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UCLA Football Postgame Notes – UCLA vs. New Mexico

Week 3 – Sept. 12, 2025 – Rose Bowl Stadium – Pasadena, Calif.

Team Notes

- UCLA's all-time record against New Mexico moved to 1-1.
- The Bruins had a pair of goal-line stops, forcing a turnover on down on the UCLA 3-yard line twice (once in the second quarter, once in the third quarter). It was the first two times this season that either UCLA or its opponent didn't score in the red zone.
- UCLA limited New Mexico to 152 passing yards, the fewest by a Bruin opponent since holding Boise State to 117 yards in the Starco Brands LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk on Dec. 16, 2023.

Individual Notes

- WR Titus Mokiiao-Atimalala hauled in a 12-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter. It marked his first TD catch of the year, and the first touchdown reception by a Bruin wideout this season. It was his third-career touchdown catch.
- RB Anthony Woods had a 33-yard run to end the first half. It marked the Bruins' longest rush so far this year.
- Woods finished with a team-high 64 rushing yards on 10 touches (6.4 y/c). It marks the first time this season he paced the squad in rushing.
- DB Key Lawrence forced a fumble to finish off UCLA's goal-line stand in the third quarter. It was the Bruins' first takeaway of the season, and marked Lawrence's seventh-career forced fumble.
- DE Devin Aupiu recovered the fumble in the third quarter, marked his first-career fumble recovery (he had a FF in 2024).
- K Mateen Bhaghani connected on his lone field goal attempt, hitting from 51 yards out. He improved to 5-for-5 on field goal attempts this season. It was also his first 50+ yard field goal of the season, and fourth of his career. For his career, Bhaghani is now 33-for-38 (87%), including a 4-for-6 clip on attempts from 50+ yards out.
