### CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- BYU and Texas Tech are two of the 11 remaining undefeated programs in FBS, while Cincinnati, Houston and Utah give the Conference five teams with one or fewer losses.
- The Big 12 Conference welcomes FOX's Big Noon Kickoff pre-game show for a third time this season when BYU hosts Utah in a top-25 matchup in Provo.
- Big 12 QB Club: Baylor (1st), Texas Tech (3rd) and TCU (5th) give the Conference three of the top five teams in FBS in passing yards per game.
- Big 12 QB Club: Only three FBS quarterbacks have thrown for 18 or more touchdowns this season; Baylor's Sawyer Robertson, Kansas' Jalon Daniels and TCU's Josh Hoover. Arizona's Noah Fifita and Cincinnati's Brendan Sorsby give the Conference five QB's in the top 12 nationally in passing touchdowns.
- Texas Tech leads all undefeated FBS teams in margin of victory at 35.3 points per game this season.
- For the first time in program history, BYU has started consecutive seasons 6-0.
- The Red Raiders are the first Big 12 team to win each of its first three Conference games by 24 points or more since the 2015 Baylor Bears.
- TTU's Cameron Dickey's 263 rushing yards versus Kansas are the most by an FBS player this season and the fifth most ever by a Red Raider. He was named the Walter Camp FBS and Associated Press National Player of the Week.

## CONFERENCE NEWS &amp; NOTES

- The Conference is home to a pair of the nation's leaders in sacks in TTU's David Bailey (T-1st) and Utah's John Henry Daley (T-3rd) at eight-and-a-half and eight sacks respectively. The duo makes the Big 12 the only Power Four conference with multiple players with six sacks or more.
- BYU's Bear Bachmeier is the second FBS true freshman in the last 30 years to have at least seven rushing touchdowns and eight passing scores through his team's first six games of a season. The other was Baylor's Robert Griffin III in 2008.
- Cincinnati's offensive line has only allowed one sack this season, the fewest in the FBS. The only other Big 12 teams to allow one or zero sacks through six games of a season were Texas Tech (one in 2008) and Iowa State (zero in 1998).
- The Big 12 currently has 14 of its 16 teams (87.5%) with a positive point-differential this season. That is the second-highest rate among all FBS conferences this season (excluding independents) behind the SEC (93.8%; 15-of-16).
- The Big 12's quarterbacks have combined for a 3.07 touchdown-to-interception ratio this season. That is best among all FBS conferences this season (excluding independents).
- Sun Devil wide out Jordyn Tyson has reached the end-zone in his last seven consecutive games, which is the second-longest active streak by an FBS wide receiver or running back.

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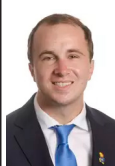
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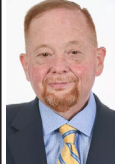
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**College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process**

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the 12 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through 12 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
