OPENING TIP

- ◆ UCF hosts LSU on Sunday for its second and final exhibition before the start of the 2025-26 regular season.
- → The Knights and Tigers battled back and forth last year at the Greenbrier Tip-Off as LSU came out with a 109-102 triple overtime victory.
- ◆ The matchup marks the first time LSU has played at Addition Financial Arena in program history.

DAWKINS' HOMECOMING IN DURHAM

- ◆ For the first time in UCF program history, the Knights played in Cameron Indoor against Duke in an exhibition game on Oct. 21.
- ◆ The exhibition was part of Duke men's basketball series called the "Brotherhood Run", a tradition in which Duke invites former players who are now collegiate head coaches back to Durham for a matchup.
- + Prior to the game, Coach Dawkins was honored at half court by Duke head coach Jon Scheyer and former Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski, they handed him a commemorative basketball.
- → Head Coach Johnny Dawkins returned to his alma mater, where he was a two-time consensus All-American and was enshrined in the Duke Hall of Fame in September 1996, when his No. 24 jersey was retired.
- ◆ Dawkins stepped back onto the hardwood at Cameron for the first time since 2008, when he was an associate head coach.
- → The last matchup between the two teams took place on March 24, 2019, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at Colonial Life Arena in Columbia, South Carolina, where the Blue Devils advanced following a narrow 77-76 victory.
- ◆ Dawkins played at Duke for Coach Mike Krzyzewski from 1982-86. He is regarded as a key early figure in the program's ascent to becoming a national power. Dawkins and company began to build the foundation for Duke basketball after a sub-.500 freshman season. The Blue Devils finished 24-10 the following campaign, sparking back-to-back NCAA Tournament Second Round appearances. His senior season culminated with a 37-3 record and a National Championship game appearance.
- ◆ Throughout his time at Duke, Dawkins piled up 2,556 points, a mark that stood as the school's scoring record until 2006 and remains second all-time. He was a two-time consensus All-American, a four-time All-ACC selection, four-time team MVP, and was the recipient of the 1986 Naismith National Player of the Year award.

- ◆ UCF lost 100% of its scoring from last season and is one of five Power Four teams to not bring back any returning scoring, joined by Baylor, Miami, Indiana and West Virginia.
- ◆ The Knights' newcomers that played last season averaged 86.1 points per game in total, led by Themus Fulks' 14.6 and both George Beale Jr. and Jamichael Stillwell averaging 13.0.
- ◆ Devan Cambridge is heading into his sixth year of college basketball, previously playing with Auburn, Arizona State and Texas Tech. In Cambridge's most-recent season with the Red Raiders, he reached the 1,000 points milestone.
- → Fulks enters his fifth year of college hoops, previously playing for South Carolina State, Louisiana, and Milwaukee. Fulks averaged an impressive 5.9 assists per game last season, placing him 22nd in the NCAA in assists per game.
- → UCF has three incoming senior transfers in Riley Kugel, Beale Jr. and Stillwell. Kugel posted double figures in 17 games while managing a 43.3 field goal percentage last season at Mississippi State. Beale scored 62 three-pointers in his past season at Hampton, the 12th most in the CAA while maintaining a 39.5 three-point percentage. Stillwell was a double-double magician at Milwaukee, earning 16 double-doubles to tie for 11-most in the NCAA last season.
- ◆ The Knights bring in four incoming Juniors: Jeremy Foumena, Carmelo Pacheco, Chris Johnson and Jordan Burks. Foumena appeared in 28 games off the bench for Rhode Island, averaging 5.3 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. Pacheco was lights-out from the three at Mount St. Mary's, knocking down four or more three-pointers in a game 10 times and averaged 46.8% from downtown last season. Johnson, despite only playing in three games last season, averaged 10.7 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 1.7 assists for Stephen F. Austin. Burks scored double-digits



in nine games with Georgetown while maintaining a 52.1 shooting percentage.

- Kris Parker and John Bol are the two incoming sophomore transfers. Parker appeared in 27 games for Villanova and played an average of 10 minutes per game, averaging 2.6 points and 1.4 rebounds per game. Bol was named as a top recruit in the state of Georgia and the eighth best center in the 2024 class by ESPN.
- · UCF brings in freshman Zach Johnson and Tanner Jones. Johnson competed for IV Greatness Academy and averaged 30 points, six rebounds and five assists per game. Jones played 21 games at Campbell Hall, averaging 12.3 points and 6.3 rebounds per game.

KNIGHTS ON THE ROAD

- ◆ After the exhibition game at Cameron Indoor, the Knights have road matchups in the non-conference and Big 12 conference slate that consist of teams that are known for protecting their home court.
 The Knights head to College Station to face the Texas A&M Aggies for their lone non-conference road matchup. The Aggies are 54-13 in their
- last four years at Reed Arena, going 7-0 in their non-conference home games last season.

 UCF will face lowa State at Hilton Coliseum, where the Cyclones are 60-10 their past four seasons. lowa State won 29 straight home games
- before losing to Kansas State on February 1, 2025.
- UCF heads to the Fertitta Center to play Houston after two years of not previously playing there. The Cougars are 33-1 at home since joining the Big 12 in July 2023.

FOES WITH MARCH MADNESS PEDIGREE

- ♦ Along with the exhibition game against a NCAA Final Four team in Duke, come regular season play, the Knights will play eight teams who appeared in the NCAA Tournament last season.
- The nine Big 12 teams the Knights will host have punched 49 tickets to the NCAA Tournament over the last decade. Kansas leads the way with nine appearances in the last 10 seasons with Baylor boasting eight and Arizona and Texas Tech reaching March Madness seven times.
- ◆ The nine Big 12 teams the Knights will host have punched 49 tickets to the NCAA Tournament over the last decade. Kansas leads the way with nine appearances in the last 10 seasons with Baylor boasting eight and Arizona and Texas Tech reaching March Madness seven times.
- ◆ Last season, Texas Tech reached the Elite Eight and Houston wound up in the Final Four of the NCAA Tournament.

