### THE OPENING TIP

- Pitt and UCF square off Thursday night in Daytona Beach, Fla. at Ocean Center for the Skyscanner Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper. Both teams come into the contest at 4-1 on the season coming off of a Monday night win.
- The game will be broadcast on ESPN2 with Rich Hollenberg and Miles Simon calling the action.
- The game will also be broadcast on the Pitt Radio Network (flagship 93.7 The Fan) with Jeff Hathhorn (play-by-play) and Curtis Aiken (analysis) on the broadcast.
- Pitt and UCF have met just once before -- in the 2004 NCAA Tournament inside the Bradley Center in Milwaukee, Wisc. The Panthers won the first round contest in a slugfest, leading 22-18 at the half and going on to a 53-44 win. Pitt went on

to the regional semifinal that year and finished with a record of 31-5. Carl Krauser led Pitt with 20 points in the victory over UCF and Chris Taft had 16 rebounds.

- Including two exhibition games, Pitt has won six home games already this season, but the Panthers lost their only game away from Petersen Events Center, a 71-49 decision against West Virginia in the Backyard Brawl.
- Pitt went 1-2 in neutral site games a year ago, beating LSU in the Greenbrier Tip-Off at Colonial Hall before a loss to Wisconsin. The Panthers also lost to Notre Dame on a neutral floor in the ACC Tournament.
- With a win, Pitt would start 5-1 or better for the third consecutive season.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Senior forward Cameron Corhen is almost averaging a double-double this season at 14.0 points and 9.8 rebounds, while also blocking 1.6 shots per game. He is one of four players in the ACC to be averaging at least 14 points, nine rebounds and 1.5 blocks per contest.
- Corhen is reaching those figures by shooting efficiently at 62.5 percent from the field and 75.0 percent from the free-throw line. He is the only player in the ACC to combine the scoring, rebounding and blocked shots with the shooting percentages. Only South Florida's Isaiyah Nelson and Wisconsin's Nolan Winter can match those statistical totals across all of Division I.
- Corhen also ranks first in the ACC in minutes played per game at 34.4.
- Oregon State transfer Damarco Minor has done a little bit of everything for Pitt thus far in the season. He is averaging 10.6 points, 5.4 rebounds, 3.4 assists (tied for the team lead) and has a team-best six steals. He also ranks tied for third in the ACC with a 94.1 percent free-throw percentage.
- Minor is one of just six players in the ACC averaging at least 10 points, five rebounds, three assists and a steal per game.
- Pitt is one of only two teams in the country with five players shooting at least 38.5 percent from three-point range (minimum 13 three-point attempts) this year. Vermont also has five, while six other teams have four players who qualify. Nojus Indrusaitis (8-of-18, 44.4 percent), Barry Dunning, Jr. (8-of-19, 42.1 percent), Brandin Cummings (9-of-23, 39.1 percent), Damarco Minor (7-of-18, 38.9 percent) and Omari Witherspoon (5-of-13, 38.5 percent) are leading the Panthers from deep.
- With a 42-29 rebounding advantage against Bucknell, Pitt is now outrebounding opponents by an average of 9.4 per game. The Panthers have won the rebounding battle in all four victories this year.
- Teams are shooting just 35.9 percent from the field against the Panthers this year. Pitt has held four of its first five opponents below 40 percent shooting. The Panthers rank No. 20 nationally in field goal percentage defense.
- No team has shot better than 30.3 percent from three-point range against Pitt and the Panthers are holding teams to 27.7 percent from long range this season.
- Pitt is one of just five teams in the ACC, and one of 16 nationally, holding opponents below 36 percent from the field and 28 percent from three this year.
- After a slow start to his freshman season, Omari Witherspoon has scored in double figures in three consecutive games. He is averaging 12.3 points and 3.7 assists on 55 percent from the field and 50 percent from three over those three contests. He has even blocked five shots during that stretch.
- Pitt was 14-2 in the 2024-25 season when posting a better field goal percentage than its opponent. So far in 2025-26, field goal percentage has been a determining factor in every game and Pitt is 4-0 when shooting better than its opponents.
- A year ago, Pitt ranked among the top 20 teams in the country in free-throw shooting at 78.2 percent. Despite shooting 81.5 percent from the stripe in the season opener, Pitt is still 10 points lower this year at the line, making 67.6 percent.
- The Panthers went 12-0 in 2024-25 and are

now 51-2 under Jeff Capel all-time when scoring 80 or more points in a game. Pitt reached the 80-point mark for the first time in Monday's 84-50 win over Bucknell.

- Pitt had a school-record seven wins when trailing at halftime in 2024-25. The Panthers won four games in which they had trailed by double-figures at some point in the contest.

- From the beginning of the 2022-23 season through the present, Pitt ranks tied for fourth in total wins and tied for fifth in league wins among ACC schools.

