UCLA PLAYS AT MICHIGAN STATE MONDAY

The UCLA men's soccer team returns to action on Monday afternoon, playing at Michigan State. The two sides last played each other in 2024, with the Spartans earning a 1-0 win in Westwood.

UCLA BEATS PENN STATE, 2-0

The UCLA men's soccer program earned its third win in Big Ten play on Friday night, taking down Penn State 2-0 at Wallis Annenberg Stadium. Sergi Solans Ormo scored his team-leading fourth goal of the campaign to open the scoring before Oliver Roche added a second in the 63rd minute to seal the three points for the Bruins.

BRUINS DRAW WITH NO. 18 MARYLAND

The UCLA men's soccer program drew with No. 18 Maryland 0-0 on Friday at Wallis Annenberg Stadium. The draw marks the second time that the Bruins have earned a 0-0 draw with a ranked opponent in 2025.

- Graduate transfer goalkeeper Kevin Box made his first start and appearance of his UCLA career, and kept a clean sheet on his debut for the Bruins.

WHAT'S IN THE BOX

Graduate transfer Kevin Box has started UCLA's last three games in goal for the Bruins. The Division III transfer has kept two clean sheets, one against No. 18 Maryland and the other in UCLA's 2-0 win over Penn State, before the Bruins fell at No. 16 Michigan 3-0.

- Box has recorded back-to-back shutouts and tallied seven saves over those two matches.

BRUINS BATTLE AT NO. 3 INDIANA

The UCLA men's soccer program fell 4-2 to Indiana on the road in front of over 3,000 fans on Friday evening. Sebastian Rincon scored for the Bruins in the loss.

- Freshman goalkeeper Ryan Tiltack made a career-high six saves, with four coming in the second half.
- Sebastian Rincon scored his first goal of the season, and the second of his career.
- Freshman forward Francis Bonsu recorded an assist for the third game in a row to begin conference play.

BRUINS IN BIG GAMES

Against top-10 opposition since 1998, the Bruins are 35-46-15.

- In the last three seasons under seventh-year head coach Ryan Jorden, the Bruins are 6-3-7 against teams ranked in the top 25.
- UCLA's last win over a top-3 opponent was in 2024 when UCLA took down No. 2 Ohio State in Los Angeles, 2-1. It was Ohio State's only loss in the regular season.
- The Bruins last top-5 road win was at Washington in 2014, a game UCLA won 2-1.

BRUINS IN THE B1G RANKINGS

- In conference games Sergi Solans Ormo is second in total points with six. He has two goals and two assists so far in conference play.
- Solans Ormo also leads the conference in game-winning-goals in conference play with two.
- Freshman Francis Bonsu is tied for third in the conference in points with five. He has one goal and three assists.

UCLA TAKES DOWN WISCONSIN 3-1

The Bruins earned a 3-1 win over Wisconsin on Friday evening at Wallis Annenberg Stadium. Three different Bruins scored in the win.

- UCLA's win almost marked Ryan Jorden's 50th career win in charge of the Bruins. Now in his seventh year in charge of the program, Jorden has led the Bruins to a Pac-12 title in 2023, and four-straight NCAA Tournaments (2021-2024).
- Sergi Solans Ormo scored in his third consecutive game and added two more assists on the night, totaling four points in the win.
- Francis Bonsu added a goal and an assist in the win, the goal was the first of his collegiate career.
- Konstantinos Georgallides tied the game at 1-1 in the 9th minute, the goal was his first as a Bruin.
- UCLA limited Wisconsin to four shots, with two coming on target. The Bruins only allowed one shot in the final 76 minutes of play.

BRUINS DOWN NORTHWESTERN IN BIG TEN OPENER

The UCLA men's soccer program opened Big Ten Conference play on Friday night with a 1-0 win over Northwestern at Wallis Annenberg Stadium. Sergi Solans Ormo scored the game-winning goal for the Bruins in the 86th minute.

With the score tied at 0-0 in the 86th minute, the Bruins had the ball on the left side of the field near midfield with Shakir Nixon. Nixon then chipped the ball over the defenders across the backline which found Francis Bonsu. Bonsu then cut inside and dribbled past two defenders before rolling the ball to Solans Ormo, who curled a shot past the Northwestern goalkeeper and into the top

SOLANS ORMO OPENS HIS ACCOUNT

UCLA redshirt sophomore forward Sergi Solans Ormo scored his first goal of the season in UCLA's 2-1 loss at LMU on Sunday. Solans Ormo, a preseason All-American, scored 14 goals a year ago at Oregon State, en route to third-team All-American honors.

