AVERY ANDERSON

Director of Track & Field and
Cross Country
5th Season at UCLA
UCLA '96

UCLA track and field alumnus Avery Anderson enters his fifth year as Director of Track & Field and Cross Country. As Director, Anderson oversees all aspects of the planning, development, and administration of the Track & Field and Cross Country programs at UCLA. He was named to the position on July 6, 2017.

Anderson deftly navigated COVID protocols throughout 2021 and led the Bruins to success in both Cross Country and Track & Field. The Bruin men and women both secured cross country team victories at the Arizona Invitational (Feb. 5) and Dave Murray Invitational (Feb. 19) ahead of the Pac-12 Championships. On the track, Anderson guided Ismail Turner to an NCAA Outdoor appearance after Turner went 45.64 (t-10th in UCLA history) at West Prelims. The women's 4x400m relay team notched an historic performance at Outdoor Nationals, finishing third overall with a school-record time of 3:25.01. Alyssa Wilson qualified for Nationals in a pair of throwing events and went on to better her school record in the hammer while competing at U.S. Trials, as she posted a mark of 73.75m (241-11) for the fourth-best collegiate performance all-time in the event. Harrison Schrage earned USTFCCCA All-America honors after a sixth-place finish in the long jump at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Ilaria Casarotto notched a new school record in the javelin, going 53.09m (174-02) to earn a podium spot at the Pac-12 Championships.

The 2021 UCLA women notched the No. 12 national ranking on the USTFCCCA poll, the highest ranking for the program since 2014.

Anderson's third season as Director saw the 2020 outdoor campaign canceled due to COVID-19, but his men's and women's squads impressed in the indoor season. The Bruins set six indoor school records in 2020—Christina Rice (5000m), Shae Anderson (400m—2x), women's 4x400m relay, Alyssa Wilson (weight throw), Kenroy Higgins II (60m). Anderson guided three individuals and a pair of relay squads to NCAA Indoor qualification before the Championships were, ultimately, canceled.

The UCLA women achieved a No. 15 national ranking ahead of the NCAA Indoor Championships, the highest indoor ranking for the program since 2015. The women's squad tied for fifth at the MPSF Indoor Championships after finishing 13th in 2019.

The Bruins continued to improve in Anderson's second year at the helm. The 2019 indoor season saw the UCLA men's squad finish second overall, the team's highest finish since 2010. Robert Brandt doubled with victories in the 3000m (school record - 7:55.60) and 5000m while Sondre Guttormsen and Justin Stafford notched league titles in the pole vault and weight throw, respectively. Christina Rice (second place) and Ashlie Blake (third) led the Bruin women in the 5000m and shot put, respectively. Six Bruins went on to secure eight total All-America honors at the NCAA Indoor Championships.

Anderson went on to lead the UCLA men's squad to a dominant 102-60 victory over USC in the annual crosstown dual meet. The Bruins' steady improvement continued through the Pac-12 Championships, as the men's team finished second with 140 points, the highest placement since the team finished second in 2005 and the most points since UCLA won the league title in 2004. Simon Litzell picked up his second-straight Pac-12 title in the javelin while Brandt (10,000m) and Guttormsen (pole vault) each added their first-career league crowns, respectively. The UCLA women finished in eighth place with 55 points. Alyssa Wilson (discus) and Elleyse Garrett (pole vault) each picked up league titles.

Anderson would earn Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors for UCLA's performances ahead of the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Wilson won Pac-12 Field Athlete of the Year, the first Conference individual honor for the Bruins under Anderson's direction. Anderson also earned USTFCCCA West Region Coach of the Year honors.

The Bruin men went on to finish 18th at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, as Sean Lee (first team), Dotun Ogundeji (first team), and Brandt (second team) each earned All-America honors en route to 16 points total points. It was the team's highest point total since notching 18 in 2013. Wilson qualified in the shot put, discus, and hammer throw at NCAAs, scoring 10 points on her own to give the Bruin women a T-25 finish. She also

earned First Team All-America status in each of her three events, becoming the first athlete to garner three First-Team accolades in the same meet since the First and Second teams were initiated in 2013.

In his first year at the helm, Anderson helped UCLA muster USTFCCCA All-America performances in several events during the outdoor season, including first team selections in Robert Brandt (10,000m), Kendall Gustafson (heptathlon), Jessie Maduka (triple jump) and Alyssa Wilson (shot put, hammer). The UCLA track & field program also saw two student-athletes (Simon Litzell, javelin; Marian Spannowsky, javelin) earn second team honors, while Justin Stafford (hammer) and Alyssa Wilson (discus) took home honorable mention plaudits in their respective events.

Anderson's indoor All-Americans included: Ashlie Blake (first team, shot put), Jessie Maduka (first team, triple jump), Nate Esparza (second team, shot put), Dotun Ogundeji (second team, shot put) and Alyssa Wilson (second team, shot put).

During the 2018 outdoor track & field season, UCLA notched 26 Pac-12 All-Academic honorees, and the Bruins saw 24 student-athletes qualify for the NCAA West Regional Championships.

At the Pac-12 Championships, the Bruins collected an individual title in the women's triple jump, as Jessie Maduka's mark of 13.59m (44-7) gave the Bruins their first victory in the event since 2004. UCLA also saw Simon Litzell win a Pac-12 title in the javelin, as he threw a collegiate-best 74.46m (244-3).

Anderson returned to his alma mater after spending nearly 20 years coaching at the NCAA Division I level. His coaching career began at CSUN, where he served as a volunteer assistant track & field coach from 1999-2001 while competing as a professional decathlete. He served in the same role at UCLA from 2001-2002 and at Kansas State from 2002-2004 before returning to CSUN for the next 13 years working in various coaching roles. Most recently, he served as the Director of Track and Field and Cross Country for CSUN from 2011-2017.

