Saturday's game will mark the first-ever meeting on the hardwood between UCLA and Liberty.

UP NEXT FOR UCLA

The Bruins will host Liberty (10-4) this Saturday afternoon in Pauley Pavilion presented by Wescom. Game time is 3 p.m. (PT). This marks the first time in which these two schools have faced each other on the basketball court. Liberty has gone 10-4 this season after having compiled a 22-15 record last season (and a 9-9 record in the Big South Conference). Saturday's game will be the first of three straight home games for the Bruins, who open Pac-12 play at home next week.

LEAGUE LEADER

Sophomore Jaylen Hands enters the weekend as the Pac-12's leader in total assists (89) and assists per game (7.4). The 6-foot-3 guard from San Diego has averaged 11.8 points, 3.9 rebounds and 7.4 assists through the team's first 12 games. Hands also ranks third in the Pac-12 in assist-turnover ratio (2.5-to-1). Hands has tallied at least nine assists in six of UCLA's last seven games. He had at least 10 assists in three consecutive games (versus Hawai'i, Notre Dame and Belmont).

RARE FEAT: Hands became the first Pac-12 player to record at least 10 assists in three straight games since USC's Brandon Granville in March 2000. Granville also accomplished that feat in January 2000 and November 1999.

THE LAST TIME OUT

UCLA lost to No. 15 Ohio State 80-66 in the CBS Sports Classic on Saturday, Dec. 22, playing at the United Center in Chicago. The Bruins led Ohio State throughout the first half, before the Buckeyes secured a 33-30 cushion at halftime. UCLA never reduced Ohio State's lead to any fewer than four points in the game's final 10 minutes. Kris Wilkes finished with a team-leading 18 points for UCLA, while Jaylen Hands had 13 points and nine assists and Cody Riley totaled 10 points.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Bruins will open Pac-12 play at home next week, facing Stanford on Thursday, Jan. 3, before taking on California on Saturday, Jan. 5. This will mark the second straight year in which UCLA will open its league schedule at home. Last season, the Bruins swept a pair of home games against Washington State (96-82) and Washington (74-53) prior to New Year's Day. In fact, this will be the first season since 2015-16 in which the Bruins will have opened their Pac-12 schedule after Dec. 31.

SCORING IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Sophomore guard Kris Wilkes has scored in double figures in all 12 games this season. The 6-foot-8 guard from Indianapolis, Ind., has scored at least 20 points in four games this season. He tallied 21 points in a loss at Cincinnati (Dec. 19), registered 20 points in the team's loss to Belmont (Dec. 15) and had 22 points in a game against North Carolina in Las Vegas (Nov. 23). He scored a career-high 27 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in a season-opening win against Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 6).

AMONG PAC-12 PLAYERS: Kris Wilkes will enter the weekend as the fifth-leading scorer in the Pac-12 (17.8 ppg). Washington State's Robert Franks has averaged a league-leading 22.1 points per game (11 contests). Wilkes is one of seven players in the Pac-12 with at least four games of 20 or more points.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

Through Wednesday, Dec. 26, UCLA ranked No. 2 in the Pac-12 in rebounding offense (42.2 rpg) and was No. 5 in the league in rebounding margin (+4.2). In addition, the Bruins ranked No. 12 in the nation, through Tuesday, Dec. 25, in total rebounds per game (42.2). Freshman Moses Brown (11.6 ppg, 8.8 rpg) ranks fifth in the league in rebounds per game, while redshirt freshman Jalen Hill (3.2 ppg, 6.3 rpg) ranks No. 13 in that category. Brown, a 7-foot-1 center from Queens, N.Y., ranks second in field goal percentage (66.7%) and third in blocks per game (2.6 bpg).

FIRST TIME SINCE: Moses Brown's 23-point, 14-rebound and eight-block effort against Saint Francis (Nov. 16) marked the first time any UCLA player had at least 20 points and five blocks in a game since Jan. 22, 2000 (Jerome Moiso).

MULTIPLE DOUBLE-DOUBLES: UCLA has seen three players register double-doubles of the point-rebound variety this season (Moses Brown, Kris Wilkes and Cody Riley). In addition Jalen Hill has recorded a team-high 20 rebounds (versus Presbyterian on Nov. 19). Brown has totaled a team-leading four double-doubles for UCLA.

