BRUINS HEAD NORTH FOR MATCHUP AT OREGON STATE

After opening Pac-12 play with a 1-1 draw at home against San Diego State, the UCLA men's soccer team travels north to face No. 13 Oregon State in a league tilt on Saturday, Feb. 27 at 1:00 p.m. PT. While no video or audio broadcasts are available, fans can follow along with live stats on UCLABruins.com.

WEEK IN REVIEW

UCLA had just one game on the schedule last week, battling San Diego State to a 1-1 tie at home in the Pac-12 opener for both teams. The Bruins went ahead on a 73rd minute tally from sophomore forward Ollie de Visser, but the Aztecs would go on to score an equalizer less than six minutes later. Both teams had chances to win the game in overtime, with Ruben Soria hitting the crossbar for UCLA in the 107th minute and SDSU having a golden goal wiped off by an offside call in the game's final minute. De Visser's score came after a period of sustained pressure for the Bruins, with his score capping off three consecutive quality scoring chances. Riley Ferch had the first crack at net, hitting the crossbar with a shot from the edge of the 18. That shot caromed to de Visser, who put in a sharp angle shot that was saved by the SDSU keeper. De Visser collected his own rebound, settled, and put in a left-footed shot to the keeper's right and inside the far post to net his first collegiate goal.

THE SERIES AGAINST OREGON STATE

The Bruins own a 34-8-3 record all-time against Oregon State, but are looking to break a three-game skid against the Beavers. UCLA and OSU last matched up on Oct. 27, 2019 at Wallis Annenberg Stadium, with UCLA dropping a 3-2 decision despite outshooting the visitors 15-5 and earning 13 corners to OSU's one.

GARCES IMPRESSES BETWEEN THE STICKS

Junior goalkeeper Justin Garces is off to a hot start to the 2020-21 season, as he leads or co-leads the Pac-12 Conference in both total saves (10) and save percentage (.833). He is also one of just two league keepers with a shutout on his resume this season. The Miami, Fla. native recorded his 100th career save against San Diego State on Feb. 20, while his season-opening shutout of San Francisco was the seventh clean sheet of his career.

KEEPING THE BALL OUT OF THE NET

The Bruins have conceded just two goals in three games to start the year, marking just the fourth time in the past 20 seasons that UCLA has allowed one goal or fewer in each of its first three games. UCLA's two goals against in three games trails only the defensive performances of the 2000 and 2018 (one goal against in three games) Bruins among teams from this millennium.

PLENTY OF FIRSTS

This season has brought plenty of notable firsts for UCLA:

- First career goals: Ben Reveno (Sr.), Pablo Greenlee (Fr.), Ollie de Visser (So.)
- First collegiate points: Greenlee, Grayson Doody (Fr.), Tommy Silva (Fr.), de Visser
- First points at UCLA: Kevin Diaz (Cerritos College transfer), Jose Sosa (Pacific transfer)
- First Division I starts: Diaz, Doody, Silva, de Visser
- First Division I appearances: Andrew Valverde (Fr.)

FERCH TAKES OVER THE NO. 10 SHIRT

Sophomore midfielder Riley Ferch is UCLA's top returning scorer on points (1-9-11 in 2019), headlining a lineup that features nine returning starters. Ferch was one of the top playmakers in the west last season, pacing the Pac-12 in helpers and notching the most single-season assists by a Bruin since Jackson Yueill had 11 in 2016. In addition, his nine assists were just one off the program freshman record, and the most by a UCLA frosh since Kelyn Rowe in 2010.

BRUINS WELCOME BACK NINE STARTERS

UCLA will enjoy a large amount of continuity from its 2019 lineup, with all but two starters returning to this year's team. In addition, the Bruins welcome back defender AJ Vasquez, who started every game as a freshman in 2018 but missed all of 2019 with an injury. In all, the returners on the 2021 squad accounted for 74.7% of UCLA's minutes played in 2019.

TRIO NAMED TO TOPDRAWERSOCCER PRESEASON TOP-100 PLAYER RANKINGS

A trio of Bruins were named to TopDrawerSoccer's preseason Top-100 player rankings. Eric Iloski checked in at No. 75, Riley Ferch was No. 84, and Ahmed Longmire landed at No. 90. With three players in the rankings, UCLA had the second-most of all Pac-12 teams, trailing only Cal (4).

