ROSE BOWL: THE 31st YEAR

The 2012 season marks the 31st year that the Rose Bowl, currently undergoing a renovation, will serve as home of the Bruins.

The focus of the renovation project is to expedite tunnel ingress/egress, improve concourse circulation, increase the number of concession stands and restrooms, provide state-of-the-art premium seating products in a rebuilt press box and install a new scoreboard and video board.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 126-56-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

In July of 2007, the Rose Bowl was selected the No. 1 sports venue by SI.com/Slon-Campus.

GAME 4 — The Bruins (3-0), ranked 19th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls, begin Pac-12 Conference play by hosting Oregon State (1-0) on Saturday, September 22 in the Rose Bowl. Kickoff is set for 12:30 p.m. PT and the game will be televised by ABC (and shown on ESPN2 in areas of the country where it is not the ABC regional game) with Sean McDonough and Chris Spielman in the booth and Quint Kessenich on the sidelines. UCLA played its first game as a ranked team last week against Houston since Sept. 15, 2007.

The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on 1150am in the Los Angeles area. The game will also be aired nationally on SIRIUS (Ch. 85), XM (Ch. 85).

VS. OREGON STATE — The Bruins lead the series 41-15-4 and have captured the last two meetings. The two teams met last season in UCLA's first-ever game in the Pac-12 conference. The Bruins came away with a 27-19 verdict in Corvallis. Turnovers helped UCLA jump out to a 21-3 lead. After OSU closed to 21-19 on the last play of the third quarter, the Bruins used a one-yard scoring run by Anthony Barr to go ahead 27-19 with 6:15 to play in the contest. That drive began after the Bruin defense had stopped OSU on a fourth-and-one play at the UCLA 34-yard line. Derrick Coleman ran for 100 yards in the contest. Cornerback Aaron Hester was credited with a career-best 11 tackles. Quarterback Richard Brehaut threw for 146 yards and a touchdown. In 2010, Kai Forbath booted a 51-yard field goal on the last play of the Bruin win in the Rose Bowl.

IN BRIEF

****RB Johnathan Franklin leads the nation in rushing (180.33/g) after putting together three straight 100-yard rushing games, including two season-opening 200 yards plus efforts against Rice (214) and Nebraska (217)...he also leads the nation in all-purpose yardage (222.33)**

****This is the second time in his career Franklin has put together three-straight 100-yard rushing games, also in 2010 ... the last player to have more than three straight was Tyler Ebell, with six consecutive in 2002**

****QB Brett Hundley's 320 passing yards against Houston made him the first Bruin freshman to ever throw for 300 yards in back-to-back games (309 v. Nebraska)**

****Hundley leads all freshmen nationally in passing yards (827), total offense yards (946) and completions (23/g); he is tied for the freshman lead nationally in scoring passes with eight**

****In the second half of its first three contests, UCLA has allowed a total of 282 yards of offense and 12 points**

****This was Franklin's 13th career 100-yard rushing game, tied for fifth on all-time list with DeShaun Foster**

****The last UCLA head coach to begin his career with three straight wins was Terry Donahue, in 1976, who went unbeaten in his first 10 games (tie in game four)**

****UCLA has not gained at least 500 yards of total offense in any three previous three game stretch (complete records date back to the 1958 season) ... It has not gained at least 500 yards of total offense three times in a single season since 2005 ... The 653 yards gained against Nebraska was the sixth-highest total in school history and most since 2005; It marked the first time UCLA had ever put together back-to-back games with at least 645 yards of total offense (646 yards at Rice)**

****Franklin's 3,210 yds rushing ranks fourth among active FBS players (1-Montee Ball of Wisconsin-3,630)**

****UCLA and Oklahoma State are the only schools in FBS averaging at least 300 yds rushing and 300 yds passing**

****The Bruins lead the nation in interceptions with seven in three games**

****The UCLA defense has scored in each game this season (fumble returns at Rice and vs. Houston for touchdowns and a safety vs. Nebraska)**

****UCLA had six 200-yard rushing games last season and has opened the 2012 season with a 247-yard total vs. Houston, 344-yard total vs. Nebraska and a 343-yard total at Rice ... The Bruins have won 23 straight games in which they have rushed for at least 250 yards (80-3-1 all-time)**

