Coming off its first of three bye weeks during the 2025 season, Kansas State looks to regroup in its Big 12 home opener when the Wildcats host UCF on Saturday inside Bill Snyder Family Stadium. The game kicks off at 11 a.m., and will be shown nationally on FS1 with Connor Onion (play-by-play) and Mark Helfrich (analyst) on the

2 Each of Kansas State's first four games this season have been decided by one score as the first three games were by a margin of a field goal, while its game at Arizona was decided by six points. K-State is the only team in the nation to already have four games decided by one possession. The Wildcats were 4-2 last season when the final margin was eight or less points.

Quarterback **Avery Johnson** is set to make his 19th-career start under center having thrown for 851 yards and six touchdowns through the first four games. His favorite target has been wide receiver Jayce Brown, who has 25 catches for 284 yards and two touchdowns. Brown ranks 21st nationally and third in the Big 12 in receptions per game (6.25), while he has a catch in each of the last 25 games dating back to 2023.

Linebackers Austin Romaine and Des Purnell lead the Wildcats in tackles with 37 and 28, respectively. Romaine ranks 22nd in the country and fourth in the Big 12 with 9.3 tackles per game, while his average of 5.75 solo tackles per game ranks 11th in the nation. Cornerback Zashon Rich is tied for the Big 12 lead with five pass breakups, and the Wildcats rank seventh in the country with four fumble recoveries.

K-State's specialists have started the year strong. Kicker Luis Rodriguez drilled a 51-yard field goal at Arizona, and he is 4-for-4 on field goal attempts and 11-for-11 on extra points. Punter Simon McClannan ranks fifth in the Big 12 with a 43.5-yard average. Bryce Noernberg returned a kickoff 99 yards for a score against Army, and Garrett Harstad blocked a punt at Arizona.

STATISTICAL SPOTLIGHTS

RECENT RECAP

- Kansas State's first of three bye weeks in the 2025 season came at a time when the Wildcats are looking to rebound from a 1-3 start to the season.
- All four of K-State's games this season have been decided by one possession. In three of the four games, the Wildcats trailed late in the fourth quarter and had the ball with a chance to either tie or take the lead.
- K-State was able to put together a 10-play, 81-yard drive over 1:03 against North Dakota, scoring a touchdown with 42 seconds remaining to swing a 35-31 deficit into a 38-35 victory.
- The next week against Army, K-State had the ball with less than two minutes remaining and got into plus territory until an interception sealed the Black Knights' three-point win.
- Six days later at Arizona, K-State had the ball near midfield with just over one minute remaining, but a turnover on downs ended the contest in a six-point defeat.

CATS IN BIG 12 HOME OPENERS

- Kansas State is 18-11 all-time in its Big 12 home openers, including wins in each of its last three opportunities against Texas Tech (2022), UCF (2023) and Oklahoma State (2024).
- The Wildcats' first Big 12 home contest was the first ever Big 12 Conference game when they defeated Texas Tech, 21-14, at then-KSU Stadium on August 31, 1996.

A MORNING CONTEST

- Saturday's game against UCF is the first time K-State will kick off in the morning (local time) since almost exactly one year to the day.
- The last time the Wildcats played a game that kicked off at 11 a.m., was a 42-20 home victory over Oklahoma State on September 28, 2024.
- K-State has played 12-straight games that kicked off in the afternoon or evening, including 10 that began at 6 p.m. or later local time.
- The Wildcats' 2025 season opener in Dublin, Ireland, against lowa State kicked off at 11 a.m. in the Central Time Zone but began at 5 p.m. in Irish Standard Time.

FOUR ONE-SCORE GAMES

- Of Kansas State's last 16 games dating back to Week 2 of the 2024 season, 10 have been decided by just one score.
- Last year, the Wildcats went 4-2 in one-possession games. All four of the victories were fourth-quarter comebacks, which ranked second in the nation to Illinois' five.
- This season, K-State has played four one-possession games but has only come out on the winning side one time.
- The four one-score games this year are the most in the FBS. Second on the list is lowa State Army and UConn as each have played three one-score games.

TOWARD THE TOP IN CONSISTENCY

- K-State is one of only 10 Power 4 schools that have won at least nine games in each of the last three seasons, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, LSU, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oregon, Penn State and Tennessee.
- Among those teams, only Kansas State, Alabama, Clemson, Georgia and Oregon have accomplished that feat in addition to winning a conference championship during that timeframe.
- The Wildcats are tied for 17th among Power 4 teams and are second among current Big 12 programs with 29 total wins since the beginning of 2022.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

- K-State has a total of 232 victories since 1996, which ranks 22nd nationally.
- Among active Big 12 teams, the Wildcats rank fourth behind BYU (242), TCU (241) and Utah (236).

A WINNING TRADITION

- Kansas State has totaled 144 Big 12 victories since the conference's formation in 1996, which stands as the most among active Big 12 programs.
- The Cats are also second among active Big 12 members in winning percentage since non-divisional play began in 2011. They sit at 59.1% (75-52), trailing only Oklahoma State (61.1%; 77-49).
- During that stretch, the Wildcats are 42-21 (66.7%) at home in Big 12 play and 33-31 (51.6%) on the road/neutral.

OFFENSIVE NOTES TOTAL OFFENSE

- K-State has totaled at least 375 yards of offense in 34 of the last 44 games dating back to the beginning of the 2022 season.
- The 34 games with at least 375 yards are tied for 10th among Power 4 programs and ranks second among Big 12 schools.
- Georgia leads the way with 39, followed by USC (38), Oregon (37), TCU (37), Ole Miss (36), Texas (36), LSU (35) and Washington (35).
- During that stretch, K-State holds a 27-7 record when totaling at least 375 yards, while the Wildcats are 2-8 when going under that mark.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

- Since Chris Klieman's first season at K-State in 2019, the Wildcats have been the best in the Big 12 in terms of converting red-zone opportunities into points.
- The Wildcats rank first in the Big 12 with an 89.9% (277-of-308) success rate in the red zone since 2019, just ahead of Texas Tech (88.1%) and Oklahoma State (87.5%).
- K-State also ranks first in the league in touchdown success rate at 66.9% (206-of-308), ahead of Kansas (66.3%) and Utah (65.6%).

