PHOTOGRAPHY

TV and photo credentials entitle video and still photographers to shoot from designated spots on the floor. Media members are not allowed to sit between the 10-foot lines on the sport court, but may be seated opposite the benches in the break between the tables if they are on the brown tarp off of the sport court. Flash photography is prohibited.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interviews must be arranged through the UCLA Sports Information Office and Assistant Sports Information Director James Ybiernas. Student-athletes have been instructed not to grant any interviews, in person or by telephone, not arranged by the Sports Information Office. Telephone numbers are private and will not be released. Please do not expect student-athletes to be available if you have not made prior arrangements.

INTERVIEW AVAILABILITY

Players and coaches are available before or after practice depending on availability. Practice is generally from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. in Pardee Gym at the John Wooden Center. Please contact the Sports Information Office to arrange access into the John Wooden Center. Afternoon interviews will require advance planning. Any photographer planning to attend practice must be cleared in advance by the John Wooden Center staff.

PAULEY PAVILION

UCLA will play all of its 2010 home matches on a SportCourt at the east end of the building.

The John Wooden Center is located on the campus of UCLA. From Los Angeles International Airport, take Century Blvd. east to the San Diego Freeway (405). Take the San Diego Freeway north to Sunset Blvd. going east. Turn right at Westwood Plaza. Parking is straight ahead at Lot 4.

One of the most storied buildings in all of collegiate athletics, Pauley Pavilion is now in its 41st season as the home of UCLA Women's Volleyball. Regarded as one of the nation's finest all-around collegiate facilities, it has been the site of numerous illustrious events, including 16 volleyball NCAA Championships (women's in 1981, '84 and '91; men's in 1970, '71, '75, '77, '79, '84, '85, '87, '89, '93, '96, '99 and '05) and the 1984 Olympics gymnastics competition.

Outside of athletics, the facility has played host to the Presidential Debate between George Bush and Michael Dukakis on Oct. 13, 1988, and a sitting President, Bill Clinton, who was the keynote speaker for UCLA's 75th anniversary convocation on May 20, 1994. On Sept. 9, 1992, the Pavilion was site of the annual MTV Video Awards show. In 1991, it served as the site for the 1991 U.S. Olympic Festival basketball and gymnastics competitions.

Beginning with the 2003 season, the Bruin women's volleyball team has averaged over 1,000 fans during home matches at Pauley Pavilion each year. The last time the Bruins played host to the NCAA women's championship, they defeated Long Beach State in a thrilling, five-game match on Dec. 21, 1991 to hoist the National Championship trophy in front of a Pauley Pavilion-record crowd of 7,177.

Pauley Pavilion was built at a total cost of \$6 million and was introduced to the University at the June 1965 Commencement exercises, at which time it was dedicated and named for Regent Edwin W. Pauley, the principal donor to the building fund. In October of 1990, a highly-efficient lighting system was installed that double the lighting capability in the Pavilion. In October 1999, a state-of-the-art video scoreboard was installed in the multi-purpose facility.

The facility contains 10,337 permanent upholstered seats and retractable bleachers for 2,482 spectators. The UCLA women's volleyball team plays on a sport court at the east end of the arena. For volleyball, capacity is listed at 4,500 spectators while the basketball configuration seats 12,819.

Between 1983 and 1995, the UCLA women's volleyball team played some of their regular-season home contests in the more intimate setting of the Wooden Center. Attendance averages for matches in the Wooden Center from 1990-94 hovered around 1,200 per match, and topped out with a standing-room only crowd of 2,500 to see the Bruins face Stanford on Oct. 19, 1991. The Wooden Center, which will serve as the Bruins' home in 2011 during Pauley Pavilion's renovation, has also played host to many NCAA volleyball matches over the year, particularly first-round contests and regional competition.

UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero announced on Feb. 10, 2010 that Mike Sealy has been named head coach of the Bruin women's volleyball program. Sealy returns to his alma mater after spending the last four seasons as an associate head coach at the University of Hawai'i. He was a three-time All-American and an assistant coach for four years with the UCLA men's volleyball team and was an assistant with the Bruin women's volleyball program in 2005.

"We are excited to welcome back Mike Sealy to lead the women's volleyball program," Guerrero said. "Mike clearly possesses the necessary credentials to allow UCLA to compete at the highest level. He is well-respected in the volleyball community and has an enthusiastic and passionate approach towards the game. Furthermore, as a former Bruin player and coach, he understands the tradition of excellence that has defined the volleyball programs at UCLA and I am confident that he will continue that legacy of success with ambition and integrity."

"I am very excited and inspired to be back at UCLA," said Sealy, who will assume his head coaching duties on March 1. "I feel very fortunate and humbled to take over a program with such a storied history. I would like to thank Dan Guerrero and (Senior Associate Athletic Director/Senior Women's Administrator) Petrina Long for giving me this opportunity and for supporting my vision for the future of the program."

Sealy helped Hawai'i to a berth in the National Semifinals in 2009. The Rainbow Wahine recorded their second-straight, 30-win season last year, going 32-3 overall. They also posted a 16-0 mark in conference play to earn their 14th-straight Western Athletic Conference title and went on to claim

their 10th-consecutive WAC Tournament championship. Sealy's record during his tenure at Hawai'i was 119-19 (.862 winning percentage).

Prior to his stint at Hawai'i, Sealy coached for four seasons at UCLA, where he was an assistant on the men's side from 2003-2006 and an assistant for the women's volleyball team in 2005. In his lone season on the women's side, the Bruins posted a 20-11 record and advanced to the Regional Semifinals. With the UCLA men, Sealy was 91-38 (.705) during his four campaigns, helping the Bruins to an NCAA Championship in 2006 and an NCAA Runner-Up finish in 2005. Sealy was also a volunteer assistant with the Cal State Northridge men's volleyball team in 2000 before working in the same capacity with the UCLA men in 2001.

