FIRST AND 10

DUNNAM DAZZLES WITH THREE SPACE GAME INTS

- ◆ Senior DB Phillip Dunnam had a career night in UCF's space game, becoming the first player in program history to snag three interceptions in a single game. Two of the interceptions were in the first half, and one ended in a 43-yard pick-six to put UCF up 24-14 late in the second quarter.
- Dunnam was honored as the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week
 → He became the third player this seaosn to have three interceptions, but
- → He became the third player this seaosn to have three interceptions, but became the only one to return it for a touchdown. Additionally, he became one of 13 players to have a three pick game in the Big 12 since 1996
- ◆ Oddly enough, this isn't the first time defensive coordinator Alex Grinch has had one of his players on defense earn three picks in a game. The other was Wyoming's Shamiel Gary in his first collegiate game against Weber State. Grinch was the defensive backs coach in Wyoming from 2009-2011.

2 SPACE GAME PERFECTION REACHES ITS END

- The ninth-annual Space Game became the first loss in the tradition's history as UCF fell to Houston 30-27, snapping the perfect 8-0 mark
- UCF, known as the Citronauts during its celestial celebration, forced four turnovers but were unable to capitalize as Frost-led UCF teams are now 17-2 when forcing more turnovers
- ◆ Entering the game, UCF averaged 50.6 points per game in Space Games, while opponents were held to 19.9 ppg. The split is now 48.0 and 20.7.
- → The Space Game recognizes the University of Central Florida's roots, founded as Florida Technological University in 1963 with the mission of providing personnel to support the growing U.S. space program at the Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. As the academic scope expanded beyond its original focus on engineering and technology, the school was renamed the University of Central Florida in 1978.

3 LAWRENCE CLIMBING SACK LEADERBOARD

- ◆ UCF edge rusher Malachi Lawrence has earned 20 career sacks, propelling himself into the top 10 of active leaders in the FBS and all-time at UCF
- ◆ Lawrence sits at No. 9 among active FBS players in career sacks and is second among active players in the Big 12 Conference behind only TTU's David Bailey
- ◆ Lawrence sits alone at No. 10 allOtime in career sacks at UCF, passing Keenan Wimbley's 19 compiled from 1984-87 and is one sack away from jumping into sole possession of ninth (see record watch later in notes)
- ◆ Lawrence recorded back-to-back 2.0 sack games at Baylor & vs. Houston, putting him at 7.0 on the season which is 0.5 shy of tying his career best

4 NO FLY ZONE

- ◆ The Knights have the 12th-ranked passing defense in the country, surrendering just 168.2 passing yards per game thus far
- ◆ UCF has allowed the second fewest passing plays of 20+ yards in the Big 12, surrendering just 18 behind Utah's 15. That number has the Knights tied for eighth in FBS. Additionally, UCF has allowed the fewest 20+ yard plays of any variety in the Big 12 and is tied for sixth-lowest in the FBS with 24.
- → The UCF defense held Kansas quarterback Jalon Daniels to no passing touchdowns for the first time this season (as of Oct. 4), he entered the contest vs. the Knights as the nation's fifth-most efficient passer
- ◆ UCF held West Virginia to just 79 passing yards, tied for the 17th fewest surrendered in UCF's FBS history. Earlier this year, UCF limited N.C. A&T to 40 passing yards, the fourth fewest allowed during UCF's FBS era.

5 FIRST QUARTER LOCKDOWN

- ◆ The Knights sit 11th in the nation in fewest points allowed in the first quarter after posting another 0 against Houston. UCF has shutout its opponents in the first quarter in seven of nine games this season, allowing just 21 points.
- UCF entered November ranking third in the category after allowing just seven points in the first quarter to Cincinnati on Oct. 11. UCF didn't allow a firstquarter score through the first five games of 2025 and didn't allow a touchdown

- in the first half of the first three games of the season
- UCF and Pitt were the only two FBS programs to hold its opponents scoreless in the first quarter through the first six weeks of 2025. Both teams saw that streak snapped in week seven, each giving up a TD in the first quarter.

6 SAVING THE BEST FOR LAST

9-1 (6-1 Big 12)

- ◆ The Knights have been sharp on defense in the fourth quarter, surrendering the 14th fewest points per game in the fourth this season with 39 total
- What's been more impressive is the amount of yards surrendered in the fourth quarter during Big 12 conference play:
 - Nov. 7 vs. HOU 96 yards, 8 first downs, 22 plays, 6 points
 - Nov. 1 at BU 64 yards, 4 first downs, 16 plays, 7 points
 - Oct. 18 vs. WVU 7 yards, 0 first downs, 14 plays, 6 points • Oct. 11 at CIN - 17 yards, 1 first down, 9 plays, 3 points
 - Oct. 4 vs. KU 12 yards, 0 first downs, 9 plays, 0 points
 - Sep. 27 at KSU 30 yards, 2 first downs, 17 plays, 3 points

REMARKARI E RIJEI AS

- ★ Kicker Noe Ruelas tied his career long with a 54-yard made field goal against Houston on Nov. 7, making him the first player in UCF's FBS history to hit three field goals from 50 yards or longer in a single season (54 vs. Houston, 53 at Kansas State and 51 vs. West Virginia)
- Ruelas had a streak of 11 straight field goals made prior to just his second
 miss of the 2025 season at Baylor on Nov. 1. He joined a group of just five
 Knights to make 11 or more consecutive field goals in the program's history,
 tying the legendary Matt Prater for 11 straight made.
- Prior to hitting his third, Ruelas and Colton Boomer were the only two Knights in the program's FBS history to make a pair of 50+ yard field goals in a single season, Boomer doing so in 2023. The last UCF kicker to hit 11 or more consecutive field goals was Shawn Moffitt who nailed 12 in a row across the 2012 and 2013 seasons. The UCF record for consecutive field goals is 16, achieved by Michael Torres from Oct. 20-Dec. 29, 2007.

8 LONG SCORING DRIVES

- ◆ UCF had two scoring drives of 90+ yards in the win over West Virginia, matching the two collected over the course of the season, now sitting at four
- ◆ Prior to the West Virginia win, the last time UCF had two or more 90+ yard touchdown drives in a single game was Oct. 19, 2019 against East Carolina
- Additionally, the Knights earned three scoring drives of 75+ yards against the Mountaineers, bringing the total to of 75+ scoring drives to 12 this season
- Now at 13 drives of 75+ yards, the 75+ yard drives make up 33.3% of all UCF's scoring drives this season with 39 total scoring drives

9 BIG GAIN RUNNING GAME

- ◆ Nixon has four runs of 50+ yards this season, all of thlem for touchdowns. Two of his long runs came in UCF's 68-7 victory over N.C. A&T, ripping off 87- and 66-yard touchdown runs. His third came at Kansas State, a 54-yard touchdown, making way for his 83-yard score against West Virginia.
- → UCF is one of two Big 12 teams (Utah) to boast four different players with 100-yard rushing outings. Jaden Nixon, Myles Montgomery, Jacurri Brown and Cam Fancher have all earned 100+ rushing yards in a game this season.
- Additionally, Montgomery earned two long runs at Kansas State, scampering for 45 yards, his longest rush as a Knight, and later running for 44 yards for his highest career rushing total of 119 yards on 10 carries

10 FLAWLESS START ON FOURTH DOWN

- ◆ UCF started the season a perfect 8-for-8 on fourth downs through the first three games and now sit at 15-for-27 on the season, or 55.6%
- Currently, UCF's 15 conversions on fourth down rank 15th-most in FBS
 UCF was one of 11 FBS teams to be perfect on fourth down leading up to
 week five

BY THE NUMBERS

The Knights have compiled 73 victories since the start of the 2017 season, the most of any program in the Big 12 Conference. The win total is 16th most in the nation since that time. A full list is available in later in the notes



The Knights welcome 63 new players to the roster this season, with the total roster size being 111. Of the 63 newcomers, 36 are transfers from DI schools while 18 are from high school. Just four players who started 6+ games last year return.





QUICK HITS

- ◆ Texas Tech's ninth win marks the first nine-win season for the Red Raiders since 2009, and 15th in program history
- ◆ The Red Raiders' 6-1 start to Big 12 play marks their second time doing so, matching the 6-1 start in 2008
- ◆ The Red Raiders' seven points allowed to BYU are their fewest against an AP Top-10 opponent since they beat then-ranked No. 8 Texas A&M 14-7 on October 7, 1995
- Texas Tech is the only FBS team that owns two wins against CFP Top 15 teams (No. 7 BYU, No. 13 Utah)
- ◆ The Red Raiders have held their opponents scoreless on their opening drive in each of their 10 games this season. It's the longest streak to start a season by a Big 12 team since Oklahoma had 11 in a row to begin 2019.

HUNGTINGTON, W.Va. (Nov. 15, 2008) - Freshman running back Brynn Harvey rushed for a career-high 150 yards and a touchdown to lead the UCF football team to a 30-14 victory at Marshall Saturday. The Knights recovered two fumbles and senior defensive back Sha'reff Rashad intercepted a pair of passes in the win, helping improve UCF's record to 3-7 and 2-4 in Conference USA.

Marshall (4-6, 3-3) finished with 145 rushing yards and 84 passing yards against the Black and Gold defense. Meanwhile, UCF's 2T3 rushing yards were the second most of the year. Along with Harvey's impressive performance, fellow freshman Lativius Murray also had a season-best effort of 46 yards on the ground.

Another freshman, quarterback Rob Calabrese went 4-for-17 for 29 yards and a touchdown. His counterpart, Marshall's Mark Cann, also finished 4-for-17 with 32 yards and a TD, as UCF posted its fourth-straight win over the Thundering Herd.

In the third-coldest game since UCF made the move to FBS in 1996 (42 degrees), the Knights jumped out to a 13-0 lead on a fumble recovery in the end zone by sophomore Jamar Newsome in the first quarter and two field goals by freshman Nick Cattoi. His first field goal ended a 16-play, 68-yard drive in the opening quarter.

Even though Chubb Small's one-yard rush with 5:59 left in the second quarter cut it to 13-7, sophomore tight end John Lubischer recorded his first-career reception, a two-yard TD from Calabrese with 4:16 showing on the clock. Following the break, Cody Slate hauled in a 15-yard fouchdown reception to kid-off the third quarter and keep Marshall in the game. Cattoi then added his third field goal of the night to make it a two-possession game in the third quarter. And as UCF was trying to run down the clock late in the fourth, Harvey found the end zone on a 50-yard run on a 3-and-11 call to seal it with just less than three minutes remaining.