- Themus Fulks and Jamichael Stillwell both had breakout years with Milwaukee in the 2024-2025 season after their first year playing together. Fulks and Stillwell bring their talents to Orlando to continue their duo chemistry.
- ◆ Fulks and Stillwell bring elite scoring, dropping 14.6 points and 13.0 points per game, respectively.
- ◆ Fulks assisted the ball at a high level with the Panthers last season, putting him at ninth nationally for returning assist leaders at 5.9
- Stillwell recorded 10.7 rebounds per game last season, putting him fifth nationally for returning rebound leaders at 10.7 rebounds per game. Stillwell's 16 double-doubles last season put him at No. 5 nationally for top returning double-double leaders.
- ◆ Stillwell's efforts on the glass for the Panthers put the team at second nationally in rebound margin, fifth in offensive rebounds per game, and 21st in rebounds per game.
- Milwaukee went 13-5 last season when Fulks and Stillwell each played 25-plus minutes in a game.

- ◆ UCF joined the Big 12 conference prior to the 2023-24 season and this season marks its third season in the league.
- ◆ The AP Preseason Poll came out on October 13 and it featured six Big 12 teams ranked in the Top 25.
- ◆ The six teams tie for the most in Big 12 history and has happened in back-to-back years. With three teams in the top 10 it marks the most by any conference this year
- ◆ The Black and Gold are set to face three of the opponents at home with No. 10 Texas Tech, #13 Arizona and #19 Kansas. The Knights travel to the other three schools starting with No. 2 Houston, #8 BYU and #16 lowa State.

- ◆ UCF ranked 32nd in free throw attempts per game, 24th in free throw percentage, and 14th in free throws per game nationally.
- → Four of the Knights transfers, Fulks, Kugel, Beale Jr., and Pacheco shot above 75% from the free throw line last season.

◆ With the win over Oregon State, UCF has secured the program's single season points record with 2,693, topping the previous best of 2,617 accomplished in 1979-80. The mark is UCF's highest point total in a season in the program's Division I era, as UCF's last year in Division II was the 1983-84 campaign.

ON POINT FROM DEEP

- ◆ UCF ranked 56th nationally in three-point attempts per game, placing them 65th in three-pointers made per game.
- → The Black and Gold were 14-4 last season when the team shot above 35% from three-point range.
- → Transfers George Beale Jr. and Carmelo Pacheco shot the three-ball above 40% last season.
- ◆ Both Beale Jr. Pacheco averaged 6.3 three-point attempts per game on their two previous teams, respectively.
- ◆ UCF earned 10 or more three-pointers for the 14th time last season against 0regon State, hitting 10 or more threes in four of its last five games after not doing so for the entire month of February. The streak including tying a season-high 14 made threes vs. Kansas in the second round of the Big 12 Championship. To put in perspective the shooting capability of this year's team, the Knights hit 10 or more three pointers just twice last season. Additionally, UCF has five games where they've shot 50% or better from the floor after doing that four times in the previous campaign.
- The Black and Gold have knocked down a program record 328 three pointers last season, reaching the milestone during the College Basketball Crown first round. The mark tops the 295 made triples during the 2022-23 season.
- The Knights averaged 8.9 made three pointers per game, beating the previous record during Dawkins' tenure at 8.8 during the 2021-22 campaign. The high clip has helped UCF to its highest scoring offense under Dawkins as well.

DJ LEFT A LEGACY

- Darius Johnson will go down as one of the best to ever suit up in a Knights uniform. With his outing at TCU, Johnson cracked into the top 10 in career points at UCF. He is also third in career assists at UCF and second in steals for the Black and Gold, achieving more than 400 and 200, respectively, reaching both milestones at Kansas on Jan. 28, making him one of four Knights to accomplish the feat. He boasts the most steals
- in UCF's Division-I history and is one of the programs 21,000 point scorers.

 Johnson, one of the most tenured Knights, finished his career third in the record book for games played in Black and Gold with 125.

 Johnson broke his own UCF Division I record of steals, accomplishing the feat against Utah in the Big 12 Conference Championship first round. His previous best was 73 and now sits at 79. He ranks 14th in the nation, averaging 2.32 steals p/gm. He finished last season 18th nationally and 2nd in the Big 12 in steals per game at 2.21.
- Johnson was a marksman from deep last season, hitting 40.5% of his threes, improving on his 39.4% from last season, which was a 12.5% improvement over his sophomore season. The campaign saw him tally 12 games with a trio of three-point makes, including three instances of five or more. He made eight threes in a game, going 8-for-10 behind the arc against Milwaukee (Nov. 27) accounting for eight of UCF's 11 threes that day. At the time of achieving the feat, Johnson was tied for the most made threes in game for a Power Four team on the season.
- Johnson is in nine different career top 10 lists in UCF's program record book.

KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)

POSTSEASON PURSUIT

- ◆ Under head coach Johnny Dawkins, the Knights have made a postseason appearance in five of his nine seasons, including three straight postseason appearances.
- ◆ UCF experienced immediate postseason success by making the NIT in the first year under Dawkins' new leadership, reaching the NIT semifinal in Madison Square Garden in 2016-2017.
- The Black and Gold returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2005 when they earned an at-large bid into the 2019 bracket as a No. 9 seed. Dawkins led the Knights to their first NCAA Tournament victory in program history, beating VCU 73-58 in the first round. The Black and Gold narrowly defeated in the next round, falling to top-seeded Duke
- ◆ UCF returned to the postseason by making the NIT in 2022-23 and earning a first round victory over in-state foe Florida. The Knights were the only team to hold Florida below 50 points during 2022-23 while the 49 Gator points were the least they've scored at home since Jan. 13, 1962 when they beat Auburn 43-40.

 The Black and Gold earned a spot in the 2024 NIT bracket as a No. 4 seed in their second straight trip to the tournament.
- This past season, the Knights were invited to compete in the inaugural College Basketball Crown in Las Vegas to play for a share of a pool of NIL prize money. After wins against Oregon State and conference-foe Cincinnati, the Knights would find themselves in a thrilling semi-final game against Villanova. UCF won 104-98 in overtime, earning a guaranteed \$100,000 of the NIL prize money pool.