One of the top setters in UCLA history, Sealy was a four-year letterwinner with the Bruins from 1990-93 and ranks fourth in Bruin annals in assists (4,749). In his senior season, Sealy and the Bruins won the program's 14th National Championship, going 24-3. The team captain was named the co-Most Outstanding Player of the 1993 NCAA Tournament and also earned ASICS/Volleyball Monthly Player of the Year and AVCA All-American first-team honors. In addition, Sealy was named an All-American in 1991 (first-team) and 1992 (third-team), as well as All-Conference three times. The Bruins won three conference titles during Sealy's days, posting an 80-24 (.769) overall mark.

Following his playing career in Westwood, Sealy went on to play professionally in Switzerland, Belgium, Holland and Puerto Rico. He also played with the U.S. National Team in 1994 and 1997. Sealy graduated from UCLA in 1993 with a degree in physiological science.

Dan Connors begins his fifth season with the UCLA women's volleyball program in 2010. The Bruins have reached the postseason all four years Connors has been on staff, including three trips to the NCAA Regionals and a berth in the National Semifinals in 2006. The Bruins have a record of 102-35 (.745 winning percentage) during Connors' tenure.

During his four seasons, the Bruins have ranked first in the Pac-10 in blocks per set three times ('06, '08, '09) and have held opponents to under a .182 hitting percentage each year. Nationally, UCLA has ranked in the Top 30 in bps every season, including fifth in 2006, eighth in 2008 and ninth last year.

Connors' collegiate coaching career began at Cal State Northridge, where he was the top assistant from 2004-06 and helped the Matadors to a 56-36 record. He has also served as the head coach of the West Coast Volleyball Club Boys U-18 squad. Just prior to the '05 women's season, he was

named the interim coach for Occidental College, an NCAA Division III program in Eagle Rock, Calif.

As a member of the UCLA men's volleyball team during his collegiate tenure, Connors played on the 2001 NCAA runner-up team as the Bruins lost to BYU in the championship match. He averaged 6.25 assists per game during that season.

Following his collegiate career, Connors played professionally for the Almoradi Volleyball Club in Almoradi, Spain. As the team's setter, he led the squad to a first-place standing during the regular season and a third-place postseason tournament finish. While in Spain, Connors started his coaching career, working with an Under-16 girls team associated with the Almoradi club.

A native of Apple Valley, Calif., Connors was a three-sport athlete at Apple Valley High School before attending UCLA. He earned his degree in political science from UCLA in 2001.

Connors was engaged to Becky Green in Spring '10 and the couple will be married in Spring '11.

On March 11, UCLA head women's volleyball coach Mike Sealy announced the hiring of assistant coach Joy McKenzie-Fuerbringer, an All-American player at Long Beach State and successful club coach.

"Joy is a well-respected player and coach and her reputation adds to the tradition and legacy we have here and only makes us stronger and better," Sealy said.

McKenzie-Fuerbringer brings 14 years of experience as the head coach, head trainer and club director of Mizuno Volleyball Club. The club director since the program's inception in 1994, her teams have won 14 USA Volleyball Junior National Championship medals. In 2002, she was an assistant for the Youth National Team, which won the gold medal for the U.S. in the NORCECA Youth Girls' Volleyball Championship. She has also trained over 100 high school and college All-Americans and two Gatorade Players of the Year in the last five years. McKenzie-Fuerbringer has trained youth players at the highest

levels of beach volleyball in the United States and the FIVB World Championships for the last decade. In February, she accepted a position to sit on the USA Volleyball Board of Directors as its elite beach development representative.

McKenzie-Fuerbringer coached for two seasons at Long Beach State (1999-2000), helping the 49ers to a National Semifinal appearance in '99. She also coached for two seasons at Golden West College (1996-97), as Golden West claimed a pair of state championships, as well as for one season at both Long Beach Wilson and Los Alamitos High Schools.

As a player, McKenzie-Fuerbringer helped Long Beach State win a National Championship in 1993. The team captain was a second-team All-American, first-team All-Region and first-team All-Big West honoree during her senior campaign, leading the team in assists. The 49ers also reached the title game in 1991 and the National Semifinals in 1992. After her days at Long Beach, she competed for two seasons on the Bud Light 4-Person Tour and was named Rookie of the Year in 1995 and the Best Defensive Player and Best Setter of the Year in 1996. McKenzie-Fuerbringer played an additional season on the AVP Tour, as well as competing professionally in indoor leagues and coaching in Holland and Spain from 1999-2002.

McKenzie-Fuerbringer graduated from Long Beach State in 1994 with a bachelor's in liberal studies and sociology. She resides in Redondo Beach with her husband and AVP Tour player Matt, daughter Charlie and son Mateo.

O'Dell was a standout setter at Penn State from 2003-06, helping the Nittany Lions to four trips to the Final Four, including a National Championship appearance in 2006. O'Dell was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team in '06 and also earned All-Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association honors every season,

receiving first-team honors as a sophomore, junior and senior.

O'Dell led Penn State in assists per set each season and was in the top four every year in digs and blocks per set. His 4,993 assists rank second in Penn State history and he is also tied for eighth with 301 block assists and 10th with 342 total blocks. O'Dell played in 120 matches with the Nittany Lions, recording 186 kills, 40 aces and 469 digs over 397 games played.

Last year, O'Dell played professionally for Ginasio Clube Vilacondense in Portugal, leading the team to its highest finish in club history.

O'Dell's coaching days began with the Long Beach Wilson High School boys' varsity team in 2009, helping the team advance to the CIF semifinals. He coached for Mizuno Long Beach 16's and 17's in 2010. The 17's squad finished fifth at the Junior National Championships, while the 16's squad placed 27th. O'Dell has also worked camps for Gold Medal Squared the past two summers.

