UCLA HOSTS COLORADO, USC TO END REGULAR SEASON

The Bruins wrap up the 2018 regular season this week at Pauley Pavilion presented by Wescom, hosting Colorado on Wednesday and No. 15 USC on Friday. Both matches will be televised on Pac-12 Networks National and Los Angeles, and will also feature free live audio on UCLA Bruins.com.

WHAT'S NEXT?

On Sunday, ESPNU will air the NCAA Volleyball Selection Special at 5:30 p.m., as the 64-team postseason field is revealed. The first- and second-rounds of the NCAA Championship will be played Friday, Nov. 30 and Saturday, Dec. 1 at 16 campus sites.

BRUINS IN THE POLLS

For the first time since Sept. 1, 2014, the Bruins are unranked in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. UCLA is still receiving votes in the poll, which features six other Pac-12 teams (No. 2 Stanford, No. 15 USC, No. 17 Oregon, No. 19 Washington, No. 20 Washington State and No. 23 Arizona), with Colorado and Utah also receiving votes.

NEWS AND NOTES

Senior Zana Muno set a new UCLA single-match record on Nov. 8 against Washington State when she had 38 digs. Muno, whose previous career high in digs was 34, broke the former Bruin single-match record of 36 set by Chrissie Zartman (2004) and Taylor Formico (2016) ... Muno surpassed the 1,500-dig mark in the match against the Cougars, and enters the final week of the regular season with 1,553 digs for her career. She is in fourth place in school history, which will likely be where she ends her days, as third-place Formico recorded 1,685 digs ... the Bruins picked up the 1,300th victory in program history on Oct. 10 against Arizona State ... Michael Sealy is two wins away from 200 for his head coaching career ... on Oct. 19, UCLA won for the first time in Seattle since Oct. 3, 2003 (15 matches), while its victory over Washington snapped a nine-match overall losing streak to the Huskies ... the Bruins had 22 blocks in the Sept. 2 victory at then-No. 19 San Diego, their highest total since Nov. 8, 2007 against Oregon State. This century, UCLA has five matches with at least 20 blocks, with the 22 at USD ranking third on that list ... the Bruins are 11-0 when winning the third set of a match, as well as 9-0 when winning set four ... UCLA is 11-0 when leading the match in hitting ... the Bruins are 7-0 when leading in blocks ... UCLA is 4-0 in five-set matches ... senior Kyra Rogers recorded her third double-figure kills match of the season versus Washington State when she had 11. Her career best in kills came at Oregon State on Nov. 2 when she had 15 with just one error in 27 attempts for a .519 hitting percentage. Rogers has produced a .400 percentage or better in six contests, adding 12 matches with at least four blocks and an ace in five of her last seven tilts ... sophomore Jenny Mosser registered a pair of double-figure kills contests last week, totaling 15 at Arizona State last Friday and 11 at Arizona last Sunday. She did not commit a hitting error in 55 attempts versus the Sun Devils, adding five blocks. Mosser has 12 double-figure kills contests, as well as 10 matches with at least 10 digs ... Muno has double figures in digs in

21 matches this season, including 14 of her last 15. In that 14-match stretch, she has gone for at least 20 digs in half of them, including her 38-dig effort versus WSU, her second-career match with at least 30 digs. In a five-match stint from Oct. 26 (Cal) through Nov. 8 (WSU), Muno had 142 digs in 19 sets for an average of 7.47 digs per set ... redshirt freshman Alexis Light has at least five kills in 12 of her last 14 matches, producing a career-high 19 at California on Sept. 28. Light, who missed the Arizona match with an injury, has three contests with double figures in kills ... in her last 12 matches, junior Kylie Miller is averaging 10.39 assists and 2.49 digs per set. Miller, who missed the Arizona match with an injury, also has 12 aces in her last dozen contests, including five in her last three ... junior Savvy Simo has double figures in digs in five of her last six matches, averaging 3.35 digs per set in her last half dozen contests. Simo has served an ace in four of her last six matches ... sophomore Mac May has at least eight kills in all but one match this season, recording double figures in kills in 20 of 25 contests. May, who leads the team in double-doubles with eight, set a new career high in kills at Washington with 27. Behind the service line, May, the team leader in aces, has at least one in 17 of 25 contests. She has reached multiple aces in 11 matches and has eight aces in her last six contests ... junior Madeleine Gates has at least five kills in all but three matches this season, registering double figures in kills in nine contests. Gates has hit over .300 in 14 matches, while adding at least five blocks in 10 tilts. She tied a season high with three block solos at Arizona State last Friday.

