UNBEATEN IN NINE STRAIGHT

→ The Knights will enter the Big 12 Tournament unbeaten in their last nine games. UCF's last loss came on Sept. 25 at Arizona. Over the course of the last nine contests, the Black and Gold recorded back-to-back victories over then-No. 17 Arizona State (3-2) and Utah (2-0) before picking up consecutive 0-0 draws versus Kansas State and Cincinnati. UCF pulled out a 2-1 win at Oklahoma State before drawing 1-1 at Houston. The Knights then returned home to record backto-back 2-1 victories over No. 16/10 Baylor and BYU, before capping the regular season with a 0-0 draw at No. 15/6 Texas Tech.

→ In all, the Knights hold just two losses on the year as they previously suffered a 1-0 setback to in-state foe FIU on Sept. 4. With an 11-2-5 overall record, the Black and Gold enter the Big 12 Tournament rated 26th nationally in the latest RPI rankings and as the tournament's six seed after going 5-1-5 in league play.

CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT SUCCESS UNDER SAHAYDAK

- ◆ UCF will enter the 2025 Big 12 Soccer Tournament Presented by Allstate with a 1-1 all-time record in Big 12 Tournament play after defeating TCU in the quarterfinals in 2023 and falling to BYU in the semifinals that year
- → The Knights also hold a 7-6-5 conference tournament record under Coach Tiffany Roberts Sahaydak with the team having won their last conference championship in 2013—Coach Roberts Sahaydak's first season at the helm in Orlando.

PEREZ WATSON'S STELLAR START

- ◆ UCF goalkeeper Genesis Perez Watson has had an impressive season so far, commanding a back line that has only conceded 12 goals, or 0.67 per game. Perez Watson's seven clean sheets bests her two from 2024, and she has set career highs in save percentage (.846) and goals against average (.670), with the latter putting her in third in the Big 12. Her 66 total saves see her in fifth
- place in the conference standings.

 After recording a pair of clean sheets against Utah and K-State recently, Perez Watson also took home Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week and Big 12 Conference Goalkeeper of the Week honors.

SILVEST & ERIKSEN NAMED TO TOP DRAWER SOCCER TOP 100 LIST

- ◆ Redshirt sophomore defender Jada Silvest has been included in Top Drawer Soccer's Women's Midseason Top 100 Players list, taking the 80th spot, while freshman forward Tyra Eriksen was included as No. 58 on Top Drawer Soccer's Midseason Top Freshmen
- ◆ Silvest has been an instrumental player for the Black and Gold this season. playing 90 minutes in all but two contests, in which she featured for at least 80 minutes in both. Silvest has been a key contributor to the Knights' seven clean sheets in 2025, and has chipped in offensively as well, with a goal against then-No. 16/10 Baylor and a pair of assists on the season.
- ◆ Eriksen, a true freshman from Sweden, has had a strong season for the Knights in which she has scored one goal and also recorded a pair of assists so far during her debut season at the college level. She has tallied a total of 16 shots with six shots coming on target on the year. The striker has played in all 18 matches with 14 starts for the Black and Gold.

BEST START AT THE DI LEVEL

- ◆ The Knights began the 2025 season with an unblemished 5-0-0 start. The 5-0 record marked the Black and Gold's best start to a season in program history at the NCAA Division I level and the best since the program's inaugural season of competition in 1981 when UCF opened a perfect 7-0.
- ◆ UCF opened the year with a 2-1 victory on the road at UAB and followed it up with a trio of home wins over Florida Atlantic (3-1), South Florida (4-1) and LSU (2-1). The Knights then defeated their second straight SEC foe on Aug. 28 with a 1-0 shutout victory at Florida
- ◆ UCF has outscored the opposition 26-12 on the season and after Liz Worden's
- ◆ Now at 11-2-5, the record marks the Black and Gold's best at this point in the season since 2017 when the team achieved a 13-2-3 record through 18 games.

LATE GAME MAGIC

- ◆ UCF has scored a pair of game-winning goals with the clock winding down against SEC foes on the season.
- ◆ All deadlocked at 1-1 and less than 30 seconds to play against SEC foe LSU, the Knights found themself in a goal line scramble. Gabi Berchon took a shot from the center of the box with 17 seconds to go but LSU's keeper was there to make the save. The ball then bounced over to Tyra Eriksen and she got off another shot that was again saved, but the ball deflected to Berchon right in front of the goal and she was able to slot it home for the dramatic game winner with just 11 seconds on the clock
- ◆ Scoreless at Florida just days later and in the 87th minute, Guta Franke fed a deep pass over the top to Liz Worden. Worden then deflected it ahead to Reed on the right side of the box and the senior forward was able to drill a late strike into the back of the net to propel UCF to another thrilling victory.

