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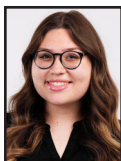
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MEDIA POLICIES AND INFORMATION

Weekly Press Conference

The UCF football team will hold a Monday press conference with head coach Scott Frost and two players each week at noon, in the Steve and Brenda Sloan Media Room at Acrisure Bounce House. It will be streamed on ESPN+.

Postgame Interviews

Coach Frost and selected student-athletes will meet the media following the game in the Steve and Brenda Sloan media room for home games and will use a designated location for road games. UCF's locker room is closed to the media.

UCF Football on the Radio

Longtime UCF radio play-by-play veteran Marc Daniels is in his 31st season in that role in 2025. He's also UCF's director of broadcasting. Analyst Gary Parris (a former Florida State player) is in his 30th season in that position. They are joined by Scott Adams (pregame host and sideline reporter—in his 24th season) and Frank Louvre (engineer, in his 34th season).

Pregame coverage begins two hours before kickoff and features a preview of the game with interviews from UCF players and coaches—including coach Scott Frost and athletics director Terry Mohajir. All games and radio shows can be heard on 96.9FM/740AM—and UCF fans can access all broadcasts from anywhere with the iHeart app (search for 96.9 The Game).

Scott Frost

Head Coach / First Season, Third Season Overall at UCF

After an unforgettable two-year run that saw the UCF football program rise to national prominence, Scott Frost is coming back home.

Known for sparking the "Charge On" spirit and guiding UCF to its first perfect season, Frost was re-introduced as the program's next head coach by UCF Vice President and Director of Athletics Terry Mohajir on Dec. 8, 2024.

Frost originally served as UCF's head coach from 2016 to 2017, culminating in a historic 13-0 season, an AAC championship and a national championship that captured the nation's attention. In his final game, Frost guided UCF to a victory over No. 7 Auburn in the 2018 Peach Bowl, securing the program's first undefeated season in school history.

Frost posted the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history at UCF, inheriting a 0-12 team in 2015 and taking the Knights to a perfect season in his second and final year, when he was named the national coach of the year.

"I'm deeply honored to return to UCF, a school that has always held a special place in my heart," Frost said. "The foundation we built here has only grown stronger, and I am thrilled to continue shaping this program's legacy. As we prepare for year three in the Big 12 Conference, I look forward to working alongside our dedicated student-athletes, talented staff, and passionate fans to reach new heights together."

Frost went a combined 19-7 in two seasons at UCF, helping turn an 0-12 team into a 13-0 squad in just two years. In Frost's first season, he took the Knights to a bowl game and finished with a 6-7 record. The turnaround was historic, as Frost became the only first-year coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season. UCF led the nation with a six-win improvement in 2016 and exceeded that mark in 2017 as the nation's only undefeated team. The Knights put together the first undefeated regular season in UCF and AAC history in 2017, posted the longest winning streak in school history at the time of his departure (13 games), achieved the highest in-season ranking in program history (10th), highest final ranking (6th) and set an AAC record with 16 all-conference selections.

UCF was led by its high-powered offense and improved defense under Frost. The Knights led the nation in scoring at 48.2 points per game and were the only FBS team to score at least 30 points in every game in 2017. Defensively, UCF improved its scoring defense by 65 spots in Frost's two seasons.

In addition to being the unanimous choice as the 2017 AAC Coach of the Year, Frost was honored as the national coach of the year by the Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association, the Touchdown Club of Columbus, the Lombardi Award and FCA in addition to winning the Home Depot, Paul "Bear" Bryant and Eddie Robinson coach-of-the-year awards.

Frost began his coaching career at Northern Iowa in 2007 as a linebackers coach and was promoted to co-defensive coordinator in 2008. That season, his defense excelled, tying for third in the FCS with 40 takeaways and ranking ninth in scoring defense, allowing just 17.7 points per game. The 12-3 Panthers also led the Missouri Valley Football Conference in both rushing defense (107.1 yards per game) and scoring defense.

In 2009, Frost joined the Oregon coaching staff as the wide receivers coach under head coach Chip Kelly and offensive coordinator Mark Helfrich. Frost helped Oregon post a 79-14 record in his seven seasons, during which time the Ducks won four conference titles and twice played for the national championship.

Oregon never ranked lower than eighth nationally in scoring offense during Frost's seven seasons on staff, and the Ducks led the nation in scoring in 2010. Frost was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2013, and Oregon ranked in the top five nationally in both scoring and total offense each of his three seasons calling plays. The Ducks scored 681 points in 2014, the second-highest total in NCAA history. Oregon made it to the College Football Playoff Championship Game that year, when Frost was one of five finalists for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the nation's top assistant. Frost's quarterback, Marcus Mariota, won the Heisman Trophy and was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2015 NFL Draft.

After Kelly left for the Philadelphia Eagles, Oregon promoted Mark Helfrich to head coach and named Frost offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2013. In this role, Frost guided Marcus Mariota to a Heisman Trophy win and a berth in the national championship game. During Frost's tenure as offensive coordinator, Oregon recorded a 33-8 record and consistently ranked among the nation's top teams in scoring and total offense. His standout performance in 2014 earned him a finalist spot for the prestigious Broyles Award, recognizing the nation's top assistant coach.

Following his two years at UCF, Scott Frost served as the head football coach at the University of Nebraska for four-plus seasons from 2018 to 2022, coaching the first three games of the 2022 season. Frost posted a 16-31 record with the Cornhuskers. His tenure was defined by close losses, as 23 of his 31 losses were by single digits, including each of his final 13. Nebraska lost 22 one-score games during Frost's career, including 12 games by five or fewer points.

