AUGUST

The UCF football team, in conjunction with Orlando Health Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children, recognized Childhood Cancer Awareness Month leading up to the game vs. Sam Houston State. After a successful UCF Spring Game, which featured pediatric patients from the hospital creating their own UCF helmet logos, the two organizations showcased these brave patients again for Childhood Cancer Awareness Month as they continue their fight for life. The football team sported specially designed logos on each side of their helmets, which were designed by the children.

SEPT. 28

FOX Big Noon Kickoff made its highly anticipated Week 4 stop at UCF, drawing the largest crowd in the show's history. The record-setting event energized campus as part of the electric pregame atmosphere leading into the UCF vs. Colorado showdown.









NOV. 1

The UCF Athletics Hall of Fame officially inducted its 2024 class at the Celeste Hotel, celebrating the achievements and contributions of six remarkable inductees: Chris Duffy (baseball), Mark Giacone (football), Shaquem Griffin (football), Ashley Holder (women's golf), Anne-Marie Blaney (track and field/cross country), and Kirk Speraw (men's basketball head coach).





NOV. 2

UCF continued its dominance in the annual Space Game, improving to 8-0 all-time with a 56-12 win over Arizona. The Citronauts jumped out to a 28-0 lead and scored touchdowns on eight of their 10 drives, including seven in a row. UCF controlled nearly every statistical category in the wet, lopsided victory at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

NOV. 4

Senior Darius Johnson led UCF to a statement 64-61 upset over No. 13 Texas A&M with a game-high 24 points in the season opener. The victory marked UCF's 11th all-time win over a ranked opponent and its first in a season opener.









DEC. 5

RJ Harvey was named First Team All-Big 12 following a record-breaking season in which he led the conference and ranked third nationally with 1,577 rushing yards. He scored 25 total touchdowns, including a program-record 22 rushing, and set the UCF all-time mark for career touchdowns with 48.

DEC. 8

Scott Frost was (re)introduced as the next head football coach at UCF by Vice President and Director of Athletics Terry Mohajir.






DEC. 12

UCF officially broke ground on the new Roth Tower at Acrisure Bounce House. The Roth Tower was made possible by a \$90 million commitment of Tourist Development Tax revenues from the Orange County Board of County Commissioners.

DEC. 21


Matt Botsford is named UCF's 10th head volleyball coach. Botsford spent the past 11 seasons at Florida Gulf Coast where he led the Eagles to four consecutive Atlantic Sun Conference Championships, including four consecutive, and five NCAA tournament appearances.





MARCH 4

UCF baseball defeated No. 6 Florida 13-3 at John Euliano Park, the sixth straight win over the Gators in front of a crowd of 4,204 fans—the secondlargest home crowd in program history.





APRIL 1-6

UCF enjoyed a thrilling run in the inaugural College Basketball Crown tournament in Las Vegas, advancing past Oregon State (76-75), Cincinnati (88-80), and an overtime victory over Villanova (104-98) to earn a spot in the championship game before falling to Nebraska in the final. The run propelled UCF to just its 10th 20-win season in program history.

APRIL 12

The women's tennis team made history, capturing the school's firstever Big 12 championship as the Knights dominated Utah 4-1.














APRIL 25-26

RJ Harvey (Broncos) and Mac McWilliams (Eagles) were selected in the second and fifth rounds, respectively, in the NFL Draft.

APRIL 30

Women's tennis player Olivia Lincer was named Big 12 Player of the Year.





MAY

TifTuf Bermudagrass was installed in Acrisure Bounce House, marking the first time the playing field had been replaced since the stadium opened in 2007.

MAY 4

Men's tennis defeats in-state rival Florida to secure its first trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 in program history.









MAY 7

Softball pitcher Isabella Vega was named First Team All-Big 12 after leading the conference with a 0.89 ERA.

MAY 18

Softball advanced to the regional finals of the NCAA Tournament, its fifth straight NCAA appearance. In the process, head coach Cindy Ball-Malone notched her 250th victory in her career at UCF.











MAY 18

Rowing captured its first Big 12 championship after a clean sweep in all races.

MAY 22

Rower Hannah Lovejoy and head coach Mara Allen were named Big 12 Rower and Coach of the Year.