 The Knights have been to five NCAA DI Tournaments and four NITs, totaling 11 postseason appearances (one CBI and one
- College Basketball Crown).

TREND SWAPS

- ◆ Prior to last season, UCF hung its hat on winning games on the defensive side of the ball. Last season, it was on the
- ◆ In Dawkins' previous eight seasons at the helm of the Black and Gold, the Knights averaged 68.9 points per game with the best clip in points per game sitting at 72.3 back in 2018-19, the last time UCF made the NCAA Tournament. This season, the offense has erupted, averaging 79.2 points per contest with 17 games of 80 or more points this season (54 total in JD era).
- The Knights' defense has allowed an average of 65.8 points per game over the previous eight seasons under Dawkins and has allowed 80.0 on the current campaign. The previous season-high never eclipsed 69.4 points per game (2020-21).
- UCF's defense allowed 90 points five times across Dawkins' first eight seasons and has allowed nine 90+ point games this season.
- ◆ UCF plays at one of the fastest paces in the nation, ranking 11th with a adjusted tempo of 72.0 according to KenPom.

TURNOVER TIME

- The Knights are averaging 13.03 forced turnovers per game last season, nearing a trend from the last three seasons of UCF forcing north of 14.0 turnovers per game, including a 14.21 clip last season and a 14.82 mark in 2022-23, the highest during the Dawkins era.
- ◆ UCF's defense ranks No. 108 in turnover percentage according to KenPom with a 18.2% clip which indicates that about one of every five Knight possessions stemmed from a turnover. The Knights finished ranked 29th during the 2023-24 season after recording a
- A big part of the Knights' high-forced turnover rate has been their steals, as the Knights have snatched 7.6 steals per game, a mark that ranks fourth in the Big 12. UCF averaged 8.7 steals per game during the 23-24 season, ranking 22nd in
- The Black and Gold forced 23 turnovers against Tarleton St., the first time forcing 20+ in a game last season. UCF accomplished the feat four times in 2023–24, the most in any season under Dawkins. UCF has forced 20+ turnovers 16 times under Dawkins after the 22 forced against Colorado on Jan. 8.

DAWKINS' DECADE

- ◆ Johnny Dawkins enters his 10th season with UCF during the 2025-26 season, he has built a particularly glossy college basketball playing and coaching catalogue—most recently including a 2025 induction to the Washington D.C. Hall of Fame and the 2023 induction into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame and selection of a UCF player in the first round of the 2023 NBA Draft.
- ◆ Dawkins has continued to rewrite UCF's history books, as he is responsible for nine of UCF's 11 total wins over ranked opponents. Prior to his arrival, the program had won two total games against ranked foes from 1984-2016.
- ◆ UCF had never won two games against ranked teams in a single season, and Dawkins has now accomplished the feat twice. It first happened during the 2018-2019 campaign, taking down No. 6 Houston and then No. 19 Cincinnati in Orlando in a span of five days in March. Now, the Knights have wins over three top-25 teams in 2023-2024, beating No. 3 Kansas in January while topping No. 25 Oklahoma and No. 23 Texas Tech in February.
- Dawkins picked up win No.100 as UCF's head coach in the Knight's win over N.C. A&T on Dec. 11, 2022, becoming just the third coach in UCF history to reach the milestone. Dawkins has a .583 winning percentage since starting with the Knights in 2016, which is the second best of any UCF coach in program history (Torchy Clark, .754 from 1969-83).
- Dawkins is the fastest coach to earn 100 wins in program history in the Division I era, needing only 162 games to do so. → At one point during the contest, the Knights had compiled a 20-2 run, dating back to Hall's three prior to halftime.
- Dawkins had his squad off to a 4-0 start to begin the 2024-2025 season, tying the 2021-22 and 2017-18 season for his best starts to a season at UCF.
- ◆ Dawkins led UCF to its first NIT Final Four (2017), first at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament (2019), and first NCAA Tournament win (2019). Additionally, he has led the Knights to three straight postseason appearances, including a championship appearance in the inaugural College Basketball Crown last season.
- Associate head coach, Robbie Laing has stayed beside Dawkins throughout his tenure at UCF.
 Laing was responsible for leading the charge in the recruitment of Taylor and Tyler Hendricks, both of whom joined the team's roster in the 2022-23 season.
- Taylor went on to lead the team in scoring, blocks and a multitude of other categories in a phenomenal freshman campaign, one that led to him becoming the program's first one-and-done, as well as first lottery pick in the NBA draft. Taylor was selected ninth overall in the 2023 NBA Draft to the Utah Jazz, the second of UCF's selections in the modern

DAWKINS' PERFECT RECORD VS. KANSAS, BILL SELF COMES TO AN END

- Kansas' Jan. 5, 2025 defeat of UCF snapped what was an unblemished 39-year run for Knights' head coach Johnny Dawkins against either Kansas or Bill Self as a coach or a player. Kansas swept the season series with a narrow win in Lawrence.
- UCF head coach Johnny Dawkins was a combined 6-0 in meetings against either Kansas or Bill Self, or a combination of both. Separately, he started 4-0 against Kansas in his career, with two wins as a player and two as a coach while also going 4-0 against Bill Self, with two wins as a head coach and two as an assistant. Dawkins is now 2-2 as a head coach against Self at
 - Dec. 1, 1985: Duke 92, Kansas 86 While playing for Duke and Mike Krzyzewski (Coach K), Dawkins, in his senior year, helped lift the Blue Devils over the Jayhawks in the fifth game of the 1985-86 season, played in Madison Square
 - March 29, 1986: Duke 71, Kansas 67 Dawkins leads all scorers with 24 points, shooting 11-for-17, in the NCAA

- ◆ When holding a team to 33.3% or less, UCF is 37-2 under Dawkins. Furthermore, the Black and Gold are 15-1 when holding a team to under 30% from the field under their current head coach.