Last season, Frost had been serving as a coaching consultant for Sean McVay and the Los Angeles Rams.

Alex GRINCH

Defensive Coordinator & Safeties / First Season

Alex Grinch, a four-time nominee and two-time Broyles Award semifinalist, is in his first season as UCF football's defensive coordinator. Grinch joins the Knights after spending the 2024 season as the co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Wisconsin.

Nationally recognized among his peers, Grinch was a semifinalist for the Broyles Award (presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach) in 2019 at Oklahoma and 2017 at Washington State as the defensive coordinator at both places. His Sooners defense improved drastically in nearly every statistic from the year prior to his arrival.

Oklahoma jumped more than 100 spots in third-down conversion percentage, leaping from 118 (46.4%) in 2018 to 17 (32.2) in 2019. The Sooners led the Big 12 Conference in rushing defense and ranked among the top 35 nationally after ranking outside the top 50 the previous year.

In 2019, OU won the Big 12 Championship and earned a spot in the four-team College Football Playoff where they fell to eventual national champion LSU. The Sooners led the conference and ranked 17th nationally in tackles for loss per game with 7.4.

Grinch's 2017 Washington State defense finished among the nation's top 10 in third-down conversion percentage (4th: 28.5), passing yards allowed (9th: 170.9) and team tackles for loss (9th: 7.9) to earn him a spot on the Broyles Award semifinalists. WSU ranked 16th in the country in total defense, yielding 323.2 yards per game to opponents.

Under Grinch's direction, Washington State recorded 28 turnovers to rank ninth nationally.

He joined the Wisconsin Badgers in February 2024 following defensive coordinator stints at USC (2022-23) and Oklahoma (2019-21). UW is among the top 15 FBS programs in fewest passing yards allowed this season, checking in at No. 14 with 177.7 per game. Under his guidance, senior safety captain Hunter Wohler led the Badgers in tackles with 71, the fifth most among Big Ten Conference defensive backs to claim honorable mention all-conference honors.

According to Pro Football Focus (PFF) advanced metrics, Wisconsin ranked 18th nationally in pass coverage as a team at 89.7.

In 2022 at USC, Grinch's defensive unit led the nation in turnover margin (1.57) after the Trojans ranked No. 74 nationally in 2021 prior. USC ranked No. 3 nationally with 19 interceptions by 11 different players.

At Oklahoma, the 2020 season was another strong season for Grinch's defensive unit. The Sooners ranked top 10 nationally in interceptions, third down defense, sacks, passing efficiency defense and rushing defense while allowing only 21.7 points per game. Oklahoma claimed the 2020 Big 12 title and earned a trip to the Cotton Bowl.

Grinch spent the 2018 season at Ohio State as co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach. That year, the Buckeyes ranked sixth nationally with four defensive touchdowns. Before his season in Columbus, Grinch was the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Washington State (2015-17) and the safeties coach at Missouri (2012-14).

He broke into the SEC as a full-time assistant in 2012 for a three-season stint at Missouri. Grinch coached the Tigers' safeties and Mizzou won SEC East Division titles in 2013 and 2014 and claimed a Cotton Bowl victory in 2013.

Grinch was a safety at Mount Union (1998-2001), as the Purple Raiders went 54-1, won three NCAA Division III championships (1998-2000-01) and four Ohio Athletic Conference titles. He earned All-America third team honors and was an Academic All-League first team selection as a 2001 senior.

The Grove City, Ohio, native received his bachelor's degree in sport management from Mount Union and earned a master's degree in educational leadership and policy analysis at Missouri.

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Steve COOPER

Offensive Coordinator & Tight Ends / First Season

Steve Cooper, who spent four seasons with new UCF head coach Scott Frost at Nebraska, is in his first season as offensive coordinator in 2025.

Cooper joins the Black and Gold following a season as an offensive analyst at Boise State, helping the Broncos earn a spot in the inaugural 12-team College Football Playoff and win the Mountain West Conference Championship.

With Cooper's assistance, Boise State compiled a 12-1 record and earned the No. 3 seed and a first-round bye in the College Football Playoff. Boise State's running back Ashton Jeanty is a finalist for the Heisman Trophy and leads the nation in rushing yards (2,497) and rushing touchdowns (29).

The Broncos rank fourth nationally in scoring offense (39.1 points per game) and sixth nationally in rushing offense (250.5 yards per game).

Cooper spent the 2023 season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Maine, leading the Black Bears to the 10th-ranked passing offense in FCS with 3,081 yards. Under his direction, quarterback Derek Robertson finished the season ranked ninth nationally with 25 passing touchdowns. He ranked seventh in FCS with 2,993 passing yards and set a school record with 503 passing yards against Campbell.

His time at Maine followed four years at Nebraska (2018-22) where he served in various roles including senior offensive analyst (2022), interim quarterbacks coach (2021) and offensive quality control (2018-21).

In that span, Cooper mentored Nebraska quarterback Adrian Martinez. Under Cooper's guidance, Martinez's 295.1 passing yards per game ranked first among FBS freshmen and 15th overall in the country. His 7,404 total yards marked the fourth highest on Nebraska's all-time list for total yards, while his 64.2 completion percentage was second in Nebraska history.

In 2021, Cooper served as interim quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator where he was responsible for the game plan against Wisconsin and Iowa. During those games, Nebraska averaged 390 yards of offense against a Wisconsin team with the No. 4-ranked total defense and the Hawkeyes, who ranked 13th in total defense.

Cooper spent eight years (2010-17) in various full-time coaching capacities at his alma mater, Portland State. He started as the tight ends coach in 2010 before shifting over to coach the receivers (2011-14) where he guided Kasey Closs to all-conference honors, ranking 13th in FCS in receiving yardage (1,167 yards on 63 receptions).