STANDING TALL

UCLA's 17-person roster includes eight players who measure at least 6-foot-8. Freshman Moses Brown (7-foot-1, 245 pounds) is the Bruins' tallest player since the late Mike Lanier (7-foot-7, 310 pounds) competed as a reserve center for UCLA in 1991-92 and 1992-93. UCLA redshirt junior Alex Olesinski and redshirt freshman Jalen Hill both stand at 6-feet-10, while freshmen Shareef O'Neal and Kenneth Nwuba, sophomore Chris Smith and redshirt freshman Cody Riley all stand at 6-foot-9. Sophomore guard Kris Wilkes rounds out the eight-person group at 6-foot-8.

Weekly media availability typically takes place Tuesday afternoons, prior to practice (in either the Mo Ostin Basketball Center or Pauley Pavilion). Players are available to the media after Steve Alford speaks. Members of the media are welcome to observe and record the first 15 minutes of practice those days. Media availability is not open to the public.

Admission to the press seating and media room is by credential only. All credential requests should be made through UCLA's credential website uclaathletics.com/credentials at least two days prior to the game. Website address and instructions can be obtained by emailing Alex Timiraos (atimiraos@athletics.ucla.edu). Members of the media covering UCLA should request credentials for road games through Timiraos (via email, or phone at 310-206-0524).

Credentials are available during the week at the Athletic Communications Office. Credentials not claimed prior to game day will be available at Pauley Pavilion's "Will Call" window (Northwest corner of the arena). The media will call window and entrance opens two hours prior to tip-off.

A press pass enables entrance at Pauley Pavilion's Northwest media gate (across from the intramural field). Press seating is located in the upper level (Section 215) of the arena's south side (opposite team benches). Pauley Pavilion's media workroom is located in the Southeast corner of the building on the event level, adjacent to the Southeast elevator.

Steve Alford and selected players will be available to the media in Pauley Pavilion's locker room following a 10-minute cooling off period after each game. UCLA's locker room is closed to the media. To access the media room during or after the game, follow the stairwell down to the court and proceed to the southeast corner (elevator access available at the arena's southeast corner). The visiting team's head coach will be available following a 10-minute cooling off period outside the visiting locker room (northwest corner, event level).

NEWS AND NOTES

- Kris Wilkes has scored in double figures in all 12 games for UCLA this season. He leads all current UCLA players in most career points (665), career field goals made (238), career three-pointers made (81) and career free throws made (108).
- Kris Wilkes' game-winning shot against Notre Dame (Dec. 8) was UCLA's first near-buzzer-beater to win a game since Jan. 7, 2016, when Bryce Alford made a 3-pointer to put UCLA ahead of No. 7 Arizona, 87-84, with 1.8 seconds remaining.
- Earlier this month, Jaylen Hands became the first UCLA player with multiple games of at least 10 assists in the same season since Lonzo Ball finished his freshman year (2016-17) with seven games of at least 10 assists.
- Prince Ali is the oldest player on UCLA's roster (currently a redshirt junior) and has played in 74 career games, the highest career total of any current Bruin. Ali leads all current UCLA players in career minutes played (1,399).
- Prince Ali made a career-high five three-pointers (on six attempts), totaling a career-high 23 points, in the team's victory over Hawai'i (Nov. 28). Ali was a perfect 4-for-4 from three-point range before the 16:00 mark in the first half that night.
- Moses Brown became UCLA's first player with at least 19 points and 17 rebounds in his collegiate debut since Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (then Lew Alcindor) tallied a then-school-record 56 points and grabbed 21 rebounds on Dec. 3, 1966.
- Moses Brown had eight blocks in the team's win against Saint Francis U (Nov. 16). Since the school began to officially record blocks in 1978-79, only three other players at UCLA have recorded at least eight blocks in one game.
- Jalen Hill tallied a season-best 20 rebounds in the team's victory over Presbyterian (Nov. 19). That marked the highest single-game rebound total by a Bruin since Kevin Love had 21 rebounds at Oregon State on Jan. 26, 2008.
- UCLA has made a season-high 10 three-pointers in two games – against North Carolina in Las Vegas (Nov. 23) and at home against Hawai'i (Nov. 28). The Bruins shot a season-best 50.0 percent in the win over Hawai'i (10-for-20).
- Presbyterian attempted 45 three-pointers in UCLA's 80-65 victory (Nov. 19). That marked the highest total ever attempted against UCLA since the NCAA adopted the three-point line (prior to 1986-87). Presbyterian made 13 of 45 attempts.