- Quarterback **Avery Johnson** produced the first 300-yard passing game of his career against North Dakota when he totaled 318 yards and a career-high tying three touchdowns on 28-of-43 aim. His completion and attempt totals were also a career high.
- It was the 46th 300-yard passing game in school history and the first since Will Howard went for 327 yards during an overtime contest at Texas in 2023.

VERY RESPONSIBLE

- Avery Johnson has been responsible for 52 total touchdowns in his 25 career games played to rank ninth in school history.
- His touchdown responsibility total is tied for 27th nationally among active players but ranks sixth among non-seniors.
- A native of Wichita, Kansas, Johnson has 36 career passing touchdowns to tie for sixth in school history two shy of taking over sole possession of fifth place while his 16 career rushing touchdowns rank ninth in school history among quarterbacks.

NEARING 1,000

- Avery Johnson has rushed for 963 yards in his career, just 37 yards shy of becoming the seventh K-State quarterback to reach the 1,000-yard mark.
- Johnson has averaged 5.07 yards on his 190 career rushes, which would rank eighth in school history if he had 10 more rushes to meet the minimum.
- When taking away sack yardage, Johnson has rushed for 1,108 yards on 173 true rushing attempts, good for a 6.40-yard clip.

FAVORITE TARGET

- **Avery Johnson**'s favorite target to open the 2025 season has been wide receiver **Jayce Brown**, who has 25 receptions for 284 yards and two touchdowns over the first four games.
- Brown's 6.25 receptions per game this season rank 21st nationally and third in the Big 12.
- Brown hauled in 12 catches against North Dakota, which tied for the seventh-most catches in a single game in school history, doubled his previous career high of six (last year at Colorado) and were the most by a Wildcat since Tyler Lockett had 13 in the final game of his career in the 2014 Alamo Bowl vs. UCLA.
- Brown tallied at least 100 scrimmage yards in the final two games of 2024 and in three of the first four games of 2025 after only one such performance in the first 21 games of his career.



CATCH STREAK

- Jayce Brown has recorded at least one reception in each of the last 25 games dating back to the 2023 Texas Tech contest.
- It is the 14th-longest active streak in the nation and fourth in the Big 12 behind Baylor's Kole Wilson (34 games), TCU's Joseph Manjack IV (30 games) and BYU's Chase Roberts (29 games).
- It is the longest streak by a Wildcat since Phillip Brooks went 25-straight games with a reception over the 2022 and 2023 seasons.
- If he were to record a catch against UCF, Brown's streak would be the longest by a Wildcat since Deuce Vaughn held a 33game streak that spanned from his first-career game in 2020 through the 10th game of 2022.
- A 26-game catch streak would be the longest by a K-State wide receiver since Curry Sexton also went 26-straight games, catching a pass in every game over the 2013 and 2014 seasons. Dalton Schoen had a catch in 31-straight games in which he played over the 2017, 2018 and 2019 seasons, but he missed four games during that timeframe.

TO THE HOUSE

- Jayce Brown opened the second half at Arizona with a 75yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage to get the Wildcats back to within one score.
- His 75-yard run was the Wildcats' longest rush since Deuce Vaughn had an 88-yard score against Alabama in the 2022 Sugar Bowl.
- It was the longest rush by a K-State wide receiver since Malik Knowles had a 75-yard score on the first play from scrimmage of the 2022 season against South Dakota.

DEFENSIVE NOTES CONTINUITY ON THE STAFF

- Each of the Wildcats' full-time coaches on the defensive side of the ball have been the same since 2020, as Kansas State and lowa are the only two programs in the country to lay that claim.
- · However, lowa utilizes four positional coaches on defense, whereas K-State employs five.
- Safeties coach Joe Klanderman was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2020, the same year that cornerbacks coach Van Malone was elevated to assistant head coach and Steve **Stanard** joined the staff to coach the linebackers. Defensive tackles coach Mike Tuiasosopo and defensive ends coach **Buddy Wyatt** – along with Klanderman and Malone – were members of Chris Klieman's original staff at K-State in 2019.

LIMITED POINTS PER GAME

- Since the 2021 season (57 games), the Cats are allowing just 22.1 points per game, which ranks 27th nationally and third among current Big 12 teams.
- · Additionally, the Cats have allowed 144 offensive touchdowns (2.5 per game) over that time to tie 18th among Power 4 schools (minimum 40 games).
- The Wildcats have finished each of the three previous seasons allowing less than 24.0 points per game, their longest streak since going 13-straight years from 1991 through 2003.
- · Since head coach Chris Klieman's first year of 2019, the Wildcats have held 42 of their 54 Big 12 opponents under their season average at the time it faces the Wildcats (excluding 2025 season opener against lowa State).

CREATING TURNOVERS

- Since the beginning of 2022, K-State has forced 67 turnovers, which is tied for the most among active Big 12 teams and 13th among Power 4 teams.
- Of the 66 turnovers, 40 have been via interception to tie for fourth among all active Big 12 programs and tie for 20th among Power 4 teams.

JUMPING ON THE BALL

- Although the Wildcats only have one interception through the first four games of 2025, K-State has had a propensity for falling on fumbles this season as it ranks seventh nationally and is tied for first in the Big 12 with four fumble recoveries.
- The four fumble recoveries this season are the most through the first four games of a season since 2017 when that squad also fell on four fumbles. Last year, the Wildcats only had five fumble recoveries in 13 games.
- · K-State's four recoveries this season have come from four different players. Austin Romaine and Chiddi Obiazor each had one in the season opener against lowa State, Tobi Osunsanmi recovered one against North Dakota, and long snapper Mason Olguin recovered a muffed punt at Arizona.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK

- K-State finished the 2024 season ranked 25th nationally and second in the Big 12 with 2.69 sacks per game.
- It was the Wildcats' best national ranking since 2015 (No. 9) and highest sacks-per-game mark since 2020 (2.80).
- Kansas State's 35 sacks a year ago resulted in 249 lost yards, which ranked 11th in the Power 4 and first in the Big 12.
- It was the most sack yardage by the Wildcats since 2003 (345) and tied for the fifth most by any K-State team in the Big 12 era (since 1996).
- · After starting out the 2025 season by recording seven sacks in its first two games, K-State has only recorded two in its two most recent games.

