



# NOV. 11

Football defeats No. 15 Oklahoma State, 45-3, for its seventh consecutive win in its annual Space Game. It also marked head coach Gus Malzahn's 100th career win.

# DEC. 3

UCF becomes the only Big 12 newcomer to make a bowl in its inaugural season, its eighth consecutive bowl game, which is tied for the eighthlongest streak among FBS teams.

In a one week span, men's basketball defeats No. 3 Kansas (65-60) in its inaugural Big 12 home game and goes on the road to defeat Texas (77-71).




# JAN. 14



UCF hosts the NFL Pro Bowl Skills Competition on campus in the Nicholson Fieldhouse. The event was broadcasted to an audience of 1.14 million viewers, which was up eight percent from 2023 and the best audience since 2018.

UCF athletics celebrates National Girls and Women in Sports Day, presented by Orlando Health, with a pair of events. The first was a free children's sports clinic on Feb. 3. The second was the 2024 UCF Women in Sports Dinner, presented by Orlando Health, on Feb. 6.

# FEB. 22

Taylor Gerring makes the largest single gift in the history of UCF athletics to name the new football administration building the Taylor A. Gerring Football Center. Gerring donated \$5.5M to athletics and an additional \$1M to The Kingdom.

# MAY 12

Softball earns its fourth consecutive and 11th all-time bid to the NCAA Tournament, marking the first time in program history the Black and Gold have earned four consecutive NCAA bids under head coach Cindy Ball-Malone.



UCF becomes one of three Big 12 schools to make the postseason in the top revenue sports of football, men's basketball and baseball (Arizona, Kansas State).

# **JUNE 8**

Asherah Collins becomes the first Knight in program history to garner All-America honors in the long and triple jump.



Kenneth G. Dixon pledges a transformational \$10 million commitment that will significantly enhance UCF's Career Services and Athletics programs. In honor of Dixon's longstanding commitment, the UCF Board of Trustees voted to rename North Orion Boulevard to Ken Dixon Way.



# **MISSION XII OBJECTIVES**


- To fully support our student-athletes in their NIL endeavors.



# **Dick Nunis**

1932 - 2023

Dick Nunis, former chair of UCF's Board of Trustees, passed away in December 2023. He was 91.

Known for his commitment to

inspiring wonder and executing with impeccable quality, Dick proudly served on UCF's Board of Trustees from 2001 to 2008. Nunis had a vision for UCF to be an exceptional institution, and his enthusiasm, service, and personal philanthropy propelled UCF to where we are today. His vision also set UCF up for a historic move into the Big 12 through investment in UCF Athletics and support for on-campus facilities. His UCF connection began somewhere around the time he retired as chairman of Walt Disney Attractions, culminating exactly 44 years with the Disney organization.

Then one day, Nunis' phone rang. On the other end was Florida Governor Jeb Bush. Bush had decided to institute a Board of
Trustees at each Florida university
— and he invited Nunis to be a
charter member of the UCF Board
that would begin its work in 2001.

Nunis accepted, later spent several years as chair of the Board — and played a particularly instrumental role in a boom period of growth for UCF Athletics that included the opening of both the Bounce House (originally Bright House Networks Stadium) for football in 2007 and Addition Financial Arena (originally UCF Arena) for basketball that same year.

Both those were major oncampus additions — and changes from playing football at what is now Camping World Stadium west of downtown Orlando and basketball at the Venue.

The addition of those two new facilities helped create and expand



UCF's vision for an athletics village that continues to broaden today, thanks to the Mission XII initiative.

Nunis' fingerprints (and financial support) could be found all over a lengthy agenda of athletics projects since that call from Bush more than two decades ago, as he originally worked closely with then UCF President John C. Hitt.

"I told him, 'If you want to be an amazing university, you've got to be good in athletics," said Nunis in 2022. "There may have been a few times where we literally just bulldozed ahead — and maybe asked for forgiveness later. There was a lot of work to be done, and we had a lot of fun doing it."