Anderson's tenure with the Matadors was marked by staggering levels of success. During his time with CSUN, Anderson led his student-athletes to 13 Big West/WAC Conference Team Titles, 91 individual conference championships, and 21 NCAA All-America honors. He also coached the only individual male NCAA Division I champions in CSUN history, in any sport, long jumpers Dashalle Andrews and Reindell Cole.

Additionally, Anderson presided over three Big West Outdoor Championships on the women's side (2011, 2015, and 2017). The women's victory in 2017 extended CSUN's record for most conference team titles on either the men's or women's side. Anderson was recognized for his coaching prowess when he received the 2015 and 2017 Big West Conference Women's Track and Field Coach of the Year awards.

In addition to his evident coaching expertise, Anderson returns to Westwood with the invaluable experience of being a two-sport student-athlete with the Bruins, as he competed in both football and track & field and understands the winning tradition of UCLA Athletics. He was a member of the NCAA runner-up 4x100m relay squad his senior season and helped UCLA take home four Pac-10 Championships. As a wide receiver from 1991-1995, Anderson competed in football for the Bruins at the highest level. His most notable season came when he helped lead UCLA to a 1993 Pac-10 title and later played in the 1994 Rose Bowl.

Anderson went on to play for the Indianapolis Colts during the 1996-97 season. When a back injury ended his football career, he decided to return to track & field as a decathlete. He soon became a prominent decathlete as he set the CSUN complex decathlon record to qualify for the 2000 U.S. Olympic Trials. After finishing seventh at trials, he went on to compete internationally for the United States in 2001 in the U.S. vs. Germany decathlon competition in Germany.

In addition to receiving a Bachelor of Arts in political science from UCLA, Anderson earned his Master's of Public Administration with honors at CSUN. His advocacy for academic success was on display during his tenure at CSUN, as his program achieved a total of 12 NCAA APR Public Recognition Awards.

Anderson is married to the former Bridget Pearson, who is in her third season at UCLA as a volunteer assistant after coaching for 12 seasons at CSUN. She is also a UCLA track & field alumna. The couple have two children: a son, Andy, and daughter, Avery.



MARSHALL ACKLEY

Assistant Coach -
Jumps, Hurdles, Pole Vault
3rd Season at UCLA
Oregon '11

Marshall Ackley enters his third season as Assistant Coach on the Bruins' coaching staff, leading coaching operations for the jumps, hurdles, and pole vault event groups.

The 2021 outdoor season notably saw Ackley guide Harrison Schrage to a Pac-12 title in the long jump, as well as the sixth-best mark in school history with a clearance of 7.97m (26-01.50) at the West Coast Classic in Arizona. Schrage also went on to qualify for the U.S. Olympic Trials in the event. Alex Enos also impressed under Ackley's guidance, clearing seven meters for the first time as a collegian with a mark of 7.04m (23-01.25) against USC.

Ackley also guided three Bruin pole vaulters to scoring positions at the Pac-12 Championships: Kyle Brown (third place) and Tate Curran (eighth) place on the men's side and Katerina Adamiec (seventh place) on the women's side. Camryn Thomson and Mia Cervantes each cleared the 4-meter barrier with 4.01m (13-01.75) marks against the Trojans, good for season-best marks for both student-athletes.

Ackley's first season with the Bruins was highlighted by strong performances from student-athletes in his event groups. Harrison Schrage led the way for the Bruin men in the long jump, clearing a season-best of 7.59m (24-11.00) at the MPSF Indoor Championships for third place overall. Matthew DeRoos went 7.41m (24-03.75) for fifth place at the league indoor meet. DeRoos also picked up three top-10 finishes in the triple jump this past indoor season. On the women's side, Ackley helped guide graduating senior Jazmin moss to a seventh-place finish in the triple jump at the MPSF Indoor Championships (11.81m, 38-09.00).

Prior to joining UCLA, Ackley served as assistant coach at UC-Davis before being promoted to Associate Head Track & Field Coach in 2016. He was the jumps/multis coach and assisted with sprints and hurdles. During his eight-year stretch in Davis, Ackley coached the Aggies to four Big West Outdoor Championships (2012, 2013, 2014, 2016). He produced 15 Big West individual champions, six NCAA Championship qualifiers (five outdoor, one indoor), 35 West preliminary qualifiers and the 2019 MPSF pentathlon champion, Erinn Beattie. The Aggies broke 17 school records under Ackley's direction.

He oversaw all daily operations of the UC-Davis track & field and cross country programs while assisting with sprints, hurdles, technique, drills and conditioning. Ackley was also named the interim head cross country coach during the 2018 campaign.

In his competition days, Ackley was a standout competitor at Oregon, helping the Ducks to four outdoor conference championships between 2007 and 2010. He was a six-time scorer at the conference meet and earned NCAA All-America plaudits in the decathlon in 2009 and 2010, the same years that Oregon finished as the NCAA runner-up. As a sophomore, Ackley finished fifth in the decathlon at the conference championships before improving to second and third, respectively, in his final two seasons.

One of Ackley's most memorable moments came at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor Championships. In pursuit of a second All-America award, Ackley pulled his left hamstring during the pole vault. Despite posting a no-height finish in the vault, Ackley refused to withdrawal from the decathlon and continued to compete in the last two events – the javelin throw and 1500m.

With his leg tightly bandaged, Ackley limped around the track with determination, receiving a standing ovation from an appreciative home crowd of nearly 12,000 at Hayward Field. The final event may've taken him a little over seven minutes, but it was Ackley's heart and courage that stole the show in his final collegiate meet of his career.

A native of Nyssa, Ore., Ackley graduated from Oregon in 2011 with a Bachelor of Arts in history. He remained with the track & field program as a volunteer assistant for multis coach Harry Marra and also coached and trained alongside Ashton Eaton, the former world decathlon record holder and the reigning world record holder in the indoor heptathlon.