ERIC ILOSKI SELECTED IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT BY VANCOUVER

UCLA senior midfielder Eric Iloski was selected in the second round (No. 46 overall) of the 2021 MLS SuperDraft by Vancouver Whitecaps FC. Iloski becomes UCLA's 80th MLS draft pick all-time, and the first since Frankie Amaya went No. 1 overall in 2019 to FC Cincinnati. Iloski also becomes the first Bruin ever to be drafted by Vancouver. The Escondido, Calif. native will complete his senior season at UCLA before beginning his pro career. When he enters the pro ranks, he will join both of his brothers, Milan (Real Salt Lake, MLS) and Brian (Orange County SC, USL).

BRUINS ON THE U.S. MEN'S NATIONAL TEAM

Former UCLA standouts Reggie Cannon and Jackson Yueill have been frequent contributors to the U.S. Men's National Team during the program's latest cycle. Yueill, a midfielder, has been in the Starting XI for each of the last two games for the USMNT, bringing his career cap total to nine. Cannon, a right back, has 13 caps with the USMNT.

REINFORCEMENTS ON THE WAY

UCLA's latest recruiting class, which arrives on campus in fall 2021, has been ranked the No. 4 class in the country by TopDrawerSoccer. The five-player class (two forwards, two midfielders, one goalie) is the highest-ranked in the west, with Stanford (No. 7) the only other Pac-12 team to crack the rankings. The 2021 UCLA men's soccer recruiting class consists of MF Charlie Crockford (Northfield, Ill. / Chicago Fire Academy), GK Nathan Crockford (Northfield, Ill. / Chicago Fire Academy), F Aaron Edwards (San Jose, Calif. / SJ Earthquakes Academy), MF Mauricio Gutierrez (Lawndale, Calif. / LAFC Academy), and F Brandon Zelaya (Redwood City, Calif. / SJ Earthquakes Academy).

OCHOA, CERVANTES JOIN STAFF IN 2020-21

UCLA head coach Ryan Jorden welcomed a pair of new coaches in 2020-21, with assistant coach Andres Ochoa and volunteer assistant coach Juan Cervantes joining the staff. Ochoa played four seasons under Jorden at Pacific (2014-17), then spent two seasons on the coaching staff in Stockton. Since the conclusion of the 2019 season, he completed his master's degree in sport management and coaching and played professionally in Italy and Mexico. Cervantes, a Bruin goalie from 2012-15, coaches the team's goalkeepers. He made coaching stops at Cal State Dominguez Hills, Santa Monica College, Loyola High School, Santa Monica High School, and Beach Futbol Club before returning to UCLA in September 2020.

2019 IN REVIEW

UCLA posted a 6-9-3 overall record in 2019, finishing fifth in the Pac-12. The Bruins returned just three starters from the previous season, integrating promising newcomers such as Riley Ferch, Marcony Pimentel, and Ben Reveno. Forward Milan Iloski had a breakout offensive campaign, scoring 17 goals and leading the country in goals per game (1.06) before signing a homegrown deal with Real Salt Lake. Ferch also had a stellar debut, leading the Pac-12 with nine assists. Highlights for UCLA during the 2019 campaign included a 3-2 win over then-top-ranked Maryland on Sept. 6, and a program-record five-goal game from Iloski on Oct. 6.

SCHEDULE UPDATES

The Bruins have had a number of schedule changes so far in 2021. Scheduled contests against Westmont on Feb. 3 and 16 were both canceled due to COVID-19 protocols within the Westmont program. In addition, the Bruins' contest at LMU was moved up two days to Feb. 12, instead of the originally-scheduled Feb. 14 date.

NEWEST BRUINS

The 2020-21 UCLA squad features 11 newcomers, including a pair of transfers and nine freshmen. Center back Ahmed Longmire joins the Bruins from Division I Utah Valley University, and forward Kevin Diaz (Cerritos College) comes to Westwood from the junior college ranks. UCLA's true freshmen include defender Kasper Strom (Stabaek IF), forward Jose Contell Lechon (Valencia CF), midfielder Tucker Lepley (Sporting KC Academy), forward Grayson Doody (Beach FC), defender Pablo Greenlee (LA Breakers), midfielder Andrew Valverde (LA Breakers), goalkeeper Tyler Kirberg (Phoenix Rising FC), midfielder Connor Manning (Hanworth Villa F.C.), and defender Tommy Silva (Real Salt Lake Academy).

