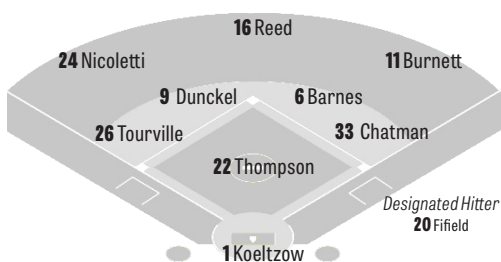

AT A GLANCE

- » Head coach Shanon Hays is only the second head coach in GCU softball history.
- » Hays earned WAC Coach of the Year after matching a program best record before entering the post season.
- » 7 Lopes earned All-WAC honors. Five were named to the first team: Denae Chatman, Katelyn Dunckel, Kristin Fifield, Gianna Nicoletti, and Ariel Thompson.
- » Catcher Kinsey Koeltzow earned second team and Dunckel, Koeltzow and Stephanie Reed earned All-Defensive team.
- » The Lopes return six players from the 2021 season and welcomed 11 transfers and five freshmen.
- » Returners for the Lopes include Anjolee Aguilar-Beaucage, Ryan Denhart, Jacie Hambrick, Kristin Fifield, Gianna Nicoletti, and Savannah Tourville. All six returners earned All-WAC awards in the 2021 season.
- » Hays added transfers from a few big-name programs: Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, ASU, North Texas, and Utah State. As well as multiple junior college transfers including National Champion Phoenix College.
- » The Lopes are heavy on experience this season with two graduate students, three season, and six juniors making up most of the Lopes' roster.
- » In the circle the Lopes have added four pitchers rounding out the staff to six total righties. The familiar faces of Denhart and Hambrick will be supported by two juniors, Kaila Eastburn and Ariel Thompson as well as two freshmen, Brooke Owens, and Kennedie Magorian.
- » The Lopes have added depth to the infield as well with the addition of Katelyn Dunckel and Macee Barnes in the middle infield as well as Jocellyn La Flesch, Hannah Burnett, and Denae Chatman at the corners.
- » The outfield will look similar to last season with the addition of Stephanie Reed to command center field and having Nicoletti and Fifield in left and right.
- » Behind the plate and commanding the defense will be Kinsey Koeltzow with competition from Annie Villalobos, Mikaela Payne, and Brylee Bilger.

LAST TIME OUT

- » The Lopes won the WAC Conference Tournament after dropping game one to SFA the bounced back in game two.

» FIFTH YEAR STADIUM

Excitement continues to build on the campus of GCU. After opening the brand new stadium for the first year of postseason eligibility, the Lopes will look to use their fourth season of eligibility to make noise in the WAC Tournament.

THE STADIUM: GCU SOFTBALL STADIUM

The 1,200-seat GCU Softball Stadium opened Feb. 8, 2018, to surround a playing field that was installed in 2017.

In the second phase of the facility's construction, the temporary bleachers were removed and ground was broken for permanent chair-back seating and bleacher seating, an indoor press box capable of handling television and radio broadcasts, a full concession stand and full-amenity bathrooms.

The first phase of the project consisted of a new FieldTurf playing surface, relocating the field from Stapleton-Pierson Stadium to make room for a larger stadium north of the Lopes Performance Center. The first phase also included construction of spacious dugouts, batting cages and bullpens on the home and visitor sides.

The new stadium features a middle section of individual chairback seats and sections to each side with bench seating that has back supports. The northeast-facing stadium also is protected by fabric shading.

» 2022 WAC TOURNAMENT

New WAC opponent Sam Houston will host the 2022 WAC Tournament at Bearkat Softball Complex in Huntsville, Texas on May 11-14.

There are only eight schools eligible to compete in the WAC tournament this season including Abilene Christian, GCU, Lamar, New Mexico State, Sam Houston, Seattle U, Stephen F. Austin, and Utah Valley.

The Lopes have won two WAC regular season championships but have not won the conference tournament and a bid to the NCAA tournament.



1 KINSEY KOELTZOW- JR. - C/INF - TUTTLE, OKLA. / OKLAHOMA

Koeltzow brings a winning attitude to the Lopes as she transferred from the University of Oklahoma after being apart of the 2021 National Championship team. In 2021 she saw action in 29 games and totaled 13 at bats, 11 runs scored and five hits. She totaled 17 putouts and two assists for the Sooners.