CBS SPORTS CLASSIC

The Bruins absorbed an 80-66 loss to No. 15 Ohio State last Saturday afternoon, playing in the CBS Sports Classic for the fifth consecutive season. UCLA trailed Ohio State at halftime, 33-30, as Kris Wilkes scored 13 of his team-leading 18 points in the first half. Over the five years of the CBS Sports Classic, the Bruins have compiled a 2-3 record with wins against Ohio State (Dec. 2016) and Kentucky (Dec. 2017).

BRUINS AT HOME

UCLA went 14-2 at home last season and has won 36 of 40 games in Pauley Pavilion presented by Wescom since the start of the 2016-17 campaign. During UCLA's 2016-17 season, the Bruins went 16-1 at home. Last year, the team's only home losses came against No. 25 Cincinnati (12/16/17) and Colorado (1/13/18). Since UCLA renovated Pauley Pavilion prior to the 2012-13 season, the Bruins have tallied an overall home record of 94-16 (posting an 85.5 winning percentage).

STREAKING

UCLA has made at least one 3-pointer played in its last 634 games. That 3-point streak began after the Bruins went 0-for-14 from 3-point territory in a 78-63 loss at No. 2-ranked Stanford on Feb. 3, 2000 (Maples Pavilion). UCLA has made at least three 3-pointers in 181 of 186 games under sixth-year head coach Steve Alford. The Bruins made a school single-game-record 19 three-pointers (on 31 attempts) at Colorado on Jan. 12, 2017 (UCLA won that game, 104-89).

MAKING AN IMPACT

Redshirt freshman Cody Riley has averaged 9.0 points and 5.3 rebounds per game, having played in each of UCLA's last nine contests. After missing the first three games of the season (jaw injury), Riley has shot 46.2 percent from the field and has connected on 3 of 6 attempts from 3-point range. The 6-foot-9 forward who starred at nearby Sierra Canyon High School (Chatsworth, Calif.), registered his first collegiate double-double at Cincinnati (11 points, 10 rebounds).

UCLA vs. STANFORD

The Bruins will open Pac-12 action versus Stanford on Jan. 3. Last season, UCLA and Stanford split a pair of regular-season games before the Bruins secured an 88-77 win in the Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinals. UCLA won the game in Pauley Pavilion (89-73) after Stanford had secured an 107-99 win in double overtime at Maples Pavilion. UCLA has compiled an all-time record of 145-94 against Stanford. UCLA has won 10 of the last 14 meetings over the previous seven seasons.

UCLA vs. CALIFORNIA

Last season, UCLA went 2-0 against California. The Bruins won the game at Haas Pavilion (Berkeley, Calif.) by a 107-84 margin. Three weeks later, UCLA downed the Golden Bears 70-57 in Pauley Pavilion. UCLA has won its last three meetings against California and leads the all-time series versus the Golden Bears, 139-103. In fact, the Bruins have gone 6-3 versus California over the previous four seasons. UCLA has won its last five home games against California.

THE BRUINS WHEN ...

Since the start of the 2013-14 season, UCLA has gone 101-12 when leading at halftime (spanning 186 games). During that same span, the Bruins have gone 20-45 when trailing at halftime and 3-5 when tied at the break. UCLA's largest halftime deficit overcome during that stretch has been nine points (twice) – the Bruins trailed Oregon State, 38-29, on March 2, 2014 and trailed Oregon, 48-39, on Feb. 9, 2017. When the Bruins have built a 10-point lead (or larger) at any point in the game, UCLA has gone 111-14. Conversely, when trailing by 10 or more points in a game, UCLA has gone 10-49.

DEFICITS, COMEBACKS & MORE

UCLA'S LARGEST COMEBACK (in 2017-18): The Bruins overcame a 14-point deficit with 17:11 to play in the second half in the team's 74-53 victory against Washington (Dec. 31). Trailing by a 43-29 margin, the Bruins used a 45-10 scoring run over the game's final 17:11 to earn the victory. In fact, Washington led the Bruins, 52-48, with just over eight minutes to go. Over the last seven minutes, UCLA outscored Washington by a 26-1 margin to coast to a 21-point victory. Earlier in the season, UCLA had overcome a 12-point deficit in the 72-70 win against Wisconsin (Nov. 21). Wisconsin built a 38-26 cushion with 1:51 to play in the first half before UCLA closed the gap to just seven points by halftime (38-31).