THE ROBERTS SAHAYDAK ERA

- ◆ The Knights have experienced tremendous success under Roberts Sahaydak, as the program has made the NCAA Tournament five times during her tenure
- here in Orlando as well as won four conference championships.

 Under Roberts Sahaydak's leadership, UCF has made the NCAA Tournament in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, and 2022.
- ◆ The Knights also won conference titles in 2013, 2014, 2017, and 2022. Roberts Sahaydak has recorded a winning season in 10 of her 12 years here in Orlando and will enter the season with a 121-61-32 record at UCF as well as a 174-111-51 career record over 18 years
- ◆ She was recently named a finalist for the National Soccer Hall of Fame Class of 2026 Veteran Ballot due to her tremendous success as a player and a coach.

EAR THREE IN THE BIG 12

- ◆ The University of Central Florida officially joined the Big 12 Conference on July 1, 2023, and will enter its third season of competition in the league in 2025-26.
- ◆ UCF entered the Power 4 as the youngest school, having been founded in 1963 to supply NASA with engineers.
- The Knights, who finished sixth in its first season of Big 12 competition in 2023 with a 5-4-1 clip and 13th in 2024 with a 1-5-4 record, are 41-24-14 against current Big 12 teams all-time.

KNIGHT KICKS

BOUT UCF

- → UCF (11-2-5, 5-1-5 Big 12) earned the No. 6 seed for the conference tournament after going unbeaten over its last nine matches with a 5-0-4 record. After defeating both No. 16/10 Baylor and BYU at home last week, the Black and Gold capped the stretch by playing No. 15/6 Texas Tech to a 0-0 draw on Thursday evening in Lubbock.
- ◆ Genesis Perez Watson recorded a game-high five saves in goal for the Black and Gold in the game, as she denied each shot on frame from TTU.
- ◆ With the game scoreless and Texas Tech looking to score the go-ahead goal in the second half, the Red Raider offense tallied 13 second-half shots, which included seven over the final 10 minutes. The UCF defense was up for the challenge, however, as it denied the Red Raiders of scoring down the stretch.
- ◆ After a handful of shots that were just off target, TTU had one more opportunity with the clock ticking down under 10 seconds. Texas Tech got off a corner kick and Taylor Zdrojewski was in the box to head a shot towards the goal, but Perez Watson was able to deflect the ball over the crossbar as time expired to seal the draw.
- ◆ For the game, TTU outshot the Knights 20-3 and five to two on goal. Perez Watson saved all five shots that were sent her way to earn her seventh clean sheet of the season and move to 11-2-5 on the year.
- ◆ With the result, UCF remains unbeaten on the season against ranked foes with a 2-0-1 mark.
- → Liz Worden's brace last Monday against BYU brings her team-leading goal tally to seven, pipping Rajanah Reed's six and Honoka Hamano's four. Gabi Berchon follows with three goals and Ainsley Moy has two on the season. Tyra Eriksen, Ella Holloran, Jada Silvest, and Edidiong Etim have all chipped in with one each. Worden also tops the assist charts with eight, and the points charts with 22, as well as leading the team in total shots with 52. Reed continues to lead the shots on goal tally with 25 shots on frame.
- ◆ After recording five more saves on Thursday, goalkeeper Genesis Perez Watson now totals 66 saves and a remarkable .846 save percentage, good enough for third in the Big 12. She has played all 1620 minutes of the season for UCF.

ABOUT COLORADO

- ♦ The No. 11/4 Buffaloes earned the No. 3 seed for the Big 12 Tournament after going 14-2-3 overall and finishing in third place in the conference standings with an 8-1-2 in league record. CU is unbeaten in its last six matches and has won three straight with wins over No. 5/3 Texas Tech, Arizona, and Kansas down the stretch. Colorado has only suffered two losses on the season with setbacks to No. 20 Baylor and Wisconsin. CU advanced to the second round of the Big 12 Tournament last season and had their 2024 season come to a close in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Buffaloes have made the NCAA Tournament in six of the last nine seasons.
- ◆ The Big 12's leading scorer Hope Leyba leads Colorado on the season and is ranked second nationally with 19 goals scored. She also ranks third nationally in goals per game average (1.00), fourth in total points (39), seventh in points per game (2.05), and 12th in game-winning goals (5). Jace Holley is next for CU with 11 goals on the season, while Caley Swierenga paces the team in assists and ranks third in the Big 12 with nine.
- ◆ Preseason All-Big 12 Goalkeeper of the Year Jordan Nytes is second in the Big 12 in saves with 88 and leads the conference with an .871 save percentage. Her save percentage is also good enough for eighth nationally. She holds a 14-2-3 record on the year with seven shutouts.
- + Colorado is coached by Danny Sanchez. Sanchez is in his 14th season at the helm in Boulder and has led the Buffaloes to eight NCAA appearances.