CURTIS ALLEN

Assistant Coach - Sprints, Relays
5th Season at UCLA
Fresno State '91

Curtis Allen begins his fifth season as an assistant coach at UCLA, coaching sprints and relays.

The 2021 outdoor season was historic for the Bruin sprinters and demonstrated Allen's coaching prowess. Impressively, Allen guided UCLA's women's 4x400m relay squad (Meleni Rodney, Makenzy Pierre-Webster, Kate Jendrezak, Shae Anderson) to a third-place finish at the NCAA Championships with a school-record time of 3:25.01, the eighth-fastest time in collegiate history. Allen also helped lead the women's 4x100m relay to an appearance at Nationals.

Ahead of the 2021 National Meet, Ismail Turner broke out and ran a lifetime-best time of 45.64 in the 400m at NCAA West Prelims, earning a spot at Nationals with the 10th-fastest time in school history. Earlier in the year, Anderson ran 22.96 in the 200m at the West Coast Classic, good for the seventh-fastest time in program history. Jendrezak flew to a time of 2:04.46 at Pac-12s, the fourth-fastest time in program history in the event.

Anderson ran 50.84 in the 400m at the U.S. Olympic Trials to earn a spot in the Relay Pool for Team USA, while Meleni Rodney qualified to compete in the 400m for Grenada. Anderson's 50.84 was the second-fastest time in program history. Myles Misener-Daley also qualified to compete in the 400m at the 2021 Canada Olympic Trials.

The 2020 indoor season saw impressive performances up and down the sprint roster. Shae Anderson led the way for the Bruin women in the 400m, twice setting the indoor record in the event this season and notching a personal best of 52.07 at the Don Kirby Elite Invite (Feb. 14). Allen also helped guide Anderson and the rest of the 4x400m relay squad -- Meleni Rodney, Makenzy Pierre-Webster, and Catherine Leger -- to a school-record time of 3:30.28 at the MPSF Championships. Anderson (400m) and the 4x4 squad qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships (eventually canceled).

Kenroy Higgins II had a breakout season in the 60m, clocking a school-record time of 6.59 at the MPSF Championships en route to NCAA Indoor qualification. Myles Webb and Harrison Schrage posted times of 6.69 (4th in UCLA indoor history) and 6.81 (T-4th), respectively, this past season. A trio of Bruin women -- Chinyere Okoro (7.42), Kenyla Miles (7.44), and Makenzy Pierre-Webster (7.45) -- all recorded Top-10 UCLA 60m times this past season.

Okoro also posted the No. 4 indoor 200m time in UCLA history this past season, going 23.83 at the New Mexico Collegiate Open. Fellow freshman Catherine Leger finished second at the Dr. Sander Invite with a time of 24.02, the No. 6 time in program indoor history. Pierre-Webster is currently No. 8 in program history at 24.14. Allen also helped freshman Cameron Reynolds to a seventh-place finish at the league indoor championships in the 400m, as Reynolds' time of 47.74 was good for the No. 10 time in UCLA indoor history.

Allen's sprint squad started to truly take form in his second year with the Bruins. Allen helped guide Joe Herrera and Meleni Rodney to strong 400m finishes at the Pac-12 Championships. Herrera finished second overall in the men's competition with a time of 46.25 while Rodney notched fourth place in the women's race with a time of 52.06. Rodney's mark was good for the eighth-fastest time in school history.

Allen helped guide the men's 4x100m relay team to NCAA Outdoor Championship qualification. Leon Powell, Harrison Schrage, Kenroy Higgins II, and Seth Holloway each earned USTFCCA All-America honors after combining to finish 22nd in the preliminary heats.

Rodney (400m) and Myles Webb (100m) each qualified to compete at the NCAA West Regional Championships, where they each placed in the preliminary heats. Allen also helped send the women's 4x100m squad (S. Acolatse, J. Gruenwald, T. Moses, S. Moore) to Regionals, as the team finished 16th in prelims.

Allen served as the head track & field coach and assistant football coach at College of the Sequoias from 2002-17. He led COS track & field to unprecedented success, including a state championship in 2017 for the men's program and Top 5 finishes for both men's and women's teams from 2014-17. Allen coached 2016 Olympian and 2017 USATF 200m champion Deajah Stevens to California Junior College championships in both 200 meters and 400 meters in 2015.



SEAN DENARD

Assistant Coach - Throws
1st Season at UCLA
Mount Union '12

Sean Denard was named to the position of Assistant Coach – Throws on September 24, 2021 and enters his first season with the UCLA coaching staff.

"I'm very excited to add Sean to the Bruin family," said Director of Track & Field/Cross Country Avery Anderson. "He is a very talented coach whose ability to develop throwers makes the future bright."

Denard most recently served as an Assistant Coach for CSUN Track & Field (2019-21) and has a strong history of elite coaching accomplishments. He has coached six student-athletes to NCAA titles and has 51 top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships to his coaching credit. Denard has also recruited athletes who have garnered 20 All-American accolades, as well as 33 conference and four NCAA individual or team titles. Additionally, 16 of Denard's former athletes or volunteer assistants have gone on to coach at the collegiate level.

"I would like to thank Director Avery Anderson, our staff, and Gavin Crew for showing their confidence in my abilities to connect with our student athletes, providing them a world class education and experience that will continue the longstanding tradition of excellence within the UCLA Throws and Track & Field programs," said Denard.

Denard has coached many notable athletes over his coaching career, including Sean Donnelly (Four-time NCAA Division III Champion, Olympic Trials qualifier), Bobbie Goodwin (NCAA Division II Champion), Justin Rodhe (Olympian, Commonwealth Games finalist), and Darien Thornton (NCAA Division II Champion, Olympic Trials qualifier).

"As Coach, Mentor, and Leader of this program and for these student athletes, I want to emphasize the importance of finding balance in life through studying, living, and training at the #1 public university in the world, in the greatest city in the world, and at the most successful athletic department in college sports," said Denard. "Through balance we will discover new levels of excellence and elite performances."