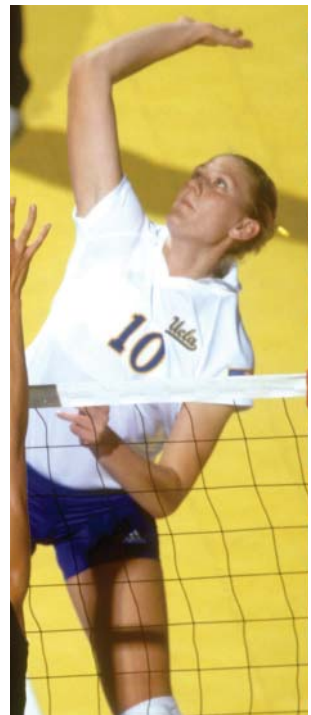

The Pacific-10 Conference continues to uphold its tradition as the "Conference of Champions"®, claiming an incredible 171 NCAA team titles over the past 20 years, including eight in 2009-10, averaging nearly nine championships per academic year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-10's success, with championships coming in 26 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-10 has led the nation in NCAA Championships in 44 of the last 50 years and finished second five times.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievements, the Pac-10 has captured 390 NCAA titles (267 men's, 123 women's), far outdistancing the runner-up Big Ten Conference's 226 titles.

The Conference's reputation is further proven in the annual Learfield Sports Directors' Cup competition, the prestigious award that honors the best overall collegiate athletics programs in the country. STANFORD won its unprecedented 16th-consecutive Directors' Cup in 2009-10, continuing its remarkable run. Seven of the top 25 Division I programs were Pac-10 member institutions: No. 1 STANFORD, No. 4 UCLA, No. 9 CALIFORNIA, No. 13 USC, No. 14 OREGON, No. 22 ARIZONA STATE and No. 24 WASHINGTON. The Pac-10's three teams in the top 10 was second-most for any conference, behind only the ACC (4), while the Big 12, Big Ten and SEC had one team each.

It was also a historic year for the Pac-10 off the field. After 26 years as Pac-10 Commissioner, Tom Hansen retired from his position and on July 1, 2009, was succeeded by Larry Scott, the former Chairman and CEO of the WTA Tour, a 2008 TIME Magazine Best Sports Executive and a former All-American tennis player at Harvard University. Eleven months later, the Conference announced the expansion of the Pac-10 to include Colorado (2012) and Utah (2011), the first time since 1978 the league has invited new members.

The Pac-10 captured eight NCAA titles in 2009-10, tying with the ACC for the most in the country. Of the eight titles, Pac-10 teams claimed a nation's-best five women's NCAA crowns. California also captured the IRA National Championship in men's rowing, the Pac-10's ninth national title of the season.

OREGON, STANFORD, UCLA and USC each claimed NCAA team titles in the last academic year. The Trojans were the only team in the nation to win three crowns, while the Cardinal and Bruins joined USC as three of only nine institutions to claim multiple crowns.

The Trojans swept the men's and women's water polo titles, also adding the men's tennis crown to its trophy case. The Cardinal claimed the top spot in men's volleyball and women's tennis, while the Bruins took home titles in women's gymnastics and softball. The Pac-10 also had runners-up in 14 NCAA Championship events: men's cross country (OREGON), women's soccer (STANFORD), men's water polo (UCLA), women's basketball (STANFORD), men's gymnastics (STANFORD), men's swimming (CALIFORNIA), women's swimming (STANFORD), men's indoor track and field (OREGON), baseball (UCLA), softball (ARIZONA), women's golf (USC), women's rowing (CALIFORNIA), women's outdoor track and field (OREGON) and women's water polo (STANFORD). Overall, the Conference had 33 teams finish in the top four at 20 NCAA Championship events.

Participation in the postseason was a common occurrence for the Pac-10 in 2009-10. Of the 22 sports sponsored by the Conference, 19 witnessed at least half its teams participating in NCAA or other postseason action. The men sent 64 of a possible 90 teams into the postseason (71.1 percent), while the women sent 73 of a possible 99 teams (73.7 percent).

On the men's side, Pac-10 members have won 267 NCAA team championships, far ahead of the 200 claimed by the runner-up Big Ten. Men's NCAA crowns have come at a phenomenal rate for the Pac-10 - 15 basketball titles by five schools (more than any other conference), 51 tennis titles, 44 outdoor track & field crowns, and 26 baseball titles. Pac-10 members have won 24 of the last 41 NCAA titles in volleyball, 36 of the last 51 in water polo, and 21 in swimming & diving national championships.

Individually, the Conference has produced an impressive number of NCAA men's individual champions, as well, boasting 1,171 individual crowns.

On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 29 years ago, Pac-10 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 21 occasions, including 2009-10. Overall, the Pac-10 has captured 123 NCAA women's titles, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second with 74. Pac-10 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 22 softball titles, 19 tennis crowns, 13 of the last 20 volleyball titles, 13 of the last 21 trophies in golf, and 11 in swimming & diving.

Pac-10 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 527 NCAA individual crowns, an average of nearly 19 championships per season.

The roots of the Pacific-10 Conference date back over 90 years to December 2, 1915, when the Pacific Coast Conference (PCC) was founded at a meeting at the Oregon Hotel in Portland, Ore. The original membership consisted of four schools - the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Washington, the University of Oregon, and Oregon State College (now Oregon State University). All still are charter members of the Conference.

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916 and, one year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the league, with Stanford University following in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California (USC) and the University of Idaho. In 1924, the University of Montana joined the league roster, and in 1928, the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-member league until 1950, with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II curtailed intercollegiate athletic competition to a minimum. During that time, the league's first commissioner was named. Edwin N. Atherton was Commissioner in 1940 and was succeeded by Victor O. Schmidt in 1944. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and joined the Mountain States Conference. The PCC continued as a nine-team Conference through 1958.