- ◆ The return of Scott Frost as UCF's head coach reignites some trends from his first tenure, showcasing where the program was at 2017's end
- ◆ UCF outscored their opponents 627-329 in 2017, scoring 30 points or more in all 13 victories. The Knights' offense ranked No. 1 in the nation, averaging 48.2 points per game. UCF's high-powered offense continued even after Frost had departed, as the Black and Gold tacked on 18 more consecutive games scoring 30 points or more. Additionally, UCF compiled 500+ yards of offense in eight of their 13 wins in 2017
- ♦ So far in 2025, UCF has scored 30+ points three times (N.C. A&T, UNC, WVU) and has 500+ yards of offense in two game (N.C. A&T, WVU)
- ♦ When looking at 2016-17 and the 2025 season, Frost's UCF teams have posted 30 or more points in 21 of his 35 games at the helm and has scored 24 or more points in 27 of the 35. Additionally, Frost's UCF squads have tallied 500+ yards of offense 11 times across his three seasons in Black and Gold.

- ◆ UCF's defense compilied eight sacks in the 45-13 win over West Virginia, the most sacks for the Knights in a single game since Oct. 14, 2000 vs. Eastern Kentucky when the Black and Gold earned nine. The nine stand as the most in UCF's FBS history and the eight earned against the Mountaineers was one of just four times earning seven or more sacks since 1996 and becoming FBS.
- ◆ The Knights are one of six teams to record eight or more sacks in a game in the FBS this season and were one behind tying the top spot
- ◆ On top of his 1.5 sacks, Nyjalik Kelly forced a fumble which was returned for a touchdown for 32 yards by Keli Lawson. It was the second forced fumble of the season for Kelly, the other also was returned for a TD vs. N.C. A&T.
- → The defensive line accounted for seven of the eight sacks, including 5.5 from the starters up front, earning the honor of Big 12 Defensive Line of the
- ◆ Malachi Lawrence earned 2.0 sacks, the first player to do so in a game in 2025

- ◆ UCF scored its most points in a Homecoming game since 2020 in a 45-13 thumping of West Virginia, snapping a two-game Homecoming losing skid
- ◆ The Knights have won seven of their last nine, as well as 13 of their last 17 Homecoming games
- ◆ Chris Domercant caught his first two touchdowns at the FBS level, both in the first quarter, becoming the first Knight to snag two touchdowns in a single guarter since Oct. 13, 2022 when Ryan O'Keefe did so in a 70-13 win vs. Temple
- → Jaden Nixon tallied another 100-yard rushing game, his second of the year and added another two touchdowns, his sixth of the season and 20th career
- ◆ With the final score, UCF has posted 30+ points for the third time this season. As of Nov. 1, UCF has scored 30+ points in 21 of Scott Frost's 34 games leading UCF (more on this in "feeling trendy" later in notes on page four)

- ◆ UCF's 45-13 victory over West Virginia on Oct. 18 this season as the first win in the month of October since Oct. 29, 2022 when the Knights topped No. 20/19 Cincinnati in Orlando. The Knights won three of four matchups in October in 2022 but went winless in 2023 and 2024
- ◆ The October losses of 2023 and 2024 contributed to five-game losing streaks in each of the past two seasons
- ◆ Over his two tenures, Scott Frost has found relative success at the helm of UCF in October, going 7-4.

- ◆ The Knights have compiled the most wins since the start of the 2017 season than anyone in the Big 12 Conference, posting 73 victories from 2017-present. Fellow leaguemates Cincinnati (72), BYU (71) and Utah (70) join the top 25 in wins since 2017.
- ◆ UCF is tied for 16th nationally in wins since the start of 2017. UCF got the streak going by posting 13 wins in 2017, 12 victories in 2018 and 10 in 2019.
- → The Knights are among the nation's elite, as Georgia leads the way with 105 followed by Alabama (104), Ohio State (101), Clemson (95), Notre Dame (94), Oklahoma and Oregon (85), Michigan (84), Boise State (81), Memphis (80), LSU and Penn State (79), Texas (77), Appalachian State (76) and Iowa (75)
- + Outside of the Big 12, UCF are ahead of other programs such as Washington (72), Texas A&M (69), Ole Miss (68), Miami (67), USC (66) and Missouri (65)

- ◆ UCF sits eighth in FBS in most points scored since the start of the 2017 season, posting 4,067, an average of 37.0 points per game
- ◆ UCF's points are the most by a current Big 12 program over that time, the next closest is Texas Tech who sit 18th with 3,656. Other opponents on UCF's schedule this season in the top 25 in points since 2017 include Oklahoma St. (3,548) and North Carolina (3,509), sitting 22nd and 24th, respectively.
- + The Black and Gold sit behind Alabama (4,789), Ohio State (4,617), Oklahoma (4,421), Georgia (4,314), Memphis (4,267), Clemson (4,243) and SMU (4,107)
- ◆ UCF sits eight in points from touchdowns, registering 533 times hitting paydirt

- ◆ 14-time Grammy Award winner Taylor Swift released her 12th studio album on Oct. 3, and while that has no link to UCF football, the Knights historically perform well following a new Swift album, going 33-15 after a fall album debut through the end of that particular season. Most recently, UCF finished the 2023 season 3-2 following the 1989 (Taylor's Version) release on Oct. 27 and going 4-2 after Midnights arrived on Oct. 21, 2022. The Knights are 1-4 since the debut of Life of a Showgirl.
- ◆ Prior to the result against Kansas, UCF averaged nearly five touchdowns a game (4.7) in contests immediately following a fall album release. When counting up wins and losses following only new album releases (doesn't include "Taylor's Version" re-records) UCF is now 4-4.


- ◆ UCF has been consistently been top tier when it comes to offense, finishing in the top 15 in six of the last eight seasons
 - 2025 57th (402.6 yards per game)
 - 2024 14th (447.8 yards per game)
 - 2023 8th (487.0 yards per game)
 - 2020 2nd (568.1 yards per game)
 - + 2019 2nd (540.5 yards per game)
 - 2018 5th (522.7 yards per game)
 - 2017 5th (530.5 yards per game)(Scott Frost Head Coach)
- ◆ UCF rushing attack has powered the offense to its high numbers. The last two seasons were headlined by RJ Harvey before he was drafted by the Denver Broncos this past summer. The Knights have finished in the top 20 in rushing offense in five of the last seven seasons.


- ◆ UCF is one of 30 FBS teams that started 2025 with a new head coach; 28 of which are completely new while the other two were elevated from interim ◆ The Knights are a perfect 4-0 against teams with new coaches this season, beating Jacksonville St. with Charles Kelly, N.C. A&T (FCS) with Shawn Gibbs, North Carolina with Bill Belichick and West Virginia with Rich Rodriguez. All games were at home and decided by a margin of 164-39.
- ◆ UCF began the season with four scheduled games against teams with new head coaches, but now will have five after Oklahoma State's leadership change. The Knights' meeting with the Cowboys is the final game of 2025 against a new head coach, hosting interim HC Doug Meacham on Nov. 22
- ◆ Of the new crop in 2025, Frost and Rodriguez are the only pair of FBS head coaches to have coached at a school, leave, and return as head coach again

OUTGAINED CINCINNATI IN TOUGH ROAD LOSS

- + The Knights' offense outgained Cincinnati 413-306 in a 20-11 defeat in Ohio.
- ◆ The Bearcats entered the contest with the 15th ranked offense in the nation when it comes total yards, averaging 478.4 yards per game, including an







- average of 39.2 points per game, a clip that was No. 17 in the nation
- ◆ UCF's defense limited UC to three points in the second half, which tied the fewest Cincy had scored in a half this season since the first half of the 2025 opener vs. Nebraska
- ◆ In his first start since opening night, Cam Fancher earned his fourth career rushing game of 100+ yards, scampering for 108 yards and a touchdown while throwing for 222 yards
- ◆ The UCF defense was on the field for just 7:06 of the second half, limiting Cincinnati to just 109 yards and three first downs over the final two quarters
- ◆ UCF has outgained its opponents in five of the first six games this season; Scott Frost at the helm of UCF was 12-2 entering 2025 and is 3-2 this season

CAN'T HOLD OFF KANSAS: UNFAMILIAR OUTCOME

- ◆ UCF jumped out to a 14-0 lead over Kansas in the Knights' 2025 Big 12 home opener, including a 20-14 halftime advantage. A second-half Jayhawks surge resulted in the 27-20 loss. It was just the program's third loss when holding a halftime lead under Frost in his three seasons, now sitting 19-3. After KU and UC losses. UCF is 18-3 when a Frost-led squad surrendered 29 points or less.
- ◆ The Knights' highly rated pass defense was able to hold one of the nation's best passers without a touchdown through the air for the first time this season. Jalon Daniels entered the contest as the nation's fifth most efficient passer.
- → The Knights continued their first quarter dominance on defense, not allowing a score in the first quarter to the Jayhawks who came in with 63 points scored in the first quarter this season, which was tied for third-most in FBS

- + UCF played its first Big 12 Conference game on a Saturday night since becoming members of the league in 2023 when they hosted Kansas on ESPN2
- ◆ With the results against Kansas and Houston included, home field at night has powered UCF to a 19-8 clip since 2016 in games at Acrisure Bounce House that start at 7 p.m. or later, including 8-5 on Saturday nights.