6 MACEE BARNES- JR. - INF - GROVE, OKLA. / OKLAHOMA STATE

Barnes brings experience to the Lopes middle infield as she was apart of the Oklahoma State team who appeared in the College World Series in 2021. During her time with the Cowgirls, Barnes appeared in six games mainly as a pinch runner and scored two runs and had one at bat.

9 KATELYN DUNCKEL - SO. - INF - VALLEY CENTER, CALIF. / OKLAHOMA CHRISTIAN

Dunkel comes to GCU from Oklahoma Christian where she played under head coach Shanon Hays in 2021. She made 46 starts and played in 47 games at shortstop for the Eagles earning second team All-Lone Star Conference as well as all-freshman team and all-tournament team. Dunkel was second in batting average at OCU (.348). She totaled 48 hits, 18 of which were extra base hits including 10 doubles, six triples, and two homeruns. Also was 17 for 18 in stolen bases.

10 JOCELYN LA FLESCHE- JR. - INF - GILBERT, ARIZ. / PHOENIX COLLEGE

LaFlesche comes to the Lopes from Phoenix College where she was apart of the NJCAA D2 National Championship team. She earned all-region first team, ACCAC first team, NJCAA D2 All-American second team, NJCAA D2 south region first team and NFCA D2 all-american first team. She hit .538 with 11 homeruns and 63 RBIs for the Bears. As well as an on base percentage of .596 and a slugging percentage of .924.

11 HANNAH BURNETT- JR. - INF - INDEPENDENCE, KS / NORTHEASTERN OKLA. A&M

Burnett transferred to GCU from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M where she was a standout for the Lady Norse. In 2021 she started in all 46 games and hit .463 with a slugging percentage of .673 and an on base of .503. Burnett totaled 75 hits including 17 doubles, four triples, and three homeruns. She added 51 stolen bases and 68 runs scored.

13 ANNIE VILLALOBOS- JR. - C/1B - ESCONDIDO, CALIF. / GEORGE MASON

Villalobos comes to GCU from George Mason University. The catcher played in 21 games and made 11 starts for the Patriots in 2021. She recorded a slash line of .200/.275/.543 with eight RBIs and a team best four homeruns. Including a walk off for her first homer of the season.

16 STEPHANIE REED- GR. - OF - SANTA FE, TEXAS / UTAH STATE

Reed is not a new face to the GCU softball stadium as she has taken on the Lopes many times with the Aggies of Utah State. The outfielder will bring lots of experience to the outfield. In her final season with the Aggies, Reed played in 39 games and started in 38. She totaled 39 hits including 14 extra base hits: five doubles, eight homeruns, and one triple. She scored 21 runs and added 17 RBIs of her own.

18 MIKAELA PAYNE- SO. - C/INF - ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. / YAVAPAI CC

Payne comes to the Lopes after spending a year at Yavapai community college. The catcher hit .437 and had a slugging percentage of .937 with 17 homeruns. She earned ACCAC second team all-conference battery as well as NJCAA first team Division I all-region battery. As well as being named NJCAA DI all-american catcher and NJCAA national all-tournament team. She also appeared in the 2021 NJCAA DI Championship.

22 ARIEL THOMPSON - JR. - P/UTL - CLAREMONT, OKLA. / NORTH TEXAS

Thompson comes to the Lopes after being part of the North Texas pitching staff just a season ago. In her career at NT she made 23 appearances and eight starts on the rubber. In 2021 she posted a 2-0 record with an ERA of 1.97 and 31 strikeouts in 21.1 innings pitched. She held opponents to a .190 batting average and issued just five walks while also earning a save.

33 DENAE CHATMAN - GR. - 1B - GOODYEAR, ARIZ. / ARIZONA STATE

Chatman is finishing up her softball career with the Lopes after spending four seasons as a starter at ASU. In 2021 she started 42 out of 44 games for the Sun Devils. At the plate she hit .264 with a slugging percentage of .585 and an on base of .373. She totaled 28 hits including nine homeruns, five doubles, and a triple. Adding 27 RBIs and 25 runs scored.