ROMAINE LEADING THE WAY

- · After leading the Wildcats in tackles last season en route to All-Big 12 Second Team honors, linebacker Austin Romaine is back at it again in 2025.
- A product of Hillsboro, Missouri, Romaine has a team-leading 37 tackles, ranking 22nd in the nation and fourth in the Big 12 with 9.3 tackles per game. The junior has collected 5.75 solo tackles per game through four contests to rank 11th nationally and first in the conference.
- Romaine has at least eight tackles in every game this season, including a pair of 10-tackle performances against North Dakota and Army.
- · Last season, Romaine led the Wildcats and ranked ninth in the conference with 96 tackles (7.38 per game). He was the first Wildcat with at least 90 tackles in a season since Jayd Kirby had 99 in 2017.

SENIOR STANDOUT

- · Ranking second in the tackle department is senior Des Pur**nell**, who has totaled 28 stops this season, including 5.00 solo tackles per game to rank 26th in the country and third in the
- A native of Topeka, Kansas, Purnell recorded a career-high 10 tackles against Army and topped that mark six days later with 11 stops at Arizona.

WILDCATS IN THE NFL

With NFL season in full swing, Kansas State currently has 20 players on NFL rosters. Of the 20, there are 11 on offense and nine on defense.

The longest-tenured former Wildcats are Tyler Lockett and Cornelius Lucas as both are entering their 11th season, but both are playing with new teams. Lockett is now with the Tennessee Titans after spending the first 10 seasons of his career with the Seattle Seahawks, while Lucas will suit up for the Cleveland Browns after spending the last five seasons with the Washington Commanders.



Four players from last year's roster are now on NFL teams, including thirdround pick Jacob Parrish (Tampa Bay) and fifth-round selections DJ Giddens (Indianapolis) and Marques Sigle (San Francisco).

K-State closed out its non-conference slate with a bang, romping UTEP, 58-28, in front of 52,899 fans at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. The 25th-ranked Wildcats dominated play, scoring 42 unanswered points on six-consecutive drives at one point en route to their third win of the season.

For K-State, it was a complete effort that saw the offense, defense and special teams all excel in their respective areas.

On the offensive side, the scoring was backed by an exceptional performance from the Wildcat rushing attack, which combined for 188 yards and six scores on 37 attempts. Halfbacks Charles Jones and DeMarcus Robinson, who each averaged over six yards per carry, accounted for 132 of those yards with the former crossing the plane on three occasions and the latter once.

The Wildcat defense was just as dominant, allowing only one first Miner first down in the entire first half that saw K-State take a commanding 31-0 lead into the break. The Miners, who entered the game averaging a gaudy 314 yards per game on the ground, were held to 59 yards total on 31 attempts with almost all their scoring coming in the late stages of the game.

And lastly, on special teams, wideout Tyler Lockett led a special teams unit that, along with a punt block on defense, totaled 150 yards on five punt returns with 143 of those yards coming from Lockett himself, including two returns of 50-plus yards that was highlighted by a 58-yard return for a score.

BREAKING UP THE PASS

- Sophomore cornerback **Zashon Rich** has five pass breakups in four games this season to tie for eighth in the country and first in the Big 12.
- His five pass breakups are already two shy of the top mark by a Wildcat last year. Jacob Parrish had seven pass deflections in 2024 before going on to be selected in the third round of the 2025 NFL Draft by Tampa Bay.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES SCORING IN THE THIRD PHASE

The Wildcats continue to lead the nation in total kickoff- and punt-return touchdowns since 2005 with 63, which is 23 more than the next closest team in Alabama (40) and 29 more than the next closest Big 12 programs, Oklahoma State and TCU (34).
 Of the 63 total returns, a nation-leading 32 are on kickoff returns, and the next closest team is Houston with 21.

TO THE HOUSE

- Redshirt freshman Bryce Noernberg returned a kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown against Army. It was Kansas State's first kickoff-return score since Malik Knowles went 93 yards against Oklahoma in 2021.
- Noernberg's return was the longest by a Wildcat since Knowles went 99 yards earlier in the 2021 season at Oklahoma State.
- A product of Olathe, Kansas, who was a quarterback at Olathe South High School, Noernberg recorded Kansas State's 12th kickoff return of at least 99 yards.
- Noernberg holds a 33.9-yard average on his 10 kickoff returns this season, which ranks 10th in the nation.

EIGHT STRAIGHT

- With **Garrett Harstad**'s blocked punt at Arizona, K-State has now blocked a punt in eight-straight seasons, which is the lonqest streak in the nation.
- San Diego State is next on the list with seven-straight years, while lowa State, Oregon State, Rutgers and South Carolina are tied for third with five-consecutive years.

RODRIGUEZ FROM DISTANCE

- Due to injuries at kicker late in the summer, the Wildcats scrambled to find a replacement for the 2025 season, and they landed community-college transfer **Luis Rodriguez** from College of the Canyons in Santa Clarita, California.
- After arriving in Manhattan just as preseason practices commenced, all Rodriguez has done over his first four games is connect on all four field goal and 11 extra-point attempts.
- At Arizona, Rodriguez opened the game's scoring by connecting on a season-long 51-yard field goal. It tied for the 25th-lon-

gest field goal in school history and was the longest in a road game since Ty Zentner was true on a 53-yarder at West Virginia in 2022.

 Rodriguez came to K-State after being named to the 2024 California Community College Football Coaches Association (CCCFCA) All-America Team. In his lone season playing for the Cougars, he was true on 21-of-25 field goals with a long of 54 yards, while he connected on 31-of-34 extra points.