During his final three years (2015-17) at Portland State, Cooper was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Vikings where his offense scored the second-most points in school history in 2015. That season, he led a dynamic Portland State offense that recorded the largest margin of victory by an FCS school over an FBS program in a dominant 66-7 victory against North Texas. He also mentored quarterback Alex Kuresa to Big Sky Conference Newcomer of the Year honors.

Cooper graduated from Portland State with a Bachelor of Science degree in Philosophy and was a two-time letterwinner at wide receiver for the Vikings, taking part in the top-ranked passing offense in FCS for the 2007 and 2008 seasons. He was also a two-year member of Oregon State's football team in 2005-06.

Sean BECKTON SR.

Associate Head Coach & Wide Receivers / Second Season, 21st Season Overall at UCF

UCF Hall of Famer Sean Beckton Sr. was named associate head coach and wide receivers coach by head coach Scott Frost in December 2024.

During his time as coach with the Black and Gold, Beckton has helped the Knights win four of the six conference championships in UCF history and claim the program's two New Year's Six bowl wins. Additionally, numerous players have earned all-conference accolades under his guidance.

Beckton was a part of the historic 2017 National Championship campaign when the Knights went a perfect 13-0, highlighted by a victory over Auburn in the Peach Bowl. It marked the greatest two-year turnaround in NCAA history with both seasons (2016 & 2017) during Frost's first stint with the Black and Gold.

As a player, Beckton concluded his career as UCF's all-time leader in receptions (196) and receiving yards (2,493). Those marks currently rank third and fifth, respectively, in the UCF record books. He still owns the program record for consecutive games with a reception (42), punt returns in a single game (8) and punt return yardage (158) in a single game.

He was one of the first two football players inducted into the UCF Athletics Hall of Fame, as he was enshrined alongside Mark Giovanetti in 2000.

Beckton remains on the UCF staff in his fourth stint with the Knights, after rejoining the program as an analyst in July 2024. He served on staff from 2009-2017 as the Black and Gold's tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator (2016-17), wide receivers (2012-15) and defensive backs coach from 2009-11. He was also wide receivers coach from 1996-2003, after working as a graduate assistant from 1992-93.

Originally from Daytona Beach, Florida, Beckton served as tight ends coach at Nebraska for five years. He coached one of Nebraska's best tight ends while in Lincoln with Frost from 2018-22, as Austin Allen set the Huskers' season tight end records with 38 receptions and 602 yards. He also set a school single-game record with 143 receiving yards at Wisconsin. Allen earned first-team all-conference honors and was the Kwalick-Clark Big Ten Tight End of the Year.

Beckton led the Knights in receiving yards in three consecutive years as a player, highlighted by 1,030 yards as a sophomore in 1988. As a senior against Texas Southern, Beckton scored a touchdown four different ways (passing, rushing, receiving and punt return). He threw a 33-yard touchdown pass, rushed for an 11-yard TD, caught a 17-yard TD and returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown.

Beckton earned his degree from UCF in liberal studies in 1993. He and his wife, Zorana, have one son, Sean Jr., and one daughter, Zaria. Sean Beckton Jr. is an assistant director of sports performance for the football program, and Zaria earned her degree from Nebraska in May 2022.

Mike DAWSON

Defensive Run Game Coordinator & Edge / First Season, Third Season Overall at UCF

Mike Dawson returns to UCF in 2025 as the Knights' Defensive Run Game Coordinator and Edge Coach, reuniting with head coach Scott Frost. This marks Dawson's third coaching stint with UCF, having previously led the Knights' defensive line during the 2016 and 2017 seasons, including the program's historic undefeated run in 2017. His impact was immediate and measurable — during his first two years in Orlando, the Knights' defense improved by more than 12 points per game in scoring defense and forced 58 turnovers, ranking third nationally in that category over that span.

Dawson's career has spanned more than 25 years across college football and the NFL. Most recently, he served as a senior defensive analyst at Kansas in 2024 and Ohio State in 2023, contributing to high-level defensive operations within two Power Five programs. Prior to that, he spent four seasons at Nebraska (2018, 2020-2022), working under Frost and coaching both the defensive line and outside linebackers. His Nebraska defenses made significant strides in pressure, scoring defense, and overall productivity, with multiple players earning All-Big Ten recognition.

In 2018, Dawson helped Nebraska's defensive line increase the team's sack total by 11 over the previous year and contributed to a 27-spot improvement in national scoring defense rankings. After a one-year stint coaching outside linebackers for the New York Giants in 2019, Dawson returned to Lincoln, where he developed standouts like JoJo Domann, Garrett Nelson, and Caleb Tannor. In 2021, Nebraska allowed its fewest points per game in over a decade, while Dawson's edge defenders accounted for the majority of the team's tackles for loss and sacks.

Before Nebraska, Dawson served on the defensive staff of the Philadelphia Eagles from 2013-2015. He began as a defensive quality control coach under head coach Chip Kelly, helping the team win the NFC East in 2013. He was promoted to assistant defensive line coach, contributing to a unit that ranked fifth in the NFL in opponent rushing average and tied for second in total sacks in 2014. He also spent the 2019 season coaching in the NFL with the New York Giants as the outside linebackers coach.

Dawson's earlier collegiate stops include Boston College (2009-2011) as Special Teams Coordinator, Akron (2006-2008) as Linebackers Coach, and New Hampshire (2000-2005), where he progressed from linebackers coach to defensive coordinator. While at UNH, he helped lead the Wildcats to a 21-5 record over two seasons and guided a defense that led the FCS in takeaways in 2005. His coaching career began in 1998 with UMass-Lowell, followed by positions at Maine and Pittsburgh.