- → UCF fought until the end in its 2025 Big 12 Conference opener, but fell 34-20
- ◆ The Kansas State lead grew to three scores on multiple occasions during the second half but UCF remained in it until the finish, cutting the deficit to 11 with 9:34 remaining
- ◆ Both of UCF's touchdowns were greater than 50 yards, with Jacurri Brown connecting for 82 yards with DJ Black to make it a 10-7 contest late in the first half; the other was a 54-yard touchdown run by Jaden Nixon near the end of the third quarter, cutting the Wildcat lead to 31-17
- ◆ The Black and Gold have started each of their three Big 12 slates on the road

- ◆ With UCF's first loss of the 2025 season, Coach Frost's 16-game winning streak as head coach of the Knights was snapped at the hands of Kansas State. It was the longest active streak by an FBS coach at one institution. The 2017 Knights, piloted by Frost, were the only team to finish that season unbeaten as they earned 13-straight victories, setting up the streak.
- ◆ The victory over North Carolina tied Frost with Nick Saban of Alabama and Lincoln Riley with Oklahoma; Saban pieced together 16 straight wins from Jan. 1, 2017 - Dec. 29, 2018 while Riley did it from Oct. 10, 2020 - Oct. 30, 2021

- ◆ Offensive line coach Shawn Clark, 50, passed away the evening of Sep. 21 at a local hospital unexpectedly, with his wife, Jonelle, by his side. He was admitted on Tuesday, Sept. 9, after experiencing a medical emergency and remained in stable condition before passing away.
- ◆ A veteran coach with more than two decades of experience, Coach Clark joined UCF in December 2024 following a successful tenure as head coach at Appalachian State, where he compiled a 40-24 record across five seasons. His App State tenure was highlighted by a 10-win season in 2021 and three bowl wins. Coach Clark's teams earned multiple Sun Belt East Division titles and developed some of the nation's top offensive lines, with his 2018 and 2019 groups ranked among the best in the country.
- ◆ The Knights will honor Coach Clark with a decal on the back of their helmets for the remainder of the season

- ◆ UCF concluded its non-conference slate with a resounding 34-9 victory over Bill Belichick-led North Carolina, securing a 3-0 start to the 2025 schedule and for the third straight season
- ◆ Scott Frost, who was a defensive back in the NFL for the New York Jets during the 1998 and 1999 seasons, was coached by Belichick who was the defensive coordinator at the time, earning the victory over his former coach
- ◆ After their two previous meetings were canceled (see additional info later in notes), UNC and UCF finally met for the first time in program history, with another meeting scheduled for 2027 in Chapel Hill + UCF set the tone early, scoring in 13 plays on the game's opening drive to take a 7-0 lead. North Carolina's first possession ended in an interception as
- Horace Lockett batted the pass at the line, setting up Nyjalik Kelly for a one-handed pick. The Knights cashed in by adding three points to the scoreboard.
- ◆ Quarterback Tayven Jackson was an impressive 25-for-32 including a passing and rushing touchdown, earning his longest career rush and most career rushing yards in a single game in his career. He helped orchestrate a two-minute drill at the end of the first half that resulted in a 20-3 lead.

- + Following UCF football's 34-9 victory over North Carolina, the Knights' offensive line group was honored as Big 12 Offensive Line of the Week.
- ◆ The UCF offensive line's play was a story of resilience in tribute to offensive line coach Shawn Clark. The unit responded by allowing zero sacks in the Knights' victory, the first time this season and the first since Oct. 19, 2024 at No. 9 lowa State. The Black and Gold controlled the game with three scoring drives of 13 plays or more, including a final march of 18 plays for 93 yards and a touchdown that took over 10 minutes off the clock in the fourth quarter.
- ◆ In addition to keeping the quarterback clean against the Tar Heels, UCF's starting offensive line graded out as the second-best pass blocking performance in the Big 12 Conference this week, according to PFF.

- → A phrase often muttered on long car rides, but for the Knights, they thrived on long drives on the gridiron against North Carolina. UCF scored on three drives of 13 plays or more in the win over the Tar Heels, earning touchdowns on two of the three with the other being a field goal. Each drive ate up at least 6:37 of clock, including a 10:26 drive in the fourth to ice the game.
- ♦ It was an improvement from UCF's first game of the season, where they had drives of 13 and 17 plays stall out and result in punts vs. Jacksonville State

RECEIVED VOTES IN AP POLL (WEEK 5)

- ◆ UCF saw its name crack into the AP Poll during week five, receiving three votes
- ◆ The Knights are seeking their first ranking in the AP Poll since Week 13 of the 2022 season when they sat at No. 22
- ◆ Prior to Scott Frost's arrival, UCF had been ranked just 13 times in the AP Poll as an FBS school. In just 2017 alone, Frost nearly doubled the time UCF spent in the rankings, checking in for the 11 final polls of his final season in his first tenure as a Knight. In total, Frost sparked 33 straight appearances in the AP Poll, lasting through the entirety of the 2018 season and coming to an end in Week 6 of 2019, well after Frost had departed.
- ◆ The Knights total 57 AP poll appearances after popping their head back in for the finall 2019 ranking as well as five weeks in 2020 and 2022

- ◆ As Scott Frost's first run as UCF's head football coach was set to get started, UCF and UNC agreed to a home-and-home, announced Aug. 10, 2016.
- ◆ The first scheduled meeting was set to be in Chapel Hill in 2018, but with Hurricane Florence bearing down on the Carolinas, the game was canceled ◆ UCF was set to host UNC in 2020, but the ACC implemented a conference-only schedule due to the COVID-19 pandemic, canceling the contest.
- ◆ Now, in Frost's second run at UCF, the two teams finally met on the gridiron, with UCF taking the first leg of the home-and-home 34-9 with the return
- game set to take place in Chapel Hill in 2027



the NFL for the New York Jets during the 1998 and 1999 seasons while Belichick was the defensive coordinator.

◆ Mike Dawson, UCF's edge rushing coach, worked at Nebraska alongside then-defensive coordinator Bob Diaco in 2017; Diaco is on staff with UNC as the defensive line coach. UCF faced Diaco while he was head coach of UConn from 2014-16, and attempted to start the "Civil Conflict" rivalry.

- ♦ While UCF has faced the No. 1 team in the nation head-to-head just once, the Knights have a streak of playing historic programs that at some point in the program's history have reached a No. 1 ranking. Including 2025, the Knights have five consecutive regular seasons of playing one of those teams. If bowl games are included, the streak extends all the way back to Scott Frost's first year with the Knights, 2016.
- ◆ Since 2006, the only season that didn't include a previous No. 1 in the regular season or bowl game was 2015.
- → The Knights' 2025 schedule sees BYU and North Carolina on that list, with BYU earning four weeks at No. 1, most recently in 1984 while North Carolina earned one number one ranking in 1948. Other years/teams in the streak: 2024 saw Colorado (7 weeks, last 1990), Florida (41 weeks, last 2009) and TCU (2 weeks, last 1938); 2023 saw Oklahoma (101 weeks, last 2011); 2022 and 2021 saw SMU (2 weeks, last 1950).
- ◆ If bowls are included, the 2020 season saw UCF match up with BYU in the Boca Raton Bowl. Keeping the streak alive: 2019 saw Pitt (21 weeks, last 1982); 2018 saw Pitt, SMU and LSU in the Playstation Fiesta Bowl (38 weeks, last 2019); 2017 saw Maryland (6 weeks, last 1955), SMU, and Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (9 weeks, last 2010); 2016 saw Michigan (36 weeks, last 2024) and Maryland.

- ◆ The redshirt senior running back posted a memorable performance in the win over N.C. A&T. He returned the opening kickoff 96 yards for a gameopening touchdown. His long sprints didn't stop there as he earned 87- and 66-yard touchdown rushes in the game, compiling 156 rushing yards on the night. The 87-yard rush tied the third longest run from scrimmage in program history.
- ◆ The kickoff return for a touchdown was the second of Nixon's career and the first by a Knight since Mike Hughes did so in the War On I-4 game of 2017, which ended up being the game winner. It was the first opening kickoff return by a Knight since 2010 when Quincy McDuffie did it at Tulane.
- ◆ Nixon compiled 252 all-purpose yards and 18 points in the 68-7 win. The last UCF player to tally over 250 all-purpose yards was wide receiver Ryan O'Keefe, who tallied 251 in the Gasparilla Bowl against Florida on Dec. 23, 2021.
- ◆ Nixon became the fourth player in UCF's FBS history to tally a kickoff return for a touchdown and an offensive score in the same game (last 2012).
- ◆ On one of his touchdown runs, UCF's dance team was waiting for the next dead-ball whistle to put on their performance in the endzone. Nixon celebrated with the awaiting dance team, and later filmed a dance on Instagram reels with the team.

- ◆ More Knights than just Jaden Nixon put on a show in UCF's 68-7 victory in week two. Tayven Jackson and Jacurri Brown each had two rushing touchdowns of their own while Stacy Gage rushed for his first career touchdown, going 23 yards.
- ◆ The Knights rushed for seven touchdowns, one shy of tying a program record for rushing touchdowns in a single game
- ◆ Nixon and Brown both surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark, the first time a pair of Knights have done that since Ryan O'Keefe and Isiah Bowser did so in the Gasparilla Bowl against Florida on Dec. 23, 2021.

- ◆ UCF scored three different ways against N.C. A&T, earning kick return, defensive and offensive touchdowns all within the first quarter.
- + This first-quarter frenzy marked a rare trifecta that UCF last accomplished in a full game on Oct. 28, 2017 against Austin Peay. Doing it all within the first quarter? That hadn't happened since Oct. 1, 2016, when Frost's first UCF squad pulled off a score in all three categories against East Carolina, although the defensive score was a safety.

- ◆ After posting the best two-year turnaround in the recent history of college football back in 2016 and 2017, the second first game of Scott Frost's UCF career resulted in a victory, beating Jacksonville State 17-10.
- ◆ The Knights' Tayven Jackson tossed a 33-yard strike to DJ Black near the endzone on 3rd and 9 with 1:03 left to play for the game-winning touchdown
- ◆ A two-hour, seven-minute weather delay paused the game with 10:45 left in the second quarter. UCF's starting quarterback Cam Fancher was injured just before the weather delay in a 0-0 game.
- ◆ The game remained scoreless into the half, just the sixth time in Big 12 history and first since Ohio and Iowa State in 2023
- ◆ In three season openers under Frost, UCF has shut out its opponent in seven of 12 possible quarters. Frost improved to 3-0 in openers as a Knight

- + UCF earned its 300th victory in program history in the season opening 17-10 win over Jacksonville State
- ◆ It took the Knights 542 games to reach the mark, making them the second-fastest of the Power 4 teams in Florida (Florida State, 479; UCF, 542; Miami, 552; Florida, 560)
- ◆ Additionally, it makes UCF the seventh-fastest to reach that mark out of members in the Big 12 Conference (Arizona, 463; Utah, 466; Colorado, 483; Arizona State, 494: West Virginia, 501; TCU, 526; UCF, 542; Kansas and Texas Tech, 547; Baylor, 560; Houston, 574; BYU, 598; Cincinnati, 604; Iowa State, 661; Oklahoma State, 673; Kansas State, 815)

DJ BLACK: D-II TO P4 TD

- ◆ DJ Black, who was on the receiving end of the game-winning touchdown to lift UCF to a 17-10 victory, earned the start in his first game in the Power 4
- + Last season, Black was a member of Limestone, a Division II program that closed the football program down last season. Black plastered his name all over the statsheet, scoring 11 touchdowns and recording 939 receiving yards.
- ◆ Offensive lineman Owen Spell was also at Limestone with Black in 2024

RETURNING TO THE AIR

- ◆ The two quarterbacks to play in UCF's opener vs. Jacksonville State totaled 314 passing yards. UCF didn't pass for over 300 yards at any point last season; the last time before 2025's opener was the third game of the 2023 season, tallying 349 vs. Villanova
- ◆ Tayven Jackson accounted for 282 passing yards vs. Jacksonville State, the second highest total of his career behind his career-best 299.