HIGH AVERAGE BY McCLANNAN

- Sophomore punter **Simon McClannan** has gotten off to a great start in 2025, ranking fifth in the Big 12 with a 43.5-yard average on 15 punts. His high average is due to five punts that have traveled at least 50 yards, which is tied for third in the Big 12. Last year, McClannan only had six punts of 50 or more yards over 13 games.
- A native of Omaha, Nebraska, McClannan recorded a career-best 50.8-yard average on five punts at Arizona, the eighth highest single-game average in the nation this season (minimum 4 punts).
- It was the first time a K-State punter averaged more than 50 yards per punt on at least four attempts since Ty Zentner had a 54.3-yard average against Missouri in 2022.
- McClannan enters his 20th-career game against UCF with a 42.61-yard average on 62 career punts, which would rank fifth in school history if he had 13 more punts to meet the minimum amount of attempts.

DEFENSE ON KICK RETURNS

- K-State has not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since the 2013 season, going the last 155 games and 445 returns without allowing its opponent to find paydirt.
- The streak is the longest among the active Big 12 teams, 257 returns better than the next closest team (Arizona State 188).
- Since K-State allowed its last kickoff-return touchdown, the Wildcats have scored 15 of their own.

PRIOR RELATIONSHIPS

- Several K-State coaches had prior working relationships before their time in Manhattan. Defensive coordinator **Joe Klanderman** was a part of **Chris Klieman**'s original staff at North Dakota State and came to Manhattan with Klieman in 2019. When Klieman was the defensive coordinator at NDSU in 2012 and 2013, **Steve Stanard** was the linebacker coach.
- Additionally, Klieman and running backs coach **Brian Anderson** were at Western Illinois together from 1994 to 1996.
- Other connections include: assistant head coach/cornerbacks coach **Van Malone** and defensive ends coach **Buddy Wyatt** working together at Texas A&M in 2008 and 2009 as well as SMU from 2015 to 2017; Offensive coordinator/quarterbacks/ associate head coach **Matt Wells** and tight ends coach **Luke Wells** working together at both Utah State (2013-18) and Texas Tech (2019-21).
- Also, Matt Wells and Athletics Director **Gene Taylor** were at Navy together from 1997 to 2001.

ROSTER NOTES OWNING THE STATE

- K-State casts a wide net in addition to owning its state when it comes to roster composition as a total of 25 states are represented on the 2025 roster, and none more than the state of Kansas as 33 players hail from the Sunflower State.
- The next highest totals come from Texas (14), Missouri (8), Florida (8), Colorado (6), Nebraska (6) and Georgia (5).



LOTS OF LETTERWINNERS

- For the sixth-straight season, Kansas State brings back 44 or more letterwinners as the 2025 squad sees 45 returning letterwinners come back for another year.
- Of the 45 returning letterwinners, 18 are on offense, 25 are on defense and there are two specialists.
- The 45 returning letterwinners are tied for the sixth most by a K-State squad since 2003.

SUPER SENIORS

- K-State has eight players who are using an extra year of eligibility and are seniors again in 2025 as the NCAA froze eligibility clocks during the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic in addition to the community-college ruling for this season.
- Those using a second senior season are cornerback Justice Clemons, transfer safety Gunner Maldonado, transfer wide receiver Caleb Medford, linebacker Beau Palmer, offensive lineman Taylor Poitier, defensive tackle Uso Seumalo, defensive end Cody Stufflebean and tight end Will Swanson.
- Poitier is actually in his seventh season of college football in 2025 due to the pandemic followed by season-ending injuries in both 2021 and 2022.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

- Kansas State welcomes 14 Division I or II transfers with eight on offense and six on defense. The 14 transfers are the most for K-State under head coach **Chris Klieman**, topping the previous mark of 11 last season.
- Nine of the transfers have multiple years of eligibility remaining, while nine of the 14 came from Power 5 schools.
- The incoming transfers for 2025 include: wide receiver Jerand Bradley (Texas Tech/Boston College), offensive lineman Terrence Enos Jr. (Pittsburgh), offensive lineman George Fitzpatrick (Ohio State), cornerback Amarion Fortenberry (South Alabama), safety Gunner Maldonado (Northwestern/ Arizona), running back Antonio Martin Jr. (Georgia Tech/ Southeastern Louisiana), wide receiver Caleb Medford (TCU/ New Mexico), safety Qua Moss (West Georgia), offensive lineman JB Nelson (Penn State), linebacker Ralph Ortiz (West Florida), linebacker Gabe Powers (Ohio State), cornerback Jayden Rowe (Oklahoma), offensive lineman Amos Talalele (USC) and wide receiver Jaron Tibbs (Purdue).

THESE CATS ARE SMART

- Not only has Kansas State put in hard work on the field, but also in the classroom as the Wildcats have been one of the Big 12's best over the better part of a decade.
- Since 2014, K-State has accumulated a Big 12-leading 347 Academic All-Big 12 selections, which is 34 more than the next closest program (lowa State).
- The Wildcats have produced at least 24 Academic All-Big 12 performers every year since 2014, including a school record 45 selections in 2023.

- Two seasons ago, K-State picked up a 44-31 victory in UCF's first ever Big 12 game thanks to the legs of DJ Giddens, who rushed for 207 yards and four touchdowns in addition to tallying eight receptions
- It was the Wildcats' 16th 200-yard rushing game in school history, while his four rushing scores tied for fourth in school history
- The first time the two teams squared off was 2010 in Manhattan, a 17-13 K-State victory during a game that was delayed over an hour during the first quarter due to weather.
- K-State trailed for a majority of the game until quarterback Carson Coffman engineered a 13play, 67-yard drive in the Wildcats' last possession, which was capped off by a 7-yard Coffman touchdown run.