A native of Pepperell, Massachusetts, Dawson is known for developing high-performing front-seven defenders and elevating team defenses. Most recently, he spent the 2023 and 2024 seasons as a senior defensive analyst at Ohio State and Kansas, respectively, before returning to UCF in 2025 to reunite with Frost and continue building on a legacy of defensive excellence.



Kenny MARTIN

Defensive Tackles / Fifth Season

Orlando native Kenny Martin serves as UCF's defensive tackles coach and has played a pivotal role in the Knights' defensive resurgence over the past four seasons. Under his guidance, standout tackles Lee Hunter and Ricky Barber led a strong front, highlighted by Hunter's 2024 second-team All-Big 12 selection after recording 45 tackles and 9.5 tackles for loss, grading out as the Big 12's second-best DT according to Pro Football Focus (PFF).

In 2023, Hunter earned All-Big 12 honorable mention after tallying 64 tackles and 10.5 for loss—leading all DTs nationally in tackles. Despite injuries, Barber started nine games and remained productive, while freshman John Walker also contributed meaningfully. Martin's coaching consistently developed impact players year after year.

The 2022 season saw Martin's unit anchor a defense that ranked among the nation's best in red-zone efficiency and helped propel UCF to the AAC Championship Game. Barber earned honorable mention All-America honors from Pro Football Network and was a first-team All-AAC selection. Veteran Anthony Montalvo added leadership and production in his final season.

During the 2021 season, Martin's group helped UCF close the year with six wins in their last seven games, including a Gasparilla Bowl victory over Florida. That stretch saw the Knights allow just 11.8 points per game in wins. The defensive line also boosted UCF's national rankings in pass efficiency defense and tackles for loss.

Martin arrived at UCF in February 2021, following three years as Western Kentucky's defensive tackle coach. While at WKU, his lines were among the most disciplined and effective in the country. In 2020, the Hilltoppers ranked eighth nationally in pass defense, and Barber was named a FWAA Freshman All-American under Martin's mentorship.

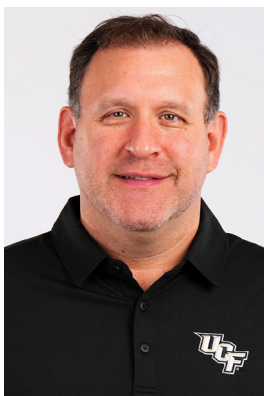
From 2018–2019, Martin's WKU defensive lines helped the team become a top-25 defense nationally. His players earned multiple all-conference honors, and WKU consistently ranked among the FBS leaders in categories like third-down defense, missed tackles, and scoring defense.

Martin began his coaching career at Virginia-Wise and in the high school ranks in Kentucky and Florida before returning to his alma mater in 2016. He played defensive tackle at Western Kentucky from 2009–2012, starting 42 games and helping the Hilltoppers reach their first FBS bowl in 2012.

A 2012 graduate of WKU with a degree in sociology, Martin and his wife, Tasha, have a daughter, Khloe, and a son, Tre.

Shawn CLARK

Offensive Line / First Season

Shawn Clark, who spent the previous five seasons as an FBS head coach, is in his first season as UCF's offensive line coach. Clark comes to Orlando after compiling a 40-24 record at Appalachian State, headlined by a 10-win season in 2021.

"I'm thrilled to join UCF as the new offensive line coach and have the chance to work with such talented student-athletes and coaches," said Clark. "UCF has a proud history of high-powered offenses, and I'm eager to contribute to that tradition. I want to thank Coach Frost for giving me this incredible opportunity."

Clark was a two-time All-American and three-time all-conference selection as an offensive lineman during his playing career at App State, when the Mountaineers compiled a 45-16 record.

Prior to taking over as the head coach in Boone, Clark was the assistant head coach/offensive line coach in 2019 and the co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach from 2016-18. He was also the offensive line coach at Kent State (2013-15), Purdue (2009-12) and Eastern Kentucky (2003-08).

His 2024 Appalachian State team led the Sun Belt in passing offense, averaging 273 yards through the air each game to rank 19th nationally. Quarterback Joey Aguilar led the league and ranked 21st in the nation in passing yards (3,003). In 2023, Aguilar set the program record 3,757 passing yards after Chase Brice established a new mark under Clark in 2021 with 3,337.

During a 9-5 season in 2023, Clark posted his third bowl victory, a third straight season with a win against a top 25 opponent and a third season with at least nine victories. The Mountaineers won the final five games of the regular season, headlined by winning the Sun Belt Conference's East Division title and delivering a 13-9 victory against Miami (Ohio) in the Cure Bowl.

In 2022, Clark recorded App State's first victory against an Associated Press (AP) top 10 opponent since 2007, taking down No. 6 Texas A&M, 17-14.

In each of Clark's four seasons coaching App State's offensive line, the Mountaineers won four straight Sun Belt Conference titles while compiling a 43-10 record in that span. His offensive line ranked in the top 25 nationally in both rushing yards per game and fewest sacks allowed. The unit was recognized by the Joe Moore Award as one of the nation's top 15 offensive lines in 2018 and 2019, and all five starters on the 2019 line received All-Sun Belt Conference recognition.

The 2018 team ranked 14th nationally in rushing yards per game (240.3) and 20th nationally in sacks allowed (18). Quarterback Zac Thomas was named the Sun Belt's Offensive Player of the Year. The Mountaineers led the Sun Belt in both rushing yards and fewest sacks in 2017, as they allowed only eight sacks (No. 2 nationally) and averaged 223.6 rushing yards per game to rank 22nd in the country. App State averaged 315.8 rushing yards during its 4-0 finish, eclipsing 300 yards in each of the last three games, and it became the first Sun Belt program with three offensive linemen (Colby Gossett, Beau Nunn, Victor Johnson) named to the all-conference first team.