Denard also had coaching stops at Grand Valley State University (2014-19) and North Central College (2012-14). He graduated from the University of Mount Union in 2012, where he earned NCAA Division III All-America acclaim as a thrower.

UCLA alumnus Devin Elizondo enters his fifth season with the Bruins as Assistant Coach – Distance for the Track & Field and Cross Country Programs.

Elizondo helped lead the Bruins' young distance squad to a strong year in cross country. Peter Herold earned All-Region honors after a 25th-place finish at the NCAA West Regional Championships. The Bruin men took sixth at the Pac-12 Meet while the UCLA women improved two spots to take eighth place overall. True freshmen Mia Kane and Audrey Allen became key contributors on the women's side and junior Emma Tavella developed to become a No. 1 runner for the Bruins in postseason competition.

Ahead of the 2021 cross country season, Elizondo helped sign a freshman class of eight elite distance runners from up and down the West Coast. Four freshman Bruins are from Northern California, three are local products from Southern California, and one arrives in Westwood from Portland. Ajani Salcido is an 8:46 two-miler who won each of his seven cross country races this past season. Elizondo also brought in Patrick Curulla and Audrey Allen, who both earned NCS XC victories in 2019. Three of the four women's freshmen have already cracked the 5:00 barrier in the 1600m while Mia Kane from Portland owns a lifetime-best time of 4:38.92 in the 1500m.

Elizondo and the distance staff helped guide the UCLA Cross Country program to a successful season in a shortened 2020 campaign. The Bruin men and women each earned team victories at the Arizona Invitational (Feb. 5) and Dave Murry Invitational (Feb. 19). Michael Mireles earned an individual victory at the Arizona Invite on his freshman debut with the Bruins. Elizondo led six Bruin men to crack 3:50.00 in the 1500m, including Munir Kabbara, who ran 3:47.24 against USC to break the Lebanese national record in the event. Peter Herold etched his name in the UCLA record books after running 8:42.94 in the steeple at Pac-12s, the fifth-fastest time in program history. Elizondo also helped lead the Bruin women to a sweep of the distance events against USC, as Paige Carter (1500m), Emma Tavella (3000m), and Kira Loren (3000m steeplechase) picked up wins against the Trojans.

Elizondo helped the distance squad to an impressive 2020 indoor campaign. Junior Christina Rice broke the school record in the 5000m, clocking a time of 16:12.16 at the MPSF Championships. Rice also ran 9:20.02 in the 3000m at the UW Invitational, the second-fastest indoor mark in school history. Arturo Sotomayor (4:01.63) and Chris Morzenti (4:02.15) notched the No. 5 and No. 7 all-time UCLA indoor mile times, respectively, this past season. Graduating senior Colin Burke also etched his name in the program record books in his final season. Burke notched PRs in the 3000m (7:59.34) and 5000m (13:47.78), the No. 5 and No. 2 all-time UCLA marks in the events, respectively.

Elizondo also helped guide the men's DMR squad (Riley Kelly, Chris Morzenti, Arturo Sotomayor, and Ismail Turner) to NCAA Qualification and eventual USTFCCCA All-America accolades.

The 2019 cross country campaign produced the first USTFCCCA All-American in Elizondo's tenure, as Christina Rice finished 37th at the NCAA Championships to earn the accolade. It was the Bruins' first female All-American since Ashley Caldwell in 2005.

In the 2018 cross country season, Elizondo helped guide the women's and men's squads to fifth- and sixth-place finishes, respectively, at the Pac-12 Championships. Erika Adler also qualified individually for the NCAA Championships. The 2019 track season saw Elizondo help coach Robert Brandt two three All-America honors (Indoor: 3000m, 5000m; Outdoor: 10,000m). He also helped guide the UCLA men's and women's squads to victories in the 1500m, 3000m, and 3000m steeplechase in the annual dual meet against USC.

Elizondo's first season on the distance staff in 2017 saw the men's cross country team finished third at the Pac-12 Championships, with Brandt leading the 8k through Split 6. The men's squad went on to finish fifth at Regionals and qualify for the NCAA Championships.

Elizondo previously served as head cross country coach and assistant track & field coach at UC Davis from 2014-2017. In his first cross country season at the helm, he led the Aggie women to their first Big West Conference title since 2011 and was named the conference Women's Cross Country Coach of the Year.

In 2016, O'Neil earned Indoor All-America honors with a seventh-place finish in the DMR.

Robert (Rob) Beamer enters his sixth season as a volunteer coach for the UCLA Cross Country and Track & Field programs, specializing in the distance events.

Beamer's presence on the staff helped the Bruins' young distance squad solidify a strong year in cross country. Peter Herold earned All-Region honors after a 25th-place finish at the NCAA West Regional Championships. The Bruin men took sixth at the Pac-12 Meet while the UCLA women improved two spots to take eighth place overall. True freshmen Mia Kane and Audrey Allen became key contributors on the women's side and junior Emma Tavella developed to become a No. 1 runner for the Bruins in postseason competition.

Beamer was on the distance staff that helped guide UCLA Cross Country program to a successful season in a shortened 2020 campaign. The Bruin men and women each earned team victories at the Arizona Invitational (Feb. 5) and Dave Murry Invitational (Feb. 19). Michael Mireles earned an individual victory at the Arizona Invite on his freshman debut with the Bruins. Beamer helped coach Robert Brandt to three first-team All-America honors in the 2019 track season (Indoor: 3000m, 5000m; Outdoor: 10,000m). The UCLA men and women also swept victories in the 1500m, 3000m, and 3000m steeplechase against USC.

The women's cross country team continued to improve in Beamer's third year on the staff, finishing fifth overall at the Pac-12 Championships, the team's highest placement since a fifth-place finish in 2014. Beamer helped then-sophomore Erika Adler qualify individually for the NCAA Championships. The men's team picked up five top-50 finishes at West Regionals in 2018.