▶ Game Notes

- K-State scored 44 points, the third-straight Big 12 game (not counting the Big 12 Championship) in which the Wildcats hit the 40-point mark... It is the longest streak by the Wildcats in Big 12 games since 2012 when they had 55 points against both West Virginia and Texas Tech and 44 points vs. Oklahoma State.
- K-State registered 536 yards of total offense, the second time this season the Wildcats eclipsed the 500-yard mark (588 yards vs. SEMO)... It is the first time K-State had two 500-yard games in the same season since 2019 Chris Klieman's first year in Manhatan vs. Nicholls (573 yards) and Bowling Green (521 yards), while it is the first time they had two 500-yard games in a season with at least one being a Big 12 game since 2014 (vs. Texas Tech and Kansas).
- DJ Giddens set career highs in rushing yards (207), carries (30) and touchdowns (4)... It is the first time a K-State running back had four rushing touchdowns since Alex Barnes had four vs. Oklahoma State in 2018... The four rushing scores are tied for the third most in a game in school history... His 207 yards were the most by a K-State running back since Barnes went for 250 at Baylor in 2018... His 30 rushing attempts were the most by a Wildcat since Barnes rushed 32 times against Texas Tech in 2017.
- In addition to his 207 rushing yards, DJ Giddens also recorded 86 receiving yards on eight catches, giving him 293 yards from scrimmage in the game...
 It was the third most yards from scrimmage in school history behind a pair of efforts by Darren Sproles... Sproles had 323 yards from scrimmage int he 2003 Big 12 Championship victory over Oklahoma and 298 yards against Louisiana in 2004.

GIDDENS' 4 TDS CARRIES K-STATE PAST UCF

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Kansas State welcomed UCF to the Big 12 Conference, and DJ Giddens said hello to one of the Wildcats' more memorable individual performances in recent years in a 44-31 win before a much-needed bye week.

Giddens had 30 carries for 207 yards and four touchdowns and added eight receptions for 86 yards for the Wildcats while scoring on runs of 1, 9, 18 and 3 yards. However, one of his biggest plays came when he didn't even reach paydirt. With the score tied 24-24 late in the third quarter, Giddens caught a third-down swing pass from Will Howard and gained 16 yards for a first down.

Howard coasted around the left side and into the end zone on the next play with 1 minute, 28 seconds left in the third quarter.

From there, the Wildcats steadily pulled away from the Knights, who played in their first conference game as a Big 12 member in front of a crowd of 51,912 at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. As the fourth quarter wore on, K-State head coach Chris Klieman became more animated on the sidelines, cheering on his players after key offensive and defensive plays.

The Wildcats' victory comes off the heels of a heartbreaking three-point loss at Missouri on a lastplay 61-yard field goal last Saturday.

Howard completed 27-0f-42 passes for 255 yards and tossed one interception, and he rushed for two scores after entering the week questionable to play. He proved capable and grew stronger toward the end — rushing for a 31-yard score for a 44-24 lead.

Timmy McClain completed 14-of-24 passes for 264 yards and three touchdowns and one interception. McClain's favorite target, Kobe Hudson, had five catches for 138 yards and two touchdowns. Johnny Richardson had six carries for 76 yards.

K-State out-gained UCF 536 to 407 in total offense. The Wildcats were balanced with 281 rushing yards and 255 passing yards while running off 82 total plays.

The Wildcats gave up scoring plays of 27, 69 and 46 yards but stiffened at critical times as the Knights were 5-of-12 on third down. The Knights had 10 penalties, including several delay-of-game penalties due to crowd noise.

UCF came out of halftime and struck immediately as Hudson reeled in a 46-yard pass from McClain for a 24-21 lead. Then K-State answered as Chris Tennant tied it at 24-24 with a 30-yard field goal.

Things stayed that way until the Wildcats made their charge and Howard connected with Giddens before he kept the ball and rolled into the end zone.

It wasn't until running back RJ Harvey scored a 1-yard run with 3 seconds left that the Knights added to their scoring total. By then, the K-State Marching Band had already played, "Happy Trails."

And there was rightfully much happiness in Manhattan.

Giddens finished with 293 scrimmage yards, third-most in school history and only behind Darren Sproles' total of 323 scrimmage yards against Oklahoma in the 2003 Big 12 Championship Game and his 298 yards against Louisiana in 2004.

Head Coach • Seventh Year at K-State 32nd Year in Coaching • 13th Year as a Head Coach Northern Iowa '90, '92

- A culture of selflessness, discipline, toughness and commitment is the cornerstone of a Chris Klieman-led K-State program, and that is what has led the Wildcats to sustained success and the distinction of being the winningest active program in the Big 12 Conference. In six seasons, Klieman has led the Wildcats to a 49-31 record as he has the second most wins in school history.
- Under Klieman's leadership, K-State has won eight or more games in five of the six seasons, the lone exception being the COVID-19 campaign of 2020. No other coach in school history has more wins or eight-plus win seasons in their first six years. Klieman has led the Cats to five victories over teams ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25 the most of any active Big 12 program since 2019 while they have eight wins over top-20 teams since 2019 which is tied for the second most among current Big 12 teams. Additionally, the Wildcats' overall record the last two years (18-8), three years (28-12) and four years (36-17) all lead the Big 12.
- Sustained success is demonstrated by K-State being one of only five Power 4 teams to win at least nine games each of the last three seasons with at least one conference championship in that timeframe, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia and Oregon. The Wildcats' three-straight seasons of at least nine wins are the most since an eight-year streak from 1993 through 2000.
- The latest of the stretch of nine-win campaigns came in 2024 as the Wildcats earned a pair of early-season victories over teams ranked No. 20. Those two top-20 wins propelled K-State to a 7-1 start, its best record over the first eight games of a season since 2014. Although the Wildcats finished the regular season with one win in their final four games, they ended on a high note with a thrilling 44-41 victory over Rutgers in the Rate Bowl. That game saw K-State trail by as many as 17 points in the middle of the third quarter and by 13 points early in the fourth before it put together the largest bowl comeback win in school history.