In 2016, the Mountaineers led the Sun Belt in rushing offense (250.9 yards per game to rank No. 10 nationally, as well as No. 2 in Sun Belt history) and ranked 16th nationally in sacks allowed. The line also paved the way for running back Jalin Moore to be named the Sun Belt's Offensive Player of the Year and helped Marcus Cox become the program's all-time leading rusher with more than 5,000 career yards.

He coached three All-Americans who went on to play in the NFL at Eastern Kentucky, with two offensive linemen from the 2010 team selected in the NFL Draft.

Brandon HARRIS

Defensive Backs / First Season

Brandon Harris, a former second round NFL Draft pick, is in his first season as UCF football's defensive backs coach in 2025. A name synonymous with football in the state of Florida, Harris joins the Knights after spending the previous three seasons as an assistant coach at Florida Atlantic.

"I'm incredibly excited to join the UCF program and compete at the highest level in the Big 12 Conference," said Harris. "Growing up in South Florida, I've watched UCF build a dynamic football culture. Now getting a chance to be here and work with an outstanding group of student-athletes and coaches is an opportunity I'm beyond excited for."

"The energy, passion, and vision of this program under Coach Frost align perfectly with my coaching values, and I cannot wait to get started."

Harris served as the Owls' co-defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach in 2024, helping the squad tally 11 interceptions and two defensive touchdowns. FAU recorded at least one turnover in eight of its 12 games and ranked among the nation's top 40 teams in red zone defense.

The Owls' defense held seven teams to 25 points or fewer during the season, including AAC Champion Army, which went undefeated in conference action with an 8-0 record in The American.

With his assistance, true freshman defensive back CJ Heard was named a Third Team All-AAC Selection and led FAU with 82 tackles.

In 2023, Jarron Morris earned all-conference honors after leading the team in tackles for a loss with 7.5, pass breakups (6), interceptions (3) and forced fumbles (2). FAU was third nationally in fewest penalties with 41, while tallying a pair of defensive touchdowns.

Harris helped establish FAU as an aggressive defense in his first season in 2022, as the Owls were tied for 12th nationally in defensive TDs, while picking off 12 passes.

Prior to his time in Boca Raton, Harris was the cornerbacks coach at FIU in 2021 and a defensive analyst at Florida State in 2020.

The South Florida native starred as a player at Miami, where he was a Phil Steele Second Team All-American and First Team All-ACC selection in 2009. Harris was a Jim Thorpe Award Semifinalist, presented annually to the nation's best defensive back, in 2009 and 2010.

During his 2009 standout season, he tied for second nationally with 15 pass breakups and third in passes defended (17). He also ranked third on the Hurricanes with 52 tackles.

Harris was selected in the second round of the 2011 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans. He played six seasons in the NFL, spending time with the Tennessee Titans and Miami Dolphins in addition to the Texans. He won a Grey Cup Championship with the Toronto Argonauts in 2017 before launching his coaching career.

His father, Tim Harris Sr., is a high school coaching legend in the Miami area where Brandon starred as a player at Booker T. Washington Senior High School. Brandon is the younger brother of former UCF assistant coach, Tim Harris Jr., who was the Knights' offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach in 2024.

Jimmy BEAL

Running Backs / First Season

Jimmy Beal is in his first season as the Knights' running backs coach in 2025. Beal brings nearly two decades of collegiate coaching experience to UCF, along with a strong reputation for developing dynamic rushing attacks.

"I'm thrilled to join the UCF coaching staff as the running backs coach and become part of such a storied program with a tradition of excellence," Beal said. "I am grateful to Coach Scott Frost for believing in me and giving me this incredible opportunity. UCF is a special place with a proud history of running backs, and I can't wait to get to work with this talented group of student-athletes and compete in the Big 12 Conference."

Beal joins UCF following a successful 2024 season at Utah State, where he helped the Aggies rank among the Mountain West's top five teams in rushing, averaging nearly 200 yards per game. Prior to that, he coached running backs at San Diego State in 2023, where the Aztecs averaged 154.3 rushing yards per game.

From 2020 to 2022, Beal served as running backs coach at his alma mater Montana State. In two active seasons, the Bobcats ranked second nationally in yards per carry (5.8), third in total rushing yards (7,662), and third in rushing yards per game (262.4). Beal helped lead Montana State to a 12-2 record and Big Sky Conference championship in 2022, reaching the FCS semifinals, and coached Isaiah Ifanse to second-team All-America honors in 2021.

Beal also coached at South Dakota State (2019), where his unit averaged 198.2 rushing yards per game and produced All-American Pierre Strong Jr., and Northern Arizona (2010-18), where his running backs earned eight all-conference honors and Zach Bauman set the school's career rushing record.

He began his coaching career at Rocky Mountain College (2005-08) and worked as a graduate assistant at Texas State, also coaching track & field sprinters at MSU Billings.

As a player, Beal started at Montana State before finishing at Rocky Mountain College, where he earned team MVP and most valuable running back honors.

Mark D'ONOFRIO

Linebackers / First Season

Mark D'Onofrio, who has more than 20 years of experience coaching at the FBS level, was named UCF's linebackers coach by head coach Scott Frost in January. D'Onofrio joins the Knights after spending the previous two seasons working with the inside linebackers at Stanford.

"I'm thrilled to join Scott Frost's staff at UCF," said D'Onofrio. "It's an incredible opportunity to be part of a program with a strong vision and commitment to excellence. I'm deeply grateful to Coach Frost and Alex Grinch for trusting me with this responsibility, and I can't wait to get to work!"