Beamer's second year on the distance coaching staff saw the Bruin men's cross country team make its second-straight team appearance at Nationals, finishing 21st overall. The men's squad secured fifth place at NCAA West Regionals following its second-straight third-place showing at the Pac-12 Championships. The women's team finished 12th and eighth at Regionals and Conference, respectively.

In his first year on the cross country staff in 2016, Beamer helped the Bruins send both their men's and women's squads to the NCAA National Championships.

Prior to coming to UCLA, Beamer coached for two stints at UC Santa Barbara under head coach Pete Dolan. His most recent (2011-2015) saw him working with the throwers, sprinters and vaulters. In 2012, Beamer was part of a staff that coached the Gauchos to the highest point total in program history on the men's side which earned a Big West conference title, with the women finishing as first runners up by a half point margin.

Athletes Beamer worked with at UCSB included NCAA championship qualifier and USATF 2015 heptathlon top finisher Barb Nwaba, who Beamer coached as a freshman (2007). NCAA championship qualifiers Beamer trained at UCSB included Jen Carey (400 meters, 52.29), Jessica Johnson (400 meters, 52.5) and Albert Hughes (hammer, 209-3).



BRIDGET ANDERSON

Volunteer Coach - Multis, Pole Vault
4th Season at UCLA
UCLA '04

Bridget Anderson enters her fourth season as a volunteer assistant at UCLA. She is married to UCLA's Director of Track & Field/Cross Country Avery Anderson and assists with the Bruins' multi and pole vault athletes.

The 2021 season saw Anderson's work with the pole vaulters result in three Pac-12 scorers in Kyle Brown (third place) and Tate Curran (eighth) on the men's side and Katerina Adamiec (seventh) in her postseason debut on the women's side. Isa Videler (5509 points) and Christina Chenault (5259 points) also both scored for the Bruins in the heptathlon at the Conference Meet, taking fifth and eighth place, respectively.

Anderson's work with the pentathletes and heptathletes this past indoor season had evident results for the Bruins. Isa Videler completed a pair of pentathlons in 2020, including a 3,899 point-performance at the MPSF Indoor Championships. Videler solidified her No. 5 position on the UCLA all-time pentathlon list with the third-place finish at the league indoor meet. Isaiah Holmes competed in the heptathlon on the men's side, finishing the season with a third-place finish at the MPSF Championships. His 5,517 points moved him into fifth place in UCLA indoor history in the event.

Prior to joining the Bruin track & field program, Anderson served 12 seasons on the California State University, Northridge coaching staff, where she was in charge of the Matador pole vaulters and multi-events student-athletes, and was the team's strength and conditioning coach for the sprinters, jumpers and multi-event athletes. During her time at CSUN, Anderson helped the Matadors win a total of 10 Big West team championships between the men's and women's programs.

Conference champions coached by Anderson include pole vault titles by Krystal Quinn in 2008 and Tiana Webberley in 2010 and 2011. LaShana Verdon won a Big West multi-event title in 2006 followed by Sherrina Lofton in both 2009 and 2011 and Robert Robinson in 2010.

Olympia Jewett, the UCLA track & field program's director of operations, competed as a heptathlete under Anderson's guidance and took home the Big West Championship in 2015. Lofton and Justin Johnson each earned All-American honors in the multi-events, and earned multiple NCAA Championship berths.

Anderson also coached three all-conference performers in the javelin, including Lance Gonzales' Big West championship in 2009.

A 2004 graduate of UCLA, Anderson came to CSUN after serving the 2004-05 season as the head track & field coach at Hoover High School in Glendale, Calif., her alma mater. Before that, Anderson was the head cross country coach at Hoover during the 2003-04 season.

The former Bridget Pearson competed in the javelin and pole vault at UCLA from 1999-2004. One of her career highlights was winning the Irish National Championships in 2000 in the pole vault. At Hoover High School, she was an All-American in the pole vault all four years and the California state champion in 1997. She claimed the CIF title in 1999 and went on to finish fourth at nationals. Anderson also competed in volleyball and water polo at Hoover before graduating in 1999.

Anderson earned her Master's Degree with Honors in Public Administration from CSUN in 2017. Anderson married Avery Anderson in 2009. The couple have a son, Andy, and a daughter, Avery.



MARK ANDERSON

Volunteer Coach
3rd Season at UCLA
UCLA '81

Former UCLA track and field great Mark Anderson enters his third year as a Volunteer Coach for the program. He is the father of current Bruin sprinter, Shae Anderson.

Anderson returns to his alma mater with an impressive athletic resume behind him. A 1981 UCLA grad, he was a standout for the Bruins in the multis. He set a school record in the decathlon with 8,171 points, a record that still stands today. Anderson was a two-time All-American in the event, winning the NCAA decathlon title in 1980 and taking second place in 1981. He was also the conference decathlon champion in 1980.

He also graduated as the school record holder in the old javelin throw with a launch of 78.05m (256-01), a mark that now ranks second in program history.



REGGIE TROTTER

Volunteer Coach
3rd Season at UCLA
CSUN '15

Former CSUN track and field student-athlete Reggie Trotter enters his third season as a Volunteer Coach for the UCLA program.

Trotter has increased his coaching responsibilities throughout his time on the Bruins' coaching staff. He provides coaching in drills and stretching exercises for several event groups and provides specific instruction in the high jump. He also assists Coach Allen with UCLA's sprint squad.