- + The opening night victory against Jacksonville State was the 10th consecutive win for the Knights in their first game of the season, a trend Frost started as UCF's head coach in 2016 with a 38-0 win over South Carolina State
- + Beyond that, UCF has now started 1-0 in 19 of the last 21 seasons and has won 21 of 31 openers since becoming an FBS program to begin the 1996 season
- → The Knights have won 16 of 19 home openers at Acrisure Bounce House, including five in a row and nine of the last 10

- → In what is technically his third year at the helm of the Knights and the first in his second stint, over half of Frost's roster is new to UCF. Officially, 63 of the 112 players on the squad will be making their debut on the roster.
- ◆ Of the 63 newcomers, 36 are transfers from other D-I institutions. Another six transfers are from football programs throughout other levels while two are former Division I basketball players and one is a former MiLB pitcher.
- ◆ A class of 18 true freshmen make up the remaining newcomers

- → With 63 new players on the roster, returning production is slim
- ◆ Four players from the 2024 squad started in six or more games, with Paul Rubelt being the lone returner to start in all 12. Just behind him was Malachi Lawrence and Nyjalik Kelly with 11 starts while Braeden Marshall had six.
- ◆ In total, 17 returners from last year's roster played in seven games or more
- → The three starters on defense who started six or more games last season account for 11.7% of tackles in 2024 (90 of 772), 22.2% of tackles for loss (18.5 of 83), 47.7% of sacks (10.5 of 22) and one of nine interceptions

THRIVING ON THURSDAYS

- ◆ UCF extended its Thursday winning streak to 11 with the win over Jacksonville State, the third-longest active streak in college football
- ◆ Two conference mates, Oklahoma State and Utah, lead the active list with 13 and 12 straight Thursday wins each, respectively, after week 1 of 2025
- ◆ Other active Thursday win streaks include Memphis with nine and Toledo and Clemson with eight each. The longest Thursday winning streak in college football history belongs to Miami (FL) at 15 which went from 1998-2008.

HE'S RACK

◆ Scott Frost's return to UCF makes him one of 16 active head coaches who coached at a school, left and returned. Frost, along with Rich Rodriguez (West Virginia) and Matt Viator (McNeese) are set to start their second term as head coach when the 2025 season kicks off. - + Last season, UCF was tied for the second-fewest touchdowns allowed in the fourth quarter in all of FBS, allowing just five offensive TDs in the fourth
- While Northern Illinois led the nation with just four fourth quarter offensive scores allowed, UCF led the Big 12 with the fewest in the category and
 was tied at five with Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, James Madison, Ole Miss and Wyoming
- ◆ A handful of other Big 12 programs were close to the Knights, as Houston and Iowa State each allowed six fourth quarter offensive scores while Cincinnati allowed seven

WATCH LISTS

- + A handful of Knights have been named to preseason watchlists throughout the fall, with Jaden Nixon leading the way with four nods
- Running back Jaden Nixon was named to four preseason watchlists: Maxwell Award (college player of the year), Paul Hornung (most versatile player in college football), Doak Walker (best running back), Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award (offensive player who exhibit the enduring characteristics that define Earl Campbell; also must either be born in Texas, attended high school in Texas or attend a college/university in Texas).
- Running back Myles Montgomery joined Nixon on the Doak Walker Award watchlist, an honor former Knight RJ Harvey and was a two-time semifinalist for
- → Paul Rubelt was tabbed to the Alistate Wuerffel Trophy watchlist, college football's premiere award for community service
- ◆ Cam Fancher and John Walker were named to the Comeback Player of the Year watchlist; Walker missed all last season while Fancher missed time late

TRIO HONORED BY PHIL STEELE

- ◆ UCF had a trio of Knights named to Phil Steele's 2025 Preseason Big 12 Teams
- A pair of Knights made their way onto the Second Team; defensive end Nyjalik Kelly earned the nod after 5.5 sacks for the Black and Gold last year while running back Jaden Nixon compiled 921 yards for Western Michigan
- → Fifth-year senior and Knight offensive lineman Paul Rubelt earned a spot on the Third Team after grading out at a 78.7% clip in pass blocking and helping the Knights finish fifth nationally in rushing offense per game

DUNNAM FIFTH-HIGHEST RATED SAFETY IN BIG 12

- ◆ UCF newcomer and defensive back Phillip Dunnam graded as the fifth highest safety in the Big 12 Conference, according to PFF College.
- → He earned a 76.6 grade. Proceeding him was TCU's Bud Clark (89.8), Houston's CJ Douglas (85.7), Utah's Tao Johnson (82.5) and Cincinnati's Antwan Peek Jr. (80.9). Dunnam checks in ahead of West Virginia's Jordan Walker (75.1), rounding out the top half-dozen safties in the Big 12.
- ♦ Last season, Dunnam suited up for Florida Atlantic, eight starts in 11 games played; he tallied 56 tackles, 2.5 of which were for a loss, and three picks

IN OUR KNIGHTED ERA

- UCF debuted new uniforms for the 2025 season and the return of head coach Scott Frost. The uniforms are a fresh blend of classic and modern elements that pay homage to multiple iconic eras in UCF football history. The numbers in particular have four different eras represented:
 - * The drop shadow on the numbers are a nod to 1998, the year UCF QB Daunte Culpepper finish top 10 in Heisman voting
 - The notches in the numbers were introduced in 2013, the year UCF QB Blake Bortles led the Knights to a Fiesta Bowl victory, they also replicate the block "Knights" wordmark in the endzones of the Bounce House.
 - + Select tones and edges were selected from UCF's "Knighted" font which was featured in the program's rise to the Big 12.
 - + The numbers on the new uniforms are bigger and bolder than the most recent version, a nod to large numbers worn from 2016-21.
- → In addition to the new number font, shoulder numbers return to UCF's uniforms from the 2016-21 versions. The shoulders keep a nod to the pegasus, the university's academic logo, by featuring an oversized pegasus wing which was first featured on UCF's 2023 Mission VII Space uniforms. The pants on the new uniforms feature three larger polaris stars, representing UCF's past, present and future. The polaris star also makes an appearance inside the numbers as the shape of the perforation in the numbers. The polaris star is also a part of the university's academic logo.

TOUCH GRASS


- Acrisure Bounce House has new grass for the first time since it opened back in 2007. This summer, Carolina Green Corp. installed TifTuf

 Bermudagrass, replacing the stadium's original field. The grass came from a sod farm in Vero Beach.

- + Phillip Dunnam's uncle is Miami Heat legend Udonis Haslem, while his cousins E.J. Biggers (cornerback) and Louis Delamas (safety) played in the NFL
- Jaden Nixon's second cousin is NFL legend Adrian Peterson. Nixon's father, Jeroid Johnson played football and ran track at Oklahoma State while his cousin LaKyron
 Mays ran for the track team there as well. Two more of Jaden's cousins, Larry and Issiah, just wrapped up their college careers on the defensive side of the ball.
- ◆ Davi Belfort's father is retired UFC and Brazilian pro boxer Vitor Belfort
- + Jayden Bellamy's father, Jay, played in the NFL for 14 seasons with the Saints and Seahawks. Jayden's sister, Brellyn (Bre), played five seasons of college basketball
- → Kam Moore's father, Ron, played in the NFL for six seasons, scoring 14 touchdowns and rushing for 2,210 yards
- ◆ Agyeman Addae's father, Jahmile Addae, currently coaches cornerbacks for the Buffalo Bills
- Jabari Brooks' father, Willie Kelly, played fullback at Auburn from 1988-92, wining SEC titles in 1988 and 1989. His borthers Karekin (RB at Penn), Kelly (EDGE at Mercer) and Djimon (DL at Georgia Tech) all recently wrapped up their college careers
- → Zack Palmer's father, Mike, also played football at UCF, suiting up as a linebacker from 1995-98
- ◆ Brothers Carson and Chase Hinshaw are both rostered as wide receivers on this years roster; nephew of former UCF OC Darin Hinshaw

REMEMBERING COACH CLARK



The UCF Athletics community is deeply saddened to announce the passing of offensive line coach Shawn Clark.

Coach Clark, 50, passed away the evening of Sept. 21 at a local hospital unexpectedly, with his wife, Jonelle, by his side. He was admitted on Tuesday, Sept. 9, after experiencing a medical emergency and remained in stable condition before passing away last night.

"Shawn was so much more than a coach. He was a remarkable man, husband, and father who cared deeply about his players and staff," said UCF head coach Scott Frost. "The reaction of our players and coaches to the news this morning is a testament to Shawn's character and the impact he had on every life that he touched. He was loved. Our thoughts and prayers are with his wife, Jonelle, and children, Giana and Braxton. We are here to support them and will continue to keep them in our hearts and prayers."

A veteran coach with more than two decades of experience, Coach Clark joined UCF in December 2024 following a successful tenure as head coach at Appalachian State, where he compiled a 40-24 record across five seasons. His App State tenure was highlighted by a 10-win season in 2021 and three bowl wins. Coach Clark's teams earned multiple Sun Belt East Division titles and developed some of the nation's top offensive line units, with his 2018 and 2019 groups ranked among the best in the country.

"We are heartbroken by Shawn's passing," said UCF Vice President and Director of Athletics Terry Mohajir. "He brought passion, integrity, and a genuine love for people to everything he did. Shawn will be remembered not only for his impact on the game of football, but also for the relationships he built and the example he set as a husband and father. Our deepest condolences go out to his wife and children during this difficult time."

As a player, Clark was a two-time All-American and three-time all-conference selection on the offensive line at App State, where the Mountaineers posted a 45-16 record during his career. He later built his coaching résumé with roles at Eastern Kentucky, Purdue, Kent State, and App State, where he guided multiple All-Americans and NFL draft picks.


Clark graduated from App State with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 1998 and earned a master's in education from Louisville in 2003.

