knights led the nation in scoring at 48.2 points per game and were the only FBS team to score at least 30 points in every game in 2017. Defensively, UCF improved its scoring defense by 65 spots in Frost's two seasons.

In addition to being the unanimous choice as the 2017 AAC Coach of the Year, Frost was honored as the national coach of the year by the Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association, the Touchdown Club of Columbus, the Lombardi Award and FCA in addition to winning the Home Depot, Paul "Bear" Bryant and Eddie Robinson coach-of-the-year awards.

Frost began his coaching career at Northern Iowa in 2007 as a linebackers coach and was promoted to co-defensive coordinator in 2008. That season, his defense excelled, tying for third in the FCS with 40 takeaways and ranking ninth in scoring defense, allowing just 17.7 points per game. The 12-3 Panthers also led the Missouri Valley Football Conference in both rushing defense (107.1 yards per game) and scoring defense.

In 2009, Frost joined the Oregon coaching staff as the wide receivers coach under head coach Chip Kelly and offensive coordinator Mark Helfrich. Frost helped Oregon post a 79-14 record in his seven seasons, during which time the Ducks won four conference titles and twice played for the national championship.

Oregon never ranked lower than eighth nationally in scoring offense during Frost's seven seasons on staff, and the Ducks led the nation in scoring in 2010. Frost was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2013, and Oregon ranked in the top five nationally in both scoring and total offense each of his three seasons calling plays. The Ducks scored 681 points in 2014, the second-highest total in NCAA history. Oregon made it to the College Football Playoff Championship Game that year, when Frost was one of five finalists for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the nation's top assistant. Frost's quarterback, Marcus Mariota, won the Heisman Trophy and was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2015 NFL Draft.

After Kelly left for the Philadelphia Eagles, Oregon promoted Mark Helfrich to head coach and named Frost offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2013. In this role, Frost guided Marcus Mariota to a Heisman Trophy win and a berth in the national championship game. During Frost's tenure as offensive coordinator, Oregon recorded a 33–8 record and consistently ranked among the nation's top teams in scoring and total offense. His standout performance in 2014 earned him a finalist spot for the prestigious Broyles Award, recognizing the nation's top assistant coach.

Following his two years at UCF, Scott Frost served as the head football coach at the University of Nebraska for four-plus seasons from 2018 to 2022, coaching the first three games of the 2022 season. Frost posted a 16-31 record with the Cornhuskers. His tenure was defined by close losses, as 23 of his 31 losses were by single digits, including each of his final 13. Nebraska lost 22 one-score games during Frost's career, including 12 games by five or fewer points.

Last season, Frost had been serving as a coaching consultant for Sean McVay and the Los Angeles Rams.

- → Beal began his coaching journey at Rocky Mountain College (2005–2008) working with wide receivers and running backs followed by a graduate assistant role at Texas State and sprinter coaching at MSU Billings

# Knights Earn 300th Program Win with a Triumph over Jacksonville State

ORLANDO - In a game that stretched across more than five hours, two quarterbacks, and a two-hour, seven-minute weather delay, the Knights defeated a determined Jacksonville State squad to open the second Scott Frost era with a gutsy 17-10 victory Thursday night at Acrisure Bounce House.

UCF leaned on depth and timely execution to grind out its first win of the season and give Frost a successful return to the program. The Knights totaled 422 yards of offense and held Jacksonville State to 322, making key plays on both sides of the ball when it mattered most.

UCF quarterback Tayven Jackson, stepping in early in the second quarter after starter Cam Fancher exited with an injury following the weather delay, delivered an efficient and composed performance. He completed 17 of 24 passes for 282 yards and two touchdowns, providing the offense with rhythm and stability in his first action as a member of the Black and Gold.

"I'm happy that we got out of it and that we got out of it with a win. That's all that mattered, a win is a win." -Tavven Jackson

Running back Myles Montgomery was a consistent force throughout the night, totaling 150 yards with 79 rushing yards on 21 carries while adding 71 through the air on three catches. His ability to extend drives and break off chunk plays helped UCF stay in control of the possession for most of the game.

After both teams traded early field goals, Jacksonville State found the end zone for the first time on a 10-yard rush by Andrew Paul with 12:01 left in the game.

UCF immediately responded, however, when Jackson connected with Dylan Wade on a 40-yard catch-and-run touchdown pass in with 9:30 left to tie the game at 10-10. Jackson found Wade all alone over the middle after sneaking out from his tight end position and darted down the right side for UCF's first TD of the season.

Then with just under two minutes to go and JSU driving into UCF territory, defensive back Jayden Williams stuffed Gamecock's running back Cam Cook on a fourth-down, hurry-up play to turn the ball over on downs to the Knights.

"Jayden got a game ball," Frost said. "He's one of a number of new guys around here, but he's played a lot of football and is very savvy. When they handed it off it looked liked they dented our line a little and I thought it was a first down ... but he just shot in there and knifed and that was probably the biggest play of the game."

Then, starting at their own 36-yard line, UCF marched 64 yards in six plays to take the lead late and seal the win. After two incompletions, Jackson took off on a 15-yard scramble on third down to the JSU 34-yard line. Then, when many thought UCF would play it safe and inch closer for a go-ahead field goal on 3rd and 9, Jackson hit wide receiver DJ Black on a naked bootleg in stride over the middle for a 33-yard score and the lead with just over a

"We were sitting there and kinda said, "let's win this thing"," Frost said. "I think a lot of people were probably expecting us to call something and kick a field goal. But we still had a couple bullets in the chamber, and we hit one."

"It was a great play call by Coach Frost." Black said. "The offensive line held up real well. D Wade made a good block on the edge and Tayven threw me a great ball and it landed right in the pocket."

The UCF defense held strong the rest of the way, limiting big plays and forcing a key fourth-down stop late in the fourth quarter.

The win marked the 300th in program history and extended UCF's streak to 10 straight opening game victories. It also marked the Knights' 11th consecutive Thursday night win, the third most such wins in all of FBS history

Frost's season-opening win was his 20th career victory with the Knights and extended his winning streak to 14 games in Black and Gold.