In 1959, the PCC was dissolved and the Athletic Associates of Western Universities was formed and Thomas J. Hamilton was appointed Commissioner of the new league. The original AAUW membership included California, Stanford, Southern California, UCLA and Washington. Washington State joined the membership in 1962, while Oregon and Oregon State joined in 1964. Under Hamilton's watch, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted in 1968. In 1971, Wiles Hallock took over as Commissioner of the Pac-8.

Ten years later, on July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted to the league and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality. In 1986-87, the league took on a new look, expanding to include 10 women's sports. Thomas C. Hansen was named the Commissioner of the Pac-10 in 1983, a role he would hold for 26 years until 2009. Hansen was succeeded by current Commissioner Larry Scott, who took on the new role in July 2009.

Currently, the Pac-10 sponsors 11 men's sports and 11 women's sports. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and three women's sports.

The University of Colorado accepted an invitation to join the Pac-10 on June 11, 2010, and on June 17, 2010, the University of Utah agreed to join the Conference. The Buffaloes and Utes will become the 11th and 12th members of the Conference, the first additions to the league since 1978.

The Pacific-10 Conference offices are located 25 miles east of San Francisco in Walnut Creek, Calif.

HISTORY



1971-72 DGWS CHAMPIONS (28-1)

The Division of Girls and Women's Sports (DGWS) was the first sanctioning body for the National Women's Volleyball Tournament and would later evolve into the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) in 1972. But in the final year before the implementation of the AIAW, UCLA captured its first-ever crown with an 8-0 record at the DGWS Nationals. Prior to the fall of 1972, the women's volleyball season was played out from October to February. UCLA steamrolled through the 1971 portion of its season with a 20-1 record, dropping just six sets. The 1971-72 Nationals took place at Miami Dade Junior College in February and the Bruins continued their domination, pulling out seven straight-set victories (sets were best 2-of-3). The lone match that went the distance was the final one against Long Beach State on Feb. 7, 1972, with UCLA prevailing 2-1 to clinch the championship.

1974 AIAW CHAMPIONS (28-2)

Following back-to-back, top-five finishes in their first two AIAW seasons of 1972 and 1973, the Bruins returned to the top of the mountain in 1974. UCLA began the season on a 20-match winning streak, losing just two sets during the first two months. A bump in the road occurred just prior to the start of AIAW Nationals, when the Bruins lost a pair of matches on Dec. 7 at the SCWIAAC Championships to UC Santa Barbara and Long Beach State to finish third in league. But it would be the last time UCLA tasted defeated during the 1974 campaign, running the table during AIAW Nationals to win the program's second title. All eight matches over the three-day tournament would be straight-set victories, including a 15-7, 15-8 win on Dec. 14 against Hawai'i in the championship game. Three of the greatest players in UCLA history, Terry Condon, Nina Grouwinkel and Lesley Knudsen, led the team to the school's second National Championship.

1975 AIAW CHAMPIONS (32-2)

The UCLA women's volleyball team made it back-to-back AIAW titles in 1975, finishing the season on a 17-match winning streak to claim its third school championship. The only blemishes during the Bruins' 32-2 campaign were three-set losses to Cal State Northridge and Long Beach State. The Bruins were challenged more than in either of their previous two championship runs, losing as many games in 1975 (13) as in 1971-72 and 1974 combined (13). After sweeping through the SCWIAAC Championships and the Western Regionals, the Bruins traveled to Princeton, N.J. for AIAW Nationals. UCLA was perfect through the first six matches, not dropping a game and setting up a rematch of the 1974 championship contest against Hawai'i. The result would be the same for the Bruins, defeating the Rainbow Wahine 14-12, 15-11 on Dec. 14 to take the crown. The championship was the second in a row for six UCLA Bruins, including team captain Nina Grouwinkel and U.S. National Team members Terry Condon and Lesley Knudsen.

In its fourth season since the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) started to sponsor women's championships, and after knocking on the door in 1981 but losing on its home court to cross-town rival USC and falling in '83 to Hawai'i in the title match, UCLA brought home its first NCAA women's volleyball title in 1984.

It was a dream season for the Bruins capped off by an epic battle in the title match against Stanford. Still two years removed from becoming members of the Pacific-10 Conference, the Bruins were dismantling the competition in the Western Collegiate Athletic Association (WCAA). After winning the league title in 1983, the Bruins posted a second-place finish in '84 with an 11-3 conference mark. UCLA, which completed the regular season with a 29-6 record, earned a first-round bye into the 28-team NCAA field and traveled to Austin, Tex. to face Duke in the Regional Semifinals. The Bruins routed the Blue Devils 15-4, 15-3, 15-8 to setup a Regional Final with the host Longhorns. With the home court crowd cheering them on, Texas won a hard-fought first game by a score of 17-15, but UCLA battled back to win the next three (15-11, 15-13, 16-14) to advance to the Final Four for the second straight season.

For the second time in four seasons, UCLA hosted the NCAA Championship, and in an All-California Final Four, faced San Jose State in the semifinals. The Spartans were no match for the host Bruins, falling 15-6, 15-2, 15-4 in just 50 minutes to setup a final between UCLA and Stanford, which beat Pacific in its semifinal match. The Bruins were determined to not let their home court advantage go to waste like in 1981 and won the first game 15-12. The Cardinal rallied back for a 15-7 victory in game two, but UCLA re-took the lead with a 15-10 triumph in the third game. Stanford forced a deciding fifth set with a 15-9 win in game four, and took that momentum into game five, scoring the first five points and jumping out to what seemed like an insurmountable 11-2 advantage. But the Bruins chipped away thanks to the play of All-American and Honda Award winner Liz Masakayan. Behind five of her kills, the Stanford deficit was cut to 13-8. Then the school's all-time leader in aces served four straight winners to make it 13-12. After six side outs, the Bruins netted two more points to earn match point at 14-13. Masakayan would spike home the winner to give UCLA its first NCAA title.