Trotter competed at CSUN under now UCLA Director of Track & Field/Cross Country Avery Anderson and volunteer coach Bridget Anderson. He was teammates with UCLA Director of Operations Olympia Jewett. Trotter earned All-Big West honors as a high jumper in 2014, notching personal-best mark of 2.06m (6-09.00) in a runner-up performance at the Big West Outdoor Championships. 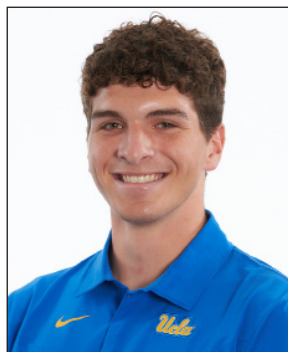

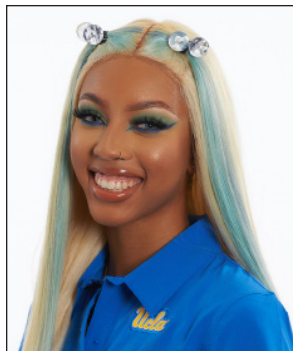

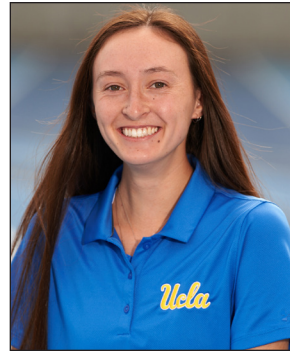

DRAKE STADIUM

Drake Stadium, one of the finest track and field facilities in the world, has been home to the UCLA track and field team since 1969.

In October 2019, the track at Drake Stadium was named the Betsy and Rafer Johnson Track in honor of legendary Bruin track star and humanitarian, Rafer Johnson, and his wife, Betsy. Rafer passed away in December 2020.

The stadium took on a new look in 1999 when it was transformed into a state-of-the-art soccer/track and field facility, adding the Frank W. Marshall Field at Drake Stadium. The stadium provides seating for 11,700 spectators. The cost of the project was \$1.5 million and was made possible by a lead gift from Frank Marshall and Kathleen Kennedy. All the money was raised from private funds; no state money was utilized.

The stadium received a state-of-the-art Mondo surface in January 2014, the first phase of a multi-phase renovation plan. The blue Mondo surface placed at Drake Stadium was the latest generation of Mondo and the same surfacing used at the 2012 Olympic Games in London. UCLA also reconfigured its shot put area and expanded the high jump area.

Phase two included an upgrade to the upper main gate to the facility, the placement of a UCLA track and field recognition area, and the installation of a new state-of-the-art video scoreboard. Entry upgrades highlight the stadium's namesake, Ducky Drake, and integrates the facility architecturally with the UCLA campus aesthetics.

The recognition plaza, which lies outside the main entry to Drake Stadium, recognizes Bruin track and field All-America selections, national champions, Olympic medalists, world champions and world record holders. The recognition area, known as Legacy Lane, highlights the rich Bruin history of men's and women's track and field and focuses on the legends of Bruin track and field.

Since its inaugural meet on Feb. 22, 1969, Drake Stadium has been the site of numerous championship meets, including the National AAU in 1976-77-78, the Pacific-8 Championships in 1970 and 1977 and the California CIF High School meet in 1969-71-77. In 1988, Drake Stadium hosted the Pacific-10 Track and Field Championships, and in 1994, the facility hosted the first-ever California-Nevada Championships. Drake Stadium again hosted the Pacific-10 Track and Field Championships in 1996 and 2005 and the Pac-12 Championships in 2015. The stadium also has been the home for UCLA women's track teams since 1975. It was the site of the National Collegiate T&F Championships (the AIAW) in 1977.

In 1973, it was officially named Drake Stadium in honor of a legend at UCLA, Elvin C. "Ducky" Drake, who had been associated with his alma mater as a student-athlete, track coach and athletic trainer for over 60 years. Drake died in Los Angeles of a heart attack on Dec. 23, 1988. He was 85.

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Rafer Johnson (1974)

Former world record-holder in the decathlon Rafer Johnson won the gold medal at the 1960 Olympics in Rome, Italy. At the 1956 Melbourne Olympics, Johnson, competing with an injury, won the silver medal in the decathlon. For the remainder of his career, he would not lose another multi-event competition.

In 1974, he was inducted into the National Track & Field Hall of Fame and, in 1984, was a charter inductee into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame. As a Bruin, he won conference championships in the 220y low hurdles in 1956 and in the javelin in 1958. Johnson lit the Olympic torch at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles. His daughter Jenny was an All-American volleyball player for the Bruins. As a Bruin senior, his son Josh placed second (248-7) in the javelin at the 1998 USA Outdoor. Johnson currently serves as the Chairman for the Board of Directors of the Southern California Special Olympics.

In 2006, Johnson was inducted into the California Sports Hall of Fame as a member of the inaugural class.

In 2019, the track at legendary Drake Stadium was renamed The Betsy and Rafer Johnson Track at Drake Stadium in honor of Johnson and his wife. UCLA has mourned the loss of Rafer after his passing in December 2020.



Jim Bush (1987)

During his tenure as UCLA's men's head coach from 1965-1984, Bush led the Bruins to an impressive 20-year dual meet record of 151-21-0 (.879), seven national dual meet titles, seven Pac-10 crowns and five NCAA championship team titles. In 1966, his Bruins recorded UCLA's first ever dual meet victory over USC, winning 86-59 at the Coliseum. From 1968-88, 23 of his athletes competed in the Olympics, winning four gold, five silver and three bronze medals.

In 1987, Bush was inducted into the National Track & Field Hall of Fame. In December 1996, he was inducted into the U.S. Track Coaches Association Hall of Fame. And, the following year (1997), he was inducted into the UCLA Hall of Fame.

To this day, UCLA Track & Field hosts the annual Jim Bush Legends Invitational in his memory.



Kate Schmidt (1994)

Kate Schmidt was inducted into the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame in 1994 and was UCLA's first female inductee. Schmidt won the NCAA javelin title in 1975 (198-1).