**FROM THE 'BELT TO THE 'BURGH**

- Although Pitt does not return any All-ACC players to its roster, Barry Dunning, Jr. did join the Panthers after being named First Team All-Sun Belt a year ago at South Alabama.
- After a slow start to the season, Dunning broke out in a big way against Bucknell. He made seven three-pointers and scored 23 points to lead Pitt in the victory. That came after scoring just 11 total points through the Panthers' first four games.
- The seven three-pointers are tied for the seventh-most in a single-game in program history. It marked the third time in his career in which he has made 6+ three-pointers in a game.
- After making just 1-of-8 three-pointers through the first four games, he is now second on the team in three-point percentage at 42.1 percent (8-of-19).

**SCORIN' WITH CORHEN**

- After averaging 11.0 points and 5.2 rebounds per game in 2024-25, Cameron Corhen has taken the next step in his game in 2025-26. He is averaging 14.0 points and 9.8 rebounds per game, while shooting a team-best 62.5 percent from the field. He's also blocked eight shots, made 18-of-24 free-throws (75.0 percent) and even knocked down two three-pointers, one more than he made all of last year.
- In the season opener against Youngstown State, Corhen finishing with 23 points and 12 rebounds, while shooting 8-of-11 from the field. He now has five career double-doubles.
- Against West Virginia, Corhen recorded his second double-double of the season with 14 points and 10 rebounds, while blocking two shots and adding two assists and two steals. He shot 6-of-8 from the field and made his lone three-point attempt.
- In 2024-25, Corhen had a true shooting percentage of .635, ranking fourth in the ACC among those with at least 200 field goal

LAST TIME OUT

- Barry Dunning, Jr. delivered his best performance in a Pitt uniform Monday night, drilling seven three-pointers and scoring 23 points as the Panthers rolled to an 84-50 win over Bucknell.
- Pitt used a 12-0 run to build a 21-11 lead and never trailed again. Although Bucknell did claw back within four points, Dunning answered with a three-pointer that sparked a 9-1 run and Pitt led 38-25 at the break.
- Pitt stretched its lead to as many as 40 points in the second half before settling into the 34-point win.
- After Dunning, Pitt had four players who scored 11 points apiece -- Cameron Corhen, Brandin Cummings, Omari Witherspoon and Nojus Indrusaitis.
- Pitt shot 51 percent from the field and a blistering 52 percent (13-of-25) from three-point range. The Panthers dominated the glass 42-29, and finished with 20 assists, 10 steals and 38 bench points.
- Papa Amadou Kante came off the bench to record career-highs with 11 rebounds and five assists.

attempts. True shooting percentage measures a player's scoring efficiency by accounting for two-point field goals, three-point field goals, and free throws.

- Corhen's true shooting percentage through the first five games of the regular season is .681, which ranks No. 8 in the ACC this year.
- Corhen is the only student-athlete among last year's top four in true shooting percentage to return to the ACC for the 2025-26 season.

HEATING UP FROM DEEP

- Pitt is shooting 41.8 percent from three-point range in the second halves of games this year, compared to 34.5 percent in the first halves. The team has attempted 55 three-pointers in both the first halves and second halves, making 23 in the second halves and 19 in the first halves.

THE BATTLE OF THE BOARDS

- Pitt outrebounded Youngstown State 46-24 and then Longwood 48-35 in the first two games of the season, posting a +17.5 rebounding margin.
- Over being -1 on the board during a two-game stretch against Eastern Michigan and West Virginia, Pitt once again dominated on the glass against Bucknell, 42-29.
- Three players are averaging at least 5.0 rebounds per game through the first five games. Cameron Corhen is leading the way at 9.8 rebounds per contest and has three double-figure rebounding games. Papa Amadou Kante had 10 against Youngstown State and then a career-high 11 against Bucknell and is averaging 7.6 per contest. Starting point guard Damarco Minor is third on the team at 5.4 boards per game.
- Corhen's 9.8 rebounds per game ranks sixth in the ACC, while Amadou Kante's 7.6 are the most in the ACC for a player coming off the bench. Minor's 5.4 boards are ninth among guards in the ACC.

THE RETURN OF BIG PAPA

- Papa Amadou Kante returned to the Pitt rotation in 2024-25 after missing all of the 2023-24 season with a knee injury. He averaged 2.1

points and 1.1 rebounds, while going 16-of-29 (.552) from the field, in 7.0 minutes per game.

- A year removed from that knee injury, Amadou Kante has a much larger role in 2025-26. He had 10 rebounds in the season opener, including five on the offensive glass. He posted eight more rebounds against Longwood, adding four points and a block. He then finished with eight points and five rebounds against Eastern Michigan. Monday night, he recorded new career-highs with 11 rebounds and five assists.
- He ranks second on the team with 7.6 rebounds per game, which is the most in the ACC among players who come off the bench.