61 KAILA EASTBURN - SO. - P/UTL - ONTARIO, CALIF. / VERNON COLLEGE

Eastburn comes to the Lopes after spending two seasons at Vernon College. In 2021 she appeared in 28 games making 18 starts in the circle for the Chaps and throwing 17 complete games. Posted a 20-3 record totaling 156.2 innings and an ERA of 2.10. She fanned 195 batters for an average of 8.71 strikeouts per seven innings. In the batters box she totaled 162 at bats and totaled a .401 batting average. She plated 56 RBIs and totaled 41 extra base hits on the season including 22 doubles, nine triples, and 10 homeruns.



3 ANJOLEE AGUILAR-BEAUCLAGE - SO.-INF - TUCSON, ARIZ/SALPOINTE CATHOLIC

In her first season with GCU Anj earned All-WAC honorable mention. She started all 49 games at shortstop for the Lopes and had a team best 11 doubles. She was third on the team in RBIs with 23 and hit .311 with a slugging percentage of .467. In total she had 42 hits including two homeruns. At Salpointe high school she was a four-year varsity starter and earned Kino Defensive Player of the Year as a senior.

19 JACIE HAMBRICK SO.- P/INF - DEWEY, ARIZ. / BRADSHAW MOUNTAIN

In her freshman season Hambrick earned All-WAC honorable mention and earned one WAC Pitcher of the Week award. She made 10 starts in the circle and appeared in 24 games for the Lopes. Had a team best 68 strikeouts and was second in ERA with a 4.62 and a record of 6-10. She also made 10 starts as the designated player collecting 10 hits and six RBIs.

20 KRISTIN FIFIELD - JR. -UTL - EL PASO, TEXAS / CHAPIN

Fifield has spent two seasons with the Lopes and seen action in both the infield and outfield. In the 2021 season she was named first team All-WAC and started all 49 games in center field. She had a team best slugging percentage of .562, 33 RBIs, seven homeruns, and four triples. She was second in total hits (52) and third in average (.340). In 2020 she made 22 starts and appeared in 26 games.

23 RYAN DENHART - SR. - RHP - LOS ALAMITOS, CALIF. / MARYLAND

Denhart enters her fourth and final season with the Lopes. She has earned All-WAC second team twice as well as being named preseason pitcher of the year. Last season she made 20 starts and appeared in 25 games in the circle. She has a team best 3.46 ERA and a 8-10 record. She threw seven complete games including shutout. In 101.1 innings she totaled 62 strikeouts and two saves.

24 GIANNA NICOLETTI - GR. - OF - FULLERTON, CALIF. / DRAGNE LUTHERAN

Nicoletti earned first team All-WAC and a place on the WAC Tournament Team after her performance in 2021. She stole 28 bases in 2021 to become the Lopes' DI-era holder for steals in a single season and for a career with 39. G started all 49 games in left field and hitting leadoff for GCU. She had a team best average of .361 with 56 hits and 38 runs scored. She totaled seven extra base hits including five doubles and two triples. She also collected 22 walks and an on base percentage of .450.

26 SAVANNAH TOURVILLE - SR. - INF - WHITTER, CALIF. / LA HABRA

Savy enters her final year with the Lopes after earning first team All-WAC and having a place on the all-tournament team as a freshman and being named to the preseason All-WAC team as a sophomore. Last season she earned All-WAC honorable mention. She led the Lopes in on base percentage (.458) with nine hit by pitches and 17 walks. She was second in batting average (.354) and slugging percentage (.504).

4 BRYLEE BILGER - FR. - C - SURPRISE, ARIZ. / PARADISE HONORS

Bilger enters her freshman season with the Lopes after being a four-year varsity starter at Paradise Honors. She earned all-region catcher, all-region player of the year and led the state in homeruns in her senior season. In her high school career she totaled a .523 batting average with 141 RBIs, 33 homeruns, and a slugging percentage of 1.099.

5 EMMA VILLAESCUSA - FR. - UTL - PHOENIX, ARIZ. / SANDRA DAY O'CONNOR

Villaescusa was a four-year varsity starter for the Eagles. She earned 6A Desert Valley All-Region 2nd team as a senior and helped lead her team to a state championship in 2019. She was also named to the all-academic team.

27 KENNEDIE MAGORIAN - FR. - RHP - FORESTHILL, CALIF. / OAKMONT

Magorian comes to the Lopes after being a four-year varsity starter and captain at Oakmont High School. For the Vikings she helped lead her team to two league championships. In her senior season she earned FVL Scholar Athlete, all-metro team, max preps all-star team and optimist all-star team. She carried a 2.81 ERA in 79 innings pitched with 109 strikeouts.