OPPONENT, LARGEST COMEBACK (in 2017-18): UCLA surged ahead by 15 points in the second half at Michigan (Dec. 9), leading 46-31 with 14:48 to play after a three-pointer by Aaron Holiday. The 15-point cushion fell to two (60-58) at the 4:06 mark. Michigan trailed, 64-61, with less than 30 seconds to play but tied the contest, 65-65, in the final 10 seconds. The Wolverines outscored UCLA, 13-4, in the overtime session to win, 78-69. That marked UCLA's largest blown lead since Nov. 25, 2012, when Cal Poly overcame an 18-point deficit in the game's final 12:21 to defeat UCLA, 70-68, in Pauley Pavilion.

COMEBACKS IN 2016-17

The Bruins' largest comeback victory during the 2016-17 campaign took place in a game against No. 5 Oregon in Pauley Pavilion (2/9/2017). UCLA trailed by 19 points (37-18) with 6:37 to play in the first half and by a 13-point margin (64-51) with 13:40 left in regulation. Midway through the second half, the Bruins used an 18-3 scoring run to overcome the deficit and secure an 82-79 victory. In an 83-82 win at Utah (1/12/2017), UCLA trailed the Utes, 51-42, with 16:13 left in the second half. UCLA's largest deficit at any point during the 2016-17 season was 19 points versus No. 5 Oregon (2/9/2017).

UCLA'S TRIPLE-DOUBLE NOTES

The Bruins have four triple-doubles in their record book, including three since the assist became an official NCAA stat prior to the 1983-84 season. Most recently, Kyle Anderson had a triple-double as a sophomore in Nov. 2013.

- Freshman Moses Brown finished with 23 points, 14 rebounds and eight blocks in the Bruins' 95-58 victory against Saint Francis U, earlier this season (Nov. 16, 2018). Brown became UCLA's first player since Jerome Moiso (Jan. 22, 2000, versus Arizona State) to have recorded at least 20 points and five blocks in a game. The Bruins have not had any player with a triple-double of the point-rebound-block variety since Jelani McCoy on Dec. 9, 1995 (stats located above).
- Earlier this season, Jaylen Hands finished with 12 points, eight rebounds and seven assists in UCLA's 74-72 loss to Belmont (Dec. 15). Last year, Aaron Holiday came close to achieving a triple-double with 23 points, nine assists and six rebounds in an 82-79 victory at home against USC (Feb. 3, 2018). Holiday also approached triple-double territory in a win over Stanford (March 8, 2018), recording a career-high-tying 34 points, eight assists and seven rebounds.
- In 2016-17, then-freshmen Lonzo Ball and TJ Leaf each came close to recording triple-doubles. Now playing for the Los Angeles Lakers, Ball was two rebounds shy of a triple-double in his UCLA debut on Nov. 11, 2016 (19 pts, 11 assists, 8 rbs versus Pacific). Ball and TJ Leaf each finished just short of triple-doubles in UCLA's 102-62 win over UC Santa Barbara (12/14/16) – Leaf had 25 points, 10 rebounds, and eight assists, while Ball had 13 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists.

UCLA IN OVERTIME

The Bruins played five games into overtime last season (2017-18), with one of those contests pushing into two overtime periods. UCLA went 2-3 in those games, logging wins at home against Central Arkansas (106-101) in its first regular-season home game and versus Oregon (86-78) in the team's final home contest. The game against Arizona in the Pac-12 Tournament semifinals was UCLA's first overtime game in the conference tournament since March 8, 2007.

HEADED TO DOUBLE OVERTIME

Two of UCLA's last three double OT games have come against the Stanford Cardinal. Last season, the Bruins absorbed a 107-99 loss at Stanford. UCLA's last win in double overtime came against Stanford in Pauley Pavilion (Jan. 8, 2015). In that game, freshman Kevon Looney totaled 27 points and 19 rebounds to help the Bruins overcome a 14-point deficit with just over nine minutes to play in the second half.

Other recent games against No. 1 teams took place against Kentucky in Chicago (Dec. 20, 2014), at home versus Arizona (Jan. 9, 2014) and in the Sweet 16 against Florida (March 27, 2014). UCLA has gone 12-22 all-time against the Associated Press' No. 1-ranked team.