BEEBAH BUCKETS

- Brandin "Beebah" Cummings averaged 6.3 points per game as a freshman in 2024-25, while going 29-of-77 (.377) from three-point range. He scored in double figures nine times, including a season-best 30 points in a win over Eastern Kentucky (12/11).
- Although he missed Pitt's game against Eastern Michigan with a lower-body injury, Cummings is becoming the Panthers' go-to scorer in 2025-26. He had 18 in the win over Youngstown State and followed that with 19 against Longwood.
- Cummings is the team leader from long range, having made 9-of-23 (39.1 percent) three-pointers. His nine three-pointers lead the team and his shooting percentage is third. He is also shooting 77.8 percent from the free-throw line.

BOMBS AWAY

- Brandin Cummings is one of five Pitt players shooting at least 38.5 percent from three-point range this year (who have attempted at least 13 long balls).
- Nojus Indrusaitis (8-of-18, 44.4 percent), Barry Dunning, Jr. (8-of-19, 42.1 percent), Cummings (9-of-23, 39.1 percent), Damarco Minor (7-of-18, 38.9 percent) and Omari Witherspoon (5-of-13, 38.5 percent) all qualify. Cameron Cohen is shooting 50 percent from three, but has only attempted four this year.
- Pitt is one of just two teams in the country to have five such long range threats, along with Vermont. Charleston Southern, High Point, Purdue Fort Wayne, San Diego, Georgia Southern and Evansville all have four shooters that reach those numbers.

MAJOR MINOR

- Fifth-year point guard Damarco “Polo” Minor has taken the long road to get to Pitt, but is already leading the Panthers in 2025-26.
- Minor began his collegiate career in junior college at South Suburban College for the 2021-22 season and then spent two years at SIU Edwardsville, culminating in First Team All-OVC honors. He transferred to Oregon State for the 2024-25 season.
- With 1,308 career points and 361 career assists to his name prior to the start of the season, Minor brings experience to the Panthers. He played in his 100th career game at the NCAA Division I level when he got the starting nod against Youngstown State in the season opener.
- In the win over Eastern Michigan, Minor had 12 points, seven rebounds, six assists and four steals, while playing almost 38 minutes. He became just the third player in the NCAA this year to post a 12/7/6/4 game.
- Similarly, he is averaging 10.6 points, 5.4 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.2 steals per contest. He is just one of six players in the ACC to be averaging at least 10 points, five rebounds, three assists and one steal per game.

STIRRING START FOR WITHERSPOON

- Freshman Omari Witherspoon is beginning to show the potential that landed him in the starting lineup to open the season
- Witherspoon has scored in double-figures in each of the past three games. Against Eastern Michigan, he was 6-of-11 shooting for a career-best 15 points. He had 11 points in back-to-back contests against West Virginia and Bucknell.
- In the first two games of the season, he was just 3-of-13 (23.1 percent) shooting, but is over

50 percent at 16-of-29 (55.2 percent) over the past three games.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Pitt has compiled a 321-95 (.772) record, including a 186-18 (.912) ledger in non-conference play, at the Petersen Events Center. Pitt has won 14 straight non-conference games inside the PEC.
- Pitt is 28-29 (.491) versus teams ranked in the top 25 of the AP Poll at the Petersen Events Center, with a 14-10 (.583) mark against top-10 teams and a 9-4 (.692) ledger versus teams ranked in the top-5.

EARLY RETURNS

- Pitt started a pair of true freshmen in the season opener against Youngstown State -- Roman Siulepa and Omari Witherspoon.
- It was the first time Pitt started multiple freshmen in the season opener since Head Coach Jeff Capel put three freshmen in his starting lineup to open the 2018-19 season.

ROMAN’S EMPIRE

- Freshman Roman Siulepa plays with a bruising style that complements his rugby background.
- The top basketball prospect out of Australia and someone who has appeared on the radars of NBA teams since the age of 16, Siulepa was also one of the best youth rugby players in the country. Commentators praised him as one of the best high-school rugby players ever through the GPS system.
- Siulepa’s basketball resume has led to claims that he is the best prospect out of Australia since Ben Simmons. He has drawn comparisons to past notable NBA prospects such as Zion Williamson.
- Siulepa had his first career double-figure scoring game against Longwood, posting 12 points. He added 11 for another double-figure scoring game against Eastern Michigan. He had 10 points by halftime in each contest.

CLOSE BUT NO CIGAR

- Pitt went 17-15 during the 2024-25 season but the season had the potential for another 20-win campaign as the Panthers lost a number of close contests.
- Pitt lost six ACC games in which it led, was tied or was within one possession in the final minute of regulation. The Panthers’ ACC Tournament loss to Notre Dame was a seventh such contest.
- In total, Pitt lost 10 games in which it led, was tied or was within one possession in the final six minutes of regulation.

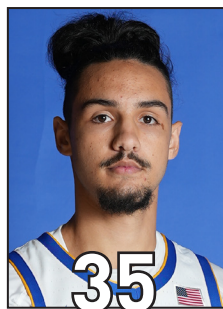