Nicknamed "Kate the Great" with good reason, she completely dominated the American women's javelin throwing scene for a decade. She broke the American javelin record 10 times, culminating with a throw of 227' 5" that has held up as the record for more than a quarter century. At the time, that throw was a world record and established her place on the international scene. Schmidt was third at the 1972 and 1976 Olympic Games and was also a member of the 1980 Olympic team that didn't compete. She just missed making the 1984 team when she placed fourth at the U.S. Trials. She won seven national titles and placed in the top three in 12 of 13 national championships from 1972 to 1984.



Florence Griffith-Joyner (1995)

Florence Griffith-Joyner won the NCAA 200m championship in 1982 and the 400m title in 1983. She was a silver medalist in the 200m at the 1984 Olympics and also medaled at the 1987 World Outdoor Championships, taking second in the 200m and running on the winning 4x100m relay team. At Seoul in 1988, she won three gold medals (100m, 200m, 4x100m relay) and one silver (4x400m relay), setting a world record in the 200m. It was Flo-Jo's golden moment and it will be tough to repeat.

She still holds the women's world record of 10.49 for 100 meters and 21.34 for 200 meters and no one has come close to threatening them. Her 10.49 at the 1988 Olympic Trials in Indianapolis was one of the most eye-popping performances in track and field history.

She won the Sullivan Trophy in 1988. Flo-Jo married Al Joyner, 1984 Olympic triple jump champion, in 1987. She died on September 21, 1998 at the age of 38.



Evelyn Ashford (1997)

In 1997, Evelyn Ashford was inducted into the USA Track and Field Hall of Fame. She was inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame in 1990. Ashford ranked No. 1 in the world four times in the 100m and was the top-ranked American seven times, including four in a row from 1981-84.

A competitor at the 1976 Olympic Games while attending UCLA, she also competed in the 1984, 1988 and 1992 Games, winning four gold medals and a silver. She was a two-time World record holder in the 100m.

While at UCLA, Ashford won four national collegiate titles in the sprints and relays and led the Bruins to the 1977 national championship.

In 2003, she was named to the Board of Directors for the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency, and in November of 2005 was named to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame Class of 2006.



Greg Foster (1998)

Greg Foster was one of the world's greatest hurdlers from 1981-91. He was a national collegiate champion while at UCLA in both the high hurdles (1978, '80) and 200m (1979), and still leads the All-time Bruin chart in the high hurdles (13.22).

After college, Foster won 10 national titles, both indoor and outdoor, and he won the first three world outdoor championships (1983-87-91). Foster's best Olympic Games showing was a silver in 1984. He was world-ranked for 15 of 16 years from 1977-92, achieving top-five rankings five times. He was world-ranked in the 200m in 1979 and set world indoor hurdles records in 1986 and '87. He was a member of 12 international teams, and was the 1991 world indoor champion and the 1981 World Cup winner.



Francie Larrieu Smith (1998)

Francie Larrieu Smith's running career spanned four decades and 35 U.S. distance records from 1000m to two miles. In 1998 she was inducted into the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame.

Larrieu Smith was on 28 national teams and won 21 national titles. She was a member of five Olympic teams, starting in 1972 when she ran the 1500m. Larrieu Smith also ran the 1500m at the 1976 Games and was a team member at that distance in 1980. She missed out on the 1984 team but ran the 10,000m at the 1988 Games, taking fifth. Larrieu Smith moved up to the marathon for the 1992 Games. At the '92 Games, she carried the U.S. flag at the Opening Ceremonies.

She was nationally ranked in every event from 800m to the marathon. Larrieu Smith also ran in the 1987 and '91 World Track and Field Championships in the 10,000m.

While at UCLA, Larrieu Smith won the 1974 AIAW Outdoor titles in the 880, mile and two-mile and still leads the UCLA chart in the 3000m (9:03.2).



Dwight Stones (1998)

Dwight Stones, a former world record-holder in the high jump, was one of the world's top jumpers from 1973-84. He represented the U.S. in three Olympic Games, winning the bronze in both 1972 and '76 and placing fourth in 1984. An 11-time national champion, Stones, who attended UCLA and Long Beach State, set his first world-record in Munich, Germany in 1973 by clearing 7-6.50. That jump also made him the first "flop" jumper to set a world high jump record. He raised the world record to 7-7 in 1976 and added another quarter inch to the record two months later. He won the Olympic Trials in 1972 and '84. While at UCLA, Stones placed third at the 1972 NCAA Outdoor Championships. He is now one of television's top track and field analysts.

In 2003, Stones was presented a Lifetime Achievement Award by the Los Angeles Track & Field Organizing Committee.



Willie Banks (1999)

In his first competition since retiring in 1992, Willie Banks set a world triple jump record in the 45-49 age group in June 2001 (47-8.75). In 1999, the former world record-holder in the triple jump was inducted into the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame. One of the greatest triple jumpers ever produced by the U.S., Banks had his best moment on June 16, 1985 when he set a world record of 58-11.50 at the USA Outdoor Championships in Indianapolis, IN. At UCLA, he was twice runner-up in the NCAA Championships (1977-78) and won two Pac-10 titles (1977-78).

After college, he set his first American record in 1981 and increasing that record six more times. Banks represented the U.S. in 18 international competitions and was a member of the 1980, '84 and 1988 Olympic teams. He was also on the 1983 and '87 U.S. World Championship teams. In 1985, Banks was the Track & Field News' and U.S. Olympic Committee Athlete of the Year. Banks still holds the UCLA record in the long jump with a mark of 17.05m (55-11.25), set back in 1978.



Jackie Joyner-Kersey (2004)

Jackie Joyner-Kersey was honored in 2001 by the Honda Award as the Top Women's Collegiate Athlete of the Last 25 years and by Sports Illustrated for Women as the World's Greatest Female Athlete of the 20th Century. She was also named the Summer Olympian of the Century by the Associated Press in 1999. The world record-holder in the heptathlon, JJK's six Olympic medals, including three gold, was the highest total ever won by a U.S. woman. JJK was inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame in 1996. In 1987 and '86, she was given the Jesse Owens Award.