- ** UCLA has put points on the board in all but one quarter of play in the first three games
- **In recent years, UCLA has opened a season with at least three straight wins in the 2009 (3-0), 2005 (8-0), 2001 (6-0), 1998 (10-0)
- **With a career total of 3,210 yds, Franklin has vaulted into second on the all-time school list He is 522 yards shy of Gaston Green's (1984-87) mark of 3,731 yards.
- **UCLA is off to a 2-0 start in games played at the Rose Bowl this season after posting a 5-1 record in Pasadena last season, including wins in all four Pac-12 conference home games
- **Franklin became the third UCLA back to rush for at least 200 yards in at least three games, joining Gaston Green (3) and Karim Abdul-Jabbar (3) ... Abdul-Jabbar rushed for over 200 yards in three straight games in the 1995 season against Stanford (261), Cal (217) and Arizona State (207).
- **The 2011 season marked the eighth straight season in which UCLA had won its first conference game of the year and then gone on to become bowl eligible
- **Nine of the last 13 UCLA quarterbacks making their first start have helped lead the team to a win
- **LB Eric Kendricks has started the last six games and totaled 47 tackles in those contests (7.8 avg.) ... he had a career-best 11 stops at Rice
- **Senior cornerback Sheldon Price tied the school record with three interceptions against Houston ... Redshirt soph safety Tevin McDonald tied the school mark last season with three thefts against Cal
- **Senior punter Jeff Locke, on the Ray Guy Watch list, placed a personal-best 26 punts inside the 20 in 2011 and has 11, out of 17 kicks, so far this season, with six fair catches, as he helps UCLA win the field position battle
- **Y receiver Joseph Fauria, on the Mackey Award Watch List, caught his 10th and 11th career scoring passes vs. Nebraska marking the third game in his career with multiple tds

FOR THE OREGON STATE GAME — Honorary Captain --- The Bruins welcome back quarterback Matt Stevens (1983-86) as this week's honorary captain. Stevens currently serves as a radio analyst for UCLA football on FOX Sports Radio AM 570. During his collegiate career, Stevens amassed 2,931 passing yards which ranks 12th on the all-time school list). He helped lead the Bruins to the 1986 Rose Bowl, a 45-28 win over Iowa. The following year, Stevens guided UCLA to its fifth straight bowl victory as the Bruins toppled BYU 31-10 in the Freedom Bowl. Prior to his work in sports broadcasting, Stevens spent a year with the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs as well as seeing action in the Arena League.

THIS AND THAT ABOUT THE BRUINS — Linebacker **Eric Kendricks**(#6) is the son of former Bruin, Marv Kendricks, who led UCLA in rushing in 1970 and 1971; Eric's brother, Mychal, is a former linebacker at Cal who is now in the NFL ... Defensive back **Tevin McDonald**'s(#7) brother, Tim Jr., plays at USC and his dad, Tim, played in the NFL from 1987-99 with the Cardinals and 49ers ... Defensive back **Sheldon Price**'s(#22) dad, Dennis, played at UCLA from 1984-87 and then in the NFL with the Raiders ... Punter **Jeff Locke**(#18) has been named to the All-Conference academic team the past three seasons; he has finished 12th (2011), fourth (2010) and 16th (2009) in the nation in punting average ... OL **Xavier Su'a-Filo** (#56) spent the last two years on an LDS mission in Alabama and Florida during which time he learned the Spanish language ... LB **Anthony Barr**'s(#11) dad, Tony Brooks, was a fourth-round pick of the Eagles in the 1992 draft, after playing at Notre Dame ... Reserve fullback **Luke Gane**(#49) underwent chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant in high school to help overcome a rare blood disorder (aplastic anemia) ... Offensive guard **Alexandru Ceachir** (#76) came to this country two years ago from Moldova (located between Romania and Ukraine) and can speak four languages - Russian, English, Romanian, Ukrainian ... Freshman linebacker **Aaron Porter**'s (#30) mom, Sandy, played in the Softball World Series for Long Beach State and is in the school's Hall of Fame ... Running back **Jordan James** (#6) has a black belt in Taekwondo ... Defensive back **Brandon Sermons**'(#2) brother, Rodney, also played for USC ... **Brett Hundley**'s(#17) dad, Brett, Sr., lettered at running back for the University of Arizona ... Most of the Bruin coaching staff has a tie to the NFL - head coach **Jim Mora** - 25 seasons with San Diego 1985-91, New Orleans 1992-96, San Francisco 1997-2003, Atlanta 2004-06, Seattle 2007-09; receivers coach **Eric Yarber** - 5 seasons with Tampa Bay 2010-11, San Francisco 2003-04, Seattle 1998; Defensive Coord. **Lou Spanos** - 17 seasons with Washington 2010-11 and Pittsburgh 1995-2009; Special teams Coord./ Linebackers coach **Jeff Ulbrich** - 2 seasons with Seattle 2010-11; Offensive Coordinator **Noel Mazzone** - 3 seasons with NY Jets 2006-08 ... Coaches who played in the NFL include Yarber, Ulbrich (who was on 49ers' defense coached by **Jim Mora**), Y receivers coach **Marques Tuiasosopo**, running backs coach **Steve Broussard**, offensive line coach **Adrian Klemm** ... Other players with NFL ties include freshmen **Ishmael Adams** (#24) (dad, Stefon, was selected in third rd. of 1985 draft); **Paul Perkins**' (#24) dad played football at Arizona State and with Tampa Bay and Indianapolis and his uncle, Don Perkins played with the Dallas Cowboys; redshirt freshman linebacker **Aaron Wallace**'s (#12) dad played at Texas A&M and for eight seasons with the Raiders; freshman quarterback **Jerry Neuheisel**'s (#11) dad played with Tampa Bay and San Diego and was the head coach at UCLA (2008-11) ... In addition, **Jerry Rice, Jr.**'s (#88) dad was a 13-time Pro Bowler with San Francisco and Oakland ... Y receiver **Joseph Fauria**'s (#8) uncle, Christian, played at Colorado and for 13 seasons in the NFL with Seattle, New England, Washington, Carolina ... P **Jeff Locke** was named UCLA's male Scholar Athlete of the Year for 2011-12.