Masakayan finished the match with 32 kills and 24 digs and was named to the All-Tournament Team, being joined by All-American Michelle Boyette and Merja Connolly.

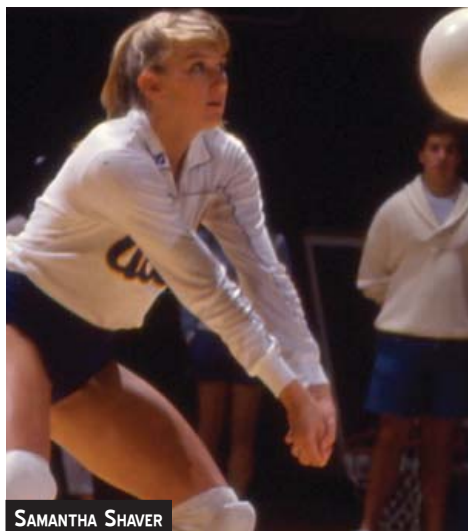

The UCLA women's volleyball team achieved back-to-back Final Four appearances in 1988 and '89, but fell short of their ultimate goal of a national title with semifinal losses both times. The third time was the charm for the Bruins though in 1990, almost running the table and finishing the season with a school-best record of 36-1.

When the Bruins lost to Nebraska on Sept. 6 in a rematch of a 1989 National Semifinal match, UCLA held a 3-1 record. From that point on, the Bruins would not taste defeat for the remainder of the year. UCLA swept through the Pac-10 season at 18-0 for its third-straight league title, despite not having the services of four-time All-American Elaine Youngs, who was sidelined with a knee injury for the entire season.

The Bruins were rewarded for their spectacular regular season by staying home for the first three rounds of the NCAA Tournament. First up in the opening round was Gonzaga, which the Bruins quickly dispatched in straight sets. In the Regional Semifinals against New Mexico, a tough Lobos team took the second game to even the match, but the Bruins rebounded with a resounding 15-3 win in game three and a 16-14 victory in game four to advance to the Regional Finals. Taking on conference rival Stanford in the final, the Bruins coasted to a three-set victory to advance to their third consecutive Final Four.

UCLA met up with LSU in the National Semifinal and were determined to not let this match, as it had been the previous two years, be the last one of the season. Game one against the Lady Tigers was a back-and-forth affair, but the Bruins came out on top 15-13. UCLA never trailed in game two to win 15-10 and then dismantled the Tigers in game three, hitting .519 to take it 15-6 and advance to its first National Championship match since its title-winning season of 1984. The only thing that stood in the way of the Bruins and the program's fifth national title was Pacific. It didn't turn out to be much of a threat, as for the second straight match, the Bruins bested a group of Tigers. In a scant 75 minutes, UCLA swept Pacific 15-9, 15-12, 15-7 to win its second NCAA Championship.

Standout All-American Natalie Williams was named the Most Valuable Player of the tournament and was joined on the All-Tournament Team by fellow All-American Jenny Evans, Marissa Hatchett and Holly McPeak.

With three consecutive Final Four trips, UCLA was having one of the most successful runs in the history of the program. But with just one national title, it left the Bruins wanting more and they responded with another NCAA Championship in 1991 to go back-to-back.

UCLA carried over its 33-match win streak from the 1990 championship season and had it at 35 until a bump in the road in Hawaii. Leading the Rainbow Wahine 2-0, Hawai'i stormed back for a five-game win to upset the Bruins. UCLA won 13 of its next 14 matches, but had a bit of a stumble, dropping two of three home matches to Stanford and Texas. The loss to the Cardinal snapped the Bruins' 62-match Pac-10 winning streak. Another loss to Stanford on Nov. 15 would unseat the Bruins as three-time defending league champs.

Postseason play began on Dec. 6 at home against Pepperdine, who the Bruins quickly beat in straight sets. The next round would send the Bruins to Stanford. UCLA beat New Mexico in three games in the Regional Semifinal to setup a final with Stanford for the second straight season. Last year, the Regional Final had been on UCLA's home court, but Stanford was the home team this time and had the confidence of having already defeated the Bruins twice during the regular season. The Cardinal confidence would be demolished in just eight minutes. UCLA took game one by a 15-2 score and went on to sweep Stanford to advance to its fourth consecutive Final Four. UCLA returned to Pauley Pavilion as host of the Final Four, hoping to achieve back-to-back titles in front of its home crowd.

Up first in the National Semifinal was Ohio State. The Bruins hit .423 for the match and bucked the Buckeyes 15-8, 15-8, 15-5. The stage was set for a second-straight title and the opponent would be Long Beach State. The 49ers led for most of the first game and took it 15-12. Game two was a scorcher, lasting 30 minutes, but with the set tied at 13, Long Beach netted two straight points to take a two-game lead. UCLA jumped out quick in game three with five straight points, but the 49ers battled back to take a 10-9 advantage. Long Beach still led at 12-11, but the Bruins posted the final four points of the game to take it 15-11. The Bruins again jumped out to a lead at 6-1 in game four, but even when Long Beach cut it to 7-4, UCLA netted seven straight to take a commanding 14-4 lead and eventually won the set 15-6. As was the case in the previous two games, the Bruins took an early edge at 7-3 and they would not look back. On match point, Natalie Williams scored the winner to give UCLA its sixth national title.

All-Americans Williams and Elaine Youngs were both named to the All-Tournament Team, with Williams earning co-MVP honors.