- → UCF has made a habit of protecting Addition Financial Arena under head coach Johnny Dawkins, αoing 106-40 at home.
- ◆ After selling the most season tickets in program history for a second straight season, UCF welcomed a record number of fans for the second year in a row as well, hosting 136,833 for an average of 7,602 across the 18-game home slate.
- → Four games from last season grace the top-20 highest attended games list, including a sellout of 9,669 fans in attendance for the game against Kansas on Jan. 5, 2025. Six games from the inaugural Big 12 campaign last season are on the top 20
- → The Knights won 13 games at home in 2024-25, the fourth time doing so during the Dawkins era and technically the seventh time in the building's history, which opened its doors for the 2007-08 season.
- ◆ The Knights finished the out-of-league slate on an 11-game, regular season, home winning streak against non-conference foes, dating back to last season where UCF beat Maine, Florida A&M and Bethune-Cookman to wrap up nonconference.
- ◆ UCF's loss to Kansas snapped a perfect 8-0 home record this season; it goes down as the second-longest home winning streak under Dawkins.
- ◆ Dawkins and the Knights have earned six wins against ranked foes on their home floor, with an overall record of 6-12. career best and his second 30+ point game of his career. Facts about Hall's big night at the time of accomplishment are below:
- Became the third player in UCF's Division-I history (this being the 41st season) to score 40 points or more

- ◆ UCF is 43-12 in the month of December under Johnny Dawkins, never losing more than two games in any December while he has been at the helm. Two of Dawkins' five victories over top-25 teams at UCF have come in December.
- The Black and Gold are 32-4 at home in December during Dawkins' tenure.
- ◆ The Knights have averaged 73.0 points per game in December under Dawkins while holding foes to just 61.8 points per game, a double-digit margin of 11.1 points per contest.

BEATING FLORIDA FOES

- ◆ UCF has found success against in-state opponents under head coach Johnny Dawkins, going 28-11 against teams from Florida since his arrival. UCF added two tallies to the win column this season with the 100-94 win over Florida Atlantic on Nov. 12 and the 86-66 victory over Jacksonville on Dec. 21.
- The Knights have topped Florida, Florida State, Miami, South Florida, Stetson, FIU, Jacksonville, Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M during Johnny Dawkins' tenure as UCF's head coach and added Florida Atlantic to that list this season.

same campaign just once, topping No. 6 Houston on the road and beating No. 19 Cincinnati in Orlando in 2018-19. The year ended with UCF making an NCAA Tournament appearance.

DEFENSE IS A HABIT

UCF teams under Dawkins have traditionally been outstanding defensively, finishing ranked in the top 50 nationally in scoring defense in four of his eight seasons, including two top 10 finishes, finishing sixth in 2016-17 and third in 2017-18.

◆ In 2023-24, the Knights' defense ranked 21st and 22nd nationally according to KenPom and ESPN BPI, respectively. ◆ The Knights have never finished a season under Dawkins with opponents averaging north of 70 points.

◆ Since Dawkins' first season as the Knights' head coach in 2016-17, UCF has improved upon their steals per game each season, averaging 4.0 that first campaign to 8.7 at the end of the 2023-24 slate.

COACH DAWKINS - ONE OF ONE

◆ UCF's Johnny Dawkins is the only active head coach in college basketball that is a member of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame for his efforts as a player. He is joined by Danny Manning who is also in the hall, but is currently an assistant coach at Colorado. Dawkins is one of 30 players in the hall that have later gone on to be a coach.

◆ Dawkins is one of two Big 12 Conference head coaches to play in the NBA, with Bobby Hurley of Arizona State being the other. Dawkins is one of nine Power Four and Big East coaches to have played in the NBA. Of the nine coaches, Dawkins had the third-highest career scoring average at 11.1 points per game.

→ Dawkins is one of four Power Four and Big East coaches that was named an All-American as a college basketball player and is a current college basketball head coach; he is the only one of the group to be named an All-American twice.
 → Dawkins was honored as the Naismith College Player of the Year in 1986 and is the only current head coach in NCAA

Division I who has won the award. There are two former winners of the honor that served as head coaches as Patrick Ewing (1985 winner) was the Georgetown head coach from 2017-2023 while Danny Manning (1988 winner) was the head coach at Tulsa from 2012-14 and Wake Forest from 2014-20 and is now an assistant coach at Colorado.

UNLUCKY: THE MARGIN WAS SLIM

- KenPom had UCF ranked as the 32nd unluckiest team in the country to finish the 2023-24 season, continuing on a trend that had the Knights as the sixth unluckiest team in the nation in 2022-23.
- ◆ The Black and Gold wrapped up 2023-24 with four one-possession losses and 10 total games where they lost by singledigit points. UCF finished the 2022-23 season with six losses decided by a possession and 12 decided by single digits.

TAYLOR HENDRICKS IN THE ASSOCIATION

- ◆ Taylor Hendricks became UCF's first lottery pick and first round selection, as he was drafted by the Utah Jazz with the ninth pick in the 2023 NBA Draft. He became the third Knight selected in the NBA Draft and second in the modern era, joining Jermaine Taylor (2009, Round 2, Pick 32) and Bennie Shaw (1976, Round 9, Pick 146). Hendricks became the fifth Knight to play in the NBA, joining Taylor (Houston, Sacramento), Tacko Fall (Boston, Cleveland), Mark Jones (Orlando) and
- ◆ The Big 12 Conference has 66 players on NBA rosters as of the beginning of the 2023-24 season. Hendricks is joined on the Jazz by four other alumni from Big 12 institutions; Svi Mykhailiuk (Kansas), Cody Williams (Colorado), Keyonte George (Baylor) and Lauri Markkanen (Arizona).

→ Unfortunately, Hendricks suffered a season ending injury in just the third game of the 2024-25 campaign.