COACH MORA'S TEAM — First-year head coach Jim Mora, a former NFC Coach of the Year while with the Atlanta Falcons, has 43 letterwinners returning for action. The Bruins welcome back six players who started the bulk of the games at their defensive positions in 2011 and seven more on the offensive side of the ball who were on the field for the first snap in the majority of games. Returning players with 20 or more starts under their belts include -- Offensive lineman **Jeff Baca** (35), running back **Johnathan Franklin** (35), defensive cornerback **Sheldon Price** (34), defensive end **Datone Jones** (32), defensive cornerback **Aaron Hester** (27), quarterback **Kevin Prince** (26), linebacker **Damien Holmes** (21). Also back is Y receiver **Joseph Fauria** who led the team with six touchdown grabs last season. Linebackers **Eric Kendricks** and **Jordan Zumwalt**, who ranked second and third, respectively, on the team in tackles last season return. Interception leaders **Andrew Abbott** (4) and **Tevin McDonald** (3) move back into the secondary. Punter **Jeff Locke**, one of the nation's best, is primed for a standout season.

WORKING OVERTIME — UCLA has a 7-1 record in overtime games, the last coming in the 2008 season-opener against Tennessee, a 27-24 win.

FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS — Nine true freshmen -- CB Ishmael Adams, WR Jordan Payton, F Kenneth Walker, OT Simon Goines, CB Fabian Moreau, DB Randall Goforth, PK Ka'imi Fairbairn, DL Ellis McCarthy, DB Marcus Rios -- have seen action in 2012.

A school-record 17 true freshmen played for the Bruins in 1977. Thirteen played in 1975, 12 in 1978, 1980 and 2004 and 10 played in 1979. In recent years, nine played in 2005, eight in 2006, two in 2007 and 11 in 2008. UCLA played 10 freshmen in 2009. The Bruins played 10 freshmen in 2010. Tight end Raymond Nelson (no longer on the roster) was the lone first-year player to see action in 2011.

THE OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK — Redshirt freshman **BRETT HUNDLEY (#17)** scored a touchdown after taking his first snap as a college player at Rice. He raced 72-yards to paydirt on UCLA's initial offensive play from scrimmage. Hundley completed 21 of 28 passing attempts during the game for 202 yards and two touchdowns. He ran seven times for 68 yards. The redshirt freshman threw for 305 yards (10th on freshman list) and ran for 53 yards against Nebraska for 358 yards of total offense (third on freshman list). He threw for 320 yards against Houston, sixth on the all-time freshman list. His 318 yards of total offense rank eighth on the school freshman list.

Hundley graduated early from Chandler HS in Chandler, AZ and joined the Bruins in Winter Quarter 2011 (January). He took part in spring practice at UCLA, but was limited early in the 2011 fall camp due to a summer knee injury. Hundley did not see action in the 2011 season. He participated in a second spring practice in 2012 and won the starting job in pre-season camp.