SCOUTING THE COLORADO BUFFALOES

Colorado (17-12, 9-9 Pac-12) has gone the distance in four of its last five matches, winning a pair of them last weekend at Oregon and Oregon State. The Buffaloes are averaging 13.19 kills, 0.88 aces, 14.12 digs and 2.65 blocks per set, hitting .238 as a team. Four players are posting at least two kills per set, led by senior Alexa Smith's 3.73 kps. Junior Justine Spann is second with 2.86 kps, followed by redshirt freshman Anyse Smith (2.77) and senior Naghede Abu (2.27). Freshman Jenna Ewert (6.34 assists per set) and sophomore Brynna DeLuzio (5.93) are splitting the setting duties. Junior Rachel Whipple is first on the team with 3.19 digs per set, while Abu (1.38) and redshirt freshman Danielle Price (1.15) are each tallying over a block per set.

THE SERIES: UCLA VS. COLORADO

The Bruins are 13-3 all-time against Colorado and 10-3 since the Buffaloes joined the Pac-12 Conference. UCLA has won three in a row in the series. The Bruins are 6-1 at home versus the Buffaloes.

SCOUTING THE USC TROJANS

USC (20-9, 12-6 Pac-12), which hosts Utah on Wednesday, has won five of seven, but was stunned by Arizona State last Sunday in four sets. The Trojans are averaging 14.04 kills, 1.45 aces, 15.71 digs and 2.17 blocks per set, hitting .247 as a team. A total of 75 percent of the team's kills comes from three players, as sophomore Brooke Botkin is first with 4.47 kills per set, junior Khalia Lanier is second at 4.34 and junior Emily Baptista is third with 2.90. quarterbacks the offense and is posting 11.29 assists per set. Senior Victoria Garrick is first with 4.86 digs per set and junior Jasmine Gross is tops with 1.16 blocks per set.

THE SERIES: UCLA VS. USC

The Bruins lead the all-time series with USC, 64-58, but were swept across town on Sept. 19. UCLA is 29-24 at home against USC. The Bruins have won six of the last nine against the Trojans.

NO. 25 BRUIINS FALL IN THREE AT NO. 24 ARIZONA

Senior Zana Muno recorded 18 digs and sophomore Jenny Mosser posted 11 kills and seven digs, but the 25th-ranked Bruins dropped a three-set decision to No. 24 Arizona on Sunday at the McKale Center. Set scores were 13-25, 22-25, 15-25.

Freshman Devon Chang had 29 assists and seven digs, as the Bruins registered a .206 hitting percentage. Sophomore Mac May tallied eight kills, senior Kyra Rogers and redshirt freshman Emily Ryan each notched five kills and junior Savvy Simo had 12 digs.

The Bruins (13-12, 8-10 Pac-12) scored three of the first four points of the match on kills by Rogers and junior Madeleine Gates and an Arizona attack error. However, Arizona (20-10, 9-9 Pac-12) scored the next five and led for the rest of the set. The closest the Bruins would be the rest of the way was two, as Arizona won the opener by a score of 25-13. Mosser recorded four kills, Muno had seven digs and Simo posted six digs. The Bruins were out-hit, .389 to .118.

In set two, the Bruins were up by two on a few occasions, scoring five of the first eight points on kills by Ryan and Chang and three Arizona errors. The Wildcats grabbed their first lead at 6-5, and despite a couple of ties and a valiant comeback by the Bruins, Arizona didn't trail for the rest of the set. Trailing 20-12, the Bruins scored seven in a row and 10 of 12 to even

things at 22. The first four points came on May kills, and after an Arizona error, kills by May and Ryan made it 20-19. Trailing 22-20, a Wildcat attack error and a Ryan kill evened the score at 22. However, Arizona got the next three points to win the set. May was error-free with seven kills in 16 attempts, while Ryan was a perfect 4-for-4. Muno had eight digs, with Chang and Mosser providing four each. The Bruins hit .385 in the set with 16 kills and just one error in 39 attempts, with the Wildcats hitting .245.

The only tie in set three was at 1-all, as Arizona never trailed in winning the third set by a score of 25-15. Mosser produced six kills in the third, as the Bruins were out-hit, .375 to .088.

BRUIINS BATTLE BACK TO DEFEAT ARIZONA STATE

Sophomore Mac May paced the 25th-ranked Bruins with 19 kills, sophomore Jenny Mosser was error-free with 15 kills to go with five digs and five blocks and senior Zana Muno added 25 digs, as UCLA knocked off Arizona State in four sets on Friday at Wells Fargo Arena. Set scores were 18-25, 25-22, 25-18, 25-23.