In addition to his expertise coaching linebackers, D'Onofrio has also coordinated defenses with 12 years as a defensive coordinator at three different schools. He has coached and recruited numerous all-conference selections and NFL Draft picks, including 10 players that were taken in the first three rounds of the draft, most notably Los Angeles Chargers linebacker Denzel Perryman, who he coached at Miami, and Cleveland Browns tight end David Njoku, who he recruited to Coral Gables.

At Stanford (2023-24), D'Onofrio was responsible for all defensive run-game planning, helping the Cardinal improve from 126th nationally in rushing defense (224.4 yards per game) prior to his arrival to 40th (132.9 ypg) by 2024 — the program's best run defense since 2014. Under his leadership, linebacker Gaethan Bernadel led the team in tackles two consecutive seasons, earning Pac-12 All-Conference honors in 2023 and a spot on the 2024 Preseason Butkus Award Watch List. Stanford also ranked 21st nationally in forced fumbles in 2024, significantly improving its turnover production.

In 2022, D'Onofrio helped Wisconsin rank 10th nationally in total defense (303.5 ypg), eighth in rushing defense (99.2 ypg), and fourth in yards per rush attempt (2.91). Linebacker Maema Njongmeta flourished under his coaching, earning third-team All-Big Ten honors after leading the Badgers with 95 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, and 3.5 sacks.

During his time at Houston, his defense ranked second in the American Athletic Conference in scoring defense (23.8 points per game) despite facing multiple high-powered offenses. Houston also ranked second in rushing defense, pass efficiency defense, and red zone defense. Inside linebacker D'Juan Hines earned first-team all-conference honors, finishing third in the AAC with 110 tackles.

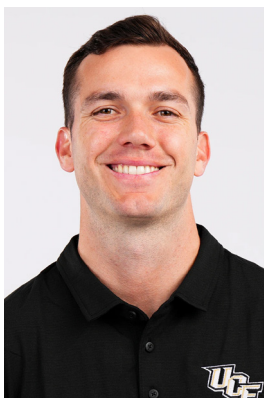
At Miami, D'Onofrio coached and recruited standout linebacker Denzel Perryman, a two-time Dick Butkus Award semifinalist and 2015 AP All-American who became an NFL Pro Bowler. His Miami defenses consistently ranked near the top of the ACC in takeaways, total defense, and rushing defense, forcing 25 turnovers in 2015 and holding multiple opponents under 100 rushing yards.

At Temple, D'Onofrio transformed a defense that ranked last nationally into a top-20 unit by 2010, helping the Owls reach bowl eligibility in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history.

A former standout linebacker at Penn State from 1988-91, D'Onofrio was a team captain as a senior and was selected in the second round of the 1992 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers. He earned a starting role as a rookie before an injury ended his playing career.

McKenzie MILTON

Quarterbacks / First Season

McKenzie Milton, one of UCF's most iconic players, returned to Orlando as the Knights' quarterbacks coach in December 2024. A two-time American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year, Milton led UCF to a 27-6 record as the starting quarterback, guiding the Knights to two AAC Championships and consecutive New Year's Six bowl appearances.

"I'm beyond excited to be back in Orlando and part of the UCF family once again," Milton said. "UCF holds such a special place in my heart, and to return as quarterbacks coach is truly an honor. I can't wait to help develop the next generation of Knights and build on the incredible tradition of success we've established here at UCF. Charge On!"

Milton joins UCF after two seasons as an offensive analyst at Tennessee, where he helped the Volunteers earn a 10-2 record and a spot in the inaugural 12-team College Football Playoff. A native of Kapolei, Hawaii, Milton threw for 8,683 yards and 72 touchdowns at UCF, ranking third in program history with 9,761 yards of total offense. He finished with 92 total touchdowns and a 61.8 completion percentage.

Milton's historic 2017 campaign led the Knights to a perfect 13-0 season and a Peach Bowl victory over Auburn. That year, he set UCF single-season records with 4,037 passing yards and 37 touchdowns, ranking among the national leaders in both categories. He also earned the Touchdown Club of Columbus Archie Griffin Award as college football's Most Valuable Player.

Following the 2018 season, Milton finished sixth in the Heisman Trophy voting and was a finalist for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award. He passed for 2,663 yards with 25 touchdowns and was a semifinalist for the Maxwell, Walter Camp and Davey O'Brien Award. Milton finished the regular season ranked third nationally in passing yards per completion (15.57) and ninth in passing efficiency (161.0).

After suffering a major injury in 2018, Milton made his return to the field in 2020 and earned the 2021 Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year.

Pete ALAMAR

Special Teams Coordinator / First Season

Pete Alamar, who has more than 40 years of experience as an assistant coach and 20 years working with special teams units, was named UCF's special teams coordinator and senior analyst by head coach Scott Frost in January.

"I'm incredibly grateful to Coach Scott Frost for this opportunity to join his coaching staff as special teams coordinator," said Alamar. "My goal is to develop and lead the best special teams units in the Big 12 and nationally and I cannot wait to get to work with our players and coaches."

Alamar most recently served as associate head coach and special teams coordinator at Rice, where he also acted as interim head coach for the final four games of the 2024 season. He led the Owls to two victories, including a key 24-20 win over Navy, which finished the year 10-3. His 2024 kickoff return unit ranked ninth nationally, averaging 26.22 yards per return, led by Quinton Jackson who set a new program record with a 100-yard kickoff return at UConn—breaking a 50-year-old mark—and earned AAC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. Jackson finished the season fifth nationally with 589 kickoff return yards and was Rice's first kickoff return touchdown scorer since 2012.