He threw for 2,348 yards as a senior in high school with 20 scoring passes, two interceptions. He also led his team in rushing with 856 yards and nine touchdowns. Following his senior season, he won the passing competition at the Under Armour All-America Game Skills Challenge. As a junior, he threw for 1,517 yards and 16 touchdowns with two interceptions. Hundley rushed for 1,208 yards and 12 touchdowns. He was named Arizona's Gatorade Player of the Year in 2009.

Redshirt senior **KEVIN PRINCE (#4)** saw his first action of 2012 in the fourth quarter of the Houston game. He started the last eight games (10 starts overall) of 2011. Prince completed his junior season ranked among UCLA's all-time best in total offense (8th), pass completions (8th) and passing yards (9th). He finished up with 424 yards rushing for 2011 (most by Bruin qb since Jeff Dankworth racked up 815 in the 1976 season). His 163 yards rushing v. Cal marked the first time a Bruin quarterback had rushed for at least 100 yards in a game since Dankworth in 1976. It was the most rushing yardage by a quarterback since John Sciarra totaled 178 versus Tennessee in 1974.

In 2010, Prince appeared in five games, all starts. He was sidelined for the balance of that season after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery on Oct. 23. In 2009, Prince started all 11 games in which he played. He became the second freshman quarterback in UCLA history to pass for over 300 yards three times in a season (Tommy Maddox, 1990).

True senior **RICHARD BREHAUT (#12)** saw action for a few plays in the second half of action against Nebraska and completed one pass. He came on in the fourth quarter of the Rice game and threw for 101 yards.

In 2011, he appeared in seven games, with four starts. He came on in relief of Kevin Prince in the opener at Houston and went on to start game two against San Jose State. He came off the bench against Texas and then started games at Oregon and at Stanford. He suffered a broken leg after starting game six against Washington State. He came back for a brief appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game and threw his first interception in 141 passing attempts.

In 2010, Brehaut appeared in nine games, with seven starts. He started the final six games of the season. At Arizona State, he set school records with his 33 pass completions (old record, 32 by Troy Aikman v. USC in 1988) and 56 pass attempts (old record, 51 by Dennis Dummit v. Cal in 1970). He also set personal bests with 321 passing yards and three touchdown passes.

OFFENSIVE LINE — The Bruins started three freshmen on the offensive line in a season-opening game for the first time in history. Redshirt freshmen Torian White joined true freshman Simon Goines at the tackle positions, Jake Brendel handled the center spot.

Redshirt senior **JEFF BACA (#60)**, the team leader with 35 career starts, started at guard in the first two games of the 2012 season. He started at tackle for 11 contests last season before sliding to guard against Illinois in the bowl game. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left guard. In 2008, he appeared in nine games with eight starts at left tackle.

True sophomore **XAVIER SU'A-FILO (#56)** returns to UCLA after serving a two-year Mormon mission. Su'a Filo started the first three games of 2012 at guard. He re-enrolled in school for the 2012 Winter Quarter and was back on the field in the spring. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left tackle which was the most starts by a Bruin true freshman at any non-kicking position. Su'a-Filo became

Entering the Oregon State game, 98 of UCLA's last 99 games have been televised live, including 36 in a row.

All 14 of UCLA's games in the 2011 season were on live TV. In 2010, each of the 12 contests were broadcast live. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was delayed).

the first Bruin true freshman to start a season-opener on the offensive side of the ball and earned Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 honors.

Redshirt freshman **JAKE BRENDLE (#54)** made his first start in the 2012 opener at Rice. He was named Coach Ed Kezirian "Coach K" Award winner for Academic and Athletic Balance. Redshirt freshman **TORIAN WHITE (#77)** enjoyed a solid spring and started his first game at Rice. True freshman tackle **SIMON GOINES (#70)** started his first college game at Rice. Redshirt junior **GREG CAPELLA (#64)** came on for Baca at guard in the second half at Nebraska and saw action off the bench against Houston. He lined up at guard for 13 games and moved in at center for the San Jose State game in 2011. Redshirt senior **BRETT DOWNEY (#78)** was a member of the Bruin special teams unit for placekicks in 2011 and appeared in two games at tackle. He made his first career start (OT) in the bowl game against Illinois. He started at guard in game three of 2012 against Houston.

RUNNING BACKS — Redshirt senior tailback **JOHNATHAN FRANKLIN (#23)** has started 35 career games. He kicked off the 2012 season with a pair of 200-yard plus rushing games, the second and third of his career to match Gaston Green (1985, 1986, 1987) and Karim Abdul-Jabbar (three in a row 1995) for the most in school history. In game three against Houston, he racked up 110 yards on the ground and caught a career-best four passes for 58 yards.