Junior Kylie Miller tallied 35 assists, nine digs, four blocks and two aces, setting the Bruins to a .322 hitting percentage in the final three sets. Senior Kyra Rogers had nine kills and tied a career high with seven blocks, junior Madeleine Gates added eight kills and eight blocks, junior Savvy Simo recorded 11 digs and freshman Sawyer Aigner-Swesey registered seven digs.

Arizona State (13-16, 4-13 Pac-12) led wire-to-wire in set one, winning by a score of 25-18. May recorded five kills in the opener, while Muno added five digs. The Bruins were out-hit, .333 to .147.

The Bruins (13-11, 8-9 Pac-12) hit .500 in set two to even the match. The second featured a dozen ties and a trio of lead changes. Trailing 15-13, the Bruins scored three in a row on back-to-back May kills and one from Rogers to go up by one.

Despite three more ties, UCLA didn't trail for the rest of the set. Even at 19, the Bruins scored six of the next nine points to win the second by a score of 25-22. The last two points came on kills by Gates and Rogers. May notched six kills, Mosser added four and Rogers posted three. Muno had five digs.

Up 10-9, the Bruins scored four of five on two Mosser kills and kills by Gates and Light to go up 14-10. UCLA led 18-12, but four in a row by Arizona State shaved the deficit to a pair. However, a 7-2 run for the Bruins to close out the set gave them the 25-18 win. The first three points came on back-to-back May kills and a Miller ace. After an ASU sideout, three consecutive blocks by Rogers, the first two with freshman Hawley Harrer and the last with Mosser, gave the Bruins seven set points. On the second attempt, Mosser closed out the seven-point win. Mosser had four kills in the third and May added three kills. Muno recorded nine digs, Miller had five and Rogers posted four blocks. The Bruins hit .205 and held the Sun Devils to a -.024 percentage.

Set four featured 10 ties and four lead changes. Trailing 13-9, the Bruins scored seven of nine to go ahead for good at 16-15. May had two kills, Rogers posted one, Gates recorded two block solos, Miller served an ace and ASU made an error. UCLA led by at least three for the rest of the set, as a May kill closed out a 25-23 win. May and Mosser both had five kills and Gates added three kills. Muno posted six digs, Simo had five and Aigner-Swesey recorded four. The Bruins out-hit the Sun Devils, .295 to .213.

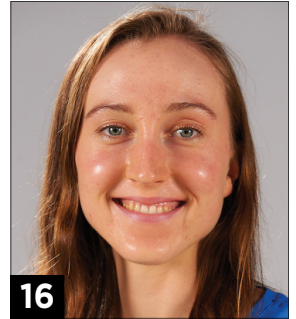

Michael Sealy begins his ninth season as the head coach of the UCLA women's volleyball team in 2018. Sealy has a career record of 198-88 (.692) and guided the Bruins to a National Championship in 2011.

Last season, the Bruins went 21-11 and tied for fifth in the Pac-12 Conference (12-8). UCLA advanced to the Round of 16 for the fourth year in a row, defeating Austin Peay and Cal Poly in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament. UCLA ranked 30th in the nation in digs per set (17.15), 35th in assists per set (13.09) and 38th in kills per set (13.91). Sarah Spencil, who was an AVCA and VolleyballMag.com All-American Honorable Mention selection, was 23rd in the country in aces (11.23), while Zana Muno, an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American and All-Region honoree, ranked 41st in digs (4.97). In addition to Muno and Spencil's plaudits, Madeleine Gates was named a Second Team AVCA All-American and Honorable Mention VolleyballMag.com All-American, while Reily Buechler picked up AVCA Honorable Mention All-Region honors. The three AVCA All-American awards tied for the most in a single season in school history.

The Bruins went 27-7 in 2016 and tied for second in the Pac-12 (15-5). UCLA, which won its first seven matches for its best start to a season since 2006, won 10 times against ranked teams, including a season sweep of eventual national champion Stanford, the first sweep of the Cardinal since 2011, as well as a sweep of cross-town rival USC. The Bruins made their

first Regional Final appearance since 2011. UCLA ranked sixth in the nation in digs and assists per set and 13th in kills per set, while also ranking first in the conference in digs and aces and second in kps. The digs mark of 17.88 was tied for the second-best total in school history. Four Bruins picked up VolleyballMag.com All-American honors, as Taylor Formico, the back-to-back Pac-12 Libero of the Year, was named to the First Team, Buechler to the Third Team and Jordan Anderson and Jennie Frager to the Honorable Mention Team. Those four, plus Torrey Van Winden (First Team), were selected to the AVCA All-Region Team.