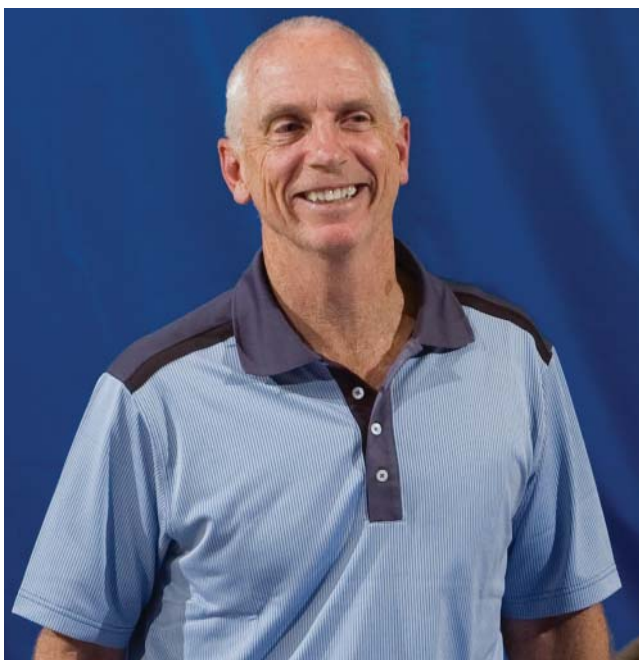

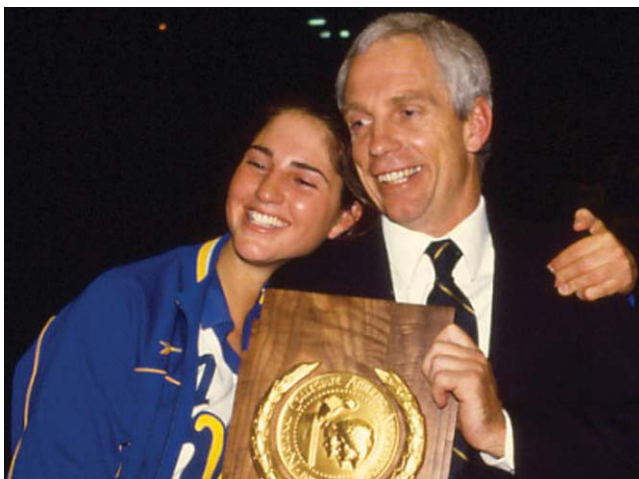

Andy Banachowski, the winningest Division I women's volleyball coach in history, retired on June 30, 2010 following a 43-year career at the helm of the UCLA women's volleyball program.

In his final season in 2009, Banachowski guided the Bruins to a 24-9 record. It was the program's 11th-consecutive, 20-win season, as UCLA finished in a tie for second in the Pac-10. On Oct. 31, 2009, Banachowski won his 1,100th match in a five-set triumph at Stanford. His final career record was 1,106-301 (.786).

In 2006, Banachowski led the Bruins to their first Final Four appearance and 30-win season since 1994. UCLA won its first 20 matches of the year and breezed through the first four rounds of the NCAA Tournament with four straight three-game sweeps. Following the 2006 season, Banachowski was honored as the Tachikara/AVCA Division I National Coach of the Year, the second time he had been named Coach of the Year, with the other coming in 1989. He also received Volleyball Magazine Coach of the Year honors for the fifth time and AVCA Pacific Region COY accolades for the fifth time (1989, '92, '93, '98). On five occasions, Banachowski was named Pacific-10 Conference Coach of the Year (1988, '89, '93, '94, '98).

Banachowski, the first women's volleyball coach inducted into the National Volleyball Hall of Fame, coached at least one All-American in each of his last six seasons. UCLA women's volleyball earned 42 AVCA All-American honors, to go with 51 Under Armour/Volleyball Magazine All-American awards under Banachowski. He also coached players to numerous other awards, including 49 All-Pacific Region honors, 98 All-Conference awards, five Pac-10 Players of the Year and the National Player of the Year in 1992 (Natalie Williams). Eighteen Bruins earned All-NCAA Tournament accolades, including Williams, who was named Most Outstanding Player in both 1990 and 1991. Williams also won two Honda Awards under Banachowski's tutelage in 1992 and '93, with Liz Masakayan earning the honor in 1985.

Banachowski and UCLA women's volleyball have been synonymous since the program's inception in 1965. He directed the Bruins for all but two of those seasons, the 1968-69 and 1969-70 campaigns, which directly followed his graduation.

The Bruins won six national championships over Banachowski's tenure, winning the program's first title in 1972 while affiliated with the Division of Girls and Women's Sports (DGWS). In 1974 and 1975, UCLA combined for a record of 60-4, winning back-to-back Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) championships. Since 1981 when the NCAA began sponsoring women's sports, the Bruins have appeared in 11 Final Fours, winning championships in 1984, 1990 and 1991 and earning runner-up finishes in 1981, 1983, 1992 and 1994. Banachowski has more victories than any other collegiate volleyball coach in history, with the exception of UCLA men's volleyball coach Al Scates. On Nov. 12, 2005, Banachowski became the first Division I women's coach to reach 1,000 career victories when the Bruins handed eventual national champion Washington its only loss of the season in a five-game thriller at Pauley Pavilion.

In February 2007, Banachowski was named head coach of USA Volleyball's Junior National Team. That July, he guided Team USA to a fourth-place finish at the FIVB U-20 Junior World Championships, the best-ever finish for the United States in that tournament.

Banachowski has been involved with the U.S. Olympic Team as a coach many times. He is a former advisor with the U.S. National Team, helping teams during the 1990 Goodwill Games, the 1992 Summer Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain, the 1995 Pan-American Games in Argentina and the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta. Additionally, he coached the West Team in the 1986 Olympic Festival. In 1993, Banachowski was the head coach of the U.S. World University Games squad, a group which achieved the highest American finish in WUG history, earning a silver medal in Buffalo, N.Y.