In 2003, the UCLA track and field programs named their annual invitational the Rafer Johnson/Jackie Joyner-Kersey Invitational. JJK was inducted into the U.S. Track and Field Hall of Fame in December of 2004. She also had the ninth and 25th top moment of the past 25 years in track and field. Her world record breaking heptathlon total of 7,215 points was the ninth-best moment, while becoming the first woman to break the 7,000 point barrier was ranked 25th.



Mike Powell (2005)

In 2005, Mike Powell became the 11th Bruin member inducted into the USATF Hall of Fame.

In what many consider the greatest head-to-head competition in track and field history, Mike Powell won the 1991 World Outdoor Championships men's long jump gold medal over fellow Hall of Famer Carl Lewis by setting the world record of 8.95 meters/29 feet, 4.50 inches, in Tokyo, Japan. The mark broke the previous standard set by Bob Beamon in 1968. Powell, who also won the World Outdoor Championships gold medal in 1993, was a two-time Olympic silver medalist and six-time USA Outdoor champion. Ranked #1 in the world on four occasions, he won 34 consecutive competitions in 1993 and 1994. He was inducted into the UCLA Hall of Fame in the Class of 2020.

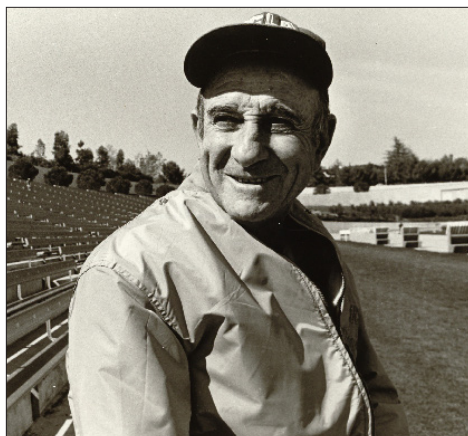


Kevin Young (2006)

Kevin Young was inducted into the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame in December of 2006. Young had an incredible career highlighted by a gold medal finish in the 400m hurdles at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics where he set a then-world record at 46.78. At the 1988 Seoul Olympics, Young finished fourth in the hurdles.

While at UCLA, Young won the 1987 and 1988 NCAA 400m hurdles titles, was the NCAA runner-up in the intermediate hurdles in 1986 and was a member of two 4x400m relay NCAA Championship teams (1987/1988). He was a three-time Pac-10 Champion in the 400m hurdles. His school-record time of 47.72, set in 1988, still stands today.

Young won the USA Track & Field Senior National 400m hurdles title in 1992 and 1993 and was the No. 1 ranked American intermediate hurdler in 1989, 1992 and 1993. For eight straight seasons (1986-1993), Young was ranked in the U.S. top-10 list, as well as in 1996 and 1998. He was the No. 1 world-ranked hurdler in 1989, 1992 and 1993, and was ranked in the top-10 in the world on eight total occasions.



Elvin C. "Ducky" Drake (2007)

Elvin "C" Ducky Drake was inducted into the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame in December of 2007, becoming the 13th Bruin to join the Hall of Fame after a storied career at UCLA.

In 19 seasons under Drake, UCLA had a dual meet record of 107-48-0 (.690) and won one NCAA Championship and one conference title. Drake was a charter member into the UCLA Hall of Fame in 1984 and was inducted into the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame.

In 1973, the Bruin track and field complex was officially named "Drake Stadium" in honor of the UCLA coaching legend who had been associated with UCLA as a student-athlete, coach and athletic trainer for over 60 years.

Some of Drake's star athletes include Rafer Johnson, C.K. Yang, George Stanich, Craig Dixon and George Brown.



Gail Devers (2011)

Gail Devers (1985-1988) was a four-time Olympian, winning two gold medals in the 100m (1996 Atlanta, 1992 Barcelona). She won four World Outdoor titles (1999-100mH, 1995-100mH, 1993-100mH/100m) and two World Indoor titles (1997, '93-60m) during her professional career.

Devers ranked No. 1 in the world in the 100m hurdles on seven different occasions (top-10 ranking 10 different years) and ranked No. 1 in the world in the 100m in 1993. In all, Devers was ranked in the top-10 in the world in the 100m seven different times. Nationally, Devers was the top 100m hurdler 10 different times (top-10 13 times). In the 100m, she ranked in the top-10 14 times (twice ranked No. 1).

While at UCLA, Devers won nine Pac-10 titles and two NCAA crowns. In all, she earned 13 All-American accolades. Today, her top times of 10.97 (100m) and 12.61 (100mH) still stand as school records. She ranks third all-time in UCLA history in the 200m (22.71) and long jump (22-02.50).



John Godina (2013)

John Godina finds his name near the top of a long list of dominant American men in the shot put. A total of four times in his career he finished the year ranked No. 1 in the World in the event and finished no worse than second in the World from 1995 until 1998.

His career is highlighted with a Silver Medal at the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games, a Bronze Medal at the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games and winning a trio of World Outdoor Championships Gold Medals ('95, '97, '01).

A standout for Bob Larsen and throws coach Art Venegas at UCLA, Godina won five NCAA individual titles in his Bruin career, including the indoor shot put and outdoor discus titles in 1994, indoor and outdoor shot put and outdoor discus championships in 1995 and setting the collegiate outdoor shot put record (72-2.5). He was a 10-time All-American in the shot put and discus and six-time Pac-10 champion. Godina is a 2005 inductee into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame.

He also won the 1998 World Cup title in the shot put and earned World Indoor Championships Gold in 2001 and Silver Medals in 1999 and 2003. Retiring in 2008, Godina was elected to the National Track & Field Hall of Fame the first year he was eligible.