- ◆ While at UCF, Hendricks shattered the American Athletic Conference record for most rookie of the week honors won, tallying nine with the previous record being six. He was unanimously named to the league's all-freshman team and received a nod to the all-conference second team.
- Hendricks led the team in scoring, averaging 15.1 points per game (515 total points) and also in rebounding, averaging 7.0 boards per contest (237 total rebounds, 80 offensive). He started all 34 of UCF's games, one of two Knights to do so on the 2022-23 roster and played 1,179 minutes, the second most in a single season in program history.
 Hendricks was the only in the country to finish the season with 60+ three pointers, 55+ blocks and 35+ dunks.
 When all was said and done, Hendricks had shattered UCF rookie records. He finished with the most single-season
- points (515), scoring average (15.1), rebounds (237), offensive rebounds (80), rebound average (7.0) field goal makes and attempts (184-for-385), free throw makes and attempts (86-for-110) and minutes (1,179), all tops of UCF's freshman leaderboards. He was second in blocks (59), fourth in steals (31) and three-point field-goals (61). He also finished 10th on UCF's all-time three-point percentage list.

FEAR THE FRONDS

"The Most Florida Free Throw Distraction"

A storm, in multiple senses of the word, created a new tradition for Knight Nation in attendance at UCF men's basketball games. The legend goes that the night prior to the Black and Gold's first home conference game as a member of the Big 12, a massive storm rolled through campus. The wind blew down plenty of palm fronds across campus, and students picked them up and brought them into the game to use as a free throw distraction. It ended up working, as No. 3 Kansas shot just 6-for-11 from the free throw stripe in the second half in front of the student section. The fronds gave UCF that extra edge to top the Jayhawks 65-60, winning by as many points as Kansas had missed second half free throws.

Now, that's not exactly how one of college basketball's newest traditions was born. UCF's Brand Experience team wanted to create a unique experience for the team's first season in the Big 12. Director of brand experience Tim Connor (UCF alumnus 2017) and assistant director of brand experience Lexi Campagna (UCF alumna 2022) created and executed the idea. Knight Nation immediately took to the new tradition and the country took notice. The pair were named as one of nine finalists in NACMA's "Best Of" Awards in the People's Choice - Student Engagement category.

As the flagship Big 12 institution in The Sunshine State, nothing says Florida like palm trees. Design elements incorporated on social media, uniforms and even the lane on the court, all included palm trees and fronds. Leaning into that element wound up creating the most Florida free throw distraction imaginable.

Not only was the new free throw distraction perfectly on brand, but it actually worked. The palm fronds caused opponents to miss nearly 10% of their second half free throws in Big 12 play and the postseason. Visiting teams made 75% of their first half free throws while making just 66.4% in the second half, accounting for a total of 44 misses.

As the final buzzer sounded on UCF's upset over No. 3 Kansas, the team's first conference win as a Big 12 member, fans stormed the court with palm fronds in hand. The Knights had topped the highest ranked opponent in program history (previously No. 4 UConn, a 68-63 neutral site win on Nov. 25. 2011).

UCF went on to beat a total of three ranked opponents during the 2023-24 Big 12 slate, all at home in front of the frond-waving faithful. The win against No. 3 Kansas was the first, followed by a 74-63 win over No. 23 Oklahoma on Feb. 3 and a 75-61 triumph over No. 23 Texas Tech on Feb. 24.

With two seasons of the "Fear the Fronds" mantra in the students section they are here to stay as a long standing tradition at men's basketball games.





The UCF men's and women's basketball programs have called the beautiful 10,000-seat Addition Financial Arena its home since the start of the 2007-08 season. Located in the heart of Knights Plaza on the expansive north side of campus, the state-of-the-art facility opened in the fall of 2007 to packed crowds at multiple events. Under the current configuration, the capacity for basketball games sits at 9,400.

Addition Financial Arena's unique design provides an intimate atmosphere for all students, alumni, fans and supporters, while creating an intimidating environment for opponents. With a raucous student section, dubbed the "Knightmare," Addition Financial Arena has quickly become one of the more formidable basketball facilities in the entire southeast. The design offers perfect sight lines for all fans, giving every spectator a spectacular view.

UCF's first year in the Big 12 Conference saw record attendance for the men's basketball teams, hosting a total of 134,000 fans over the 2023-24 season that saw the Knights host 19 home games, averaging just over 9,000 fans per league home contest. The inaugural Big 12 campaign also saw the introduction of palm fronds as a free throw distraction in the student section. The terms "Fear the Frond" and "Frond Warning" were born as Knight Nation helped cause opponents to make 10% less of their second-half free throws in Big 12 and postseason play.

The venue has sold out twice for UCF men's basketball games, the first being the Black and Gold's 2017 NIT Quarterfinal contest against Illinois, filling the seats with 10,011 fans. The second was the Knights' Big 12 Conference home opener against No. 3 Kansas on Jan. 10, 2024, as 9,469 fans piled through the turnstiles. Most of those fans piled out of the stands as both games ended in court stormings. UCF's 65-60 victory over the Jayhawks was the highest-ranked opponent that the Knights had defeated in program history.

Approximately 7,000 seats make up the lower bowl of Addition Financial Arena, with an additional 3,000 seats situated in the upper level. Club level seating is on the east side of the Arena, with exclusive access to the regal Black and Gold Club before, during and after each game. The addition of a courtside club on one of the baselines subtracted 600 seats from the lower bowl, making the current configuration for men's and women's basketball games a 9,400-fan capacity. The area, located floor-level in front of sections 101-103, offers great views of game action as well as access to top-notch food and beverage options.

The facility features 16 luxury boxes and suites, a club lounge, open concourse areas and numerous concession options. Fans benefit from a state-of-the-art audio and video system. The scoreboard located at center court features four video screens that show replays and player information with an LED ribbon board stretching around the bottom.

Patrons enter the building through a spacious lobby that has conveniently located concession and apparel stands.

Addition Financial Arena sits on the northern side of campus and is nestled in with UCF's other athletics facilities, including FBC Mortgage Stadium, The Venue, John Euliano Park and the UCF Soccer/Track Complex. FBC Mortgage Stadium also opened up during the same September week in 2007.

The arena is the centerpiece of an area that includes apartment-style dormitories with 2,000 total beds and about 100,000-square feet of retail space. Before and after games, fans can dine and shop at establishments like Barnes & Noble Bookstore, Burger U, Gringos Locos, Domino's, The Pop Parlour, Dunkin', Jimmy John's, Subway and Knightro's.