- The Rate Bowl victory capped a school-record tying four comeback victories by Klieman's squad when trailing in the fourth quarter, matching the mark by the 2011 Wildcats. In addition to the bowl win, K-State also overcame a seven-point deficit in week two at Tulane for a 34-27 win; a four-point deficit by scoring on a 50-yard touchdown pass with 2:14 left at Colorado for a 31-28 win; and a one-point deficit with a 51-yard field goal with 1:42 left for a 29-27 win over Kansas, the latter being the Wildcats' 16-straight Dillons Sunflower Showdown victory.
- It only took year four of the Klieman era for a milestone to be reached at K-State as the Wildcats captured the 2022 Big 12 Championship the fourth league title in school history and first since 2012 and the Wildcats finished the season with a 10-4 record, the 11th double-digit victory campaign in school history. K-State finished No. 9 in the final College Football Playoff Top 25, the Wildcats' second-highest ranking ever in the CFP era and the highest for the final poll. K-State also ranked No. 14 in the final Associated Press Top 25 and Coaches' Poll, the highest final ranking since 2012.
- The Wildcats' championship campaign was spearheaded by a school-record three victories over teams that were ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25, culminating with a 31-28 overtime victory over No. 3 TCU in the Big 12 Championship. In fact, since Klieman took over the reins of the K-State program in 2019, the Wildcats have five wins over teams ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25 poll, the most victories by any Big 12 program over that span.
- Under Klieman, 10 Wildcats have been selected in the NFL Draft, including four in 2023 and three in 2024. In fact, Anudike-Uzomah was selected in the first round (No. 31) and Julius Brents was picked in the second round (No. 44) of the 2023 NFL Draft, marking the first time in school history two Wildcats were taken within the first 44 picks of an NFL Draft.
- Prior to arriving at K-State, Klieman capped his five-year stint as head coach at North Dakota State by winning his fourth national championship in 2018. He tied Jim Tressel (Youngstown State) for the most FCS National Championships as a head coach, while he was a part of seven national championships at NDSU, which was the most in FCS history at the time of his departure. Klieman guided the 2018 Bison to a perfect 15-0 record, just the fifth team in FCS history to go undefeated and untied on the way to a national championship.
- Klieman was a three-time All-Gateway Conference defensive back at Northern lowa and four-year letterwinner from 1986 to 1990. He graduated from UNI in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in health education and a master's degree in physical education in 1992.
- Klieman and his wife, Rhonda, are parents of two sons, Devin and Colby, and one daughter, Haley.



▶ Game Notes

- This was the 109th all-time meeting between K-State and lowa State, each coming in consecutive seasons as this is the eighth-longest active uninterrupted series in FBS history... It was the second time this century that there was a ranked matchup on opening day (2009 No. 14 Boise State vs. No. 16 Oregon) and the first time two Big 12 teams met in Week 0/1 since Nebraska faced Oklahoma State in 2003.
- Kansas State and lowa State played to yet another one-score game... It was the 14th one-score game between the two teams dating back to 2008, the most may any series in the country... Each of the last four games in the series have been decided by one score.
- Junior Avery Johnson posted a pass efficiency rating of 168.4, which was the second-highest of his career (min. 10 attempts)... His career best is 186.0 last year at West Virginia... His 273 passing yards were the second most of his career, just behind the 298 yards he put up last year at West Virginia... He has now thrown for multiple touchdowns in four-straight games dating back to last season... K-State is now 6-1 all-time when Johnson passes and rushes for a touchdown.
- Junior defensive end **Tobi Osunsanmi** finished the game with a career-high 2.0 sacks...
 His previous best was 1.5 sacks in last year's season opener against UT Martin... It was the most sacks by a Wildcat since Brendan Mott had 2.5 last year at Colorado... As a team, K-State had 4.0 tackles, its most since carding four in last year's Cincinnati game.

K-STATE FALLS TO IOWA STATE IN DUBLIN

DUBLIN, Ireland – They call the Aer Lingus College Football Classic "Much More Than a Game," and this fifth edition of the classic lived up to that billing, as the 2025 college football season got underway under the lights of Aviva Stadium. In a game that featured two ranked teams and longtime arch-rivals, No. 17 Kansas State and No. 22 lowa State slugged it out in old-school style in the rain before the Cyclones finally outlasted the Wildcats, 24-21, to get a quick jump on the 2025 season.

The game that was announced 486 days ago and pitted the Wildcats against the Cyclones for the 109th time in the eighth-longest active uninterrupted series in FBS history carried a Big 12 feel with purple filling one side of the stadium and red filling the other.

Both teams reportedly sold 11,000 tickets, but the crowd was much larger, as the teams played before a sellout crowd of 47,221. The K-State marching band, which endured significant travel challenges to make it more than 4,000 miles for kickoff, was in midseason form at an overseas venue that served as a home game for the Wildcats and brimmed with purple furnishing, thousands of purple Powercat flags, and highlight upon highlight upon the videoboards.

In the end, though, lowa State, 1-0 overall and 1-0 in the Big 12, made more plays to capture its third straight victory over K-State, 0-1 and 0-1 in the Big 12, in a series that dates to 1917.

From beginning to end, this game was excruciatingly close — on brand with previous clashes between these two programs. The teams have played 14 one-score games since 2008, the most in any series in the country. Each of the last four games in the series have been decided by one score. It wasn't until the final possession by lowa State that this back-and-forth game reached its conclusion.

Johnson rocketed a deep ball to new wide receiver Jerand Bradley for a 65-yard catch-and-run down the lowa State sideline, as Bradley outran three defenders for his first K-State touchdown. K-State trailed, 24-21, with 6:23 left in the fourth quarter, and still had a chance.

But lowa State dug in and drained the clock behind a punishing second-half rushing game that gashed the Wildcats. K-State needed a stop. K-State needed the football. But K-State couldn't get the stop it needed for its offense to gain possession. After an lowa State timeout on fourth-and-3 at the K-State 16-yard line, lowa State quarterback Rocco Becht completed a pass to running back Carson Hansen and let him take care of the rest, as he rumbled and twisted on a 15-yard catch-and-run to the 1-yard line just before the 2-minute timeout.

From there, the Cyclones downed the ball three times inside the 3-yard line until the game clock expired.

After the teams slugged through the rain in the first half, the conditions proved more favorable over the final two quarters. Johnson completed 21-of-30 passes for 273 yards and two touchdowns, and Becht went 14-of-28 for 183 yards and two touchdowns. Both quarterbacks, who can run, were limited by field conditions. Becht had 12 carries for 18 yards and one touchdown, and Johnson had eight carries for 21 yards and one score.