A total of 22 former Bruins have trained with the U.S. National Team following their UCLA careers. The group includes five indoor and eight beach Olympians. The beach team of former Bruins Annett (Buckner) Davis and Jenny (Johnson) Jordan, as well as former Bruin Holly McPeak, comprised three of the four members of the U.S. Beach Volleyball Team for the Sydney Olympics in 2000. Additionally, Elisabeth Bachman was a member of the 2004 U.S. Olympic Team (indoor) for the Athens Games. On the beach in '04, a team of former Bruins (McPeak and Elaine Youngs) won a bronze medal with Masakayan as their coach. Youngs (with partner Nicole Branagh) returned to the Beijing Games in 2008 with Masakayan as their coach.

Many Bruins have also been involved in the Association of Volleyball Professionals (AVP) Tour on the beach, including Davis, Jordan, McPeak, Youngs, Ashley Bowles, Lauren Fendrick and Chrissie Zartman. From 1993-2000, former UCLA players competed in 83 straight professional tournament finals, winning 70 of those events. Bruin former players have won more FIVB International events than players from any other college.

On Oct. 24, 1997, Banachowski became the first women's volleyball coach in history to be inducted into the National Volleyball Hall of Fame as a coach. He has since become the first volleyball inductee into the Serra High School and San Mateo County Halls of Fame and was inaugurated into the National Polish-American Sports Hall of Fame in June 2009.

In May 2000, Banachowski was presented with USA Volleyball's highest honor, the All-Time Great Coach Award, and was simultaneously honored with the George L. Fisher "Leader in Volleyball" award, recognizing his off-court endeavors on behalf of volleyball.

The Volleyball Festival has recognized Banachowski with its "Distinguished Service to USA Volleyball" award, and he has also been recognized with the Founders Award for his role as a co-founder of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

As a player, Banachowski was a two-time All-American under Scates, winning USVBA National Championships in 1965 and 1967. After his graduation, Banachowski pulled double-duty with the UCLA women's and men's volleyball programs, serving as Scates' chief assistant from 1972-77, a period in which the Bruins won four NCAA titles (1972, '74, '75, '76). On three occasions (1972, '74 and '75), Banachowski won titles with both the men and women.

DR. GENE BLOCK
CHANCELLOR
STANFORD, 1970
FOURTH YEAR

Dr. Gene Block became chancellor of UCLA in August 2007. As chief executive officer, he oversees all aspects of the university's three-part mission of education, research and service.

A champion of public universities, Chancellor Block quickly called for UCLA to deepen its engagement with Los Angeles and to increase access for students from underrepresented populations. An advocate of interdisciplinary scholarship, he has spearheaded a process of broad-based, campuswide strategic planning.

Chancellor Block holds UCLA faculty appointments in psychiatry and bio-behavioral sciences in the David Geffen School of Medicine and in physiological science in the College of Letters and Science. He also heads a research laboratory on campus that is funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Previously, Chancellor Block served as vice president and provost of the University of Virginia, where he headed an NIH graduate training program aimed at increasing the number of scientists from underrepresented groups. In

1998, he received the Commonwealth of Virginia's Outstanding Public Service Award for his work with Virginia's business community.

A native of Monticello, N.Y., Chancellor Block holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Stanford University and a master's and Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Oregon.

Chancellor Block and his wife, Carol, have two adult children.



DAN GUERRERO
ATHLETIC DIRECTOR
UCLA, 1974
NINTH YEAR

On April 25, 2002, Daniel G. Guerrero was named UCLA's eighth Director of Athletics. A former Bruin baseball player, Guerrero, who assumed his duties on July 1, 2002, has enjoyed great success and exudes the pride of a student-athlete who is in charge of the program at his alma mater.

Guerrero is one of the most respected and talented administrators in all of intercollegiate athletics. He is the current president of the Division I Athletic Directors Association. In addition, he is the first vice-president of the National Assn. of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and a member of the NACDA Executive Committee.

This past June, Guerrero completed a five-year term on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee. As the chair in 2009-10, he was involved with the negotiation of the new \$10.8 million, 14-year NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament television package as well as the decision to expand the Tournament to 68 teams.

In Guerrero's eight years as AD, he has clearly established a pattern of "image and substance" that few in his

profession can match. UCLA stands as the No. 1 University in the nation for NCAA team championships (106) won, a number that continues to grow under his direction. In those eight years, UCLA teams have won 20 NCAA team titles (the highest total in the nation in that span) in 11 different sports, finished second 16 times and have had an additional 28 Top Five finishes (64 total). A staggering 152 teams (of 184 possible) have qualified for NCAA post-season competition and the football team has appeared in seven bowl games. The program has also won 45 conference championships in 15 different sports, produced over 400 All-Americans and featured four Honda Award winners, including the 2003-04 Collegiate Woman Athlete of the Year.

In the last eight years, UCLA has finished second three times (2007-08, 2006-07 and 2005-06),

third twice (2004-05 and 2003-04), fourth (2009-10), sixth (2002-03) and 16th (2008-09) in the race for the Leerfield Sports Directors' Cup.

This past year, UCLA placed fourth in competition for the Leerfield Cup and won its 11th NCAA Championship in softball and its sixth in women's gymnastics. The Bruins finished second in baseball and men's water polo, tied for third in women's soccer (seventh straight College Cup), fifth in women's water polo, tied for fifth in men's soccer and men's tennis, sixth in women's golf, tied for ninth in women's tennis, 12th in women's rowing, 16th in men's golf, tied for 17th in women's basketball and women's volleyball and 19th in women's swimming. UCLA also won three conference titles and two league post-season tournaments and the football team won the EagleBank Bowl.

Guerrero came to UCLA in 2002 from UC Irvine, where he had served as UCI's fifth Director of Athletics for 10 years. Prior to arriving at UC Irvine, he was the Athletic Director for five years at Cal State Dominguez Hills (1988-92). He received his Bachelor's degree from UCLA in 1974 and played second base in the Bruin baseball program for four years.