The neighboring retail area has room for 24 shops.

Addition Financial Arena also hosts premiere concerts along with UCF commencement ceremonies. The Central Florida Crusaders, expansion members of the National Indoor Soccer League, began fielding men's and women's teams in the venue for the 2022-23 season. The Orlando Valkyries of the Pro Volleyball Federation began playing their games in the arena in Jan. 2024.

The arena is located directly in front of UCF's old home, The Venue, which re-opened following a year of massive renovations to create a new home for the women's volleyball program as well as dedicated practice facilities for both the men's and women's basketball programs. The Knights played in the former 5,100-seat building from 1991-2007.

Construction on the new facility began in November of 2005. The arena was designed by HOK Sports and constructed by KUD International.

The arena officially opened on Sept. 8, 2007, with a Reba McEntire concert. The first UCF event at the new arena occurred on Sept. 28, 2007, when the UCF volleyball team hosted East Carolina. The first UCF men's basketball game was a 63-60 victory over Nevada on Nov. 11, 2007 while the first women's contest was on Nov. 9, 2007, in 72-57 loss to Texas Tech.

Johnny Daukins

Head Coach / 10th Season at UCF

UCF head men's coach Johnny Dawkins has built a particularly glossy college basketball playing and coaching catalogue—most recently including a 2025 induction to the Washington D.C.

Hall of Fame and the 2023 induction into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame and selection of a UCF player in the first round of the 2023 NBA Draft.

Dawkins' resume showcases:

- ◆ 17 seasons as a major-college head coach (the last nine at UCF), including 10 postseason berths and a pair of National Invitation Tournament titles
- → Extensive player development, highlighted by Taylor Hendricks' selection in the first round of the 2023 NBA Draft after only a single season at UCF
- → 10 additional previous seasons of experience as an assistant coach at Duke, including NCAA Championship appearances every year, an NCAA title in 2001 and seven Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament crowns
- ◆ A nine-year NBA career that included a career double-figure scoring average
- → A collegiate playing career at Duke that featured national player-of-the-year recognition as a senior as the school's all-time top career scorer, later culminating with his 2023 National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame selection and 2025 Washington D.C. Sports Hall of Fame induction

In nine seasons at UCF, Dawkins has led the program to unprecedented heights, in the only eight-year stretch with four or more postseason appearances during the Division I era. He led the Knights to their first NCAA Championship victory in 2019. He's also responsible for producing UCFs first lottery pick after Taylor Hendricks was selected by the Utah Jazz with the ninth overall pick in the 2023 NBA Draft. In the deepest, most challenging league in college basketball, Dawkins led the Knights to seven victories in their inaugural season as members of the Big 12 Conference in 2023-24, earning a program record three ranked wins during the campaign.

Dawkins boasts nine wins over ranked opponents in his time at the helm of the Knights, accounting for over 80% of the team's wins over Associated Press top-25 teams in the program's history. The Knights led off the 2024-25 season with a win over #13 Texas A&M, marking the first of three tries in a season opener. UCF made a statement in its inaugural home Big 12 game on Jan. 10, 2024, beating No. 3 Kansas by five after trailing by 16 at one point during the contest. The Knights went on to earn additional ranked wins over No. 23 Oklahoma and No. 23 Texas Tech during the inaugural Big 12 slate, joining the 2018-19 season as the only other campaign with multiple wins over ranked opponents in a single season.

The Knights also earned a host of other impressive wins against top-25 foes, beating 15th-ranked Florida State in Tallahassee in 2020, the program's first victory over the Seminoles. The Knights recorded consecutive victories over No. 6 Houston and No. 19 Cincinnati during the 2018-19 regular-season run to the NCAA Championship, solidifying themselves in the field of 68. UCF defeated No. 24 Alabama in December 2017, after earning the first ranked win under Dawkins on Feb. 26, 2017, beating No. 15 Cincinnati 53-49. UCF cracked the AP poll on Mar. 4, 2019, for the first time since 2011, earning a ranking of 25th late in the regular season. It was the latest into a season that the Knights had been ranked. The home finale against Cincinnati in 2019 marked the first matchup of ranked teams at Addition Financial Arena.

Dawkins was named UCF's seventh head men's basketball coach on Mar. 23, 2016.

The 2019 NCAA Championship Run

The 2018-19 season was one to remember for Dawkins and the Knights, as he guided UCF to a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Championship, its highest seed in five all-time NCAA Championship appearances, and defeated eighth-seeded VCU 73-58 in first-round action.

UCF then came inches away from upsetting top overall seed Duke in the second round, ultimately falling 77-76 to fellow Hall of Famer and his former college coach Mike Krzyzewski, Zion Williamson and RJ Barrett as BJ Taylor's floater rimmed out and Aubrey Dawkins' tip-in barely missed at the buzzer.

The Knights were stellar down the stretch to secure their at-large NCAA Championship berth, winning on the road at No. 6/8 Houston to snap the Cougars' 33-game home win streak and topping No. 19/20 Cincinnati in Orlando. It marked the first time UCF had earned multiple victories over ranked opponents in the same season. and the Knights did it in back-to-back games.

Dawkins led UCF back to the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2005, and the first time as an at-large selection (with the previous four NCAA Championships as champions of the Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament in 1994, 1996, 2004 and 2005). He helped three individuals earn all-conference accolades from the American Athletic Conference in 2018-19, as UCF led the league with three honorees. BJ Taylor became

the first Knight to earn first-team AAC honors, while Aubrey Dawkins was named second team and Tacko Fall added third-team honors. It marked just the second time that the Knights put multiple student-athletes on the AAC all-conference teams and the ninth time in the program's Division I history that multiple Knights earned all-conference honors in the same season (dating back to the 1993-94 season). With two players on the three all-conference teams, only Houston had more players earn all-conference honors.