A promising sign for K-State? It's passing game. Jayce Brown had four catches for 78 yards and one touchdown, Bradley had three catches for 75 yards and one touchdown, tight end Garrett Oakley had five catches for 65 yards, and Jaron Tibbs had four catches for 35 yards.

LATE TO LIFTS K-STATE PAST NORTH DAKOTA

MANHATTAN, Kan. – No. 17 Kansas State found a way.

Avery Johnson engineered an 81-yard drive and threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to running back Joe Jackson with 42 seconds remaining, and the Wildcats held off first-time starting quarterback Jerry Kaminski and North Dakota for a 38-35 nail-biting victory Saturday at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

K-State led 31-21 late in the third quarter before North Dakota scored two touchdowns, including a 20-yard run by Sawyer Seidl that gave the Fighting Hawks a 35-31 edge with 4:19 left in the fourth quarter, leaving the sellout crowd of 51,927 in stunned silence while North Dakota first-year head coach Eric Schmidt applauded his players' effort from the sideline.

But Johnson and the Wildcats avoided disaster in their first-ever meeting against North Dakota and prevented the FCS member from pulling off perhaps its biggest win in history.

The back-and-forth slugfest ended with K-State staging its fifth come-from-behind victory since the beginning of the 2024 season when trailing in the fourth quarter. This one marked the Wildcats' first game-winning touchdown with under 1:00 left in regulation since Skylar Thompson connected with Isaiah Zuber on the final play in a home game against Iowa State in 2017.

Johnson had career highs across the board as a passer, completing 28-of-43 passes for 318 yards and three touchdowns, while he rushed for 43 yards, including a crucial 25-yard run on the game-winning drive

In the second game of his second season as a full-time starter, Johnson showed something to Klieman in the game-winning drive.

After K-State's final touchdown, North Dakota took over with 37 seconds to go, and the crowd rose to peak level, and a K-State defense that had its hands full with the Fighting Hawks all game forced Kaminski to throw four straight incompletions, including a deep ball that glanced off the hands of Caden Dennis down the sideline with 5 seconds left, as the Wildcats survived a rollercoaster night.

K-State outgained North Dakota, 461 to 354, in total offense and held the Fighting Hawks to just 5-of-14 on third downs and 1-of-2 on fourth downs. K-State improved to 27-7 when totaling at least 375 offensive yards since 2022.

K-State wide receiver Jayce Brown had a career-high 12 catches for 109 yards and a touchdown, marking the most receptions by a K-State player since Tyler Lockett had 13 in the final game of his career, the 2014 Alamo Bowl. Jerand Bradley had five catches for 46 yards and Jaron Tibbs had three catches for 55 yards and a touchdown.

However, the third quarter saw sophomore running back DeVon Rice rise to the occasion with a pair of touchdowns of nine and 13 yards. Seeing significant action in place of the injured Dylan Edwards, Rice had seven carries for 40 yards and two touchdowns, and Joe Jackson had 11 carries for 55 yards.

Meanwhile, Jackson's lone catch in the game made everybody happy. Jackson caught the game-winning pass from Johnson along the edge to the right side inside the 10-yard line, turned up field and stepped into the end zone, then dropped the ball and flexed in excitement.

K-State got it done in the clutch. K-State found a way.

ARMY GRINDS OUT 24-21 VICTORY OVER K-STATE

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Kansas State hoped its lengthy preparation for Army paid dividends. All that quarterback Avery Johnson and the Wildcats offense could do, though, was watch almost the entire second half from the sideline as the Black Knights ran, ran, and ran some more — and scored. It all ended with a forgettable 24-21 loss in front of a sellout crowd at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

K-State took a 13-7 lead into halftime following a balanced first two quarters between the teams. K-State led in total offense, 198 to 140, and in time of possession — 16:15 to 13:45. Then Army started its march. And it simply wouldn't be stopped.

Incredibly, K-State possessed the football for fewer than four minutes in the second half. The Wildcats ran four offensive plays from scrimmage before their final fourth-quarter drive. In actual time, the K-State offense didn't see the field for almost an hour.

Army quarterback Cale Hellums and slotback Noah Short guided drive after drive. They put together drives of 14, 13 and 14 plays that consumed more than seven minutes apiece and produced two touchdowns and a field goal in the second half.

K-State saw its halftime lead dissolve as Army efficiently ran the ball down the field with three- and four-yard gains. And the clock continued to dwindle.

K-State surrendered its lead for good the final time that the noticeably worn-down defense was on the field. Facing second-and-4 at the K-State 14-yard line, Hellums got good blocking from the right side of the line, skated through a hole up the middle with only an arm touching along the way, and celebrated with his teammates in the end zone to take the 24-21 lead, capping a monster 14-play, 56-yard drive and giving the Wildcats just 2:52 left to pull off a comeback.

Johnson completed 15-of-25 passes for 172 yards and one touchdown and one interception. His first pick of the season arrived when a ball deflected off running back Joe Jackson and into the hands of Collin Matteson near midfield with 1:35 left.

The Black Knights ran three plays to run out the final 95 seconds and secure their third win all-time against the Wildcats.

Army outgained K-State, 332 to 247, as the Black Knights put up 237 rushing yards, went 10-for-22 on third downs, and 6-for-7 on fourth downs. Army held the ball twice as long as K-State — 40:44 to 19:16. K-State recorded its lowest time of possession in a game since holding the ball for 18:34 at Louisville in 2008.

Total plays? Army ran 82, K-State ran 43. It marked the fewest plays by K-State in a game since it ran 41 plays against Navy in the 2019 Liberty Bowl.

It marked the third-straight close game to start the season for K-State, which suffered a 24-21 loss to Iowa State in Ireland and needed a game-winning touchdown to escape North Dakota, 38-35.