Born on November 10, 1951 in Tucson, AZ, he is married to the former Anne Marie Aniello and they have two daughters: Jenna and Katie.

SR. ASSOCIATE AD/SWA

SEVENTH YEAR

Petrina Long is in her seventh year as senior associate athletic director/senior women's administrator at UCLA, having joined the staff in June of 2004.

Long has oversight responsibility for several sports, including women's basketball, women's volleyball, softball and gymnastics, as well as several administrative areas, among them academic services, compliance, equity issues, and governmental relations.

Long came to UCLA from UC Irvine, where she served as senior associate athletic director/senior women's administrator since 1993, working closely with Bruin athletic director Dan Guerrero. She also served as interim athletic director following Guerrero's departure to UCLA.

In addition to her UCLA commitments, Long is also extensively involved in a number of areas relating to intercollegiate athletics. She currently serves as chair of the new NCAA Recruiting Cabinet after serving for three years as chair of the NCAA Academics and Eligibility Cabinet (AEC) Subcommittee on Recruiting. Long also serves on the NCAA Men's Volleyball Committee. On the

conference level, Long is an administrative liaison to several sports, including women's volleyball, cross-country, track & field, and men's soccer. Long received her B.A. degree in Anthropology from the University of California, Berkeley in 1977 and her Master's degree in Anthropology from Columbia in 1992. She and her husband, Sam McCamey, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Monte and Traland.

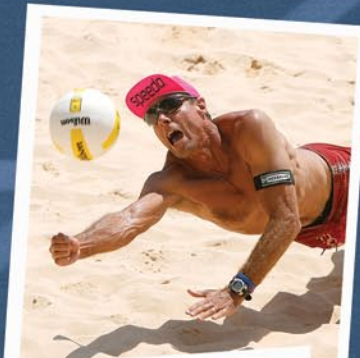

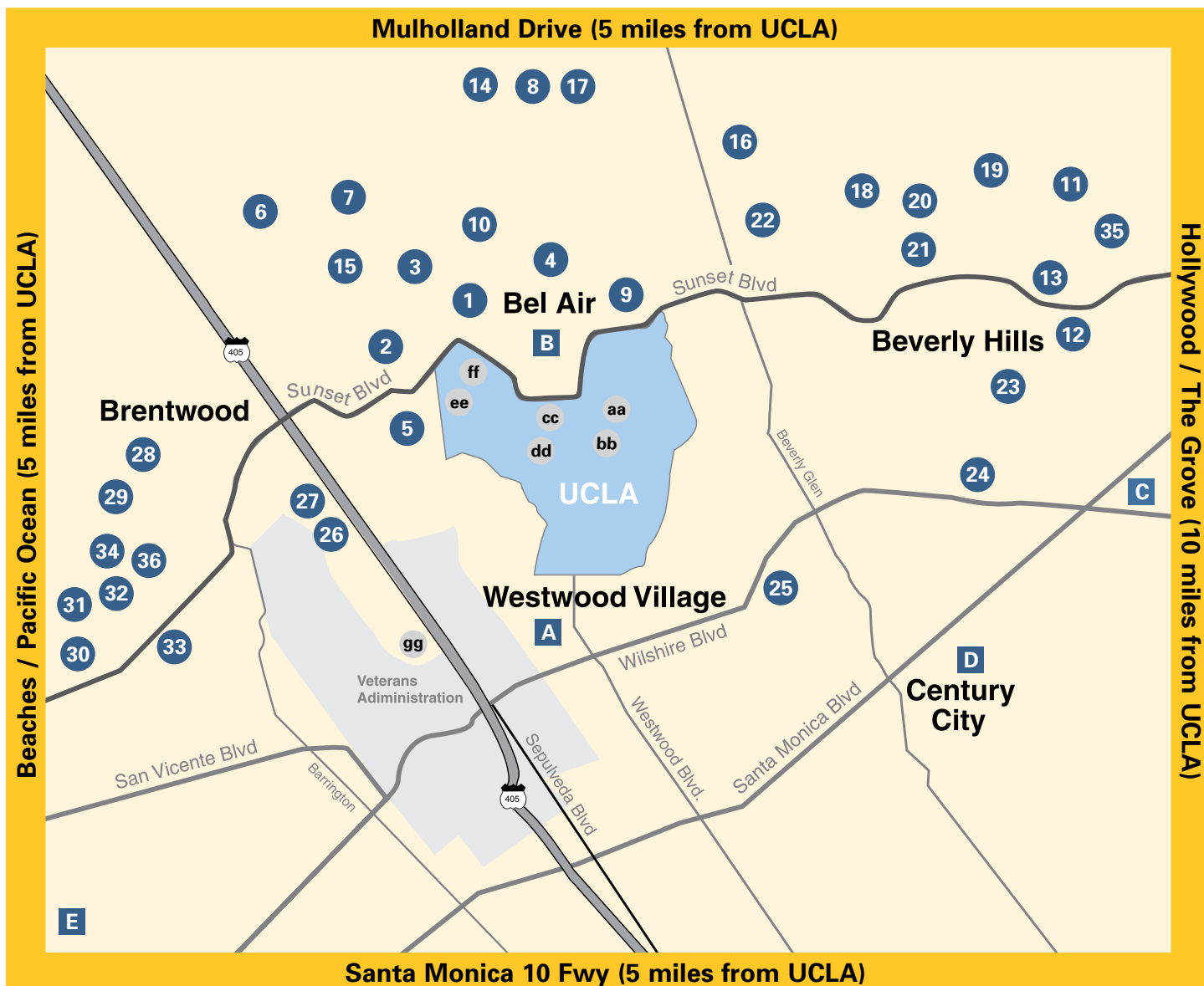


This Is Los Angeles