◆ Two members of Tyreek'e Robinson's family, Sam Shields and Demarcus Christmas, were drafted into the NFL

- ◆ According to a preseason release by Brett McMurphy of On3, UCF was listed as the No. 12 most underrated team by the AP poll since 2014, comparing the Associated Press' preseason Top 25 rankings with the AP's final rankings each season.
- ◆ Eight Big 12 Conference teams made the list of underrated teams, with BYU at No. 1, TCU at No. 4, Cincinnati at No. 6, Arizona State at No. 9, UCF at No. 12, Houston at No. 16, Oklahoma State at No. 17 and Arizona at No. 19
- ◆ On the flip side, UCF will face a non-conference opponent this seaosn on the top 25 most overrated teams list as North Carolina checks in at No. 12. Also on the most overrated list is Utah at No. 18, Iowa State at No. 23 and Kansas State at No. 24.

- → Since it's inception in 1995, Conference USA has seen 33 FBS porgrams have played in or are currently a part of the league, equalling 24.3% of the FBS teams. UCF was one of those teams, joining the league in 2005 before playing its final season in the league in 2012.
- → The Black and Gold won two conference championships while members of CUSA, doing so in 2007 and 2010. The Knights finished first or tied for first in the East Division four times while members (2005, 2007, 2010, 2012).
- → Jacksonville State is the most recent champion of Conference USA, winning the 2024 title after joining the league in 2023.
- ◆ Other teams that have come from Conference USA that are on UCF's 2025 schedule include Cincinnati and Houston

- ◆ Fourteen members of this year's UCF squad are making the jump to the FBS level this season
- ◆ The Knights have eight players who are new to a Division I roster and an additional six that make the jump to FBS from FCS
- → The eight Knights that are making the jump to Division I this season are: DJ Black (Limestone DII / South Carolina), Dominick Campbell (Howard and Notre Dame men's basketball). Anthony Coaxum (W.V. Weslevan/Kentucky Christian/Carson-Newman) Dallan "Deebo" Coleman (UCF and Georgia Tech men's basketball), Mason Denaburg (Milb, Washington Nationals organization), Laparka Langston (NW Mississippi - NJCAA), Justin Royes (Virginia Union - DII), Owen Spell (Limestone - DII / Madonna)
- ◆ Additionally, six Knights make their jump from FCS to FBS in the 2025 season: Jabari Brooks (Samford), Chris Domercant (Chattanooga / Stonehill), Cole Kozlowski (Colgate), Jeffson Lafontant (Bethune-Cookman), Connor Meadows (Tennessee State / Tennessee), Isaiah Reed (Brown)

MULTI-SPORT ATHLETES

- + Plenty of Knights on this year's roster were multi-sport athletes in high school, but a few have gone on to play multiple sports at some high levels
- Punter Mason Denaburg recently traded in a baseball for a football after pitching in the Washington Nationals minor league orgainzation after being a first round selection in the 2018 MLB draft. He appeared in 88 games across rookie ball to High-A, punching out 139 batters in the process.
- → Tight end Dallan "Deebo" Coleman dons the Black and Gold for a second straight season, just on a diferent playing surface. After playing basketball at Georgia Tech for the first three seasons of his college career, Coleman transferred to UCF, helping the Knights reach the College Basketball Crown championship game. He averaged 6.7 points per game over his career, shooting 33.6% from the three-point line.
- ◆ Offensive lineman Dominick Campbell also transitions from the hardwood to the gridiron, playing basketball at Notre Dame his freshman year before spending the last two seasons with Howard. He averaged 5.8 points and 3.7 rebounds per game while shooting 49.7% from the floor.

- ◆ The Knights have a chance to add two new nations to the all-time letterwinners list this season, welcoming Aymeric Koumba of France and Davi Belfort of Brazil
- ♦ Both players transferred in this season, as Koumba joins UCF from Michigan and Belfort from Virginia Tech
- ◆ Overall, UCF has six different nations represented on this year's roster: United States, France, Brazil, Italy, Canada and Germany

- + For the fifth consecutive season and the sixth time since 2019, UCF has sold out of its football season tickets allotment
- ◆ The lone season that separated the streak was due to a COVID-19 affected 2020 season
- ◆ With the sell out of season tickets, UCF is excited to reintroduce the Bounce Pass. The Bounce Pass is the most unique way to experience UCF Football allowing you to bounce around the stadium to take in gameday from different areas of Acrisure Bounce House

- ◆ 2025 marks the 30th season of Big 12 Football, which held its inaugural season in 1996
- ◆ UCF's win over North Carolina helped the Big 12 improve to 6-1 against ACC opponents this season as non-conference play concludes
- ◆ The Big 12 has eight wins versus Power Four opponents, which ties the 2002 season as the most non-conference wins against major conference opponents in league history.
- ◆ Big 12 QB Club: The Big 12 has nine teams that return quarterbacks who threw for 2,400 yards or more last season, nearly twice the total of any other Power 4 conference. The Conference also bolstered its QB class with talented newcomers.
- ◆ The Big 12 will create excitement again this season after the Conference led the nation in 2024 in fourth-guarter lead changes and go-ahead scores in the final minute of conference games
- ◆ The Big 12 Conference will publicly provide player availability reports for all Conference games this season

THE SPACE GAME BACKGROUND

- ◆ The UCF Space Game has been played annually since the 2017 season and the Knights are 8-1 all-time in space games following its first loss in the celestial celebration, falling 30-27 Houston this season.
- ◆ The game recognizes the Ūniversity of Central Florida's roots, founded as Florida Technological University in 1963 with the mission of providing personnel to support the growing U.S. space program at the Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. As the academic scope expanded beyond its original focus on engineering and technology, the school was renamed the University of Central Florida in 1978.
- → This year's Space Game theme is Mission IX: Hyperspace with the tagline Citius Est Futurum, meaning the future is faster. The UCF HyperSpace Center, in partnership with the U.S. Air Force, stands on the forefront of hypersonics and space propulsion research. This technology allows for air travel at speeds of Mach 6 to 17, meaning six to 17 times the speed of sound, or more than 4,600 to 13,000 mph; it means going from New York to London in less than 15 minutes. Far beyond science fiction, a team of 40 UCF undergraduates and 25 graduate students, led by Professor Kareem Ahmed, are turning theory into reality. Hypersonic technology holds promise for opening up the boundaries of space exploration, changing our perceptions of the impossible.





Scott FROST

Head Coach / First Season, Third Season Overall at UCF

After an unforgettable two-year run that saw the UCF football program rise to national prominence, Scott Frost is coming back home.

Known for sparking the "Charge On" spirit and guiding UCF to its first perfect season, Frost was re-introduced as the program's next head coach by UCF Vice President and Director of Athletics Terry Mohajir on Dec. 8, 2024.

Frost originally served as UCF's head coach from 2016 to 2017, culminating in a historic 13-0 season, an AAC championship and a national championship that captured the nation's attention. In his final game, Frost guided UCF to a victory over No. 7 Auburn in the 2018 Peach Bowl, securing the program's first undefeated season in school history.

Frost posted the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history at UCF, inheriting a 0-12 team in 2015 and taking the Knights to a perfect season in his second and final year, when he was named the national coach of the year.

"I'm deeply honored to return to UCF, a school that has always held a special place in my heart," Frost said. "The foundation we built here has only grown stronger, and I am thrilled to continue shaping this program's legacy. As we prepare for year three in the Big 12 Conference I look forward to working alongside our dedicated student-athletes, talented staff, and passionate fans to reach new heights together."

Frost went a combined 19-7 in two seasons at UCF, helping turn an 0-12 team into a 13-0 squad in just two years. In Frost's first season, he took the Knights to a bowl game and finished with a 6-7 record. The turnaround was historic, as Frost became the only first-year coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season. UCF led the nation with a six-win improvement in 2016 and exceeded that mark in 2017 as the nation's only undefeated team. The Knights put together the first undefeated regular season in UCF and AAC history in 2017, posted the longest winning streak in school history at the time of his departure (13 games), achieved the highest in-season ranking in program history (10th), highest final ranking (6th) and set an AAC record with 16 all-conference selections.

UCF was led by its high-powered offense and improved defense under Frost. The Knights led the nation in scoring at 48.2 points per game and were the only FBS team to score at least 30 points in every game in 2017. Defensively, UCF improved its scoring defense by 65 spots in Frost's two seasons.

In addition to being the unanimous choice as the 2017 AAC Coach of the Year, Frost was honored as the national coach of the year by the Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association, the Touchdown Club of Columbus, the Lombardi Award and FCA in addition to winning the Home Depot, Paul "Bear" Bryant and Eddie Robinson coach-of-the-year awards.

Frost began his coaching career at Northern Iowa in 2007 as a linebackers coach and was promoted to co-defensive coordinator in 2008. That season, his defense excelled, tying for third in the FCS with 40 takeaways and ranking ninth in scoring defense, allowing just 17.7 points per game. The 12-3 Panthers also led the Missouri Valley Football Conference in both rushing defense (107.1 yards per game) and scoring defense.

In 2009, Frost joined the Oregon coaching staff as the wide receivers coach under head coach Chip Kelly and offensive coordinator Mark Helfrich. Frost helped Oregon post a 79-14 record in his seven seasons, during which time the Ducks won four conference titles and twice played for the national championship.

Oregon never ranked lower than eighth nationally in scoring offense during Frost's seven seasons on staff, and the Ducks led the nation in scoring in 2010. Frost was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2013, and Oregon ranked in the top five nationally in both scoring and total offense each of his three seasons calling plays. The Ducks scored 681 points in 2014, the second-highest total in NCAA history. Oregon made it to the College Football Playoff Championship Game that year, when Frost was one of five finalists for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the nation's top assistant. Frost's quarterback, Marcus Mariota, won the Heisman Trophy and was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2015 NFL Draft.

After Kelly left for the Philadelphia Eagles, Oregon promoted Mark Helfrich to head coach and named Frost offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2013. In this role, Frost guided Marcus Mariota to a Heisman Trophy win and a berth in the national championship game. During Frost's tenure as offensive coordinator, Oregon recorded a 33–8 record and consistently ranked among the nation's top teams in scoring and total offense. His standout performance in 2014 earned him a finalist spot for the prestigious Broyles Award, recognizing the nation's top assistant coach.

Following his two years at UCF, Scott Frost served as the head football coach at the University of Nebraska for four-plus seasons from 2018 to 2022, coaching the first three games of the 2022 season. Frost posted a 16-31 record with the Cornhuskers. His tenure was defined by close losses, as 23 of his 31 losses were by single digits, including each of his final 13. Nebraska lost 22 one-score games during Frost's career, including 12 games by five or fewer points.