BRUINS DRAW AT NO. 18 KENTUCKY

UCLA and No. 18 Kentucky played to a goalless draw in Lexington, Ky. on Monday afternoon. It was the first clean sheet the Bruins have earned to date on the season, and also marked the first time the Wildcats had been held scoreless in 2025. Freshman centerback Blake Bayless made his first collegiate start and appearance in the match.

BRUINS DRAW WITH CSUF

The UCLA men's soccer program tied Cal State Fullerton 1-1 on Thursday evening at Wallis Annenberg Stadium. The Titans opened the scoring before Oliver Roche tied the game in the 67th minute with his first goal of the year, his first as a Bruin after transferring from Virginia Tech.

- Cal State Fullerton (1-0-2) cashed in first as Jose de la Torre volleyed in a bicycle kick from the penalty spot off a cross from Jorge Quintero to fire CSUF in front in the 66:06 mark.
- However, the Bruins (0-2-1) responded almost instantly. Philip Naef picked up the ball in midfield before dribbling wide and finding the run of Roche. Roche then dribbled past his defender and fired his shot into the roof of the net from a tight angle to tie the game at 1-1.

2024 IN REVIEW

- The Bruins finished sixth in their first year in the Big Ten, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth year in a row.
- UCLA went 7-6-6 overall on the year, and 3-4-3 in conference play
- After the season Nicholas Cavallo was drafted in the third round, 88th overall, by New York City FC in the MLS SuperDraft. It marks the fourth year in a row that a Bruin has been drafted or signed a homegrown contract in MLS.
- The Bruins' best result of the season came in a come-from-behind 2-1 win over then No. 2 Ohio State on October 11th. Edrey Caceres and Artem Vovk scored the goals as the Bruins went a goal down before coming back to earn the win, handing OSU it's only loss during the regular season.
- To close the season senior midfielder Andre Ochoa earned second team All-North region honors, while Ochoa, Cavallo, and Allan Legaspi were all named to Big Ten teams.
- UCLA played one of the hardest schedules in the nation in 2024. The schedule featured matches against 10 ranked teams throughout the year, with the Bruins going 4-2-4 in those matches.

ON DEBUT

Over the first two matches of the season the Bruins had 11 newcomers make either their collegiate or UCLA debuts.

- In UCLA's season opener at UC Irvine, freshman Francis Bonsu, Ian Charles, Kian Concepcion, and Ander Marticorena all made their collegiate debuts, while Drew Brown, Oliver Roche, Sean Sent, and Sergi Solans Ormo all made their UCLA debuts.
- As for UCLA's matchup with Cal, freshman Dylan Cantafio, Zach Mastrodimos, and Ryan Tiltack all made their collegiate debuts.

BROWN, RATOVIZ, SOLANS ORMO SELECTED TO BIG TEN PRESEASON PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- Drew Brown enters his fourth season of college soccer in 2025, and his first in Westwood after transferring from Wisconsin. The graduate defender totaled 48 appearances and 42 starts across three seasons at Wisconsin. Brown made 11 appearances and five starts for the Badgers in 2024 while in 2023 he started in all 16 games he played, and played 90 minutes in all but three of them. He was a key member of a Wisconsin defense that collected seven shutouts, and was named to TopDrawerSoccer's National Team of the Week after a shutout of No. 2 Kentucky in 2023. Brown played every minute of the season as a freshman in 2022, where he scored his first career goal against Maryland on Oct. 10, 2022.
- Tamir Ratoviz enters his second season at UCLA in 2025. The Oak Park, California native played in 18 games, making two starts as a true freshman in 2024. He tallied nine points (2G, 5A) on the year, the fourth most on the team and the most of any freshman on the roster. His five assists were the second most on the team in 2024. Ratoviz recorded his first collegiate goal and collegiate assist in UCLA's 2-0 win over No. 8 Portland on Aug. 30, scored UCLA's equalizer in the Bruin's 1-1 draw at No. 6 Maryland on Oct. 21, and dished out his third assist of the year in the game against No. 25 Indiana. He then recorded a season-high two assists in UCLA's 6-0 win over Maryland in the Big Ten Tournament Quarterfinals.
- Sergi Solans Ormo is UCLA's third player on the watch list. He was recently named to the United Soccer Coaches Forwards to Watch list for 2025 after being named a third-team All-America honoree while playing at Oregon State in 2024. He led the Beavers with 14 goals and three assists in 2024 over 16 appearances, and after the year was drafted in the first round, 30th overall by Real Salt Lake in the 2025 MLS SuperDraft. Solans Ormo had one of the best offensive seasons in Oregon State men's soccer history, earning third-team All-America honors, WCC Offensive Player of the Year and United Soccer Coaches All-Region honors in 2024.