Ryan Jorden enters his second season as the UCLA men's head soccer coach in 2020-21. He was named the 11th head coach in program history on Apr. 29, 2019 by then-UCLA Director of Athletics Dan Guerrero.

The Bruins posted a 6-9-3 record under Jorden in 2019, his first year at the helm. Fielding an opening day lineup that featured just three returning starters, UCLA saw a tangible improvement over the course of the season. Under Jorden's guidance, junior forward Milan Iloski established himself as one of the top offensive threats in college soccer, leading the country with 1.06 goals per game (17 total) including a program-record five scores against San Diego State on Oct. 6. Jorden also oversaw the seamless integration of newcomers including Riley Ferch (Pac-12-high nine assists), Marcony Pimentel, and Ben Reveno. As a team, the campaign featured a number of highlights, none loftier than a 3-2 win over defending national champion and then-No. 1-ranked Maryland on Sept. 6.

His recruiting success has continued at UCLA, with his 2021 recruiting class earning a No. 4 national ranking from TopDrawerSoccer, the highest of any Pac-12 program.

Jorden arrived in Westwood with 23 years of collegiate coaching experience under his belt, most recently serving as head coach at Pacific where he re-started a dormant program in 2013 and turned the Tigers into perennial national contenders. Pacific reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of his last three seasons, one of just two west coast programs able to make that claim over that span (Stanford).

Prior to that, he helmed the men's soccer program at Cal Baptist, transforming the Lancers into two-time NCCAA National Champions during his five-year tenure.

His 2016 squad at Pacific went 13-4-2, representing the largest single-season win-loss turnaround in Division I men's soccer history at 11.5 games. Jorden secured a number of accolades after that standout season, including NCAA Far West Region and West Coast Conference Coach of the Year honors.

His last two seasons in Stockton were just as successful. In 2017, the Tigers posted an identical 13-4-2 record while reaching as high as No. 14 in the national rankings. In 2018, Pacific went 12-5-2 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Over his final three seasons, the Tigers went 38-13-6 (.719).

At Pacific, Jorden oversaw the development of a trio of players who went on to be drafted by MLS teams, as Tristan Blackmon was the third overall selection in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft (LAFC), Camden Riley was a second-round pick by Sporting Kansas City in 2019, and Jonathan

Jimenez went No. 26 overall to the Chicago Fire in 2020. Overall, his time at Pacific yielded 27 All-WCC selections, five All-Far West Region picks, three All-Americans, and 13 WCC All-Academic honorees.

Jorden got his head coaching start at Cal Baptist University in 2008, taking the Lancers to an unprecedented level of success during his five years in Riverside. Taking over a program that had qualified for postseason play just once in the prior 18 years, Jorden guided CBU to the postseason in all five of his seasons, including NCCAA National Championships in both 2011 and 2012. Jorden was honored as the NCCAA National Coach of the Year after both of those championship campaigns.

He recorded a 60-30-10 overall record at Cal Baptist, including a 48-15-3 (.750) mark over his final three seasons. He was instrumental in NCAA compliance management as CBU transitioned to Division II during his tenure.



Cal Baptist had 12 players earn All-PacWest honors over his final two seasons, including two-time Goalkeeper of the Year Joey Pacheco. Seven Lancers earned All-America status during that span, headlined by 2012 NCCAA National Player of the Year Carlos Figueroa.

Jorden made assistant coaching stops at Westmont College — his alma mater — Northern Colorado University, and Oregon State earlier in his career.

He served as the lead assistant under head coach Dave Wolf at Westmont from 2000-2007, helping the Warriors to an 82-39-11 record. Westmont was consistently ranked in the NAIA Top-25 during his time in Santa Barbara, including No. 1 in 2000. The Warriors claimed back-to-back conference championships in 2001 and 2002.

Jorden was an assistant on the Northern Colorado University women's soccer staff in 2003 and 2004 as he pursued his doctoral degree.

His first coaching stop came at Oregon State, where he served as the lone assistant from 1996-1999. With the Beavers, he managed day-to-day aspects of the program such as recruiting, training, scheduling, and compliance.