4-1 AGAINST SUNSHINE STATE FOES

- The Knights capped non-conference play with a solid 4-1-0 record against Sunshine State foes on the season.
- ◆ The Black and Gold first pulled out back-to-back home wins over Florida Atlantic (3-1) and South Florida (4-1), before shutting out the Florida Gators on the road by a score of 1-0. UCF then suffered a 1-0 setback in its first loss of the season to FIU at home on Sept. 4, but responded with a 2-0 victory at North Florida in the Black and Gold's non-conference finale on Sept. 11.

BACK-TO-BACK VICTORIES OVER SEC FOES

- + After opening the season with a trio of matches against American Conference opponents in which the Knights went a perfect 3-0 with wins over UAB (2-1), Florida Atlantic (3-1) and South Florida (4-1), UCF then kept things going with back-to-back wins over SEC foes.
- ◆ The Knights started the stretch by hosting LSU at the UCF Soccer Complex and pulled out a dramatic 2-1 victory over the Tigers thanks to a last-second goal from Gabi Berchon. UCF then headed to Gainesville and went on to record a 1-0 shutout victory over the Gators thanks to a late goal from Rajanah Reed in the 87th minutes.
- ◆ The Aug. 28th win over Florida, marked UCF's sixth straight unbeaten result against the Gators. The Knights are 5-0-1 during the last six matches against UF.

O CAPTAIN. OUR CAPTAIN

- * Redshirt junior midfielder Maria Tregansin has been named UCF's team captain for the 2025 campaign.
- ◆ Tregansin is in her fifth year with the program and had a solid season a year ago in which she played in 13 matches and started four of them.
- + She notched a career-high three assists in 2024 with two coming against Arizona and one against Cincinnati.
- ◆ Maria was named to the 2024 Fall Academic All-Big 12 Team and is a true team leader for the Knights both on the field as well as behind the scenes.

BIG 12 CONFERENCE PRESEASON POLL

- ◆ The Knights have been picked to finish 12th out of 16 teams in the Big 12 Conference's annual preseason poll that was annouced prior to the season.
- ◆ UCF went 3-6-6 overall and tied for 13th a season ago with a 1-5-4 league clip. The Black and Gold were picked to finished ahead of Cincinnati (13th), Iowa State (14th), Houston (15th) and Kansas State (16th).
- ◆ The defending Big 12 champion TCU Horned Frogs were picked to win the conference this year, while Texas Tech was picked second, BYU third, West Virginia fourth, Kansas fifth, Colorado sixth, Oklahoma State seventh, Arizona eighth, Utah ninth, Baylor 10th and Arizona State 11th.

TO BE THE BEST, YOU'VE GOT TO PLAY THE BEST

- ♦ Head coach Tiffany Roberts Sahaydak has stressed the importance of playing a tough schedule and the Knights 2025 slate is no different.
- ◆ UCF will face a pair of SEC foes in non-conference play in LSU and Florida, and a total of six teams that made the NCAA Tournament a season ago in LSU, FIU, West Virginia, Oklahoma State, BYU and Texas Tech.

GUTA FRANKE & GENESIS PEREZ WATSON COMPETED AT FIFA U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP

- ullet UCF had a pair of players represent their home nations at the 2024 FIFA U20 Women's World Cup that ran Aug. 31-Sept. 22 in Colombia.
- ◆ Now sophomore defender Guta Franke played for her home country of Brazil, while now redshirt sophomore goalkeeper Genesis Perez Watson participated for Costa Rica.
- Franke started all five games for Brazil and helped her home nation go 4-1 and advance to the quarterfinal round, while Perez Watson started all three matches in goal and was a captain for Costa Rica.

Head Coach - 13th Season

An Olympic gold medalist, World Cup champion and two-time NCAA champion, Tiffany Roberts Sahaydak was named head women's soccer coach at UCF in May 2013.

A four-time American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, Roberts Sahaydak has wasted on time in putting her stamp on UCF's successful program. Under her guidance, the Knights have earned five NCAA Tournament bids and four American Athletic Conference championships while boasting 18 Conference Player of the Year awards and 67 all-league and tournament selections.