Last season, Frost had been serving as a coaching consultant for Sean McVay and the Los Angeles Rams.



ACRISURE BOUNCE HOUSE



The crown jewel in UCF's impressive Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village, Acrisure Bounce House, opened in 2007. The campus facility gives the Knights one of the top venues in the southeast. After spending their previous 28 seasons at the Florida Citrus Bowl (now known as Camping World Stadium) in downtown Orlando, the Knights made their debut in the new on-campus facility on Sept. 15, 2007 against the Texas Longhorns. A capacity crowd was on hand for the game, which was televised live nationally on ESPN2.

In its inaugural campaign at the stadium, UCF completed the season with six-straight wins at home, including a 44-25 victory over Tulsa in the Conference USA Championship game. When UCF hosted Miami on Oct. 17, 2009, a facility-record 48,453 fans were on hand for the contest.

Located on the modern north side of campus, the stadium features luxury boxes, a large club lounge and a natural grass playing surface.

In the summer of 2015, the stadium enjoyed its first major renovation with the addition of the Carl Black and Gold Cabana. This is premium area inside Acrisure Bounce House became one of the signatures of the UCF game-day experience. The Cabana is a 10,000-square-foot, Florida-themed social area and lounge located between the 30-yard lines. The section was expanded prior to the 2017 campaign with 2,921 chair-back seats and features open-air sun deck to enjoy the game.

Two more premium areas were added for 2017. Eight field-level cabanas were added at the south end zone with access to the enclosed air conditioned J and J Rosengren Lounge. The concourse between sections 108-113 was converted into the Stadium Club. This premium area on the popular west side of the stadium, provides access to dedicated food and drink options, as well as plenty of other amenities.

Just in time for the 2016 season, the video board was upgraded to a 114 by 36 feet LED display. It features a Daktronics 15MM HD pixel layout for excellent image clarity. The display also has variable content zoning, allowing it to show one large image or be divided into multiple windows to show any variety of live video, instant replays, statistics, scoring, graphics, animations and sponsorship messages.

The addition of a ribbon display to the south end zone was unveiled in 2017. This display measures more than seven feet high by 199 feet wide.

Acrisure Bounce House has new grass for the first time since it opened back in 2007. This summer, Carolina Green Corp. installed TifTuf ® Bermudagrass, replacing the stadium's original field. The grass came from a sod farm in Vero Beach.

Acrisure Bounce House is enduring its largest renovation in years as Roth Tower is set to be expanded with a completion date of Fall 2026. Currently home to suites, the press box and more, the new Roth Tower will enhance the gameday experience and serve as a premier event space in east Orange County.

The existing tower and club spaces will remain operational for the 2025 season. The north and south expansion structure and roof will take shape around existing tower while the west expansion foundations and columns will be in place. At the conclusion of the 2025 season the existing tower will cease operations to complete remaining structure and interior buildout

The tower will increase premium capacity, expand suite offerings, and provide unique event opportunities year-round, attracting more fans, visitors and events to the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village beyond game days.

The Tower is Go for Launch in Fall of 2026. The new Roth Tower will see a 256% increase in square footage of useable club space for gameday and non-gameday events (4,400 SF to 15,650 SF). It will also include loge seating, 42% more club seats, 28 luxury suites that are 38% larger in size than current suites and 34 new outdoor sky suites. The new tower will include four levels and will provide substanially more shade across the stadium bowl.

Knights Earn 300th Program Win with a Triumph over Jacksonville State

ORLANDO - In a game that stretched across more than five hours, two quarterbacks, and a two-hour, seven-minute weather delay, the Knights defeated a determined Jacksonville State squad to open the second Scott Frost era with a gutsy 17-10 victory Thursday night at Acrisure Bounce House.

UCF leaned on depth and timely execution to grind out its first win of the season and give Frost a successful return to the program. The Knights totaled 422 yards of offense and held Jacksonville State to 322, making key plays on both sides of the ball when it mattered most.

UCF quarterback Tayven Jackson, stepping in early in the second quarter after starter Cam Fancher exited with an injury following the weather delay, delivered an efficient and composed performance. He completed 17 of 24 passes for 282 yards and two touchdowns, providing the offense with rhythm and stability in his first action as a member of the Black and Gold.

"I'm happy that we got out of it and that we got out of it with a win. That's all that mattered, a win is a win." -Tayven Jackson

Running back Myles Montgomery was a consistent force throughout the night, totaling 150 yards with 79 rushing yards on 21 carries while adding 71 through the air on three catches. His ability to extend drives and break off chunk plays helped UCF stay in control of the possession for most of the game.

After both teams traded early field goals, Jacksonville State found the end zone for the first time on a 10-yard rush by Andrew Paul with 12:01 left in the game.

UCF immediately responded, however, when Jackson connected with Dylan Wade on a 40-yard catch-and-run touchdown pass in with 9:30 left to tie the game at 10-10. Jackson found Wade all alone over the middle after sneaking out from his tight end position and darted down the right side for UCF's first TD of the season.

Then with just under two minutes to go and JSU driving into UCF territory, defensive back Jayden Williams stuffed Gamecock's running back Cam Cook on a fourth-down, hurry-up play to turn the ball over on downs to the Knights.

"Jayden got a game ball," Frost said. "He's one of a number of new guys around here, but he's played a lot of football and is very savvy. When they handed it off it looked liked they dented our line a little and I thought it was a first down ... but he just shot in there and knifed and that was probably the biggest play of the game."

Then, starting at their own 36-yard line, UCF marched 64 yards in six plays to take the lead late and seal the win. After two incompletions, Jackson took off on a 15-yard scramble on third down to the JSU 34-yard line. Then, when many thought UCF would play it safe and inch closer for a go-ahead field goal on 3rd and 9, Jackson hit wide receiver DJ Black on a naked bootleg in stride over the middle for a 33-yard score and the lead with just over a minute remaining.

"We were sitting there and kinda said, "let's win this thing," Frost said. "I think a lot of people were probably expecting us to call something and kick a field goal. But we still had a couple bullets in the chamber, and we hit one."


"It was a great play call by Coach Frost," Black said. "The offensive line held up real well. D Wade made a good block on the edge and Tayven threw me a great ball and it landed right in the pocket."

The UCF defense held strong the rest of the way, limiting big plays and forcing a key fourth-down stop late in the fourth quarter.

The win marked the 300th in program history and extended UCF's streak to 10 straight opening game victories. It also marked the Knights' 11th consecutive Thursday night win, the third most such wins in all of FBS history.

Frost's season-opening win was his 20th career victory with the Knights and extended his winning streak to 14 games in Black and Gold.

Nixon's Historic Knight Leads to UCF 68-7 Victory Over N.C. A&T

ORLANDO - An hour and twelve minutes of stormy suspense delayed Saturday evening's kickoff, but when the skies finally cleared, Jaden Nixon wasted no time reigniting head coach Scott Frost's signature #UCFast philosophy to take down North Carolina A&T in a convincing 68-7 win.

"We've been talking to him, as fast as he is, he just needs to run through the smoke." - Head Coach Scott Frost on Jaden Nixon's performance

And Nixon delivered exactly that, blazing 96 yards on the game's opening kickoff, to become the first player in over a decade to take it back to the house from play one. The last player to manage that feat was Quincy McDuffie, who took one 95 yards to the end zone against Tulane on Nov. 20, 2010. Some may also remember a similar spark from Mike Hughes in 2017, the last player to score on a kickoff of any kind until tonight, which helped catapult that magical 2017 season

The offense didn't miss a beat after Nixon's burst. Quarterback Tayven Jackson orchestrated back-to-back touchdown drives, each under three minutes, and capped both with rushing scores—his first career multi-rushing touchdown performance

From the defensive end of the ball, UCF struck late in the first quarter. Edge rusher Nyjalik Kelly recorded a strip-sack, and redshirt sophomore Rodney Lora capitalized, scooping up the loose ball in the end zone for his first career touchdown.

This first-quarter frenzy marked a rare trifecta of touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams. UCF last accomplished that in a full game on October 28, 2017, against Austin Peay. Doing it all within the first quarter? That hadn't happened since October 1, 2016, when Frost's first UCF squad pulled off a score in all three categories against East Carolina, although the defensive score was a safety.

From that moment on, the Knights never looked back. They held the Aggies scoreless until the final three minutes of regulation, when A&T finally broke through for its lone touchdown of the night.

As for Nixon, he cleared the smoke and made the night one for the history books, becoming the first player in UCF's FBS era to record both a kickoff return and a rushing touchdown in the same game—and just the fourth to combine a kickoff return score with any type of offensive touchdown.


His second of three touchdowns was an 87-yard sprint that tied for the third-longest run from scrimmage in program history, further cementing his breakout performance. In all, Nixon touched the ball five times on the night and registered three scores. He tallied 156 yards on the ground on four carries, while housing his lone kickoff return for 96 yards.

"What I did all week was go at it hard, just taking cuts and making hits that I haven't been really making as much as I used to. Coach Frost pushed me all week, and I feel like that's what really motivated me to go out here and play the game I did " . Laden Niyan

UCF chalked up 560 yards on offense, averaging exactly a first down on each play, finishing the contest with 10 yards per offensive snap. The entire offense was humming throughout the night, as Jacurri Brown secured a pair of touchdowns of his own while Stacy Gage closed out UCF's tab for the night, earning his first career score on a 23-yard scamper.

In addition to the strip stack for a score, Jayden McDonald snagged an interception while Antione Jackson recovered a fumble, resulting in three takeaways, securing an all-around team victory.

UCF Improves to 3–0 with 34–9 Victory Over North Carolina

ORLANDO – In a game defined by control and execution, UCF's steady offense and disruptive defense turned a much-anticipated showdown into a 34-9 statement win over North Carolina Saturday at Acrisure Bounce House in front of a sellout crowd and nationally-televised audience on FOX.

The win moves UCF to 3-0 on the young season heading into their Big 12 opener next Saturday at Kansas State.

"I just have fun coaching here. There's pressure like anywhere else, but it's not the same. It allows me to be better because I can be free to care about the athletes and try to put them in the best position to be successful." - Scott Frost, UCF Football Head Coach

Quarterback Tayven Jackson delivered a stellar performance, setting two personal bests. The redshirt junior steadied the offense while completing an efficient 25 of 32 passes for 223 yards. His 25 completions marked a new career high while also leading the team in rushing with a career-high 66 yards on the ground.