NEW BLOOD

The Bruins brought in 18 newcomers to augment the roster for the 2025 season:

- **Adrian Aguilar, MF/F** (LAFC Academy) – A product of the LAFC Academy, Aguilar will be a freshman with the Bruins in 2025. Scored the game-winning goal in UCLA's exhibition win over UC Riverside.
- **Bridger Baltes, F** (Santa Barbara SC) –Center Forward from Santa Barbara Soccer Club (MLS Next)... Ranked #155 in TDS top-200.
- **Blake Bayless, D** (FC Cincinnati Academy) – Center Back from FC Cincinnati U-18 Academy...Has been training with FC Cincinnati's second team at MLS Next Pro ... Ranked #125 in TDS top-200. l.
- **Francis Bonsu, F** (Milbrook HS, N.Y.) – Forward/Winger for the Millbrook School in New York... Named Gatorade High School Player of the Year for the state of New York in 2025 ... Played in USL2 with the Hudson Valley Hammers during the summer in 2024 and 2025.
- **Kevin Box, GK** (Claremont-Mudd-Scripps) – Spent four seasons at Claremont-Mudd-Scripps in Claremont, California, where he was a three-time SIAC All-Academic team honoree, and earned College Sports Communicators Academic All-District honors in 2023 ... Box appeared in 27 total matches over four seasons for the Stags.
- **Drew Brown, D** (Wisconsin) – Totalled 48 appearances and 42 starts across three seasons at Wisconsin ... Brown made 11 appearances and five starts for the Badgers in 2024 while in 2023 Brown started in all 16 games he played, and played 90 minutes in all but three of them.
- **Dylan Cantafio, MF** (Real Salt Lake Academy) – Central Midfielder/Winger for Real Salt Lake U-18 Academy... Prior to Real Salt Lake, played for Strikers FC Academy in Irvine, CA (MLS Next).
- **Ian Charles, D** (FC Dallas Academy) - Centerback for the FC Dallas U-18 Academy... He has captained his academy age group for the past two seasons... Ranked #116 in TDS top-200.
- **Kian Concepcion, D** (Austin FC Academy) – Left Back for Austin FC's U-18 Academy... He has been training regularly with the MLS Next Pro team during this past season... Ranked #60 in TDS top-200.
- **Konstantinos Georgallides, MF** (UNC Greensboro) – Played in 15 matches and made four starts UNC Greensboro in 2024 where he played a total of 463 minutes and helped lead the Spartans to a SOCON Regular Season title ... Prior to UNC Greensboro, Georgallides spent two years at Louisville in the ACC where he played a total of 39 matches and made 26 starts, producing eight goals and six assists.
- **Ander Marticorena, MF** (CA Osasuna) – Joins the Bruins after a standout club youth career in Spain ... Marticorena first came through the CA Osasuna youth system before playing for CD Subiza this past season in the third tier of Spanish soccer ... He made 15 appearances for CD Subiza during the 2024-25 season.
- **Zach Mastrodimos, MF** (Philadelphia Union Academy) – Central Midfielder from Philadelphia Union's U-18 MLS Next Academy... Regularly playing with Philadelphia's MLS Next Pro team... Led the Philadelphia Union U-17 squad to the MLS GA Cup Championship in 2024... Ranked #48 in TDS top-200.
- **Schinieder Mimy, D** (Oral Roberts) – played in 34 matches and made 33 starts over the last three seasons at Oral Roberts University ... Scored one goal and added four more assists over three seasons ... Started all 16 matches as a senior and helped the Owls post a 7-6-3 record.
- **Ethan Pendleton, D** (DC United Academy) – Previously played for DC United Academy and most recently with Loudon United FC of the USL Championship, where he has played with and against former top college players at the professional level... Ranked #57 in TDS top-200.
- **Oliver Roche, F** (Virginia Tech) – Played in 34 matches and made 23 starts for Virginia Tech over the past two seasons ... Scored nine goals with three game-winning goals for the Hokies ... As a freshman in 2023, Roche made 12 starts and 17 appearances, scoring four goals, and played a total of 710 minutes ... In 2024 Roche had 11 starts and 17 total appearances, while tallying a career-high five goals.
- **Sean Sent, MF** (Washington) – Part of the Washington men's soccer team for the past four seasons ... Made 39 appearances and started in 21 matches for the Huskies between 2022 and 2024 ... Tallied two goals and played a total of 1,699 minutes.
- **Sergi Solans Ormo, F** (Oregon State) – Recorded 16 appearances and 14 starts for Oregon State in 2024 ... Led the team with 14 goals and three assists on the year ... After the year was drafted in the first round 30th overall by Real Salt Lake in the 2025 MLS SuperDraft ... Earned Third Team All-America honors, WCC Offensive Player of the Year and United Soccer Coaches All-Region honors ... Seventh most goals in the country in 2024.
- **Ryan Tiltack, GK** (Toronto FC Academy) – Goalkeeper for the U18 MLS Next Academy of Toronto FC... Has trained with both the Toronto FC First and Second Teams and has been invited to train with the Senior Canadian National Team.