99 BROOKE OWENS - FR. - RHP - TRABUCO CANYON, CALIF. / SANTA MARGARITA

A Trabuco Canyon, California native, Owens averaged seven strikeouts per game and has a career ERA of 1.97 for the Eagles. In her junior season she earned a record of 8-1 with 52 innings pitched. She also plays for So Cal Athletics, the previously top-ranked travel ball team in the country.

AT-A-GLANCE

- » UCLA enters the Los Angeles Regional with a record of 43- 8. The Bruins are making their 37th tournament appearance and their seventh consecutive hosting dating back to 2014.
- » The Bruins are the 5th overall seed in the NCAA Tournament and finishing second in the PAC 12 standings just one game behind Arizona State.
- » UCLA earned two major PAC 12 awards, four first teamers, three third teamers, one all-defensive team, and one all-freshman team. Megan Faraimo was named Pitcher of the Year and Briana Perez was named Defensive Player of the Year.
- » Faraimo and Perez were named to the first team along with Holly Azevedo and Delenie Wisz. On the third team was Maya Brady, Savannah Pola, and Kinsley Washington.
- » Perez earned a place on the all-defensive team and Pola found a place on the all-freshman team.
- » As a team the Bruins are hitting .319 with 319 runs scored, 410 hits, including 81 doubles, 13 triples, and 54 homeruns. They have a team slugging percentage of .528 and an on base of .396.
- » In the circle UCLA's four person staff is posting a 1.38 ERA with 16 complete games and 20 shutouts. In 328.2 innings pitched they have allowed 203 hits, 86 runs, 65 earned runs, and retired 429 batters. Opponents are hitting .171 against the Bruins.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

- » Faraimo was logged the most innings on the rubber for the Bruins with 164.1 she has made 21 starts and appeared in 38 games. The junior has a team best 20-4 record, 12 complete games, six saves, and 252 strikeouts. She has allowed 20 doubles and 22 homeruns with opponents hitting .168 against her.
- » Fellow pitcher Azevedo matched Faraimo in starts with 21 and made 26 appearances, she tossed 103.2 innings on the rubber for the Bruins. The senior has a 1.15 ERA with a record of 17-2, she has retired 175 batters and allowed 65 hits.
- » At the plate Perez leads the Bruins in most offensive categories; average (.397), slugging percentage (.756), hits (62), triples, (6), and stolen bases (16). She has also totaled 14 doubles, 10 homeruns, and 38 RBIs on the season. Defensively she has only made nine errors on the season with 68 assists and 59 putouts.
- » Senior Delanie Wisz is right behind Perez in average with a .396. She has a team best 13 homeruns and 46 RBIs. The infielder has totaled 53 hits including five doubles and a triple this season she has a slugging percentage of .739 and has drawn a team high of 27 walks with an on base percentage of .506.

AT-A-GLANCE

- » GCU has made a huge turn around from just a season ago as they have already won the same amount of games thus far in the season as they did all last year.
- » The Lopes were picked to finish third in the WAC West side and ended up being the overall one seed in the WAC Tournament and won their first WAC Championship in school history. The Lopes come to UCLA for their first ever NCAA Regional birth.
- » GCU has the largest one-year win improvement of any team in this year's NCAA tournament.
- » In all of Division I, GCU tied for the fourth-largest win improvement from the 2021 season to 2022. 1st Penn State - 25 (7-34 to 32-22), 2t. North Florida -21 (21-23 to 42-17), 2t. Presbyterian - 21 (15-19 to 36-15), 4t. GCU- 20 (19-30 to 39-14), 4t. Boise State - 20 (20-25 to 40-10)
- » GCU is ranked seventh the nation in stolen bases (127) and fifth in stolen bases per game (2.40). They are 10th in team batting average (.330), and 17th in on base percentage (.399) and runs per game (6.25).