The Knights wasted no time setting the tone, continuing their trend of opening-drive excellence. Jackson orchestrated a 13-play, 75-yard march, accounting for 67 yards himself and finishing it off with a 13-yard rushing touchdown. It marked the second straight game the Black and Gold reached the end zone on their first possession.

On UNC's opening drive, defensive tackle Horace Lockett swatted a pass from quarterback Gio Lopez at the line of scrimmage, and the deflection hung in the air just long enough for senior edge rusher Nyjalik Kelly to snag it one-handed, giving the Knights an early takeaway that led to a field goal. UCF's defense has now held opponents scoreless on their opening possession in all three games this season.

"The play was caught, Horace Lockett was great with the pressure, slapped it and it just landed in my hands. I knew I had to catch it for a big play to get the offense back on the field to possibly get points." - Nyjalik Kelly, EDGE

The interception marked Kelly's first career pick and set up kicker Noe Ruelas, who converted a 36-yard field goal to match his season long. Minutes later, he topped that with a 41-yarder, pushing the Knights' lead to 13-0.

The defense remained dominant in the opening half, keeping the Tar Heels out of UCF territory until just 7:30 remained in the second quarter. When UNC finally threatened, advancing to the Knights' 12-yard line, the secondary held firm. Defensive back Braeden Marshall intercepted a tipped pass by Jayden Bellamy, his first of the season, to deny the Tar Heels again

UCF capitalized quickly. Just over a minute later, Jackson, who hit nine different receivers on the night, connected with sophomore Kylan Fox for a 17-yard touchdown — the first of Fox's collegiate career. The 83-yard drive, aided by timely Tar Heel penalties, capped a 1:04 burst and sent the Knights into halftime with a commanding 20-3 lead.

And the Knights stayed sharp after the break. Running back Myles Montgomery powered in his first touchdown of the season from close range, stretching the margin to 27-3.

The defense held strong well into the second half, maintaining its streak of not allowing a first-half touchdown this season. North Carolina finally broke through with 1:06 left in the third quarter, their lone touchdown on the afternoon.


UCF answered one last time by closing the game with its most impressive possession of the year when Jaden Nixon capped an 18-play, 93-yard drive — the Knights' longest of the season — with a touchdown that consumed 10 minutes and 26 seconds, sealing the 34-9 victory.

The win marks the third straight season UCF has opened 3-0 under Head Coach Scott Frost. The victory also extends Frost's winning streak at UCF to 16 consecutive games, a run that ranks among the longest active streaks in college football.

Knight Nation, donning their black and gold, packed the stands to support the Hometown Team as tonight's attendance marked a sellout crowd of 44,206. The last sellout was last season's match up against Colorado with an attendance of 45,702.

UCF Football Falls at Kansas State in Big 12 Opener

MANHATTAN, Kan. - UCF football dropped its first conference game of the season after losing to Kansas State, 34-20, at Bill Snyder Family Stadium Saturday afternoon.

Entering the game as one of the nation's top pass defenses, UCF (3-1, 0-1 Big 12) tallied 402 yards of total offense but had three turnovers and six penalties, which proved to be the difference. Kansas State (2-3, 1-1) compiled 434 yards with 168 through the air and 266 on the ground, while going four-for-four on red zone attempts.

"I don't think this team will ever give up... You've got to go through some success and some hard stuff to come together as a group. And there's no doubt now that this team has been through some tough things, but I think because of that, we can only get better." - Head Coach Scott Frost

UCF's defense came out strong with Demari Henderson intercepting a Kansas State pass on the opening drive, marking his fourth career interception and first since the 2023 Gasparilla Bowl against Georgia Tech. Henderson's snag marked the Knights' first interception on an opponent's opening possession since former Knight, Deshawn Pace, picked off Shedeur Sanders on the third play of the game against Colorado on September 28, 2024.

The stop was part of a continued first-quarter trend, as UCF has now held opponents to just 210 total yards and zero points across all four opening quarters this season. The Wildcats wouldn't be deterred that easily, though, as running back Joe Jackson would find the end zone late in the second quarter to take the first touchdown off UCF's defense in a first half this season

With Tayven Jackson going down early in the second quarter, Jacurri Brown entered at quarterback for the Black and Gold. Despite throwing an interception on his first pass of the game, Brown would shift offensive momentum back around quickly, connecting with DJ Black for an impressive 82-yard touchdown to put the Knights on the board.


The play marked career-longs for both players (pass and reception) and was good enough to take the spot of the eighth-longest reception in program history. It was also the first 75+ yard touchdown catch by a Knight since November 11, 2023, and the longest scoring grab for the program since Javon Baker's touchdown against Oklahoma State on October 21, 2023. K-State managed to sneak in one more touchdown with under a minute remaining in the first half, extending their lead to 17–7 at the break.

The Wildcats maintained control coming out of the locker room, despite Noe Ruelas jumpstarting the Knights' second-half scoring with a field goal. The 55-yard field goal, just a yard short of his career-long set during his freshman year, marks the longest for a Knight since Colton Boomer's 55-yarder on Sept. 9, 2023, and ties for the third longest in program history.


Although the Wildcats stretched their lead to as much as three touchdowns, the Black and Gold continued to push back. With Jackson reentering the game for the Knights, the offense found some strength as Jaden Nixon ran 54 yards to close out the third with a touchdown. The play marked Nixon's third 50-plus yard run of the season, with all three of them culminating in touchdowns.

Myles Montgomery was a highlight in the Black and Gold's offensive performance of the day as well, tallying 119 rushing yards, his first 100-plus yard rushing game as a Knight. His 45-yard drive to open the second half also marks a UCF career best for the senior.


While defensive efforts got the Knights the ball back for multiple fourth-quarter possessions, the Wildcats were able to fend off the late surge and claim victory after an interception with just over two minutes left on the clock.

UCF Football Comes Up Short Against Kansas, 27–20

ORLANDO - Despite outgaining, outrushing and outpassing the Kansas Jayhawks (4-2, 2-1 Big 12) in the first half, the UCF Knights (3-2, 0-2) were ultimately overtaken by a second-half surge, falling 27–20 in their first Big 12 home matchup Saturday night at Acrisure Bounce House.

Although the Knights outgained the Jayhawks 375 to 356 yards and racked up nearly 200 rushing yards, six costly penalties, including three in the final quarter, proved to be their Achilles' heel as Kansas capitalized on every opportunity, going a perfect 4-for-4 in the red zone.

"This team is good enough to win some of these games, and we just have to be much better in all phases, and more consistent" - Head Coach Scott Frost

A familiar UCF defense took the field first, with Cole Kozlowski tallying his first sack of the fall on the game's opening drive. Once again, the Knights kept their foe scoreless in the first quarter of play despite Kansas entering the game as one of the top first-quarter offenses in FBS, tallying 63 points across this season's first quarters. The Knights are one of only three teams to boast this stat, making them one of the top quarter-one defenses in the FBS.

UCF struck first midway through the opening quarter, as Myles Montgomery found a seam up the middle and sprinted into the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown. Montgomery kept the momentum rolling early in the second quarter, finding the end zone again at the top of the second quarter to bring his touchdown tally to two on the night and give the Black and Gold an early 14-0 lead.

Montgomery, fresh off a career-high 119 rushing yards in last week's battle against Kansas State, picked up right where he left off, powering his way to 110 yards on the ground and blowing by the 100-yard mark once again. The performance sealed a career milestone for the senior: back-to-back 100+ yard rushing games for the first time in his collegiate tenure.

The Jayhawks looked to gain ground on the Knights midway through the second, capping a nine-play, 75-yard drive to get on the board. Coming out of the two-minute timeout, Kansas kept the momentum alive, punching it in from four yards out to pull within striking distance at 17-14. Just before the break, Noe Ruelas delivered a timely 38-yard field goal, giving the Knights a six-point cushion heading into halftime.

Struggling to find rhythm coming out of the break, the Knights allowed back-to-back scoring drives from the Jayhawks, both resulting in field goals that tied the game at 20 with just four minutes remaining in the third quarter. Moments later, a costly fumble by Tayven Jackson on UCF's own seven-yard line handed Kansas the opportunity they needed to seize control late in the third. 27-20.


Stepping in at quarterback late in the third quarter, Cam Fancher delivered the spark the Knights needed, opening the final period with back-to-back first downs to ignite the offense. However, consecutive penalties stalled the drive, forcing UCF to give up possession once again. Fancher would not be deterred long, though, launching a deep 18-yard strike down the left side to Waden Charles for a crucial first down late in the fourth.

"The motto is when you get the ball, you do something with it. That's my game, when I get the ball, I'm going to get the yards. And when other receivers get their chance, they do as well." - Duane Thomas Jr.


The drive pushed the Knights all the way to the one-yard line, setting the stage for a potential game-tying score. But in a heartbreaking finish, the Black and Gold came up just short, allowing Kansas to escape with a 27-20 victory.

UCF Football Drops Road Tilt at Cincinnati, 20-11

CINCINNATI, Ohio – Redshirt senior quarterback Cam Fancher impressed in his squad's rushing efforts, but the UCF football team was bested by the Cincinnati Bearcats, 20-11, at Nippert Stadium Saturday.

Fancher, making his first start since the Knights' 2025 season debut against Jacksonville State Aug. 28, spearheaded the Black and Gold's attack on the ground, producing a game-high 108 rushing yards and his team's lone touchdown on 20 tries.

The quarterback on three occasions picked up at least 10 yards on an attempt and recorded the highest singlegame rushing output by a UCF signal-caller this fall, besting Jacurri Brown's 106 ground yards against N.C. A&T Sept. 6. His 108 yards marked his highest single-game rushing total since he also accrued 108 with Florida Atlantic against UTSA Oct. 19. 2024.

Penalties stalled the Knights' progress throughout the afternoon, though, as the team was flagged 10 times for 75 total yards in the contest and mustered only a Noe Ruelas field goal through the first three quarters.

Despite UCF's offensive struggles, defensive coordinator Alex Grinch's unit produced another encouraging display, limiting Cincinnati to just 115 total rushing yards, well below its season average of 205.2 per game. None of the Bearcats' three rushers eclipsed 50 yards on the afternoon.


Cincinnati's 20 points also represented a departure from the norm for the second highest-scoring offense in the Big 12 (39.2 per game) thus far, as it was limited to 20 or fewer points for just the second time in its first six games this season.