In 2015, the Bruins posted a record of 25-8, placing fourth in the Pac-12 (14-6). Three Bruins were named AVCA All-Americans, tying for the most awards in a single season in school history. Formico, the Pac-12 Libero of the Year, earned Third Team honors, while Anderson and Claire Felix picked up Honorable Mention nods. All three players were also named AVCA Pacific South All-Region First Team. In June of 2016, Sealy was the head coach of the Pac-12 All-Star volleyball team which traveled to China.

In 2014, the Bruins finished 22-12 and in a tie for fourth in the Pac-12 (11-9), reaching the NCAA Regional Semifinals. Karsta Lowe earned First Team AVCA All-American and All-Region honors. UCLA led the country in kills (15.10) and assists (14.26) per set, the first time the Bruins led the nation in a stat category since 1997, while Lowe was tops in the country in kills and points per set.

Lowe was AVCA First Team All-Region and Honorable Mention All-American in 2013, as UCLA went 15-15. In 2012, the Bruins posted a 23-8 record, finishing in a tie for fourth in the Pac-12 with a 14-6 mark and advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament. Two Bruins, Rachael Kidder and Tabi Love, were named All-American and All-Region. UCLA was second in the nation in kills per set (14.76) that season, third in assists per set (13.84) and fifth in hitting percentage (.295), which was also the second-best, single-season total in program history. The Bruins led all Pac-12 teams in hitting and were second in kps and aces.

In 2011, Sealy led the Bruins to the program's fourth NCAA title and seventh National Championship. The Bruins posted a 30-6 record and defeated four-time defending champion Penn State, #1-overall seed Texas, Florida State and Illinois en route to the championship. Sealy was named the AVCA National Coach of the Year. The Bruins finished second in the Pac-12 with a 17-5 record. Kidder, the Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Tournament, was a First Team All-American and All-Region selection. Zoë Nightingale and Lauren Van Orden were also named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team. UCLA finished fifth in the nation in assists per set (13.71) and eighth in kills per set (14.52). Among Pac-12 teams, the Bruins ranked first in aces, second in kps and opponent hitting percentage (.160) and third in digs per set (15.95).

In his first campaign, Sealy guided the Bruins to a 22-9 record, a fourth-place finish in the Pacific-10 Conference (11-7) and a Second Round appearance in the NCAA Tournament. UCLA finished in the top half of the Pac-10 in digs (2nd, 15.41), assists (4th, 13.46), kills (4th, 14.26) and aces (5th, 1.20) per set along with opponent hitting percentage (4th, .187).

Sealy spent part of the summer of 2012 in London at the Olympic Games, serving as a scout coach for the U.S. men's volleyball team.

UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero announced on Feb. 10, 2010 the hiring of Sealy as head coach of the Bruin women's volleyball program. Sealy returned to his alma mater after spending four seasons (2006-09) as an associate head coach at the University of Hawai'i. He was a three-time All-American and an assistant coach for four years with the UCLA men's volleyball team and was an assistant with the Bruin women's volleyball program in 2005.

Sealy helped Hawai'i to a berth in the National Semifinals in 2009. The Rainbow Wahine recorded their second-straight, 30-win season last year, going 32-3 overall. They also posted a 16-0 mark in conference play to earn their 14th-straight Western Athletic Conference title and went on to claim their 10th-consecutive WAC Tournament championship. Sealy's record during his tenure at Hawai'i was 119-19 (.862 winning percentage).

Prior to his stint at Hawai'i, Sealy coached for four seasons at UCLA, where he was an assistant on the men's side from 2003-2006 and an assistant for the women's volleyball team in 2005. In his lone season on the women's side, the Bruins posted a 20-11 record and advanced to the Regional Semifinals. With the UCLA men, Sealy was 91-38 (.705) during his four campaigns, helping the Bruins to an NCAA Championship in 2006 and an NCAA Runner-Up finish in 2005. Sealy was also a volunteer assistant with the CSUN men's volleyball team in 2000 before working in the same capacity with the UCLA men in 2001.

One of the top setters in UCLA history, Sealy was a four-year letterwinner with the Bruins from 1990-93 and ranks fourth in Bruin annals in assists (4,749). In his senior season, Sealy and the Bruins won the program's 14th National Championship, going 24-3. The team captain was named the co-Most Outstanding Player of the 1993 NCAA Tournament and also earned ASICS/Volleyball Monthly Player of the Year and AVCA All-American first-team honors. In addition, Sealy was named an All-American in 1991 (first-team) and 1992 (third-team), as well as All-Conference three times. The Bruins won three conference titles during Sealy's playing days, going 80-24 (.769) during his four years.

Following his playing career in Westwood, Sealy went on to play professionally in Switzerland, Belgium, Holland and Puerto Rico. He also played with the U.S. National Team in 1994 and 1997.

Sealy graduated from UCLA in 1993 with a degree in physiological science.