In 2023, Alamar's kickoff return defense ranked 15th nationally, limiting opponents to just 16.39 yards per return. That season, Rice blocked two field goals and a punt, while opponents did not block a single kick or punt against the Owls.

Before Rice, Alamar spent 11 years at Stanford (2012-22) as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach. He also held similar roles at Fresno State (2010-11) and Cal (2003-09). Throughout his career, his specialists and special teams units have consistently ranked among the nation's best. He has been part of eight teams that won at least 10 games—including two at Arizona, two at Cal, and four at Stanford—and participated in 18 bowl games.

At Stanford, kicker Joshua Karty flourished under Alamar's guidance, becoming a finalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2022 after a perfect 18-for-18 field goal season, including a school-record 61-yard kick. Karty earned two All-American and All-Pac-12 selections before being drafted by the Los Angeles Rams in 2024. Stanford's kickoff return defense led the Pac-12 that year, allowing just 17.09 yards per return.

In 2021, Alamar's special teams remained a highlight for Stanford. Nathaniel Peat led the Pac-12 with 663 kickoff return yards, averaging 24.6 yards per return, and earned Phil Steele's All-Pac-12 first team honors. Punter Ryan Sanborn averaged 43.3 yards per punt on 63 attempts, while Stanford's kickoff return defense ranked fourth nationally, allowing just 13.8 yards per return. The punt return unit also ranked 10th nationally that season.

Alamar also coached kicker Jet Toner, who finished his Stanford career in 2020 with a school-record 113 consecutive PATs and ranked third in program history with 280 career points. Stanford ranked sixth nationally in 2019 with four blocked kicks, including one returned for a touchdown. In 2018, Stanford's special teams led the Pac-12, powered by punter Jake Bailey and kicker Toner, both of whom earned second-team All-Pac-12 honors. Bailey was drafted by the New England Patriots in 2019.

In 2016, Alamar helped kicker Conrad Ukropina set multiple Stanford records, including field goal percentage (.900) and perfect extra-point percentages. Ukropina and the Cardinal set single-season team records for field goals made (22) and extra-point percentage (1.000).

Alamar's influence also extended to one of college football's most dynamic players, Christian McCaffrey, who won the 2015 Jet Award as the nation's top kick returner, finishing with over 1,000 kickoff return yards and ranking second nationally in combined kick returns.

Alamar was named Phil Steele's Special Teams Coach of the Year following the 2013 season, when Stanford's kickoff return unit ranked second nationally, averaging 27.4 yards per return. Ty Montgomery scored two kickoff return touchdowns that year, including a school-record 100-yard return. The kickoff coverage unit was equally strong, ranking 10th nationally.

During his time at Cal, Alamar coached All-America punt returner DeSean Jackson, who led the nation in 2006 with an 18.2-yard average per return and set Pac-10 records with four touchdown returns. That season, Sporting News rated Cal's special teams the best in the Pac-10.

In his 12th season at the helm of the UCF program George O'Leary announces his retirement on Oct. 25. He finishes with an 81-68 overall record with the Black and Gold. Quarterbacks coach Danny Barrett takes over as the interim head coach for the final four games of 2015. During the year, UCF has 21 former Knights appear on NFL rosters with a total of 20 players ending the regular season with NFL clubs. UCF leads all Group of Five schools, and ranks ahead of 25 Power Five schools, with the most players on NFL rosters.

2016

The first year of the Scott Frost era at UCF saw the former Oregon offensive coordinator take the Knights from 0-12 to a bowl game, finishing 6-7 on the year. One of the top turnarounds in the nation, Frost's Knights were the first team to go from winless to a bowl game since UCF did it from 2004 to 2005. Linebacker Shaquem Griffin burst onto the scene in Frost's defensive system, earning First Team All-Conference and American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors. Four Knights were honored by The American in all as Shaquill Griffin and Jamiyus Pittman earned Second Team honors and Drico Johnson was named an Honorable Mention. Shaquill went on to be selected in the third round of the NFL Draft, while five members of the UCF defensive back field signed NFL contracts (Johnson, D.J. Killings, T.J. 2017

The Knights went undefeated in 2017, winning the American Athletic Conference East Division, their third American Athletic Conference Championship, the 2018 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, and claiming a National Championship. UCF finished the season ranked sixth in the Associated Press Poll and seventh in the Coaches Poll, receiving four first place votes in the AP Poll. The Knights were ranked number one in the nation by the Colley Matrix, an NCAA National Champion Major Selector. McKenzie Milton burst onto the scene, earning American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year and Archie Griffin National Player of the Year honors, while finishing eighth in the Heisman voting. A record in The American, 16 players were named all-conference, including nine first teamers. The Knights had four All-Americans in Milton, Shaquem Griffin, Mike Hughes and Tre'Quan Smith. Hughes became the fourth Knight to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft, while Smith and Jordan Akins went in the third round and Griffin heard his name called in the fifth.

2018

The first season under head coach Josh Heupel was another success for the UCF football program. The Knights finished the 2018 regular season undefeated for the second straight year, advancing to the American Athletic Conference Championship and winning their second straight league title. Heupel became one of just three coaches to have gone undefeated in their first season as a head coach, joining Chris Peterson (Boise State, 2003) and Larry Coaker (Miami, 2001). The Knights extended their program-record winning streak to 25 games before falling to LSU in the Fiesta Bowl. It was the longest streak in the nation at the time and the fourth longest win streak in FBS since the year 2000. The rushing attack for UCF was one of the best in the nation in 2018. Led by Greg McCrae, who went for 1,182 yards on the ground, rushing for a school record and second-best in the nation 8.9 yards per carry. The Knights set new program bests of 3,448 rushing yards, 265.2 rushing yards per game, 43 rushing touchdowns and a team average of 5.8 yards per carry. McKenzie Milton led a conference record 17 all-conference honors, earning AAC Offensive Player of the Year honors for the second straight season. He also finished sixth in the Heisman Trophy voting despite missing the final two games of the season due to injury.

