Bye Week: Baylor and West Virginia

- 68.8% (II of I6) of Big I2 teams have at least four wins this season, which is the highest rate among all FBS conferences.
- The Big I2 leads the FBS this season in conference games decided by three points or fewer at six.
- Big I2 QB Club: Four Conference signal callers rank in the top eight nationally in passing touchdowns with Baylor's Sawyer Robertson (Ist), Kansas' Jalon Daniels (2nd), TCU's Josh Hoover (T-4th) and Arizona's Noah Fifita (T-8th).
- Big I2 QB Club: BU's Sawyer Robertson remains the FBS leader in passing yards per game (343.0), and TCU's Josh Hoover ranks sixth. Robertson is also tied for the FBS lead in points responsible for, while KU's Jalon Daniels ranks fourth.
- BYU, Texas Tech and Utah each have a scoring offense and scoring defense in the top 25 of FBS. The Red Raiders rank in the top five of both scoring offense (2nd) and scoring defense (4th).
- Texas Tech is the first Big I2 team to start a season 5-0 with an average margin of victory of 37+ points per game since the 20I5 Baylor Bears, who won their first five games by an average of 42 points per game.
- BYU has started 5-0 for a second consecutive season for the second time in program history with both instances (2020-21, 2024-25) taking place during the Kalani Sitake era.
- Cincinnati (T-Ist), Utah (T-6th), K-State (T-6th), BYU (T-IIth), Kansas (T-I6th) and Texas Tech (T-I9th) give the Big I2 six programs in the top 30 nationally in fewest sacks allowed, which is the most of any conference.

Conference News & Notes

- Big I2 Conference defenses lead the nation with 77 interceptions, seven more than any other league.
- BYU's Bear Bachmeier is the first Big I2 player with at least five passing and five rushing touchdowns through his first five career games since Baylor's Robert Griffin III in 2008.
- Arizona's Noah Fifita threw five touchdowns versus Oklahoma State, his second game in 2025 with at least five touchdown passes (also vs. Weber State). The only other FBS player with multiple such games this season is Indiana's Fernando Mendoza.
- On Saturday, Baylor's Michael Trigg became the fourth tight end in Big I2 history to have a game with at least I55 receiving yards. He joins Jace Amaro (in 20I2 and 20I3), Jared Wiley (2023) and Jermaine Gresham (2008).
- Only five teams in FBS have at least five different players with I3 or more receptions and I50+ receiving yards.
 Three of those five teams are Baylor, lowa State and Texas Tech.
- Jordyn Tyson has caught a touchdown in all five games this year, the longest streak by an Arizona State player to begin a season since Keith Poole in 1996 (six). The last Big I2 player with a longer such streak was Oklahoma's CeeDee Lamb in 2019 (six).
- The Big I2 Conference will publicly provide player availability reports for all Conference games this season at BigI2Sports.com/FBReporting, beginning three days prior to kickoff.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