PLAYERS TO WATCH

- » Nicoletti, a senior from Fullerton, Calif, has been the Lopes every-day left fielder and leadoff hitter for three consecutive seasons. She leads the Lopes in hits (71), runs (62), walks (24) and triples (4). Nicoletti has stolen 51 bases this season to beat her previous single-season GCU record of 27 and set a career record of 90. Her 51 steals also broke a 25-year-old WAC record for a season.
- » Nicoletti ranks second in the nation for stolen bases per game (.96), second in stolen bases (51), seventh in runs per game (1.17), 20th in hits (71) and 46th in batting average (.406). Nicoletti earned NFCA West -Region 1st team and 1st team All-WAC.
- » Dunckel, a sophomore from Valley Center, Calif. has been the Lopes shortstop all season and earned 1st-team All-WAC, WAC All-Defensive team, and NFCA West Region 3rd team. The Lopes shortstop ranks 21st in the nation in RBIs (55) and 35th in runs per game (.96). Dunckel is second in average (.403), hits (62), and homeruns (7).
- » Fifield and Chatman are tied for the Lopes single season homerun record with 14. Fifield has a team best slugging percentage of .692 and is second in RBIs with 54.
- » The Lopes first baseman, Chatman is second in slugging percentage (.646) and has 50 RBIs and 57 hits in her final season.
- » Thompson had a team-best record of 21-4 that makes her 1st in the GCU record book for single-season wins. Thompson was named WAC Tournament MVP and first team All-WAC in her first season with GCU. She has a team best 2.41 ERA with 17 complete games, five shutouts, two saves, and 135 strikeouts in 165.1 innings. Her 135 strikeouts is second in the GCU single season record book.
- » Behind the plate Koeltzow has caught all but one game for the Lopes and earned a place on the WAC All-Defensive team and second team All-WAC. At the plate she has a team high of 16 doubles and is hitting .333.

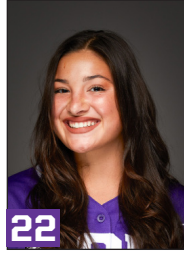
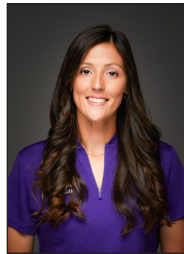

Shanon Hays was named the second head coach in the history of the Grand Canyon softball program on June 6th, 2021.

In 12 seasons as a softball head coach, Hays has racked up 468 career victories (an average of 39 per year) and holds a .721 winning percentage. He remains the winningest coach in the history of Texas Tech's softball program, winning 186 games in his five seasons leading the Red Raiders.

Hays has built numerous winning programs and built them fast.

He started the softball program at Lubbock Christian University and led the team to a 58-9-2 record and an NAIA National Championship in the program's inaugural season. Hays inherited a Texas Tech program that was 15-42 and led the Red Raiders to a 38-18 record and an NCAA tournament appearance in his first season in 2010.

Hays has spent the last five seasons in the Division II ranks in successful runs at Colorado Christian and Oklahoma Christian. He caps a three-year run at Oklahoma Christian where he posted a 99-30 record.

Hays also has five years as a D-I head coach on his resume. He posted winning records in each of his seasons as the head coach at Texas Tech, his alma mater where he played baseball under his father, Larry, from 1988-90. Inheriting a program that went 15-42 in 2009, Hays had the Red Raiders in their first NCAA tournament in a decade by posting a 23-win improvement and going 38-18 in his inaugural season in 2010. Hays was 186-96 during his time at Texas Tech.

While spending most of the last 15 years in college softball, Hays holds a diverse athletic background prior. He spent seven seasons in men's basketball: leading the Abilene Christian program in the late 1990s, two years as an assistant coach at Texas Tech, and two years as the associate head coach at Houston. He was also the athletic director at Abilene Christian.

Hays made the move from men's basketball to softball in 2006 when he was given the opportunity to start a softball program at Lubbock Christian University. After spending the 2006-07 school year recruiting players and raising funds, the Chaparrals debuted to a 58-9-2 record and an NAIA National Championship. He was named NAIA Coach of the Year. After another successful season at Lubbock Christian (53-7-3), he moved across town to take his first D-I softball head coaching position at Texas Tech.

From a family full of coaching success, Hays' father, Larry, and brother, Daren, are both actively coaching college softball. Larry took over for Shanon as Colorado Christian's head coach and just capped his third season leading the program. Previously, Larry served as the head coach of Texas Tech's baseball program for 21 seasons. Daren recently finished his 10th season leading the Lubbock Christian program.

Hays takes the reins of a Lopes program that has a 216-178 (.548) record in eight D-I seasons and has won WAC regular-season titles in 2014 and 2017.