An integral member of the 1999 United States World Cup winning squad, Roberts Sahaydak returned to the fold as an assistant coach under Vlatko Andonovski in 2022. At the 2023 FIFA World Cup in Australia and New Zealand, Roberts Sahaydak became the first champion as a player to transition into a coaching role with the team, propelling the USWNT to knockout round qualification for the ninth consecutive edition.

Ushering in a new era in the Big 12, the Knights' inaugural campaign as a member of one of the nation's premier conferences was historic, resulting in a trip to the Big 12 Championships semifinals. Under the guidance of Roberts Sahaydak, UCF secured a 10-7-1 (5-4-1 Big 12) record and the second-most wins of any conference newcomer. In Austin, Texas, the Knights defeated the 2022 conference runner-ups, TCU, 3-2 to garner UCF Athletics its first postseason win in the Big 12. In the program's inaugural conference home match at the UCF soccer Complex, the Knights defeated reigning champions, West Virginia, 4-2. Following the squad's sixth-place finish in conference play, Dayana Martin earned second-team honors on the Big 12 All-Conference team, while Jessica McCullen secured a spot on the all-freshman team. Martin would also be named to the United Soccer Coaches All-Midwest Region Third Team following yet another dominating 13-point season leading the Knights attack. For the second consecutive season, Roberts Sahaydak and her staff produced an NWSL draft pick as Talia Garbarra was selected by the Orlando Pride with the 14th pick in the fourth round.

In their final season in the AAC, the Knights boasted a 9-2-7 (7-0-1 AAC) record, going undefeated in conference play and picking up nine clean sheets along the way to becoming AAC Regular Season Champions. With the first victory of the season, Roberts Sahaydak earned her 100th win at UCF as a head coach. The Black and Gold collected a bid to the NCAA Tournament and advanced past NC State in the first round to face eventual national champion UCLA, where they fell in penalty kicks. Kristen Scott picked up Offensive Player of the Year honors, while Caroline DeLisle earned her second-straight Goalkeeper of the Year award. DeLisle and Scott were joined by Dayana Martin and Darya Rajaee on the All-Conference First Team, with Georgia Eaton-Collins being named to the All-Conference Scoond Team and Mia Asenjo earning unanimous selection to the All-Rookie Team. Scott would later be drafted by the Orlando Pride with the 41st overall pick in the 2023 NWSL draft.

In 2021, Roberts Sahaydak coached the Knights to an 8-7-1 (3-4-1 American Athletic Conference) and entered the American Athletic Conference Championship tournament as a six seed. With the Knights sixth victory of the season, Roberts Sahaydak earned her 150th career win as a collegiate head coach. Under Roberts Sahaydak, Caroline DeLisle and Darya Rajaee earned their first selections to the All-Conference First Team. In total, four Knights earned conference awards with Caroline DeLisle also earning Goalkeeper of the Year and Darya Rajaee also earning Midfielder of the Year while Ariel Young earned All-Rookie Team honors and Kristen Scott earned All-Conference First Team.

In an unconventional 2020-21 campaign due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Roberts Sahaydak led the Black & Gold to picking up five all-league selections as the Knights finished the spring season with a 2-4-1 mark. Four Knights picked up honors, with Sarai Linder representing the Knights on the First Team All-Conference and All-Rookie Teams, Ellie Moreno and Madsion Murnin were named to the Second Team All-Conference, and Katie Bradley joined Linder on the All-Rookie Team.

In 2019, Roberts Sahaydak led the Knights to a 11-4-4 (5-2-2 American Athletic Conference) and earned a No. 3 seed to the American Championship. The Knights posted a six-game unbeaten streak and climed to as high No. 21 in the United Soccer Coaches Polls. Under Roberts Sahaydak, Konya Plummer was named First Team All-Region by the United Soccer Coaches Association, as well as the AAC Defensive Player of the Year. In total, six student-athletes were recognized by the Conference coaches with Plummer also earning First Team All-Conference, while Senior Zandy Soree and sophomore Kristen Scott earned Second Team All-Conference honors. Caroline DeLisle, Ally Gudorf, and Ellie Moreno picked up All-Rookie accolades.

The Knights finished the 2018 campaign at 10-7-1 (6-3 American Athletic Conference) and entered the American Athletic Conference Championship tournament as a the third seed. Under Roberts Sahaydak, three Knights earned All-Southeast Region honors - Stefanie Sanders earned second team all-region, while Vera Varis and Carrie Lawrence collected third team all-region recognition. Vera Veris was named Goalkeeper of the Year and named to First Team All-Conference. Stefanie Sanders joined Veris with First Team All-Conference accolades and Kristen Scott was named to the All-Rookje team. All-Rookie team.