INTERNATIONAL FLAIR

UCLA's current crop of players boasts eight student-athletes who were born or have lived abroad. UCLA's roster features two from Denmark (Philip Naef, Oliver Roche), two from Spain (Ander Marticorena, Sergi Solans Ormo), and one from Canada (Ryan Tiltack), Cyprus (Konstantinos Georgallides), and Ghana (Francis Bonsu), while Artem Vovk was born in Ukraine before coming to the United States as a kid.

BRING ON THE B1G TEN

UCLA men's soccer begins its second season as a member of the Big Ten Conference on Thursday evening. The Bruins boast winning records against five current Big Ten schools. UCLA's first conference match will be on Sept. 12 when UCLA hosts Northwestern.

BRUINS ON THE BIG TEN NETWORK

UCLA will have six games broadcast on the Big Ten Network in 2025. UCLA's home matches against Wisconsin on Sept. 19, and Maryland on Oct. 3 will be broadcast on the network, while the squads matches at Indiana, Ohio State, Michigan and Michigan State will be broadcast on the network as well.

BRUINS ON B1G+

Five of UCLA's matches will be broadcast on B1G+ (\$) in 2025, including UCLA's home opener on August 24 at 7 pm PT against California.

Ryan Jorden enters his sixth season as the UCLA men's head soccer coach in 2024. He was named the 11th head coach in program history on Apr. 29, 2019 by then-UCLA Director of Athletics Dan Guerrero.

through 16 seasons as a head coach at the collegiate level, Jorden has compiled an overall record of 150-113-35 (.562 winning percentage) and secured 10 postseason berths. He has steered his teams to double-digit wins in eight separate seasons, including five of the last nine years. On the player development side, Jorden has coached 13 players who were drafted or signed Homegrown deals with MLS clubs, including nine during his tenure in Westwood.

In 2024 UCLA entered the Big Ten Conference and Jorden led the Bruins to a 7-6-6 overall mark, and the NCAA Tournament for the fourth year in a row. The Bruins played an immensely difficult schedule in 2024, with UCLA playing 12 of their 19 games against teams ranked or receiving votes in the United Soccer Coaches Poll rankings. Highlights from the year included a 2-1 win at home over No. 2 Ohio State (it was Ohio State's only loss of the regular season), and a 6-0 neutral site win over receiving votes Maryland in Big Ten Tournament Quarterfinals. Under Jorden senior midfielder Andre Ochoa earned first-team All-Big Ten honors, and graduate defender Nico Cavallo earned second-team honors. At the end of the season Cavallo was also drafted in the third round of the MLS Super Draft by New York City FC.

The Bruins had another strong season under Jorden in 2023, finishing 9-4-5, won the Pac-12 title in the league's final season, and reached the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament. UCLA earned the 2023 Pac-12 title in dominant fashion, going undefeated with a 6-0-4 record en route to their first conference title under Jorden, the programs first since 2012, and the teams eighth overall Pac-10/12 title. Under Jordens' tutelage Tucker Lepley earned three third-team All-American honors, while six Bruins were placed on the Pac-12 end-of-season honorees list with Lepley named to the first team, and Jose Contell, Jack Sarkos, and Tommy Silva each earned second team honors. To conclude the season two Bruins, Grayson Doody (1st round - 10th overall to CF Montreal) and Tucker Lepley (3rd round - 62nd overall), were selected in the MLS Super Draft, while Tommy Silva signed a homegrown contract with Real Salt Lake.

UCLA had its strongest season yet under Jorden in 2022, going 12-7-1 and reaching the Third Round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2014. The Bruins also hit the double-digit wins mark in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2014-15. UCLA limited its opponents to one goal or fewer in 10 consecutive games from Sept. 15 to Oct. 29, the program's longest such streak since 2005. Overall, the Bruins held their opponents to one goal or under in all but four contests. Nationally, UCLA ranked among the elite in fewest fouls per game (9.3, 10th), save percentage (.780, 23rd), assists (33, 40th), and goals against average (1.00, 40th). Highlights from the season included a win on the road at No. 12 Clemson in the NCAA Tournament Second Round, the program's first unbeaten trip to the Bay Area Pac-12 schools since 2013, and a season-high five goals against Liberty on Sept. 2. Six Bruins were cited on the Pac-12 All-Conference Team, including Second Team honors for Jose Sosa and Tommy Silva.