Senior Phillip Dunnam led the way defensively with a team-high seven tackles and was joined by Nyjalik Kelly and Lewis Carter, both of whom recorded six to help hold the Bearcats to their second fewest total yards in a game this season (306).

UCF finally found its way into the end zone on its penultimate drive of the day, a 19-play, 90-yard march that was highlighted by a 4th and 12 conversion via a tipped pass from Fancher that was ultimately caught by junior tight end Dylan Wade, after Fancher narrowly escaped a would-be drive-ending sack.

After a defensive pass interference flag in the red zone on another 4th down attempt once again extended UCF's drive, Fancher scored his first UCF touchdown with a three-yard scamper into the end zone. A subsequent pass attempt to Chris Domercant on the two-point try was completed to punctuate the Black and Gold's offensive exploits.

Football Earns First Big 12 Win of 2025 Over West Virginia, 45-13

ORLANDO - Powered by dominance on both sides of the ball, UCF cruised past West Virginia 45-13 Saturday afternoon at Acrisure Bounce House, securing its first Big 12 victory of the season and the program's first win over the Mountaineers.

After leading by only seven at the half, UCF took command with three touchdowns in the third quarter, two on offense and one by the defense, who forced two turnovers on the day.

Tayven Jackson earned the start at quarterback for the Knights, completing 23 of 34 passes for 277 yards and two touchdowns while connecting with 10 different receivers. In total, the Knights racked up 578 yards of total offense, while recording nine passing plays of at least 15 yards, and six rushes of at least 10 yards.

The Knights wasted no time setting the tone. On the opening drive, Jackson connected with redshirt senior Chris Domercant for a 40-yard touchdown on fourth down, marking the Black and Gold's fourth opening-drive score of the season. The play capped a 97-yard march, UCF's longest scoring drive of the year.

Jackson and Domercant struck again later in the first quarter, hauling in a 34-yard touchdown pass from Jackson, again on fourth down. It marked Domercant's fourth career multi-touchdown game and his first at the FBS level, with both scores coming on fourth-down conversions. With the explosive start, Domercant became the first UCF receiver to record two touchdowns in a single quarter since Ryan O'Keefe did so against Temple on October 13, 2022.

West Virginia responded with a six-yard rushing touchdown in the first minute of the second quarter, trimming the lead to 14–7. The Mountaineers attempted to narrow the gap with a 44-yard field goal to end the half, but the kick was no good.

"I think we just talked about how well we played... we have to be able to line up, run the ball and get a yard, and that's something we'll certainly continue to look at over the bye week. Other than the short yardage, you're not going to hit on everything, but we executed at a higher rate today than we have and made some big plays, and that's the ingredient that's been missing." - Head Coach Scott Frost on halftime conversations

Running back Jaden Nixon added to the offensive efforts in the third quarter, punching in his fifth rushing touchdown of the season from 12 yards out. Minutes later, he broke free for an electrifying 83-yard score, finishing the day with 116 rushing yards on just seven carries.

Nixon's performance marked his 20th career rushing touchdown and sixth as a Knight. It was also the fourth time this season he's recorded a rush of at least 50 yards, with each resulting in a touchdown.

UCF's defense continued to shine, building on a growing reputation for clutch plays. With the Knights leading 21-7 in the third quarter, linebacker Keli Lawson scooped up a fumble forced by Nyjalik Kelly and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown, serving as Lawson's second career score and first since 2022. The forced fumble was the fifth of Kelly's career and his second this season.

The Knights held West Virginia to just 210 total yards, forced two fumbles and racked up seven sacks. The high volume of sacks marks the most in a game in almost two decades in a win in similar fashion at 47–13 over Marshall on November 3, 2007. Linebacker Cole Kozlowski led the defensive effort with 11 tackles and a sack, while Kelly added eight tackles and another sack.

"I know we were counted out early but we still have a lot of year left, a lot of the season left. We are still in the process of showing the world what we have to offer, but I hope this was a step in the right direction." - Keli Lawson


In the fourth quarter, kicker Noe Ruelas drilled a 51-yard field goal, marking his fifth career successful kick from 50+ yards. Freshman quarterback Davi Belfort capped the scoring with a 10-yard touchdown run late in the game, the first of his collegiate career.

West Virginia added a late touchdown from Diore Hubbard with under two minutes remaining.

With today's win, the Knights earned their first win in October since 2022 as well as their first homecoming win since 2023.

Football Falls to Baylor on the Road, 30-3

WACO, Texas – The Knights were unable to overcome a fast start from Baylor and costly penalties, falling 30-3 to the Bears on the road Saturday afternoon at McLane Stadium.

Eight recievers got a piece of the ball including wide receiver Duane Thomas Jr., who led the team with 77 receiving yards on eight receptions. Tight end Dylan Wade added 34 yards of his own, while running back Myles Montgomery led the rushers with 50 yards and followed Wade and Thomas with 23 yards from catches.

UCF's lone score came at the end of the first half, when kicker Noe Ruelas drilled a 45-yard field goal after a crucial defensive play, marking his 11th straight. EDGE Malachi Lawrence recorded a strip sack of Baylor quarterback Sawyer Robertson, which was recovered by Derrick LeBlanc and returned 13 yards to set up the scoring opportunity.

Lawrence was a standout on the day, recording two sacks, three tackles for loss and multiple quarterback pressures. Lawrence entered the contest 13th in the nation among active sack leaders and slotted in second in the Big 12. Today's game marked the second consecutive with Lawrence recorded two sacks.

Baylor opened the game with an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, capped by a 13-yard strike from Robertson to tight end Michael Trigg. The touchdown marked the first opponent score on the opening drive that the Black and Gold have allowed all season. After a short opening drive from the Knights, the Bears added another score on their next possession, this time finishing an 8-play drive with a short touchdown pass to Josh Cameron to take a 14-0 lead.


UCF responded with its most promising drive of the first half, highlighted by a 14-yard pass to Montgomery and a 17-yard run from the back himself. The Knights advanced to Baylor's 13-yard line but came up short on a fourth-down pass attempt, turning the ball over on downs.

The second quarter saw the Bears extend their lead with a 40-yard field goal and another scoring drive that ended in a 28-yard kick, pushing the margin to 20-0. UCF's defense held strong on several possessions throughout the half, including a red zone stand that forced a missed field goal and a turnover on downs. Ruelas' field goal brought the score to 20-3 entering halftime.

In the second half, UCF opened with a drive that reached Baylor territory thanks to a pass interference call and a series of short gains from Montgomery. However, the drive stalled leading to a 53-yard field goal attempt by Ruelas that ultimately came up short. Baylor responded with a 13-play, 42-yard drive that ended in a 41-yard field goal, extending their lead to 23-3. With an additional field goal and one final receiving touchdown, the Bears claimed the win 30-3.

Football Falls to Houston, 30–27, in Space Game Heartbreaker

ORLANDO – In a mission that just fell short Friday night in Acrisure Bounce House, the UCF Citronauts were bested by the Houston Cougars in a 30-27 heartbreaker.

"We've got to complete more balls when we take a chance to throw. We've got to get open a little better, throw it a little better. You can't just come up with a bunch of gimmicks and tricks to move the ball. We just need to do the basic things better." – UCF Head Coach Scott Frost on how the team needs to improve

Despite being outgained 433–282 in total offensive yards, the Citronauts' defense forced four turnovers and registered six sacks, keeping the contest a back-and-forth fight from start to finish.

Noe Ruelas put the 'Nauts on the board first with a 37-yard field goal, while UCF's defense continued its early dominance, holding Houston scoreless in the opening quarter. It marked the seventh first-quarter shutout of the season for the Citronauts, who entered the night ranked 16th nationally in fewest points allowed in the opening frame.

Early in the second quarter, senior running back Myles Montgomery extended the lead with a one-yard touchdown rush up the middle, recording his fourth score of the season and the 11th of his career. Houston quickly turned the momentum, though, first executing on a four-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, then capitalizing on defense with an interception returned for a score to seize a 14-10 advantage.

Undeterred by the momentum swing, UCF responded immediately with a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 15-yard touchdown run from Jaden Nixon, his seventh of the season and 21st of his career. The drive was the Citronauts' 13th scoring drive of 75 yards or more this year, giving them a 17-14 edge

On the defensive side, senior defensive back Phillip Dunnam delivered a performance for the record books. He intercepted two passes in the first quarter alone, marking his first career multi-pick game and the first by a UCF player since Demari Henderson's two interceptions in the 2023 Space Game against then-No. 15 Oklahoma State.

The latter of those interceptions, Dunnam returned 43 yards for his first career touchdown, also the Citronauts' first pick-six since BJ Adams' 63-yard score against lowa State Oct. 19, 2024. Dunnam's defensive efforts gave the 'Nauts a seven-point edge at the half, 24-17.

Although Houston tied the game at 24 midway through the third quarter, Dunnam's defensive presence kept the Citronauts firmly in the fight – and made program history.

Late in the third stanza, Dunnam snagged his third interception of the game, becoming the first player in program history to record three in a single contest. Since 1996, only 12 players in Big 12 history had achieved the feat, while Dunnam became the 13th. Houston quarterback Conner Weigman had thrown just four interceptions all season entering the matchup, but left the game giving up nearly that many to Dunnam alone. In total, the Citronauts' defense forced four turnovers, their most since Mission VII against then-No. 15 Oklahoma State Nov. 11, 2023.


Ruelas capitalized on the defensive momentum with a 54-yard field goal, matching his career long and putting UCF ahead 27-24. The Connecticut native also became the first player in program history to hit three or more field goals from 50-plus yards in a single season.

Houston responded with a pair of field goals of their own, one to tie the game at 27, and another from 22 yards to take a 30-27 lead late in the fourth.

A post-kick unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on the Cougars gave UCF a boost for one final drive, but the Citronauts' comeback bid fell short when a late interception with just 11 seconds remaining sealed a 30-27 Houston victory.

Tayven Jackson of Greenwood, Indiana, began his college career at Tennessee in 2022, where he appeared in three games and scored his first collegiate touchdown against Akron on Sep. 17, a one-yard touchdown scramble. He transferred to Indiana in 2023, starting five games and throwing for 914 yards and two touchdowns while showcasing his dual-threat ability. In 2024, he saw action in seven more games, adding 349 passing yards and four touchdowns. Following the season, Jackson entered the transfer portal and committed to UCF in January 2025.

 Tayven's father, Ray, played cornerback at Washington State and was a member of the Cougars' 1998 Pac-10