Franklin began the 2012 season with a 214-yard effort at Rice, which included two 70-plus yard runs for touchdowns. He raced 74 yards midway through the first quarter and then navigated 78 yards for a score late in the second quarter. He became the first Bruin to have two runs of over 72 yards in a game. Franklin was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for his efforts against the Owls. Against Nebraska, Franklin compiled a career-best 217 yards on the ground on 26 carries. He also caught a nine-yard scoring pass in the fourth quarter. For the second week in a row, he was named Conference Player of the Week. UCLA had never before had the same player earn back-to-back POW honors from the Pac-12/Pac-10.

The big start to the new season has vaulted Franklin into second place on the all-time school rushing list with 3,210 yards. He posted his 13th career 100-yard rushing day against Houston, which ties him with DeShaun Foster for fifth on the all-time school list. Franklin ran for a previous career-best 216 (30 carries) in a 2010 contest against Washington State (it was the most since Maurice Jones-Drew ran for 322 at Washington in 2004).

In 2010, Franklin appeared in all 12 games and made 10 starts. He led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards (5.3 ave), the 10th-best season mark in school history. He became UCLA's first 1,000-yard rusher since Chris Markey in 2006 (1,107), and totaled the highest yardage by a Bruin since Skip Hicks (1,282-1997). He ran for 118 yards against USC to become the first Bruin back to hit the century mark versus the Trojans since DeShaun Foster in 1998. Franklin saw action in all 13 games in 2009, making eight starts. He led the team with 566 rushing yards, 12th in the Pac-10 and No. 6 on UCLA's freshman rushing list.

HEAD COACH JIM MORA



*25 years NFL experience

*Head coach Seattle Seahawks and Atlanta Falcons

*NFC Coach of the Year with the Falcons

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. Mora comes to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brings 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game in the playoffs. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year. The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. In the 2002 and 2003 seasons with San Francisco, the defense finished no worse than fourth in the NFL versus the run and in 2003, produced 42 sacks to tie for second in the conference. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game and had three defensive players voted to the Pro Bowl, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach, while working for head coaches Coryell, Al Saunders and Dan Henning.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of head coach Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

NFL Pro Bowlers who have played under coach Mora over the years include -- Julian Peterson, LB Seattle and San Francisco; Marcus Truitt, DB Seattle; Allen Rossum, DB Atlanta; Patrick Kerney, DL Atlanta; Roderick Coleman, DL Atlanta; Keith Brooking, LB Atlanta; DeAngelo Hall, DB Atlanta; Michael Vick, QB Atlanta; Alge Crumpler, TE Atlanta; Warrick Dunn, RB Atlanta; Bryant Young, DL San Francisco; Lance Schulters, DB San Francisco; Merton Hanks, DB San Francisco; Eric Allen, DB New Orleans; Tyrone Hughes, DB New Orleans; Gill Byrd, DB San Diego Chargers.

DID YOU KNOW...

Three Bruin coaches and 11 players, including 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 13 former players currently working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

During the last 30 years (including 2011), UCLA has been ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 on 12 occasions, second only to USC (17) among Pac-10 schools. Washington is next with 10 rankings.

The selection of tight end Mercedes Lewis by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round of the 2006 NFL draft marked the 29th time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 28 of the last 31 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

In the initial decade of the 2000's, UCLA had 12 finalists / winners of the National player awards --- 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 108 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's volleyball in 2011-12).

THE KICKING GAME

Redshirt senior punter **JEFF LOCKE (#18)** had four more punts land inside the twenty against Houston and kicked to a 43.4 average with seven out of eight touchbacks on kickoffs. He placed four punts against Nebraska inside the 20 yard line and helped the team win the field position battle. Locke had six punts, three inside the 20, for a 43.7-yard average. He boomed all nine kickoffs for touchbacks. Locke ranked fifth in the Pac-12 and 12th in the nation with a 44.34 average in 2011. He also kicked his first field goals, making two against Texas. Locke's career punting average of 44.58 ranks first all-time at UCLA. He was named to the 2011 second-team Pac-12 All-Academic squad for the third straight season and was selected UCLA's male Scholar-Athlete for 2011-12.

In 2010, Locke helped UCLA lead the nation in net punting (41.27). He ranked first in the Pac-10 and fourth in the NCAA (45.84). Locke earned third-team All-America acclaim from Rivals.com and was the punter on the ESPN Academic All-District 8 team as well as Pac-10 All-Academic first team.
