A DIFFERENT LEAGUE

- The Big 12 Conference placed five teams in the College Football Playoff's Top 25 rankings this week. Arizona (25th) made its CFP debut this season and Arizona State (20th) moved up five spots. Texas Tech (5th), BYU (11th) and Utah (13th) gave the Big 12 three programs in the top 13 for a fourth consecutive week.
- Arizona State, BYU, Texas Tech and Utah are the only programs that can clinch a berth in the 2025 Edward Jones Big 12 Football Championship entering the final week of Conference play. For complete tiebreaker information, please visit Big12Sports.com/Tiebreakers.
- BYU and Texas Tech, who are tied atop the Big 12 standings, can both punch their ticket to Arlington with a win in Week 14 or with an Arizona State loss.
- Arizona State must defeat Arizona in Friday's Territorial Cup and have a combination of losses by BYU, Texas Tech and Utah as parts of their three different scenarios.
- Utah's path to Arlington would begin with a win over Kansas on Friday with wins by ASU and BYU alongside a Texas Tech loss.
- The Big 12 has had 12 different teams defeat an AP Top 25 opponent (at time of game) this season, which is the most among all FBS conferences and the most by the Big 12 in Conference history.
- Entering the final week of Big 12 play, nine programs are bowl eligible with another three that are one win away.
- Texas Tech has 10 wins by at least 20 points this season, most in the FBS. That mark is one victory shy of tying the Big 12's all-time record, set by Oklahoma in 2008.

CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- BYU is the only FBS team this season with four or more wins on the road over bowl-eligible opponents. Only two other FBS programs have three such wins.
- Utah has eight wins by at least 25 points this season, which leads the FBS. This marks the most by a Big 12 team in a single campaign since Baylor in 2013.
- With a record of 5-1 this season in games determined by seven points or fewer, Arizona State has posted a mark of 10-1 in such games since joining the Big 12. The 10 wins by seven or fewer points since 2024 are tied for the most ever by a Big 12 team in a two-year span.
- Arizona has held seven straight opponents under 200 passing yards, the longest active streak in the nation. The last Big 12 team with a longer streak was Missouri's eight-game stretch during the 2004 season.
- The trio of Arizona, Houston and Utah have all increased their win totals by four from last season. They are tied for fourth in single-season win improvement in FBS.
- Houston is the only unbeaten Power Four program on the road this season with five or more games played away from home.
- Texas Tech is the only team to rank among the top five in the FBS this season in scoring offense, scoring defense and takeaways per game. The last FBS team to finish a season in the top five in all three categories was Florida during its 2008 BCS National Championship season.
- BYU's Bear Bachmeier is one of three FBS players this season with at least 2,300 passing yards and 10 rushing touchdowns with four or fewer interceptions.

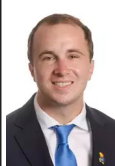

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the 12 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through 12 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