- Last season's game against Kentucky marked UCLA's fifth meeting with the Wildcats in four seasons. The Bruins have gone 3-2 against Kentucky in those five games (spanning four seasons). Two years ago, UCLA won at Rupp Arena (97-92 on Dec. 3, 2016) before the Wildcats knocked off the Bruins, 86-75, in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament (on March 24, 2017, at FedEx Forum in Memphis, Tenn.). UCLA's win against Kentucky last December took place in New Orleans, La.

2017-18, AT A GLANCE

The Bruins went 21-12 last season, posting an 11-7 record in Pac-12 play (tied, third place). UCLA entered the Pac-12 Tournament as the No. 4 seed, securing one of four first round byes. After defeating Stanford in a quarterfinal contest (88-77), the Bruins lost to top-seed Arizona in overtime (78-67). UCLA's season ended four days later with a loss to St. Bonaventure in the "First Four" of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton, Ohio.

Aaron Holiday led the Pac-12 in scoring last season, averaging 20.3 points per game. He was selected No. 23 in the first round of the 2018 NBA Draft by the Indiana Pacers. With Holiday's selection to that organization, the Pacers currently have four UCLA products on their roster (including Darren Collison, TJ Leaf and Ike Anigbogu).

Thomas Welsh was selected in the second round of the 2018 NBA Draft by the Denver Nuggets (as the No. 58 overall pick). Welsh concluded his UCLA career ranking No. 3 on the school's all-time rebounding list and blocked shots list (1035 rebounds, 143 blocks).

• Russell Westbrook was named MVP of the NBA All-Star Game in 2015 and 2016 ... last season, Westbrook was selected to compete in the NBA's All-Star Game for the seventh time ... in 2017, Westbrook scored 41 points in the contest ... Kevin Love, who was teammates with Westbrook at UCLA in 2007-08, was chosen last season for the fifth time in his career.

• UCLA's former guards stole the show at both NBA All-Star Weekends in 2015 (New York) and 2016 (Toronto) ... during of those two All-Star Weekends, Zach LaVine won the annual Slam Dunk Contest one night before Westbrook captured NBA All-Star Game Most Valuable Player (MVP) accolades.

• UCLA has seen 13 players under head coach Steve Alford advance to the NBA. Seven of those Bruins were first-round NBA draft picks (Zach LaVine, Jordan Adams, Kyle Anderson, Kevon Looney, Lonzo Ball, T.J. Leaf and Aaron Holiday). Norman Powell, Jonah Bolden, Ike Anigbogu and Thomas Welsh were selected in the NBA Draft's second round, while Travis Wear and David Wear joined NBA teams as undrafted free agents.

PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

UCLA was selected second in the preseason Pac-12 media poll, announced at Pac-12 media day in San Francisco (Oct. 11). Oregon was picked to finish first in the preseason poll, earning 16 of 23 first-place votes. The Bruins secured six of the first-place votes.

PREDICTIONS: Members of the media have correctly picked the regular-season winner of the conference 16 times in 26 tries, while the winner has been accurately chosen in 18 of the 29 all-time preseason votes. UCLA was selected third in last season's preseason poll and finished in a tie for third place in the standings with an 11-7 conference record.

LAST TIME: UCLA last won the Pac-12's regular-season crown in 2012-13. Other previous regular-season titles for UCLA took place in 2005-06, 2006-07 and 2007-08. The Bruins finished second in the league in 2013-14 and third in 2016-17. UCLA most recently won the Pac-12 Tournament Championship in 2014 (in Las Vegas, Nev.).

MO OSTIN BASKETBALL CENTER

UCLA officially opened the Mo Ostin Basketball Center with a grand opening ceremony on Oct. 26, 2017. The state-of-the-art facility not only has provided the men's and women's basketball teams with vital resources, but has also freed up facility access for other programs and student-athletes. With approximately 35,000 gross square feet of space, the facility stands near Pauley Pavilion's southwest corner, along the south end of the Los Angeles Tennis Center.

The Mo Ostin Basketball Center was designed by award-winning architectural design firm Kevin Daly Architects, in partnership with globally acclaimed high-performance design firm AECOM. The practice facility features two separate courts – Russell Westbrook Court for the men's team and Ann Meyers Drysdale Court for the women's team. The building also houses the Kevin Love Athletic Performance Center, which is raised over the main entrance, has its own skylights and includes separate offices for the athletic performance staffs of the men's and women's basketball teams.