JUNE 1

Rowing finished the 2025 season with a programhigh 13th-place finish at the NCAA Championships.



JUNE 10

UCF announced its approach to revenue sharing and reaffirmed its commitment to supporting student-athletes by investing up to \$20.5 million annually. This includes a \$3 million investment to add 74 new scholarships, 60% of which will support women's programs. Through expanded scholarships and smart, sustainable revenue strategies, UCF is building a model designed to strengthen all of its athletic teams.



JUNE 12

UCF announced the rebranding of its football stadium to Acrisure Bounce House; Levy was named UCF's new food and hospitality provider.

JULY 15

UCF Athletics announced an all-time high in fundraising, continuing its upward trajectory with an unprecedented \$52.8 million in cash and commitments for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. The record-setting total was achieved through the generosity of more than 13,206 donors, including 467 Shareholders Society donors and 579 Varsity Knights members, marking the fourth consecutive year UCF has surpassed \$40 million in annual fundraising commitments to the Charge On Fund.





CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS

Construction is well underway on the new Roth Tower and the Hagle Football Gateway. These projects will completely transform the gameday experience for Knights fans, give UCF Athletics the potential for year-round revenue, and continue to drive tourism to Central Florida.

MISSION CRITICAL PROJECTS

UCF Athletics has invested more than \$26 million in facility enhancements and maintenance since launching Mission XII that have changed the way UCF recruits future Knights, develops student-athletes, and generates revenue. Continued investment in all sports in the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village are essential to our continued success. Our immediate mission, the Hagle Football Gateway, will solidify the foundation for the Knight's football campus that will benefit all student-athletes, coaches and fans.








SUSTAINED SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

UCF student-athletes continued to excel academically, with several programs earning perfect multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores of 1,000. Women's volleyball, women's golf, men's golf, and women's tennis all achieved perfect scores. UCF student-athletes also set a new departmental record with a 3.47 GPA, marking the 35th consecutive semester with a GPA of 3.0 or higher and 12 straight semesters above 3.3. Overall, nearly 79 percent of student-athletes earned a 3.0 or higher, with 53 achieving perfect 4.0 GPAs.

To fully support our student-athletes in their NIL endeavors

- As we enter the new Rev Share Era of college sports, we are fully committed to the maximum allowable \$20.5 million for FY26.
- The Competitive Success Fund strengthens our ability to recruit, retain, and develop student-athletes competing at the highest levels.

To provide championship-caliber services to our student-athletes in their educational and career pursuits

- We've committed \$3 million toward 74 new scholarships, with 60 percent designated for women's sports.
- UCF student-athletes set a department-record 3.47 GPA last spring — the 35th straight semester with a 3.0 or higher.
- A 94 percent graduation success rate ranks us among the Top 4 in the Big 12.
- We guarantee 100 percent job placement or graduate school admission for every graduating student-athlete

 an unmatched commitment in college athletics.

To position UCF Athletics to win conference and national championships and successfully transition into the Big 12

- Our teams continue to compete at a high level while building the foundation for long-term success.
- Since joining the Big 12, UCF has made 10 NCAA team appearances — more than Cincinnati, Colorado, Houston, and West Virginia, and tied with Kansas State and Utah.
- In 2024-25, women's tennis and rowing captured UCF's first two Big 12 championships.

 We remain focused on winning conference titles and sustaining success.

To increase the UCF Athletics operating budget to rank in the top half upon Big 12 entry, then target top third

- In 2022, we set a goal to generate \$20 million in new selfgenerated annual revenue to reach a \$100 million budget. Following another record year in FY25, that goal has been exceeded — UCF's 2025-26 operating budget is projected at \$121 million.
- As of August 2025, we've secured \$266.5 million in cash and commitments since the initiative launched in March 2022.

To deliver unique, indigenous athletics facilities for all student-athletes and fans

- Construction is underway on the Hagle Football Gateway, the first major project of our long-term facilities vision. Completed or active projects include Roth Tower, Wayne Densch Practice Complex, Nicholson Plaza, VIP parking, and the Gateway Promenade.
- More than \$27 million has been invested in facility enhancements and maintenance since launching Mission XII, directly impacting recruiting, development, and revenue.