In 2017, Roberts Sahaydak coached the Knights to a 13-2-3 record, the most wins since the 2014 campaign. UCF climbed as climbed as high as No. 6 and finished the regular season ranked eighth. The Knights posted a 16-match unbeaten streak, the longest since the 2013 campaign, captured the American Athletic Conference regular season championship and made their 21st NCAA Tournament appearance.

Under Roberts Sahaydak's tutelage, five members of the team received All-Southeast Region recognition and goalkeeper Vera Varis was named to the United Soccer Coaches Association All-American Third Team. In addi-

tion, five of her starters were recognized as American AAC Players of the Year, including Morgan Ferrara (Offensive), Kathellen Sousa (Co-Defensive), Vera Varis (Goalkeeper), Kayla Adamek (Midfielder), and Dina Orschmann (Rookie). A total of seven Knights were placed on the All-American Athletic Conference Teams, and three were recognized on the all-tournament team.

In 2016, four student-athletes were named to the All-American Athletic Conference Teams. Saga Fredriksson was named to the All-Northeast Region Team and recognized as the American Athletic Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Year. Off the field, the Knights earned recognition for their academic success as they received the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Award.

Roberts Sahaydak tackled the 2015 season with team that featured more newcomers (14) than returners (12) and lost three key members due to injury for the year before the season-opening weekend was in the books. Eight of their starters, including their American Athletic Conference Offensive Player, Defensive Player and Goalkeeper of the Year, had moved on from the year before. But the Knights earned a berth to their ninth-stright NCAA Tournament (20th overall) and nabbed a hosting gig for the first round for the fifth straight season. In addition, Carol Rodrigues was named the American's Co-Offensive Player of the Year.

In 2014, she guided the Knights to their second NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in four years and the American regular season title. Under her direction, three Knights were recognized as conference Players of the Year: Tatiana Coleman (Co-Offensive); Carleigh Wiliams (Defensive); and Connie Organ (Goalkeeper). UCF posted its first undefeated home slate (11-0) since 1999, matched the school record for wins in a season (18) and was nationally ranked through much of the year.

In her first season (2013), she led UCF to a school-record unbeaten streak (18 matches), an NSCAA national standing through much of the year and the program's first undefeated conference season since 1999. In addition, UCF made history, as the first program to win an American Athletic Conference Championship. Roberts Sahaydak came to Orlando after serving six seasons at VCU alongside her co-head coach, husband and current UCF associate head coach Tim Sahaydak.

Roberts Sahaydak spent a decade with the U.S. National Team from 1994-2004, earning 110 caps (with 60 starts). Her career was highlighted by three women's World Cups - among them, the unforgettable 1999 championship - and a gold medal with the 1996 Olympic team.

After retiring from the USWNT, she has served as an ambassador for U.S. Soccer with the U.S. Department of State Sports Envoy Program since 2007, promoting the power and benefit of sport internationally. With the program, she has visited Indonesia, Uganda, the Philippines, Thailand, Namibia, Brazil and France. In 2014, she was appointed to President Barack Obama's Presidential Delegation to the Federative Republic of Brazil at the opening of the FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

She is a native of San Ramon, Calif., and was selected as the 1994 California High School Player of the Year. She was a three-time Parade High School All-American, a three-time NSCAA All-American and was the two-time National Girl's High School Player of the Year. She debuted for the Stars and Stripes in 1994 when she was only 16 as one of the youngest players ever to suit up for the National Team. She played in her first FIFA Women's World Cup a month after her 18th birthday and won Olympic gold before she was out of her teens (USSoccer.com).

As a collegian, Roberts Sahaydak was a standout midfielder for North Carolina (1995-98) as a three-time All-ACC First Team selection. She led the Tar Heels to two NCAA titles (1996, 1997) during her tenure, was voted the 1998 ACC Tournament MVP and finished third in voting for collegiate soccer's highest honor, the Hermann Trophy. She still ranks among the top five for career starts in UNC's record book.

She was a two-time captain for the Carolina Courage in the first fully professional U.S. women's league (Women's United Soccer Association). She helped the Courage win the 2002 title after finishing last in the team's inaugural campaign one year prior.

Roberts Sahaydak took over VCU's program in 2007 and led the Rams to three conference championship game appearances. She was voted as the 2011 Colonial Athletic Association Co-Head Coach of the Year, along with her husband Tim. The duo mentored two CAA Defenders of the Year, one CAA Rookie of the Year and 20 all-conference players, including six first-team honorees. The Sahaydaks reside in Orlando with their two daughters, Layla and Evie