UCLA's facility also features separate conference rooms for the men's and women's basketball teams that each overlook their respective courts. The Mo Ostin Basketball Center includes locker rooms for the student-athletes, a film room, an equipment room, a training room, a nutrition center, an alumni locker room and locker rooms for the coaching staffs. Portions of the facility's hallways include "By the Numbers" displays and an Under Armour uniform presentation. Adjacent to both courts is a "Champions Plaza" patio with a wall that honors student-athletes from past men's and women's teams.

The Bruins' state-of-the-art facility is named after legendary music industry executive and philanthropist Morris "Mo" Ostin, who generously committed \$10 million to the project. Ostin, who holds a B.A. in Economics from UCLA, serves as Chairman Emeritus of Warner Bros. His influence is reflected throughout the building, from a state-of-the-art sound system, acoustics and videoboard to the design of the donor display in the lobby, which was modeled after a sheet of music.

UCLA BASKETBALL ON THE AIR

For the 11th straight season, UCLA men's basketball games will be produced by the UCLA Sports Network from IMG College, with AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Los Angeles serving as the flagship station for the network.

The 2018-19 campaign will mark the 22nd year of UCLA's partnership with AM 570 Fox Sports LA owner iHeartMedia (formerly Clear Channel Communications). All UCLA men's basketball games will be broadcast on KLAC (AM 570) or one of its sister iHeartMedia stations. UCLA and IMG College have agreed to terms on an agreement to simulcast a significant number of UCLA men's basketball games on 97.3 THE FAN in San Diego, home to a large population of UCLA alumni and fans. The primary sister station in the greater Los Angeles area is AM 1150 (KEIB).

All 31 regular-season games are scheduled to be televised live in 2018-19. The Bruins will have at least 10 games broadcast by the ESPN family of networks. Six games will be televised by FOX Sports, and 14 will be carried by Pac-12 Networks. CBS will televise games against Ohio State (Dec. 22) and USC (Jan. 19).

Josh Lewin enters his third year serving as the play-by-play voice for UCLA men's basketball and football. In addition to calling UCLA games, Lewin recently completed his seventh season handling play-by-play duties for the New York Mets. He served as the voice of the San Diego Chargers for 12 seasons (2005-06 through 2016-17). Lewin has over two decades of experience calling NFL, MLB, NHL and NCAA football and basketball contests.

Tracy Murray begins his 10th season as a radio analyst. Murray, who played at UCLA (1990-92) before enjoying a 12-year NBA career, spent the 2015-16 season as a shooting coach for the Los Angeles Lakers. Previously, he served as a radio analyst with UCLA from 2008-15. Murray ranks 10th on UCLA's all-time scoring list with 1,792 career points in 98 games.

- In 2016-17, he helped UCLA post a 31-5 overall record and 15-3 mark in Pac-12 play, as the Bruins defeated every team that they faced ... the Bruins tied the program record for regular-season victories (28, also accomplished in 2007-08) ... UCLA advanced to the Sweet 16 in three of Coach Alford's first four seasons at UCLA.
- Helped New Mexico secure four Mountain West Conference regular-season titles and two conference tournament championships ... coached UNM to its two highest single-season victory totals (30 wins in 2009-10, 29 wins in 2012-13).

Steve Alford has entered his 28th season as a college head coach in 2018-19. He guided UCLA to Sweet 16 appearances in three of his previous five seasons. In addition, he led UCLA to the Pac-12 Tournament title in 2014.

Steve Alford is one of 12 head coaches to have led at least four NCAA Division I programs to the NCAA Tournament (Missouri State, Iowa, New Mexico and UCLA). His UCLA teams have advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 2014, 2015 and 2017. In 2014, he became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the Pac-12 Tournament title in his first year as head coach.

The other 11 coaches to have led at least four NCAA Division I teams to the NCAA Tournament include John Beilein, Lefty Driesell, Cliff Ellis, Larry Eustachy, Jim Harrick, Lon Kruger, Fran McCaffery, Tom Penders, Rick Pitino, Tubby Smith and Eddie Sutton. Eight of those 11 coaches are active head coaches.

Of the 12 coaches who have led four different schools to the NCAA Division I Tournament, only five have won at least one game at all four schools. Lon Kruger has won at least one game at five schools.