Following the end of the 2018-19 regular season, Dawkins was named a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award and the Ben Jobe National Coach of the

UCF finished the year 24-9, tied for the fourth most wins in a season in program history. The Knights' 23 regular-season wins marked a record in UCF's Division I era. The team went 13-5 in AAC play, the team's most league wins since joining that conference, and earned the No. 4 seed in the conference tournament for the second time in three seasons.

Dominant Defense

Known for their defense under Dawkins, the Knights ranked 11th in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting in the 2018-19 NCAA Championship run. UCF was also 27th in scoring defense, allowing 64.5 points per game that season.

Defense always has been a priority with UCF teams, as four of Dawkins' nine seasons with the Knights have seen the team finish inside the top 50 nationally in scoring defense, including two top-10 finishes. UCF ranked third in the nation in scoring defense in 2017-18, holding teams to 61.7 points per game and 40.1% shooting, slotting the team at the No. 10 spot in the country. Dawkins' first season with UCF in 2016-17 saw the team finish No. 1 in field-goal percentage defense, limiting foes to 36.5% from the field, and No. 6 in scoring defense, with opponents averaging 61.2 points per contest

Despite making the jump to one of the nation's toughest leagues in college hoops, UCF held its own on the defensive side of the ball. The Knights led the Big 12 in blocks per game, averaging 5.0 per game, a top 20 mark nationally throughout the year. UCF also ranked in the top 25 in steals per game at 8.7 per contest. Although they finished just outside of the top 50 national rankings for scoring defense, the Knights often held opponents well below their season averages. UCF also posted its second-highest turnovers forced per game clip during the team's first run through the Big 12, finishing in the top 40 with a mark of 14.21.

Highly-Touted Hendricks

Taylor Hendricks qualified as UCF's top recruit in program history upon his arrival prior to the 2022-23 season. He came into college as a top-100 player in two of the three major recruit rankings, as ESPN pinned him No. 54 and Rivals had him at No. 87. Hendricks lived up to the hype on opening night, dropping a team-best 23 points in his collegiate debut and finishing the season with averages of 15.3 points and 6.9 rehaunds.

Through plenty of work and coaching throughout the season, Hendricks quietly began to creep into mock drafts across the country. At season's end, Hendricks had achieved two career-high marks of 25 points and recorded five double-doubles. He was the nation's only player to make 60 or more three-pointers, tally 55 or more blocks and record 35 or more dunks. He was honored with a unanimous selection to the American Athletic Conference All-Rookie Team and was named second-team All-AAC.

Hendricks announced his intent to enter the NBA Draft on March 22, 2023, making him UFS first one-and-done player. The freshman phenom later went on to become the Knights' first lottery pick as well as a first-round selection, going ninth to the Utah Jazz in the 2023 NBA Draft.

Enshrined in the College Basketball Hall of Fame

Dawkins was honored Aug. 30, 2023, as an inductee in the 18th class of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. He was joined by former Duke coach Mike Kryzyzewski, who was officially honored in the class of 2023 after initially being among the Hall of Fame's Founding Class in 2006.

Dawkins was inducted for his playing days as a Blue Devil and is one of the most decorated players in Duke history. He is regarded as a key early figure in the program's ascent to becoming a national power. From 1982-86, Dawkins piled up 2,556 points — a mark that stood as the school's scoring record until 2006 and remains second all-time. He was a two-time consensus All-American, a four-time All-ACC selection—and was recipient of the 1986 Naismith National Player of the

As a senior, Dawkins led Duke to the ACC regular-season and tournament titles, and an appearance in the NCAA National Championship game. The 10th overall pick by the Spurs in the 1986 NBA Draft, Dawkins saw action in nine professional seasons with the Spurs, 76ers and Pistons. He averaged 11.1 points and 5.5 assists through 541 career NBA games.

The Washington D.C. native was selected to be a part of the Washington D.C. Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2025. He was inducted for his playing days at Mackin Catholic High School, Duke and the NBA. He is considered one of the greatest players at the District's Mackin Catholic High School, where he earned All-America recognition before joining Duke.

The Washington D.C. Sports Hall of Fame marked the third Hall of Fame induction for Dawkins. His jersey was retired in 1996 as he was inducted into the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame. In 2023, he was an inductee in the 18th class of the National Collegiate Baskethall Hall of Fame.

UCF Player Honors

Multiple players have earned conference and national honors under Dawkins' tenure. Tacko fall earned a spot on the Lefty Driesell Defensive All-America team in 2016-17 and was named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year. B.J. Taylor earned first-team All-BAC and NABC first-team All-District honors in 2018-19

Seven nods to the All-AAC Team were awarded while the Knights were members of that league. An additional three All-Rookie Team honors were earned, all over the last three seasons. Taylor Hendricks earned second-team All-Conference honors as well as a unanimous nod to the All-Rookie Team in 2022-23, as well as tallying a record nine conference rookie-of-the-week accolades. Darius Johnson and Isaiah Adams preceded Hendricks in earning All-Rookie Team nods in 2021-22 and 2020-21, respectively. Aubrey Dawkins (2018-19) and Taylor (2016-17) are the other Knights who received All-AAC second-team honors, while Darin Green Jr. (2021-22), Brandon Mahan (2020-21), Darius Perry (2020-21) and Fall (2018-19) all were members of an AAC third team.

Johnson added to his decorated career as a Knight with an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honor in UCF's first season in the Big 12 (2023-24). He was joined by fellow junior guard Jaylin Sellers and fifth-year forward Ibrahima Diallo on the honorable mention list

Keyshawn Hall and Johnson were both honored by the Big 12 Conference at the end of the 2024–25 season. Hall was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team and All-Newcomer Team while Johnson was tabbed as All-Big 12 Honorable Mention for the second consecutive season.

Postseason Pushes

On top of the NCAA Championship run in 2018-19, the Knights have punched three tickets to the NIT under Dawkins' direction, as he has led UCF to the postseason in five of his nine seasons at the helm of the Black and Gold. That number of postseason appearances is more than half of the SEC, ACC and Big Ten combined over that stretch.