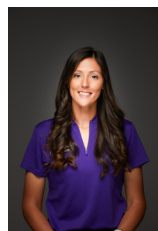

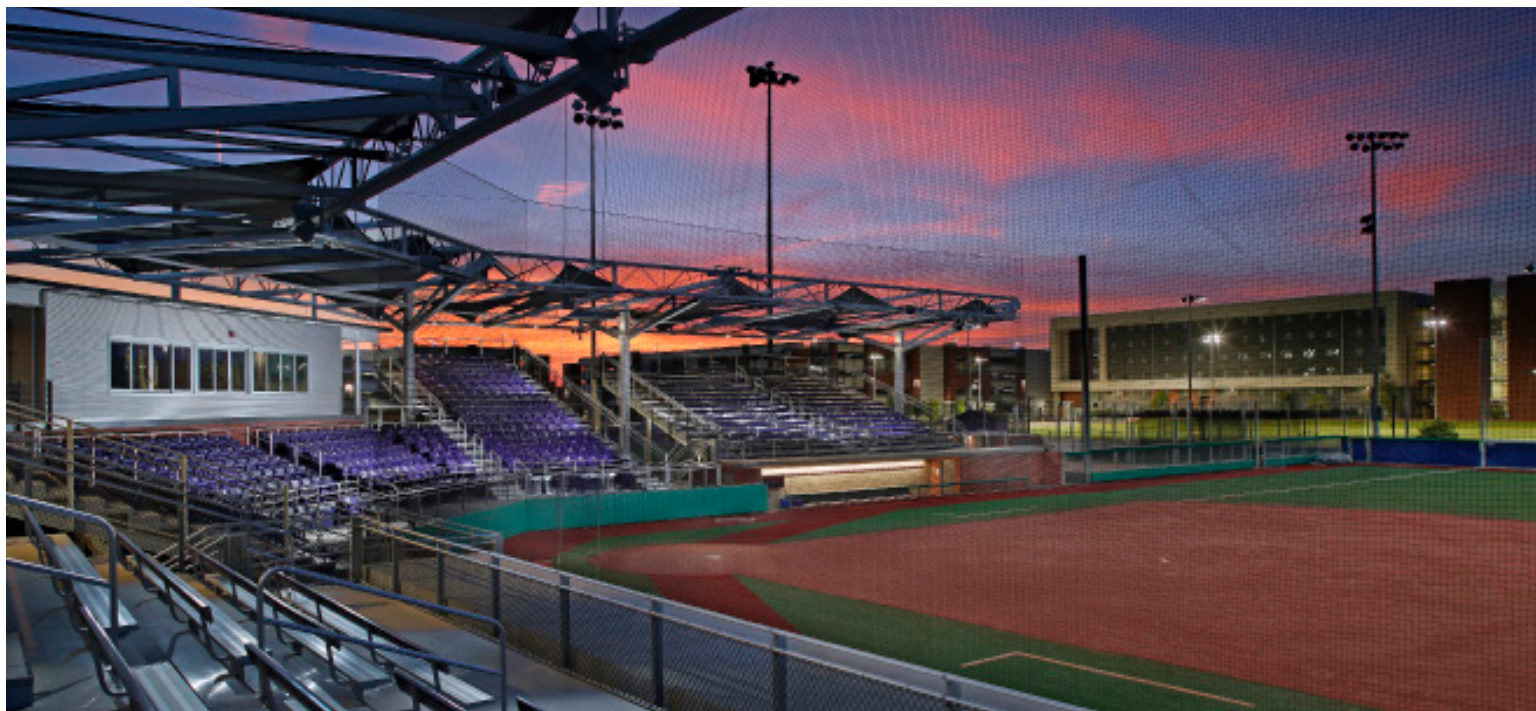

The 1,200-seat GCU Softball Stadium opened Feb. 8, 2018, to surround a playing field that was installed in 2017.

In the second phase of the facility's construction, the temporary bleachers were removed and ground was broken for permanent chair-back seating and bleacher seating, an indoor press box capable of handling television and radio broadcasts, a full concession stand and full-amenity bathrooms.

The first phase of the project consisted of a new FieldTurf playing surface, relocating the field from Stapleton-Pierson Stadium to make room for a larger stadium north of the Lopes Performance Center. The first phase also included construction of spacious dugouts, batting cages and bullpens on the home and visitor sides.

The new stadium features a middle section of individual chairback seats and sections to each side with bench seating that has back supports. The northeast-facing stadium also is protected by fabric shading.