▶ Game Notes

This was the ninth all-time meeting between Kansas State and Arizona with UofA now holding a 6-2-1 advantage in the series... K-State has dropped its last three Friday road games, loosing at Stanford in 2016 and at Texas in 2021

- Sophomore **Garrett Harstad** blocked a punt in the third quarter, which eventually led to a K-State touchdown... It was K-State's first blocked punt since Ty Bowman had one in last year's season opener against UT Martin.. The Wildcats have now blocked a punt in each of the last eight years, which currently stands at the longest streak in the nation... San Diego State entered the 2025 season tied with K-State by blocking a punt in each of the last seven years.

- Jayce Brown recorded six receptions for 68 yards, extending his catch streak to 25 games... He recorded a 75-yard touchdown run on the first play of the second half, the Wildcats' longest rush since Deuce Vaughn went 88 yards for a score in the 2022 Sugar Bowl... It was the longest rush by a K-State wide receiver since Malik Knowles went 75 yards for a score on the first play of the 2022 season against South Dakota.

• Simon McClannan averaged 50.8 yards on his five punts on Friday evening, a new career high... His previous best was a 46.5-yard average on four punts last year against Rutgers in the Rate Bowl... It was the first time a K-State punter averaged more than 50 yards per punt on at least four punts since Ty Zentner had a 54.3-yard average against Missouri in 2022.

K-STATE FALLS TO ARIZONA, 23-17

TUCSON, Ariz. – Kansas State never found its groove, Arizona put together a powerful running attack, and K-State suffered a 23-17 loss in its first true road game of the season.

Playing at Arizona Stadium, the site of K-State's first-ever bowl victory in the 1993 Copper Bowl, K-State incurred a rash of troubles in the final game before its first bye week.

K-State experienced difficulties from the start, while Arizona moved the ball. Arizona outgained K-State 412 to 193 and went 8-of-18 on third down behind a solid performance from quarterback Noah Fifita, who completed 16-of-33 passes for 178 yards and rushed 15 times for 48 yards and two touchdowns. Ismail Mahdi had 22 carries for 189 yards on the ground.

Avery Johnson completed 13-of-29 passes for 88 yards and had seven carries for minus-16 yards and one touchdown.

K-State's leading rusher was wide receiver Jayce Brown, whose 75-yard touchdown run out of the Wildcat formation down the right side on the first play from scrimmage in the third quarter gave K-State hope and drew the Wildcats to within 17-10. Brown had one carry for 75 yards and also led K-State with six catches for 68 yards.

Even after its troubles, K-State had a chance to win the game. K-State had fourth-and-7 from its 43-yard line, but Johnson saw his pass across the middle to Brown fall incomplete with 1:00 to go, effectively ending the game and extending the Wildcats' woes.

Arizona led 17-3 at halftime while outgaining K-State 257 to 44 in the first two quarters. K-State's lone score in the first half was a career-long 51-yard field goal by Luis Rodriguez with 7:42 left in the first quarter, which marked the first score by either team.

But Fifita scored touchdowns on runs of 15 and 2 yards, and Michael Salgado-Medina hit a 31-yard field goal, as Arizona had its way in the first two quarters. About the only thing that didn't go right for Arizona came when Salgado-Medina missed a 62-yard field goal to end the first half.

Faced with a halftime deficit, Brown and K-State seemingly sprang to life in the third quarter. On the first play from scrimmage, Brown took the football out of the Wildcat formation and dashed 75 yards down the right side for a touchdown to draw K-State to 17-10 just 13 seconds into the second half.

After K-State held Arizona to a three-and-out for the first time in the game, the K-State special teams came alive. Punter Salgado-Medina dropped a snap, and K-State's Garrett Harstad blocked a punt as K-State took over at the Arizona 13-yard line. It was the eighth-straight season the Wildcats have blocked a punt, the longest streak in the nation.

Johnson threaded the ball down the middle to Brown to the 1, and two plays later Johnson punched the ball into the end zone for a 17-17 tie.

Then Qua Moss leaped in front of Keyan Burnett to intercept a halfback pass from Javin Whatley, and K-State had a chance to take the lead. It marked the first K-State defensive interception this season and the first interception by the Arizona offense this season.

However, K-State went three-and-out and Arizona started its possession at the K-State 46 and drove for a Salgado-Medina 31-yard field goal and a 20-17 lead with 2:40 left in the third guarter.

On Arizona's next drive, Fifita methodically took Arizona down the field on a 7:30 drive before Damian Ilalio and Travis Bates sacked him and forced another Salgado-Medina 41-yard field goal. That gave Arizona a 23-17 lead with 4:25 to go.

K-State was unable to answer. Facing fourth-and-3 at the K-State 32-yard line, with 2:31 left, Johnson saw his pass fly off Brown's hands on a slant route, giving the ball back to Arizona.



BILL SNYDER FAMILY STADIUM

58TH YEAR - 1968-2025



Renamed in honor of Hall of Fame coach Bill Snyder by a proclamation of the Kansas Board of Regents on Nov. 16, 2005, Bill Snyder Family Stadium is hosting its 58th season of Wildcat football this fall.

Originally named KSU Stadium, the facility was built at a cost of \$1.6 million and financed from student fees, athletics gate receipts and contributions. The stadium opened its doors Sept. 21, 1968, with a 21-0 shutout of Colorado State. The original seating capacity was set at 35,000, and an expansion in the summer of 1970 added 4,000 permanent bleachers on the east side and 3,000 temporary bleachers on the west side.

Following the 1998 season, the addition of a deck and sky suites on the east side of the stadium increased capacity to more than 50,000. On Nov. 11, 2000, 53,811 fans witnessed Kansas State's 29-28 win over Nebraska. It remains the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Kansas.

Bill Snyder Family Stadium's more recent changes include a \$75 million project to construct the West Stadium Center in 2013 and the new Vanier Football Complex, with full completion in time for the 2016 season.

Most recently completed is the Shamrock Zone in the south end zone, named on behalf of the Bill Ryan and Martin Ryan families who own an operate Shamrock Trading Corporation. The Shamrock Zone was completed in time for the 2021 season. The project has transformed the south concourse and includes permanent concessions and restrooms for the first time in the history of Bill Snyder Family Stadium, along with two new videoboards in the southwest and southeast corners of the stadium, the latter of which fans began enjoying in 2020.