2019

In Josh Heupel's second season, UCF recorded its third straight 10-win season and earned its fourth consecutive bowl berth, a first in program history. The Knights finished 10-3 with all three losses coming on the road by a total of seven points. UCF was undefeated at home for the third straight year, extending its nation-leading home win streak to 21 games. The Knights' total offense of 540.5 yards per game ranked second in the nation and set a new school record. Finishing 24th in both the AP and Coaches polls, it marked the third straight season and fifth time this decade UCF finished ranked in the top 25. UCF put 12 players on the American Athletic Conference All-Conference Teams, which included Gabriel Davis, Jake Brown and Richie Grant earning first-team honors. Davis also became the Knights' 42nd NFL Draft pick, going to the Buffalo Bills in the fourth round.

In a season shortened due to the COVID-19 pandemic, UCF went 6-3 in the regular season with wins over Georgia Tech, Houston, and rival South Florida. The Knights earned their fifth consecutive bowl berth, a program record, playing in the Boca Raton Bowl. UCF ranked second in the nation with a new program record of 568.1 yards of offense per game. The defense also led the nation with 13 fumble recoveries. Nine Knights earned All-AAC honors, including Richie Grant, who was a unanimous selection and a first-team honoree for the third straight season. Grant was also a finalist for the Jim Thorpe Award and along with Marlon Williams earned honorable mention All-America accolades from Phil Steele. In head coach Gus Malzahn's first season at the helm, UCF finished 9-4 with a perfect 7-0 record at home, going 30-2 since 2017. The Knights earned their sixth consecutive bowl berth, defeating Florida in the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl. The Knights ranked first in the country in fourth down conversion percentage converting 84.6% of its tries on fourth down. Individually, safety Quadric Bullard ranked third in the country with three fumble recoveries and receiver Ryan O'Keefe ranked first in the American in receptions per game with 6.5. Seven Knights received All-AAC honors at the end of the season, including defensive end Big Kat Bryant who was named All-AAC first team and received AAC Defensive Lineman and Newcomer of the Year nods by Pro Football Network. 2022

In its final season in the American Athletic Conference, UCF finished as conference runner-ups with a 9-5 season in head coach Gus Malzahn's second year leading the Knights. UCF ranked as high as 22 in the College Football Playoff rankings. UCF finished 6-2 in conference play including wins over 19 and 20th-ranked Cincinnati, 17th-ranked Tulane and South Florida. The Knights capped off the 2022 season with their seventh consecutive bowl appearance, playing in the Military Bowl presented by Peraton. UCF ranked fifth in the country in red zone defense, holding opponents to just a 70.7% conversion rate. On the offense, UCF ranked ninth nationally with 228.4 yards-per-game and ninth in total rushing touchdowns with 35. Running Isaiah Bowser finished the season with 16 rushing touchdowns, enough for second all-time in a season in UCF history. Quarterback John Rhys Plumlee finished with 11 rushing touchdowns, finishing second for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in a season for the Knights. After the season, Nine Knights received All-AAC honors including first-team nods for offensive linemen Ryan Swoboda and Lokahi Paule, defensive linemen Ricky Barber and Tre'mon Morris-Brash and linebacker Jason Johnson. Swoboda was also named to the 247Sports Transfer All-America team. Concluding its time in the American, UCF finished with a combined record of 57-13 (.713), the most wins and best winning percentage of any team.

2023

In its first season in the Big 12 Conference, UCF was the only Big 12 newcomer to make a bowl game in 2023, as the Knights finished with six wins and earned an invitation to play in the Gasparilla Bowl. It marked a program-record eighth consecutive postseason bowl appearance, 11th in the last 12 seasons and the 15th in 19 years. In his third season as UCF head coach, Gus Malzahn has seen his teams qualify for postseason bowl games in all 12 years he has been a head coach, including seven appearances in New Year's Day games. Malzahn was one of four active coaches that has led his team to bowl eligibility in each of the past 12 seasons. UCF ranked fourth nationally in rushing offense (228.2 per game) in 2023, the sixth straight season the Knights have averaged at least 196 rushing yards per game. The Knights ranked fourth nationally in third-down conversion percentage in 2023 (.500) and were also eighth nationally in total offense with 487.0 yards per game, surpassing 500 yards in four games last season. The season was highlighted by a dominant 45-3 victory against No. 15 Oklahoma State at home in UCF's annual Space Game. The Knights recorded their first top-15 win since 2017 when the Knights defeated seventh-ranked Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and the first top-15 home win since 2009 against No. 13 Houston.

2024

For the second consecutive year, RJ Harvey was a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award, presented annually to the nation's best collegiate running back. Harvey was the story of the season, becoming UCF's all-time career touchdown leader with 48 (43 rushing, five receiving), passing UCF Hall of Famer Kevin Smith who tallied 46 during his time as a Knight. Harvey finished the campaign with 1,577 rushing yards, the second-most in a single season in program history. He also finished second in career rushing yards at UCF with 3,792. As a team, the Knights started the season 3-0 for the second consecutive campaign, posting impressive offensive performances over New Hampshire and Sam Houston. UCF started conference play with a remarkable 21-point comeback in Fort Worth to beat TCU in the first meeting against the Horned Frogs. The Knights earned their other league victory over Arizona in the eight edition of UCF's Space Game, trouncing the Wildcats 56-12 thanks to 602 yards of offense while surrendering just 261 yards on defense.