The Black and Gold participated in the inaugural College Basketball Crown (2025), a 16-team tournament hosted in Las Vegas for a share of a pool of NIL prize money. Dawkins and company led the Knights to the championship game as they fell just short of earning a title, falling 77-66 to Nebraska.

UCF's most recent NIT bid saw the squad earn a No. 4 seed. In 2023, the Knights traveled to Gainesville, Florida, and handily beat Florida 67-49, UCF's first road victory against the Gators in program history. The Knights were the only team to hold Florida under 50 points all season. It was the sixth time that season UCF limited an opponent to 50 points or fewer. The Knights' run came to an end in their inaugural meeting with top-seeded Oregon in Eugene.

The 2016-17 season took UCF to New York's Madison Square Garden in Dawkins' first year at the helm of the Knights. UCF hosted its first NIT game, defeating Colorado for the program's first postseason win in an NIT or NCAA game. The Knights went on to defeat top-seeded Illinois State on the road, before coming home to the first sellout crowd at Addition Financial Arena and winning 68-58 over Illinois to earn a spot in the NIT semifinals. Under Dawkins' leadership, UCF led all NCAA Division I teams in defensive field-goal percentage, holding opponents to just 36.5 percent from the floor. The Knights were also sixth in the nation, allowing only 61.2 points per game, and gave up 45 or fewer points in four games over the course of the year. Dawkins was a finalist for both the Jim Phelan and Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year awards in his first season at UCF. Matt Williams set UCF records for three-pointers in a career, season and game, before signing a professional contract with the Miami Heat.

Notable Notes

In UCF's Dec. 11, 2021, win over North Carolina A&T, Dawkins picked up his 100th victory with the Knights, becoming the fastest coach in program history and just the third one to do so. He earned his 300th career victory in the Black and Gold's 74-63 win over No. 23 Oklahoma. Following the end of the 2023-24 season, Dawkins stands 148-103 all-time as head coach of the Knights, a winning percentage of .590, currently the second highest in program history and first during the Division I era, trailing only Torchy Clark's .755

In nine years, Dawkins has done a similarly successful job with his players in the classroom. With Dawkins at the helm, the Knights men's basketball program recorded an average semester team grade-point average over 3.0 for the first time in recorded history in 2018. Then the Knights did it again, setting a program record with an average semester GPA of 3.03 in spring 2019. Under Dawkins' watch, more than 45 nods have been earned by Knights on the AAC All-Academic team.

When Dawkins took over at LICE the Knights had gone 12-18 the season before and hadn't finished above 500 since 2012-13. He led UCF to a 24-12 record in his first season at the helm, the sixth-best turnaround in the nation. With just seven scholarship players due to transfers and injuries, the Knights earned the fourth seed – their highest ever – in the American Athletic Conference Tournament, eventually falling to league champion SMU in the semifinals.

Stanford Stint

Stanford put together four 20-win seasons in Dawkins' tenure as head coach. He is only the second coach in Stanford history with at least four 20-win seasons. Stanford's success on the court came against some of the toughest schedules in the nation. During the 2015-16 season, the Cardinal faced the sixth-most difficult slate in the country—with a nation-leading 17 of Stanford's 30 games against RPI top-50 squads. Stanford's strength of schedule was rated in the top 50 each of his final four seasons, including two in the top 20, with an average rank of 27.75.

The Cardinal basketball program also exceled in the classroom during Dawkins' tenure, earning at least three Pac-12 All-Academic selections for five consecutive seasons and producing back-to-back Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year recipients (2014, 2015). Stanford also received annual national academic recognition, with three players earning National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Honors Court status in 2015. The Cardinal were one of 20 NCAA Division I teams to earn an NABC Team Academic Excellence Award in

In 2012, Dawkins mentored Chasson Randle to become the consummate student-athlete. Randle finished that season as Stanford's all-time leading scorer and earned the program's initial first-team Academic All-America selection since 2006. Under Dawkins, Stanford recorded back-to-back perfect Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores of 1,000 in both the 2012-13 and 2013-14 reports.

Player development was also markedly improved at Stanford under Dawkins' tutelage. Four Cardinal players were selected in the NBA Draft following their collegiate careers—including 2014 first-round pick Josh Huestis.

Learning from a Legend

The Washington, D.C., native coached for 10 years under the legendary Mike Krzyzewski at Duke. During Dawkins' decade as a coach at Duke, the Blue Devils won a national championship (2001), tallied six ACC regular-season championships, recorded seven ACC Tournament titles and posted a 330-60 (.846) record. In four consecutive seasons from 1999-2002, Duke finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both national polls, a first in college basketball history. Duke reached a No. 1 national ranking in seven of 10 seasons with Dawkins on the coaching staff.

While at Duke, he also served as the player personnel director for the USA Basketball Senior National Team from 2006-08.

Following a prolific high school career at Mackin Catholic High School in Washington, D.C. (McDonald's All-American and third-team Parade All-American), Dawkins made his way to Duke, where he would become one of the most decorated players to set foot in Durham, North Carolina,

He played for the Blue Devils from 1982-83 through 1985-86, earning consensus All-America honors twice (1985, 1986). Dawkins was also voted the 1986 Naismith National Player of the Year and named a Freshman All-American in 1983. During his collegiate career, he helped lead Duke to three NCAA Championship berths, including an NCAA title-game appearance in 1986. He was an All-ACC honoree all four seasons as a Blue Devil. Dawkins helped Duke win the 1986 ACC Tournament title in his senior season, claiming the MVP award in the process.

Dawkins finished his career as the school's all-time leading scorer and held that honor until 2006 when J.J. Redick surpassed his mark of 2.556 points. He recorded double-figure point totals in 129 of 133 collegiate games. Dawkins led the Blue Devils in scoring all four years, recording the fourth-highest season point total in school history with 809 in 1986. Dawkins remains Duke's career record-holder in field goals (1.026) and field goals attempted (2.019) while also setting the school's single-season mark for field goals (331) during the 1986 campaign.

Dawkins was inducted into the Duke Sports Hall of Fame in September 1996. His jersey number 24 was retired by the school