The Bruins returned to the postseason in 2021, going 11-7-1 overall and reaching the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015. The Bruins' eight-win improvement from the spring season represented the largest year-to-year turnaround in modern program history, and UCLA's plus-8 goal differential was its best since 2015. Season highlights for the Bruins included a 3-2 victory over then-top-ranked Oregon State on Nov. 7 (the second time a Jorden-led UCLA squad has downed the No. 1 team in the country) and a golden goal victory over UC Santa Barbara in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. The Bruins went 5-4-1 in league play to take third place, the squad's highest finish in the league table since 2015. Four Bruins picked up All-Far West Region honors and a pair of UCLA freshman earned national All-Freshman honors in 2021, led by center back Pietro Grassi who was a First Team All-Region and Freshman Best XI pick. For the season, UCLA led the Pac-12 in assists per game (2.21), fewest fouls per game (9.32), and shot accuracy (48%). The team opened the season by going 6-2-0, the program's best eight-game start to a campaign since 2009.

A trio of Bruins made the jump to the pro ranks after the 2021 season, as center back Ahmed Longmire was selected No. 10 overall in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft by Nashville SC, defender Ben Reveno was the second-round choice of the New England Revolution, and goalkeeper Justin Garces signed as a Homegrown Player with Atlanta United FC in the lead-up to the draft.

The Bruins posted a 6-9-3 record under Jorden in 2019, his first year at the helm. Fielding an opening day lineup that featured just three returning starters, UCLA saw a tangible improvement over the course of the season. Under Jorden's guidance, junior forward Milan Iloski established himself as one of the top offensive threats in college soccer, leading the country with 1.06 goals per game (17 total) including a program-record five scores against San Diego State on Oct. 6. Jorden also oversaw the seamless integration of newcomers including Riley Ferch (Pac-12-high nine assists), Marcony Pimentel, and Ben Reveno. As a team, the campaign featured a number of highlights, none loftier than a 3-2 win over defending national champion and then-No. 1-ranked Maryland on Sept. 6.

His recruiting success has continued at UCLA, with his two most-recent classes earning a national ranking from TopDrawerSoccer. The Bruins' 2021 group of newcomers was ranked No. 4 in the



country, the highest of any Pac-12 program.

Jorden arrived in Westwood with 23 years of collegiate coaching experience under his belt, most recently serving as head coach at the University of the Pacific in Stockton, Calif., where he re-started a dormant program in 2013 and turned the Tigers into perennial national contenders. Pacific reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of his last three seasons, one of just two west coast programs able to make that claim over that span (Stanford).

Prior to that, he helmed the men's soccer program at Cal Baptist, transforming the Lancers into two-time NCCAA National Champions during his five-year tenure. His 2016 squad at Pacific went 13-4-2, representing what was then the largest single-season win-loss turnaround in Division I men's soccer history at 11.5 games. Jorden secured a number of accolades after that standout season, including NCAA Far West Region and West Coast Conference Coach of the Year honors.

His last two seasons in Stockton were just as successful. In 2017, the Tigers posted an identical 13-4-2 record while reaching as high as No. 14 in the national rankings. In 2018, Pacific went 12-5-2 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Over his final three seasons, the Tigers went 38-13-6 (.719).

At Pacific, Jorden oversaw the development of a trio of players who went on to be drafted by MLS teams, as Tristan Blackmon was the third overall selection in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft (LAFC), Camden Riley was a second-round pick by Sporting Kansas City in 2019, and Jonathan Jimenez went No. 26 overall to the Chicago Fire in 2020. Overall, his time at Pacific yielded 27 All-WCC selections, five All-Far West Region picks, three All-Americans, and 13 WCC All-Academic honorees.

Jorden got his head coaching start at Cal Baptist University in 2008, taking the Lancers to an unprecedented level of success during his five years in Riverside. Taking over a program that had qualified for postseason play just once in the prior 18 years, Jorden guided CBU to the postseason in all five of his seasons, including NCCAA National Championships in both 2011 and 2012. Jorden was honored as the NCCAA National Coach of the Year after both of those championship campaigns.

He recorded a 60-30-10 overall record at Cal Baptist, including a 48-15-3 (.750) mark over his final three seasons. He was instrumental in NCAA compliance management as CBU transitioned to Division II during his tenure.
